**21.06 APPEAL NOT FORCED**

AUSTIN — After state Attorney General Jim Mattox decided not to appeal the Texas Penal Code Statute 21.06 ruling earlier this year, two Texas legislators and a prosecutor tried to get the Texas Supreme Court to force Mattox not to drop his appeal. But it was all in vain, observed TWT NEWS, as last week the Texas Supreme Court overruled their attempt. The court sided with Mattox, who believed the state could never win the appeal.

Senator John Leedom (R-Dallas), Representative Bill Ceverha (R-Richardson) and Potter County District Attorney Danny Hill (R) of Amarillo had petitioned the state Supreme Court, stating that Mattox had the legal duty "to represent the state of Texas in all legal proceedings in which vital interests of the state are endangered, including the appeal of any rulings by federal courts which strike down Texas statutes as unconstitutional."

It was Judge Jerry Buchmeyer's ruling last August that declared 21.06, dealing with homosexual conduct, was "unconstitutional."

**NEW ANTI-GAY BILL MAY PASS**

AUSTIN — Although State Representative Ceverha and State Senator Leedom filed last week on the floor of the Texas Supreme Court to force Attorney General Jim Mattox not to drop his appeal of 21.06, they may not fail on the floor of the Texas Legislature to redesign Texas' Homosexual Conduct Law.

In essence, if you can't win in the courts, then try again in the Legislature. And, if you can't get the old law (21.06)

to stay on the books, then draw up a brand new law (HB-2138).

That, simply stated, is exactly what has become the strategy of these two North Texas legislators.

Their proposed law, which has been described as having been born in a frenzy, may just possibly garner enough conservative strength to make it to the House floor for a vote.

In spite of its ridiculous language and stipulations, Bettie Naylor, gay lobbyist on Capitol Hill, confided to TWT NEWS in a conversation from her Austin office, that "the bill still has a good chance of passing," and we should not sell its possible passage short.

The proposed anti-gay legislation would make it a class "B" misdemeanor, punishable by a maximum six months in jail and a \$1,000 fine, to engage in specified sexual acts. The bill would also make repeat offenses a third degree felony punishable by a maximum ten years in prison and a \$5,000 fine.

**GOVERNOR WHITE APPOINTS COLEMAN**

AUSTIN — Governor Mark White, who was endorsed by Houston's Gay Political Caucus (GPC), has appointed the new vice-president of GPC, Marion Coleman, to his new Women's Commission. TWT NEWS has learned that the commission, which is a first for Texas, was set up to protect the issues which affect women, including all aspects from rape to working conditions.

Coleman explained that the commission would consist of a chairperson, a vice-chair and approximately 15 members from across the state. Coleman was informed of her appointment, which she dutifully accepted, by a spokesperson for the Governor's office, Dwayne Holman. Holman further ex-

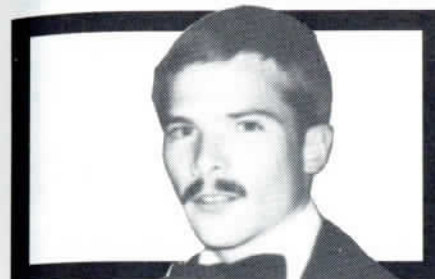

plained that the Women's Commission would meet on a quarterly basis.

### GEOFFREY THURMAN DIES OF AIDS

HOUSTON — Geoffrey Thurman, 31, died at St. Luke's Hospital around 11:00am last Sunday, April 17, of AIDS complications resulting from pneumocystis carinni pneumonia (PCP). Thurman had only been ill since January.

Thurman was born in Dearborn, Michigan and moved to Houston nine years ago, where he was in partnership and president of Wall Techniques. His nine-year life and business partner was Dennis Bergen.

Thurman is also remembered as co-founder and host of the successful Mardi Gras Madness collective.

He is survived by his mother Phyllis and father Eugene of Fort Myers, Florida, and by a brother, Jack, of San Diego.

Services were held at Settegast-Kopf Funeral Home, with cremation following, TWT NEWS was informed.

"In memory of Geoffrey, all donations should be marked AIDS, M.D. Anderson Cancer Prevention Center, AIDS Research," friends of the family explained.

