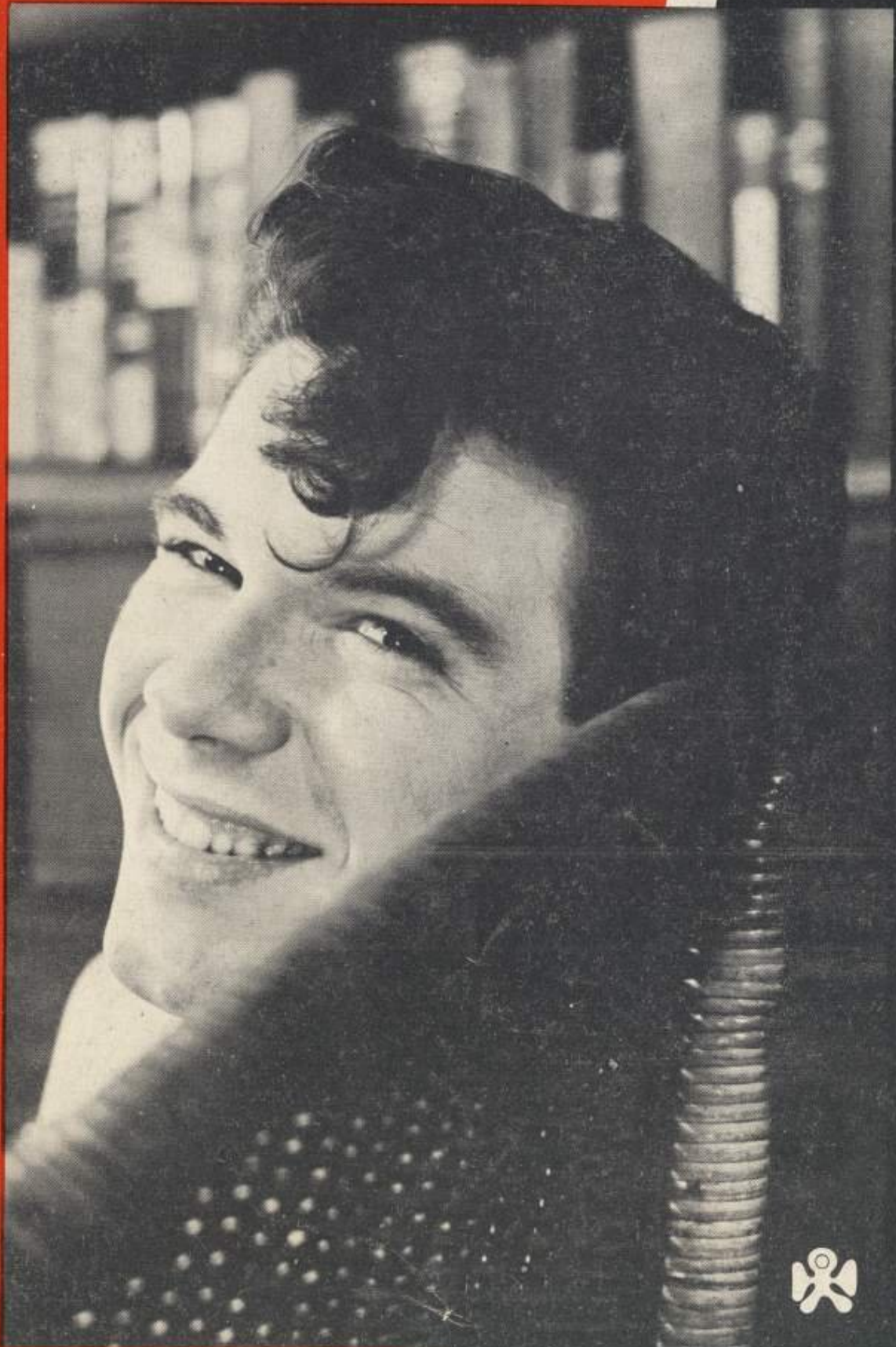

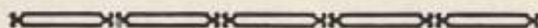

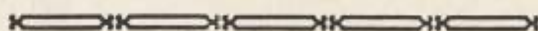

the visit

Countless citizens have been injured by gestapo-like tactics of US Postal Inspectors "investigating" possible violations of obscenity laws.

The procedure was simple: Persons known to purchase sexual photographs and literature regularly were visited by Inspectors to prevent them "from unknowingly becoming involved in a violation."

The effect of such "public minded" action by the men entrusted to *deliver* the mail was to instill abiding fear that Big Brother was watching.

Abuses ended not there. If the individual investigated happened to be a Federal (and sometimes state) employee, or a "scoutmaster or teacher," the Inspectors would "automatically" go to the man's *employer*, probably without informing the man of the action.

The Janus Society of America brought these policies to the attention of *The New Republic* and the Long Senate sub-committee investigating Federal snooping. The *NR* responded with an editorial on August 21 and Long Committee Chief Counsel Bernard Fensterwald, Jr. outlined action he plans.

It must be noted that none of the materials brought to our attention were even suspect as obscenity, but if all were the hardest core pornography, the Postal action remains unconscionable.

For their part, the Post Office claims these investigations have virtually ceased, but the weekly number of complaints received in the JSA

office indicates otherwise.

A four pronged attack, utilizing the offices of *The New Republic*, the American Civil Liberties Union, the Long sub-committee and Janus Society is in effect. The *NR* article produced several more complaints and DRUM readers are here solicited to inform us of any Postal visit to them or their employers. Complete anonymity is guaranteed by all parties.

news

CAPE MAY, N.J.

These signs, erected by direction of the City Council (DRUM, Sept.), have been responsible for an almost complete desolation of the beaches.



BOSTON

For two years, Albert L. O'Neil, a member of the Boston Licensing Board, has claimed Boston City Council denied him an opportunity to speak against Development Director Edward J. Logue's fight on local bars.

City Council has under consideration a \$113 million urban renewal plan for the South Cove area in which are located 44 liquor licenses. Some 30 of these 44 spots would be forced to move under the plan and because of local conditions, few would be able to find new homes.

O'Neil got his day in Council and ended up causing that body to "unanimously pass an order for a Police Dept. probe of liquor establishments and restaurants which allegedly cater to beatniks, homosexuals and other undesirables."

Local observers feel that O'Neil was well intentioned, but should never have presented such issues to Boston's puritanical governing body. The result of this investigation to rid Boston of "these incubators of homosexuality, evil sinfulness, indecency and this Bohemian and beatnik form of

life" remain uncertain, but Councilman Frederick Langone charged the police: "Get rid of these places."

The urban renewal drive has scheduled the demise of the *Punch Bowl Bar*, the site of which is to become the temporary home of the Univ. of Massachusetts extension.

Harvard University studies into why people drink alcoholic beverages and become alcoholics seem to indicate the basic conflicts behind problem drinking often rest on "cross-sex identity." Such a state is not homosexuality or even latent homosexuality, but double or confused identity. One example cited by Dr. David McClelland, head of the project, is "the fairly common phenomenon of pregnancy symptoms in men whose wives are expecting babies."

