

ANOTHER TEXAN **DEAD OF AIDS**

HOUSTON - Dexter Burnett, 33, became the lastest member of the Texas gay community to die of AIDS when he passed away at 7:43am, March 8 at M.D. Anderson Tumor Institute, of complications with Kaposi's Sarcoma.

Burnett had been ill with the disease only since August. He died at the hospital where he had been under treatment.

Born in Victoria, Texas, Burnett had attended the University of Texas at Austin. In Houston, he was active in GPC, Gay and Alive Sharing Experience, a T-For-2000 founding sponsor, and a participant in Lonestar I, II, III and Rosebud bike runs.

Most recently, he had been active in the AIDS support group of the Montrose Counseling Center, TWT NEWS learned.

Cremation followed a memorial service at Earthman's in Houston on Friday. March 11. Burnett's family was appreciative of the support shown by friends of their late son. Burnett's family was acknowledged for their love and understanding of the situation.

MATTOX DROPS 21.06 APPEAL

AUSTIN - Texas' newly elected Attorney General, Jim Mattox, announced March 11 that he was dropping the appeal on Penal Code Statute 21.06, Bettie Naylor, lobbyist for the Lesbian

and Gay Rights Advocates (LGRA), informed TWT NEWS.

Elna Christopher, Mattox's aide at the state capitol, confirmed that Mattox had notified U.S. District Judge Jerry Buchmeyer in Dallas, and Fifth U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans, that the appeal on 21.06 (Texas' homosexual conduct law) would not be pursued.

After Mattox was elected Attorney General last November, TWT NEWS learned that he would most likely drop the appeal, as he found the law "unnecessary." In fact, had Mattox been the State Attorney General, over Mark White, there probably would never have been an appeal filed. But, White had found it necessary, citing his oath of office to uphold state law.


It is important to remember that Mattox took many political risks in deciding not to appeal. "His courage is appluaded." remarked M. Robert Schwab, president of THRF, which spearheaded the Baker vs Wade lawsuit, resulting in the 21.06 victory. "Maddox took the correct step, both morally and legally." THRF added.

TWT NEWS learned that Mattox felt the appeal had been "seriously, seriously reviewed and that the trial court record was inadequate to sustain the statute (21.06) as presently drafted in the books," explained Christopher.

HILL WON'T DROP 21.06 APPEAL

AMARILLO - Although State Attornev General Jim Mattox officially dropped his office's appeal of 21.06 last week, Potter County District Attorney, Danny Hill, hasn't.

As readers who have followed the complex developments in this intricate story recall, Hill had also filed a notice of intent to appeal 21.06 last October. Thus, there were actually two parties



who qualified themselves to file an appeal.

One party, Mattox, dropped his appeal last week. The other, Hill, remains. In fact, Hill has just been asked by the Dallas Doctors Against AIDS to join forces.

The law firm representing the Dallas Doctors, Jackson Walker, has been retained by Hill so that he might perfect his appeal and carry it forward, TWT NEWS was informed last Monday.

"When THRF learned that Hill had filed notice of appeal last October, our group began researching the question as to whether Hill had any legal standing to pursue the appeal," THRF president, M. Robert Schwab, explained. "The research was not completed last November, however, when White's follow-up appeal muted the question of Hill's standing."

There seems to be some question as to whether Hill's appeal is going to be accepted by the courts, since he was not an active participant in the Baker vs Wade trial. Hill has even expressed his own doubts about the legality of his appeal.

The alignment of Hill and the Dallas Doctors comes about after a federal appeal court last week refused to consider the group's evidence, after plaintiff Don Baker's attorney, Jim Barber, presented affidavits from five experts indicating that keeping homosexual conduct in Texas illegal would not halt the spread of AIDS.

"The Dallas Doctors Against AIDS is more homophobic than medical," Baker said. And Hill is more political than objective, TWT NEWS opines.

ALAMO HRC SET TO ENDORSE

SAN ANTONIO — Many of this city's gay leaders and concerned citizens attended a wine and cheese fundraiser kick-off reception at Charlton Gallery, on the famous riverwalk, last Sunday afternoon, to publicly launch the new Alamo Human Rights Committee (AHRC).

