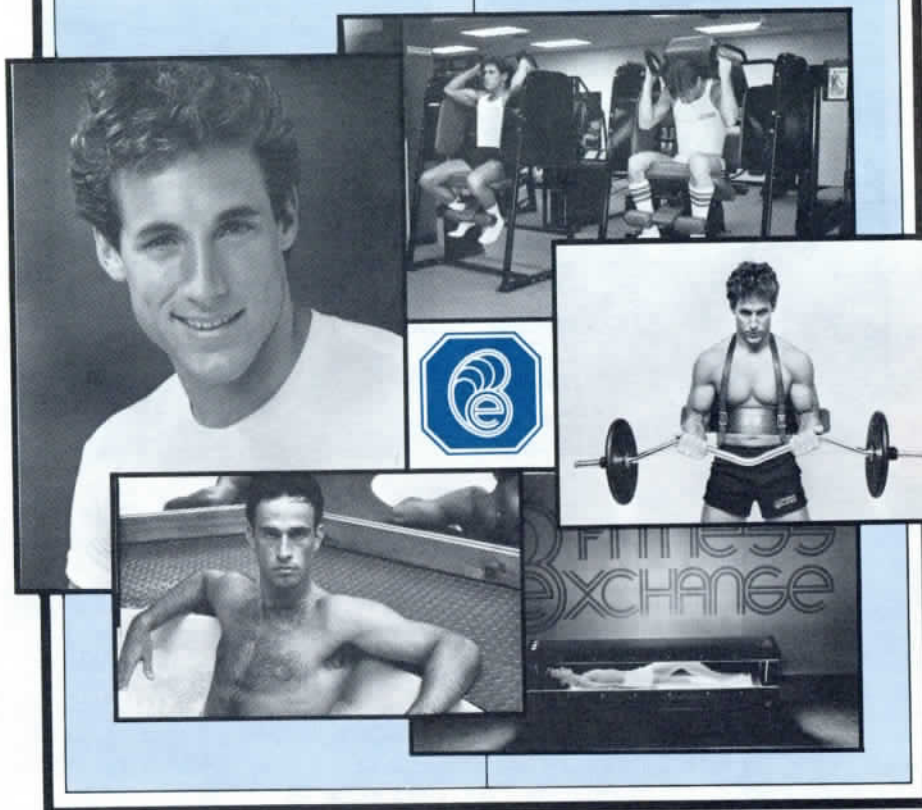

## 365 GAY DAYS OF TEXAS FREEDOM

DALLAS — Next Wednesday, August 17, will mark the first-year anniversary of federal Judge Jerry Buchmeyer's decision which struck down Texas' homosexual conduct law, Section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code, which attorney Jim Barber tirelessly helped defeat for THRF, TWT NEWS recalled.

Thus, next Wednesday will mark the 365th day of freedom for Texas homosexuals. On that day, the DGA, MCCD and OLCC will jointly sponsor an anniversary rally on the 21.06 repeal.

The event will be held at the Amphitheater in Reverchon Park beginning at 8:30pm. It is the first of several activities—the forerunner to the Gay Freedom Festival scheduled for Labor Day weekend, TWT NEWS learned.

It was August 17 of last year when Buchmeyer rendered his historic ruling. It was the first time any such statute in the U.S. had been successfully challenged on the federal level. The case is currently in the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals, and most gay leaders believe the decision will be affirmed, Buck Massey told TWT NEWS.

## TEXANS CAUGHT IN HAITIAN GAY PURGE

DALLAS — A man who has been a resident of Haiti for four years and who was visiting friends in this Texas city last week on vacation, has reported to TWT NEWS that he will not be able to return to his native land.

He learned that on July 26, police in Haiti arrested all gay visitors, vacationers and residents with American and European heritage, beat many of them up and deported them from the country permanently. Many were arrested on the

spot, in their hotel rooms, at beaches and at restaurants, and immediately sent home by air with only the clothes on their backs and what possessions they could carry.

Haitian government officials stated that they wished to purge their island home of all homosexuals because they were tired of having their country blamed as the hot-bed for AIDS spreading to America and Europe.

The visitor to Dallas said that "hopefully" his landlord would ship all of his possessions and goods back to him in the states.

Several Texans on vacation in Haiti were among those caught in the "cleansing of the land of AIDS" purge.

It was not immediately known what ill-fate native gay Haitian males were facing. "Likely death or imprisonment," it was cautioned.

## HOLLOW RAID NOT A MORAL CRUSADE

AUSTIN — Travis County Sheriff Doyne Bailey said the recent arrests for nudity, drugs and open sex at Hippy Hollow on Lake Travis were "not a moral crusade." Eleven people, one of whom is gay, were arrested and charged with disorderly conduct Sunday afternoon, July 31.

The arrests were prompted by an increasing number of complaints from neighborhood residents along Lake

Travis and Commanche Trail. Recently, several visitors had even complained in letters to the editor of *TWT COMMENT* (see page 21) attacking the deteriorating condition of the once-beautiful park, which began as a popular swimming spot for nudists back in the early 60s.

Those sunbathers who put on their clothes when asked were not arrested. Plainclothes male and female deputies had moved into Hippy Hollow to observe activity before the arrests were made, Deputy Curtis Weeks explained.

Officers used video taping and still photography to record activities. These will be shown to a Travis County grand jury to establish a criterion for lewdness and nudity, *TWT NEWS* learned.

Complaints about burglaries, noise, public sex, drunkenness, drugs, damaged cars and litter were listed.

There were five arrests for possession of marijuana, two for public intoxication, and four for indecent exposure. "Those four were performing sexual acts in public," Weeks said.

With Austin's "live and let live" liberal policy, its "laid back" attitude, and its intellectual college climate, the sheriff's department knows better than to try and control individual behavior. As long as people keep their clothes on, don't have sex in public, and keep their drugs out of Hippy Hollow, it's still safe to go, an officer explained.