ROME

A major governmental crisis over movie censorship has apparently been solved.

The controversy erupted early in June when Christian Democrats pushed an amendment to a proposed law giving state financial aid to Italy's hard hit film industry.

The amendment provided that such aid would be restricted to movies which "respect the ethical-social principles at the foundation of the constitution, excluding any ideological discrimination." The *Catholic Register* claimed that meant "no aid would be given

to films exploiting sex."

A substitute amendment, more clearly defining the nature of the films to be excluded, namely those which "lacking artistic or cultural qualities, vulgarly exploit erotic sexual themes for the sole purpose of financial gain," received coalition approval.

PRISONS

Phoenix: *A jail riot source was traced to a 20 year old man incarcerated for prostitution who complained that four fellow prisoners attacked him after he refused their homosexual advances. Prisoners then built bonfires of blankets, pillows and mattresses.*

Richmond: Homosexuality is the major problem confronting prison administrators today, a group attending a joint session of the Southern States Probation and Parole Conference and the Southern States Prison Association was told.

"I've known instances," said criminology professor Clyde B. Vedder, "where a new man was good looking and as many as 40 letters were written to the warden asking to be assigned to his cell."

Indianapolis: *A 16 year old inmate of the Marion County Juvenile Center complained "If anyone reported homosexual acts to a supervisor, nothing would get done about it and the guy who reported it would get beat up later" by some of the other prison inmates.*

The youth was then found beaten in the washroom of the detention center.

Hutchinson, Kans.: "You've got to realize that sex is a very basic thing," observed an

officer of the Kansas State Industrial Reformatory. "The guys just don't get it. Some very average guys come in here but they do have strong sex drives. Pretty soon they experiment," the official continued.

Almost 15% of the inmates are estimated as having homosexual relations on a regular basis while in the prison. Love affairs are common and some times the hand holding and petting develops "into scenes of homosexual fornication or even worse acts of sodomy and other abnormal sexual relationships," claimed the Salina Journal.

PENNSYLVANIA

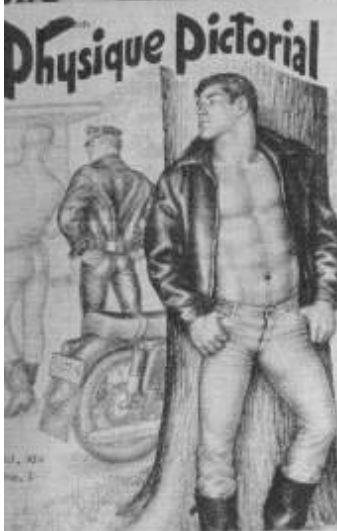
Harrisburg: Thirty-four men were arrested on charges of sodomy and solicitation in the largest such "crackdown" known to have ever been conducted in the area. The arrests took place in the State Street section between Front and Third.

District Attorney LeRoy Zimmerman promised to "rid our community of this infectious disease."

The Janus Society of America termed the actions of the police as "shocking" and noted that teenagers had been hired by the police to stand in provocative positions, ostensibly in order to entice homosexuals to solicit them.

Legal action against the police will be brought if sufficient evidence of malpractice can be gathered.

In what JSA Executive Secretary Clark P. Polak calls: "Another viciously hypocritical triumph by so-called liberals," the Pennsylvania Bar Association has recommended that (Continued on page 22)



the story behind **Physique**

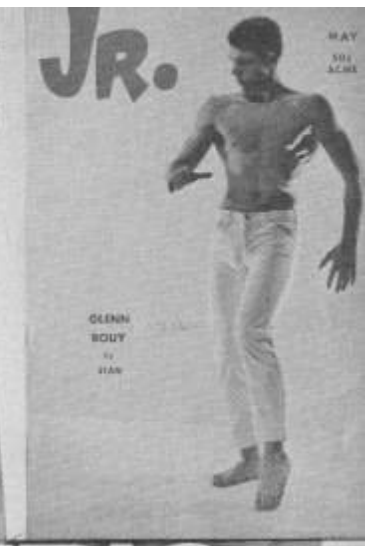
The first issue had a scant 32 pages and measured a tiny 3-3/4 inches by 5-3/4 inches, selling at the then high price of 20¢. Today it has 48 pages and sells at the now low price of 35¢. Then was almost 14 years ago, the magazine was *Tomorrow's Man*.

Conceived by Irvin Johnson in his Chicago *Health Studio* gym as an additional medium for promotion of his already successful high protein tablets, vitamin supplements and other so-called body building products, the first book was mailed to a few hundred health enthusiasts.

But Johnson had bigger ideas for his little book. He managed to convince the monolithic American News Co. (now disbanded) that *TM* was really a body builder's handbook and within two years his dream came to fruition with *TM* selling an amazing 100,000 copies per month.

The current best sellers, *Strength and Health*, plus many more of the ilk, were no competition to America's first homosexual directed photomaga-zine, though *TM* has now dropped from its hey-day top. Others have now joined the bandwagon, but *TM* sales, always respectable, are again rising.

Ironically, this rise is not despite *TM*'s consistently conservative editorial policy, but because of it. Publications from newcomer Guild Press are beginning to meet resistance on the dealer level resulting from GP's inclusion of photographs with erections scarcely concealed beneath skin-tight trunks or next-to-nothing posing straps. Zooming sales are insufficient inducement to a significant number of newsstand operators who, concerned both about apparant vi-

ulations of local obscenity laws and absolute affronts to the moral standards of at least the more conservative members of the community, now refuse to display and sell the more obvious publications. *TM*'s long tradition as "safe" keeps it available on stands that remove other books.

It is impossible to establish an exact figure, but total sales of physique magazines, in this country alone, probably top nine million per year, broken down to 750,000 per month, or one copy a year for each statistical male homosexual in America.

