

HORMONE IMBALANCE MAY CAUSE AIDS

WASHINGTON, DC - At long last, a breakthrough may have been discovered revealing what causes AIDS. The discovery of a biological hormone imbalance associated with the disease was revealed last Monday by researchers at the Biochemistry Department at George Washington University School of Medicine in the nation's capitol.

Research has shown that AIDS victims have an elevated level of a particular thymus gland hormone called thymosin alpha-1, Allan Goldstein, chair of the department, told Associated Press.

The discovery could lead to a simple test that would reveal its presence quickly and prevent its spread through blood transfusions.

Measuring the level of thymosin alpha-1 in blood is a simple, straightforward procedure that could be done routinely at hospitals.

"If there is an early warning sign for AIDS, it would enable patients to seek early treatment," Goldstein explained.

The discovery also provides a hint that the disease is biological. If AIDS turns out to be caused by a hormonal imbalance, then it correlates to 1981 Kinsey research which concluded that "homosexuality may arise from a biological precursor," TWT NEWS recalled.

MONTROSE SUPPORT **GROUP FOR AIDS**

HOUSTON - A support group for persons diagnosed with AIDS is scheduled to meet at the Montrose Counseling Center. "The purpose of the group is to provide a mutually supportive network for persons with this syndrome," Gary G. Treese, director of the center, explained to TWT NEWS. Topics discussed will range from the latest information on the treatment and prevention of AIDS, to personal relationship

Anyone who has been diagnosed as having AIDS may attend the group. The support group will meet at the Mon-

trose Counseling Center, 900 Lovett Blvd., Suite 203 on Mondays, 6:30-8:00pm. For more information, call 529-0037 after 1:00pm weekdays.

BIG FORT WORTH CIRCUS BENEFIT

FORT WORTH - A large canvas tent erected on the Lumber Company parking lot this weekend will turn this three-ring circus into a post Mardi Gras madness fundraiser. Food, drinks, games, booths, prizes, t-shirts and fun will be the bill of fare.

Jimmie Spaulding, of the soon-toopen Snake Pit in Dallas, will be the guest disc jockey this Saturday night, March 12. The carnival resumes Sunday at noon.

Local organizations participating include the Agape MCC, Tarrant County Gay Alliance (TCGA), Lambda, the Center for the Community, the Court of the Golden Unicorn and the Emperor Council, TWT NEWS was told.



HOUSTON SELECTS **GAY PRIDE THEME**

HOUSTON - "Unity Through Diversity" will be this city's 1983 Gay Pride theme, as selected at the March 6 meeting at Kindred Spirits. A record turnout of over 200 people received membership cards to become certified voters, TWT NEWS reported.

Prior to the final vote, Gary Grant's theme, "Free To Be," was leading in votes. But after considerable debate, "Unity Through Diversity" was voted the overwhelming favorite. This year's theme was authored by Rita Wanstrom, last year's parade grand marshal.

About twenty themes were placed in nomination.



After two years of chairing Gay Pride Week, Larry Bagneris, Jr. chose to step down as Marion Coleman was voted in. Bagneris and John Kirk, however, agreed to remain co-chairs.

With the theme selection now history, the Gay Pride members will gather next Sunday afternoon to select the appropriate art logo. The 2:30pm meeting will be held at Kindred Spirits.

The annual question of adding the word "lesbian" to the official name of Gay Pride Week was quickly resolved when Coleman explained that, regardless of sex, "We're all gay." The name will not be changed, the vote determined.

HOUSTON'S GAY PRIDE PLANS

HOUSTON — This city's daily agenda for Gay Pride Week has been resolved by popular vote and announced to TWT NEWS. Gay Pride Week 1983 will begin on June 16 and conclude on June 26.

Thursday, June 16: Mayor's proclamation and anniversary of HPD raid on Mary's on the eve of Gay Pride Week.

Friday, June 17: Salute to gay businesses.

Saturday, June 18: MSA softball games (but not with police or fire departments) followed by an evening victory party and reception at Family and Friends of Gays.

Sunday, June 19: Juneteenth celebration sponsored by Black and White Men/Women Together.

Monday, June 20: Second annual Montrose Art Alliance show.

Tuesday, June 21: Montrose Sports Association variety show at Numbers.

