#### NEW COUNSELING CENTER DIRECTOR

HOUSTON - Kenneth Vance has been appointed to the position of administrative director of the Montrose Counseling Center, TWT NEWS has learned from Marion Coleman, board of director's chairperson.

An extensive search had been conducted to find a new director to lead the center in expanding its activities in the community, Coleman explained. That search took the board of directors to New Mexico, where the center found Vance, then program manager for the State Department of Health and Environment, an impressive position.

When asked by TWT NEWS of his primary goals, Vance zeroed in on providing "a full time staff of mental health professionals to serve the needs of the gay, lesbian and bisexual community of Houston.

"I would like to see us in a position of removing the stigma of mental health services," Vance explained.

Another goal of the center is not to be another full service clinic, but rather to be a community oriented agency addessing the needs of the community which it was originally organized to serve.

#### **AUSTIN MORE** LIBERAL THAN NYC

NEW YORK - There are many ways in which New York City is unlike Austin, Texas. Although New York is bigger, Austin is more liberal.

Whereas the citizens of Austin voted last year to defeat an anti-gay housing ordinance. New York last week defeated a gay rights bill.

The defeat for one million homosexuals in the country's largest city came after a tumultuous 15-hour hearing where 202 people spoke for or against the legislation. In the end, the General Welfare committee voted 6-3 to kill the

About fifty cities, including Austin, and one state, Wisconsin, have passed gay rights legislation. TWT NEWS observed.

#### THRE MONITORS **GAY DONORS**

HOUSTON - The Texas Human Rights Foundation (THRF) has announced to TWT NEWS that it is participating in a national program to monitor policies restricting blood donations by gays.

A temporary restriction on gay donors of blood was placed on several Houston plasma centers last December, In January, Dallas buckled under pressure from the Center for Disease Control. And, just last month, Austin followed suit.

The crackdown came after an infant in San Francisco contracted AIDS through a blood transfusion from blood donated by a man who later died of AIDS, TWT NEWS recalled.

demic among gays of Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS).

The group, known as Dallas Doctors Against AIDS, is a non-profit group of fifteen members. A local dentist, Keith Thornton, is president, while a Richardson internist, Klem Mueller, is vicepresident and Dallas lawyer Don Campbell is secretary/treasurer.

That group has filed a motion with the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals asking to be allowed to provide evidence that ties AIDS to sexual relations between men.

They have also asked to join in the State's appeal of 21.06, feeling that the legalization of sodomy in Texas would "possibly affect the rest of society (non-gay) such as in the case of blood transfusions," Mueller told the Dallas Morning News. He added, "I'm not the expert."

Don Baker, plaintiff in 21.06, expertly responded that "these people are confusing civil rights with this disease."

"The motion is outrageous, absurd and ridiculous," Jim Barber, Baker's attorney, explained.

Baker noted, "It's ludicrous that you ought to criminalize the conduct of half a million people (gays) in Texas to prevent a few from getting a disease. If that were legitimate, we would have to ban all intimate contact between people just because they might get a disease," he concluded.

Barber's courtroom stragegy includes filing affidavits from medical experts in rebuttal of the assumption of the group of professionals.

Meanwhile, Jim Mattox, the new Attorney General, has yet to decide whether he will pursue the case. A brief will be due on March 14, TWT NEWS learned.

#### AMARILLO GAY HEALTH SEMINAR

AMARILLO — Androgyny, in cooperation with the Don and Sybil Harrington Cancer Center, presented a gay health seminar on AIDS last Tuesday, March 1 at the Unitarian Fellowship.

Speaker for the evening was Dr. Phillip Periman, medical director for the center. Among the topics covered were Kaposi's Sarcoma, AIDS, herpes, hepatitis and veneral diseases.

The seminar marked the beginning of an intensified effort between health care facilities and the Amarillo gay community resulting, hopefully, in better health care being provided for gays.

"Currently, very few doctors here understand our needs," Robert Schroeder told TWT NEWS. "In return, gays are very reluctant to open up to their physicians."

## AIDS FORUM PACKS SHERATON

HOUSTON — The response to and attendance at the AIDS Forum held at the Sheraton Hotel in downtown Houston on February 22 was much more than expected, as over 700 gathered to hear Dr. Peter Mansell update the latest data on Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS).