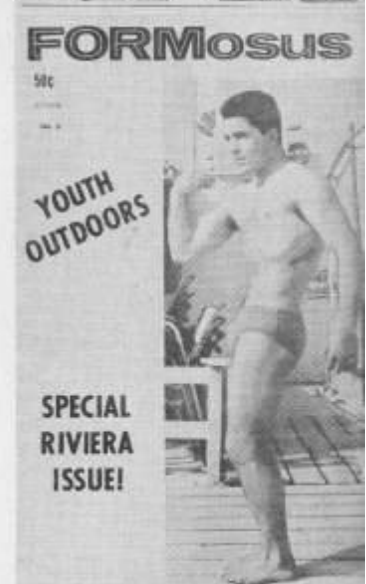
Beauty and Sex

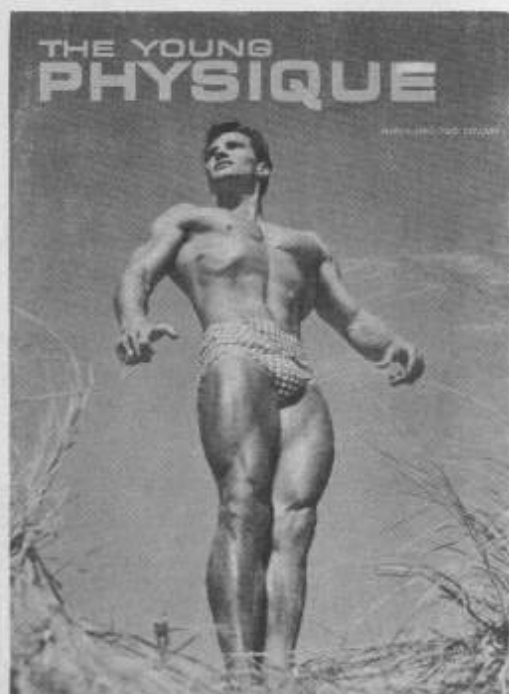
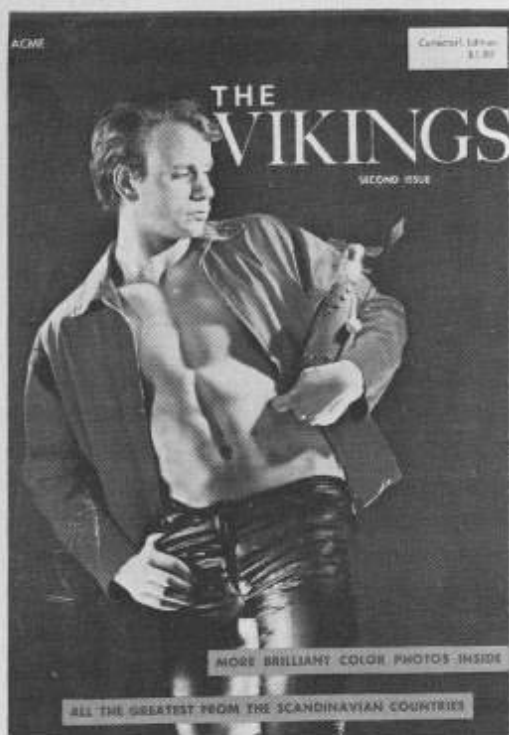
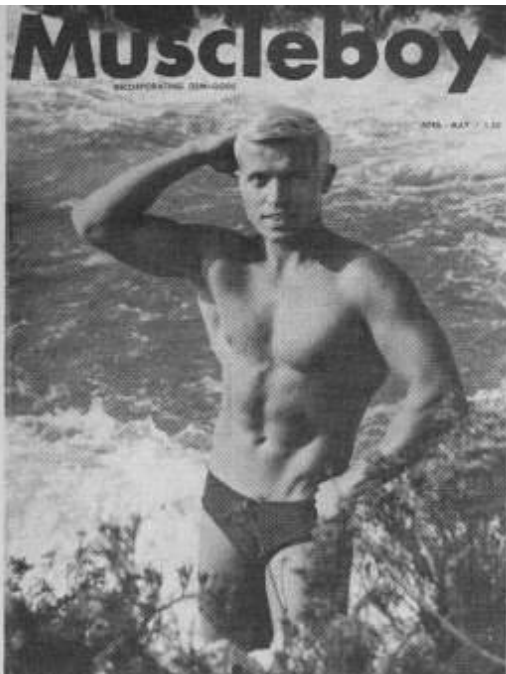
Contrasted to European countries where the magazines are equally sensuous, our publications are far inferior. Most are tawdry and the photographers pay insultingly little attention to basics such as keeping their camera in focus. Rarely are attempts to produce beauty as well as sexual stimulation evident.

Photographers alibi: "Picture buyers want big crotches, pre-adolescents and violence. A shot of two tumescent eleven year olds wrestling with each other is an unbeatable winner. Why be concerned with art?"

If this statement is loaded toward certain kinds of fetishism, it does point up trends easier to join than to fight. The assumption however, that there is no market for quality is pointedly false. Neil Edwards and *Les Folies Des Hommes*, to name just two, have established followings without compromising quality.

Outside of *Drum*, a survey finds just three publications approaching their subject with re-





spect for their readers: *The Vikings*, *The Young Physique*, and *Muscleboy*. (Technically, *The Vikings* could be dropped from the listing for it is assembled in Sweden by Stan, perhaps the finest physique photographer in the world, and it features his own work almost exclusively, *TYP* and *Muscleboy* are actually the same magazine appearing in alternate months, narrowing the field to just one American publication.

As for the others, the most that can be said for *Tomorrow's Man* is that it is never offensive. *Physique Pictorial*, reputedly the magazine with the largest circulation, substitutes generous gobs of sado-masochistic text and illustrations for exposed genitalia, but rarely publishes a notable picture.

JR., also published by the *Tomorrow's Man* Publishing Co., and Bob Anthony's *Champ* series plus his irregularly released *Young Champ*, rate high in effort, but do not reach the stature of *TYP* which, in its turn, only approaches the quality heterosexual publications.

Lowest on the quality totem are, of course, Guild Press publications where quick production seems the only rule.

Physique Art

Physique drawing, a tangential outgrowth, has suffered worse. Actually offering the highest erotic rewards, Tom of Finland and Quaintance, until his death, produced stylized but unquestionably superb work. No other serious artist has appeared and *Fizeek Art Quarterly* presents the worst of a very bad game in general.

Regardless of these negative considerations (directed at

execution rather than intent), enormous amounts of pleasure obtain from this sex medium. Homosexuals masturbate more than any other group of males (having only one-third the number of sexual orgasms with partners that heterosexuals have), and physique inspired phantasies contribute a large measure to this satisfaction.

Interest in visual sexual stimulation is a peculiarly masculine trait as women almost never achieve the same kind of arousal from photographs or artistic representations. Lesbians, for instance, are no more concerned with the *Playboy* fold out than straight women are with *TM*. In those instances where particular men are not overtly stimulated in this manner, they are at least appreciative.

Postmaster Tackled

Physiques could not always be sold as freely as they are today. This stature is of recent vintage and not until H. (for Herman) Lynn Womack, the albino chieftain of the Guild Press, tackled JFK appointed Postmaster General J. (for James) Edward Day in 1961 did the world become safe for physique publications.

Predictably, Womack lost in the lower courts and spent six months in jail and 18 months in a mental hospital for his trouble, but he pushed the case to the Supreme Court, which held:

"These portrayals of the male nude cannot fairly be regarded as

more objectionable than many portrayals of the female nude that society tolerates. Of course not every portrayal of male or female nudity is obscene."

The court was quick to find, as we have found here, that the material was: "dismally unpleasant, uncouth, and tawdry," but this, happily, was insufficient argument to declare it legally obscene.

In rendering this decision the Supreme Court was unable to regard Womack's motives as anything other than "sordid" nor the gay public as more than "unfortunate," but this case stands as one of the two most important homosexual court victories and as a testament to Womack's courage.

Over Masculinization

Not all publications on the market featuring semi-clad torsos of attractive young men are overtly directed at homosexuals, and so-called muscle books (*Mr. America*; *Iron Man*) have great popularity among weight lift enthusiasts. It is suspected that a significant portion of these persons would, however, fall into Kinsey's elusive 13% of all males who are erotically attracted to other men but who never express their interest sexually. Partially as a reaction to the increased blatancy of the physiques, the muscle books have become highly conservative of late.