It should be stressed that the raid was not directed at the gay cove.

Meanwhile, the day after the raid, *The Daily Texan*, the newspaper of the University of Texas, printed a photo of an unidentified female bather lying nude on a float, ignoring the previous day's crackdown on nude bathing. "The cops aren't going to run me off," said another.

"Bathers live on despite arrests," said the UT headline. And, indeed, nude sunbathing has continued since the arrests, *TWT NEWS* has observed.

It is agreed by leaders of Austin's gay community, however, that the park does need to be cleaned up of trash. "After every gay function, we always have a clean-up detail," one bar owner said.

## **SPINDLETOP PARK SLAYINGS SOLVED**

BEAUMONT — With the recent arrest of Billy Johnson, a familiar face in local gay clubs, the dual shootings in the bizarre Spindletop Park murder cases on July 16 appear to be solved.

Beaumont homicide detectives were able to tie the loose ends of the cases together after working in close cooperation with the gay community and management of The Copa, *TWT NEWS* learned.

After a warrant had been served for Johnson's arrest, he was arraigned on July 25 and charged with capital murder.

Johnson is to be charged, however, only with the shooting death of John Arceneaux, a junior high school science teacher. Johnson will initially not be tried for the murder of Gerald Wilcoxson, a limousine driver.

Both men were found in the park later that same morning, both shot in the head with a .32 caliber weapon. Continuous searching for the gun in the park and a nearby river has yielded no results.

Robbery was determined as the motive for the killings of the two men, whose murders occurred only three hours apart. Most of the intrigue surrounding the nocturnal details in the park have yet to be unraveled.

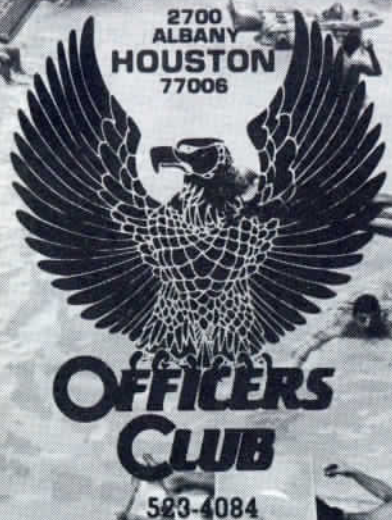
## **TEXAS HEPATITIS RESEARCH NEEDS YOU**

GALVESTON — Members of the Texas gay community with chronic hepatitis B infection are still needed by the Medical Branch of the University of Texas at Galveston for a large-scale, on-going study.

Response from a May 20 *TWT NEWS* story has been statewide, but a few more patients are still needed, Richard B. Pollard, M.D., assistant professor of Internal Medicine and Microbiology, stated.

Gay patients are needed primarily because hepatitis strikes more than twice

as many homosexuals as non-gays, Polard said. "We hope to show that the therapy we're using will affect the course of the chronic liver disease."

More than five percent of all Texas gays have had hepatitis B, and more than 30% have had hepatitis A, staggering local statistics reveal.

The study, partially funded by the National Institute of Health (NIH), is being collaborated with Stanford University Medical Center in California.

"Referral patients need only have been diagnosed as having chronic hepatitis B virus to qualify," spokesperson Karen Watermann told TWT NEWS. Call (409) 761-3111 or 761-4979.

## GAY PROGRAMS ON DALLAS CABLE TV

DALLAS — This August, Dallas Warner-Amex Qube Cable will air several programs produced by Dallas Gay Alliance (DGA) member Stephen Wagner and co-producer Nellie Thomas. *Dallas Gay Pride '83*, featuring highlights of the June 19 gay pride parade and rally, will begin airing on August 21.

Grand Marshals Dan Bradley and Miriam Ben-Shalon, DGA president Mike Stewart, MCC pastor Don Eastman, and NOW president Lynn Carroll are among the speakers included. "This inspiring program will not only offer those who were unable to attend the parade and rally an opportunity to view the events, but show the straight viewing public the vitality of the gay rights movement in Dallas," Wagner told TWT NEWS.

Also airing in August are three programs on the National Gay Leadership Conference, in honor of the anniversary of the successful national conference held in August 1982. The opening address by noted gay journalist and author, Larry Bush, the Police Relations workshop given by San Francisco Police Commissioner Jo Daly, and an overall view of the conference make up the programs that being airing this Sunday, August 14.

## GAY PROGRAMS ON AUSTIN CABLE TV

AUSTIN — Every Thursday night at 9:30pm on Austin cable TV, a weekly gay program entitled *Gay America* airs on Channel 10. The program, since it first aired last December, has been increasingly keeping the gay community home once a week to gather around the TV set before going out on the town.

The program is produced by Randy Moreau in cooperation with this city's Community Access Television. For an indepth interview with producer Moreau with TWT's Jay Cherin, see page 34.

Both Austin and Dallas now have regularly scheduled gay programs on local cable TV. The question arises as to why other large Texas cities such as Houston, Fort Worth and San Antonio have no such similar gay-oriented video programs.

Perhaps no one from a local organization has contacted their local cable TV company about a gay program, as has the Dallas Gay Alliance or Mr. Moreau, an observer pointed out to TWT NEWS.

## AYTZ CHAYIM ANNOUNCES MOVE

HOUSTON — Congregation Aytz Chayim, this city's only gay-oriented Jewish congregation, has informed TWT NEWS it will move to a larger and more central location at 217 Fairview at Taft. "We will be in the same building as the Church of Christian Faith," a spokesperson said.

Founded in 1980 with 10 members, Congregation Aytz Chayim had met at the Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection for the last three years.

