

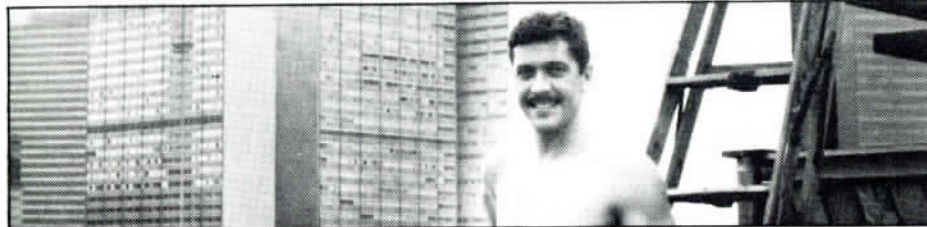

POLICE CHIEF ADDRESSES GUILD

HOUSTON — This city's police chief, Lee Brown, was the guest speaker at the September 6 meeting of the Greater Montrose Business Guild. It was an opportunity for members to ask Brown questions regarding issues involving the Montrose area, Greg Havican of TWT NEWS-Houston reported.

Security of businesses, response time and prostitution on lower Westheimer were among topics discussed. Brown enumerated on several points about recent actions being implemented by Houston police officers. He spoke on the increased patrols of the streets, intensification by vice officers concerning hustlers and prostitutes, and working with city council on the proposed Sexually Oriented Ordinance (SOB).

Several members gave specific instances of problems with officers. In each case, Chief Brown pointed out that his department could not investigate such actions unless they are reported by the citizens involved. Reaction by members to Brown's answers were positive, Havican observed.

Chief Brown closed his remarks by offering to arrange a meeting with the captain and officers assigned to the Montrose area in order "to foster a positive relationship with the department."

GAY HEALTH ON ALAMO CITY TV

SAN ANTONIO — A 30-minute documentary series featuring several interviews on AIDS and other health priorities among gays is being scheduled for broadcast on KLRN-TV, the public television station on local Channel 9.

Interviewer Linda Trafolla has spoken with several gay community leaders about the research, treatment and psy-

chological effects that AIDS has had on the San Antonio gay community, Oscar Mendiola of TWT NEWS-San Antonio reported.

Among those recently interviewed was Don Parks, who had lost his job because of tuberculosis. He claimed to be a potential person with AIDS. Also speaking was Dr. Gus Sicard, who explained the psychological treatment available on AIDS in San Antonio.

Mendiola, who personally previewed a portion of the videotape in the editing room, reported that Trafolla "did a wonderful job." In a conversation with the program's host, he reported that she "has a very positive attitude toward gays in our city."

RURAL GAYS MEET IN AUSTIN

AUSTIN — A frequently overlooked organization, the Rural Coalition, formerly the Rural Gay Coalition, held a conference in this city on August 27-28. The organization, which first met at the Texas Gay Conference V in 1978, consists of gay men and women who live in or have ties to rural areas of Texas, Jay Cherin of TWT NEWS-Austin reported.

At the conference, Kenn Waller-Zanghi, chair of the coalition, said the need for peer support and networking

dominated the discussion, adding that the group hoped to combat the bigotry of urban gays toward their "backwoods brothers."

Waller-Zanghi, who operates a home-
stead southwest of Fort Worth, explained
that communications among mem-
bers has been primarily through a news-
letter which contains information not
readily available to rural gays. The group
also planned social events, such as
group excursions to a bird auction in
South Texas and the Gay Rodeo in Reno.

Due to the great distance between
members and the small number of peo-
ple involved in the Rural Coalition, the
group voted at the Austin conference to
organize as a caucus of the Texas Gay/
Lesbian Task Force. The coalition would
act autonomously from the task force,
and would probably break away entire-
ly after the coalition gained strength,
Waller-Zanghi said. The task force has
reacted favorably to this idea.

The Rural Coalition meets four times
yearly in different cities across the state.

GPC PREPARES FOR ELECTIONS

HOUSTON — The main order of busi-
ness at the September monthly meeting
of GPC was to target three election cam-
paigns for support this fall. Those
selected were: Anne Wheeler, running
for Council At-Large Position 1; Rodney
Ellis, running for City Council District
D; and Nikki van Hightower, running
for Council At-Large Position 4. All three
were targeted for extra support by the
GPC.