Strong editorial policy precludes inclusion of shots of

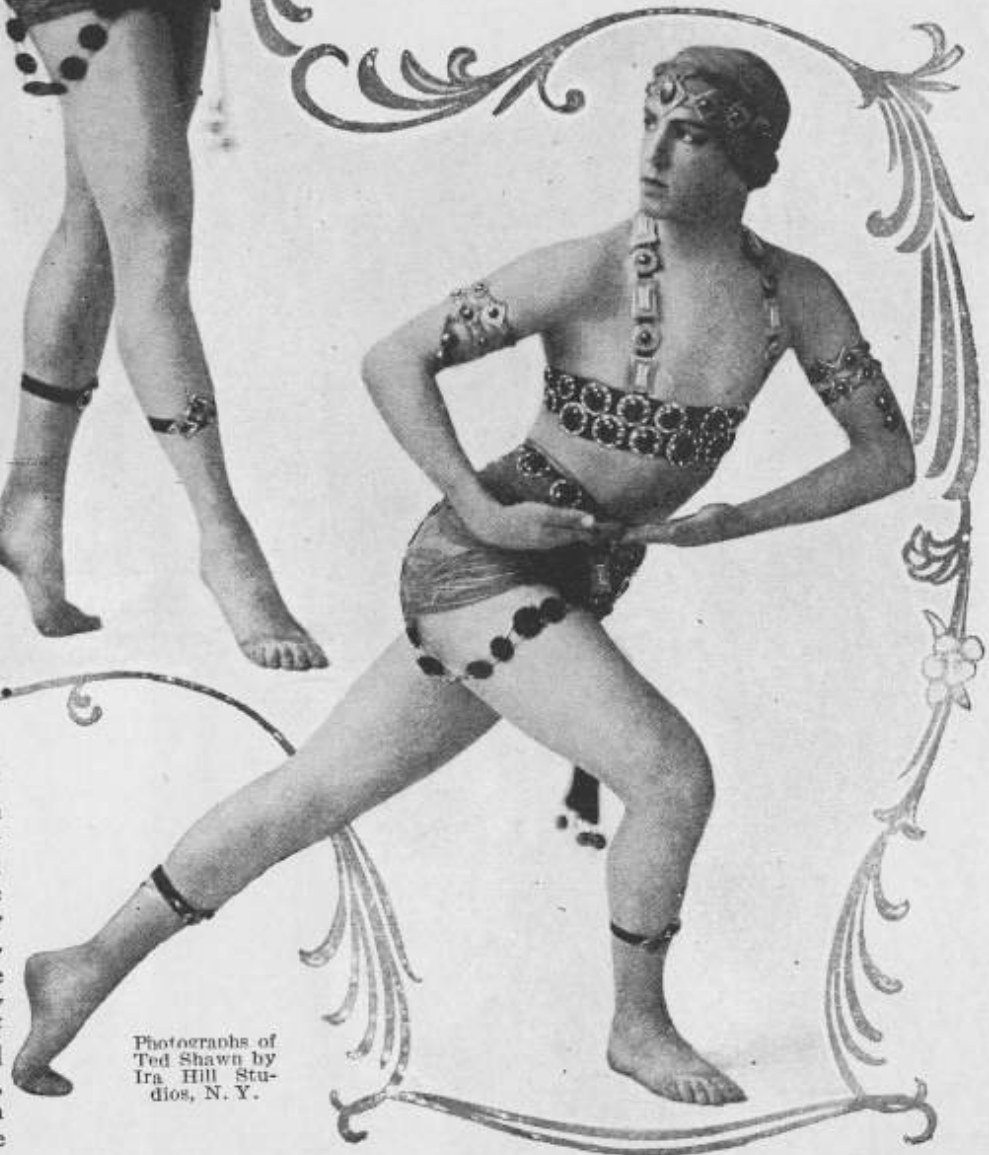




rear nudes or posing strap views. Sexually provocative photos are conspicuously absent, lending an almost sterile air.

In the days before *TM*, they were, by their current standards, quite daring. From the homosexual's standpoint, the shift in muscle book format renders little loss. Seldom are gay males interested in these over masculinized *Harry Chess* type parodies.

According to a noted New York psychologist, homosexuals seek gentleness and sensitiv-

Is His Health Wrong?

Q. In reading the PHYSICAL CULTURE Magazine, I find you help many parents to solve their problems regarding their sons. I am not a parent; I am a boy asking your help in solving my own problem. I am but seventeen, and am tired of living. I don't find anything interesting. Only a few years ago life seemed wonderful to me, but now I don't care to do anything. I have hardly any boy friends. I am in good health but for this continuous despondent mood which is responsible for many of the petty ills that bother me.

A. The fact that you are continually despondent rather disproves your statement that you are in good health. Your petty ills are a cause instead of a result. Look carefully to your diet. Make sure that you are not suffering from indigestion. Then give some time each day to vigorous exercise. Counsel yourself to get out. Mingle with people. Don't be a recluse. Walk, run, jump. Have you given up your school work? Why not resume it? If you can't attend school, you can study at home. Whatever you do, keep busy. Work. Nothing will so soon give a man a fit of the blues as idleness. Read good books. Suppose you go to church. A firm belief in the power of God will help you, but remember that God helps those who help themselves. Stop pitying yourself. Think of happy, cheerful, pleasant things. You must remember that you attract to yourself the things you think about. Make friends among the boys. Don't feel that the boys care nothing for you. Perhaps they feel the same way about you. "If you would have a friend, be one." Do something for others. That is the surest and best way in all the world to forget about yourself. If you would be happy, make others happy.

Whipping Is Not the Best Way

Q. My husband and I have agreed in

the case of our eleven-year-old son that occasionally corporal punishment is a necessity, but I claim that a light switching or spanking by me is sufficient. My husband insists that once it is decided that chastisement is necessary, it should be in the form of a sound flogging, administered by him in my presence, for which purpose he has devised an instrument not unlike the Cossack Knot. What are your views?

A. Have you ever considered doing away with corporal punishment entirely? Since you and your husband don't altogether agree upon methods, I would suggest that you compromise and settle upon some other punishment. A normal child of eleven years will listen to reason. Suppose, the next time you have any trouble with the little lad, you sit down and talk with him concerning his misconduct. Show him the error of his ways. Talk with him quietly, as you would with an older person. Appeal to his manhood, to his sense of honor. In a short time he will respond most satisfactorily. There are times when it might be well to send the child to bed; to make him go without his dessert for a few meals; to deprive him of some pleasure or privilege. Have you ever tried letting the boy select his own punishment? If, however, you feel that only a whipping will bring desired results, then by all means, your position is the correct one. A spanking or switching is certainly quite sufficient. Under no circumstances should a child of any age, for any offense, receive a "flogging."

Punishment or Education for Impure Mindedness?