This Friday, August 12, the congregation will formally enter its new home with a special Mezuzah Posting ceremony at 7:30pm, followed by a Sabbath evening service and Kiddush. "We have invited many important religious leaders from the Houston Jewish community, along with the leaders of the gay religious groups in the Houston area."

## BWMT TEXANS TO OHIO CONVENTION

COLUMBUS, Ohio — "Our Purpose, Our Organization, Our Pride" is the theme for the third annual Convention of the International Association of Black & White Men Together (BWMT), set to begin next Tuesday, August 16, and continue until August 21. Many members of Texas chapters of BWMT were ticketed to attend the convention. The gay inter-racial organization will offer workshops and social events to those committed to overcoming racial and cultural barriers, TWT NEWS was advised.

Highlighted speakers include Virginia Apuzzo, director of the National Gay Task Force (NGTF) and Dr. John Hopper, an immunologist at the University of Illinois Medical School.

Most of the scheduled workshops are designed to raise consciousness.

## CROSS-DRESSING LAW STILL DEAD

HOUSTON — August 12 marked the third-year anniversary for one of this gay community's very persistent people, TWT NEWS learned. On that date in 1980, Phyllis Frye ended a four-year lobbying bout with the city over a 70-year old "cross-dressing" ordinance, by seeing its repeal.

"That ordinance was used to arrest almost anybody who looked different or offended the 'old-image' Houston police," Frye explained. "Especially obnoxious was the practice of arresting lesbians in their bars for the crime of wearing fly-front pants." Repeal by the City Council was significant because it reflected an attitude change. Court actions can be gotten around by a legislative body if that body still has an unchanged attitude.

Friends at City Hall that day were McGowen, Lalor, Goyen, Gorzynski, Goodner, Tinsley, Hall and Reyes. Hartung was the sole "no" vote and Westmoreland was absent.