Three items were decided upon to be
added to the "pushcards," which con-
tain the list of GPC endorsements for
the election, and will be handed out
before the election. After much discus-
sion, and in a near-unanimous vote, the
caucus decided to add to the pushcard
recommendation to "vote for" the East
of Downtown Convention Center proj-

ect, David Fields of TWT NEWS-Houston
reported.

The second item, to recommend en-
dorsement or no action on school board
elections, was delayed, pending evalua-
tion by a panel. Special consideration
was given to screen such candidates be-
cause of the invitations to be screened
for endorsements were not sent until
roughly ten days after the other invita-
tions for the City Council and other
races were sent, TWT NEWS learned.

The third item was to endorse select-
ed amendments of the eleven amend-
ments that will go before the voters on
November 2. Debra Danburg was in at-
tendance and spoke for the amendment
to replace contempt proceedings and
jail for non-payment of child support
with court-ordered garnishment of
wages. The body voted to refer this to
the board of the GPC for further study.

POLICE CRACKDOWN IN ARLINGTON PARK

ARLINGTON, Texas — For many
years, Randol Mill Park has been a pop-
ular cruise spot for gay men. Or to hear
Sgt. Hugh Atwell describe it to the *Fort
Worth Star Telegram*, "A public lewd-

ness problem has plagued the park for several years, especially in the summer."

Consequently, this past summer, Arlington police have been cracking down on gay activities after receiving complaints from nearby residents and park patrons of "blatant sexual conduct during the day."

Lately, plainclothes patrols have been arresting three or four people each time they visit the Arlington park. The patrols are unscheduled, so no one ever knows when an arrest is to occur, Buddy Jones of TWT NEWS-Fort Worth reported.

Atwell said homosexual acts had been committed in full view of other park patrons as well as in the bathrooms. "The most popular places are the nature trails in a heavily wooded area," he detailed.

During a recent patrol, five men were arrested and only two were from Arlington. As a result, Arlington police believe the park is gaining a national reputation as a gay spot. "Many of the people arrested aren't even from Texas," an officer observed.

But the problem hasn't diminished. "Even though we've arrested numerous people out there, it doesn't seem to slow them down," a discouraged Atwell said.

IT'S SAFE WEEK ACROSS HOUSTON

HOUSTON — "AIDS Play SAFE Week," an eight-day event, begins this Sunday and lasts through September 25. It features the combined participation of the Houston medical community, local churches, area government officials and businesses to educate the public and affected groups about AIDS.

Sponsored and organized by the KS/AIDS Foundation of Houston, Inc., SAFE Week has been designed to educate the community about those social and sexual activities which are safe and healthy with regards to AIDS.

"Our philosophy and rationale for doing this are based upon a study of the Houston gay male population, which

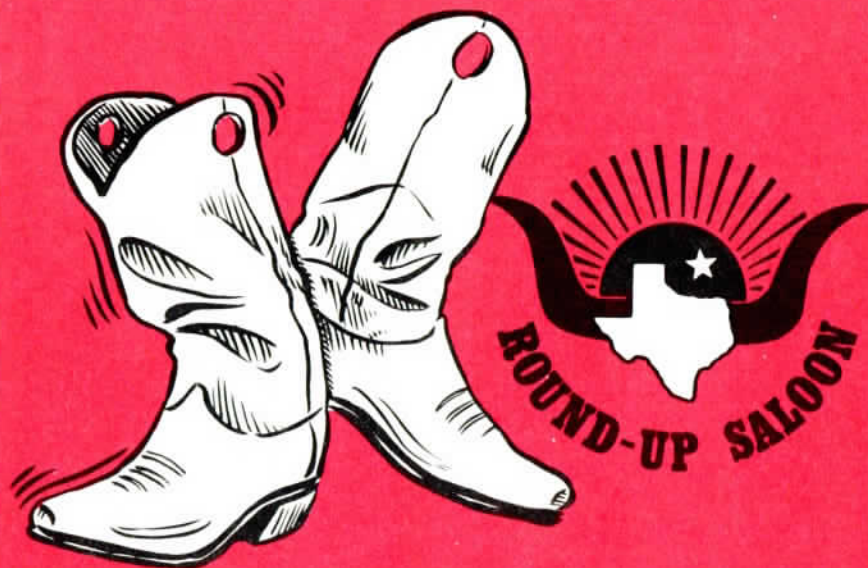

SAFE Week will be officially kicked off at 2:00pm this Sunday, September 18 at the GPC Montrose Jam in the 1000 block of California.

