**AIDS ACTION  
PROJECT-DALLAS**

**DALLAS** — In response to community needs, the Oak Lawn Counseling Center has launched an AIDS Action Project. Community education, clearinghouse and patient support services were listed as the three component intra-workings of the new proposal, TWT NEWS was advised.

Dallas and the North Texas gay community were at the heart of the new project. Local health professionals and the media were also targeted.

The center recently opened a 24-hour AIDS information hotline (214-528-2181), which is providing physician referrals and answering specific questions related to AIDS.

Quarterly AIDS information forums are also being produced by the center to update the public. Videotapes of the forums are available for individual and group showings.

The Oak Lawn Counseling Center is also providing counseling for individuals and groups.

"The center is also providing a 'buddy system' for AIDS patients," it was stated to TWT NEWS. "Under this system, volunteers are being trained to assess patient needs during home or hospital visits, and providing support services."

**CALL REAGAN MAY 2

**HOUSTON** — Next Monday night, May 2, candlelight vigils for public health will be held across America to bring attention to AIDS. The vigils will not only memorialize recent AIDS victims, but also be a plea that more public funding be released for AIDS research.

All three major television networks and cable news hookups will broadcast the message to America.

Texas will be a viable part of the endeavor as the KSC-AIDS Committee of Houston, in conjunction with the Citizens for Human Equality (CHE), have called the community to a candlelight vigil at the Reflection Pool of Houston's downtown City Hall, beginning at 8:00pm. "Please bring a candle and a paper cup, because of city ordinance," coordinator Steve Shifflet, president of CHE, told TWT NEWS.

Mayor Whitmire, who recently withdrew hesitation created a city-sponsored AIDS Working Group chaired by Dr. Newell, had been requested to proclaim AIDS Awareness Week. Whitmire's intentions would tie in with similar proclamations from Mayor Edward L. Koch in New York and Mayor Dianne Feinstein in San Francisco. "The three cities showing a unified front surely would demonstrate the concern for the AIDS crisis," Shifflet told TWT NEWS.

Speakers will include City Controller Lance Lalor, who was expected to announce local AIDS funding as part of the city's new budget, and Nathan Smith, president of the National Hemophilia Foundation, which has endorsed this vigil.

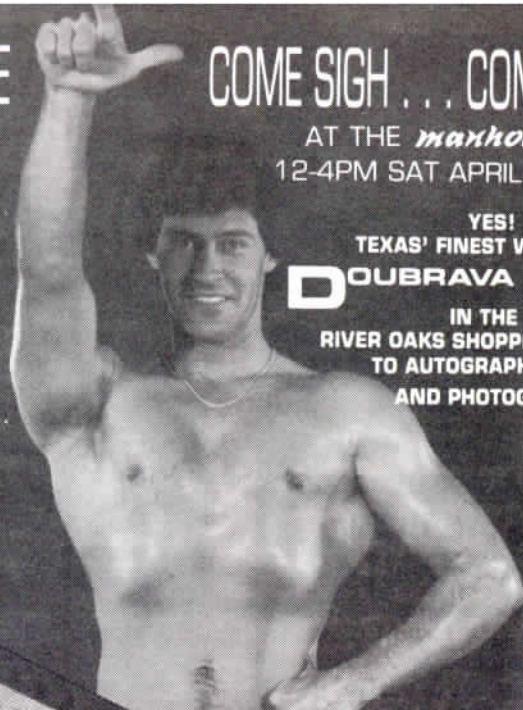

## DALLAS CLUB OWNER SHOT

DALLAS — A late-night argument over the 10¢ drink key on a cash register at The Saint, a gay club in this city, led to the shooting death of Jim McNabb, 37, at the home he shared with his life and business partner, David Reed, 25. McNabb and Reed were co-owners of The Saint and Uptown Dallas.

TWT NEWS learned that McNabb had attacked Reed after they got to their home at 3515 Brown around 3:00am, after closing the club. McNabb, after drinking heavily all day, had become violent and repeatedly attacked Reed.

McNabb had overpowered Reed on the floor of their kitchen, where he was banging Reed's head on the floor. In trying to get up, Reed reached for a kitchen drawer containing a .38 caliber pistol.

Reed aimed the gun at McNabb in self defense, asking his assailant to stop. "I never intended to shoot," Reed said. However, McNabb continued to

beat Reed, forcing him to fire four shots into McNabb's chest.

Reed was briefly hospitalized at Medical City Hospital, was not jailed and was released on \$5,000 bond. A preliminary hearing will determine whether the case will be heard by a grand jury.

Funeral services were held for McNabb last Monday, April 25 in Tulsa, at the family home. He is survived by a former wife and two pre-teenage children.

On the day after the shooting, McNabb's ex-wife appeared at The Saint to seize the will, which was in the club's safe. In the will, which was revised in 1981, McNabb had made his two children the primary benefactors through a trust fund.

Reed had to call Dallas police to have the former Mrs. McNabb removed from the scene, as she was acting without a court order.

Those wishing to make donations were asked to give to the AIDS Education Forum of the Oak Lawn Counseling Center, Richard Rogers of TWT NEWS reported.

## NEW CHURCH IN FORT WORTH

FORT WORTH — The Agape MCC has a new home on SW Loop 820 at the Anglin Drive exit, the Rev. Jim Norwood announced to TWT NEWS. He explained that the new location sits on a three-acre site of a former Church of Christ.

Purchase price was listed at approximately \$300,000, with a down payment of exactly \$50,000. The down payment had been raised over a 1½-year period through various benefits and personal contributions, Jerry Cassidy of TWT NEWS reported.

The first services for the new church will be this Sunday, May 1 at 11:00am. A special music service will be held at 7:00pm, with both Norwood and the Rev. Jo Cisco officiating.

An expansion fund has also been established to build a Sunday school

and social halls, it was announced. Those wishing to send flowers to the opening were requested instead to send money to be donated to the expansion fund.

Agape MCC began three years ago with only seven members. It has now grown to over 200, making it one of the fastest growing churches in the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches nationwide.