"We don't know the causes of AIDS,"
Dr. Mansell, associate director of M.D.
Anderson Hospital's Department of
Cancer Prevention, said at the outset.
"It's difficult to keep up with all the
rapid changes.

"We don't know if AIDS is contagious, but we do know that there is a 45% mortality rate," he explained.

"Although we don't know exactly what causes AIDS, we do know that





those who have it are susceptible to cancers, malignancies or opportunistic infections such as pneumonias, herpes and fungus diseases," he continued.

A chart graphically showed that it has affected 65% gays, 9% bisexual, 16% heterosexual and 6% female. What began as mostly a gay disease has now spread with ripples to other groups. In fact, the gay percentage is dropping.

About 100 cases of AIDS have been diagnosed in Texas. Of the cases at M.D. Anderson Hospital, 10% involved Kaposi's Sarcoma and 25% involved opportunistic infections.

In a question and answer follow-up, Dr. Mansell stated, "There is some evidence to suggest AIDS is transmissible from one person to another in human blood, but it is not hard and fast.

"We know that marijuana has an adverse effect on one's immunity system and we know that those who have had sexually transmitted diseases are more susceptible," he explained.

He also answered a question about semen. "There's proof that if you inject semen intravenously into your system, your immunity system is damaged," Dr. Mansell stated. A member of the audience disagreed by responding, "But people have been injecting semen for centuries without getting AIDS."

In response to a question as to what can be done to recharge one's immunity system back to normal, Dr. Mansell noted that there are some drugs which can help and which have the capability. Some are experimental and are being used under a critically controlled environment.

"There are skin tests and blood tests one can take, but they are expensive," he added.

When asked by TWT NEWS about the latest theory that AIDS might be caused by a virus, Dr. Guy Newell stated, "If it turns out to be caused by an infectious agent, the chances are it's going to be a virus."

The forum was sponsored by CHE and KSC and televised by KHOU-TV, Houston's CBS affiliate.

## THE GREAT DENTON DEBATE

DENTON, Texas — Resolved: That Homosexual Practice is consistent with a Christian Lifestyle. That was the topic of a major debate hosted by the North Texas State University Philosophy Department last Saturday night, February 26.

Affirming was Dr. Ralph Blair, founder of Evangelical's Concerned of New York. Denying was Evangelist Dan Billingsley of the University Church of Christ in Denton.

Over 1,000 attended, with half being gay. Many came by bus from Dallas and Fort Worth. Even members of Houston's A Capella Chorus made the pilgrimage. "Twice as many attended as expected," David Henderson of TWT NEWS in Denton reported.

The debate centered around scriptures commonly used to renounce gays and the Church of Christ's (mis)use of them.

Blair asserted that homosexuality as we know it today is never mentioned in the Bible and "Church of Christ members should not speak of what the Bible is silent on but keep mouths shut."


Blair further contended that the 27 citings of Sodom referred to pride and inhospitality, never to homosexuality.

Church of Christ members have developed opinions on homosexuality from other areas of society and abused scriptures to substantiate their views, Blair also stated.

Billingsley strongly disagreed in a typical "hellfire and brimstone" stance. He said love doesn't cover all by citing "a father engaging in sex with his 15-year-old son out of love."

"No homosexual will inherit the Kingdom of God," he said, and advised gays to "take a cold shower" for salvation.

After the debate, which was televised by PBS, gays regained their composure with a campus reception hosted by TGLTF and GLAD, followed by a party at TJ's, Denton's only gay bar, Henderson reported.

#### NOT GUILTY CASE DISMISSED

HOUSTON — When you are arrested and you know you are innocent, it pays to fight the case in court. Just ask John Pegram, manager of the Midnite Sun. When he and several other people were arrested in January at the Chicken Coop, he got a lawyer and demanded a trial by jury.

"I was arrested before I had even ordered my first drink," Pegram explained. Being sober and innocent of the charge of "public intoxication," Pegram

pleaded not quilty.

