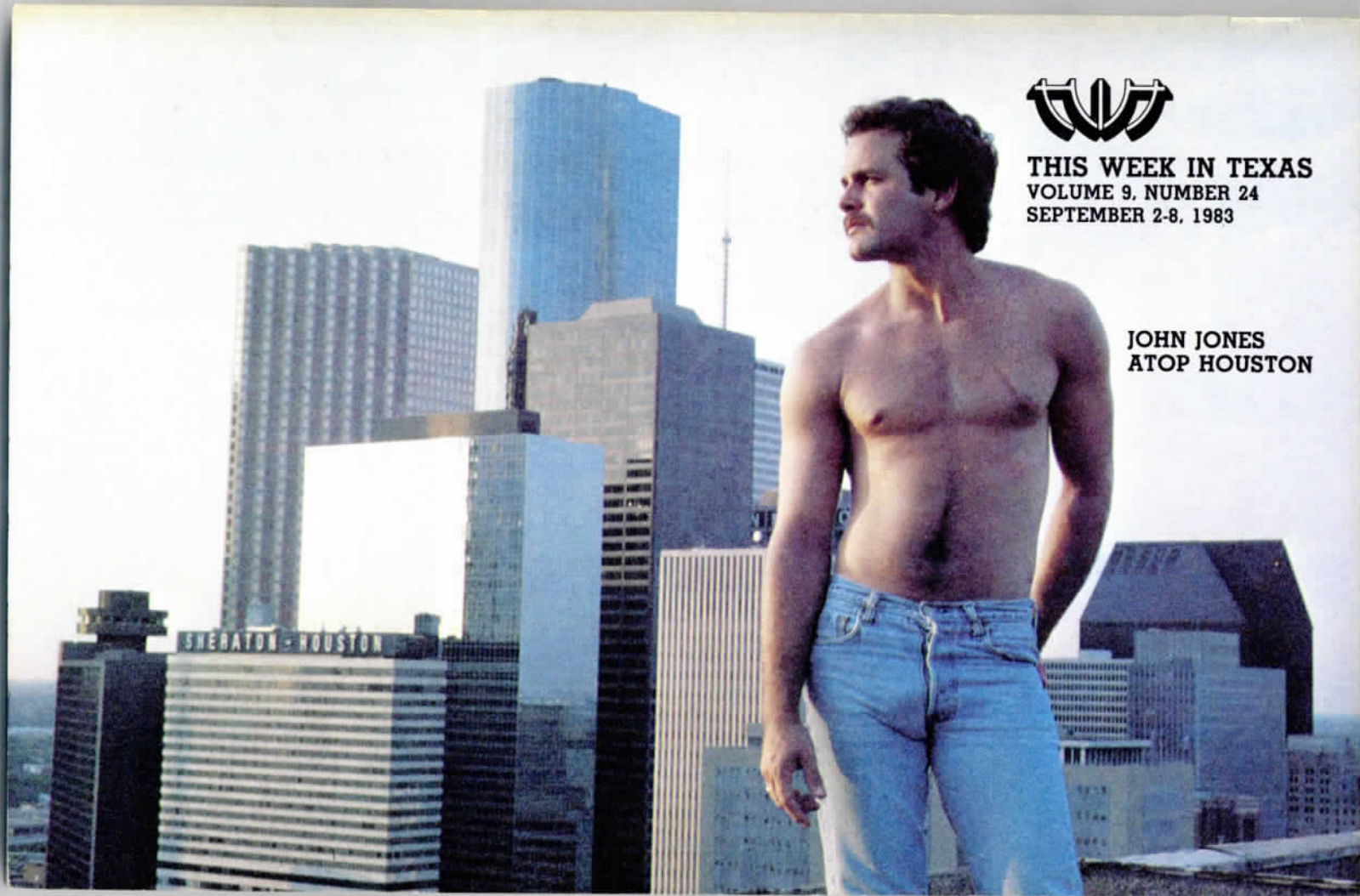

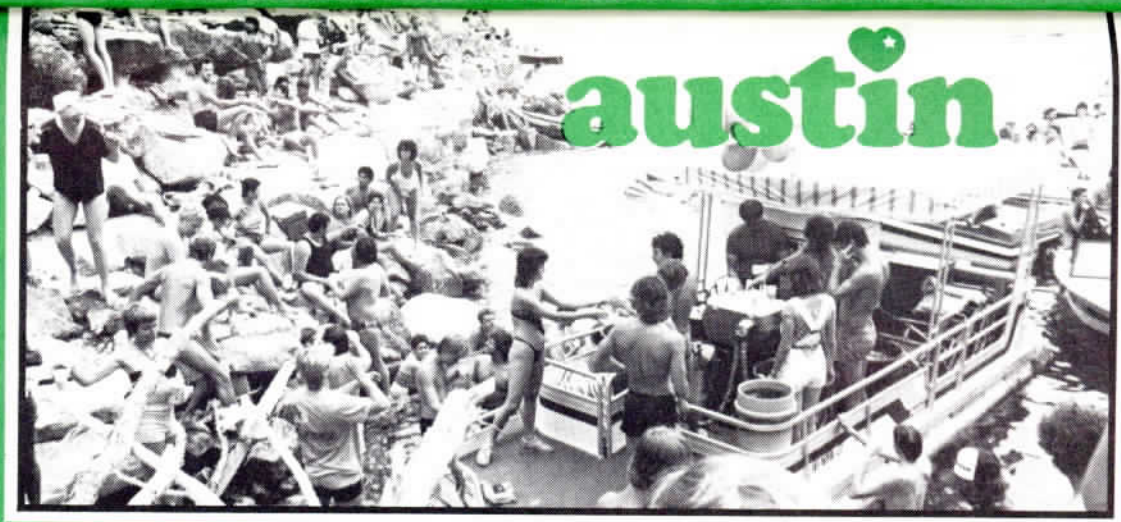

DALLAS FIREWORKS AND MAJESTIC SHOW

DALLAS — In order to help raise money to find a cure for the insidious disease known as AIDS, two related, back-to-back events are being sponsored this Sunday, September 4, by the Dallas Gay Alliance (DGA) and the Oak Lawn Counseling Center (OLCC) AIDS Action Project.