Thurman becomes the twelfth known Texan to die of AIDS. The first victim was two years ago, TWT NEWS recalled.

### AIDS CANDLELIGHT VIGIL MAY 2

HOUSTON — A nationally-coordinated day of candlelight vigils has been scheduled across the U.S. for May 2, TWT NEWS has learned from Houston's KSC-AIDS committee. The event will memorialize AIDS victims.

Phone calls to President Reagan will also be made to bring pressure on government leaders to allocate needed research funds, which have been slow in coming. All three TV networks have agreed to national coverage.

The National Gay Task Force (NGTF) has coordinated the effort and the KSC-AIDS committee of this city is sponsoring the Houston vigil at the Reflection Pool at City Hall beginning at 8:30pm, Steve Shifflet, community coordinator, announced.

Speakers are being contacted and citizens are asked to bring a candle and participate. "The White House telephone line should light up beginning at 8:00pm that night," Shifflet explained, "so please plan to call."

Burial was in St. Louis where his mother and step-father reside. May was also survived by a twin brother.

A memorial service was held April 15 at Mary's Lounge where May, also known as Peaches, had bartended for seven years. May had also worked at the Midnite Sun and the original Dirty Sally's.

A more formal service was conducted on Sunday, April 17 at MCCR, of which May was a member. He was also a member of the Montrose Singers.

May is probably best remembered for his performances as a female impersonator, under the name Peaches. TWT NEWS recalled his consistent efforts at fundraisers, especially his tireless emcee-auctioneering at Granny's annual Christmas In July benefits.

While May did not die of AIDS, memorial contributions can be made through KSC or MCCR for research of the disease. "It is only fitting that we give in the name of one who gave of himself for so many benefits," a close friend stated.

### BUDWEISER HOSTS GAY PRIDE MEETING

HOUSTON — Southwest Distributing Company has arranged with this city's Gay Pride Week (GPW) board of trustees to host a special meeting next Wednesday, April 27, in the Hospitality Room at the Budweiser Brewery, 1301 White Street off I-10 West.

At the gathering, Budweiser will present Houston's GPW with a \$5,000 donation. "They will also present us with a special surprise for our parade," GPW's Marion Coleman told TWT NEWS.

In appreciation, the board of trustees, which includes Coleman, Larry Bagneris, John Kirk, Andy Mills, Tony Vega and Roz Vecchio, invited all workers of GPW and the concerned public to the meeting and celebration, which begins at 7:30pm.

## FIELDING NARROWLY BEATS MEDRANO

DALLAS — Paul Fielding narrowly squeezed by incumbent Ricardo Medrano by 226 votes (52% to 48%) to win the District 2 City Council runoff election April 16. In the April 2 vote, Fielding's lead was slightly more with 400 votes.

Raw vote data examined by DGPC showed that most gays voted the DGPC ticket; but, "the numbers just weren't there." In some gay precincts, voter turnout was as high as 20%, compared to a city-wide turnout of only 8%.

Medrano attributed his loss to a lack of popularity in black neighborhoods. Blacks had tried to recall him in 1981 in an unsuccessful petition drive, TWT NEWS noted.

Medrano also blamed his loss on re-districting in 1982, which worked against him because it increased the number of middle-class, older white voters who voted for Fielding.

Fielding stated that "evidently Medrano was not representing his district, even though it was a minority district. . . . The man who was of a minority did not represent all the minorities." District 2 has become 60% hispanic and black.

DGPC told TWT NEWS that they looked forward to working with Fielding, even though he was not endorsed. Fielding had said he never wanted the official gay endorsement, but he did want their support.

The *Dallas Times Herald* quoted from a tape recording by Fielding, "I felt that if I sought the endorsement . . . there might be some public smearing of the fact that, uh, as has been stated, that, uh, that I am gay."

When asked by the *Dallas Times Herald* about the statement, Fielding at first denied it. He then said he meant to tell the group that he was not gay but that "he (Medrano) would come out and

say that I was. . . . I think what I said was the fact that he would come out and say that I was, not that I was."

Can Medrano's loss be viewed as a loss of credibility for DGPC? Most likely not, since in District 5, DGPC's Craig Holcomb ran very strong, 60-80%, compared to a city-wide sweep of only 54%. In the at-large District 9 council seat, DGPC's Marvin Robinson lost the election to Rucker 32% to 68%. Yet in gay precincts, candidate Robinson ran as strong as 70%, TWT NEWS learned.

