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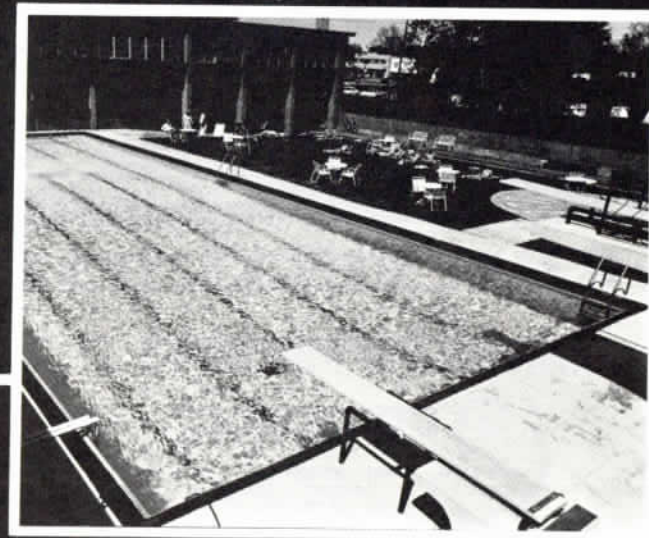
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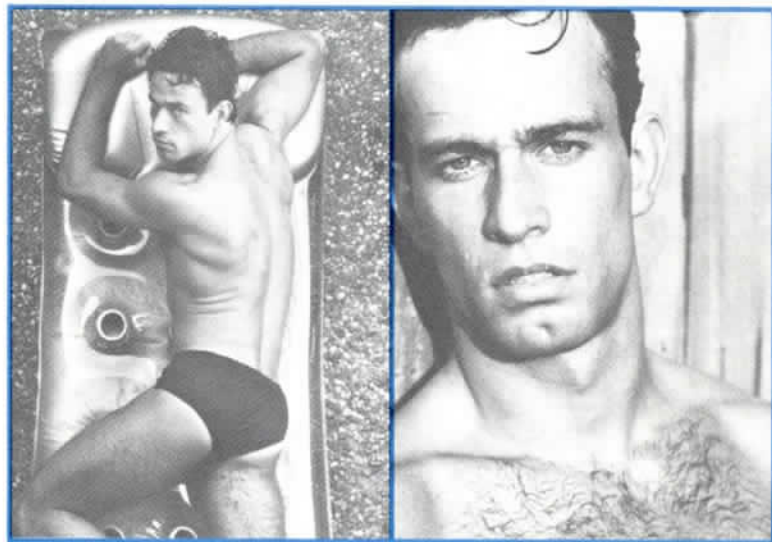
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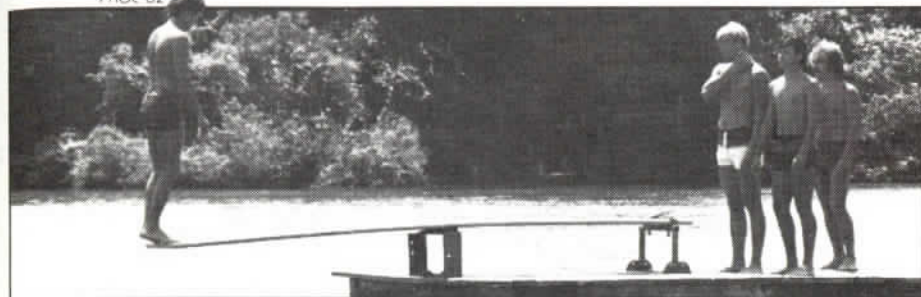
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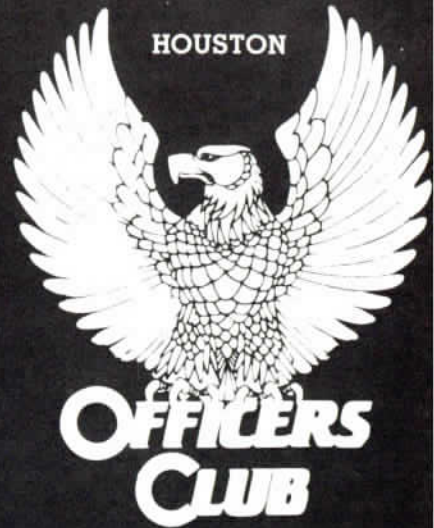
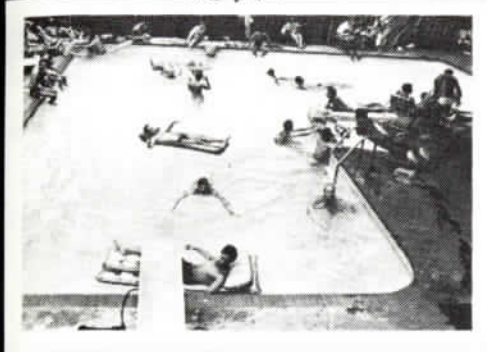
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NEW DGA BOARD MEMBERS

DALLAS — Buck Massey, Steve Weast and Melodie Alexander are the newest members of the Dallas Gay Alliance (DGA) board of directors as a result of elections held during the June general membership meeting, *Dialogue* reported.