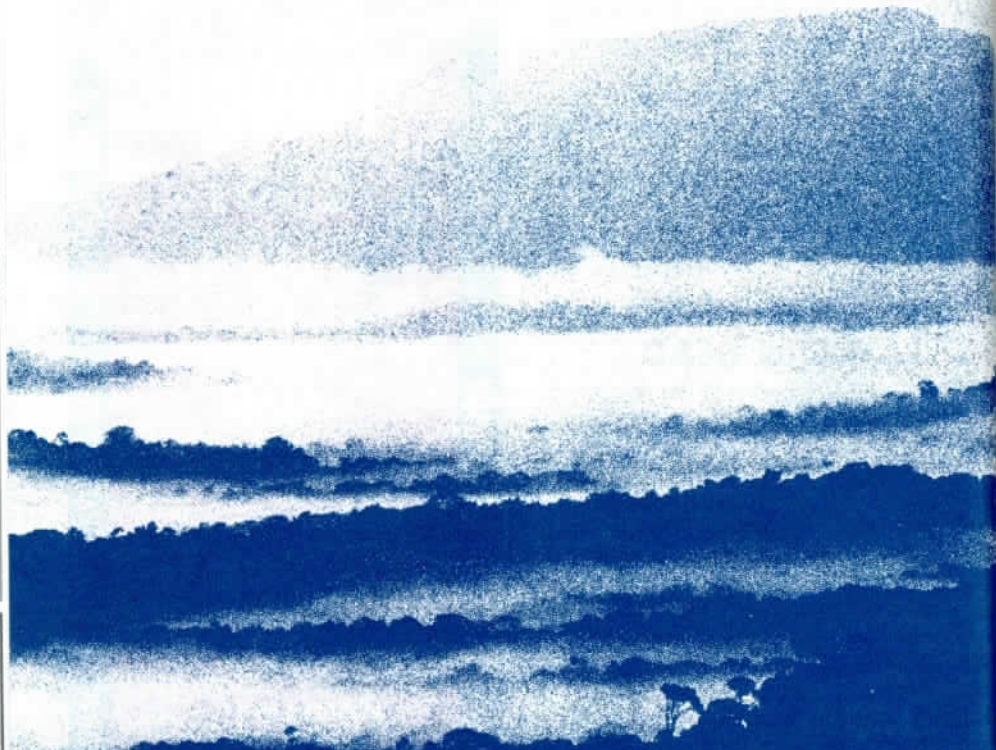

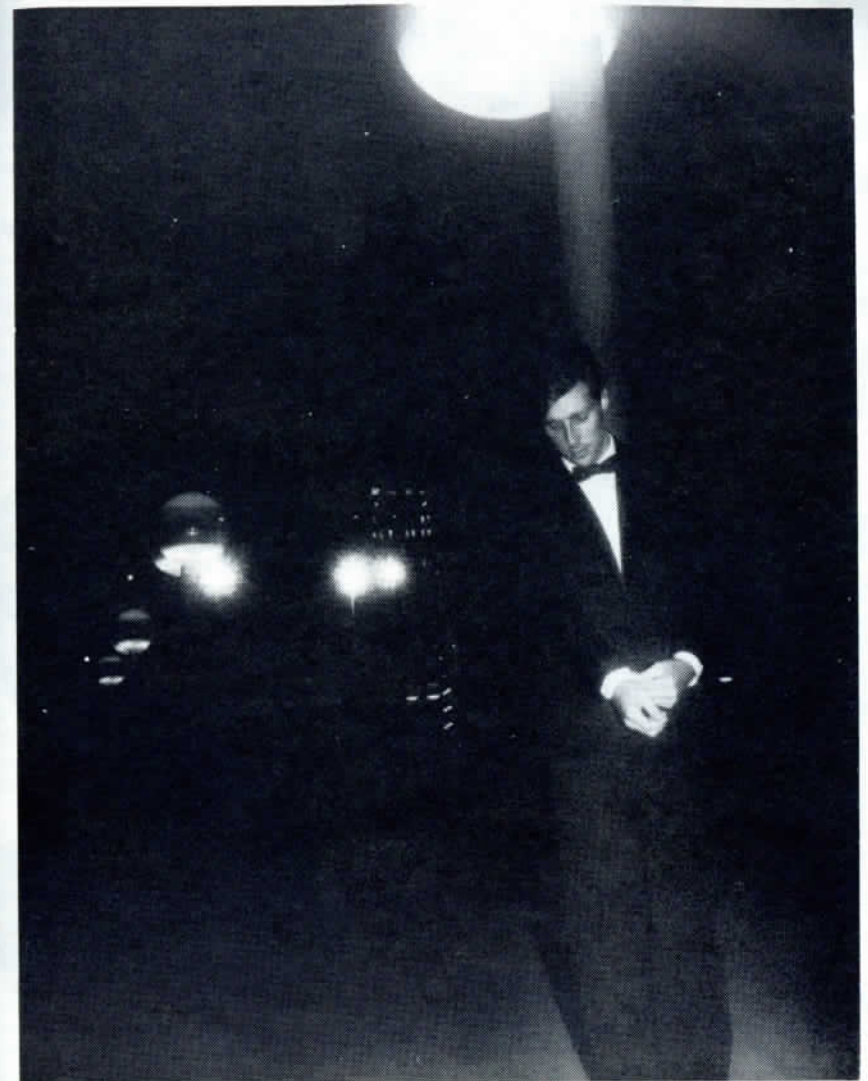

I am working on a BA degree in Sociology, having received my Associates Degree last year. I have written to the Federal Bureau of Prisons, and they tell me I will be encouraged in my efforts to obtain my Master's Degree in Sociology before I parole from the federal prison.

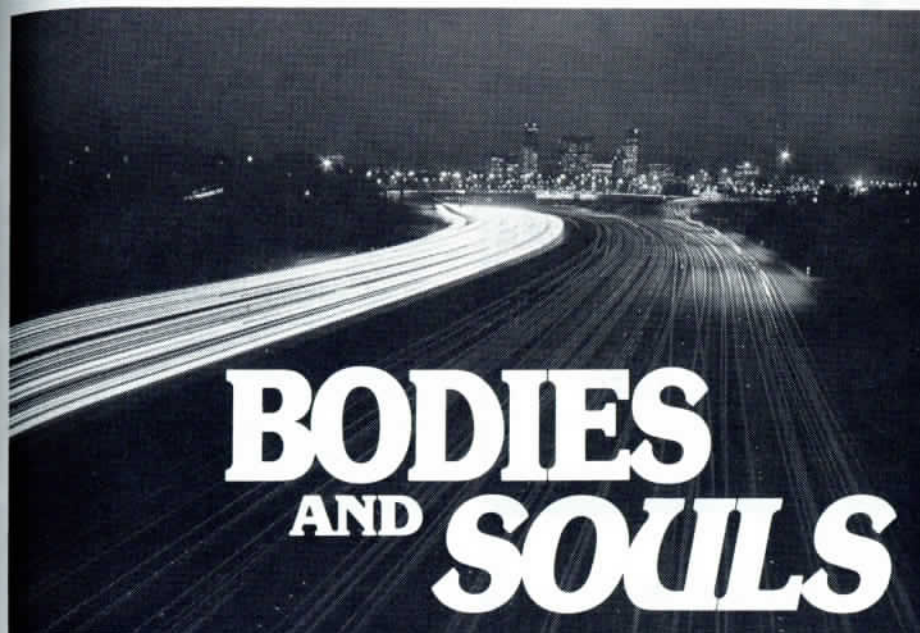

# BODIES AND SOULS

A novel by **John Rechy**

*Bodies and Souls*, by John Rechy; 421 pp.; fiction; Carroll & Graf Publishers, Inc., 260 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York 10001; softcover, \$8.95.

*Bodies and Souls* is John Rechy's latest "dark offering" in a series of novels that showcase his bitter, fatalistic view of man, gay or non-gay. Rechy is also known for his successful books, *City of Night*, *Numbers* and *The Sexual Outlaw*. Another trademark is his use of his experiences as a hustler to expose the evil, and sometimes just wasted, lives of people who exist on the street ("survive" is too hopeful a word).

The first edition of his latest novel is in paperback, and it consists of relative-

ly short vignettes about people, their anger, their hopelessness and their pettiness. The stories are interrelated by their reference to, or inclusion of, characters previously introduced. Each chapter devotes itself to one character at a time, but "comes back to" various characters during the course of the book.

The starring roles, or most often recurring roles, are filled by Orin, a strong, silent type; Lisa, the young woman living out her late adolescence; and "Jesse James," a cowboy poseur whose real name is James Jesse, from Morganfield, Kentucky, not Texas. They are the "Lost Angels" in a city of lost angels called Los Angeles. All three are randomly collected in Orin's indigo Cadillac as he picks up Jesse and Lisa, in-

dividually hitchhiking it down the freeway.

Orin bankrolls the trip as they cruise through Los Angeles and encounter the souls there. They are running away from the life they came from, relegating it to the distant mists of the past. They are not searching, they just drift. Orin's silent character hides a profound, deep-seated religious fanaticism, inspired by Sister Woman, a television evangelist in Los Angeles.

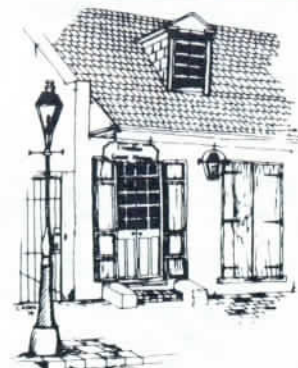
Lisa, carrying her doll, Pearl, guides her life and experiences with her oft-watched "all-times," the grand old movie classics of the past, shown in double features in her hometown. These movies help her understand a confusing, hostile world of constant uncertainty. She is also the sexual focus of Orin and Jesse as they travel in the front seat of the purple Cadillac.