Obviously, DGPC can still get out the gay vote on its own home-turf precincts. It's beyond Oak Lawn where the gay vote splits.

## AHRC's EURESTE BEATS VALDEZ

SAN ANTONIO — Bernardo Eureste, who the Alamo Human Rights Commission (AHRC) "found acceptable" on gay issues, beat his opponent, Jess Valdez, 55% to 45% in the April 16 City Council runoff election.

The win assured gay citizens of San Antonio a friendly vote on City Council in District 5. Eureste's views on gay issues were noted when AHRC interviewed candidates prior to endorsement.

One week prior to the election, Eureste had appeared on a local television newscast, labeling his opponent a "queer." Later, he apologized to both Valdez and AHRC, asking that his apology be conveyed to the local gay community.

Ed Buckmaster, AHRC president, said that Eureste's apology was sincere, TWT NEWS had learned.

Thus, in this month's City Council races, three out of five AHRC candidates won—an impressive win for San Antonio gay voters, especially considering that this was the first time gay voters were guided by gay endorsements as they went to the polls. Heretofore, there had been no gay endorsements in this city until AHRC was formed earlier this year.

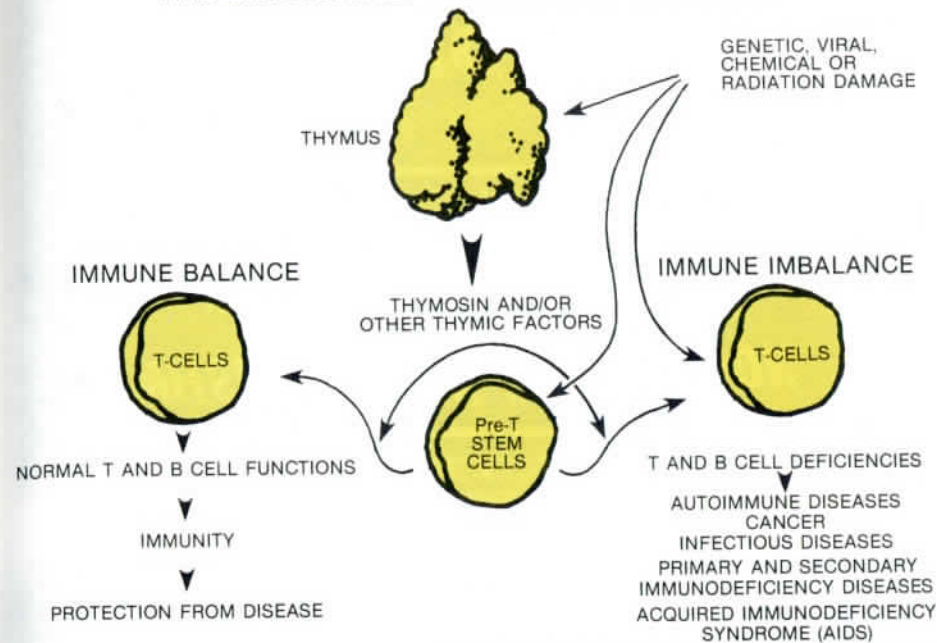

# SPECIAL REPORT

## THE ENDOCRINE THYMUS AND IMMUNITY



Last month TWT NEWS reported that researchers at George Washington University believed that Acquired Immune Deficiency (AIDS) may be caused by a hormone imbalance. This week, TWT presents a special report on the 83rd annual meeting of the American Society for Microbiology held in March. The speaker was Dr. Allan L. Goldstein, professor and chairman of the Department of Biochemistry at George Washington University School of Medicine in Washington, D.C. He spoke on elevated Thymosin A — Levels in AIDS and the development of a blood test to identify individuals at high risk for AIDS.

Blood measurements of thymosins, the hormones of the thymus gland that control immunity, are providing important clues to the identification of individuals at high risk for AIDS.

Dr. Goldstein reported that individuals can be identified on the basis of abnormally high levels of circulation thymosin. These studies have utilized a new blood test developed by Dr. Goldstein and his colleagues at the university, and should help in identifying the cause of AIDS, provide a rapid test for screening, and in identifying suspect

blood in blood bank programs.