The week will conclude with a prayer vigil at 7:00pm Sunday, September 25, in St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, 1805 W. Alabama. The theme for the vigil is "for people with AIDS and AIDS researchers," according to organizers.

Studies showed that the vaccine protected against infection caused by hepatitis B virus in 87% to 96% of those who received the required three shots.

Hepatitis B virus is an important cause of viral hepatitis, a disease mainly of the liver. Even mild forms of this disease may lead to serious complications and aftereffects, including liver cancer. There is no specific treatment for viral hepatitis.

Vaccination is recommended for persons who have a higher risk of becoming infected with hepatitis B virus because of frequent, close contact with infected people or exposure to body fluids from such people. It will not protect against hepatitis caused by viruses other than hepatitis B virus.

Because of the long incubation period for hepatitis B, it is possible for unrecognized infection to be present at the time the vaccine is given. The vaccine may not prevent hepatitis B in such patients.

In three studies involving 3,350 persons, the overall rate of adverse reactions did not differ significantly in those given vaccine and those given placebo (an inactive substance). As with any vaccine, broad use often reveals rare adverse reactions not observed during clinical trials.

Over 200,000 people are estimated to have received the vaccine since its release, and the vaccine continues to be generally well tolerated. Hepatitis B has a long incubation period, and unrecognized infection may already be present at the time the vaccine is given. Thus, reported cases of hepatitis are to be expected and do not appear to be caused by the vaccine. Reactions such as fever, nausea, vomiting, headache, and local pain have occurred. Joint pain has been reported; rash has been reported rarely. Serious illnesses affecting the nervous system—including Guillain-Barre syndrome—have been reported rarely, but no cause and effect relationship has been established.