The first event will be an afternoon forum at MCCD, 2701 Reagan. "Safe Sex" will be the topic, OLCC director Howie Daire told TWT NEWS. Presenters will include local persons, as well as the Gay Men's Health Crisis Center in New York. Everyone is invited to bring a friend to the two-hour, informational sharing.

Later that evening at the Majestic Theatre, at 8:00pm, there will be a Texas Command Performance AIDS benefit. The event will feature singer Meg Christian, the Turtle Creek Chorale, New York entertainer Laura Theodore, the Crazy Horse Revue, Dallas' Melody Jones and other exciting performers.

It's all part of the Texas Freedom Festival, which begins this Saturday with four health-related workshops at the Oak Lawn Library, a gay runner's clinic beginning at 3:00pm at the DGA office, and a nighttime celebration at the ball diamond in Reverchon Park beginning at 8:00pm.

Virginia Apuzzo will be the honored speaker. Richard Rogers of TWT NEWS will dedicate the event to the bar owners and entertainers who helped defeat 21.06 through THRF efforts. Judy Christopher, the new Ms. Gay Dallas and the Montrose Cloggers will entertain prior to a giant fireworks display scheduled for 9:00pm.

Ticket donations starting at \$10.00 are available at the Crossroads Market, 3930 Cedar Springs or at the Majestic box office after 7:00pm.

HOUSTON POLICE STEER GPW PARADE

HOUSTON — It may be necessary to move the time of next year's Gay Pride Week (GPW) parade up from 5:30pm to 1:00pm, Sergeant Wells of the Houston Police Department told a public gathering last Sunday at the final meeting of the GPW committee. "The problem is too many drunks," Wells explained.

If the Sunday parade were held earlier in the day, only one hour after the bars opened at noon, there would be less chance for people going to the parade to get drunk, he stated. The big problem area is the 500 and 1100 blocks of Westheimer.

If trouble were to break out—as it almost did this year over the Gay Atheist float—it would most likely erupt in front of the reviewing stand where all city dignitaries, including members of City Council, are seated, Wells explained. And because TV cameras would capture the violence on videotape for newscasts, media coverage would be devastating, he outlined.

A controversial parade unit like this year's Gay Atheist float is the trigger that can be "the tinder box to fueling a riot," Wells cautioned, adding, "Thus, we may have to double the amount of officers for next year's parade."

"We've invited the Gay Atheists to meet with us and come to this meeting," Larry Bagneris, Jr. announced. "They didn't respond then, and they're not here at today's meeting," he noted.

The police department is obviously very concerned about any parade unit that would be so controversial as to provoke a riot, GPW has learned. Thus, strict guidelines must be enforced.

Sergeant Wells concluded by commending the gay parade as being "the best organized in the city—second only to Foley's Thanksgiving Day parade."

Studies showed that the vaccine protected against infection caused by hepatitis B virus in 87% to 96% of those who received the required three shots. Hepatitis B virus is an important cause of viral hepatitis, a disease mainly of the liver. Even mild forms of this disease may lead to serious complications and aftereffects, including liver cancer. There is no specific treatment for viral hepatitis.

Vaccination is recommended for persons who have a higher risk of becoming infected with hepatitis B virus because of frequent, close contact with infected people or exposure to body fluids from such people. It will not protect against hepatitis caused by viruses other than hepatitis B virus.

Because of the long incubation period for hepatitis B, it is possible for unrecognized infection to be present at the time the vaccine is given. The vaccine may not prevent hepatitis B in such patients.

In three studies involving 4,354 persons, the overall rate of adverse reactions did not differ significantly in those given vaccine and those given placebo (an inactive substance). As with any vaccine, broad use often reveals rare adverse reactions not observed during clinical trials.

Over 200,000 people are estimated to have received the vaccine since its release, and the vaccine continues to be generally well tolerated. Hepatitis B has a long incubation period, and unrecognized infection may already be present at the time the vaccine is given. Thus, reported cases of hepatitis are to be expected and do not appear to be caused by the vaccine. Reactions such as fever, nausea, vomiting, headache, and local pain have occurred. Joint pain has been reported, rash has been reported rarely. Serious illnesses affecting the nervous system—including Guillain-Barre syndrome—have been reported rarely, but no cause and effect relationship has been established.

FIELDING MEDIATES WITH DALLAS POLICE

DALLAS — District 2 City Councilperson Paul Fielding, the new man at City Hall working to help the gay community, has recently been visibly working hard to mediate police problems and to institute a better understanding.

Fielding, who sought the DGPC endorsement, was instrumental in defusing an erupting problem earlier this summer at Ray Martin's Unicorn Club. Fielding had mediated the problem before it got out of hand, it was learned by Richard Rogers of TWT NEWS in Dallas.

Fielding also stepped forward during Gay Pride Week when police were seen harassing the Dallas Tavern Guild's "Big Event." Noise had supposedly been the complaint from neighbors. However, Fielding contacted the officer in charge and requested he visit the site to see first hand that "there was no noise problem." Fielding remained on the scene until the event was over, to make certain there would be no other problems. And, there weren't.

More recently, Fielding has begun an investigation into last month's raid at the Eighth Day club. Had it not been for DPD knocking the club's phone off the hook, Fielding would have been alerted to be on the scene in time to witness the senseless harassment first hand. As it happened, Fielding arrived immediately after DPD departed.

To help Fielding conduct a thorough investigation into police problems, the gay community is urged to call Levi Davis, the Assistant City Manager, TWT NEWS was advised.

ALAMO AIRMAN RECEIVED BENEFITS

SAN ANTONIO — The US Air Force has approved the medical retirement of Airman First Class Raymond E. Orsini, 27, who was based at Randolph Air Force Base (AFB). He becomes the first person to receive medical retirement benefits as a result of having contracted

AIDS while serving in the military.

The final decision in the lingering and controversial case was made in the office of the Secretary of the Air Force, Verne Orr.

The decision reversed a June physical evaluation board ruling from Lackland AFB that would have denied Orsini all of his benefits. Orsini had countered with an appeal.

Orsini visited Houston during last June's gay pride parade to plead his case and gain public support. He stated then that he felt he had contracted AIDS by living in close quarters with new recruits while undergoing basic training at Lackland in 1980. The Citizens for Human Equality (CHE) had lent Orsini legal and financial support.