Wednesday, June 22: Education Forum sponsored by Montrose Clinic, Montrose Counseling Center and Gay Switchboard.

Thursday, June 23: Gay Youth Day in afternoon; National Day of Remembrance in evening sponsored by Interfaith Alliance.

Friday, June 24: Gay Latino(a) Day sponsored by Gay Hispanic Caucus.

Saturday, June 25: Afternoon party and carnival for AIDS sponsored by Mardi Gras Madness collective; cultural evening at U of H Cullen Auditorium with Montrose Symphonic Band and Chorale, MCCR Choir and Kindred Spirits Ensemble.

Sunday, June 26: Annual Gay Pride Parade down Westheimer beginning at 5:30pm; GPC evening rally and concert at the Summit with a guest star, possibly Lily Tomlin or Bette Midler.

GPC had asked to move the rally out of Spotts Park because of past vandalism to autos, women being accosted and beer sales being ruled illegal in a city park, TWT NEWS learned.

AUSTIN SPLIT OVER MAYORAL VOTE

The Austin Gay/Lesbian Political Caucus (ALGPC) has been unable to reach a final endorsement in this city's mayoral race because of a "too close to call" vote between Ron Mullen and Lowell Lebermann. The ALGPC membership was split, TWT NEWS learned.

However, most of Austin's gay clubs jointly reached a quick decision to endorse Lebermann, citing his past support of the Austin gay community as a former councilmember and as owner of the local Miller Beer distributorship, which has been generous in matters pertaining to the annual gay Fourth of July picnic.

ALGPC did, however, make endorsements in the April 2 city council races:

Place One—ALGPC endorsed the incumbent, Larry Deuser.

Place Two—ALGPC endorsed the incumbent, Roger Duncan.

Place Three—ALGPC endorsed Sally Shipman for the spot vacated by Ron Mullen, who is running for mayor.

Place Four—ALGPC endorsed Leda Roselle. TWT NEWS learned, however, that some independent gay voters were supporting Mark Spaeth.

Place Five—ALGPC endorsed John Trevino, who has been the acting mayor for McClellan, who chose not to run again.

Place Six—ALGPC endorsed the incumbent, Charles Urdy.

The deadline for voter registration was March 3. In the event that any of the close races aren't decided in the April 2 election, a runoff would be held in May.

SAN ANTONIO FUNDRAISER

SAN ANTONIO — This city's newlyformed political organization, the Alamo Human Rights Committee (AHRC) has organized its first fundraiser, a wine and cheese party with a contribution of \$10 per person, to be held this Sunday, March 13 from 2:00-5:00pm at the Charlton Gallery, 308 North Persa, TWT NEWS was told.

The Charlton Gallery is located on San Antonio's famous riverwalk, and the AHRC reception will take place shortly after the annual St. Patrick's Day festivities on the river. Events include the ceremony of dying the river green and naming it the "River Shannon" for a day, a river parade at 1:00pm and Irish musical entertainment at the Arneson River Theater.

The AHRC reception is designed primarily to introduce the organization to the community, and a steering committee hopes to be able to announce the results of its screening of candidates in next month's city elections.

AHRC endorsements for the April 2 city elections will be extremely helpful for gay voters. AHRC will be able to recommend to the voters—for the first time—whom to vote for. Heretofore, the gay voters of San Antonio were going into the voting booths virtually blindfolded.

TWT NEWS strongly urges support of this non-partisan political organization.

ture and slide show was held at the Community Center in this city.

Dr. Mansell informed the forum of 40 about the research and lack of information concerning AIDS and Kaposi's Sarcoma. Stressing good eating habits, rest and exercise, plus avoiding indiscriminate sex as the best way to avoid contracting the 40% fatal disease, Dr. Mansell's lecture was followed by a guestion and answer session.

Dr. Mansell is trying to have AIDS and KS put on the list of diseases that must be reported, so the government can get a better idea of the severity of the problem, David Gary of TWT NEWS reported.

Next month, Bart Jennings, of the Brazos Valley Health Department, will address Alternative and offer a free venereal disease screening.

A&M's GSS RAISES \$1,000




OUR ENERGETIC TEXAS LOBBYIST

HOUSTON - Bettie Naylor, lobbyist for the Lesbian and Gay Rights Advocates (LGRA) was the guest speaker at

the March 2 meeting of the GPC in the West Room of the Holiday Inn, next door to the newly-renovated offices of GPC at 4600 Main.

