HEATED DALLAS RUNOFF BATTLE

DALLAS — Oak Lawn City Council member Ricardo Medrano faces challenger Paul Fielding this Saturday, April 16 in one of the gay community's hottest city council runoff battles to date. The heated campaign has roused the interest of even the apathetic, one observer noted to TWT NEWS.

Clearly the clout of the Dallas Gay Political Caucus (DGPC) could be on the line, because if their endorsed candidate, Medrano, is beaten by Fielding, politicians will note the inability of the local gay community to mount a serious bloc vote for their candidate.

It is an uphill battle for Medrano, who was out-tallied in the April 2 election 36% to 38%. Fielding's lead, although narrow, was surprising. Few had expected Fielding to run as strong.

Fielding, who is vice-chair of the Oak Lawn Counseling Center, has criticized Medrano's past performance. Medrano, who faced a similar runoff three years ago, remained confident on election eve that he would win again.

Following the April 2 election, a political gathering was held at the Round-Up club. Fielding did not show. Medrano, who did, thanked DGPC members for their support.

In addition to the Medrano-Fielding runoff, DGPC has two other contests to win this Saturday. For District 9 at-large, Marvin Robinson is a come-from-behind candidate against frontrunner Marvin Rucker. Robinson "has offered unqualified support and sought our endorsement," DGPC assured TWT NEWS.

In District 5, DGPC-endorsed Craig Holcomb out-pollied Aymond 39% to 26%. Holcomb, who has publicly sought the Dallas gay vote, "has positively committed himself on gay issues," DGPC reiterated.

Medrano, Holcomb and Robinson offer the best possibility for effective representation of gay interests on city council, in the opinion of DGPC.

Traditionally, minorities such as gays vote heavily in runoffs. A light general turnout, coupled with a heavy gay turnout, could turn the tide and be pivotal to winning, TWT NEWS reminded.

AUSTIN CHURCH HOSTS DR. FURNISH

AUSTIN — This Sunday, April 17, Dr. Victor Furnish will speak on the subject of the Bible and homosexuality. The lecture will be at the First United Methodist Church, Gayline informed TWT NEWS.

Dr. Furnish is a professor of New Testament studies at the Perkins School of Theology at SMU. "He is a leading exponent of the view that there is no conflict in being both a Christian and a homosexual," Troy Stokes informed TWT NEWS.

EURESTE LABELS VALDEZ "QUEER"

SAN ANTONIO — In the April 2 election, neither Bernardo Eureste nor Jesse Valdez got a majority of the Alamo City vote. Thus, they will face off in a runoff this Saturday, April 16. But the campaign has gotten "dirty."

It is ironic that Eureste, who was endorsed by the Alamo Human Rights Committee (AHRC), called his opponent, Valdez, a "queer" on a local television newscast last week.

Valdez, who is married and the father of a young daughter, held a press conference the next day and termed the

remark so outrageous that he preferred not to dignify the attack with an answer.

Later, Eureste apologized, saying, "I didn't really mean it." He also apologized to AHRC.

In a telephone call to AHRC president Ed Buckmaster, Eureste asked that his apology also be conveyed to the San Antonio gay community. AHRC was dismayed at its candidate's remark, since after questioning his views on gay issues, he was found to be acceptable.

Buckmaster said he found Eureste's apology to be sincere. Meanwhile, it will be thought-provoking to see how sincere the gay vote for Eureste really is in the runoff this Saturday.

SMU GAYS SEEK RECOGNITION

DALLAS — A new group on campus at Southern Methodist University (SMU) has asked the Student Senate for recognition as an official campus group. The newly-formed group is called the Gay and Lesbian Student Support Organization (GLSSO).

TWT NEWS reported on the group's formation last month from Robert Rios, a junior from San Antonio, who had spearheaded the formation six weeks ago. The group's members had avoided major press coverage until they had become officially recognized.

The Senate had formed a committee to study the situation. GLSSO was to have its final hearing this past week, and a vote was expected in several weeks.

The purpose of the SMU group is to provide a community to "alleviate the environment of fear and isolation experienced by gays on the SMU campus," Rios told Jane Wolfe of the *Dallas Morning News*.