On February 24, Pegram appeared in City Court 3 with his lawyer, but "the seven officers involved who were subpoenaed to appear as witnesses never showed for the 8:00am trial," Pegram expounded. The case was dismissed and Pegram was returned his bond money.

Chicken Coop manager, Jerry Jones, and bartender, Roxie Starr, are also fighting their charges, with a court date set for late March. Most likely, they too, will win.

#### SAGA ELECTS NEW BOARD

SAN ANTONIO — The San Antonio Gay Alliance (SAGA) has announced new nominees to the board of directors as unanimously elected at the February 7 meeting at Sunset Boulevard.

The eight new members are Larry Cooper, Claire Vinck, Toby Johnson, Franklin Rains, Jennifer Emms, Dub Dougherty, Rudy Gonzales and Lynn Joyce.

The newly-elected join four current members, David Mitchell, Nancy Hauser, Barbara Havard and John Stewart.

SAGA has signed on to sponsor three plays from New York whose repertoire is exclusively gay. My Blue Heaven is the opener on March 28. If This Isn't Love follows the next night and A Perfect Relationship concludes on March 30. All three are to be held in

the Bonham Ballroom, Vinck, also of Community Productions, informed TWT NEWS.

By supporting the plays, you'll support SAGA, which receives 10% on all ticket sales, TWT NEWS learned.

#### GAY ALAMO VOTE TO HAVE CLOUT

SAN ANTONIO — At last, Texas' second largest city has a viable gay political caucus. A group of this city's gay citizens has formed a non-partisan organization for political action to be called the Alamo Human Rights Committee (AHRC). A goal of the group will be to increase policital awareness and activity among the city's gay community.

Projected activities include voter registration, candidate screening and fundraising for the campaigns of those who support gay rights. The impetus for becoming active at this time is the San Antonio City Council elections to be held April 2. TWT NEWS learned.

In a voter registration drive held in the fall of 1982, no more than 16% of those registered had addresses within the same city area. Since there are no neighborhoods in San Antonio where gays constitute a major portion of the population, a gay bloc vote, should there be one, would be difficult to document.

AHRC feels that fundraising and political contributions may be the most effective way to exercise gay political clout in San Antonio and Bexar County. The group's first fundraiser is tentatively scheduled for the weekend of March 12-13.

With the formation of AHRC, San Antonio becomes the last large gay community of Texas to endorse sympathetic candidates. The circle comprised of Houston, Dallas, Ft. Worth and Austin is now encompassing San Antonio.

Gay voters in San Antonio will no longer have to go the polls—as they did last November—without knowing for whom to vote. TWT NEWS enthusiastically welcomes AHRC. W

Adonis Garcia, by Luis Zapata; 208 pp.; Gay Sunshine Press, P.O. Box 40397, San Francisco 94140; softcover, \$7.95.


I looked up the word "picaresque" in the dictionary, unfamiliar to me as it was, and discovered these definitions:

1) of or dealing with sharp-witted vagabonds and their roguish adventures. 2) designating a style of fiction originating in Spain and having a roguish hero. In this case, our roguish hero is Adonis Garcia, an intelligent, free-spirited hustler in central Mexico City, presented to us in an intriguing format by Luis Zapata, one of the first authors from Mexico to have a novel reviewed here.

The format is as interesting as the content that fits into it. To preserve a colloquial, informal and intimate dis-

tance with the reader, Adonis always speaks in the first person, all of the novel is written in lower case and, instead of punctuation, spaces of various lengths set off his sentences, phrases and interjections. Though it is at first strange, the reader will get used to it quickly and will find it approximates more accurately in the reader's mind the directness and conversational quality of Adonis' speech.

Each chapter is named Tape 1, Tape 2, Tape 3, etc., showing us that Adonis is giving an interview about his life. Other first person accounts from hustlers in fiction form come to mind—Phil Andros and John Rechy's antihero. But Adonis is not embittered or left cynical by his experiences. He is positive, upbeat, off-beat and has a sense of humor that informs as well as



entertains. Zapata reminds us that it is an interview through Adonis' various references to the recorder, when they will stop for a break and so on.

Adonis has a liberated view of people he deals with. He takes them as they come, and is realistic about himself and his future. His education is his major strength, as is his street-wise attitude. He is not afraid of love, but is aware of its dangers to his "no attachments" code that allows him to continue his trade.