## ABILENE CHURCH MUST RELOCATE

ABILENE — In this conservative, church-filled city, Exodus Metropolitan Community Church (EMCC) has been caught in a media stir. On April 7, R. Eric Steele, worship coordinator of EMCC, appeared on the evening newscasts on KTAB-TV, Channel 12, speaking of how God did not reject Abilene gays.

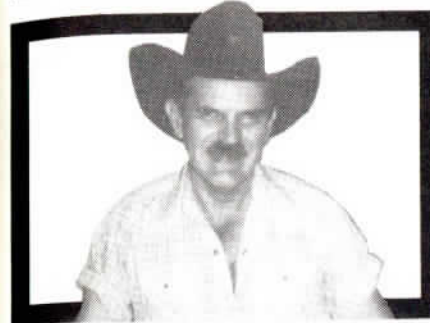
As if that were not enough to rock this city, three days later, the Sunday *Abilene Reporter News* ran a page and a half feature story on the Walnut Street Pub, a local gay bar. In the story, photos of female impersonator Tiffany appeared, along with statements from club manager Phillip and EMCC's Steele.

All the media coverage set this city "on its heels," TWT NEWS learned. One woman from a local Baptist church announced her plans to shut it [EMCC] down. A local preacher joined the fight. Another told the newspaper, "I'd like to see Steele stop playing up homosexuality as a normal, everyday situation, which it is not."

As a result, EMCC has been asked to vacate its location, which also houses a dance studio, twirling studio and Maids World business. It was the dancing studio which asked EMCC to move by June 1, citing too much publicity and public pressure.

Fearing reprisals, some EMCC members have stayed away from the church. By the same token, four employees of the bar have found it "best to quit."

Some members of the community have criticized Steele for moving too fast too soon in the few weeks since he became worship coordinator. Yet Steele maintains that "though opposition to the church has been threatening, the overall response has been good. Our doors are still open." Steele also remains confident that EMCC will find a new location.

## HEART ATTACK CLAIMS HICKEY

HOUSTON — Gerald Logan Hickey, 52, known to his friends as "Big Gary," died of a sudden heart attack at his home around 7:15am, Friday, April 22.

Hickey, born in Indianapolis, Indiana, had been employed as a bartender at The Pink Elephant, 1218 Leeland in this city. He was initially employed briefly at Methodist Hospital.

Hickey was honorably discharged from the U.S. Army in 1953 where he had served as a company clerk for the 103rd Medical Battalion.

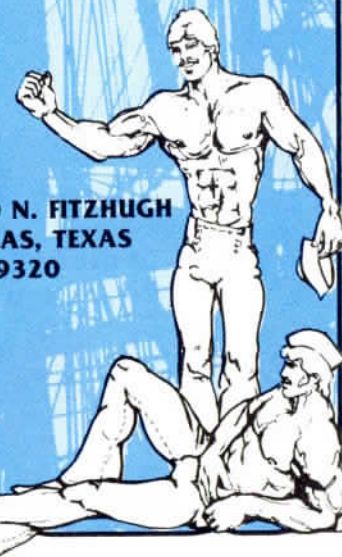
"Big Gary will be remembered by Little Gary, and his other close friends, as a very honest, friendly, sincere and dedicated person," TWT NEWS was told.

Funeral services were held at the family home in Indianapolis last Tuesday, April 26. Internment followed in Hall, Indiana, TWT NEWS learned.

## KLAN MARCH IN SAN ANTONIO

SAN ANTONIO — This city marks the third Texas city to be targeted for bigotry and hatred toward minorities. It can be deduced that in a city where the merriment of Fiesta has just concluded, it is inappropriate that the Ku Klux Klan should choose to march this Sunday, May 1.

When the Klan marched in Austin, six people were injured and a dozen arrested. When the Klan marched in Houston, no one was injured, but six people were arrested, TWT NEWS noted.

The San Antonio gay community has been advised to "stay away and not honor the Klan with our presence." Similar advice had been given on the eve of the Houston Klan march, and the request was honored, resulting in no injuries.

Had such a call to ignore the Klan in Austin been issued, the violence witnessed in the shadow of the state capitol would most likely have been averted.

## DALLAS' NEW GAY DISTRICT

DALLAS — Now that the dust has settled from the political windstorm in Oak Lawn over the city council races, it has become exceedingly clear to the Dallas Gay Political Caucus (DGPC) that Ricardo Medrano's carved-up district no longer contains the most gay voters.

A new gay district has emerged: District 5. In fact, DGPC reported to Richard Rogers of TWT NEWS that they "now mail three times as much literature to registered gay voters in District 5 than they do in old District 2."

In retrospect, it is unquestionably clear that the bulk of the Oak Lawn gay vote is solidly entrenched in District 5, where DGPC endorsed candidate, Craig Holcomb, galloped to victory.

Compared to Holcomb's city-wide 54% sweep, he took a staggering 60-

80% chunk out of Oak Lawn. "DGPC clearly got out the vote for Holcomb on our home turf," TWT NEWS was told.

Voter turnout was 15% to 16% in District 5, compared to as high as 20% in District 2, April 16 vote totals revealed.

DGPC's new influence lies in District 5. Since redistricting last year, many who lived in District 2 now live in District 5.

DGPC's clout remains unblemished as five of their seven endorsed candidates won. And those candidates who made anti-gay statements, such as in Districts 3 and 4, were poised for defeat under the orchestration of DGPC.

## AUSTIN RUNOFF ELECTION SATURDAY

AUSTIN — This Saturday, April 30, the polls will be open in the Capitol City from 7:00am until 7:00pm for a runoff election for two candidates who didn't win a majority in the April 2 city election.

At stake is the mayor's office and one remaining city council seat. In both races, the gay vote has been batted back and forth to gain support. In one race, the Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus (ALGPC) has made no official endorsement.

In the mayoral race are Ron Mullen and Lowell Lebermann. Both candidates are seeking the gay vote. Both candidates have advertised in TWT magazine. While ALGPC has leaned toward Mullen, most gay businesses have been in Lebermann's camp. Lebermann campaigned extensively in the gay bars during the past week.

In the city council race for Place 4, a similar situation has developed. Mark Spaeth has campaigned in local gay clubs and ran advertisements in TWT magazine. On the other hand, George Humphrey has many supporters in the Austin gay community, including ALGPC, who voted just last week to make an official, last-minute Humphrey endorsement.