Alan Ross and Tom Hartfield were re-elected to the board. Those board members whose seats are up for election in December 1983 are Bill Nelson, John Thomas, Michael Burnett, Tony Anthony and Dave Jones.

Past DGA president Don Baker was recently named as one of ten people who made the greatest difference for gay rights in 1982, the *Dialogue* story continued.

Writing in the *New York Native*, journalist Larry Bush wrote: "Head of the Dallas Gay Alliance, Baker was in the news for two major accomplishments this year. He was the plaintiff in the case in which a federal court struck down Texas' sodomy law, setting forth a U.S. constitutional argument not seen previously, and his organization was the host for the National Gay Leadership Conference last August [1982] in which gays from around the country touched bases with each other."

ELTON JOHN AND RICHARD LONGSTAFF

DALLAS — What do singer Elton John and local clothier Richard Longstaff, of the Union Jack, have in common? Both are immigrants to America from Great Britain, both share similar lifestyles, and both are active participants in the American economy. But the similarity stops there, TWT NEWS has observed.

Longstaff's application for citizenship was rejected in 1979 because of his lifestyle. Yet Elton John continued to pass through U.S. Customs, as recently as earlier this year.

The government, by applying the rule against Longstaff but not against John, indicates that if one is rich and famous, homosexuality is a flaw that money can overcome. Obviously, the homosexual exclusion clause is selectively enforced.

In recent weeks, TWT NEWS has seen a flurry of developments revolving around the long-standing drive to end the policy to exclude foreign lesbians and gay men from entering America. Senator Alan Cranston (D-California), who is running for the 1984 presidential nomination, has introduced a bill to strike the offending language. Bills have in fact been introduced in both Houses of Congress to repeal the provision of the 1952 Immigration Act, which is the foundation for anti-gay exclusion.

It is not right of Longstaff, who emigrated from Great Britain in 1965 to become an entity in the American economy, to be forced into protracted court proceedings to defend his interests, while Elton John is given the customary warm welcome granted to famous and popular foreign homosexuals, *The Philadelphia Enquirer* opined.

AUSTIN COUPLE WED IN CHURCH

AUSTIN — The fact that two men should get married by a pastor of the Metropolitan Community Church (MCC) is no longer news in these more liberal times. It happens every week somewhere in America.

But the fact that two men got married in a Methodist church in this city is news—especially when TWT NEWS considers that only a month previously, over

Memorial weekend, a few miles away in San Antonio, the United Methodist Church held its Southwest Texas Conference and banned homosexuals from serving in the hierarchy.

And the entire situation became even more ironic when it was learned that Troy Stokes—that controversial Methodist from Austin—arranged it all.

Therefore, when Dr. Philip Richardson, 45, and his lover and business partner of over three years, nurse Michael Jones, 29, of Austin, were wed on the 4th of July at 5:00pm at St. Luke's Methodist Church, new religious ground was broken. Even Rev. Wade of St. Luke's was in attendance at both the ceremony and rehearsal. After the wedding, Wade expressed his appreciation for "the worshipfulness of the ceremony."

Some members of the church's regular congregation came to the ceremony, which attracted a gathering of 240 people. "There was a broad mix of both gay and non-gay in attendance," Rev. Louis de Spain, associate pastor of MCCA, told TWT NEWS. De Spain, who officiated at the ceremony, explained to TWT NEWS that it was not a wedding in the strict sense of the word, but "what MCCA calls a Holy Union of same-sex couples."

When asked why the couple had chosen to be married at St. Luke's rather than MCCA, Richardson, who was raised as a Methodist, explained that a large church was needed to accommodate the gathering. "Actually, it was Troy Stokes who arranged it all," he said. Stokes, not unaccustomed to orchestrating the unusual in the Methodist Church, has been involved in a 12-year struggle with his own United Methodist Church over its anti-gay doctrine and was most vocal at the recent San Antonio conference.

Contrary to a news article in the *Austin American Statesman*, most of St. Luke's congregation was not upset over the service. Only a few dissidents have been outspoken. Ironically, those most opposed were the ones who are least

seen in attendance at Sunday services, an inside source told TWT NEWS.

The ceremony was permitted at St. Luke's, Rev. Wade said, because "gays are just as much a part of the family of God as anyone else."

"We got married for two reasons," Richardson said. "First, our love for each other, and secondly, we thought it was important to present a positive alternative role model for the gay community."