AHRC's immediate goal is to endorse pro-gay candidates in the April 2 city election. "We've already sent out our questionnaires to the candidates, and should be ready to start endorsing by this weekend," treasurer Steve Clement told Alan Gellman of TWT NEWS.

It has worked in Houston, Dallas, Austin and Fort Worth. With community support, it can also work in San Antonio.

TWT NEWS looks forward to publishing San Antonio's first official candidate endorsements.

DALLAS GAY ENCOUNTERS

DALLAS — A day-long communications workshop, which will provide an opportunity for gay men and women to explore their thoughts and feelings concerning their gay humanity, will be presented on two successive Sundays this month.

This Sunday, March 20, there will be a Gay Women's Encounter lasting all day, from 9:00am until 6:00pm. The following Sunday, March 27, a Gay Men's Encounter will be presented during the same time period.

Both encounters are to be held at Maple Plaza, 5415 Maple Ave., Suite 211, at a cost of \$30 per encounter, TWT NEWS was told.


The workshops will discuss encountering one's self and also encountering other gay people. Interested persons may contact Michael Boothman, M.A., the facilitator.

DALLAS — The Oak Lawn Symphonic Band (OLSB) is anticipating its "most ambitious season ever," president Judith Atwood told TWT NEWS. The band is to make a trip to Los Angeles for next year's first annual Lesbian and Gay National Band Conference.

With a heavy schedule of coordination ahead, the band has selected a fulltime conductor, Steve Boykin. Also selected at a recent meeting of OLSB,

GAY PRIDE LOGO JOINS THEME

HOUSTON — The artwork and graphic design of an appropriate logo to compliment this year's Gay Pride theme, "Unity Through Diversity," was chosen last Sunday by the collective of the Gay Pride Association.

Of the nine logos submitted, many in color, the vote was highest for a twocolor logo by Dennis Dunwoody of Dunwoody Graphics, and a silver and black logo by bartender Lee Wood of the Ripcord. The final vote, however, tipped in Wood's favor. It will be presented to the public in its finished form by TWT NEWS in early April.

In other gay pride updates, it was announced that Jerry Kaufmann would direct the MSA variety show, that the Montrose Band would play at Razzle Dazzle Dallas during that city's Gay Pride Week, that the Family and Friends of Gays reception would be open to the entire community, and that Dallas, for the first time, would play Houston in an All-Star softball game. Houston's police and fire departments have dropped from competition.

"We have already put a \$5,000 deposit as a down payment on the Rally at the Summit," Bagneris announced.

The selection of this year's grand marshals will be May 1, TWT NEWS reported. One must attend three Gay Pride meetings, however, to be eligible to vote.



AIDS and the Gay Lifestyle

Dear TWT:

I read the TWT COMMENT [Vol. 8, No. 49] letter from D.S. of Austin on AIDS and his brother "Jim." . . . [T]he person they thanked in the last paragraph is a very public figure, Michael Houston McAdory, chair of the Kaposi's Sarcoma Committee and Mr. Gay Pride 1982. I mention this, not because Mac needs further publicity or aggrandizement, but simply because I have heard him be criticized, maligned, guestioned, judged, mocked and even threatened about his qualifications to chair the KSC. Whenever someone is compelled to thank him, I think it should be as public as possible so that the community at large is made aware of the extent of the job Mac is doing with KSC, not just as committee chair, but answering letters (hundreds of them) by hand, personally contacting fellow victims of KS and AIDS, almost daily trips to the hospital for his own treatments and handling his work responsibilities at the Drum. And funds collected by the KSC are deposited in a special trust fund and completely accountable. Direct donations to M.D. Anderson Hospital tend to go unnoticed, so it was decided to set up a fund so that a significant amount of money could be collected and then donated directly to KS research.

I was going to write this letter earlier. but I was admitted to Park Plaza Hospital and the next day was told that I, too, had been diagnosed as having AIDS and pneumocitis pneumonia. The shock, of course, was immediate and intense. PCP is a known killer (66% of the cases) and I had amost died at work.... Thank God for my doctors, the exceptional emergency staff here at Park Plaza and my otherwise generally good health, because the combination of quick action and correct medication has cured the PCP, although the AIDS remains.