SMU student body president, Joe Dooley, said he thought most of the student senators would vote against recognition. Meanwhile, Rios remained confident.

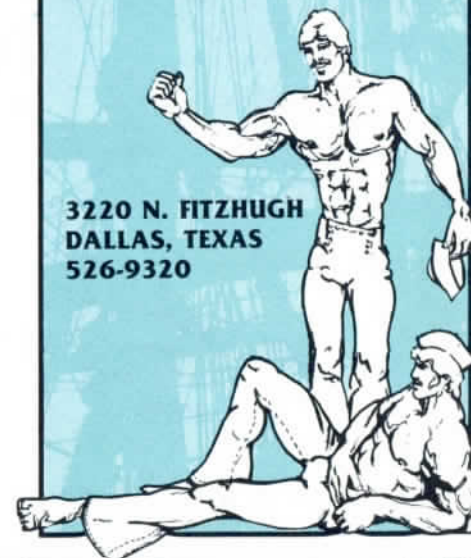
GAY TASK FORCE FIESTA MEETING

GPC STRUCTURE CHANGE

HOUSTON — In the first general meeting of the GPC this month on April 6, discussion on procedure and other issues in adopting a new and simplified committee structure were discussed. The president of GPC, Larry Bagneris, Jr., took questions and suggestions from the general body of members present, attempting to clarify and further define the new structure.

The vote was then made to ratify the new structure of four major committees: Political/Finance; Media Relations; Community Outreach; and Membership/Voter Registration.

Other business of the caucus was also conducted. Bagneris reiterated GPC's commitment to a bi-partisan emphasis on the strength of the caucus. His hope was that the bonds of fellowship and cooperation developed between now and next fall's political campaigns, would serve to maintain their effectiveness as a united body.

The 60-plus members of GPC voted to endorse rape reform bills sponsored by Debra Danburg in the House and John Whitmire in the Senate, supported by the Women's Lobby Alliance (WLA).

The WLA is also working with Houston Mayor Kathy Whitmire's administration on a bill seeking equal work for equal pay, and the caucus voted to be cosigners on that bill.

TWT NEWS learned that City Councilmember George Greanias would be speaking at the next regular meeting of GPC on April 20 at the Holiday Inn. Bagneris also asked the membership to accept the resignation of two board members who had commitments in other areas. After some discussion, the motion passed to accept their resignations, David Fields of TWT NEWS reported.

NEW GAY YOUTH GROUP FORMED

HOUSTON — A new organization intending to serve the needs of young men and women in Houston's Bay Area has been formed as an off-shoot of the 4-year-old Texas Bay Area Gays (TBAG). The new group is known as Texas Bay Area Gay Youth (T-BAGY).

"During the past few months, our organization started receiving an increasing number of telephone calls from area high school- and college-age men and women asking for information and counseling," a TBAG spokesperson told TWT NEWS. "Even though TBAG is open to all age groups, the members decided that the very particular needs of young people could better be served by a group of their own. Thus, T-BAGY was created—an organization for young people, run by young people, and offering social programs and counseling for young people."

Being composed of young members, average age 17, T-BAGY offers a wide range of activities such as biweekly meetings, peer counseling, visits to Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection (MCCR), guest speakers, parties and even plans for entering a float in the upcoming Gay Pride Week.

T-BAGY stated that their purpose "is not to recruit. All of our present members came to us seeking the comfort and counseling we try to offer. It is everyone's desire to be needed."

More information about T-BAGY may be obtained by calling (713) 332-3737. Membership is open to young men and women under 23. Voluntary donation is \$2 a month.

The Bay Area includes Alvin, Clear Lake City, Nassau Bay, Dickenson, Friendswood, Galveston, Hitchcock, Kemah, La Marque, La Porte, League City, Pasadena, Seabrook, Texas City, Webster and other neighboring towns. Membership in T-BAGY is open to young people from other sections of the city as well.

POPPERS NOT AIDS RELATED

ATLANTA — Recently released test results seem most likely to rule out the theory that nitrite-based odorants, often called poppers, relate to AIDS. The announcement was made available to TWT NEWS after Dr. James Curran, assistant director of the Center for Disease Control (CDC) met in this city with Joseph F. Miller, president of Great Lakes Products, the nation's largest manufacturer of odorants (Hardware, Quicksilver and Ram).