ANGROGYNY KEEPS AMARILLO BUSY

AMARILLO — Androgyny, Gay Community Services (GCS) of Amarillo has been keeping this city's gays busy this summer with a wide variety of activities. Summer in the Panhandle has been very eventful.

The next summer event will be the second annual Canyon Capers, to be held in Palo Duro Canyon this Sunday, July 17. This outing will be held in the Cottonwood Picnic Area, and will begin at 2:00pm. The picnic area is located just west of Water Crossing No. 3. Hot dogs and soft drinks will be provided, and everyone is asked to bring their favorite picnic food.

July 28 will find the board of directors meeting at 7:00pm for a short meeting. Following that meeting will be the first meeting of next year's 1984 Gay Pride Amarillo Committee. This meeting, to be held on the patio of Maggie's Disco, will be an organizational meeting, with officers will be elected.

During this year's second annual Gay Pride Week, held June 26-July 3, events included the annual Volleyball Shootout on July 2. Also on that evening, there was an awards banquet at Maggie's to present the winners their trophies.

On July 3, there was a city-wide picnic held in Ellwood Park. This was the fifth year for this gay pride event, and was sponsored by Maggie's Disco, Take Five, Papiillon and Gopher's, Robert Schroeder, director of Androgyny, GCS, informed TWT NEWS.

CRANSTON'S BID FOR PRESIDENCY

WASHINGTON, DC — U.S. Senator Alan Cranston (D-California) has lately been campaigning heavily on the gay trail. He recently spoke to over 400 at a Gertrude Stein Democratic Club banquet, saying that he was "the only candidate for the presidency with a clear-cut, positive record on gay rights."

The latest *Washington Post*/ABC-TV News poll shows Cranston as the Democratic front-runner for the 1984 presidency, far ahead of second-place contender, John Glenn.

Cranston has not only found great support in the gay community, but has also made large in-roads into the women's movement. His appearance in San Antonio at last week's NOW convention was greeted with thunderous applause. In his keynote address, Cranston again underlined his philosophy that it is wrong to discriminate against any group

of people—including women.

When he criticized President Reagan's opposition to the Equal Rights Amendment, Cranston's popularity soared. Texas Governor Mark White, also in attendance at the River Walk speech, rose to the occasion and applauded in obvious support of Cranston's message.

Recently, Cranston also appeared on ABC-TV's news program, *Nightline*, moderated by Ted Koppel, saying, "Any form of discrimination against any group of people is folly, tragic, unwise and uncivilized."

He followed those powerful words by explaining that research has found that the gay vote is not strictly liberal Democrat. "That's a myth," he stated. "We have found the gay vote is far more moderate." Cranston noted that with the gay vote, the sympathy vote comes from friends and family.

When asked by Koppel, "What's changed?" TWT NEWS recorded Crans-

ton's explanation about new factors. "Gays have come out of the closet; bankers and business people and labor leaders, citizens of all walks of life have emerged and have stated that they are gay and lesbian. They say we want our rights. What they are seeking are the repeal of laws that discriminated against them, and that's all. Equal opportunity, and nothing more than that."

Koppel then asked political adviser Jim Foster, also a guest on *Nightline*, "Then it's simply a human rights position that more candidates are taking?"

"I expect before 1984 you're going to see more [candidates] willing to take that position," Foster replied. "In 1980, John Anderson took that position, and Reagan also said he opposed discrimination on that basis."

"When do you think we will reach the point when gay rights will no longer be an issue?" Koppel queried.

"There was a time when you couldn't elect a Catholic," Cranston answered,

"but that happened with Kennedy. There was a time when you couldn't elect a divorcee, but that happened with Reagan. Breakthroughs are being made.

"Discrimination is slowly eroding. . . . It is playing less a part in our country. The great thing is that, officially, our country is against discrimination. The government is now plainly on record against it. The civil rights act is broadening the opportunities for all people. But, there are still some barriers to be broken down," Cranston concluded.

MCC 11TH NAT'L CONFERENCE

TORONTO — Many Texans belonging to various Metropolitan Community Church (MCC) chapters, including MCCA (Austin), MCCR (Houston), MCCD (Dallas), Agape MCC (Ft. Worth) and MCCSA (San Antonio), are traveling

to this Canadian city to join approximately 1,000 members and friends the week of July 11-17 to join the oldest and largest Christian organization ministering to lesbians and gays for the 11th Biennial General Conference of the Universal Fellowship of MCC. MCC recently made headlines by its application to join the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.

The controversial application will be the subject of a special media briefing on Friday, July 15, by the co-directors of MCC's Department of Ecumenical Relations. The conference theme is "Many Gifts, One Spirit."