Q. Can you suggest a punishment for telling vulgar stories?

A. Wash out his mouth with soap and water. This is a good old-fashioned remedy. I would suggest that a good plain talk on purity, without any punishment, would accomplish more. Teach the boy to have clean thoughts, and you will have little difficulty with vulgar stories.

ity within models. Says Dr. Clarence A. Tripp: "In most instances the homosexual male is heavily interested in what the Greeks called the androgenous angle, meaning the advantages of masculinity coupled with those of sensitivity. Maleness that is extremely polarized, intensified like the supermuscleman, cheats itself out of at least half of the market as it lacks this sensitivity.

"Any muscleman caricature that depicts a person being proud of his fist is contradictory to the homosexual male.

"More leverage is gained making the model's posture dreamy, a little approachable and not so aggressive or narcissistic."

Money

The average model receives from \$5 to \$100 depending on what was described to us as "skill." Many insist they enter the field for the few dollars involved: "That is what I told myself," remembers an ex-star turned photographer. "It was a heady experience seeing my pictures plastered where ever I went, but I still told myself



I was doing it for the money.

"Now that I have a stable of young bucks and my personal posing days are over, I realize the money was the least of it."

Gay or Straight?

Not all models are gay or even available, but the majority have some experience. In this they are but little different from the 37% of males generally who have at least one homosexual experience to the point of orgasm during their lifetimes.

Whether the photographers have the models sexually or not is as much a matter of circumstances as it is in all of life. Womack has grumbled: "People begin physique photography as it is an easy way to get trade," but this does not seem to be a necessary rule. More realistically, Neil Edwards holds that confusing "personal involvement" with what can most productively be a professional relationship is an almost certain way to alienate a valuable model.

The Top

An ultimate rise to success as a model or photographer has little to do

with such considerations. The men who make it to the top do so because they are good and good in this context must ultimately mean skillfully combining the two intangibles of sexual provocation and artistic integrity.

Some top models have gained immense followings and have used modeling as a stepping stone. The success these men have had in other fields seems to depreciate the almost paranoid notion held by some that so posing must beget instant destruction.

Bob Hover and Jim Stryker are everywhere to be seen in male fashion advertising (Hover as one of the highest paid models in the world and Stryker recently presented in a 20 page *Gentlemen's Quarterly* spread); Glenn Bishop, another of the most popular stars, now practices chiropractic in Michigan.

Besides the obvious exceptions, models are from lower socio-economic levels. Men from this stratum are not only more readily available, but are taken to be more masculine. In our society, intellectuality and sophistication have feminine associations that mitigate against pure physical attractiveness.

"Dirty" vs. "Clean"

To ask that all physique photographers have genius and all models Grecian builds is as unreasonable as being willing to accept total lack of form, composition, and technique. Cleanliness in matters sexual has little relationship to the subject depicted for there is nothing inherently "dirty" about sexually stimulating photographs of two persons enjoying sodomy, fellatio mutual masturbation or any other act.

Currently distributed pictures of tumescent boys and men are not "dirty" because of the tumescence, but because of the apparent view that this delightful state is the *only* point of importance. In operating, as we do, from the position that sexual stimulation is a valuable force, we ask not that it be channeled into what the hard core puritans might term "productive" endeavors, but that it be treated as worthwhile and not as semi-clandestine and shameful.

Obviously, if given a choice between non-sexual art and non artistic sex, only a unique few would elect the former. But crude photographic technique is not vital for sexual arousal.

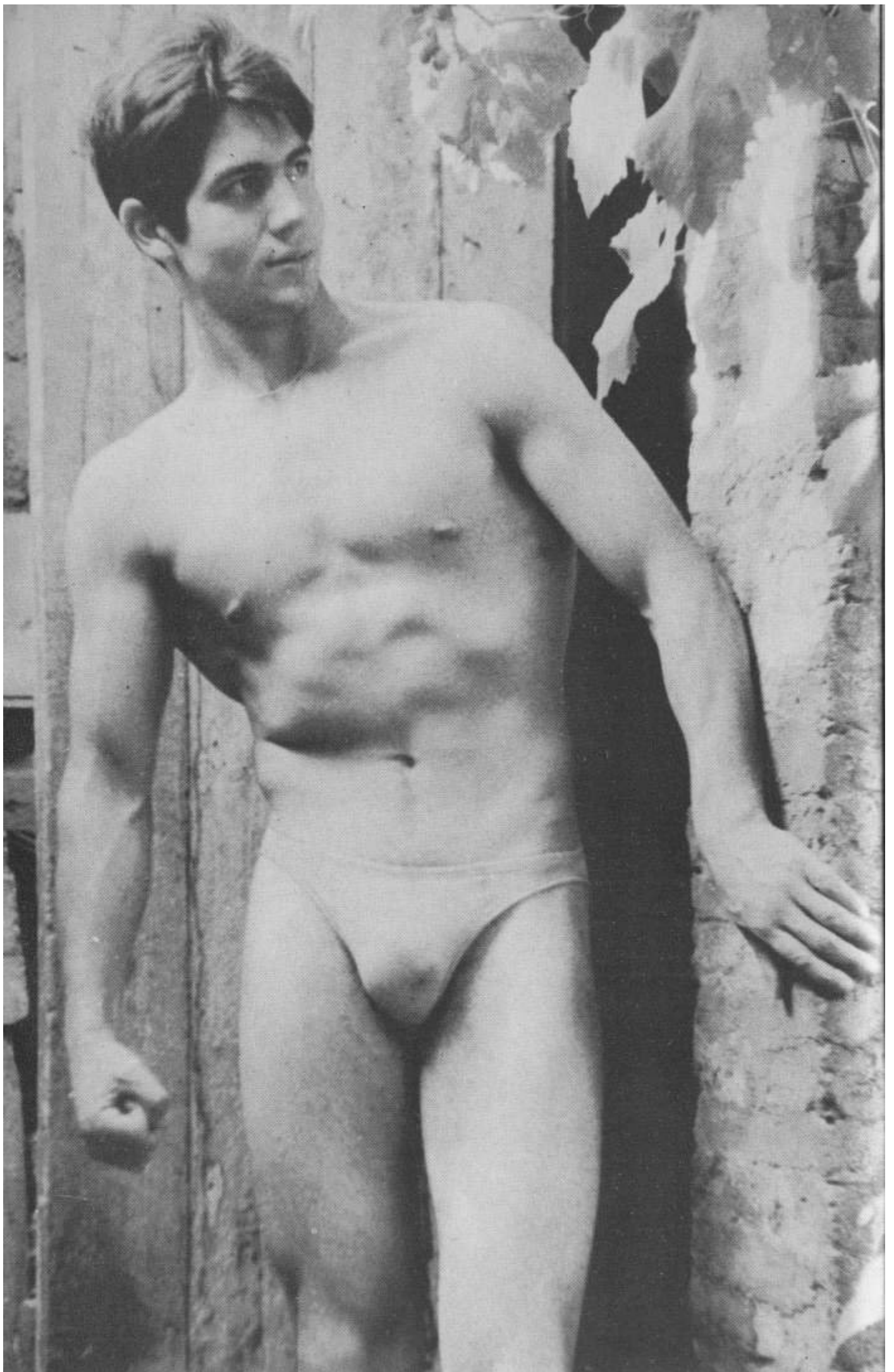
Future's Meaning

Regardless of temporary local set backs, the future will see wider and wider circulation of all sexual publications in line with the current trend. Even today there are few towns in which at least one physique book is not available and a surprising number of rural and metropolitan areas feature nudist magazines.