Naylor, who resides in Austin just steps from the State Capitol, was invited to speak about her lobbying efforts and legislation in the works concerning gay rights in Texas. Her presence was in anticipation of Lobby Weekend, March 5-6, when GPC members were at various Montrose businesses and clubs to accept donations to help raise \$1,500 for the GPC's share of the lobbying preliminaries for the 68th Texas legislative session.

TWT NEWS learned Monday that last weekend's fundraiser netted \$1,200, about \$300 short of LGRA's goal.

This donation will help Ms. Naylor to continue monitoring the legislative session that began January 11, and so the GPC could receive the benefit of her services. Ms. Naylor told TWT NEWS she had been working in Austin since 1971, and moved there a year ago. For more active lobbying efforts on the behalf of the GPC, a tentative proposal of \$7,000 had been discussed.

Her presentation was warmly received by those in attendance, and she came across as energetic, straightforward and personable—qualities certainly of value in dealing with legislators of all political persuasions, TWT NEWS reporter David Fields observed.

Fields spoke with Ms. Naylor in an interview during a small reception held for her in the offices of GPC. When asked if the drinking age in Texas would be raised this year to 21, Ms. Naylor indicated that she didn't feel the Texas legislature would change the law during this session.


When asked what the GPC could do to become more effective, she responded by saying, "They should expand their base and reach out more to the areas outside the Loop."

When asked what gay people can do in general, she said, "Houston is doing all the right things and could further increase their progress simply by getting more involved."



AIDS Takes Twin Brother

Dear TWT:

I have just returned to Texas to live. I must admit that I cried a great deal upon reading the letter from "D.S." in Austin, Texas [TWT COMMENT, Vol. 8, No. 49].

About a year ago, my identical twin brother and I agreed to spend a year apart, simply because we had never been apart since birth. I moved to San Francisco and Robert (my twin) to New York City. I became the one to turn on to every possible trick I met in San Francisco; often I had sex with three or four different guys in one day. I almost lived in the baths, I took "poppers" and smoked all the dope I could get my hands on. I gave little thought to my health; hell, I thought that I was really living it up! Robert, on the other hand, fell in love with a great guy in New York, and all the time that he was in New York he slept with only his lover. He did not smake dope, take poppers or go to the baths. His lover was and still is a very healthy guy.

On November 1, 1982 Robert was rushed to a hospital in New York—he was diagnosed as having AIDS. I flew to New York the morning of November 2, 1982 to

be with my brother. Our stepfather spent over \$100,000 on the finest doctors in the country. Even so, 47 days later, my beloved twin was dead. We both had always been healthy, well-built males; still his system could not withstand the attack of AIDS. I lived and slept in his hospital room for 40 days and nights, only to watch him die before my very eyes. Why? I've never been given a decent answer. I often felt Robert's physical pain, which he knew; frankly, I thought that I might very well die with him (as identical twins often do); in secret, I hoped that I would die with him.

Tell your readers to be careful. This AIDS thing is very, very real—it is not game-playing, and I don't believe that one damn doctor really knows anything about AIDS. How could Robert's beautiful, healthy body be attacked, whereas my equally healthy body was not? I was holding Robert in my arms when he died, and at death it seemed that his body returned to its original beauty and handsomeness before his illness. I kissed his lips upon death and closed his eyes forever.

The autopsy showed that his entire body had been destroyed in that short period of time. Teddy, Robert's lover, is so desolate that he has moved to Texas with me. I suppose that we hope that we can help one another to live through this hell.

It's true enough we have sadly neglected the necessary support of our workers whose hightech, highly specialized functioning at great personal sacrifice has made our Houston community happen. Somebody shake poor Ms. Smathers and wake her up out of her dream world. The Houston Spirit wouldn't be anywhere at all without the insistent, constant and aggressive professionalism of a few people like Ray Hill and others I could laudably name—who are always there. Always plugging away. And always underpaid.

It's a fact! We haven't been paying our dedicated professionals for the work they have been doing. BUT WE NEED TO. Just like any other profession. It's there because we need it

there. And we need to pay for it.