Which leads me to the most important point. I was in intensive care for nine

days here. One of my nurses attended the forum on KS and AIDS at the Sheraton Hilton on February 22 and later told me that she had learned a great deal and appreciated the forum greatly, but she was distressed by the attitude of the (presumably gay) people around her, which was, "Well, AIDS can't kill you, so I'll wait 'til I get it and then take care of myself."

They still don't understand the nature of AIDS or the seriousness of the problems it can cause. True, AIDS won't kill you; but AIDS leaves your body with NO IMMUNITIES to fight off any disease. It would not be unlike being allergic to air or water. The allergy wouldn't kill you, but the lack of air or water would.

Since so little is known about AIDS and so much is known about the deleterious effects of recreational drugs, extremely promiscuous sexual habits, poppers, et al-in other words, the "gay life"-it follows that practicing at least moderation in these things makes sense. Before gay life becomes gay death.

In the interview you published with me last year, I was quoted as saying words to the effect of, "How proud of yourself can you be if you're stoned or drink yourself into a stupor every night."

The operative phrase is "every night." I got flack on that quote because it's no secret that I've indulged in a generous share of "gay life," and I'm paying for it. Don't let the same thing happen to you.

When the KSC was formed, I told the committee that the only thing that would alert the gay community was fear. As I recall, I said, "We've got to scare the shit out of every one of those queens or they won't believe it." I still mean it, and no platitudes on taking offense to the euphemism "queens," please.

If you remain aloof or stick your head in the sand, you may be the next death statistic we read about in TWT NEWS. Danny Villa Houston, Texas w



Neveryona, by Samuel R. Delany; 385 pp.; Bantam Books, Inc., 666 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York 10103; softcover, \$6.95.

For those who read Wallace Roe's survey of gay themes in science fiction in TWT several months ago, including mention of Samuel Delany's Tales of Neveryon, Delany offers another in the series entitled Neveryona. It would be better classified as fantasy or sword and sorcery, and bears his characteristic ambiguity in casting these tales as based on fiction or, possibly, fact. He continues to include relationships of interest to the gay reader, but this is one of a multitude of attractions he sup-

His chapter titles do not correspond

to their content (to which he readily admits later) and are quite uniform throughout the book. He begins each chapter with a highly abstract, often obscure quote from some technical, philosophical or sociological treatise. full of jargon and complex relationships. After giving this somewhat negative appraisal, it is also necessary to state, if one is so inclined to spend the time, these snippets of analysis from the likes of Susan Sontag could be informative upon inspection, though they seem to have little to do with the story.

Ah, the story, pryn is our heroine. Later, when she is taught to write her name correctly, it becomes Pryn-an effect Delany is fond of using but has little to do with e.e. cummings, apparently. The characters wax eloquently

about political relationships, master/ slave, ruler/ruled, rich/poor, unemployed/employed. This is the content of a major soliloguy by Gorgik the Liberator, a slave who is master, leader of slaves to freedom. Madame Keyne, a rich merchant with power, also teaches Prvn lessons about these issues. It seems Delany uses Neveryona as a vehicle for moral/ehtical/political expositions as he tells his story.

Tales true and untrue guide Pryn in her experiences with the people she meets. The book opens with her riding a dragon, setting her character up to be the adventuress with knowledge, ability to read and write, courageousness and uniqueness, though she is only fifteen. She is the only character that is constant throughout the novel as she meets others dictated by destiny. Her goal is unknown, her purpose is lost; it only unfolds as her life and chance take their turns.

The tale is told by an unknown and unidentified narrator who casually converses with the reader and acknowledges the reader's world, stepping out of the "framework" of the real world of Neveryon, and just as casually inviting the reader to return. Delany has taken a much longer segment of the novel and condensed it for inclusion, stating, "... what we have told of Pryn's adventures till now might well have been elided or omitted as unbelievable or, at any rate, as uncharacteristic. In that other story. Pryn's next few weeks might easily have filled the bulk of these pages." Later, he moves back into the main story.

The pacing of the plot is slow, without a lot of the rip-snorting, violent action that litters many adventure tales. Pryn moves through three major locales: the mountain country from which she comes; the city of Kalhari (and its suburbs); and Ellamon, the area of the country where her family lived. As she travels, she finds more and more traces of her father. He has done many things as an inventor, a man of ideas about the physical, and the cosmic nature of his world. He has left behind many tools and creations which Prvn discovers. and she uses her own knowledge and abilities to safeguard those tools for the future.