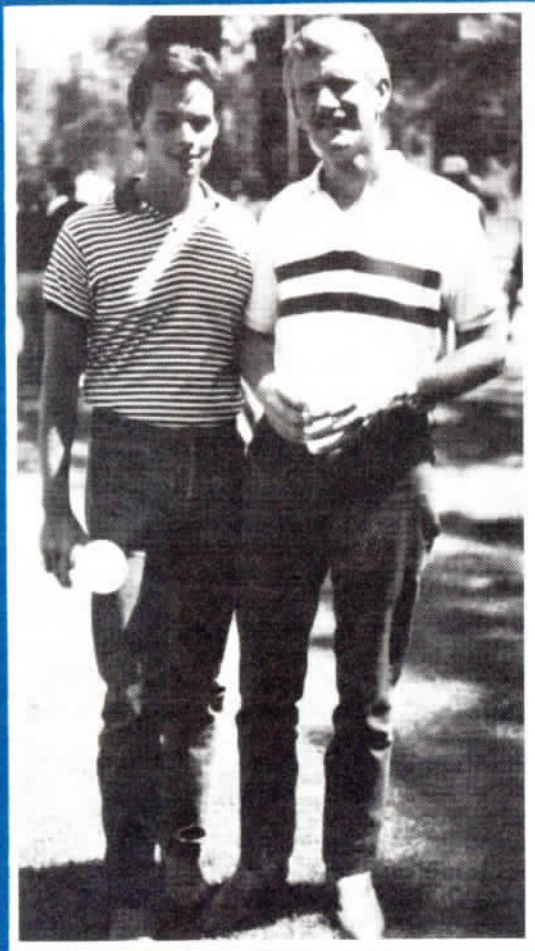

## SMU GAY GROUP LOSES 17-11

DALLAS — After four hours of debate, the student senate at Southern Methodist University (SMU) voted 17-11 against recognition of a newly-formed group called Gay and Lesbian Student Support Organization (GLSSO). Even though the group met all of SMU's requirements for recognition, "I still voted against it," said student president, Joe Dooley.

The audience of more than 300 students, faculty and alumni who packed the senate chambers applauded loudly when GLSSO was defeated.

The April 19 defeat did not come as a surprise to GLSSO's founder, Robert Rios. After initial hearings several weeks ago, it had appeared that SMU sentiment was running against recognition, **TWT NEWS** had reported.

Reports reaching **TWT NEWS** had indicated that 3,500 students, more than half the student body, had signed petitions to block recognition; whereas only 350 had signed a counter-petition supporting GLSSO.

**TWT NEWS** also learned that several SMU alumni had met privately with individual senators urging them to vote against GLSSO.

Rios, undaunted by the rebuff, said he would explore alternative methods of recognition. This story has similar overtones to A&M's refusal to recognize Gay Student Services (GSS) at College Station.

"If this were not SMU, we would not have been defeated," Rios said. "SMU has not seen the last of this group. We'll be back again by doing whatever it takes to be recognized."

SMU, a private college owned by the United Methodist Church, had wrestled with the issue for over a month. Prior to the vote, students, trustees and alumni had lobbied heavily in the student senate.

One 1960 SMU alumni, Jimmy Williams, reasoned, "We shouldn't destroy our hopes and dreams by forming clubs

at SMU based on sexual preference." GLSSO would not be compatible with SMU's statement of philosophy and Methodist discipline, the student government felt.

## GAY ALL-STATE STUDENT CONFAB

COLLEGE STATION — The Texas Gay/Lesbian Student Coalition (TGLSC) held its second conference in this city April 9-10. Jay Cherin acted as chair for the meeting and Robert Rios acted as internal secretary. Cherin is a student at UT Austin and serves as chair of UT's Gay Student Association (GSA), and Rios serves as the male co-chair of Southern Methodist University's Gay and Lesbian Student Support Group.

Following a unanimous ratification of by-laws drafted by John Hepner of Gay and Lesbian Association of Denton, and amended by delegates of the Coalitions eleven-member organization, the delegates discussed how TGLSC would help the GLSSG at SMU win their fight for recognition as a campus organization. It was decided that a letter would be written from TGLSC to the SMU Student Senate urging the senators to vote for GLSSO's recognition. The letter was signed by officers of TGLSC, Cherin explained to **TWT NEWS**.

A benefit was held April 9 at Astraptes in this city and \$100 was given to TGLSC. The next day, GSA held its sixth anniversary picnic, where member organizations of TLGSC met to elect the officers of TLGSC. Rios was elected as male co-chair; Ruth Sathre, of the Rice Gay/ Lesbian Support Group (RGLSG), was elected female co-chair; Cherin was elected communications coordinator; David Henderson of GSA was elected treasurer; and Joe Blurton, of the Lesbian/Gay Resources Services (L/GRS) of the University of Houston, was elected internal secretary.

The next conference will be co-sponsored by the RGLSG and L/GRS in Houston from June 24-26.