The Fellowship, a world-wide Christian Church founded in 1968 by Rev. Troy D. Perry, will open its General Conference XI next Monday, July 11, at the University of Toronto. The conference will feature two speakers, Dr. Virginia R. Mollenkott, who is a noted Evangelical Christian feminist, and George Hislop, who is one of the founders of the gay/lesbian movement in Canada and a recipient of the MCC's Human Rights Award for 1983.

MCC is an international Fellowship with congregations in 11 countries. "This is the first time our General Conference will be held outside the United States," spokesperson R. Adam DeBaugh explained to TWT NEWS. The conference is designed to bring together Christians from not only the U.S. and Canada, but also from Great Britain, Denmark, Australia, New Zealand, Mexico and other countries, many of whom are noted activists for gay rights in their home country.

Music is always an important part of MCC worship. Danny Ray of Dallas, as Music Director, has held auditions for choirs, soloists and instrumentalists who will take part in the Conference. "For the first time in MCC history, there will be a Conference orchestra at the Saturday night Ordination service and Sunday morning's closing worship, along with the traditional General Conference massed choir," DeBaugh told TWT NEWS.

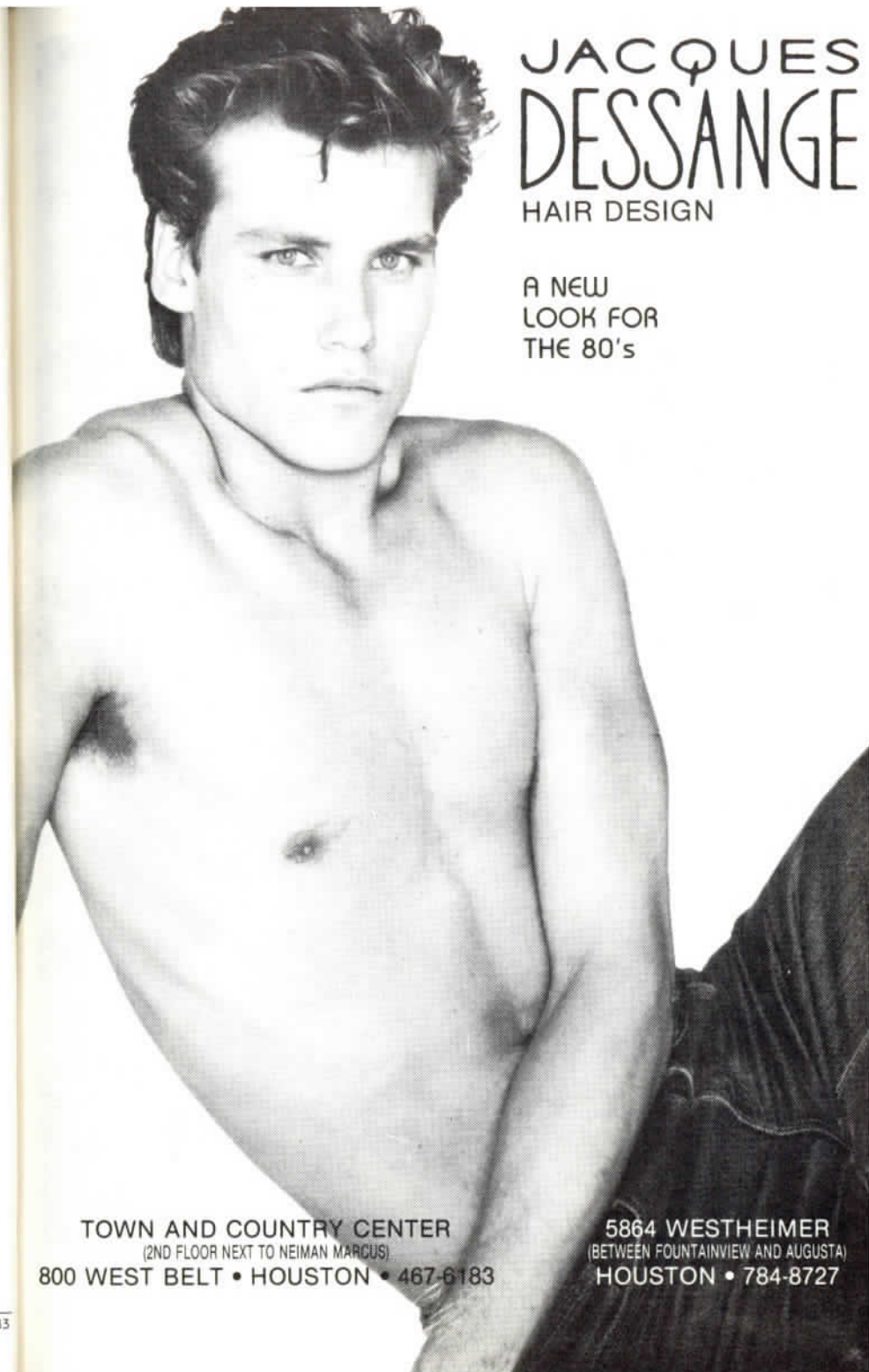
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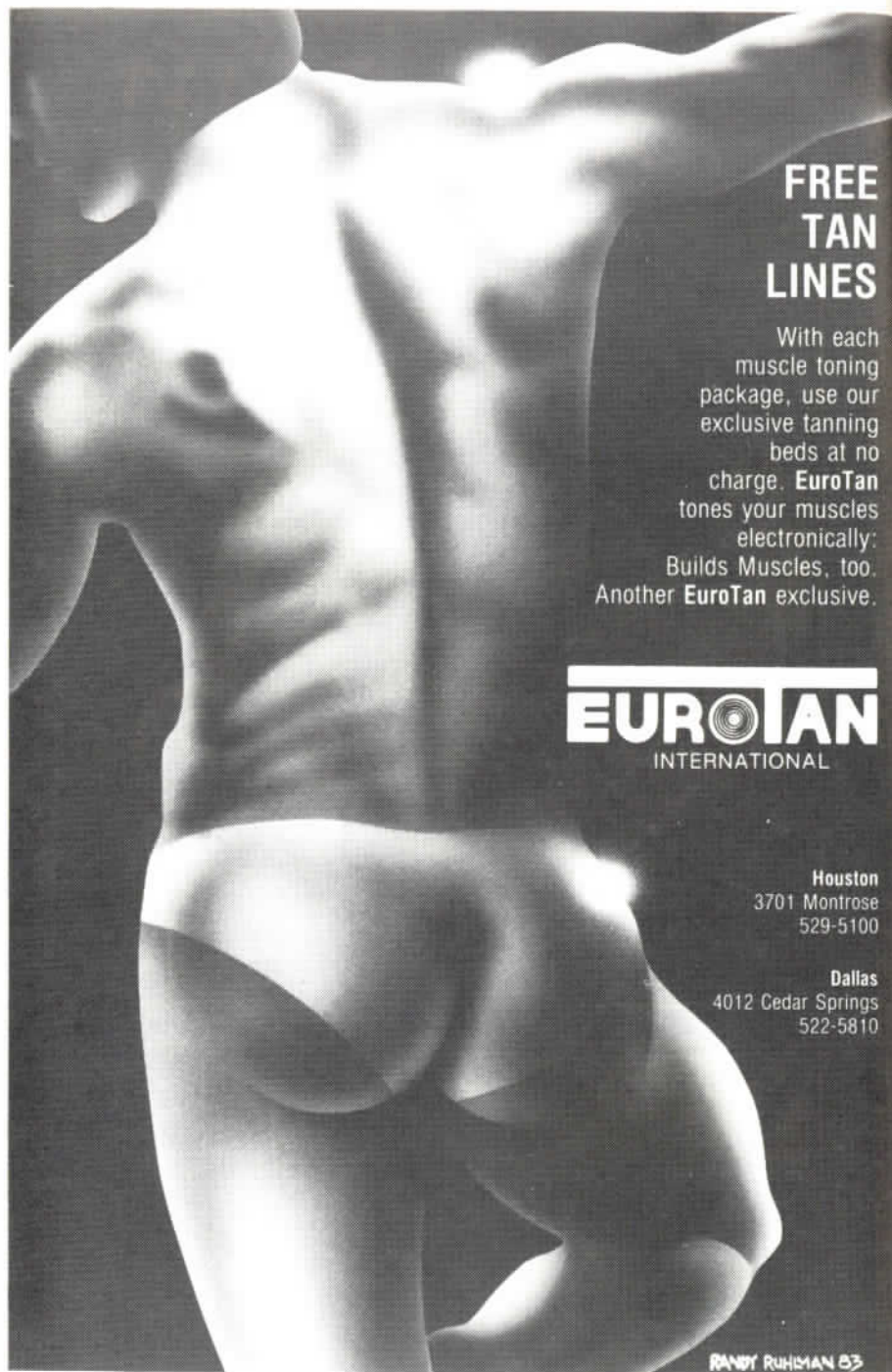

Atheist Float Banned

Dear TWT:

We, the Gay Pride Week Committee and Parade Director, would like to inform the gay community of our actions regarding the American Gay Atheist Unit in the recent parade. This organization has been officially banned from the parade for a period of four years. This was an unanimous decision on the part of the parade committee. We base this decision on three points.

1) Before the parade, Larry Bagneris, parade director, instructed the Gay Atheists not to use the blow-up doll in a sexual manner. These instructions were not adhered to. In a large public endeavor such as the parade, the final decision must rest with the director and (s)he must be able to trust the participants to carry out the final decision. If this is not done, unnecessary incidents, such as the booing of the Gay Atheists' float, will result: embarrassing the community and overshadowing the positive effects of the parade.