The latest decision was reached last week after extensive medical testing at Wilford Hall USAF Medical Center, it was reported by Tim Ramm of TWT NEWS in San Antonio.

Wilford Hall's prestige in accurately diagnosing AIDS has recently been aided by the purchase of an \$80,000 machine that uses a laser beam to count blood cells. No other machine is as technologically advanced or as easy to use, and only Wilford Hall has it, it was learned. Consequently, the Alamo City hospital has been named the official medical center for all Air Force AIDS patients.

DRYDEN CLINIC IS NOW OPEN

HOUSTON — One of this city's first private, physician-owned screening and diagnostic clinics, the Dryden Clinic, Inc., designed to address AIDS and what is now thought to be related, Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STD), opened its Houston facility on September 1.

In addition to being a full-service clinic for STDs, the Dryden Clinic will perform complete clinical examinations and laboratory testing for the early detection of AIDS. The clinic, under the supervision of its medical director, Maria A. Scouros, MD, told TWT NEWS

that the clinic feels that early detection of AIDS, and appropriate measures taken for those persons diagnosed with AIDS, may reduce the mortality of this ailment.

As an immunologist and oncologist, Dr. Scouros is presently assistant professor of Internal Medicine at the University of Texas Medical Center. She was previously associated with M.D. Anderson Hospital in the departments of Clinical Immunology and Biological Therapy, and is experienced in treating AIDS patients.

The Dryden Clinic has also announced that because of its direct relationship with Immu-Test Laboratories, Inc., it will be able to provide AIDS screening at reasonable rates, most of which is insurance reimbursable for many patients.

Those persons concerned with STDs and AIDS can make an appointment by calling (713) 795-0385. The Dryden Clinic is located in the Medical Center complex at 1709 Dryden, Suite 1002. Hours are presently established for Monday-Friday, 9:00am-5:00pm.

FIRE DESTROYS GALVESTON CLUB

GALVESTON — This city's oldest gay bar, the Kon-Tiki, 214 23rd—which would have celebrated its seventeenth year in business this month—was destroyed in the early morning hours of Friday, August 26, by a devastating fire which erupted next door in an historic building.

The fire broke out at 12:55am at the rear of RBM Drug Co., 2216 Mechanic, and quickly spread through the 1874 Washington Hotel Building. By 1:10am, power was knocked out at the adjacent Kon-Tiki, at which time there was an orderly evacuation of all bar patrons and upstairs tenants who lived in the apartments atop the club. "No one was injured," TWT NEWS learned from witnesses, who said many club patrons stood outside crying.

"We've lost everything," said one of the several staff members who lived in

the upstairs apartments. "We literally got out only with the clothes on our backs," he explained.

"Flames were 100 feet in the air at 3:00am," Galveston Fire Marshal Willie Wisko said.

By the time firefighters controlled the three-hour blaze, the building was gutted, leaving behind only crumbling outside walls. Charred rubble was still smoldering the next day.

It was believed that the fire was sparked from a power line—one of the many which had been knocked down by Hurricane Alica one week earlier. "The fire is quite possibly Alicia-related," Galveston Fire Chief H.R. O'Donohue told Associated Press.

However, last Monday, Graham Painter of HL&P said there was no problem with outside power lines. Thus, an interior wall electrical short in the old building has been ruled the probable cause.

This is the second fire in the history of the long-lived club, as a blaze had destroyed the former Kon-Tiki when it was located on 19th Street.

Kon-Tiki management assured TWT NEWS that the club would reopen, in its present location or somewhere else.

Meanwhile, the Silver Palace and Robert's LaFitte, which are both located in the same downtown city block as the Kon-Tiki, reopened for business the next day after power was restored to the area. Minor smoke and water damage was incurred, a witness stated.

tional conference from September 30 to October 2.

Therefore, next month's state meeting is a preliminary opportunity for Texas women and feminists to plan strategies and form a statewide cohesiveness before journeying to the national conference.


"We Can Do It Now" is the theme for the Corpus Christi gathering. The theme relates to the powerful fact that women "can do it now" prior to this November's election by organizing campaign work.

The keynote address will be delivered on Saturday by Judy Goldsmith. Among topics to be discussed are the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA), the women's lobby, women's music and art, and women's rights. Insurance, battering, family violence, domestic problems, child rearing, reproductive rights, and rape prevention are among the many topics to be discussed by the women of Texas at the statewide convention of NOW.

AIDS ACTION INCORPORATES

DALLAS — The local AIDS Action Project has informed TWT NEWS that it has now officially been incorporated by the Secretary of State of the State of Texas. Until official incorporation by the State, it had been operating as a unit of the Dallas Blood Center. The board of trustees include James Wheeler, M.D., Maryanne Townes and Mark Harris.

The position of "fundraiser/chairperson" has been abolished, which was formerly held by Ed Fugate, who resigned on July 26 during a scheduled open meeting. "The organization and community wishes to thank Mr. Fugate for his untiring efforts during the early days of organizing this project of uniting a broad cross-section of the population," a spokesperson said.

Future fundraising will be handled by the board of trustees and whomsoever they may appoint for various fundraising events. At the recent Gay Pride Week "Big Event," over \$5,000 was donated by the Dallas Tavern Guild.

It is appropriate that I quote Harvey Milk since his efforts to pursue a progressive agenda were also opposed by the established gay organization of San Francisco during his life. I suppose I should not be surprised that the Houston GPC, an organization which claims to represent gay people, attempts to discredit my efforts to pursue a concrete proposal which they have been talking about, in general, for years; an ordinance endorsed by ACLU and CHE, two major progressive rights organization of Houston.