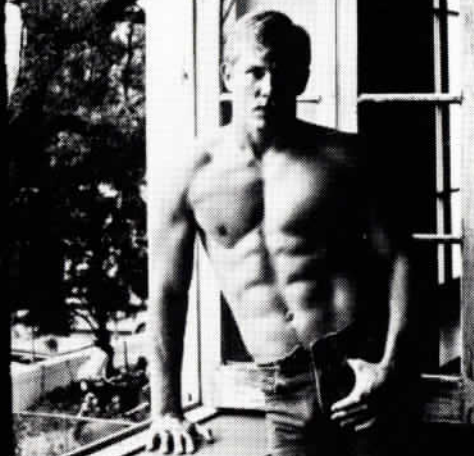

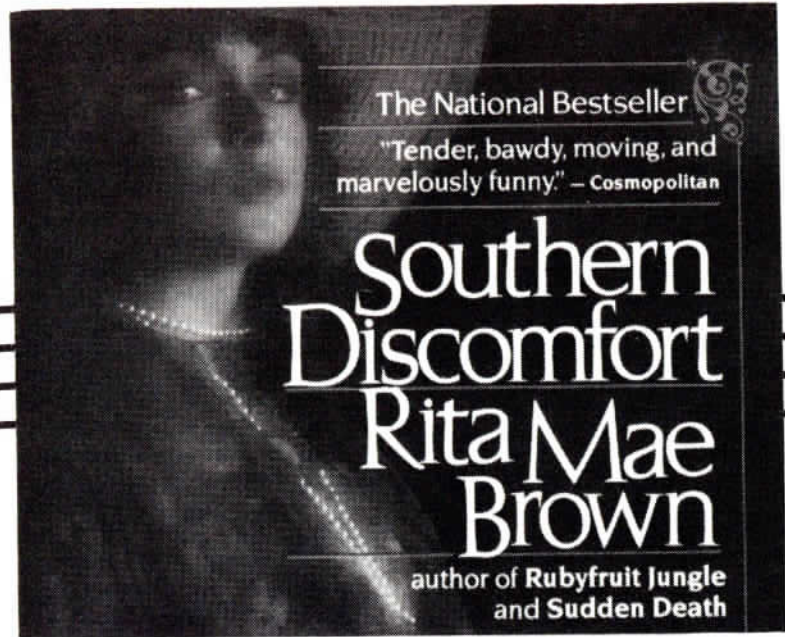

*Southern Discomfort*, by Rita Mae Brown; 277 pp.; Bantam Books, 666 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York 10103; paperback, \$3.95.

Rita Mae Brown has written some very successful and entertaining novels, such as her famous *Rubyfruit Jungle*, and regales us once again with her wit in a story of love and humor, and freedom from rigid social convention in the town of Montgomery, Alabama, in *Southern Discomfort*. The novel is surprisingly reminiscent of Edward Swift's *Splendor*. Just consider Ms. Brown's offering a sister work. Those of you who enjoyed Swift's book most likely will be satisfied (or satiated) with Rita Mae Brown's newest paperback edition.

The stellar (not Stella) attractions of

the story are two whores in the Montgomery, Alabama of the turn of the century, Banana Mae Parker and Blue Rhonda Latrec. Though action takes place all around them, they are often the focus of the reader's perspective, and they supply the running commentary that threads through the story. They are the ones who tell it like it is, revealing the class snobbery, the hypocrisy of the small town. Their pure, proud feelings about sex (sex is their business, their only business) and the warmth they have for the blacks and their customers make them touching and memorable.

Though there are no gay relationships, male or female, in the book, Ms. Brown recreates such a similar situation that it will stand up and identify itself without warning. Hortensia Reedmuller Banastre, at the very tip-top of the social ladder for years, falls in love

with Hercules Jinks, a 16-year-old black "boy" who stands six-foot tall and is a bare-knuckle boxer, successful at that. The strain it causes on social convention and tradition in the small town is very similar to that caused by a gay relationship. And, Blue Rhonda and Banana Mae are also best buddies, in more ways than one.

For comic relief, as if there was need for it, we have Reverend Linton Ray, the town preacher, whose life is devoted to "unearthly pleasures," that is, heaven. He knows no pleasure in life and is without understanding, and acceptance of, real human needs that are not cared for in the social and moral code of the times there in Montgomery.

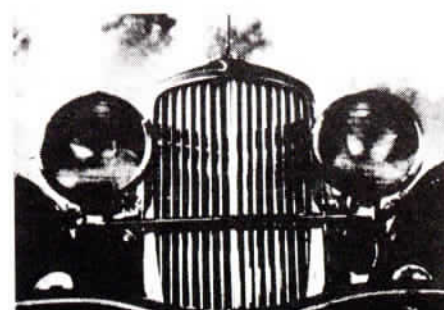
The story covers two decades, and there are roughly three different stories in the one book. At times there seems to not be a main story line, per se, as Ms. Brown moves into the various subplots. But the consequences of the first part of the story are felt throughout the book in the lives of the characters. Her writing is lively and, especially, her turn of a phrase or cliché can be very amusing. Grace Deltaven was the town beauty, the siren who attracted the boys, and her mother, Icellee, had to "beat off the boys with a stick." Ah, well, so much for overturning a cliché.

Ms. Brown's message, for those who care for one, is demonstrated through-

out the novel, and the characters Blue Rhonda and Hortensia talk about it more specifically. Blue Rhonda speaks: "God put beautiful spirits into these bodies, all kinds of bodies . . . And we dumb humans are confused by the outside. We keep looking at the outside instead of the inside . . . but inside, the soul is pure. All souls are equal. If only we could see the soul."

This seems to be a novel "for all the people," of all races, all classes. For those who subsist on convention and pretensions, this novel is, and will be, a mockery of them and their conceits. For the rest, *Southern Discomfort* can be a reflection, a confirmation, of what people feel is the reality of their internal perceptions and feelings. In fact, this has occurred, as shown by the success of the novel as a national best-seller.

Of course, there are many things to be derived from a tale such as this. Ms. Brown's characters are multi-faceted, enduring, alive. Her plots to keep the reader interested deal not with bombers, mysteries or contrivance. The drama of human love in its many and varied forms, as well as the banality we as humans are capable of, both serve to entice and entertain us. *Southern Discomfort* contains these elements and Rita Mae Brown displays them well.