2) The Gay Atheist unit was not only in poor taste but terribly offensive to a large and important segment of our community. It is regrettable that the American Gay Atheists chose not only to ignore our theme—Unity Through Diversity—but to use the parade to openly insult other organizations and individuals. Their float clearly displayed the fact that they have separated themselves from the diversity within the gay community. It also showed that our unity obviously means very little to them.

3) The manner in which they used the doll during the parade was clearly against the long-standing rules of the parade committee. We do not allow nudity, much less simulated acts. The parade is not a sex show on wheels!

We would also like the community to realize that we do not object to the goals or beliefs of any organization. It is

everyone's right to get their ideas or goals across in their own manner—as long as it does not violate our rules, is done in a tasteful manner, and is not done in a way which other groups are openly attacked, ridiculed or seriously offended.

Gay Pride Always Costs

Dear TWT:

In the issue of TWT [Vol. 9, No. 15] immediately following Gay Pride Week, a letter in TWT COMMENT from Lakey Eastmore contained statements more acceptable in Moscow than Houston. I quote Eastmore:

"Why is this turning into a commercial venture?"

"What was so horrible about just having a parade, and a rally in the park? Who asked us, anyway, where we wanted the rally?"

"You had a meeting to decide where to hold the rally? Fine; how many voices does it take to represent the gay community? What are we being charged for *something we should all be given*?"

The "you" who had a meeting is GPC, of which I am a member and which has sponsored the rally and financed it since its inception. Yes, I said *financed* it. These rallies do cost money. So do the parades; ask anyone who has placed a unit in one.

To my knowledge—and as a member of both GPC and the Gay Pride Week Committee I should know—there is nothing commercial in Gay Pride Week or the rally. A small percentage of the gay community spends many hours and contributes thousands of dollars to underwrite the week in order to pull it off and try to see that it breaks even financially.

Anyone who wants his/her voice heard should join the GPC (the annual membership fee is \$15—very small

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compared to the benefits the community gets from the organization) and attend the meetings of the Gay Pride Week Committee (they start six months before Gay Pride Week each year).

I personally could never feel that I *should be given* anything that happened between June 16 and June 26. The gay community has been very good to me, and I have tried to repay it thoroughly. I appreciate having been named grand marshal of the parade; I just hope that I *earned* the honor.

Dear TWT:

The Gay Political Caucus (GPC) would like to respond to various published remarks appearing in the gay press regarding the GPCelebration '83 held at the Summit June 26.

The caucus was a body voted to hold the annual rally at the Summit for various reasons. Vandalism and harassment occurring during and after the traditional Spotts Park rally were the prime considerations.

The caucus decided on an admission cost of \$9.65 to cover the expenses incurred at the Summit. We also hoped to raise the monies necessary to help fund caucus activities as we come into a very difficult election season. As had been reported in the press, we made no money on the event. Although we covered all expenses for the event, we still assumed a debt stemming from loans made to help sponsor GPCelebration '83.

We feel that the decision made to hold the celebration at the Summit was a good one. We have produced a professional event that can be expanded and used in future years to bring the community closer together at the conclusion of Gay Pride Week. We are proud that the GPC has the leadership necessary to make such an event happen, and we are confident that the event will be even better and more successful next year.

GPC is an all-volunteer organization that depends solely on the generosity of the community. Unfortunately, in a city of over 1.5 million people, the community's ability to support such a large gay organization has been severely strained. GPC members realized that only a project as large as the Summit could provide a sound financial base and prevent the community from

being "nickel-and-dimed" any further. We would love to be able to produce a free extravaganza for the community. In fact, the free rally at Spotts Park in 1982 cost in excess of \$14,000.


A successful Summit event next year guarantees the GPC will be able to expand its activities for the benefit of the entire gay community.

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For the past two months, my lover and I have received many annoying and downright frightening phone calls. Having had enough, we decided to have a trace put on our phone line in an effort to trap this lunatic. Getting this service on your phone is a first-year lesson in persuasion. Bell has many rules and regulations you must follow—good, because without these rules we would all be prey to violations of our constitutional rights.