He shares his life and an apartment with those who wish to remain his friends, and some who each think they are his lover. Everyone else but him is a transitory figure in any case, never developed as characters to any great degree. But this is mainly due to the nature of the novel; Adonis is telling us about his life, giving his thoughts directly to the reader/interviewer. For this same reason, the plot is connected only by the continuity of Adonis' thoughts and memories, as he reveals to us his experiences.

One more quick note about the format concerns the chapters' beginnings. Each contains a dream sequence; sometimes it is an actual dream, at times a daydream, other times the reader is not told how it fits into Adonis' psyche. Also at the beginning of each chapter is a quote from a Mex-

ican or Latin author that Zapata uses to foreshadow what comes in the chapter. They are often philosophical or religious, demonstrating the range and sophistication of thought and education of modern-day authors in the Latin American countries.

The many references to people and places popular or well-known in Mexican culture and the capitol city itself open up a new world of information about our nearest neighbor nation for those who want to know more or want to go back to visit. What we learn about the culture helps us to understand our own, and we see the similarities to our own culture.

Luis Zapata was born in 1951, has a degree in medieval French literature and teaches at the National University of Mexico (D.F.). He has written one other novel previously, and his current one was published first in Mexico as El Vampiro de la Colonia Roma, in 1979. The prizes and honorable mention this most radical contemporary Mexican novelist has received there qualify him to be read and appreciated here in the United States, and aids a great deal to the civil rights struggles everywhere, but also now in Mexico when it needs it the most.

Adonis Garcia is entertaining, different and illuminating, a book not to be passed up.



## TABLE FOR FIVE

TWO-HOUR LOVE BOAT

He played a male hustler in Midnight Cowboy, a crippled vet in Coming Home, a boxer battling over the custody of Ricky Schroder in The Champ, and now Jon Voight plays co-producer for a bittersweet seafaring drama intended to entice the whole family. Mr. Voight stars as a divorced husband and long-distance father of three kids whom he invites on a dream cruise from New York to downtown Cairo. His ex-wife and her new man, who's long been accepted as ersatz dad, are both surprised and somewhat concerned over the extravagant excursion Voight has planned for the children, mainly because he has never been considered a candidate for Daddy of the Month, but partly be-

cause there seems to be the distinct chance for a war at sea.

Soon after the wonderful voyage has begun, we see some of the expected rifts and run-ins; however, they are overcome a little bit faster than is good for the picture. The dinner table on board, over which Mr. Voight presides, sports an extra chair. The reason, much to the kids' chagrin, is that dad has the specific strategy to fish for a date or more in the boat's cruisy atmosphere. Consequently, it should not come as a surprise to the viewer if at times you feel that you made the regrettable mistake of having tuned in to the Love Boat. The light comedy suddenly turns dramatic when Voight gets the mes-

sage that his ex has expired in an accident. How do I tell my children, is the sad task he faces and winds up delaying for days.

First time feature director Robert Lieberman unscrupulously uses the Mediterranean postcard scenery as backdrop whenever possible, and some of the takes look more than a tad choreographed. Much of the talking is done inside the Colosseum, in front of the Acropolis or Egypt's Sphinx or next to other touristy hotspots. If you're aware of the fact that screenwriter David Seltzer has written other films with a BYOKrating (Bring Your Own Kleenex) such as The Other Side of the Mountain and Six Weeks, you're bound to expect something similar in this case, and you won't be disappointed. A few of the scenes are tearjerkers without shame. but there are also passionate, touching moments. The children are not overly cute, yet lovably lifelike and, refreshingly, for the most part they do not talk like "mini adults." Roxana Zal, age 13, and Son Hoang Bui, 15, as the adopted Filipino son have fine screen debuts; the midget showstealer, however, is Robby Kiger, 9, as Truman, the encorethird-grader who half-heartedly battles a learning disability. Marie-Christine Barrault is well cast as the possible occupant of the fifth chair at the table; she manages to avoid being seen as only an object in the game-playing world aboard the cruiseship. Richard Crenna is excellent as the children's stepfather. Jon Voight is quite credible in his bid to win the younsters' hearts; he also seems out to gain the viewers' sympathy at the same time. Mr. Voight can certainly not be accused of understating his plight as a frustrated father.