Rechy introduces other characters alternately between the chapters on the Lost Angels. He uses an interesting literary technique in these chapters. What we have seen Orin, Lisa and Jesse do from their own perspective, we see from the perspective of other characters as they (Orin, Lisa and Jesse) make cameo appearances in these chapters. Watch carefully for characters that are minor parts in early chapters but are "reprised" in later ones.

In the very first section, with the words "Bodies and Souls" as the heading and before the chapters are numbered, we see Orin, Lisa and Jesse on a hilltop, overlooking the freeway. Orin has a rifle, Jesse points to a car on the freeway, and Orin covers the whole area with rifle fire. This is Rechy's gesture at foreshadowing the doom that hangs like Damocles' sword over the events and human beings who live in his stories.

He is reminiscent of Daniel Curzon who seems to believe that anything that is not cynical, bitter or hopeless is considered "happy talk," which has no place in the "real world." Rechy is, thankfully, less fatalistic in his portrayal of people and events, yet he has Orin evolve into an instrument of death on a stretch of Los Angeles highway, a fictional version of a real event that occurred some years ago.

Rechy is successful with his books; he is realistic in his portrayals of the underside of life and morals, but too often dwelling there for some. Depending on the individual, Rechy's view of mankind and womankind will be alternately depressing, intriguing, repelling; an opportunity to experience a "fascination for the perverse," generally speaking. His fans will accept his latest with open arms.

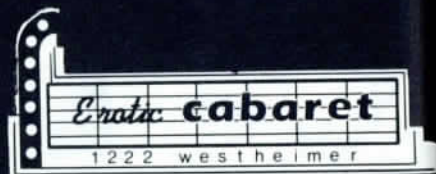

## CHANNEL 10 GAY AMERICA

An interview with **Randy Moreau**,  
the producer of Austin's "Gay America"  
Cable TV weekly program

*Randy Moreau, producer of Austin Community Access Television's program, Gay America, which airs every Thursday at 9:30pm on Austin's Channel 10, has been involved in the gay movement for many years in as many different cities. He has been instrumental in planning Austin Gay Pride Week, and various MCC programs. Now in Austin, Randy Moreau continues his work in the gay movement by proving through video that Austin does have a viable community. Past Gay America programs have featured The West Street Repertory Co. from New York, the Texas Gay and Lesbian Student Organization Coalition, Austin Gay Pride Week, and close-ups of most Austin organizations and outstanding members of the community.*

**TWT:** You were born in Killeen, Texas, spent much of your childhood traveling, and seem to keep yourself busy with a wide range of activities. What brought you into working primarily as a gay activist?

**Randy:** I was involved with somebody who could not deal with their sexuality. I decided to become active in our liberation so nobody would have to grow up feeling like him.

**TWT:** For somebody from Killeen, you speak with a most interesting accent. I imagine you get asked a lot about it, but would you mind telling me about it?

**Randy:** Most people think I'm Canadian or Australian. I grew up in several countries and have been multilingual since my childhood, which doesn't make you grow up sounding like you're from Killeen.

**TWT:** Randy, you have been doing the TV show since last December. What caused you to choose video as your area to promote gay liberation?

**Randy:** First of all, television has the

broadest range; immediate; an effective method of communication. I feel it's the quickest way to reach the community. Secondly, I think with the advent of cable, we have a chance to be part of a media in which we, as gay men and lesbians, can express ourselves without fear of censorship or stereotypic presentation by the non-gay community. My final reason is that we have a right to the printing press, and if we don't take advantage of it, then we are guilty of the same self oppression that has kept us in secret societies and subculture ghettos for the last 2,000 years.

**TWT:** How did *Gay America* begin?

**Randy:** *Gay America* got started because one of the community producers told me that ACTV was interested in doing a gay show, and I said yes.

**TWT:** Many Austinites have seen the show, and I understand you are planning to expand distribution. What have been some of the major accomplishments of the show?

**Randy:** When we first started, I worked at U.T. in the freshman English de-

partment, and I was buying the tape myself, but I couldn't keep that up. It was too expensive. Although we have been on the air since February of 1983, and our show was debuted in December, we've not been able to produce as frequently as I would like to, but we still manage to keep something on the air and preserve our time slot.

**TWT:** I imagine that with all the other programs on ACTV, you must have to consider their schedule, as well as your own staff's.

**Randy:** All the staff are volunteers, most with theatre or video experience, but we have to work production time around everybody's schedule, equipment availability, and the people and stories we want to do. That can be exceptionally hard when dealing with up to twenty people, as we sometimes have.

**TWT:** Surely there must be expenses for such things as tape, and other items. How have you alleviated these costs?

**Randy:** I left the university last April to develop a funding apparatus for the show, and we came up with the Progressive Education Foundation. The Foundation is organized for much more than just *Gay America*. It's a non-profit organization under filing status 501(C3), which seeks to educate and inform the community through film, video, theatre

—all the artistic media of what and who we are to ourselves. *Gay America* is the principle project at present, although the board of trustees has begun to look at a broad spectrum of programs of gay and lesbian culture in Austin.

**TWT:** Are your endeavors strictly confined to the Austin area?

**Randy:** *Gay America* has correspondents in San Francisco and Minneapolis. We also have the potential of going onto every public access outlet in the different cable systems across the country, which is our eventual goal.

**TWT:** It seems that lately the gay and lesbian community has been asked to donate a lot of money to numerous groups. Has the Foundation experienced, like most groups, a lack of consistent income?