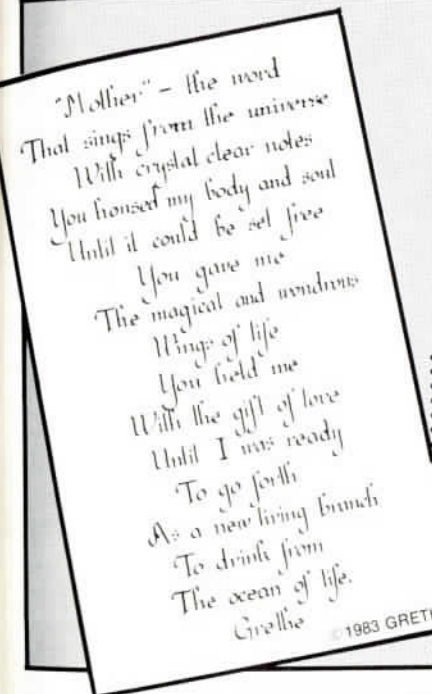

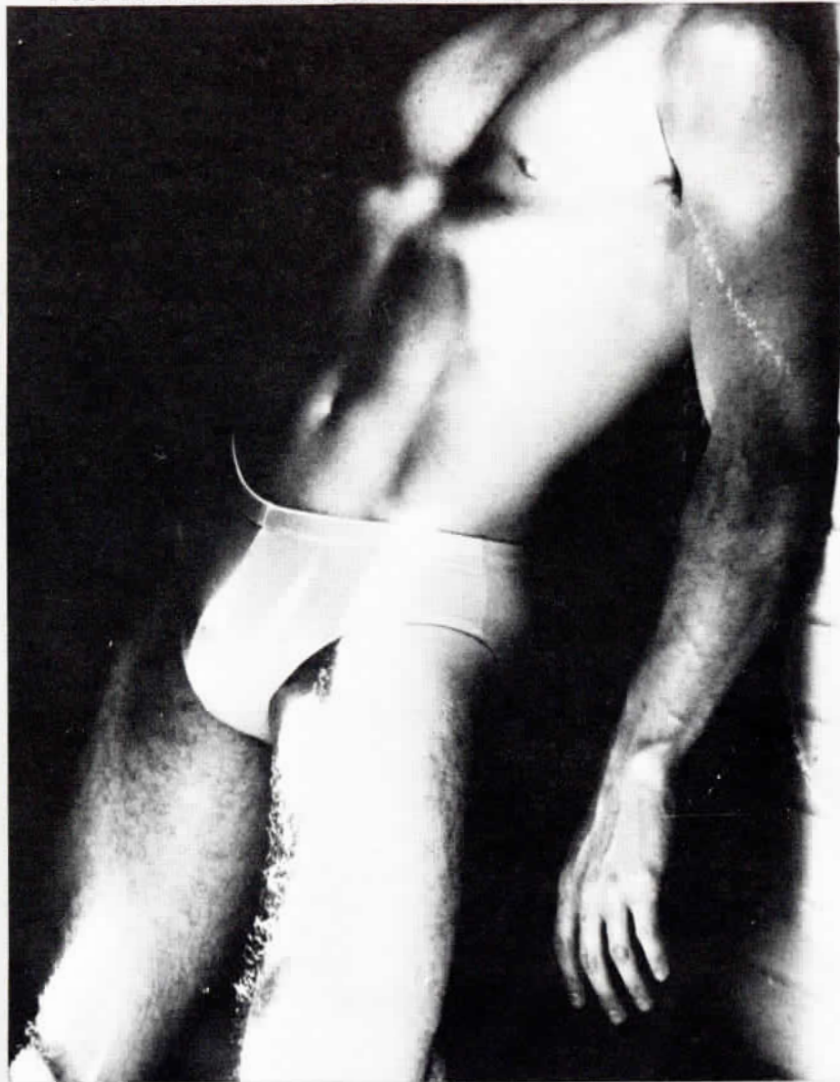

Albert Innaurato's *Gemini* is probably the most successful comedy with a definite gay slant in the history of the American stage. It will be presented in a lively production through May 21 at Houston's Chocolate Bayou Theater Co. This energetic, ethnic play made people laugh their heads off on Broadway for 1,819 hilarious performances over four years.

The action takes place in the backyards of two Philadelphia houses the day before and on Francis Geminniani's 21st birthday. To celebrate the occasion, the young man who persistently bemoans his mild weight problem is surprise-visited by two friends from school. The girl, Judith, goes to Radcliffe and has the hots for Francis; her brother is a Harvard student and, it turns out, he more than just tickles the birthday boy's fancy. As Francis lets Judy in on his own suspicions by suddenly bursting out, "I think I'm queer," he alters the direction of the comedy which leads to frank and funny exchanges and observations.

Roger Gentry does fine as Francis, the confused lad struggling hard to come to terms with his feelings. Bob Lemmon as the handsome *objet de desire* displays some natural boyish charm. Ginny Lang is all right as his sister. Steve Caporiccio proves to be a good choice as the father whose body is erupting regularly in some way or fashion through coughing or wheezing. Under his seemingly rough exterior hides a rather sensitive core. The two

wackiest characters are played marvelously by Deborah H. Boily as the voluptuous next-door neighbor whose vocabulary is full of foul four-letter words, and her son, portrayed by Jeff Nathan, a 16-year-old. He is a public transportation buff who, on the surface, appears way overdue for the nearest funny farm, but has the IQ of a near-genius. The set designed by Debora Jasien serves the purpose; however, there should have been some better alternative than putting up sheets to serve as the inside of the two houses whose facade we see on the stage.

For an enjoyable evening of live entertainment I can recommend *Gemini*. Go see it, whatever your sign is!

# Querelle

NO HURRAH  
"QUERELLE"

I have been a die-hard fan of Rainer Werner Fassbinder for many years. His sudden, possibly accidental death last year was an experience, to me, as devastating as the murders of Milk and Lennon.

The prolific German director has never been in the biz to merely entertain with his movies; he wants to challenge. Mr. Fassbinder always loved complex stories with more than a touch of melodrama; his work is usually full of symbolisms with limited room for interpretation. Herr Rainer co-signed responsibility for the screenplay of *Querelle*, which is loosely based on Jean Genet's controversial classic for connoisseurs, *Querelle de Brest*.

*Querelle* is a handsome sailor played by Brad Davis, whose main claim to fame was *Midnight Express*. The folks in the best little bar and whorehouse at the port of Brest are all in danger of falling for the fellow in his kinky navy attire. Especially the males seem to have a hell of a hard time controlling their special instinctive desires. There is only one woman (Jeanne Moreau) in *Querelle* who has a speaking part and, unfortunately, also a singing role. During her nightclub act she croons into the mike way too many encores of a tune which is still running rampant in my head. One pathetic line of prose is repeated over and over: "Each man kills

the thing he loves . . ." The lustful, sensual appetites of virtually all the players are portrayed as animalistic, mechanical, hardly ever emotional urges. Whoever enters the tavern is expected to roll the dice with Nono (played by Fassbinder's favorite black man, Gunther Kaufmann) in order to determine one's sex partner. The choice is limited to Nono and Madam Lysiane (Moreau). *Querelle* manipulates the dice so he will be paired with Nono. Now, does that mean the young man is a homo? No matter how much he is fascinated with his initiation to a rather passive sex act, and even though he seeks further similar encounters, he vehemently denies that he is a faggot.