It almost offends me to think that Dee would suggest that it is "Houston Sytle" to gleefully neglect the educational, consciousness-raising group interaction aspects of things like seminars and turn away from the serious business of organizing and planning.

"In May, 1978, the voters of Eugene, Oregon, repealed a gay rights amendment to the city's charter. This amendment had prohibited discrimination on the basis of sexual preference in housing, employment, and access to public accommodations." So begins this analysis of the struggle of gay civil rights in Eugene, Oregon, documented by The Gay Rights Writer's Group, composed of four women and one man, who were active in the campaign.

This short booklet mentions the other losses in Dade County, Florida, in St. Paul, Minnesota, and in Witchita, Kansas; and many, in the campaign to retain the ordinance, felt the tide would turn there. The cause of that failure may have been that they did not learn from those other experiences with the New Right. This reason and others are discussed here.

At this point, there may be those who wish to point out that Houston, Dallas, Ft. Worth and San Antonio have no ordinances for gay civil rights, much less a campaign to create them. Others may go so far as to say that these cities do not need them. This book is worthwhile, useful reading for other reasons



than pressing a campaign. It is interesting that the description of their organizing clearly reflects the sexism, refusal to compromise (among politically diverse groups) and "personalities" that will sabotage any organization if awareness and compromise are not practiced.

It Could Happen To You... gives a comprehensive picture of all the time, energy and planning involved in a gay political effort. The reader will come away with a much better appreciation for the work gay political organizations do and the need they have for concerned people to join if these groups are to be effective.

The book charts the dynamics of political support and non-support in terms of the effectiveness of the campaign to retain the ordinance. The writers specifically point out which groups failed to cooperate due to political and class differences, and how the mainstream gay organizations failed to attempt to build alliances with other oppressed groups in order to broaden their power base.

The book gives a detailed background history of gay politics in Eugene, the spectrum of present ideologies and their degree of organization. It then goes into describing the structure, funding and procedures for the campaign, including public opinion polls, strategy and content of media advertisements, canvassing and voter registration. Of course, there are some aspects of the campaign that are unique to Eugene, Oregon, but enough similarities of politics and organizations exist that qualify this book to be used in other locales.

Besides the internal weaknesses of the campaign, external New Right forces with new "liberal," "reasonable" tactics were carefully orchestrated to defeat the ordinance by 1) appealing to the homophobic voters with liberal rhetoric, and 2) co-opting the liberal organizations and supporters. With close analysis of their campaign, one clearly sees the combination of moral-religious appeals with "freedom of conscience"—to deny gay persons "special privileges."

The gay community in Eugene became closer, stronger, more sensitive to the wide diversity there, and most importantly, far wiser in their attempts to educate their community. Any analysis of failure, or victory, is crucial to the on-going, long-term process to educate and enlighten a homophobic society. For those who can't or won't come out of the closet, but who can see the progress made on their behalf, they surely must be encouraged in their heart of hearts to struggle with their own freedom.





LIANNA

I always put off writing my reviews till the last moment. Partly because the satisfaction of journalistic writing is working against a deadline, mostly because the written word is final. Once I've committed myself on paper to an opinion of a movie that I have seen only one time, there is no turning back.


It is said that first impressions are the strongest, and perhaps the truest. John Sayles' latest film, *Lianna*, is like meeting someone and knowing on the spot that (s)he is a soulmate, a person who will leave a mark on your life. *Lianna* is a film that has affected me deeply, and the ripples created by the impact have yet to subside.

Lianna is about the 33-year-old wife of a college professor in a small university town who discovers she is gay when she falls in love with her night class instructor, Ruth. The film traces Lianna's "coming out" and how it affects her, her family and her friends. This is not a female version of Making Love. In fact, a comparison is rather pointless, since Making Love was a Hollywood treatment of a subject almost ignored or considered taboo since the era of silent films. Hollywood examining the inner conflicts of the quest for gay identity is like a child trying to do cancer research with a magnifying glass.

John Sayles (who has never seen Making Love) established himself when his independent film, Return of the Secaucus Seven, became a critical and popular success. He had actually written the script for Lianna before making Secaucus Seven, long before Making Love was filmed.

Lianna is a film astounding in its insight, wit, sensitivity and scope. This is one of those films for which I need to drag out the thesaurus, because I don't have enough positive adjectives in my vocabulary.