**Randy:** Yes, but we've been fortunate in a few instances; the video taping of Men Together, the dance group from New York brought here by Community Productions, Don Baker's company, was underwritten by Dirty Sally's in Austin, and friends from MCCA. We've gotten a few periodic donations from friends in other cities, but funding is very sporadic and on a personal basis. The Foundation is going to take the same fundraising approach as other organizations that fall under these guidelines. Of course, that means for

any type donation, whether equipment, goods or money, its value is tax-deductible for the year in which it is given. We're hoping this will make a difference for not only *Gay America*, but the other gay arts projects we feel are such an important part of our culture.

**TWT:** You said "culture." Do you consider gay men and lesbians to have a culture unique to themselves?

**Randy:** Gays and lesbians are as much an ethnic group as blacks, chicanos, or any other group of world culture. If you look at Webster's definition of ethnic, it means a group of people who have common manners, mores, and their own language. Because of self-oppression brought on by societal pressure from the non-gay community, we've lost much of the history of our culture. Not many people remember what words like "Maryannes," "trade" and "gay" originally meant, or from whence they came, but all those words, whether we're living in anguish or not, are a part of our culture. I feel that gay culture has always existed, and that the expression of our heritage, our dreams and our emotions is what our culture is, and will always be, as with any other group of people.

**TWT:** By moderating the show you have come out, if that's the way to describe it, very publicly. Has this af-

ected your life in any way, such as your family or friends and how they react to you?

**Randy:** I'm very lucky with my family. My father was at the taping of the first show, and my niece and nephew were recently in a gay wedding that happened in Austin. My family is very supportive. As far as my friends are concerned, well, what can I say, they're all out, and so I don't see it as that big a deal. I must confess I'm always surprised when someone who's seen the show makes a comment about recognizing me, because when you do television, there's no audience. It's just like doing any other job. You do your work, finish, and you get out. But, it really hasn't changed the way I live.

**TWT:** Does the work really end after you're finished on the set?

**Randy:** It's a continuous process; it never stops, even after a show is in the can, which requires hours of preparation. We have staff meetings every week to decide what we're going to do next and what we're going to do with what we've already shot. When one show is in the can, it's time to start the next show.

**TWT:** You tell about what other people are doing on the show, and their ideas and opinions as well. Is there anything you would like to say, in your opinion, whether about the show, your life or our lifestyle?

**Randy:** I keep remembering a poster from the Los Angeles Gay Pride Week, similar to [Ben] Franklin's cartoon of the snake divided into thirteen pieces with the caption, "United we stand, divided we fall," underneath. Until we learn to act as a tribe, as a people, which I really believe we are, we are going to continuously be forced into that role of self-oppressor, imposed on us by the non-gay community at-large. So, I would say the most important thing I, *Gay America*, and the Foundation strive for, is a sense of unity, which would allow us, like the other people of the world culture, the ability to claim our rightful place in the world community. I am proud of who I am, and you should be, too.



## PROSTITUTES' BLUES by Harry Deutsch

If you like Rainer Werner Fassbinder and his work, you probably share or are intrigued by his largely untamed flair for the bizarre, multilayered melodrama which leaves plenty of room for analytical interpretation. Watching 1976's *Shadow of Angels*, you won't be disappointed, because it has many of the trimmings of a true Fassbinder, but the real thing it is not. One logical reason is that RWF was not the man in charge behind the camera. However, he did co-write the script with Swiss director Daniel Schmid and is one of the main figures on the screen.

The female lead is Ingrid Caven (a real-life, short-time Mrs. Fassbinder) who plays Lilly, a hapless, fragile hooker

who is far less successful and far more attractive than her mostly sleazy, sometimes vulgar co-workers in some dark, God-foresaken back alley. Fassbinder is her husband and pimp to Lilly and has a terribly hard time deciding how to punish her whenever she had yet another john, less evening. To beat her up, by his standards, would be an expression of love. He can't help getting off to her often-fictitious accounts of nightly sexual encounters and longs to hear the details of those anonymous mating mechanics. Things change as soon as Lilly gets picked up by a rich Jew (Klaus Lowitsch) who seems fascinated by her beauty and pays a grand so she would listen to his philosophical perception for an

hour.

Fassbinder, in the movie, opts to leave his woman for the love of another man which just about mirrors his autobiographic route. He winds up brutally beaten for kissing the male of his choice in a bar. The nasty bickering that ensues as Lilly's affair with the Jewish big-spender continues might but shouldn't be construed as an anti-Semitic slant of the film itself. In fact, Lowitsch, in spite of all the clinched wealth and influence, is the only character we can feel for, because he seems to act out of human decency. One of his adversaries, an old German Nazi who happens to be Lilly's father, is a pathetic example of a Fascist hiding behind a pitiful facade of

drag.

The acting in *Engel* is engaged and convincing; Mr. Fassbinder is low-key and looks slim, trim and better than in most of his movie appearances. The dialogue is definitely on the verbose side, and certain messages about the day-to-day struggle in the cities of this planet and between the sexes are driven home with a sledgehammer. The sets often look staged, and Mr. Schmid's direction, positively influenced by his lead actor, uses some innovative angles to tell a sometimes confusing story, a story that never makes you feel comfortable. But, Herr Fassbinder, mind you, never for long allows you the luxurious feeling of comfort.



## WHERE ANGELS FEAR TO TREAD Reviewed by George Klein

Rainer Werner Fassbinder always tended to work in extremes; his films had undeniable visual power (*Effi Brest* or *Querelle*) as well as a palpable tension between a morose kind of cynicism and a radical approach to political issues. *Schatten der Engel*, now enjoying a sort of revival after Fassbinder's death, seems an odd mixture of these elements with a bit of existentialism thrown in for good measure.