Mr. Fassbinder never made any bones about his own gayness, and his step out of the closet probably enhanced rather than hurt his standing in the European and international film scene. His *Querelle* is the clear product of a

"brother," yet it is terribly disturbing at times; and its outlandish characters utter several odd (as opposed to queer) clichés, including a concept which seems impossible to clobber to death, that of a woman inside of every gay man. Another interesting analogy is made, namely that two men kissing is like one male smooching a mirror. The world in and around Brest is an artsy stage with beige and orange skies and a giant bright yellow sun. Mr. Fassbinder obviously decided to take a completely different route by filming this novella as if it were an elaborate theater production. Some of his shots are stunningly beautiful; a few of the scenes he devised are funny and satirical while others are shockingly bizarre. Franco Nero plays the naval commander who constantly wet-dreams over *Querelle* and who loves to muse about the supposed mutual attraction of love and death.

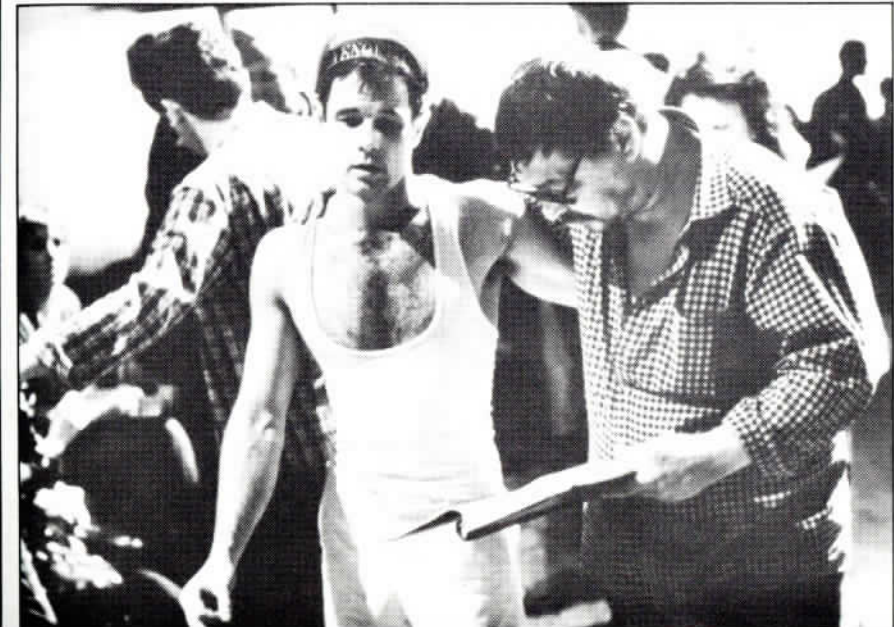
RWF has treated gay matters in a far more accessible way in many of his movies, mainly in *Fox and His Friends*

and *Tenderness of the Wolves*. My guess is that the international backing and international stars have not exactly aided his artistic progress. *Querelle* is the *wunderkind* director's last work. A last hurrah it is not.

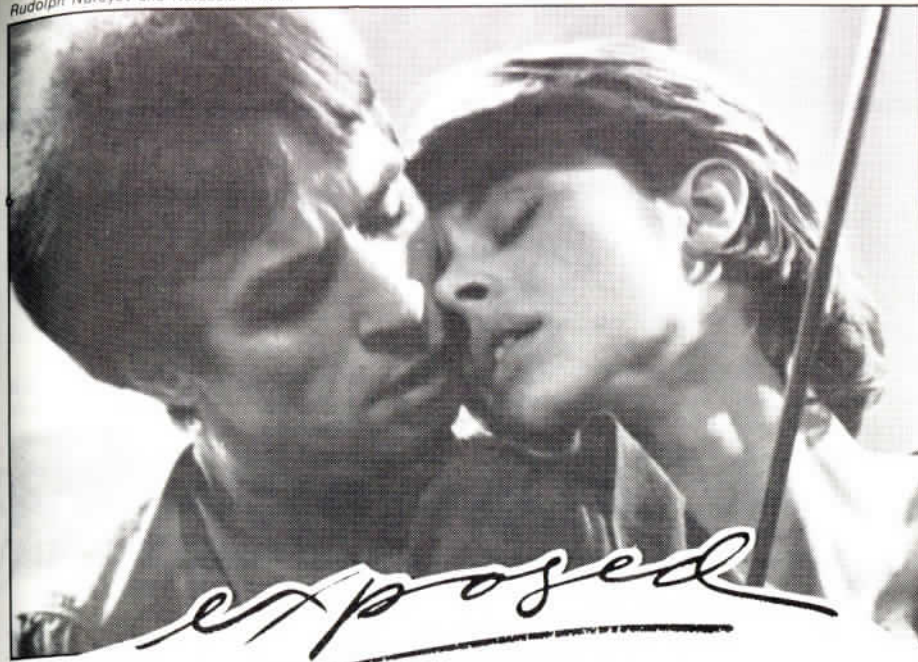

# JAMES TOBACK

*James Toback is considered somewhat of a radical in the movie industry because he refuses to compromise his principals by making a committee-designed, something-for-everyone "product" constructed solely for maximal box-office returns.*

*After writing *The Gambler* (directed by Karel Reisz in 1974), he has written, directed and (in two cases) produced three succeeding films, *Fingers* in 1978, *Love and Money* in 1982 and now *United Artists' Exposed*, which stars Nastassia Kinski and Rudolf Nureyev.*

*We spoke with Mr. Toback at his hotel during his brief stay in Houston for a promotional tour. We found Mr. Toback to be very verbose and animated. He has a refreshing smile and an easy-going personality. Having a cynical view of life and a dry sense of humor, the following are some of his ideas and observations.*

**HIS CHARACTERS** — I like having characters who think they're serious, but everyone's laughing at them. Everyone's ludicrous anyway. These people [his characters] are trying to be, oh, elegant, intellectual or whatever, and everyone is laughing at this big charade they think they're pulling off.