"We were pleased to have had the opportunity to meet with officials of the CDC," said Miller. "We were briefed in several areas, including recent and current animal studies, and the data clearly shows that no association exists between nitrite-based odorants and AIDS."

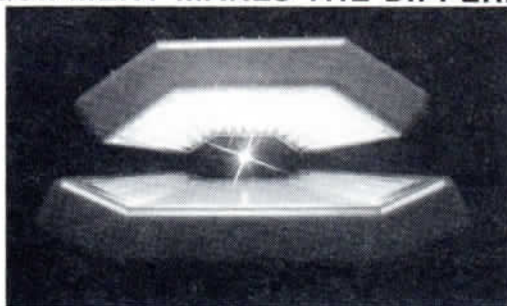
Miller's and the CDC's position was reinforced by an article in the medical journal, *Medical World News*, which printed the following paragraph as part of a significant article on AIDS published in its December 6, 1982 issue: "But one etiologic possibility does seem to have been ruled out. CDC case-control findings along with preliminary results of animal studies have apparently acquitted nitrites."

Simultaneously, an extensive article on the subject of AIDS in the November 16, 1982 issue of the Canadian journal, *The Medical Post*, quoted CDC officials that there had been a "small association with nitrites but we don't think it is important."

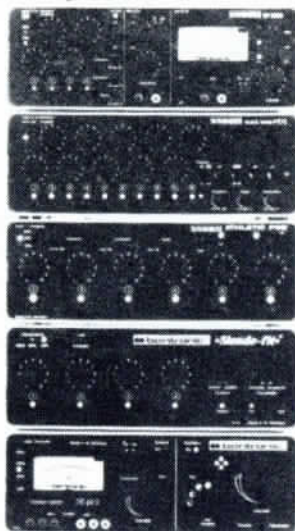
In the same article, Dr. Paul Volberding, chief of oncology at San Francisco General, said that he does not think that the nitrites have much involvement in AIDS and, if they do have an immunosuppressive action, it's not very profound.

"I feel that there is a significant need to educate the gay community in the areas of overall health issues," Miller stated.