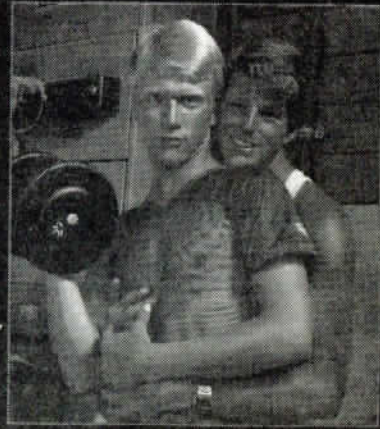

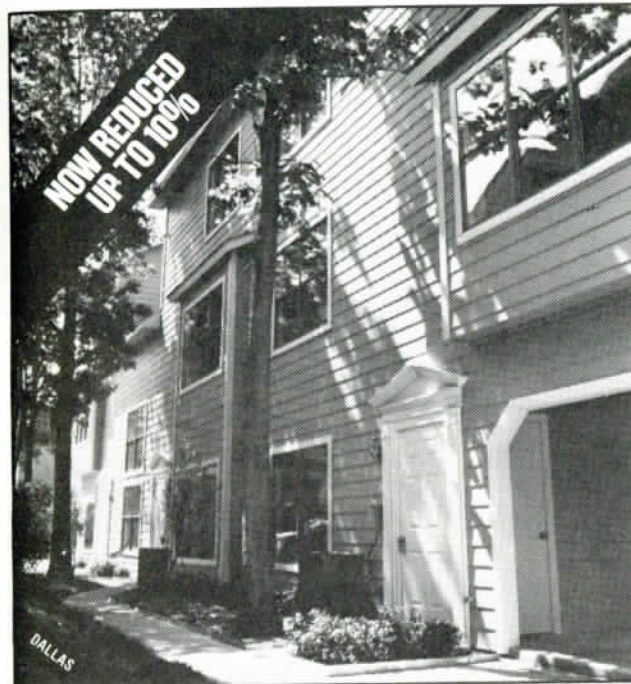

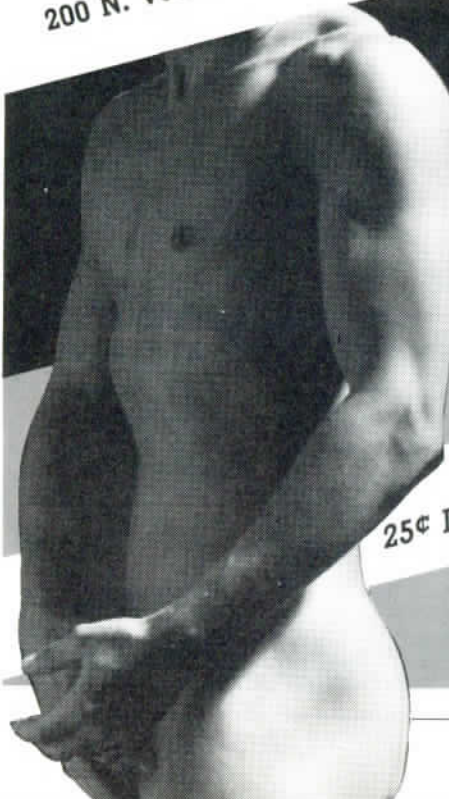

Coming Out to Parents, by Mary V. Borhek; 208 pp.; non-fiction; appendices, notes, bibliography; The Pilgrim Press, 132 West 31 Street, New York, New York 10001, softcover, \$9.95.

Advice and discussion of how to come out to parents is often only an abbreviated chapter in books on coming out in general, psychological studies, personal biographies and in other books meant to be read by parents with gay offspring. Very few of them speak directly to the parents.

Mary V. Borhek, who wrote *My Son Eric*, has turned this situation around in *Coming Out to Parents (A Two-Way Survival Guide for Lesbians and Gay Men and Their Parents)*. Helping gay people

to tell their parents is the end-purpose of this book and she pulls together all the issues and information the gay person needs to know about their parents' viewpoint to facilitate the process.

As the second part of the title suggests, she writes the book to the parents as well as to the gay person. Ms. Borhek is the parent of a gay son, Eric; what she learned from their experiences together, and what she has discovered since, in her research and in speaking with other parents of gay people, has been invaluable for this book.

This is not only for lesbians and gay men who have decided to tell their family, but also for those who want to, but just can't seem to find a way that would be constructive and/or effective. Once this book is read, new possibilities and

There are other books meant for non-gay persons to understand gay friends and relatives such as *Straight Answers* and *About Homosexuality for Straight Readers* by David Loovis, *Loving Someone Gay* by Don Clark and *Now That You Know* by Betty Fairchild and Nancy Hayward, to name a few. What sets *Coming Out to Parents* apart from the others, and makes it more valuable than the others, is her level of empathy and knowledge of the emotional realities that parents, such as herself, have felt and will feel.

She recognizes and explores the psychological dynamics of parents' reactions. One of the most powerful reactions is not anger but grief, due to a sense of loss of that set of expectations the parents have of their child being heterosexual. Another reaction she mentions is their sense of guilt, their feeling that they are responsible, with the ability to control whether their child approaches may reveal themselves. Borhek delivers in-depth analysis and discussion of possible family responses.

Ms. Borhek states in the introduction her difficulty in settling on appropriate terminology for gay men and women and unfortunately opts for the technical and awkward term "same-sex oriented," instead of "lesbian" and "gay man." But it does not prove to be much of a distraction after awhile.

turns out gay or non-gay.

A third reaction she mentions is anger. Of course parents' reactions will be mixed, with all three or just one or two evident. But she helps the gay person prepare for whatever reaction, and how the gay person will handle that reaction. Advance preparation is most important and she points out that, though you may be prepared, remember that the parent(s) will have *no* advance preparation.

Ms. Borhek is thorough and comprehensive in *Coming Out to Parents*. Her writing style is clear and engaging. Her background and experiences have eminently prepared her to write this book. An extensive chapter has been included to help meet parents' religious objections. She also tries to help parents understand the nature of gayness as not being chosen, and discusses the claims of "ex-gays" and therapies of "cure."

Coming Out to Parents has new, invaluable information that won't be found in other books. With so much to read nowadays, there is no time for redundancy, and there has been a lot written about coming out. What is new for this book is Ms. Borhek's perspective as the parent of a gay child. She lists many books and organizations, such as Parents and Families of Lesbians and Gays, in the appendices. Her book is a valuable resource.

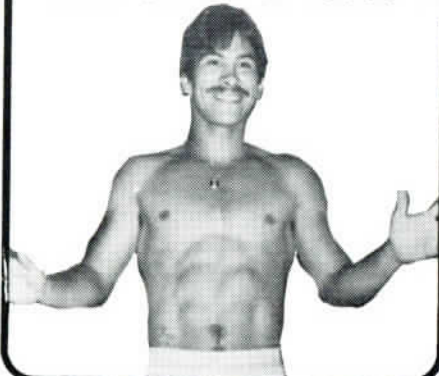

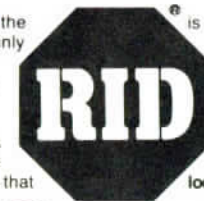

NIGHTMARES

Once Upon a Time . . .