My bitch with this system is its inefficiency. Out-of-town harassment calls cannot be traced to an actual phone number; they can however identify the call as having originated out of the Houston service areas. 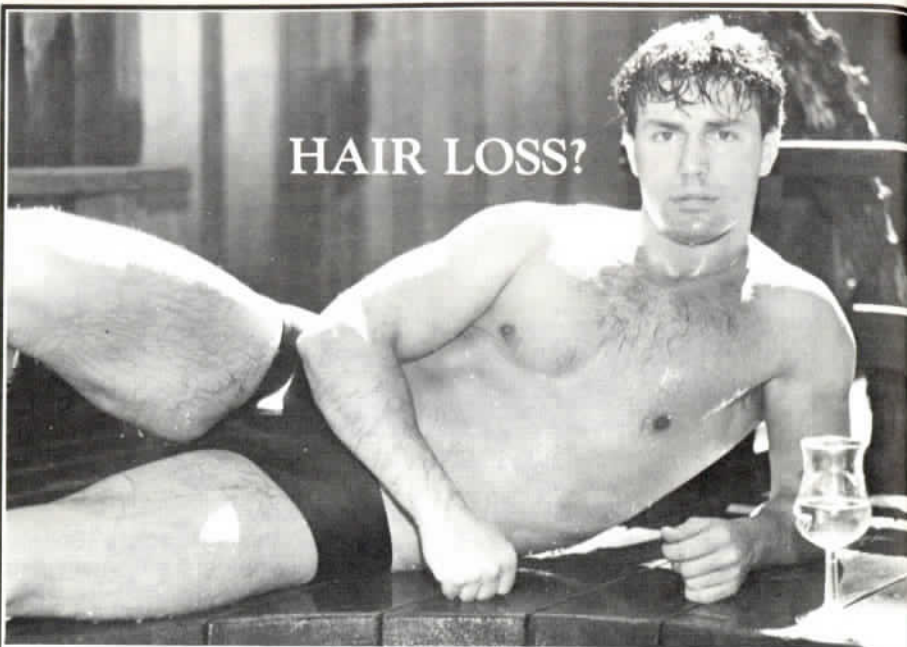
important, write it.

What does this boil down to? Bell may genuinely care about harassment calls, but the human error exists even within this multi-million dollar company. The human error was either mine or theirs; I can't remember what I was supposed to do; I was scared by these calls and, for obvious reasons, scared to have a trace put on my line.

Lesbians are especially prey to these calls; most of us must mask any semblance of being gay at our place of work, and often are requested to go to straight bars with people we work with to further enforce our covers. We meet many people, and our well-meaning friends from work will, without exception, try to fix us up with dates. More often, our names and phone numbers are given out without enough discretion. Hence, we get calls from men who want to date us. Do you see it coming?

Rejection is an ugly thing, and it brings us back to gay people not being accepted. And that is what we gay writers are trying to help with. All of us hope that some day within our lifetimes we will all feel comfortable enough to say to a stranger, "I'm not interested in dating you—I'm gay," or "Right case, wrong gender!" I have taken to saying, "Sorry, I'm taken!" This works sometimes, more often than not. Unless, of course, some grunting Neanderthal per-

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sists. In which case RUN, don't walk.

Back to Bell. In my last conversation with the rep, I said (in summary), "There is really not too much you can do to stop these calls unless they come with radical frequency, right?" RIGHT, the calls cannot be traced unless they come with more frequency than any of us would care to put up with.

Honestly, with all the advantages available now with computers, one would think a simple act like logging calls wouldn't be too hard. In any self-defense course (mine was fencing), you are taught that preparedness is the best defense. And so are the teachings in today's world—be prepared for attacks and you will have a better chance of fending someone off. One last note: If you receive this type of harassment, you are able to sue the person if you can collect evidence; Bell will help you in this matter; so will any attorney, especially those listed in this periodical. Crisis Hotline has a tremendous listening ear, if you can get through to them, and don't forget that Houston has its **very** own Gay Switchboard. Above **all**, don't feel alone or in some way guilty about obscene calls—you have done nothing to force jerks to be jerks. You are not alone!

From Violent Men, by Daniel Curzon; 248 pp.; fiction; IGNA, 511 Capp Street, San Francisco, California 94110; softcover, \$8.95.

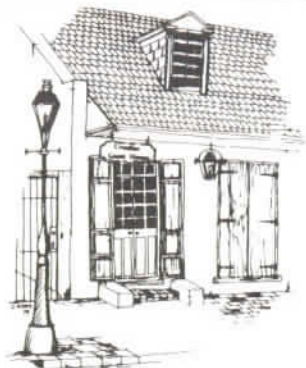
It has been almost five years since the assassination of Harvey Milk, gay member of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, and George Moscone, mayor of San Francisco. Many are or should be aware of the importance of these people and the treatment of their killer. The documented, non-fiction account of these events had been recorded in the book *The Mayor of Castro Street, The Life and Times of Harvey Milk*, by Randy Shilts, in 1982.

Only now are we getting the fictional treatments of this subject in books and plays, in 1983. One such book is *From Violent Men* by Daniel Curzon. Daniel

Curzon has written dark, fatalistic books (novels) before (*Something You Do in the Dark*, 1979), and *From Violent Men* is no exception. To be fair, he has also written *The Joyful Blue Book of Gracious Gay Etiquette*, a satire of etiquette books, but his novel here is its opposite in spirit.