Table For Five is not a bad film. It does, however, live largely under the pretense that the world is a postcard. The movie's loose ends are tied up with too little complication.

Yilmaz Guney's Yol, an extraordinary piece of work, can be viewed at once as a piece of art, a political tract and an ultimately dark portrait of human existence, but never as a simple indictment of a governmental regime or group of people. The film (the title of which translates roughly as The Way was directed by Serif Goren from sketches made by Guney in a Turkish prison. A national idol, Guney has been

Cannes Festival. In an interview, Guney relates how he created the film: "The scenario that was submitted to the censor was shorter than the real scenario. Indeed, there are things in the film which were never in the scenario, and which I was able, as I had planned, to create out of the editing process." But the Turkish authorities had the last word, however: Yol cannot be shown in Guney's homeland.

active as an actor, director, writer, political dissident and, it seems, as a convicted murderer. A member of Turkey's intellectual left, Guney was convicted in 1974 for the murder of a right-wing judge. In prison, he smuggled parts of his scenario out so that an associate, Goren, could do the actual filming. Guney escaped in 1981, and his picture received the Palme D'or-along with Missing-as the Best Film at the 1982

All (TARIK AKAN), Zine (SERIF SEZER) attempts to fight off

On one level. Yol is concerned with a group of prisoners, out on temporary leave from an island goal to settle debts with family members and enemies. Yet on a deeper level, the film deals with a country whose unspoken social restrictions mirror, and indeed help create, political restrictions of a most obvious kind. As a piece of propaganda, the film burns with a raw, defiant passion, and Guney moves a viewer through editing and at times melodramatic emotional content in his images. The photography by Erdogan Engin retains an editorial feeling throughout, and Guney distances himself from his characters to further enhance his conception. Yol works, however, as a piece of art because Guney is a reactionary with poetic vision. He condemns both Turkish society and government from his deep-rooted love of the country; the bleakly repressive order, where women have no control over their lives, where adultery is punished by imprisonment or death, and citizens are more than willing to follow the restrictions of the social and religious orders but are angered at the "repressive" political forces at work, are presented unflinchingly by Guney. Some audience members may find the treatment of women a force which invalidates the whole film. In particular, the scenes with Tarik Akan and Serif Sezer as husband and wife-an adulteress who by law must be killed-are especially ironic and brutal, more so by the fact that Turkish men can never be condemned for such an action. Yet I think Guney wants us to be shocked at the patriarchal society and the violence it creates even if he. in the end, cannot condemn wholeheartedly his people and the governmental regimes responsible for it.

Yol is a dark, uncompromising film which offers little in the way of solutions. Guney takes us on a journey through the physical landscape-from cities, to open country, and eventually through an icy wasteland-which is as torturous and painful as the twisted journeys his characters must take in their own minds. Yol's brutal, unflinching environment-moving from warmth to cold, light to darkness, and natural abundance to inhuman barrennesscorresponds to the searing, embittered world created in the minds of people at war with themselves.

Thomas Lanier Williams 1911-1983

When I first heard a radio announcement about the death of Tennessee Williams, my first reaction was neither shock nor sorrow; instead I felt an almost overwhelming urge to call Jim, a close friend who lives in New York City. Many times over the past several years our telephone bills have been enormous because of late night long distance conversations in which we discussed such intent matters as "the conversion of Mount Rushmore's colossal presidential effigies into likenesses of Reta Shaw, Mary Wickes, Eleanor Audley and Madeline Sherwood." Another of our favorite topics, and one which has come up frequently during our 15-year friendship is "how much influence did Tennessee Williams have on our intellectual development during our warped childhood?" This topic has held us for hours, perhaps even weeks if you consider it cumulatively, and during our most recent conversation I asked Jim: "Do you think we're all gay because we saw all those Tennessee Williams movies when we were children?" Jim replied with equal facetiousnesss: "I blame him for everything."