The thymus gland, the master gland of the immune system, does not function properly in patients with AIDS and produces abnormally large amounts of thymosins, the hormones that control white blood cells. The thymus gland (see illustration) controls the maturation of a type of white blood cell, called T-cells, from bone marrow, and helps to maintain immune balance by secreting thymic hormones. Damage resulting from exposure to radiation, viruses or other pathogens or chemi-

als can upset the delicate balance of the immune system and result in a number of diseases such as cancer and infectious diseases, as well as a number of autoimmune diseases.

In patients with AIDS there is an almost complete disruption in thymic function. Dr. Goldstein's studies suggest that the thymus gland itself might be the focal site for an infectious agent responsible for the disease.

Since 1980, physicians in the U.S. have diagnosed more than 1,200 Americans suffering from AIDS. A large number of these patients have already died, including 80% of the patients who had the disease for more than two years. Although the initial victims of this disease were primarily from the homosexual community, more recently, increasing numbers of patients have come from a number of other groups including hemophiliacs, children following blood transfusions and Haitian immigrants.

The problem of potential contamination of the nation's blood supply by AIDS blood has resulted in a massive effort by the American Red Cross, the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and other public health organizations in the U.S. to develop approaches to unravel the cause of this mysterious illness, as well as to develop tests which might identify suspect blood. This past year, for example, eight of the 70 hemophiliac deaths reported were caused by AIDS, now the second leading cause of death in patients with hemophilia.

The prime concern of blood programs throughout the country is that all patients receiving blood transfusions are at high risk. This has been emphasized recently by the documentation of several cases of children developing AIDS following blood transfusions.

Early diagnosis of individuals at high risk for AIDS should provide a warning signal and lead to prompt medical treatments for this serious illness.

If spring is here, can softball be far behind? And softball heroes?

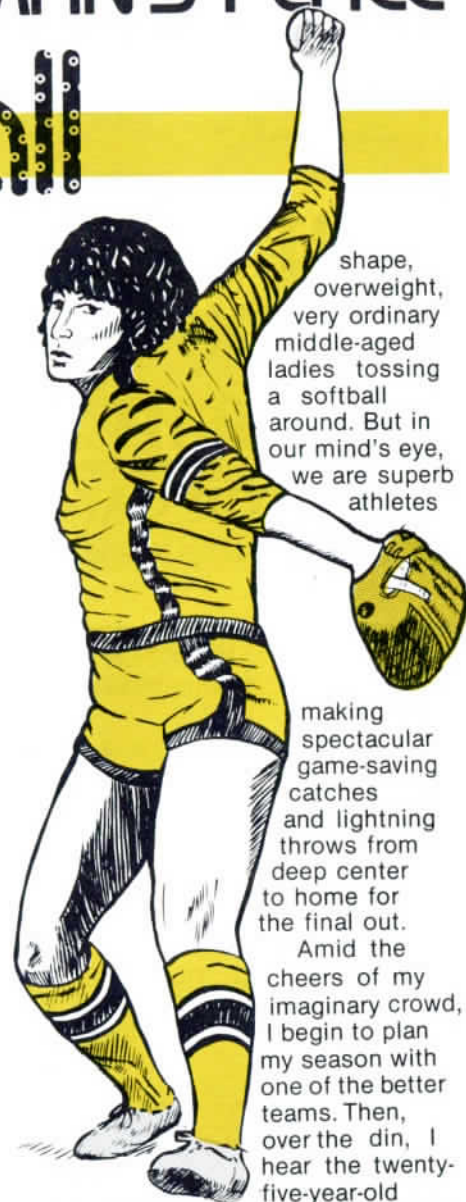

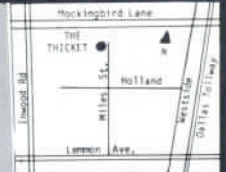

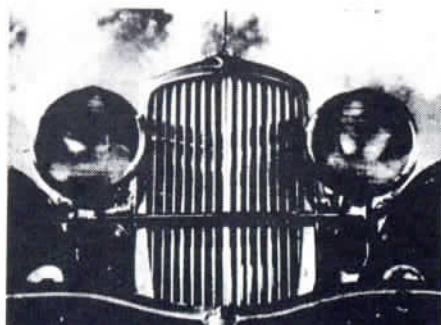

"Researchers at the Center for Disease Control in Atlanta, Georgia, estimate that 30% of the sexually active American population have been exposed [to herpes]." This information begins the introduction to *Herpes: Cause & Control*, a book written by William H. Wickett, Jr., M.D. He wrote it based on information gathered in a research study he conducted as Director of Medical Studies at California State University, Fullerton. He discovered a crying need for facts by not only those afflicted by herpes, but by medical doctors throughout the country.