This science-fantasy think-piece is not easily consumed, digested and appreciated. It offers many unique, thought-provoking issues for the reader's consideration. But the body of the book is not so complex that the reader ends a section in exhaustion; though it does require a sustained concentration. With the added effort, Neveryona gives the reader substance as well as entertainment. w

First the bad news for all of you Tom Selleck fans out there: TV's magnumismatic private eye does not disrobe once to show off the jungle on his chest. Now the not-so-good news: High Road to China is an outright imitation of the most successful action yarn of all time, Spielberg & Lucas' Raiders of the Lost Ark, but it's not as fast-paced, not as tongue-in-cheek, not as innovative, not as realistic or logical (as if

man who vanished five years ago. The word is, if Bess doesn't find him, he will be declared legally dead and she would have to kiss all his bread good-bye. Selleck and Struts, his mechanic and compadre-Jack Weston plays this Sancho-Panza-type role nicely and for laughs-take off together with Eve and go to Afghanistan, which looks more like upstate New York, Ms. Armstrong portrays the prototype of a blow-up doll, the kind that explodes every so often



in verbal fits or physical outbursts. The hunt for the lost father moves on to India and Nepal, which somehow resemble upstate New York. Eventually, the flying ace's bi-plane takes him and the lady through the thin air over the Himalayas to the Chinese hill country which, incidentally, reminded me of upstate New York. There a ludicrous, illdefined battle between angry hordes of peasants and agressive mercenaries takes place.

Director Brian G. Hutton explained in an interview that the several hundred extras used for the fierce field scene spoke various Oriental tongues and other languages: "Every time I laid out a shot, it had to be described so many times-through interpreters-that I sometimes forgot what I was talking about in the first place." That is quite evident in the wild and violent battlefield brouhaha.

Mr. Selleck as the booze-gulping daredevil does as well as can be expected: Bess Armstrong (Four Seasons) is adequate. A fresher, livelier exchange of communication between the two could have saved much of the picture. Robert Morley as Bentik, the master criminal, is plain silly and not very amusing in a plain silly and not very amusing role. Most of the action was filmed in Yugoslavia, which looks as much like Afghanistan, India, Nepal or China as upstate New York. Why producer and former Bruce-Lee-sponsor Fred Weintraub (Klute, Summer of '42) considered that Jon "Cleary's novel was a highly touted property." I can't quite grasp. In any event, the end result is never the kind of cliffhanger flick High Road was probably supposed to be. It is never terribly funny, and as I struggled hard to concentrate on the action and the characters enveloped in it, my honest-to-goodness gut feeling was: Who cares?



THE FLASHER IN MALTA



Margot Kidder has a wonderful sense of feel for the silly and absurd, with Robert Hays comfortably playing the straight man. Their scenes are evenly spread with snappy dialogue, punchthe-gut humor, and some of the best slapstick since I Love Lucy.

TWT had an opportunity to meet John Sayles, writer/director/editor of the film, Lianna. The film's co-producer, Maggie Renzi, was also present at our interview in Mr. Sayles' hotel room. TWT was particularly interested in meeting the man who has created a sensitive portrait of a young woman awakening to the fact that she is gay. Both John Sayles and Maggie Renzi were an absolute delight to talk to, and the following are excerpts from our conversation.

TWT — Lianna is already playing in some cities across the country, isn't it?

Sayles — Well, on one coast or the other, but not quite across the country yet. Chicago is as far into the West as we've got . . .

Renzi — And Atlanta representing the South. We broke the house record in New York. And then we broke our own record two consecutive weeks.

TWT — Let's talk a little about the film. When was it shot?

Renzi — We finished shooting in December of 1981.

Sayles — And then I edited it for about three months, and then we did a five-day sound mix. Then we started on another film, immediately, the day after. And when we finished that film, we started a tour for this film. And as soon as I get back, I go back to Seattle to do some publicity for my next film, called Baby It's You, which is distributed by Paramount. They're opening that in Seattle, and they're going to open it city by city, just like they are doing with this one [Lianna].