As he admits in the forward, "This book is a work of the imagination," but it reads more as a docu-drama. He picks and chooses, out of the facts, parts to include in the novel, and lists his comments, observations and opinions, with a great deal of anger and bitterness through his characters.

One example is a potshot he takes at lesbians in San Francisco who were present at the walkout from a performance by a female impersonator. He portrays the "Lesbian Caucus" as a petty group of people unwilling to aid a kidnapped



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city supervisor by raising funds demanded by the kidnapers.

Dianne Feinstein, Harry Britt, the gay supervisor now in San Francisco, Dan White and his wife have fictional counterparts—Mayor Miller, Desmond Rhodes, Brad Short and Debra Ellen Short, respectively. But Desmond Rhodes, a supposedly responsible politician, acts with others in a plot to kill Brad Short while he is still in prison. Other fanatics end up kidnapping him for his role in "leading rich gays allied with the police department in an economic assault against our poor Hispanics and blacks."

The book becomes a political tract with gruesome murders in graphic detail, and the only murders that take place in the whole book are of gays. That statement of fact can lead to many interpretations but it stands alone here. Curzon has written a novel where the situation in San Francisco has degenerated to fanatical factions killing innocent people indiscriminately.

If this book's purpose is to entertain, enlighten, rouse others to action or provoke thought, *From Violent Men* fails on all points. I don't know what Daniel Curzon is trying to do but he is being very cavalier with his novel. It seems he is trying to incite gays to action with his ending to the book, but he seems to be try-

ing to incite a provocative, enraged, vicious response very similar to Dan White's actions.

Curzon is very pessimistic and negative, exhibiting emotional excess with his characters. At the end of each chapter, he has a vignette that illustrates a fact from gay history, an example of a child having his penis cut off by his father because the eight-year-old was masturbating, a queer-bashing episode, the now-homophobic Little Richard preaching against gays and, a man-hating feminist sociology professor, etc.

Curzon has this thing about "happy" gay books and he talks about it in *Something You Do in the Dark*. He also mentions it in the vignette at the end of Chapter 29. The customer in a gay bookstore, "Unhappy in his own life, he doesn't like what he reads. . . ." So Curzon gives us "reality" in his books, even if the spirit of the book is fatalistic, aside from the facts.

I think this is what Curzon fails to understand, and so his books will continue to discourage and darken, without hope or an optimistic spirit. What he could have done was to inform and inspire, encouraging a positive, thoughtful, rational attitude, disposing with the hatred and bitterness that some have felt or would continue to feel that flow from this event.

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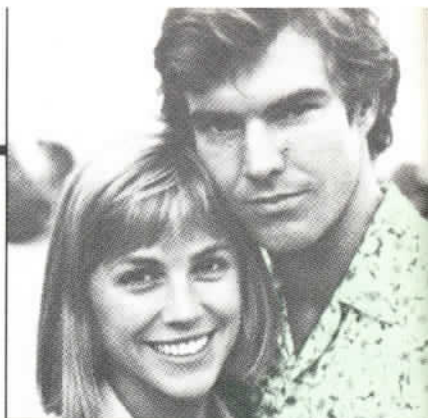

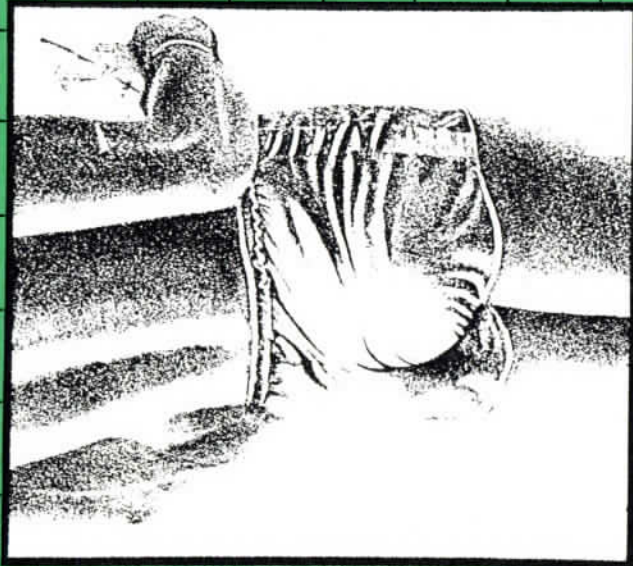

I would love to see that word (sister) disappear from the gay vocabulary. How often have you heard or said, "I know him too well," or "I can't do that with a sister." We have created a word to use in place of friend that has the connotation of a relative—hence incest. Come on!

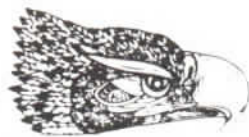