Possibly the most important word in the title of the book is "control." There is no known final cure for herpes; in fact, the virus is all around us, but the symptoms and pain of the disease can be controlled. The medication Acyclovir, under the trade name Zovirax, was approved on March 30, 1982 by the FDA as an ointment. Dr. Wickett provides a clear description of its nature and use. "Control" means more than the use of this medication, which Dr. Wickett also explains.

What makes this disease most interesting is its relationship to a reduced immune response, such as that found in AIDS. Many factors influence our immune response, and Dr. Wickett examines these factors, as well as the "triggers" that activate a herpes episode or flare-up. He mentions ways to bolster our immune response that may be helpful in preventing herpes and preventing

or minimizing a reduced immune response.

The beginning includes a medical disclaimer of responsibility for those who would use the book as a medical manual for self-treatment. He warns that the information provided here should make persons aware and alert to the symptoms so that a doctor familiar with herpes can diagnose and treat the person. What treatments are available are included to show the person who has or may have herpes that there are treatments for it, and thus minimize much of the pain and anguish they feel.

Dr. Wickett is very personable and thorough in his tone as he gives us this information. He feels this is very necessary for those who are experiencing a great deal of pain and fear caused by misinformation, or lack of information, about the disease. The situation is similar to the times a few years ago when people had no information about syphilis or gonorrhea. The doctor is very aware of the need to treat the patient and not just the disease.

As mentioned earlier, Dr. Wickett thoroughly covers all aspects of the disease, symptoms, history of treatments, the psychological components of the disease (stress and its opposite, positive feelings and laughter), lifestyle practices, similar diseases (mistaken

for herpes) and problems that are sex-specific. Dr. Wickett is very compassionate in the writing of this book and clearly illustrates his concern that everyone should be aware of and involved in the prevention and treatment of this problem.

To further amplify his point, he provides case histories of persons he has seen. They do not seem to add much, most of the time, to what he said previously, but they clearly show realistic occurrences of the illness. Dr. Wickett does include homosexual case histories in the book, but whether a man or woman gets it from another man or woman does not make much difference, except where the lesions are found, depending on what type of sex the persons had.

Prevention is dependent on information, careful observation of your body, your partner, and lifestyle practices that may reduce your immune response. Dr. Wickett has written a superbly warm, comprehensive and informative compendium of all that is known about herpes in an effort to protect everyone from danger and allow us to live our lives happy and free from fear. He succeeds through his book, but it is up to those who read it to adopt an informed attitude and reflect that attitude in their lives.

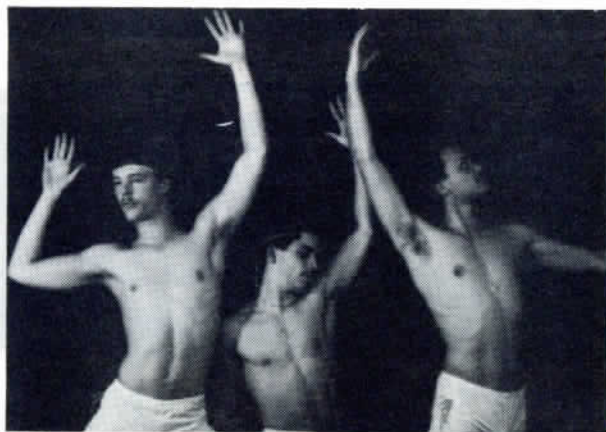

Don't anybody accuse the folks in Film City, California of being ignorant of the current shitty economic climate. They have figured out precisely, with their IBM-brains, what people nowa-

days want: sweet success stories with happy endings.