I suppose my point is that Tennessee Williams was once taken very seriously, and some of us, even though quite young and inexperienced, identified with some of his major characters, particularly those who were sad, lonely and frightened. We were probably too young to appreciate Williams' themes, but we could hear the poetry and we may have thought we recognized something of ourselves in those odd, vulnerable souls.

Now that Thomas Lanier Williams. the man who became Tennessee Williams, has passed into history, the eulogistic declarations of "greatest American playwright" sound a bit ironic and strange. The man who gave us The Glass Menagerie, A Streetcar Named Desire and Cat on a Hot Tin Roof, had little or no success with works he produced during the last decade or so of his career; his artistic reputation was maintained through revivals of his classics, including such lesser works as Sweet Bird of Youth, Summer and Smoke (which was revised as Eccentricities of a Nightingale) and Night of the Iguana. Another friend of mine, a professional stage director, tells me that the problem with "taking these works seriously" lies with casting: Nowadays where do you find performers of the magnitude of Laurette Taylor, Vivien Leigh and the young Marlon Brando?

I don't feel qualified to describe anyone as "the greatest American playwright," but I think it's safe to say that Tennessee Williams was the most "poetic" of American playwrights and that his words will continue to exert a large influence on American theater. In time, maybe some of his forgotten and overlooked works—such as Orpheus Descending, The Milk Train Doesn't Stop Here Anymore, Kingdom of the Earth, Out Cry, In the Bar of a Tokyo Hotel and Small Craft Warnings—will find new and appreciative audiences.







### Towards a Responsible Gay Lifestyle— A Preventive Mental Health Statement

by Bryan J. Guiot, M.A.; William A. Scott, M.S.W.; Walter Cadenhead, M.A.; Gary G. Treese, M.S.W.

This statement is not to promote fear or guilt-nor to dictate moralism. Our purpose is to recommend responsible. mature, informed and honest behavior among a community which is experiencing the threat of a frequently fatal disease. While medical scientists continue to study the biology of AIDS, this statement addresses the psychology of the attitudes and behavior of preventive health. Our words are directed toward a positive reaction to a bodily disease that we believe, as mental health professionals, to be related to the attitudes that we create about our mental and emotional lifestyles. Our commitment in this statement is to a quality of life for homosexual men and women that is a healthy whole.

During the past twenty years we have experienced, as an emerging group, a

newly created freedom to be who we were meant to be. By our participation within the building of a sense of identity and commonality, we said no to our history of oppression. We created bars to dance and play. We used baths and bookstores to satisfy sexual desireso often before denied, ridiculed or criticized as sick. We shed our sinfulness, took back political power and produced parties, parades and celebrations to declare our pride. We have taken a closeted, shameful tradition and remodeled it into a visible sign that we will no longer passively receive the dysfunctional projections of this culture. Personally and interpersonallypolitically and socially-we have contributed to the creation of a cultural revolution. Some of the methods and trends that we have chosen to include in that revolution are also contributing to making us sick.

AIDS is a disease that appears

throughout our bodies as a physical symptom of the suppression of our natural and autonomic ability to survive in an environment polluted with millions of bacteria and virus germs that we should be able to cope with on a daily, moment by moment basis. There are elements and trends, within what has become our community lifestyle, that can contribute to immunosuppression. These elements influence our thoughts, our feelings, our behavior and our physical bodies. The following statements address the ways that we may choose to contribute to immunosuppression. They are based upon the science of health and human behavior and our own professional experience as mental health specialists.

I am my body, my thoughts, my feelings, my attitudes and my behavior. I can choose to function as one integrated whole.

What happens in my body is influ-


enced by what happens in what I think, what I feel and what I choose to do. I can choose not to function as one integrated whole.

My body has a tendency to produce symptoms that reflect a lack of integration. This disintegration may happen between my thoughts, my feelings, my behavior or between all three parts of me.

Disintegration can contribute to immunosuppression by creating intrapsychic and interpersonal stress about what I think and what I feel about myself and other people. Stress can contribute to immunosuppression.

The way that I choose to respond to my stress—in my head, in my heart or in my body—can contribute to disintegration. Disintegration can be immunosuppressive.