The script was written by Fassbinder

and Daniel Schmid, directed by the latter, and based on Fassbinder's play *The Garbage, the City, and Death*. The play was a cause for scandal when it was first produced because its property speculator is a Jew and characters make various anti-Semitic remarks (according to some) about gas chambers and usury. Schmid, in a 1976 interview in *Variety*, denied charges of anti-Semitism while Fassbinder, with his typical detachment, merely noted that

he wrote the play "almost in a state of trance" during a flight from Frankfurt to Los Angeles. After seeing the picture, I can only say it shows. The dialogue is cryptic and resembles warmed-over Edith Sitwell, all talk and tableau, particularly from a prostitute who constantly asks about the weather and her own death.

If the picture is anti-Semitic, it is so in a very self-conscious way, breaking the German postwar taboo on anti-Semitic

references with a kind of gleeful impudence. *Schatten der Engel* is, however, beautifully shot and edited, but not even Fassbinder's presence as a homosexual pimp who hates money (it was a long airplane trip, wasn't it?) can dispell the air of smugness and conceit surrounding the work.

# FANNY & ALEXANDER

A FILM BY **INGMAR BERGMAN**

## CURTAIN CALL

At the close of Ingmar Bergman's *Fanny and Alexander*, Helena Ekdahl begins reading Strindberg's *A Dream Play* to her grandson, Alexander, and contemplates a return to the stage. Bergman has declared that this film will be his last, and so the final scene seems especially fitting: a closing celebratory salute to his admitted literary idol and favorite artistic forum. The stuff of *Fanny and Alexander* emerges primarily from Bergman's enchantment with the theatre: pantomime, ballet, puppet plays and magic lanterns. Indeed, the film opens with Alexander (Bertil Guve) looking through the proscenium of a toy theatre located in the sumptuous apartment of his grandmother, Helena, with the room itself framed like a stage. We are, without doubt, in a world of childhood ideals, memory and magic symbolized by Alexander's *petit theatre*, a world in which Bergman seems unquestionably content.

One of the many surprises of *Fanny and Alexander* rests in its opulence of mood. Bergman's concern in much of the first half of the picture is with the aspects of Alexander and his immediate family: Helena (Gunn Wallgren), the

matriarch who was once a theatrical star; Isak Jacobi (Erland Josephson), her lover and a Jewish salesperson; Helena's philandering son, Oscar (Allan Edwall), an actor-manager; his placid and reserved wife, Emilie (Ewa Froling), Alexander's mother and an actress like her husband; and the villainous Bishop Edward Vergerus (Jan Malmego), who will figure prominently in the second portion of the motion picture. Bergman handles these characters with charm and a deftness lacking in many of his films, and the scenes between Alexander and his family, particularly at Christmas, have a warmth and glow and, at times, bawdiness that is tremendously appealing. And if the second half of the picture appears somewhat self-indulgent and full of gothic touches, particularly in the scenes between Vergerus and Alexander, Bergman's wealth of details and Sven Nykvist's striking photography are more than enough to keep our interests.

*Fanny and Alexander* also serves as a kind of pictorial footnote to themes, facts, and even dialogue found throughout Bergman's other works. Erland Josephson's Isak Jacobi is recalled by

# KRULL

## Faithful Readers:

It is the unquenchable sorrow of the Little Sisters of Domination to inform you again that Mr. Movies will not be able to review *Krull* as scheduled. The good Sisters had hoped to whip him into shape quickly, but Mr. Movies is now suffering from celluloid dementia and is under the delusion that he is Mr. McGoo.

A tape recording found in his bedroom indicates that *Krull* is a story about Colwyn, the young king who must destroy a wicked alien warrior and his minions who travel to worlds to plunder and destroy cities. This is no easy task. First, he and his friend, Ynyr, must find a magical bladed weapon which works like a boomerang, and then they must find several mystical people who can tell them where the wicked alien's spaceship is located that holds captive Colwyn's bride, the young queen.

The tape also says: "This ambitious project from the Pinewood Studios c/o Columbia Pictures will fail at the box office in spite of terrific scenery and slick special effects. The similarity between *Krull* and *Star Wars* is shameless. Where there once was a light saber, there is now a magical boomerang blade; where there once was Princess Leia, there is now a Queen Lyssa; Obi Wan is now Ynyr and Yoda is the Emerald Seer; and of course the fight against The Beast/Darth Vader is won by Colwyn/Luke Skywalker. This is a children's picture for children who have short attention spans and even shorter memories."

It doesn't sound like such a hot picture after all, does it? Therefore, as Mother Most Superior, I command you to avoid this filth and hope for the recovery of Mr. Movies who will enlighten us someday as to decent entertainment.





Helena with the words, "You were a sweet lover, like strawberries," and a viewer may be reminded of Sjöberg's Isak Borg in *Wild Strawberries*. (To complicate matters, Josephson also played a character named Vergerus in *The Passion of Anna*; indeed, Bergman's use of icy intellectuals/villains named Vergerus is a standard device in many of his films. Gunnar Björnstrand was Dr. Vergerus in *The Magician* and Heinz Bennet was a mad doctor who watched himself die in *The Serpent's Egg*.) All of these facts and innuendoes may seem "precious" to many viewers and, indeed, Bergman's choice of details and thematic materials sometimes suggests an element of premeditation and self-consciousness, a teacher leading his class by the hand. Although not as explicit as in other Bergman films, his female characters, particularly Emilie, are treated with both a sensual intelligence but also a depressing kind of worship, as something to live up to rather than as whole individuals. Yet for all these faults, many of which have plagued Bergman throughout his career, *Fanny and Alexander* works as both a fascinating glossary to a large volume of work and as a sustained piece of art.