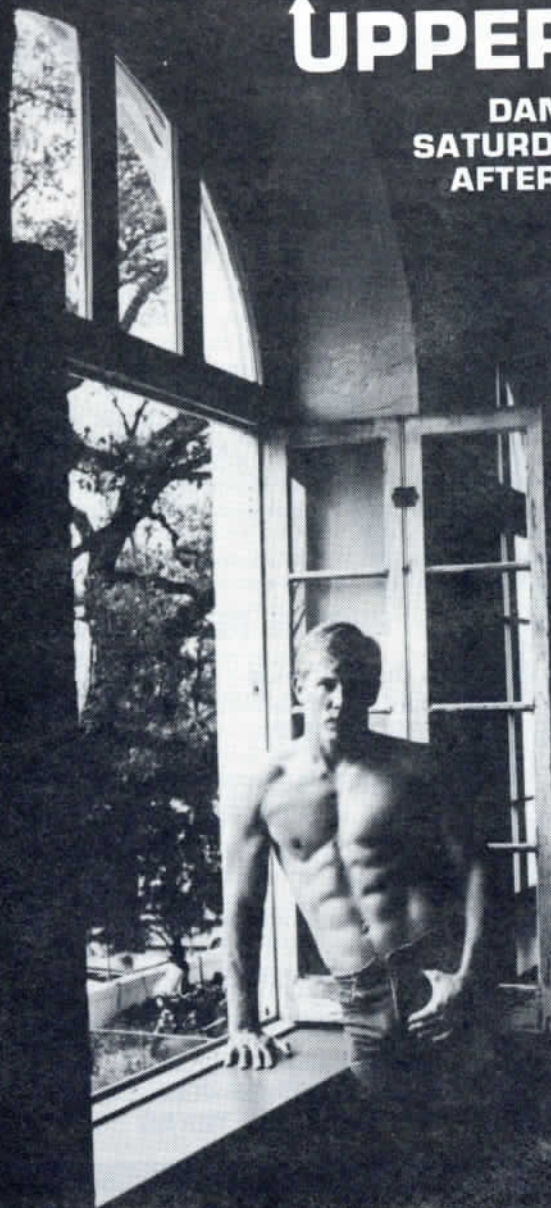

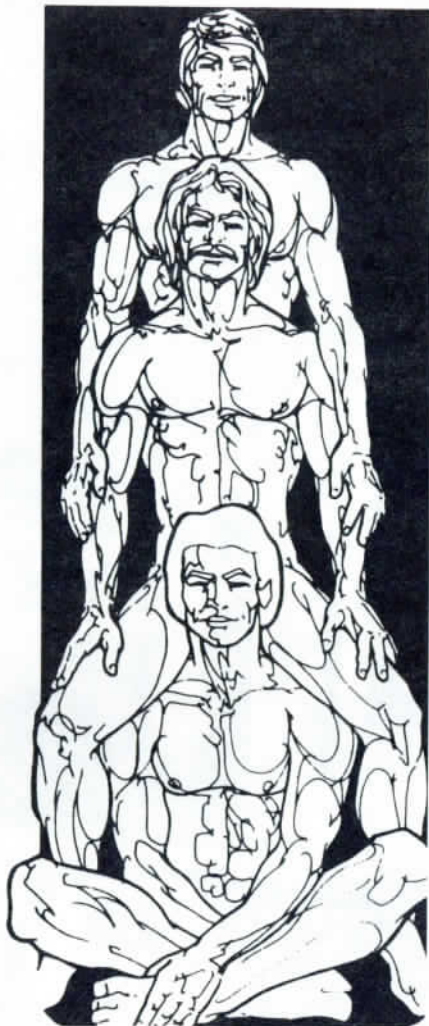

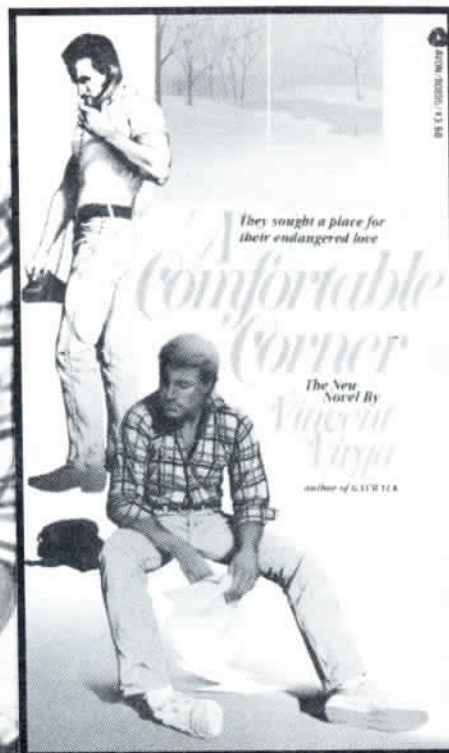

A Comfortable Corner, by Vincent Virga; 324 pp.; Avon Books, The Hearst Corporation, 959 Eighth Avenue, New York, New York 10019; paperback, \$3.50.

It often seems that the main character of most novels written lately is a writer, publisher or editor. It is always easiest to write about what you know. Terence Strange, a writer, and his lover, Christopher More, a poet, star in this richly complex story of love and success, and failure and alcohol in *A Comfortable Corner*, by Vincent Virga. Virga is the author of the first gay Gothic novel, *Gaywyck*, that came out in 1980.

I suspect Virga has a habit of writing

longish novels. *Gaywyck* was 376 pages long; *A Comfortable Corner* is 324 pages long, and I'm sure the two historical novels he is currently working on won't be short either. Fortunately, the pace of his two published novels is well kept, i.e., the plot doesn't drag. But in the novel reviewed here, the reader is assaulted with characters whose lives seem quite independent of the main action and central characters.

There is not a great deal of conflict, very little violence and a small modicum of suspense in the lives of Terence and Christopher as they deal with Christopher's alcoholism and the addictive personalities of those they socialize with. Terence goes to Al-Anon to learn how to cope with Christopher's

disease and, as the main speaking voice throughout the book, reflects the dilemmas and contradictions of saving himself so he can help Christopher save himself.