*Flashdance* is yet another account of persons who dare to dream. Immortal

direct quote: "If you give up your dream, you die." That's so new and so deep. What we have here is a cook whose ambition is to be the new Steve Martin; a waitress who's out to be a skater of Holiday-On-Ice stature; and a welder hoping to make it as a ballerina. The welder is called Alex, and Alex is a female—now, isn't that a cute twist? This lead role is portrayed with all-natural, youthful enthusiasm by newcomer Jennifer Beals. Ms. Beals, with her more cute than pretty looks, is one of the few plus-points the picture has to offer. Another plus is the warm, often soft-colored, always imaginative photography by Don Peterman. The third,

mildly positive aspect is an unusual location: Pittsburgh turns out not to be the pits at all, with its steel mills that make for a dirty metallic, non-scenic,

yet authentic background.

I felt rather indifferent toward the music masterminded by the duke of disco, Giorgio Moroder (who produced Donna Summer et al., and received an Academy Award for *Midnight Express*). Nothing struck me as ultimately original; not even Irene Cara's rendition of the title song has anywhere near the same fervor as "Fame," her 1980 Oscar-

grabber. The choreography in this type of song-and-dance movie is of utmost importance. Allan Carr-discovery Jeff-

rey Hornaday has devised a lot of new steps, but they sometimes look a bit strained; unfortunately, he decided to shoot some of the segments in "fast motion." All too seldom does he opt for pure happy-go-lucky playfulness. The blinding lightning stage dance that gives the movie its title makes you want to rush out and call your eye doctor.

Everything else spells bad news: *Flashdance* is a sketchy, skimpy, positively predictable picture. The acting, aside from Ms. Beals', ranges from mediocre via forgettable to borderline obnoxious.

At one point, during an "ice-capade" tryout the hopeful waitress engages in, a spectator on the screen remarks: "How long does this thing last?" My sentiments precisely.

*Flashdance* is *Fame* warmed over;

however, by far not as genuinely engaging. All we're expected to do is observe, not feel, not care.

A Chuck Norris film is a Chuck Norris film and with any other actor would be a Bruce Lee or Clint Eastwood movie. *Lone Wolf McQuade* is part of "commodity filming": A performer does one thing well and they film a story (and all subsequent stories) around those skills. So, it should not amaze you that the martial arts of Mr. Norris are showcased, along with his very hairy torso (which found me humming the score to *Planet of the Apes*).

Chuck Norris stars as J.J. McQuade, a maverick Texas Ranger who crusades for justice in Orion Pictures' *Lone Wolfe McQuade*.

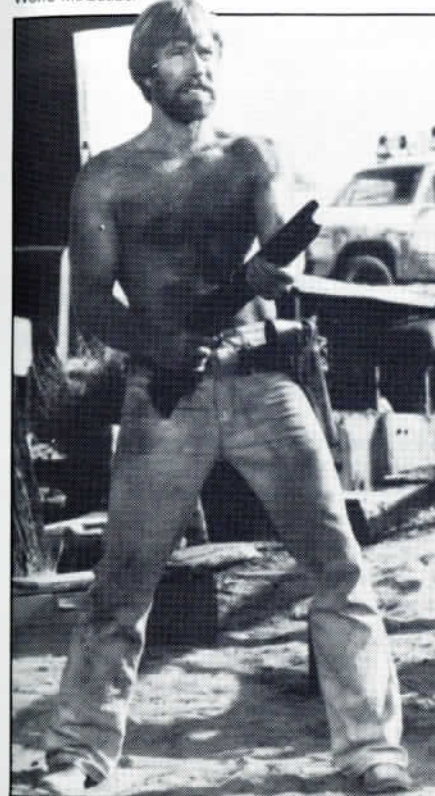
Beyond this forest is the tale of an unruly West Texas ranger who must bring to justice those meanies who have murdered his friend, a "pusher," his pet wolf and kidnapped his daughter, all in their pursuit of selling stolen U.S. arms to South America. Talk about busy schedules.

The writing of *Lone Wolf McQuade* would be best mounted in the style of early Lillian Gish: silents. It's teeming with such sparklers as four FBI men charging a troop of antagonists yelling "Drop your weapons, this is the FBI!" Come on! Even the Girl from U.N.C.L.E. would have enough sense to go back for help.