In an effort to move the gay agenda in a positive direction—away from masturbation, if you will—I began drafting the "Domestic Privacy in Employment Ordinance" over nine months ago. Since introduction, I have faced an ever increasing degree of intimidation and coercion by GPC officials. Apparently shocked that I would dare not conform to their whims, at a poorly attended meeting on the eve of the hurricane, Ray Hill made a motion to censure me on trumped-up charges involving a minor infraction of a screening

committee rule. (I made the formidable error of writing a question down for organizational purposes before asking a candidate the question.) I realize Hill is currently seeking the office of president of GPC, but I think he could find a more constructive platform to run on than his degenerate abilities in the field of character assassination. The Crib Responds:

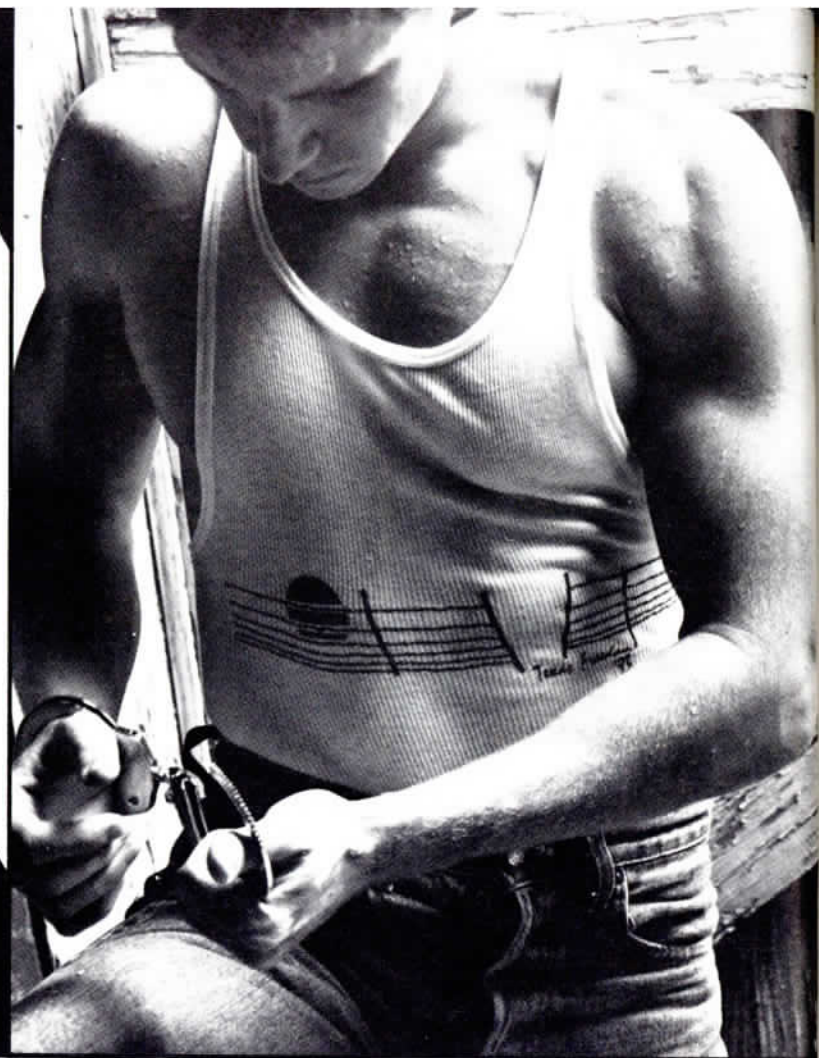
During Gay Pride Week, we were asking for a donation to benefit AIDS. It seems like such a small price to pay for helping save someone's life or helping someone who can no longer help himself due to AIDS. If you check with the Oak Lawn Counseling Center or [other] organizations, [you] can verify that the monies collected did in fact go to AIDS!

In regard to your comments about the Crib—first of all, it is white-owned, but not necessarily white-operated. We have six black and six white employees. Secondly, we have signs throughout the bar that state, "Upon entering you must remain indoors or pay the cover again." The police came to our bar and informed us that loitering was against the law and that nearby residents were filing complaints about the noise outside the bar. They said for us to do our part in discouraging this or we would be closed down! We have found that charging the cover again is very effective in keeping our customers indoors. We stamp your hand to show, first of all, that your ID has been checked, and also that you paid to come in, instead of climbing over the fence to the patio as some choose to do.

I don't call this a "greedy ripoff" at all, but instead our way of operating our bar. If you don't like our house rules, then *buy your own bar* and operate it as you see fit. It's doubtful that you would be in business long if you kept your prices low at all times, did no remodeling, or had no rules for your customers to abide by.

Our customers like our bar just the way it is. This is obvious, as we have an established clientele who frequent our bar every day we are open.

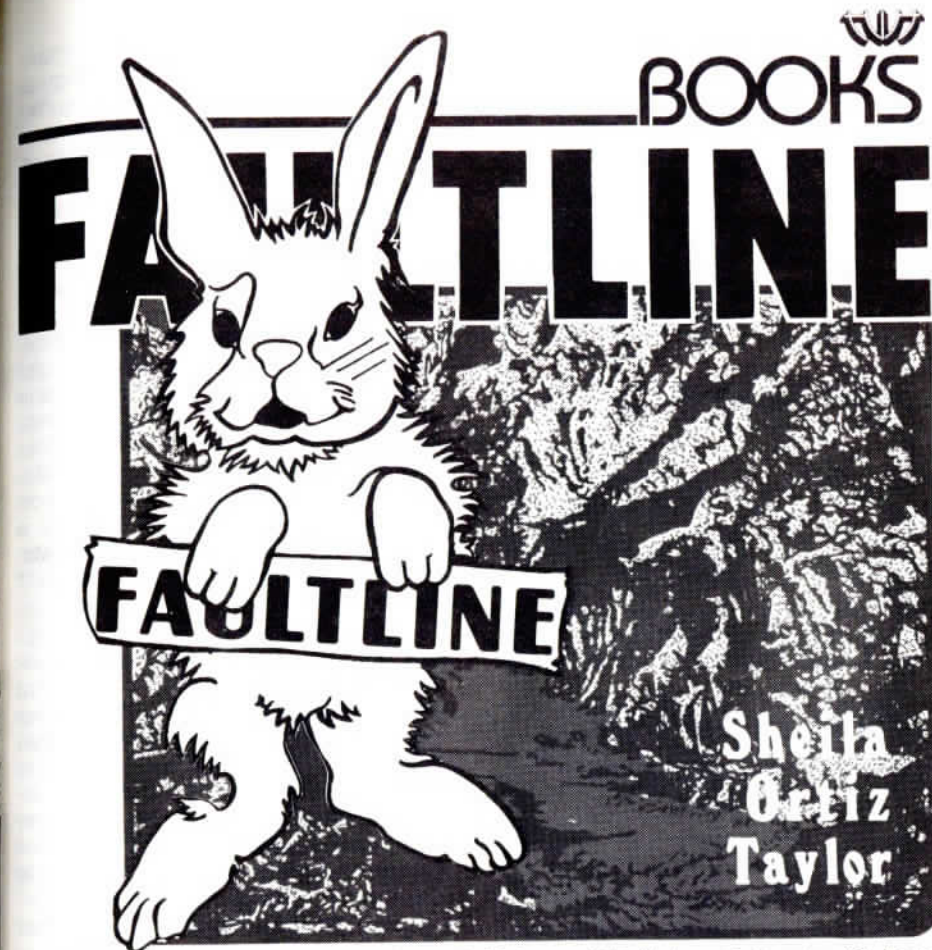

Faultline was given a brief review in *TWT* in February 1982 (Volume 7, Number 47). David Fields had requested to review the book then, but we felt one review was enough. Fields has persisted, and we feel that a more in-depth review is warranted.