The real sources of Bergman's *Fanny and Alexander* are in himself, yet it is a self that on many occasions has been difficult to decipher. Bergman has tenaciously denigrated his art, noting in interviews that he makes film for "public consumption," to be used and thrown away. Yet his motion pictures are, ironically, rarely accessible to a popular audience, and when audience members and the media approach his work critically, both groups rather foolishly equate Bergman's structural complexity (in something like *The Hour of the Wolf*) with intellectual complexity. Since the primary interest of a Bergman film is its creator, perhaps viewers should instead raise questions about whether they learn anything of significance about Bergman as an *artist* from his works. Bergman has always been a man looking into a world of his own creation—

generally agonized and contorted—and he is content too often with the outside appearances, creating an elaborate set of symbols which are seldom clarified. Why burden an audience with exposure to personal fears, tantrums and traumas when no real dramatic or formal structures are provided to illuminate these visions?

*Fanny and Alexander*, like Bergman's best works (*Smiles of a Summer Night*, or *The Seventh Seal*, or *Winter Light*, or *Monika*, or parts of *Wild Strawberries*, or all of *The Magic Flute*), appeals to our mind and emotions and is structured accordingly so that we understand the relationship between Bergman's anxieties toward being an artist and his own fears as a thinking and feeling person. He does not here assume the role that he has before in works such as the frighteningly superficial *The Virgin Spring* or the grossly enigmatic *The Silence*—a person driven by inner compulsions or neurotic anxieties over which he says he has no control. At his worst, Bergman is a fraud—a director who uses terms like "compulsion" or "anxiety" or "drive" to de-emphasize responsibility for the erratic fluctuations of narrative and dramatic perspectives in many of his films. Bergman once noted in an interview that as a child "the devil was an early acquaintance, and in the child's mind there was a need to personify him." It does not take long to realize that Bergman's devils—bound closely to his childhood fears of his father, a Swedish-Lutheran in love with that other form of theatre, the church—are given substance on film. Yet in *Fanny and Alexander*, the family is so real and sustained with such exuberance and humor that it is as if Bergman had forgotten his self-imposed label, the apostle of doom. A man who makes films to exorcise his demons, leaving the audience baffled. *Fanny and Alexander* works precisely because Bergman does not seek the "devil's acquaintance"; instead, he pursues recollections that can be shared rather than illicit and forbidden acts which must be hoarded.

He had joined ABC News in 1965 as a Washington correspondent, and in 1978 he began as anchor for *World News Tonight*. ... Actor **Raymond Massey**, well known for his stage and movie portrayals of Abraham Lincoln, and for his role as Dr. Gillespie in the *Dr. Kildare* TV series, died July 29 at age 86. Among more than 70 movies, he appeared in *Arsenic and Old Lace* (1947), *East of Eden* (1955) and *How the West Was Won* (1963). ... Actress **Lynn**


 Alfred Lunt and Lynn Fontaine in *The Great Sebastians*.

**Fontaine**, one-half of America's greatest husband and wife acting team, died July 30 at age 95. Among the stage productions she appeared in with her husband Alfred Lunt were *The Sea Gull* (1938), *O Mistress Mine* (1946), *The Great Sebastians* (1956) and *The Visit* (1958). Alfred Lunt died in 1977 at age 84. ... Movie and TV actress **Carolyn Jones**, who was born in Amarillo, Texas in 1929, died August 3 at age 54. Unfortunately, this fine actress attained her greatest popularity for portraying Morticia in the 1960s sit-com *The Addams Family*—prior to that stint she contributed some fine performances to such movies as *The Opposite Sex* (1956), *Marjorie Morningstar* (1958) and *Career* (1959). In 1957, her six-minute beatnik role in *The Bachelor Party* earned her an Oscar nomination for "Best Supporting Actress."

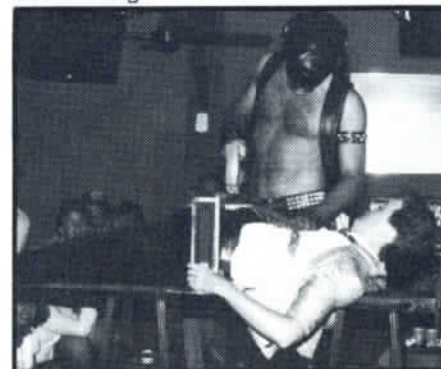

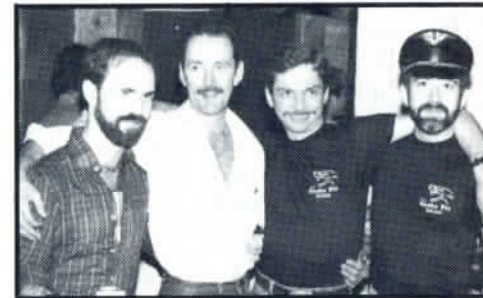

From his graduating class of eleven, he moved on to junior college in Beeville, Texas. Moving to Austin, he has begun making a name in the local theatre community.

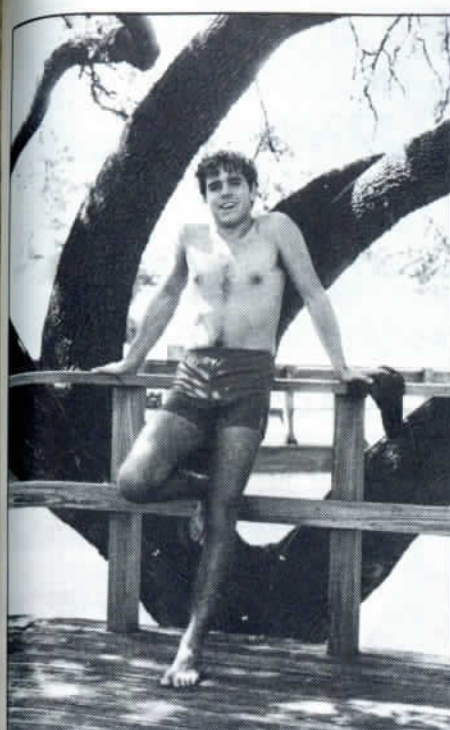