John Sayles' screenplay is spectacular. Sayles' ability to show the depth of his characters' personalities through

dialogue is reminiscent of Ibsen.

Lianna, stunningly portrayed by Canadian actress Linda Griffiths, is a "flesh and blood" character. Griffiths, who has the face of a Botticelli angel, gives a performance equal to Sayles' script. At times, she is incandescent.

Although Lianna is basically a story of a young woman awakening to her gay identity, it is a film as much about the people in Lianna's life. Again, Sayles creates characters of depth and veracity seldom seen on the screen. Jane Hallaren portrays Ruth, the woman who Lianna falls in love with. In the throes of joy at discovering her true nature, Lianna is ready to commit herself completely to Ruth; but Ruth, more experienced and wise to the ways of the world, is much more reserved.

We see how Lianna's coming out affects her family. Her husband, Dick, who is something of a classic creep, uses the knowledge as another tool of control over Lianna. When Dick tells their children, Theda and Spencer, that Mommy is a lesbian, Lianna's hand is forced. She must face her children. Theda (Jessica Wight MacDonald) is only seven years old, and she is hurt and confused by something she does not really understand. Thirteen-year-old Spencer (Jesse Solomon), on the other hand, is much more philosophical. He tells Lianna, "So, my old lady's a dyke. Big deal." To which Lianna replies, "I'm not your 'old lady.' "

Lianna sees her close friendship with Sandy (beautifully portrayed by New York stage actress, Jo Henderson) fall apart because Sandy does not know how to handle her dearest friend after discovering she is gay.

Lianna is a film about more than a woman "coming out." It is also about a woman who suddenly finds herself alone and on her own. Her husband throws her out of the house. She can see her children only a few days a week. She had dropped out of college to marry her husband, and has never had to work for a living before. Now she must face up to the consequences of her coming out. The joy of discovery soon gives way to self-doubt, lonely nights in a small, cheap apartment, and confusion over the way people have been affected by her self-discovery.

The script is not the only praise-worthy aspect of the film. John Sayles is a filmmaker of rare sensitivity and insight. Lianna is filled with moments of cinematic brilliance. There is a scene showing Lianna walking down the street. It is right after she has accepted that she is gay and is happy with the knowledge. The scene shows Lianna noticing all the pretty women as she walks down a street she has walked innumerable times before. Sayles' captures that burst of wild joy that Lianna is feeling without a single line of dialogue.

Lianna is an opportunity for everyone, gay and non-gay alike, to see a truly artistic exploration of a difficult subject: the awakening of a human being to his/her true nature.

JUMPING THE GUN

ACADEMY ENNUI — Back in those distant, apple-cheeked days of my starstruck childhood there were three major holidays which I could count on to recur at least once every year: Christmas, my birthday and, most reverent of all, television's annual broadcast of the Academy Award ceremonies from Hollywood. In early spring my parents. friends and classmates would see me wandering around in a daze, muttering to myself about Geraldine Page, or any of a number of other people they had never heard of, and when the big night finally arrived I was as excited as anyone in the first couple of rows at the actual event.

These days I don't know of any apple-cheeked brats, to say nothing of well-adjusted adults, who feel the way I once did about the Oscar show. Let's face it, that trussed-up, annual publicity stunt is probably the most boring spectacle on television (and think of the competition for that distinction: Family Feud, Morgan Fairchild and most mini-series). However, if you're anything like me, or at least human, you may find yourself reluctantly tuning in at the last minute, hoping to catch just a glimmer of the old magic-a guick glimpse of a favorite star, perhapsand if you're really lucky you might get to see a really momentous faux pas committed live right there in front of millions of disbelieving viewers. Actually, this year's Oscar show (on April 11) will probably be as unmemorable as always, but, as always, there are a few interesting notes to keep in mind as you root for your favorites.

For instance, a lot of people are predicting that this will be the year that Paul Newman (nominated for *The Ver-*



dict) finally gets his due—he's had six previous nominations, but has never taken home an Oscar. Newman's stiffest competition for Best Actor seems to be **Ben Kingsley** (Gandhi), who has already won everything but the Irish Sweepstakes for his portrayal of the Indian leader. But **Peter O'Toole**, with seven nominations behind him, could surprise everyone.