I have the ability to deny my responsibility for my health, for my

thoughts, my feelings or my behavior. I can deny by ignoring the fact that alcoholism, hepatitis, venereal disease, herpes, chemical abuse and anabolic steroid abuse are as significant an epidemic as AIDS. Denial is lying to myself. Denial can contribute to immunosuppression.

I can deny by numbing my feelings with chemicals that create my experience for me. I can deny by believing that AIDS is a science fiction. I can deny by blaming other people (particularly heterosexuals) for what I really am choosing to think or to feel.

I can deny that I am feeling at all. This kind of make-believe-fantasy gives me permission to continue to use baths and bookstores; poppers and pot; fisting and rimming with the delusion that it's "his problem."

Blaming is perhaps the most irresponsible of all behaviors. AIDS is everybody's problem, gay or straight, rich or poor. AIDS in and of itself is not a political problem. It is a disease that has psychological, social and political implications. Blaming is destructive behavior.

I am responsible for what I think, what I feel, what I do, who I do it to and why I choose to do it. This statement does not reflect a new dogmatic moralism. It is common sense. When I do something, it has effects —my behavior has consequences. My attitudes about my behavior can contribute to immunosuppression.

In our work in psychotherapy with gay clients, we are frequently asked how one may choose to improve the quality of his/her life. The following are statements that can contribute to preventive mental and physical health within our community.

#### **AWARENESS**

Be honest with yourself. Denial can be immunosuppressive.

Be aware of what you are thinking, feeling and experiencing. Disintegration can be immunosuppressive.

Be aware of your stress. Stress can be immunosuppressive.

Be aware that anabolic steroids are immunosuppressive.

Be aware of your self-destructive, sado-masochistic behavior and honestly ask yourself if what you are bringing from fantasy into reality is affecting your health.

#### INFORMATION

Be informed that marijuana can change the structure and functioning of white blood cells and be immunosuppressive. Poppers, MDA, crystal, ethyl chloride, cocaine and alcohol can be immunosuppressive.

Frequent antibiotic treatment for venereal disease can be immuno-suppressive. Be informed about the health of your sex partners by asking them questions about their general health and their protection against hepatitis.

Be informed that physical exercise enhances the immune functioning by relieving physical and, frequently, mental and emotional stress. High protein, balanced diets can enhance immune functioning.

Anger is a healthy emotion. Depression, repression, rebellious and stubborn behavior are unhealthy ways to deal with anger. These defensive games can be immunosuppressive.

#### DECISION

Dating is a healthy and appropriate way to play, meet new people and be sexually responsible. Decide to date.

House parties, movies, plays, the symphony, concerts, the zoo, art galleries, political and charitable organizations, volunteer work and community sports are already existing alternatives to irresponsible sex, intoxication, loneliness and withdrawal. Houston, Dallas, Austin, San Antonio and Fort Worth are among the most populous and cultured urban centers in the country. Ask yourself what you are doing to make yourself bored in these Texas cities. Decide to try other alternatives.

Create gay families—support groups —whatever you choose to

call them— that incorporate new people into your life. Decide to ask for support and friendship and learn to give it.

Believe that it is okay to grow up as a gay man or woman—our adoration of youth, our search for virility and acceptance and approval on physical appearance alone, chemical intoxication and irresponsible sexual activity are trends that were part of the development of our community. Gay people are changing. The adolescence of our gay lifestyle is developing into an adult community. Decide to be gay and to help create a gay lifestyle in an adult community.

If the theory that AIDS is sexually transmitted is correct, casual and anonymous sex may be one of the potential breeding grounds for the AIDS epidemic. Decide to think about that.

#### SELF

I am responsible for my behavior.

Only my SELF can make decisions, change attitudes and develop a life-style that works for ME. The choice of a healthy lifestyle is solely my responsibility. The decisions I make affect and influence the behavior of this community. I can choose to ignore or deny AIDS or I can choose to positively do something about its reality. Its prevention begins with ME.

We believe that one of our responsibilities is to educate the community within which we work daily as mental health professionals. We are asking you to look at your behavior. Listen to yourself and feel your experience. We do not wish to control you. We do want to continue to influence this community in a positive, constructive and creative way. The choice is always yours. The responsibility is always yours. For many, AIDS becomes a process of asking questions about life. We are asking you to choose to live.