TWT — Do you think it's better that way?

Sayles — For certain movies. And so far, I haven't made the kind that they can make a thousand prints of.

TWT — There's always Jaws 4 . . . Renzi — Other people tend to direct

those, he [Sayles] only writes them.

Sayles — After my friend Joe Dante directed *Piranha*, which I wrote, all he got offered—this is real type-casting for you—was not only horror films, but horror films in the water. He got offered something called *Swim Team*, and then *Orca II* and then *Jaws 3, People Nothing*. And none of them came through. And he hates the water.

TWT - It seems that you like to pick subjects or stories that will make people ask, "What does he know about that?" I was surprised to discover that you had written the novel, Pride of the Bimbos. I read it four or five summers ago and thought it was one of the funniest books I had ever read. How many books do you read about a dwarf who plays baseball in drag? That book is filled with unlikely characters. But the thing that amazed me, and in the film Lianna too, is that you have an eye for the right detail that makes it true. If you compare Lianna with Making Love, Making Love comes off very badly.

Renzi — We never saw that film. Sayles — We saw the trailer though.

The only thing that made me nervous about the trailer was the tone of voice when the guy says, "She's his best friend, he's the most wonderful person in the world, he has a slight problem ... but don't worry, folks ..."

TWT - In Making Love, he has no

problems whatsoever, except that he has to deal with the fact that he is gay. But Lianna is gay, and she also has to deal with the fact that her husband is a prick and she's got two children whom she cares for.

Sayles — And she has to make a living. People tend to forget that in movies. I accept it in Hitchcock movies, where everybody is always an architect, so they can take a vacation and have an adventure, and nobody asks, "Why isn't he calling the office?" Nobody knows what an architect does.

Renzi — The new thing we found, for women, is art galleries. A job in an art gallery. That sort of solves the problem.

Sayles — That's right. It doesn't have regular hours and you get to wear those kind of smocky clothes.

TWT — TV is big on that. Isn't that what Rhoda did?

Sayles — She did windows in department stores, then she moved into art galleries. There's always one art gallery in every soap opera.

TWT — Is the character of Lianna somebody you created out of your own mind, or is it somebody you know?

Sayles - Somebody made up of dozens of people. When I started working on it, the impetus was from my being a witness to a couple of really bad custody cases. That was sort of the basic premise. I wrote this four years ago, and at that time there were a number of stories in the news, one of them in Texas, of women who were losing custody of their kids only because they were living with another woman. All of a sudden, the husbands had this thing they could sue for, and the judges were saying, "Yes, you lose custody of the kids," even if the kids wanted to stay with the mother and all the evidence pointed to the fact that they should get the kids.

That sort of gave me the basic concept. But then the character itself came out of the fact that I had known a couple of gay women and their experiences just as they were coming out. And then a lot of women I know who were on the job market after being married a num-

ber of years and really hadn't been out there before. Someone who was forty years old, who all of a sudden was on the job market, but also the personal market, you know, selling themselves; and the last time they had done that, they were 18 years old.


And then the final thing is people I know, both men and women, who were growing up in various ways at the age of 30, 35, 40, who just had not gotten certain kinds of shit together. When you're 18 years old, you don't have responsibility to that many people. So it's one thing to make this huge decision, "Oh, I'm gonna be a Moonie, or a brown ricer; I'm gonna have a kid," this king of thing. Whereas when you're 35, and you have kids and family and friends and all this stuff, and you make one of those decisions, it affects everybody. Which is why a lot of Lianna is about all the other people in her life and how they get affected by it and how they deal with it or don't deal with it. That's why most of the peripheral characters show up at least twice-so you can get their first hit on her saying, "I'm gay," and then you also get the second hit, because that often changes.

TWT — Have you had any reaction from lesbian groups?

Sayles — I haven't gotten any reaction from *groups*, which is fine. A nonorganized reaction, which is nice, from individual gay women. Our box office has been great in New York, and a great hunk of that is gay women, who were getting off to the movie.

TWT — The only question one of our women writers had was about the bar scene-the women seemed so aggressive.

Renzi - That scene was filmed from Lianna's point of view, and she's totally paranoid. She's convinced that they are all looking at her.