Faultline, by Sheila Ortiz Taylor; 126 pp.; fiction; The Naiad Press Inc., P.O. Box 10543, Tallahassee, Florida 32302; softcover, \$6.95.

I'm sitting here wondering how to begin my review of Sheila Ortiz Taylor's first novel, *Faultline*, when I realize the novel itself has no clear beginning of its own. Ms. Taylor jumps right in at the middle of her story (stories), leaving the reader to piece together a beginning from the events and people she describes during the course of the book.

For those of you who may start to feel


a little insecure about this lack of structure, be reassured that there is a clear, identifiable "ending." To be sure, the book is loosely structured, but for the attentive reader, Ms. Taylor includes guideposts in space as well as time to help orient the reader as to what is going on, when and where.

Let me explain. Each chapter is an account of what has happened, or is happening, told from the point of view of a different character in the story. Each character speaks directly to the reader, describing the same events, and sometimes describing the same character,

from different perspectives. The main character is Arden Benbow, a poet guided by her muse and her Indian spirit.

She gets her free spirit from her Aunt Vi (short for Violet), who at one time was in a nursing home—until she "escaped" with the help of Arden and an orderly named Homer Rice (but Aunt Vi called him Maurio Carbonara). Aunt Vi's "escape" is the "main event" in the book, but Ms. Taylor's emphasis is on the people who populate the world in *Faultline*.

Either there is a strong trend for more characterization and less plot emphasis in gay novels recently, or the trend has always been there and I just have picked up more books like that lately. Ms. Taylor is brilliantly successful in her portrayals; each character establishes a rapport with the reader immediately. Ms. Taylor has put her best foot forward here.

Though Aunt Vi is not in every chapter, her spirit infuses the whole book with her hope and sense of fun and adventure. Another character in the cinema (under the category of cult movies) quite similar to Aunt Vi is Maude, played by Ruth Gordon in *Harold and Maude*. Her zest for living, her desire to squeeze the last ounce of pleasure and beauty from the world around her is duplicated in Aunt Vi.

Arden Benbow has six kids, from her

marriage to Malthus (with overtones of overpopulation and doom), and is now living on a farm with her lover, Alice, and three hundred rabbits, give or take a hundred. Ms. Taylor develops the comic potential of this situation, and others, handily. The story moves back and forth in time, going back to when Arden and Alice met.

Actually, the story has three major plot lines to be pursued. One is Aunt Vi's escape from the nursing home and their trip to Mexico, the second is Arden's life with Malthus, and the third is Arden and Alice's life on the farm with Arden's six kids, and the three hundred rabbits (lest we forget). And, believe it or not, that is in chronological order.

Faultline is a fun book. It has been noted I usually do not mention whether I like a book or not in my review, so let me correct that indiscretion by saying I like *Faultline* for its comedy, its positiveness and the humanness of its characters. Ms. Taylor writes clearly and with great detail, giving a rich texture and realism to her characters, obviously the most important elements of her story.

Faultline is a comedy, a love story, an adventure, a lesson in living, and is written from the heart. Ms. Taylor cares about people and, ultimately, tries to help people love others, a most commendable quality.

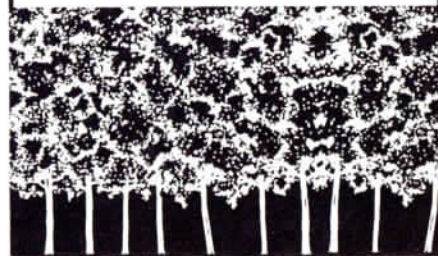

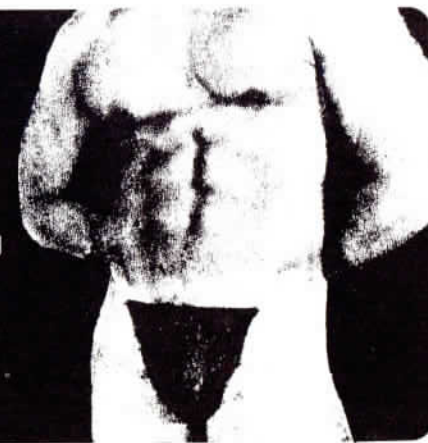

The Draughtsman's Contract

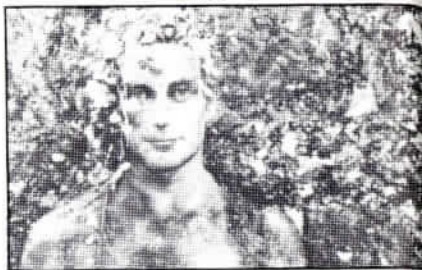

PERIOD PIECE PUZZLEMENT

Nineteen hundred and eighty three A.D. has brought us a new slick style of movie making. Largely influenced by the visually enticing, phenomenally successful and never more than skin-deep MTV cable, we have what at times looks like big-screen, computerized choreography that is stunning to the eye, often puzzling to the brain, and sometimes tranquilizing to the mind. One member of such a species which I never cared for was the big summer hit *Flashdance*; a favorite of mine which thrived on the same vein of visual elegance was the undoubtedly weird vampire flick *The Hunger*. And now, made in the U.K., we have *The Draughtsman's Contract*. The action is obscure, to say the least, and hard to comprehend. I kept wondering if British director Peter Greenaway had a definite concept himself. He may have lost track of the potentially intriguing plotline, but, without a shade of doubt, he was in full control as he composed the rich and stylish cinematography.