This spreading distribution assumes importance well beyond the value of the visual and masturbatory benefits to the reader: the free sale and display of literature designed for homosexual pleasure serves to improve the well-being of the community through the promotion of happier citizens in addition to heralding the emergence of less repressive societal attitudes, affecting both heterosexuals and homosexuals.

THE TORTURED SEX, John S. Yankowski and Hermann K. Wolff
Hollway House, Los Angeles,
1965, 95¢.

This paperback is a sleeper!

It offers erotica galore: "I looked to his crotch and saw the shape of his penis bulging against his trousers. As I reached down and unzipped his fly, the penis began to stiffen. I was astounded. It extended up beyond his navel. I took it in my hand and he told me to move it up and down. I did, and he ejaculated.

"That was the first time in my life I realized the penis was used for something besides urination."

History galore: The Greeks: "The youthful bloom of the 12 year old gives me great joy, yet I would not partake; much more desirable is the boy of 13. He whose years are 14 is fair game and a very sweet flower of love; he of 15 is sweeter still, and fortunate indeed is the man who possesses him. The sixteenth year is that of the gods; the seventeenth year is not of any god, but of Zeus himself."

Caesar's Husbands

The Romans: "Julius Caesar was termed: 'The husband to every wife and the wife to every husband.'

Besides the fun and games, *Tortured* is crammed with delightful bits of information seldom found in print and never before assembled in one so readable volume.

As with so many lesser books, case histories are used as fo-

cal points for both sociologic and psychologic discussions.

Jackie, the actor, falls for a so-called homosexula "cure" until the "old ghost" returns and he chooses suicide; Eddie, the bi-sexual who seems to find out that the best of two worlds isn't so bad; and Charles, the drag queen who finds that "water seeks its own level" appear, at first glance, to be the run of the mill folk generally peopling such reports, but the authors are able to bring them alive and avoid the maudlin.

Preaching Avoided

The writers patiently withhold their statement against homosexual persecution until the last line when they put it hard and well. Warning that condemnation of homosexual behavior is: "of itself deserving of condemnation, for it is an offense not against the homosexually disposed but against logic itself," they let it go at that and avoid the pro-homosexual preaching that dulls the sophisticated reader to sleep.

This is no faultless book and, like the girl with the curl, when they err, they make it horrid. The authors construct a sexual incidence profile for what they term: "the 'typical' queen, meaning semi-transvestite. With no apparent support and less logic, they discover that these femmes have 9.2 homosexual acts to orgasm per week with 2.3 partners. Translation: *four* orgasms per sexual contact!

In truth, for a variety of

reasons that are irrelevant to this discussion, "queens" have considerably fewer sexual contacts than homosexuals generally. Accepting the false premise that queens have this much sex, it would net them 1.2 orgasms (other than masturbatory) weekly, over 75% fewer than the tortured statistics.

Apart from this regrettable error, *The Tortured Sex* offers a rare combination of thought and sexual provocation.

Sex Offenders, Paul H. Gebhard, John H. Gagnon, Wardell B. Pomeroy and Cornelia V. Christenson, Harper & Row, New York, 1965, \$12.50.

Amid an avalanche of press coverage echoed by a storm of complaints by followers and detractors alike, the newest "Kinsey report" was released in June.

The mammoth (923 pages) tome will be reviewed in a subsequent issue.

Crimes Without Victims: Deviant Behavior and Public Policy; Abortion, Homosexuality, Drug Addiction, Edwin Schur, Prentice Hall, 1965, \$4.95.

Schur examines the interrelationship between deviant behavior and public policy. He uses the "crimes" of abortion, homosexuality and drug addiction as examples of this interaction, pointing out in the preface: "the relation between policy and problem is reciprocal. A specific policy may cause new problems, or make existing ones worse."

He explores the creation of deviants, deviance as a process, the criminalization of deviants, various hidden functions and the role of sociolo-

gists *visa vie* the law. Defining deviance as "behavior that people so lable."

Enforcement of the law in these "crimes" is exceptionally difficult and: "The attempt to control, by criminal law, the willing exchange of socially disapproved but widely demanded goods or services, seems particularly likely to create secondary deviants and to set the stage for police corruption and demoralization!"

Schur quotes on lesbians: "The male ego does not wish to recognize that women could possibly secure sexual satisfaction without the participation of the opposite sex. The tendency of judges not to prosecute female homosexuals, perhaps, is an unconscious expression of denying its existence."

He quotes another view to wit society generally evaluates maleness more positively than femaleness hence the man who acts effeminate exhibits "weakness," whereas the woman who acts in a masculine manner in a sense, shows "strength."

On race: "Many white homosexuals who will not accept Negroes socially are 'quite democratic in bed,' That such behavior implies equal acceptance of the Negro is anything but clear. A Negro exploits his homosexuality for social advantage he could not otherwise maintain; and the white homosexual exploits the Negro's low social status for sexual advantage."

In pointing out the problems involved in these three victimless crimes, Schur leaves the reader with a very distinct impression that all are due for major revision.

(Continued from page 7) *sodomy be reduced from a felony to a misdemeanor. If the Legislature adopts the new law which reduces the possible penalties from \$5,000 and/or 10 years to one to five years in jail, Polak predicted a larger percentage of persons now released because the current law appears to be abusive will, under the "improved" program, be incarcerated. "If our objective be to keep people out of jail, this new recommendation defeats that purpose," Polak mused.*

The PBA further recommended in accordance with the American Law Institute's Model Penal Code that "Loitering to solicit" become a crime.

"Anti-solicitation laws," argued Polak, "are the pseudo-liberal's way of moralistically appearing to 'love the homosexual sinner' while 'hating the homosexual sin'. It is a projection of the view that homosexuals are acceptable as long as they pretend they are heterosexuals or remain celibate."

Philadelphia: The Janus Society of America's executive board voted unanimously to explore the possibility of including frontal nude photographs within all subscription and membership copies of DRUM Magazine.

A poll was directed to be taken of present subscribers and members for an expression of opinion on such a move and JSA lawyers have been requested to investigate the legal questions involved.

Act of Congress impeding the delivery of foreign Communist publications on the ground it violated the First Amendment right of free speech.

In 1961, the government discontinued its 13 year censorship of such mail. "It served no useful intelligence function," said President Kennedy. Congress, however, passed a law requiring the Post Office to hold all incoming "Communist political propaganda" for 20 days, then destroy it unless the addressee returned a card saying he wanted it.

By quitting this phase of the censorship business, the deficit ridden Post Office can now save \$250,000 per year.

Under a program adopted quietly by the Civil Service Commission, disability retirement is now allowed to homosexuals and alcoholics who evidence symptoms of "underlying emotional illness." Retirements will still be refused to those whose illnesses are the result of their alcoholism or homosexuality.