In fact, the entire book is devoted to the application of the life-saving ideas of Alcoholics Anonymous in the lives of the characters therein. Virga has brought to life the problems and solutions that some gay people have experienced; he has done so thoroughly, and in an entertaining way. All the pathos, anger, guilt and much more that people experience in their unique lives is included here for the readers' enlightenment and diversion.

The novel is not "preachy," nor is it repetitious, and the reader can read it simply for pleasure. The "purpose" of a book in the eyes of the author can differ radically from the perceived "purpose" of the book in the eyes of the reader. Though Virga may have intended to acquaint his audience with AA principles, he also has given us a novel to be read for many other reasons.

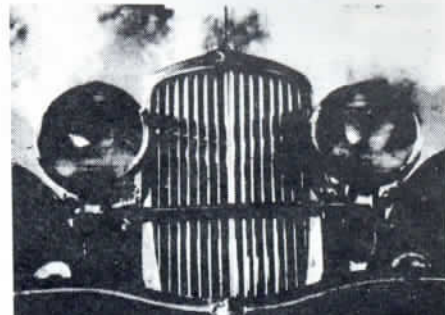
The story begins as Terence realizes he must distance himself from Christopher, whose father is also an alcoholic and gay. Judith, his close friend, and a senior editor at Voyager Press, a publishing house, commiserates with Terence about his relationship. There

are no "bad guy" characters in the novel, only self-destructive ones; the only real "bad guy" here is alcohol.

Virga makes it carefully clear that the self-destructiveness is part of the disease of alcoholism, not of gayness itself. There is the tendency of many writers, gay or non-gay, to include this old canard of "all homosexuals are suicidal" to appeal to the established stereotypes held by the larger non-gay audience. Thankfully, Virga has resisted this trend with *A Comfortable Corner*.

What sets this tale apart from others is the wit, humor, courage and sometimes brutal honesty of the characters as they deal with their problems. This is expected and necessary when the most prevalent response to alcoholism is self-deception and lying to others about their disease. Virga is aware of and sensitive to this response, ultimately producing a novel unique in its evocation of the human condition.

When the gay culture is predominantly centered around and reliant on the bars for social exchanges and conversation, alcoholism is an expected consequence. That more people are not alcoholics is the most surprising result. With hope, Virga and his book, *A Comfortable Corner*, will lead some to a more healthy and long-lived path. **W**

COVERBOYS IN TEARS

the OUTSIDERS

For the most part, this is *West Side Story* for pre-teens. In vain I searched the credits for the name of Walt Disney Productions. This is a very simple, very schmaltzy story about a bunch of street buddies growing up in Tulsa in the early 60s. Its heroes belong to the Greasers who are harassed by a rival street gang, the Socs. If you once in a while find yourself stealing secret glances at *Tigerbeat* or similar heartthrob mags directed at young teenage girls (or boys in doubt), then *The Outsiders* should hold a similar attraction for you. Be warned, though. This pic is a G-rated tease. Its kiddie-cast consists mainly of pretty boys who have already or will shortly decorate the covers of the aforementioned pubertal publications. Among them are Leif Garrett (seen for a total of about two minutes), Matt Dillon, C. Thomas Howell as the actual lead named "Ponyboy," and Ralph Macchio.

The story is based on S.E. (for Susan Eloise!) Hinton's seven-million-seller, which is a rather romantic saga about the hardships of growing up. What the venerable Francis Ford Coppola has made out of it is a melodramatic monster. There are bombastic golden sunsets, endless swollen speeches, a little buddy-buddy hugging and lots of buddy-buddy tears in Tulsa. Aside from

that, many scenes seem crudely cut with vital footage apparently left out completely. Practically all the characters seem phony or underdeveloped and this sentimental little tale is vigorously overblown. Less can be more, Mr. Coppola.