These unforgettable images of 17th century English country life are among the most beautiful in recent movie art. I used the term country life very loosely, for this is not a film about poor, sweaty peasants. The characters of *Draughtsman* all wear pompous wigs that are towering high above their well educated heads, and their grazing ground is a magnificent estate with luscious greens and parklike decor (one naked statue is quite alive and changes positions every so often). Since Kodachrome has not yet been developed, a

draughtsman is hired to produce 12 drawings of the manor, from different angles, for posterity. The artist's pay is eight pounds a day plus the right of lay with the landowner's attractive old lady. He makes frequent use of this stimulating contract stipulation. He is also open-minded enough to bed the daughter of the mansion, however, mainly for medical reasons: to help sire a long-awaited offspring. With all this strenuous activity, it is hard to believe that the draughtsman has time to concentrate on his drawings. Not only is he totally up to par—as he puts his meticulous work on paper, he records certain pieces of evidence that might help solve a crucial murder that has happened on the estate.

Don't expect an intricate mystery set against the decades of designer-drag in the late 1600s. *The Draughtsman's Contract* provides mainly visual satisfaction and many endless conversations in which you'll hear some not-so-subtle sarcasm with a few bon mots added for spice. The camera probably moves no more than two out of the total 100 minutes, a fact that only adds to the picturesque beauty of each scene. The musical fare ranges from spinet to minuet. If somebody had watched over Mr. Greenaway (who doubled as scriptwriter) in the dialogue and story-flow departments, I would have been able to draft *The Draughtsman's Contract* as a clear winner.

HERCULES

ALL THIS MEAT AND NO POTATOES

It is totally incredible that anything this trite would be brought before an audience for viewing. *Hercules* is not just a bad film. No, this should receive an award for having achieved new heights in boredom and being the only film in existence that could permanently ruin the entire sleeping pill market. Let me explain.

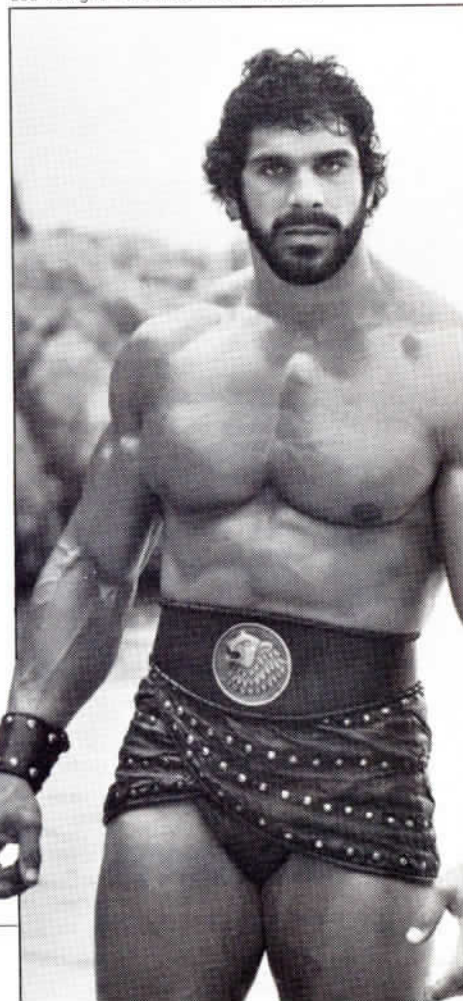

Not only are we forced to watch Hercules have three silly battles with oversized mechanical creatures (which never took place in the original tales), but we are also pressed to listen to the dubbed voice of Lou Ferrigno (who also has a speech impediment like Arnold What's-His-Muscles).

The only storyline present is Hercules proving his worthiness to be a warrior for a king and then eventually saving his daughter from some clods who want to offer her to the gods. From start to finish

there are ten battles to be fought and won, several ladies who prance around in their Frederick's of Athens underwear, and some of the funniest death scenes ever filmed.

If you thought all those other Hercules and Sinbad gems were Saturday afternoon junk food, wait till you see this swill. The thought that there is already a sequel available chills the mind. You have to admit that it has been one helluva lean summer for entertainment.

CITIZEN NOBODY — Leonard Zelig, a faceless legend of the 1920s and 30s, intermingled with some of the most famous people of his day, among them **Fanny Brice**, **Eugene O'Neill**, **Babe Ruth**, the Hearst crowd, Pope Pius XI and even Adolph Hitler. Because Zelig imitated and conformed to everybody he came into contact with—changing even his physical appearance—he was, for a while, displayed in carnivals and exploited as la the Elephant Man. Later he rose to high society, and in 1935 Warner Bros. even made a movie biography of him. So who is Leonard Zelig? Actually he is nobody and he never existed. But *Zelig* is the innovative new movie from **Woody Allen** who, this time around, and in pseudo-documentary style, satirizes just about the entire twentieth century. **Mia Farrow** co-stars as Dr. Eudora Fletcher, a psychiatrist dedicated to saving Zelig from himself (or the lack of it). Already acclaimed on both coasts as Allen's first great film since *Annie Hall*, *Zelig* is, if nothing else, a technical

masterwork with Allen's "character" inserted seamlessly into hundreds of feet of vintage newsreel film. Look for *Zelig* to open in Texas around Sept. 16.

DEJA VU — This is soooo heavy! You'd better send your paisley shirts, tied-dyed jeans and fringed jackets to the cleaners if you want to be ready for the Next Big Thing. Why? Because some of the trend forecasters are now predicting the return of psychedelic music, and the focus seems to be once again on the West Coast, which was the cradle of the **Jefferson Airplane**/**Janis Joplin**/**Doors** era. At the head of the rather small-but-growing new psychedlia movement are groups such as **Dream Syndicate**, **Green On Red**, **Three O'Clock** and the **Bangles**. The Bangles have already been signed to CBS (who recently shelled out 28 million for the crotchety **Rolling Stones**), and other major labels are also sniffing out the uh, "new" wave. Meanwhile, over on the East Coast, such groups as **Plan 9**, the **Chesterfield Kings**, the **Slickee Boys**, the **Vipers** and the **Fuzztones** are being associated with the movement. Can anybody remember what the Last Big Thing was? . . . So, with all that in mind, take notice that the **Moody Blues** have a new album—*The Present*—and a new single—"Sitting at the Wheel." . . . Talk about *deja vu*—it appears that the **Bee Gees** are going to get around to writing and producing for everybody eventually. Their latest project is the **Kenny Rogers/Dolly Parton** duet "Islands in the Stream." . . . **June Pointer** has revived the **Marvelettes'** classic "Don't Mess With Bill." Finally—there must be someone out there who wonders whatever happened to **KC and the Sunshine Band**. Don't look for them on current American music charts, but in Britain they're at #1 with a single called "Give It Up." WV