Then there is **Dustin Hoffman**, enormously popular in *Tootsie*. Incidentally, Hoffman isn't the first actor to be nominated for Best Actor in a drag role—**Jack Lemmon** has that distinction for 1959's *Some Like It Hot*. He didn't win that year, but he did win a Supporting Actor Oscar back in 1955 for *Mr. Roberts*, and later, in 1973, he was named Best Actor for *Save the Tiger*. This year he's in the running with a nomination for *Missing*.

I don't think Julie Andrews, Sissy Spacek and Debra Winger have a prayer in the Best Actress category. Meryl Streep is probably the front runner. Her work in Sophie's Choice was meticulous and difficult—and she still just impresses the hell out of everyone. Her main competition is probably Jessica Lange, nominated for both "Best Actress" (Frances) and "Best Supporting Actress" (Tootsie). That kind of double threat hasn't occurred since 1942 when Teresa Wright received a Best Actress nomination for Pride of the Yankees and won in the "Supporting" category for Mrs. Miniver.

Among Lange's Supporting Actress competition, Glenn Close was superb in *The World According to Garp*, but she's up against that living legend, Kim Stanley (*Frances*), who makes a film appearance about once every 20 years.

Speaking of drag, if John Lithgow doesn't win Best Supporting Actor for his portrayal of Roberta in Garp, I will publicly sit through a screening of the abominable Chariots of Fire. But watch Robert Preston win that one—after all, he did wait nearly 40 years for his first nomination.

Then you get to all those awards that

nobody cares about. Ordinarily we might be interested in Best Song category, but have you heard this year's nominees? They barely qualify as music, and it's rather interesting that three of the songs have lyrics by the team of Alan and Marilyn Bergman.

Instead of speculating on the various contenders, think of the talented people who weren't nominated this year. Why were Albert Finney, Diane Keaton and Dana Hill overlooked? They gave incredible performances in the depressing and little-seen Shoot the Moon. (I think I just answered my own question.) And what about Robin Williams and Mary Beth Hurt in The World According to Garp, and the various performers, extra-terrestrial and otherwise, in E.T., which is now the top-grossing film of all time?

If you want to get really pessimistic, think what might happen if Gandhi sweeps the field with 11 wins—it could start a major trend in men's fashion. Imagine millions of grown men running around dressed in diapers! w





Over the past few years, Texas has had the pleasure of seeing gay theatre performed locally in the various cities, thus proving we have very talented actors in our community. With the help of Don Baker and Community Productions, we will now have the privilege of viewing gay theatre as performed across the nation.

Realizing our need for a secure gay theatre company in Texas, Mr. Baker has traveled extensively to major cities in the United States, meeting with gay playwrights, performers and authors. This desire for professional theatre brought Don and the New York Repertory Company together. He explains, "Gay theatre is extremely important for our identity. These plays, hopefully, will help gay people realize that they're not alone in their quest for happiness. The plays are very down to earth and believable. I don't feel any of them have been 'white-washed' for our convenience. A non-gay person viewing the play will be able to better understand a gay person's dilemma. Every culture, whether black, chicano or whatever, has its own theatre as an outlet. The gay culture needs this also."

Westreet Rep was founded by Amato Petale, who operates out of the 18th Street Playhouse in Greenwich Village. Mr. Petale has been in the theatre for 35 years, and has 75 productions to his credit in Europe.

Three productions performed by Westreet Rep will tour Texas this month. They are A Perfect Relationship by Doric Wilson, If This Isn't Love by Sidney Morris and My Blue Heaven by Jane Chambers.

A Perfect Relationship is a comedy of two gay male roommates who pride themselves on their uninvolvement. In doing so, however, they miss the beauty of their unique friendship. This production is directed by Petale.

If This Isn't Love is a semi-autobiographical two-character comedy-drama about a gay male relationship and its changes over a 30-year period. This production ran for eight months and nearly 200 performances at New York's Shandol Theatre.

My Blue Heaven is a hilarious story of two lesbians who guit 9 to 5 jobs and move to a farm. We regret to inform you that playwright Jane Chambers passed away last month at age 45 of a brain tumor. But she did have the pleasure of knowing her play was being performed in Texas.