**NASTASSIA KINSKI** — I wanted a character who had determination, beauty, horniness, eroticism, restlessness, cynicism, rattiness. I saw all of these qualities in Nastassia. I don't think I would have made this movie [*Exposed*] if I hadn't gotten her. The way I met her was, first I saw a photograph of her and thought she looked interesting. Then I saw about fifteen minutes of *Stay As*

*You Are*, the best film she was in before *Exposed*. I was very impressed, tracked down her phone number and called her.

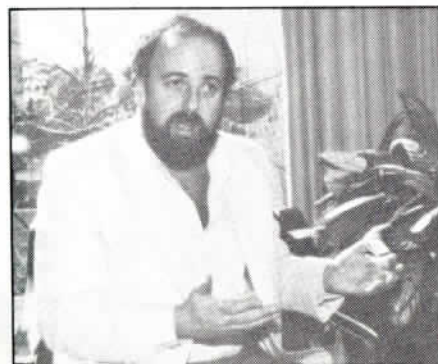
**HIS IMAGE** — Some people do look at me like I'm weird. For instance, in *Exposed*, I have Nureyev using a violin bow as a sort of phallic symbol. People look at me and say, "So, that's what's going on in that head of yours." Directors are really leaving themselves open and sort of vulnerable. You really expose yourself to the public. I like to make a film that's about 25% loving, 25% hating and then 50% in-between. If everybody hated my movie, or everybody loved it, which I find inconceivable, I think I would have missed some-

thing.

**WHAT SHOCKS PEOPLE** — Not knowing what's going to happen next; the suspense shocks people. It's very fundamental actually. Something that turns suddenly and doesn't do what it's supposed to do shocks people. It's like when someone you love dearly dies. What do you mean my father just got hit by a car? I just had lunch with him fifteen minutes ago. Well, lunch is over. People get real pissed when you just die on them and don't let them know first. It's like, how dare you not warn me! I don't let you know who's right and who's wrong in my movies. You get to figure that out. Reactions are really very easy to predict. For instance, when you pass a really bad wreck on the freeway, you slow down and look. Whether you admit it or not, you're disappointed if you don't see blood. Why are you looking? If people would just loosen up and realize everyone is eventually going to die and just relax about it. Everyone is so worried about money and sanity. You worry so much about staying sane, you become a paranoid schizophrenic. By



worrying about insanity, you bring it on yourself. Just relax.

**REGARDING WARREN BEATTY** — [Beatty was to have directed Toback's film, *Love and Money*, but diverted his attention to *Reds*, thus causing *Love and Money* to be placed in limbo for a long period of time.] Warren is still my friend, and I think always will be. We've had enough ups and down that if our friendship were going to be destroyed, it already would have been. He's got a very good sense of humor and he's a wild, free spirit. I think he's lost some of the humor he used to have. He's gone to safe commercial roles. He's not the only one to abandon himself to commercialism. Redford did, as did McQueen and Newman. There is a thing that happens to stars when they become stars. They're afraid to experiment. They fear losing their popularity.

**CURRENT PROJECTS** — I'm working on a story now, *The Pick-Up Artist*, which is a sexual-comedy that will head for a dark, twisted ending. It's going to be about a man; I decided on a man instead of a woman simply because I know more about how a man picks someone up. This guy puts the make on women in the street, in a traffic jam, at the grocery store, everywhere. Just like in real life, actually. He'll look like a cross between Warren Beatty and Woody Allen. He'll be attractive enough that you can believe someone's interested in him, but not so attractive that he can always rely on his looks. I haven't chosen an actor as of yet, but I'm sure I'll come up with someone. Some dark figure with light around the edges.

**KITTEN WITH A WHIP NAMED DESIRE** — You had better sit down for this one. It'll air sometime in the 1983-84 season. (Okay, don't any of you Ann-Margret freaks send me any bowel

movements in the mail—I've seen some of Miss Margret's recent work, and I'll be the first to applaud her if she can carry it off . . . snicker.) Incidentally, if you're still reading, **Treat Williams** has the role of Stanley Kowalski.

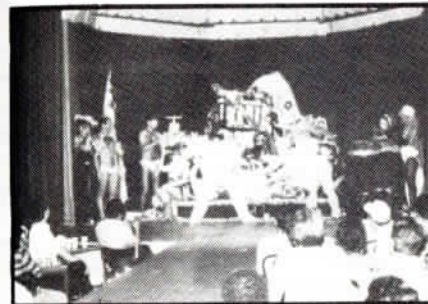

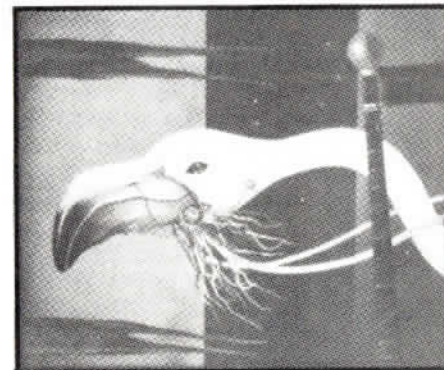

**THE DEBATE**

The battle lines were drawn on Tuesday, April 19, over Texas' proposed new sodomy bill. Concern over drunk drivers, raising the drinking age and horse racing all took a back seat to House Bill 2138.

In fact, according to Helen Kinsey, who photocopies bills for lawmakers, the sodomy bill has lately been the most copied. It seems all the lawmakers want to read about how it defines deviate sexual intercourse. "Most legislators have two copies," Kinsey said.

After the debate in the House Criminal Jurisprudence Committee hearing, TWT learned from an inside source on Capitol Hill in Austin that the vote was running about 3-1 in the nine-member committee to defeat the bill introduced by Rep. Bill Ceverha of Richardson.

On the Jurisprudence Committee is Rep. Debra Danburg of Houston, whose district includes Montrose, a district that includes more gays than any other in the state. "I find the bill disgusting and unconstitutional," Danburg told reporters. "It makes showing affection illegal. It makes kissing illegal. It makes holding hands illegal," she added.