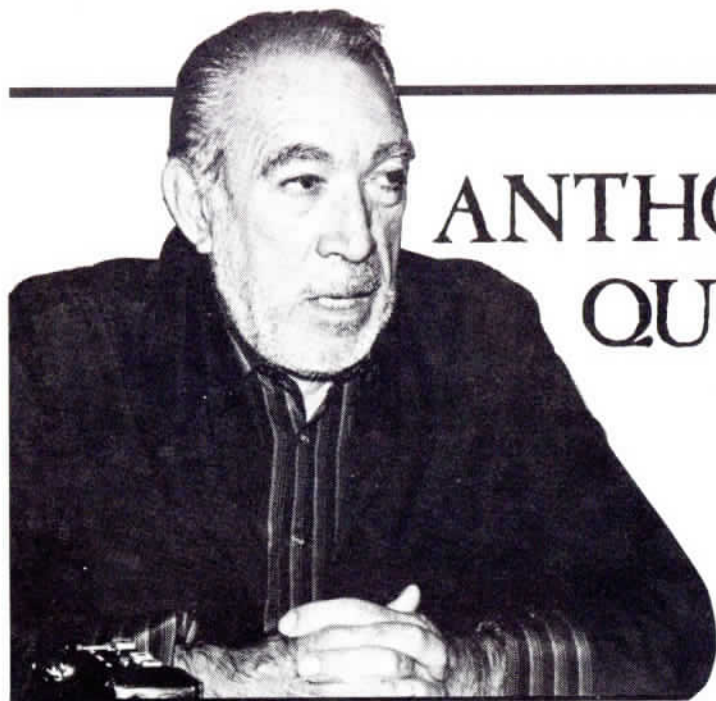

ANTHONY QUINN

We met recently with two-time Oscar winner, screen and stage star Anthony Quinn in his suite at Houston's Hyatt Regency where we discussed his experiences, thoughts and current stage production, *Zorba the Greek*. *Zorba* is currently playing at Houston's Jones Hall through September 4.

Mr. Quinn made his Broadway debut in the critically acclaimed *The Gentleman From Athens* in 1947. He then performed for two years in the 1950 revival of *A Streetcar Named Desire*. Throughout the years, Mr. Quinn has made some 200 motion pictures and starred in numerous stage productions. To honor his performance in the film version of *Zorba the Greek* in which he also starred, he had bestowed upon him the title of Honorary Citizen of Greece, a title only given to one other person, Winston Churchill.

His first book, *The Original Sin*, was published in 1972 and another is currently being written by the author.

Another aspect of his interest in the arts was revealed in 1982 when the international premier of the sculptures and paintings of Anthony Quinn were unveiled at the Center Art Galleries in Honolulu.

Mr. Quinn was most interesting to speak with and very talkative. For this interview, we are not adhering to the usual question/answer format. Instead, we are quoting his ideas on different subjects.

THE STAGE PRODUCTION OF ZORBA — The show has been re-staged for Houston; there have been some cuts made; we have put in some of the statements I want to make. You'll see a new

show that's not been seen before. Each city sees a slightly different show. *Zorba* is a very interesting character. He deals with women, war and God. He's anti-clerical, obviously, and he loves

Buddha. He's searching as we all are. By the time we get to New York, *Zorba* will be different, but basically the same.

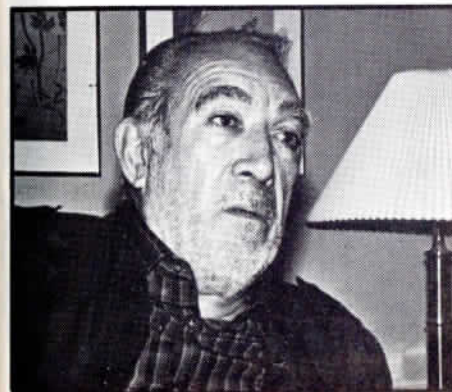
HIS WORK — I really enjoy doing what I do. Who else could get paid as well as I do for enjoying himself? It's a hell of a lot better than working in a factory. I work six hours on Wednesdays and Saturdays, and the other days I work three hours.

HIMSELF — I'm very critical of myself. I've never been happy. Only a fool would be completely happy with the world in the condition it's in today. I think I'm a fascinating person. I expose a certain amount of myself in my artwork [sculpting and painting]. I have created for myself an image of which I am the victim at times. What you see on the screen is not me, obviously. The soft me or the poetic me is exposed through my art. It's rather embarrassing to discuss publicly my inner-most self. I don't discuss it, I do it. I'm a man in constant flux. I'm a man in search, who adores the truth. I someday hope to find simplicity. I don't think I'll achieve it, but that's my goal. My father influenced me greatly. He had an enormous personality. He died when he was 29 years old. I've never been able to match his personality, and his wisdom. I adored my father.

ANOTHER ACADEMY AWARD — (Mr. Quinn has won two Oscars—one for *Viva Zapata* and the second for *Lust For Life*.) I would be dishonest if I said I wouldn't like another one. I haven't been nominated for one since the 60s. It would be interesting to see if my fellow actors today thought I was as modern as they are.

MOVIES TODAY — I think movies are in great danger. These "blockbuster" movies are horrendous. We've lost our style. I must tell you I don't go to pictures. I don't want to go see mechanical actors. It's terrible when a doll gives the best performance on the screen. I've seen very few of my own movies. It will be interesting to see what they do with cable-vision, although I realize that's just another way of marketing.