Sayles - When we were raising money for the movie, and the script was circulating, a lot of gay women came forward and were very generous. It was sort of the idea, well, if you're going to make this film, here's something you might think about. One woman said the trouble with women's gay bars is that women are so trained to be passive that nobody makes the first move.

TWT - Lianna comes across as a real person, much more so than most gays portrayed in fiction or movies that I've encountered.

Sayles - One of the things that got me interested was that at the time I was writing this, one of the things happening in the gay women's community was a conscious breakdown of those old roles. So there had been this tradition of who's playing the masculine role, who's playing the feminine role . . . and the women at that time were asking, "Why are we aping the sort of society that we don't like? Why can't we break things down and be more equal?"

Although she's still in the closet in a lot of ways, Ruth-Lianna's loverat least has the sense to realize in the


beginning that Lianna could easily fall into the same exact relationship that she had with Dick, her husband, And she would be leaning on Ruth all the time, and eventually, that's destructive. Eventually, Ruth could turn into-not as nasty as Dick-but the powerful one, the one who has to make all the decisions. And she puts a stop to it.

One of the things I'm interested inthe sexual part of the relationship is only part of it-is that it can be used for other things. There are so many other things going on. She has to deal with the kids' reaction, and the kids' reaction to the world's reaction to her.

TWT - Lianna was filmed in Hoboken, New Jersey, and your next project is in West Virginia. You like working in different places?

Sayles - One of the things I'm really interested in with movie making is that I don't think that New York is the center of the universe, and I don't think that Los Angeles is the other center. With Secaucus Seven, one of the nice things that happened was that we made a little money in L.A. and quite a bit in New York. Eventually, it was a movie that was basically supported by other cities: Washington, DC, Seattle, Portland and Boston were our best markets. And I feel that Lianna may be the same way.

TWT - We wish you the best of luck, and we appreciate your coming to Texas and talking to TWT. two

MODERN SCREEN - In recent years there has been no artistic partnership more controversial or more continuously interesting than that of film director Martin Scorsese and actor Robert De Niro. Mean Streets, the first Scorsese/De Niro collaboration, shocked the pee out of people back in 1973. but it also impressed enough critics and other fanatics to make it a modern classic. Then came Taxi Driver (with its historical reverberations in addition to artistic merit), New York, New York and Raging Bull, for which De Niro was given 1980's Oscar for Best Actor, Now we have The King of Comedy, a "dramatic comedy" which casts De Niro opposite Jerry Lewis. De Niro plays an aspiring comedian named Rupert Pupkin (who could be a cousin to Taxi Driver's Travis Bickle), and Lewis plays an enormously popular TV talk show host named Jerry Langford (described as a combination of Jerry Lewis and Johnny Carson). The plot just about defies description with its combination of fantasy and bizarre confrontations, but it has something to do with the De Niro character scheming to kidnap the Lewis character in order to get a guest appearance on his talk show. The supporting cast includes nightclub comedienne Sandra Bernhard and Diahnne

Abbott (the real-life Mrs. Robert De Niro, although none of the press kit material mentions this—have they divorced?). Word has it that the next Scorsese/De Niro project will be *The Last Temptation of Christ* with De Niro in the title role.

ON THE RISE - I think Alan Alda's The Four Seasons was just about the most boring film I walked out of in 1981; however, after giving the film another chance by viewing it on cable TV. I had to give Alda credit for casting Bess Armstrong in a pivotal role. She was the best thing in the movie-quite an accomplishment considering that among her co-stars were Carol Burnett, Rita Moreno and Sandy Dennis! Judging from her work in that film, and from her TV series, On Our Own, of a few years ago, it's probably too early to tell if she's destined to replace Jane Fonda. but I think she's off to a good start. Her latest film, High Road to China, has just been released, and, if her performance isn't totally eclipsed by her co-star's pretty face, her role in this very costly action-adventure film could be her biggest break yet. The star of the film, by the way, is none other than Tom Selleck, making his "starring" motion picture debut. If the movie is a total bomb. Bess has another shot coming up this



summer—she has the lead female role in Jaws 3-D. In that one, all she has to contend with is **Dennis Quaid**'s sex appeal and a three-dimensional shark. Well, maybe it'll be a while before she gets the Jane Fonda roles.