The director of the Texas Civil Liberties Union, John Duncan, agreed: "I think it also outlaws foreplay." Duncan compared the bill to the "officially registered bigotry in Nazi Germany."

Ceverha, who concedes his bill may need some rewriting, remains intent on its passage. He is so intent on getting HB-2138 out of committee and onto the floor of the Texas Legislature for a vote, that he brought out "experts" for debate last week.

**THE AIDS ISSUE**

Ceverha called on Paul Cameron, a one-time employee of the University of Nebraska until he was dismissed. Cameron, who now chairs the Institute for the Scientific Investigation of Sexuality of Nebraska, is also remembered by TWT for his testifying against Gay Student Services (GSS) at Texas A&M University, and the management of the River Oaks Theatre in Houston over the film, *Salò*; two cases which he failed to "win" for his lawyers.

Cameron, in the debate of HB-2138, stretched his logic by pushing the AIDS "panic button." He said, "The public is inviting a public health disaster as well as promotion of a lifestyle that is injurious to its participants and all members of society," if we don't outlaw deviate homosexual activity.

Dallas lawyer Bill Barber, who successfully challenged the old sodomy law, Penal Code Section 21.06, argued against the proposed bill calling it "totally inept in dealing with a medical problem. This is a medical issue, not a moral issue," he stressed.

Somehow Cameron concluded that "Conceivably, right now could be the demise of Western civilization."

When that statement was aired on KTRH Radio news in Houston, talk-show host Jim Tate was appalled. "If Cameron is so against homosexuality, then you'd think he'd be for AIDS, as it would eventually annihilate the very people he wants to get rid of. The man makes no sense. It's an illogical conclusion."

#### THE SEXUAL ISSUE

Ceverha came prepared with a thick volume concerning AIDS and other health problems supposedly caused by homosexuals.

The volumes included reports about the gay baths and bars in Dallas. The report also said homosexual activity is common at Dallas public parks and shopping malls.

The public restrooms at two North Dallas area shopping centers, and a host of arcades, were targeted with film and supportive material under a seven-page chapter entitled "Homosexual Conduct and Activity in Dallas, Texas."

The bill's backers seemingly know a lot about Dallas gay life, since the moving force behind Ceverha's bill is the Dallas Doctors Against AIDS, who sided with Amarillo District Attorney Danny Hill, who decided to appeal 21.06 after State Attorney General Jim Mattox declined to appeal.

They also think they know a lot about adult bookstores. "There is mounting medical evidence associated with the public display and public encounters of the homosexual movement," Ceverha told reporters.

#### THE HEALTH ISSUE

Ceverha was also quoted as saying, "There is a severe threat to public health and safety through what happens in public gay bars, baths and bookstores."

"I don't think the great majority of people who say 'why bother' even understand what homosexual activities are involved in these places," he told

Associated Press, predicting that testimony at Tuesday's hearing would "shock and revolt most Texans."

Ceverha said, "Such encounters are consenting, but how much do you tolerate this? Somebody walks into a gay bath or bookstore and has 25 encounters in an hour and then goes out to the public."

Rep. Danburg was amused. "He would know a lot more about what they do in bookstores than I would!"

Bettie Naylor, lobbyist for the Lesbian Gay Rights Movement, is also not impressed with Ceverha's public health arguments.

"Black people have sickle-cell anemia and Jewish people have Tay-Sachs disease," she said. Naylor said the Ceverha bill raises one "big question."

"Who cares?" Naylor queried. "Apparently Mr. Ceverha does. My feeling is overall and in general the people of the United States don't really care what other people do in private as long as it doesn't hurt anyone else."

#### PREDICTING THE VOTE

Danburg expects HB-2138 to pass if it gets to the House floor. Naylor agrees, saying, "In spite of its ridiculous language, we are having to deal with it."

In retrospect, Texas has continually had a sodomy law since 1860. Only since last August, when 21.06 was found unconstitutional and unenforceable, has Texas been without a sodomy law.

Within this atmosphere, Danburg explained what thoughts might be going through the minds of legislators.

"I've had probably 30 or 40 members tell me that they thought the bill was the most stupid, irresponsible thing they've ever seen, but since the public would not understand what the bill did and since the press would just simply report it as a vote on whether you were for gay people, they felt like they probably would have to vote for it just because they were scared their districts would think they were voting in favor of homosexuality."

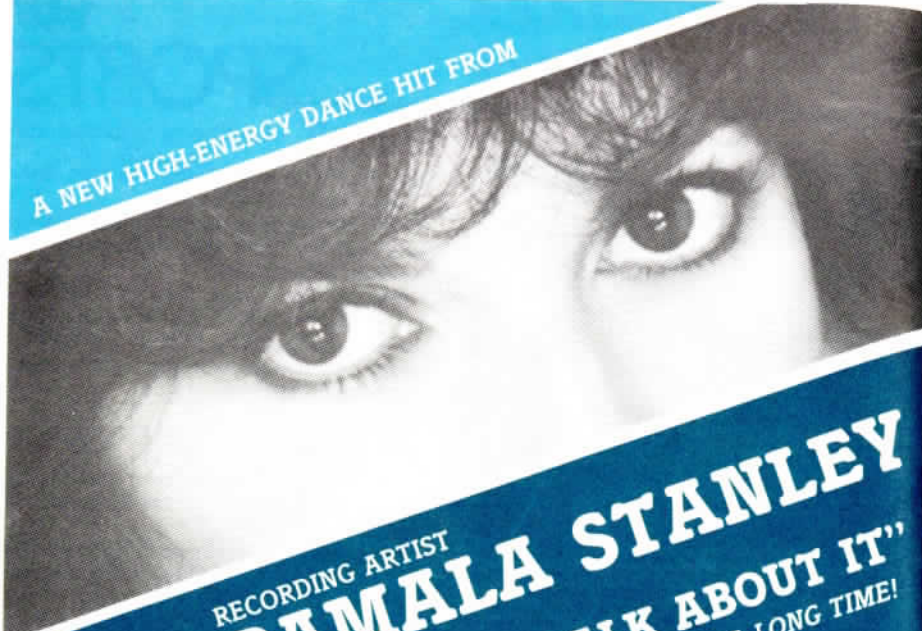