WHAT IT TAKES — Being an actor is not just learning to recite lines. You must develop very thick nails to hold on or you'll fall off that "cliff." You have to just keep crawling up. All chances are against your being a success. Even the pretty boys have a tough time. I was going to say anyone with my face would have a tough time. We saw the time when Clark Gable started to fade. Gary Cooper also, who was a very, very dear friend of mine. There's no guarantee

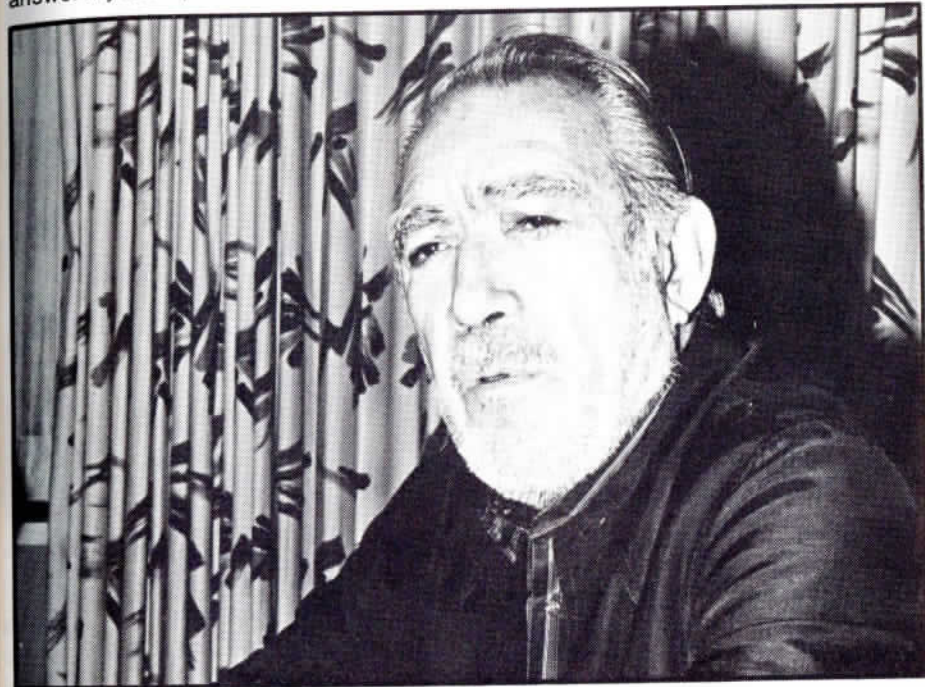

that good looks will get you anywhere. It takes *tremendous* drive. As Shakespeare said, "Ambition should be made of sterner stuff." The guys who hold on don't do it for the money. Those who put money first never last very long in the business.

HOW HE REACTS TO FAME — I don't think about it anymore. I've lived with it for 50 years. When the bellboy or the elevator boy says, "Hello, Mr. Quinn," it's very, very nice. I can act like [Here, he lowers his already deep voice and acts very macho], "Hey, look at me!" I could act that way if I wanted to. I don't like to be "on" in real life. I don't enjoy performing in life. My drive in life is to answer my own questions. I have many.

Cuban music, it was all part of his life. Another project I'll be doing is a production about Picasso. Oddly enough, he was not a great music lover. He was only interested in Flamenco music. He tried to become interested in some ballets for a while, but he lost interest. Music is, however, a great part of my life. I don't really sing, I sort of talk-sing my lines. I think these two men will be great challenges to play.

WHAT HE'S WRITING — I'm writing a book called *Suddenly Sunset*, but I did a complete turnaround and have now named it *Suddenly Sunrise*. At the age of 19, I wrote a thesis called "What the Ideal 24 Hours of My Life Would Be." Life went on, and about four years ago,



MUSICALS OR DRAMAS? — I've never done a musical, but the next two projects I'll be doing on the stage will be musicals. I'm doing a play with music on Ernest Hemingway. Music is an integral part of our lives. It's impossible to do Hemingway without the French music of the 20s. All his life in Italy was affected by the music. Bullfight music,

youth of today are facing enormous responsibilities. There's a big wave a comin'. I'm optimistic because the human being has a tremendous sense of survival. We've certainly learned a lot, but we're facing a huge, huge wave. There's no use kidding ourselves. There are five areas in the world right now that could break out in a complete holocaust at any minute. The economy of the world is in terrible trouble. Mexico owes us \$82 billion, Argentina owes us \$84 billion, Brazil owes us \$60 billion. Where did they borrow that money? From Chase Manhattan, from all the banks in

to protest. I pay to be able to say what I think.

HOPE — There's a very interesting thing happening to our youth. A lot happened to the youth of the 60s. I saw my teenage children going through terrible decisions dealing with drugs, sex, etc., flower children and so on. But, God damn it, they did stop the Vietnam war. The youth of America is the hope of America. My generation, I feel, shunned certain responsibilities. The young people are finding their own sense of right and wrong. In America, my generation, not necessarily me, screamed at their



America. If we ever try to call all those debts in, we're dead. They can just say, "Hey, sue us." We have to keep loaning more money in the hope of getting it back. In the meantime, we keep printing money. We're going to have to find another means of exchange. Whether it's bartering or whatever. There are huge powers around like Russia and China we have to deal with.

WHY STAY IN AMERICA — (Mr. Quinn currently lives in Italy and keeps an apartment in New York.) I pay my taxes in America. I pay millions of dollars in taxes. I have bought the right

kids, "You mustn't drink until you're eighteen." So the kids say, "Gee, what does it taste like?" It's all changing though with our youth and their children. The electronic field is changing us also. Instead of beginning basic math, they're beginning basic computer. I have great hope for the young people. They're going to teach us old folks how to live.

EPITAPH — I want to be remembered as a guy who did my best. I don't want to be interpreted as pleading for popularity and acceptance, but just a guy who gave from his live experience.

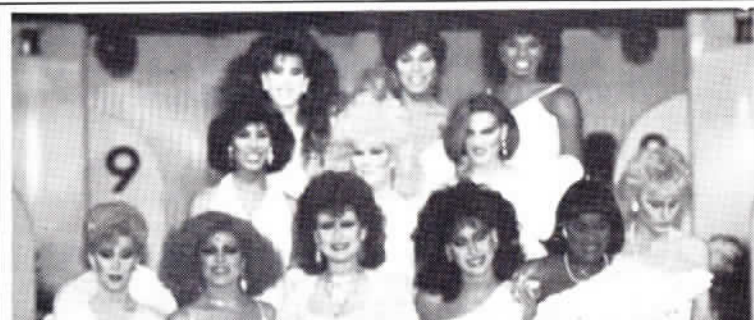