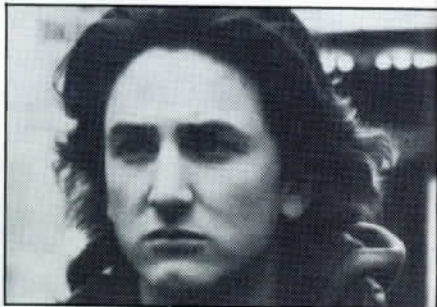
BAD BOYS

If these boys are just plain bad, then Jerry Falwell is just another humane, loving softtouch on the pulpit. No, the central characters of *Bad Boys* are some ultra-mean dudes. Sean Penn portrays Mick O'Brien and—looks aside—he would not be my ideal choice for boy next door.

After a fouled-up drug deal, 16-year-old Mick drives his escape vehicle right into some poor little kid and turns him into an instant has-been. For that deed, Mick gets what he deserves, i.e., a reserved room in an Illinois penitentiary. The interior of this joint for juniors lives pretty much up to all the cliches set by other films of the genre. Mick proves that he is as tough as a kid can be: He possesses a pair of non-discriminating

fists and an admirable amount of guts and eventually becomes the recognized leader of the imprisoned pack. Sean Penn, whose previous credits include *Fast Times at Ridgemont High* and *Taps*—also watch for him in Louis Malle's *Crackers*—is a gifted young actor. Too bad; his role description is a rather one-sided affair, and there is very little room to feel for this dangerous delinquent in view of his largely erratic and furious track record. His roommate and side-kick, who interrupts the ongoing violence with some welcome comic relief, is a pint-size, brainy hood played with insidious finesse by Eric Gurry. The all-out vicious counterpart is muscular Esai Morales, whose eye-for-an-eye rationale probably goes like this: Since you (Mick) killed my kid bro', I'll do worse to your chick. That's the stuff that arch enemies are made of, I guess. Reni Santoni as the sensitive slammer supervisor appears to vie for a big brother role—now there's a twist.

Richard Rosenthal, who gave the world *Halloween II*, has made this a non-feeling routine reel that often aims only for the spectacular. If you see *Bad Boys*, do it for Penn's sake—to study a young, promising actor in action.

CONTEMPORARY GAY CINEMA

TWT was given an exclusive preview of two films that are part of a Contemporary Gay Cinema Series now being distributed in Texas.

Track Two and *Portrait of Jason* are both documentaries, although very different in style and approach. *Track Two* is an examination of the police raids on the gay baths in Toronto a few years ago. Mostly we are shown interviews with activists and witnesses. Many of the women and men of Toronto were deeply affected by the mass demon-

strations that ensued, and they talked about their reevaluation of who they were and what it means to be gay.

The most interesting scenes, of course, are those of the actual demonstrations. The response of the Toronto gay community surprised even the leaders in the gay community. The police were certainly not prepared, although evidence is presented in the film of police infiltration into the gay community.

The second film, *Portrait of Jason*, is completely different. Director Shirley Clarke turns on her camera and lets Jason Holliday talk. Jason Holliday is a fascinating character who's apparently seen and done it all. There are not many people who can hold our attention for over an hour simply by telling anecdotes of their lives. But Jason Holliday is a rare creature. His description of drag queens in Harlem is a scream, and as the film progresses and he gets increasingly drunk and stoned, the stories get wilder and more personal. Interesting stuff.