I must say that I can admire the martial arts talent of Mr. Norris, but then, I can't open a bag of chips without scissors. His acting did not once tempt me to reach for my "flight bag."

Barbara Carrera gets my Ursula Andress "Going Nowhere" award, and David Carradine, along with the rest of the cast, delivers little to save *Lone Wolf* from colliding with memory loss.

You may want to catch this before it's shelved next to *Man, Woman & Child* (approx. four weeks), but Mr. Movies recommends awaiting its arrival on cable with the sound turned off and Queen's "Another One Bites the Dust" turned on.

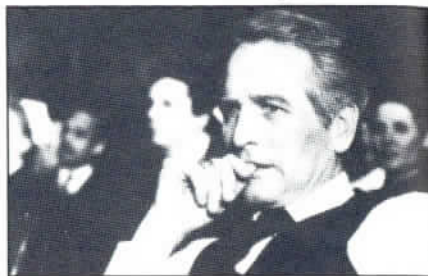

**RETURN OF THE BOUNTY** — In 1935 the Academy Award for Best Picture was given to *Mutiny on the Bounty*, which starred **Clark Gable** as the rebellious Fletcher Christian and **Charles Laughton** as the tyrannical Captain Bligh, and the film remains to this day one of the greatest nautical adventures of all time. In 1962, at a time when the Hollywood powers believed that the public was still starved for expensive epics, a new version was released, and this version also had a lot going for it, particularly a fine performance by **Trevor Howard** as Captain Bligh and some exquisite photography. Unfortunately, the 1962 remake starred **Marlon Brando** as Fletcher Christian and, for once, his extraordinary talents were not in evidence—his ridiculous performance severely limited the film's success. And so you can imagine my shock a few years ago when I heard that *Mutiny on the Bounty* was being remade *again*, this time with paunchy old Brando in the Captain Bligh role. I'm happy to report that the rumor didn't pan out, but the **Nordhoff-Hall** story is about to be refilmed in an "update" called *The Bounty*. Are you ready for the cast? **Mel Gibson** (pant, pant) as Fletcher Christian, **Anthony Hopkins** as Captain Bligh and **Laurence Olivier** as Admiral Hood. The new version, under the auspices of **Dino De Laurentiis**, will be directed by **Roger Donaldson**, the New Zealand filmmaker whose reputation was established with 1981's *Smash Palace*.

**TAKE 83** — I think a lot of us were surprised and somewhat disappointed that **Paul Newman** didn't win his long overdue Oscar this year (and I don't mean to disparage **Ben Kingsley's** remarkable portrayal of Gandhi); however, it already appears that Newman may have his best shot coming in 1984. He's

currently directing himself in something called *Harry & Son*, which co-stars Mrs. Newman (**Joanne Woodward**, as if you didn't know) and **Robbie Benson**. Newman also had a hand in the screenplay for *Harry & Son*, and I think the picture will be out by Christmas. . . . **Shelley Winters** (I feel like saying "the perennial Shelley Winters") is back in front of the cameras in *My Darling Shiksa*, starring with **Elliott Gould**, **Margaux Hemingway**, **Carol Kane** and **Sid Caesar**. . . . And **Kurt Russell**, soon to be seen in **Mike Nichols'** *Silkwood*, is currently working on *Swing Shift* with **Goldie Hawn**.

**WHERE ARE THEY NOW?** — Does anybody remember singer **Bonnie Tyler**? Her only appearance on the American pop charts came in June of 1978, when her version of "It's a Heartache" reached #3, beating out competition from **Juice Newton** and **Ronnie Spector**, each of whom recorded respectable versions of the tune at about the same time. Bonnie recently turned up at #1 on the British charts with a

single called "Total Eclipse." I don't know if the record has been released over here. . . . The recent British charts held another surprise, namely a duet with **Cliff Richard** and, of all people, **Phil Everly** of the **Everly Brothers**. Their song is called "She Means Nothing to Me," and it recently slid out of the British top ten. . . . And while I'm on the subject of duets—**Willie Nelson's** latest single is a duet with **Brenda Lee**, called "You're Gonna Love Yourself (In the Morning)." Brenda is due for a major comeback, don't you think. . . . The **8th Day**, a "soul" group of the early 70s, only had one big hit, namely "She's Not Just Another Woman," produced by ex-Motown super-producers **Holland, Dozier** and **Holland** (who gave the **Supremes** ten #1 hits a few years earlier).