The longtime Government policy to fire overt homosexuals remains unchanged and it is likely that persons known as such would be ousted before they could be retired.

For many years the CSC refused to consider these persons for disability retirement and it was also difficult to get the Commission's approval to retire mentally ill personnel.

Several homosexuals have already taken advantage of the new, more liberal provision.

WASHINGTON

The Supreme Court voided an

New Supreme Court Justice Abe Fortas was the man Walter

Jenkins called first upon being informed that his arrest on a morals charge was about to be made public. (DRUM, Dec.)

TORONTO

A woman pleaded guilty to charge of assaulting her husband after finding him "engaged in an improper act" with another man in bed.

The homosexual act was not described to the court, only that some "impropriety" had taken place between the two males.

The woman was let go on a suspended sentence because of the "extreme provocation" involved.

LONDON

Concern that male brothels might be set up in Soho as a result of passage of any bill legalizing adult homosexual acts has occupied the House of Lords. The Earl of Arran, the sponsor of the original and successful motion to legalize such acts, also sponsored an amendment to the current laws regulating brothels. Said the Lord: "It would be quite intolerable if male brothels, if such things ever were to exist were not subject to the same kind of law as female brothels. The purpose (of his proposal) is to strike four-square at the pimp."

The discussion was held when the Committee stage of the new *Sexual Offences Bill* was resumed.

A suburban London factory features a corridor in which a door marked "Experimental" sets between the ones labeled "Ladies" and "Gentlemen."

TALLAHASSEE

The so-called "Johns Committee," author of the Florida

Purple report on homosexuality that was banned as obscene has been disbanded after a decade of probing.

Nobody in the Legislature suggested that it continue.

PARIS

The French version of Helene Curtis' hair spray is called *Go Gay*.

COLUMBUS, IND.

Eight Job Corpsmen were charged with sodomy after an attack on a 17 year old fellow corpsman.

Testifying before a Senate sub - committee, anti -poverty chief Sergeant Shriver announced that 23% of all dismissals from the Job Corps were for "psychological" reasons, including: "Active homosexual, drug addiction, acts of violence, etc."

SPOLETO, ITALY

In response to charges that his musical *Festival of Two Worlds* had a reputation as a "haven for homosexuals," Gian Carlo Menotti staunchly asserted: "God forbid that we should look into the sexual habits of the participants of an artistic organization. I refuse to test the healthiness of my festival with a moral thermometer."

CALIFORNIA

Sacramento: The Assembly passed a bill stating that sexual intercourse for money among persons of the same sex was an act of prostitution and subject to penalties.

San Francisco: *The Chukker* was ordered closed by the Department of Health and Health Inspector John Reed called it a "filthy place."

Although this closing was

one of eight called for sanitation reasons, the coffee and soft drink shop's owner complained the act was taken in view of the fact that the establishment was frequented by homosexuals.

Hollywood: Last year's drive of county authorities against alleged obscene publications received its final blow when Superior Judge Joseph Sprankle dismissed the charges against eight paper back books.

The dismissal saved the County up to \$60,000 and the defendants even more.

NEW YORK

Island Park, L.I.: The *Magic Touch* bar was closed in a 2 AM raid and policemen burst into the backroom where dancing was permitted to find 200 persons sitting at tables or dancing, "boy with boy, girl with girl."

Norman J. Levy, chief of the rackets bureau, led the raid and later described the bar as "a cesspool of depravity."

The *Magic Touch* was reportedly under the control of the Cosa Nostra and, according to the *New York News*: "The DA first got wind of rackets-controlled queer joints last October when Nassau cops tipped him that fires of suspicious origin destroyed the *Trade Winds* and the *Flame*, Oceanside cocktail lounges.

The *News* further reports that in September, after the *Trade Winds* owners had opened the *Flame*, an attempt was made by rackets bosses to "straighten out gangland territories for queer bars."

The *Flame* burned on Oct. 5, and the *Trade Winds* on June 19 thus ending the peace attempt.

New York City: Shopkeepers in the vicinity of Sixth Ave-

nue and Eighth Street have complained that an increase of aggressive male and female homosexuals has caused them loss of business, especially between the evening hours of 6 to 10.

John V. Lindsay, independent Republican candidate for Mayor is reported to be one of the most liberal and sympathetic politicians seeking public office today. His record as a member of the House of Representatives indicates consistent stands favorable to the homophile movement and other minority group positions.

"It is unwise to make a public statement to this effect," warned a local homophile leader, "but homosexuals and those appreciative of their cause should spread the word."

During the trial of two men on 65 counts of mailing obscene material and conspiring to do so, the jury had been given samples of the booklets in question and asked if they would want their children to "read such stuff."

Their subsequent conviction was overthrown in the U.S. Court of Appeals on the ground that material cannot be judged legally obscene on the basis of a parent's view of the literature as possible reading matter for their children.

"The courts may have opened the floodgates for horror and filth," cautioned Judge Leonard P. Moore, "but if they are to be closed it should be done by the careful drafting of proper laws by our duly elected representatives and not by a combination of zealous governmental inspectors, prosecutors and uninformed juries."

If you are really in the bar to meet new faces, all of your errors can be summed up in a single phrase--lack of aggression. Two reticent people are just not going to meet. One of them is going to have to come forward, to smile, and start the ball rolling.

You may also be aggressive in a quieter way--by being obviously available for new acquaintances. You must appear pleasant, smile, look at people directly, put them at ease. With these gestures you will find them ready to engage con-

versation with you.

But whether you engage people actively by starting conversations or by simply making it easier for them to start one with you, you must be definite, make clear efforts to show others you are interested in them. Standing on the side with a blank expression on your face will get you nowhere.

Treat a stranger as though he's an established friend from the outset and you will pave the way for him to be friendly.

A rule for shy souls is once you have a little practice meeting people, meeting them will become an easy and natural thing for you. The simple act of introducing yourself once or a few times will make you less shy.

The decision not to make the aggressive gesture will make you more shy. The principle operates like a rolling snowball: any action you take makes that action seem more natural and easier.

Incidentally, one of the mainsprings of shyness is the concern that others aren't going to like you. Such a belief is almost never true if you are interested in others, but it may hold you back and the act of holding back will make you feel even more below par.

Change your luck in and out of the bars. You can meet about as many new people as you want. Just be friendly to them.