ON HARD — Speaking of **Dennis Quaid** (I'd take five minutes with him over an eternity with Selleck), he'll soon be seen in something called *Tough Enough*, in which he stars as a country-western singer-songwriter who finances his musical career by fighting

in amateur boxing events. The supporting cast includes the late **Warren Oates**, in his final film appearance.

IN MEMORIAM - Faye Emerson. who died March 10 at age 65, made her movie debut in 1941 in a Dennis Morgan/Jane Wyman western called Bad Men of Missouri. After that initial appearance and other bit parts in such Warner Bros. films as 1942's Juke Girl (which starred Ronald Reagan and Ann Sheridan), she graduated to more substantial roles in such films as The Mask of Dimitrios (1944), Hotel Berlin (1945) and Her Kind of Man (1946). Although she made over 20 film appearances in a 12-year period, major stardom always eluded her in that medium. It took a new medium-television-to make her a star. Her TV debut was in 1948, and by 1950 she had her own show, a 15minute "chat" called The Fave Emerson Show. Later she hosted a weekly show called Fave Emerson's Wonderful Town. Perhaps her main contribution to television's formative years was

in the area of fashion; for a brief period her customary "plunging neckline" was cause for considerable furor. Throughout the fifties, Faye Emerson continued as one of the most versatile and sought-after personalities in television. and it was Faye, not Lucy, who first earned the title "the first lady of television." Today most people probably remember Faye Emerson best as an immaculately groomed panelist on I've Got a Secret. I, for one, prefer to remember her as the swaggering "Maxine" in the 1944 film Between Two Worlds, where her brassiness was a perfect complement to John Garfield's standard "angry young man" role.

POSTSCRIPT - With celebrities dropping like flies every 15 minutes or so. it's probably impossible for me to pay homage to all of them, but this column has definitely been remiss in not mentioning the death of Eubie Blake last month. Let me make amends. Eubie Blake, born to freed slaves in 1883, was to have a significant influence on America's musical theatre. At age 15 he played ragtime piano in a whorehouse, and the following year he composed "The Charleston Rag." Later, working with various collaborators, he composed songs for such Broadway shows as Shuffle Along, Chocolate Dandies, Elsie and Blackbirds of 1930. He allegedly composed 3,000 tunes in the century before his death on February 12. He died five days before his 100th birthday. w

Ever since gay bars became "trendy" places to be seen, they have attracted a wide spectrum of customers, including non-gays. Just as it is not unusual to find gays in straight clubs, it is also not unusual to find straight people in gay bars, enjoying the music, the customers and the energy.

To answer the questions as to what type and why non-gay people would frequent a gay bar, cultivating gay friends, TWT's Scott Taylor and Bobby Compian conducted the following interview in Austin on January 14, 1983 with Maria Davis, a 19-year-old student and frequent bar patron in the Capitol City.

TWT — What do you think of the term "fag hag"?

Maria — I think the term "fag hag" falls into the same category as "queer" or "faggot" in that it is used as a very derogatory term. Usually it is applied to ugly or fat girls who don't get attention anywhere else and fall all over gay men, often with the intent of trying to get

them in bed. I don't fall into that category and never want to.

When was the first time you set foot in a gay bar?

Approximately a year and a half ago; I believe it was October of 1981. It was quite an experience.

Whatever possessed you to go to the bar?

My brother wanted me to go and I was extremely curious anyway. I was expecting a sleazy bar and pretty scummy people, but what I found was where all of the cute men hung out on weekends.

Why did your brother want to take you to a gay bar?

Well, if you haven't guessed, my brother is gay. We've always been really close, and he had told me that he was gay a few months earlier. He wanted me to meet all of his friends because he thought that would make it easier for me to accept and understand the situation.

Why did you go back?

SCOTT

I had too much fun, and everyone was so nice that I wanted to know them better. When I first started going, it seemed like I was the center of attention and I wondered if I were a novelty. In the straight clubs, I got a different kind of attention that I really didn't appreciate. It was nice to go out and not be worried about obnoxious guys trying to pick me up. Gays were interested in me, not what they could get out of me for a night.

Why do you think gay men appreciate you so much?