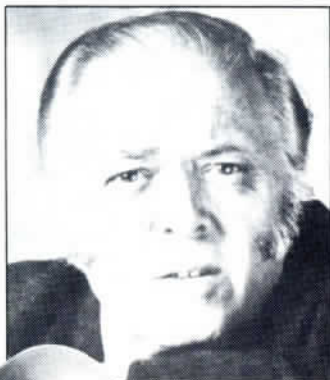

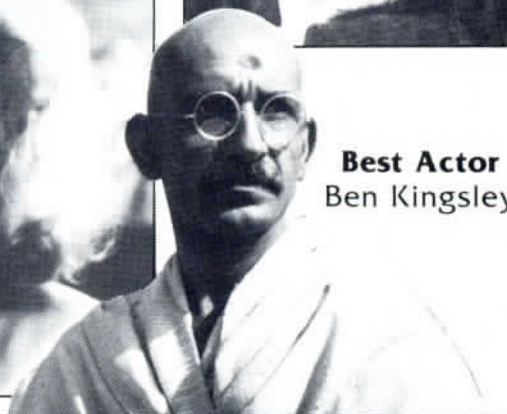

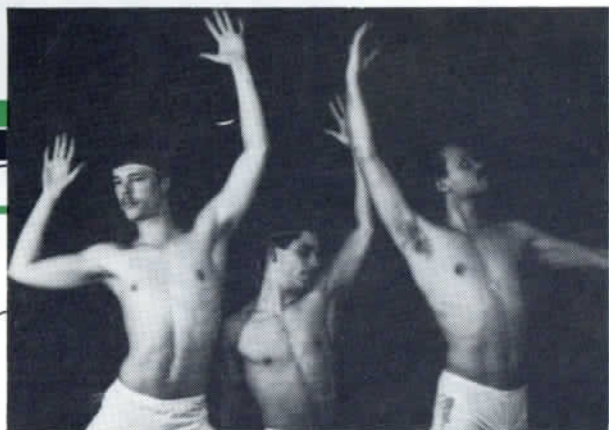

GLORIA SWANSON 1898-1983

Can you think of any name that epitomizes glamour and fantasy more than **Gloria Swanson**? Oh, I guess there's a few that are at least equal—Dietrich, Harlow, Garbo, a few others perhaps. But Gloria Swanson was definitely in a class by herself; most of her greatest films were made long before today's moviegoers were even born and, it seems, she was never out of the spotlight. Although her career went into a bit of a tailspin after her first talkie—1929's *The Trespasser*—her legend probably reached its zenith 21 years later when she starred in Billy Wilder's *Sunset Boulevard*, portraying Norma Desmond, a character that ab-

solutely no other actress could have depicted with such frightening conviction.

In *The Movie Star*, a collection of essays produced by "The National Society of Film Critics" in 1981, a writer named Bernard Drew summed up the Swanson mystique as well as anyone could:

"We all grow old, we fade and wither and stop caring, but not Glorious Gloria, as they called her in her salad days, . . . She is a star like no other star. She invented the business, and if you don't believe it, just watch her make an entrance."

THE WINDS OF VIDEO — Considering the high ratings of ABC-TV's blockbuster mini-series, *The Winds of War* and *The Thorn Birds*, it's safe to assume that we'll be seeing a lot more of the same. In fact, we will all probably have to quit our jobs and give up our sex lives in order to see everything, and I foresee a time when we'll have to prove that we own a video recorder before we can qualify for voter registration. I mean, 1984 is right around the bend. . . . **James Michener's** current bestseller, *Space*, is already being planned as a mini-series, as is **Judith Krantz's** *Mistral's Daughter*. If you are a doomsday freak, then you can look forward to a TV adaptation of **Nevil Shute's** *On the Beach*. Also look for a 10-hour adaptation of **A.J. Cronin's** *The Citadel*, starring **Ben Cross**, who played the Jewish runner in *Chariots of Fire*.

WAIT, THERE'S MORE — Home Box Office's new "HBO Premiere Films" has an interesting assortment of made-for-cable-TV films in the works. You've probably already heard about *The Right of Way*, which teams **James Stewart** and **Bette Davis** for the first time. Add

to that: *Nobody Makes Me Cry* (formerly titled *Intimate Strangers*), which pairs **Elizabeth Taylor** and **Carol Burnett** in a tale about two middle-aged divorcees. In *The Blood of Others*, based on **Simone de Beauvoir's** novel, **Michael Ontkean** (from *Making Love*) and **Jodie Foster** (from just about everywhere), star together in a love story set during WWII in Nazi Germany. And **George Segal** has the lead role in a "supernatural thriller" to be shot on location in West Berlin.

IN MEMORIAM — Although the majority of today's rock fans were born after **Danny and the Juniors'** "At the Hop" incinerated the pop charts in 1957, it's unlikely that any of them are unfamiliar with that particular rock 'n' roll anthem. It was a three-minute masterpiece, and it was followed by another record which, if not a masterpiece, was as prophetic as any record in the history of rock, namely "Rock and Roll is Here to Stay." Unfortunately, while rock 'n' roll may be immortal, rock artists aren't. **Danny Rapp**, lead singer of Danny and the Juniors, died last week at the age of 42, an apparent suicide.