Somehow, the 8th Day is still around, and their new single, "Call Me Up," was produced and co-written by **Brian Holland** of Holland, Dozier and Holland. . . . And you might be interested to know that two rockers from the 60s, **Dion** ("Runaround Sue") **DiMucci** and **Johnny** ("Poor Side of Town") **Rivers** are now Christians and have recently recorded "gospel" albums. The Dion album, *I Put Away My Idols*, is actually that artist's *third* album of religious music. Rivers' album, his first in a religious vein as far as I know, is called *Not a Through Street*.

**IN MEMORIAM** — Mexican born Lolita Dolores Martinez Asunsolo Lopez Negrete was dancing at a party in her own home when she was "discovered" by Hollywood film director **Edwin Carew**. With her name shortened to **Dolores Del Rio**, she made her film debut with 1925's *Joanna*, and thereafter, in a career that spanned 50 years, she was often considered "the most beautiful woman in the world"—in her case it wasn't an exaggeration! In the 20s and 30s she was also one of Hollywood's busiest actresses, appearing in such films as *What Price Glory* (1926), *Ramona* (1928), *Bird of Paradise* (1932), *Flying Down to Rio* (1933), *Madame Du Barry* (1934) and *In Caliente* (1935). After a romance with **Orson Welles**, with whom she starred in 1943's *Journey Into Fear*, she decided to leave Hollywood; and she was quoted at the time as saying: "I wish to choose my own stories, directors and cameramen. I can do that better in Mexico." Although she did become one of Mexico's top stars, she returned to the U.S. for a few more film appearances; her most publicized "comeback" was probably in 1960 when she returned to play **Elvis Presley's** mother in *Flaming Star*. Dolores Del Rio died April 11 at the age of 78.

**VICTORY** — The **River Oaks Theatre** was found not guilty of promoting obscenity, and the movie in question, *Salò*, was found not to be obscene, a jury ruled on April 11, after a five-day trial. Former manager of the theatre, **Don Bonetati**, was also found not guilty. To exclaim the victory, the marquee in the fashionable shopping center proclaimed "We Won!"

The brouhaha erupted on the night of September 9, when vice officers entered the theatre and seized the film, but not until waiting for the movie to be completed. No customers were arrested.

On April 5, the jury went to the theatre to view the controversial film about life in Italy under Fascist rule. The jury was described as so conservative that one member even testified that "homosexuality leads to silliness or death."



"The ACLU was most instrumental in our victory," **Maureen MacNamara**, current theatre manager, told us.

Asked if the River Oaks Theatre would show the movie again, Macnamara said, "Yes, most likely late this summer." Previous film bookings make showing *Salò* sooner impossible, she explained.

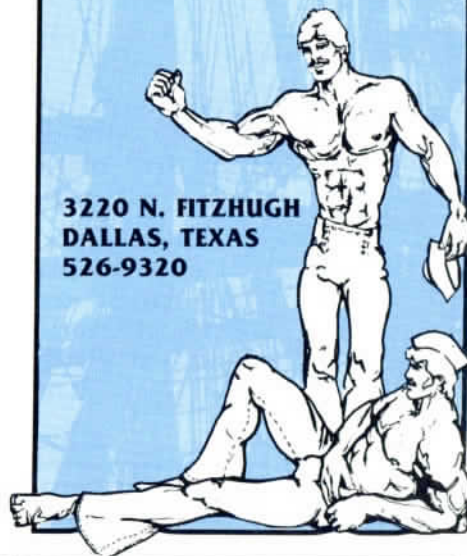

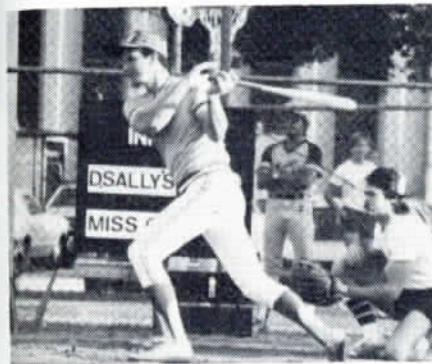