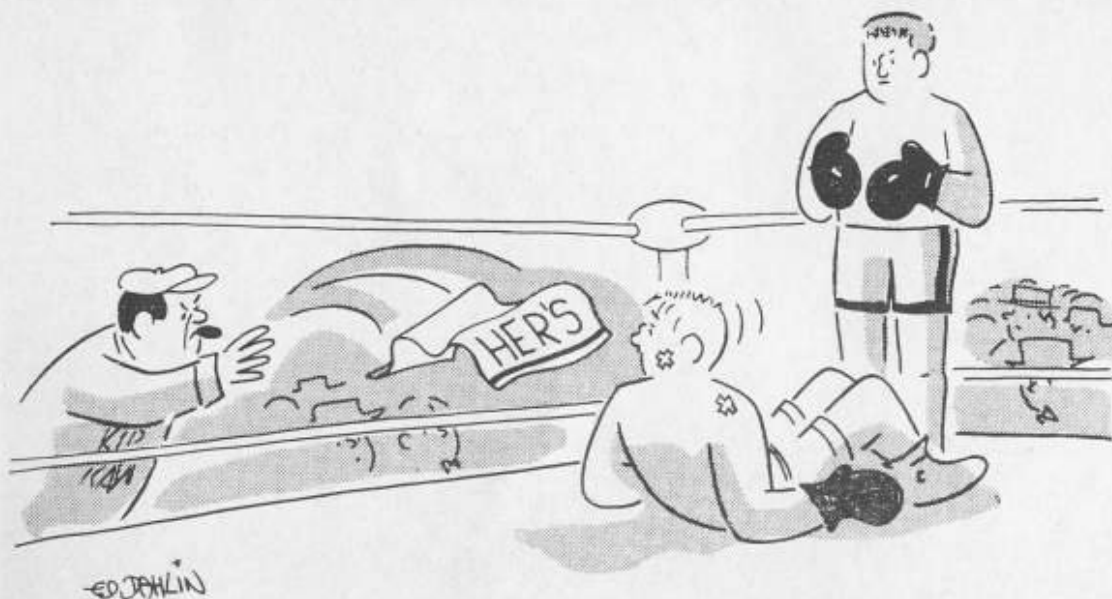
The very next homo-infested issue has *Batman* (alias Bruce Wayne) with his *hand on Robin, the Boy Wonder's Shoulder!*

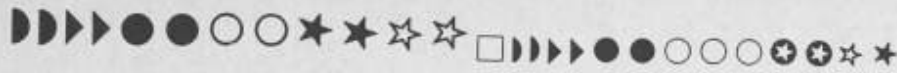

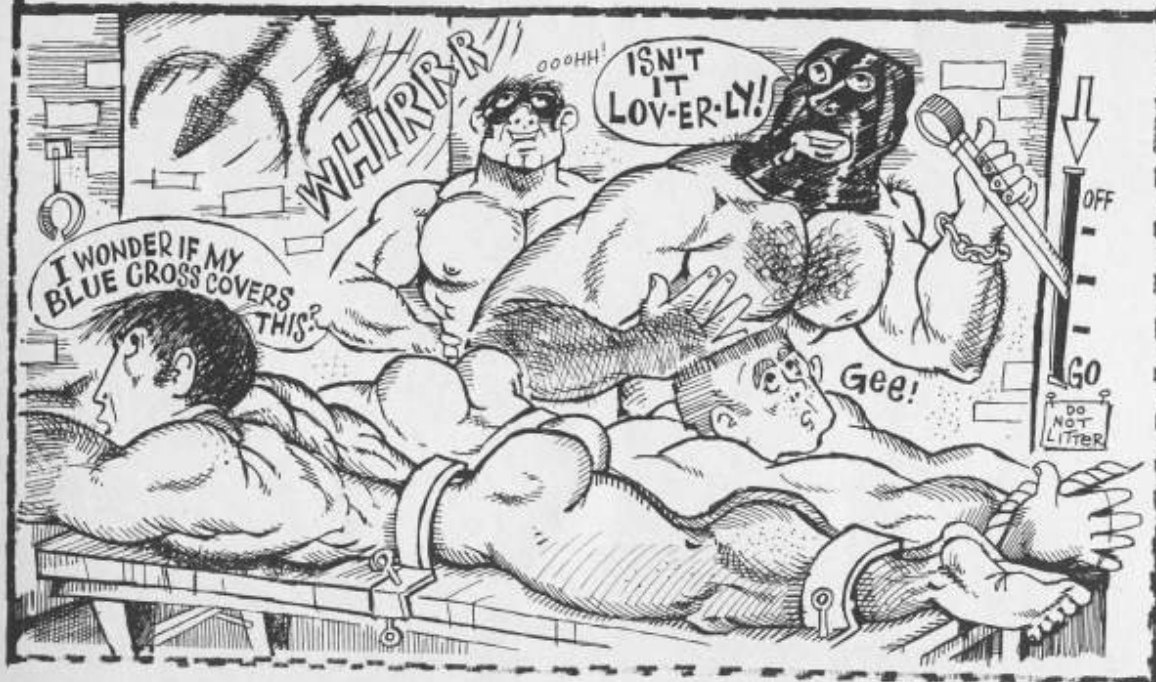

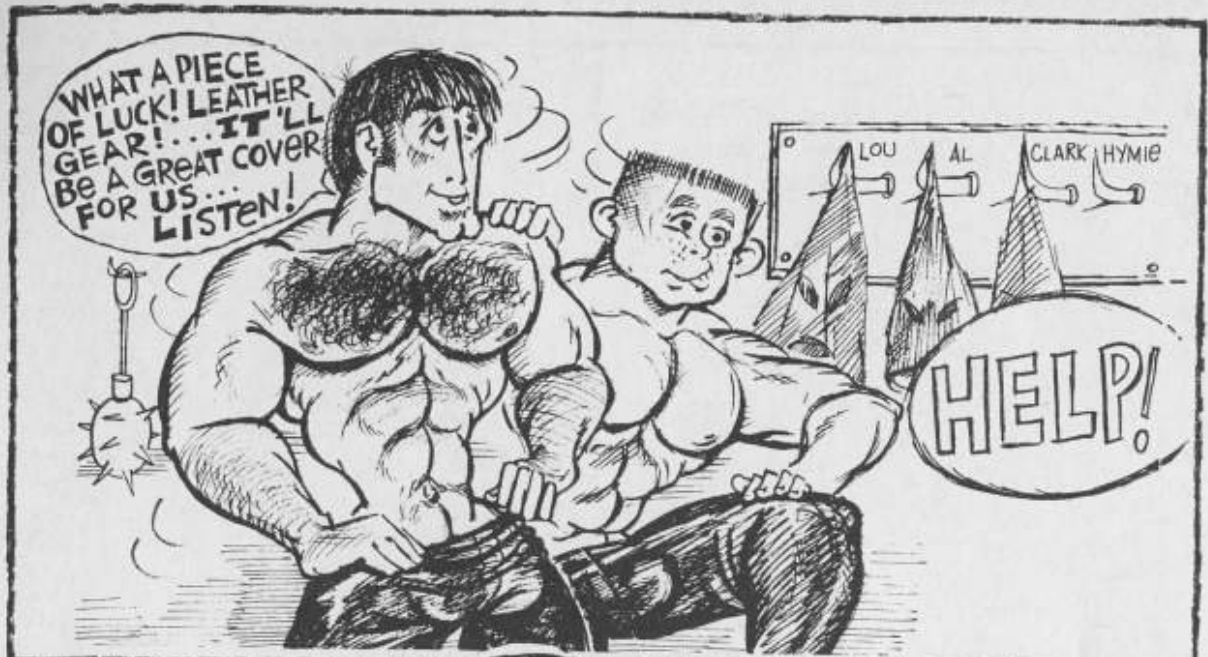