It's really hard to say, but I don't think that I intimidate them; I'm just out to dance and party, nothing more. Gays seemed to be intrigued by flashy women too, and when I go out, I try to do that.

Do you ever expect to find straight or "bi" men for something more than partying?

No, that really doesn't cross my mind because I just assume that no one is interested. I have been surprised by how many show an interest. Guys claim to be straight a lot when talking to a straight girl.

Do you think they are?

I can't say they are not, because I am

and I'm there, but I get a bit skeptical when I see how a lot of them carry on on the dance floor with other men.

Do you ever try to pick men up while in a gay bar?


No, that's not why I go; it's not like I can go in a gay bar and expect to find guys interested in that aspect of me.

Have you ever?

Yes, but very rarely. If they come on to me and the attraction is mutual, that's fine. I don't push myself on guys or start something on my own, even in a straight situation. That's just not me.

Okay, so you go out with gays to have fun. Can't you have fun in a straight bar?

Yes, I can, but not a tenth as much. There's too much game-playing and all in straight clubs. Of course, there is in



don't compare. Do you consider yourself a beautiful person?

beautiful people! Straight bars just

Hell, yes! I'm flawless, but that's just my opinion. In fact, if I had been born a boy, I'd probably have been gay and an ultra-pissy drag queen. I love pretty men-even if all I can do is lookmakeup and beautiful clothes.

Do you like drag?

I love it. Female impersonators have taught me a great deal about applying makeup, doing my hair and dressing well. I love the glamour and flash that surround them. Like I said . . . if I'd been a boy.

Have you ever been mistaken for a female impersonator?

God, yes. Many, many times.

Does it bother you?

No, not really, unless they refuse to believe I'm real, and that happens a lot too. I usually take it as a compliment, in a way, because they tell me I'm a flawless queen. Then, when they find





out I'm a real girl, a lot of them sort of lose interest. I guess you could say I'm a gorgeous fake girl, but they don't care since it's not an illusion.

What do your parents think about all this, or do they even know?

Yes, they know. They accept my brother, even though they don't condone it. So his position is no problem, but with me, it's a different matter. They can't seem to understand what attraction I have for partying with gay men, so they oppose it. They let me lead my own life though, but they sure hassle me about my choices. My mom is perhaps a little less apprehensive though. as there is little chance of my being raped or molested.

Your parents accept but do not condone your brother's sexuality. Do you think that they feel that you might be gay as well?

No, they know I'm not a lesbian, but they do have some concern about my associating with them. They still see the image of a rough butch "dyke," and worry about that type of problem for me.

Do you actually know any gay women?

No, I haven't really met very many. The bars I go to aren't "all male"naturally, or I wouldn't be there-but they don't seem to attract many lesbians. I've had a few encounters with same-sex advances, but the girls that I've met and gotten to know a little have been really nice and friendly. They seem a lot less vain and egotistical than many of their male counterparts. So many guys are overly image conscious; they think looks or money make them better than the rest. Lesbians don't seem to fall into that.

Do any of your gay friends use you as a "straight" cover?

That used to happen all the time, until I let some people know that it



bothered me. I thought that was the only reason they wanted to see me outside the bar, and with some, it probably was. I got used for show a lot, whether intentional or not. I love doing other things with my friends-movies, eating out, shopping, hanging around the park or lake-but I feel a whole lot better about going if I know they want me around as a good friend and not just so they can be seen with a girl. It doesn't happen to me much anymore, but you'd be surprised at how "closeted" people are outside the bar here in Austin.

To sum up, what one word would you use to describe your experience with gay people?

the "boys." Well, I wasn't, and I had a devil of a time proving my gaiety to the lesbian community. It wasn't so much that I wanted to prove my sexual status, as I did not want to be mistaken for that "dreaded entity"—the fag hag.

Fag hags are basically straight women who hang around gay men who really want to have sex with these men, or are they? Let's explore an experience I had with one of these women. I'll never forget the first one I ran into. She was in a bar frequented by both men and women.

The night was full of magic; it had been raining most of the day, and at night the streets took on a romantic glow of fire and ice. The bar was packed with beautiful people in beautiful attire, the music was full of inspiration and I was a young dyke "... fit as a fiddle and ready for love" I had taken my promenade through the bar looking