If you are the kind of person who enjoys bizarre tales about strange circumstances, *Nightmares* is just the kind of dark alley you'll want to walk down. It is done rather well and comparatively speaking, it is not only better than *Twilight Zone*, but is everything *Zone* should have been. For the folks who enjoy this kind of entertainment, few will be disappointed. It is just the kind of stuff your mama told you not to watch as a kid.

A collection of four stories, "Terror in Tropicana" is the first ghoulish tale about an escaped (you guessed it) maniac murderer: the only kind that can escape those dreadful institutions. If memory serves, this is an old campfire/slumber party gem. It is delightfully bearable and proves that dark roads are no place for the stupid and slow-moving. In spite of the contrived happenings, the ending has a nice twist.

Story II, "The Bishop of Battle," is worthy of an Edgar Allen Poe citation. This concerns a young man's obsession with one particular video game and tells a fantasmagorical parable that is classic. The special effects may remind you of Disney's *Tron*, but it has a slick finish and is the most sophisticated of the lot.

"The Benediction," the title of story III, has to do with the existence of good and evil/God and Satan. Although not

nearly as deliberately weird as *The Exorcist*, it unfolds a scenario that is fairly spooky: a priest whose doubts about evil are resolved. Unfortunately, this nightmare is the weakest of the group and the climax was already seen in the previews.

"Night of the Rat" is about a family that comes to realize that they have a problem with rats in a big way. This last

segment is done in Stephen King fashion with enough chills to keep the heart pumping. The big finish could have been less dramatic and more eerie because Mr. Movies thought the talking rat was a bit much to swallow.

Primarily a visual film with a minimum of dialogue, *Nightmares* is an excellent study in the creation of good horror with optimum intensity. It provides enough well-timed endings and unexpected turns to keep the viewer watching. Although this is not Academy Award material, it's worth the price of admission to watch it with the lights out.

Oh yes, let's not forget *Frankenstein's Great-Aunt Tillie*, which recently completed filming south

SHOWBIZ NOMINATES FOR STARDOM—**Amanda Plummer**. This amazingly gifted actress, who happens to be the real-life daughter of **Christopher Plummer** and **Tammy Grimes**, had her best screen role to date in 1980's *Cattle Annie and Little Britches*, but that movie had very limited release outside of occasional cable TV showings. Then she turned up in an interesting but minuscule role in *The World According to Garp*—if you blinked, you probably missed her. In between movie roles she's had far more success on the stage, particularly in New York, where she appeared in *Agnes of God*, *Artichoke* and *Alice* (the latter with **Meryl Streep**). Now Amanda is back on the screen in **Sidney Lumet's** *Daniel*, which stars **Timothy Hutton** in a story loosely based on events which led to the trial and execution of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg in 1953.

FOOTLIGHT PARADE — Musicalized biography may be the biggest noise in New York's theater district once all the ecstatic raves for *La Cage Aux Folles*

have died down—and don't expect that to happen any time soon! **Anthony Newly** hits Broadway in October with his *Chaplin* musical, which features Newly's own original book, music and lyrics in addition to his starring role. Later in the season, **Peggy Lee** may be on the boards as star of *Peg*, a musical based on her own career. Meanwhile, Michael Bennett, director of *A Chorus Line* and *Dreamgirls*, is in the planning stages of a musical based on *Love Me or Leave Me*, the 1955 **Doris Day** movie musical based on the career of **Ruth Etting**. **Ann-Margret** has been mentioned as possible star of the stage version. (Incidentally, on September 29, Bennett's *A Chorus Line* will surpass *Grease* as the

longest-running show in Broadway history.) Not to be outdone, that nebulous domain of New York known as off-Broadway will be presenting *Tallulah*, a musical based on you-know-who, starring **Helen Gallagher**. It opens in late October. . . . There are also musicals based on the lives of **Frances Farmer** and **Marilyn Monroe** floating around somewhere "out of town," but don't hold your breath waiting for them to take New York by storm. Frances Farmer and Marilyn Monroe??? Isn't it about time we gave those two a much deserved vacation from notoriety?

IN MEMORIAM — Bass player **James Jamerson** was one of the most prolific and innovative musicians in the history of rock music, but, although most of us have at one time or another danced to his beat, his name and contributions will probably remain in obscurity. As a session player—a performer in Motown Records "house band" from 1959 to 1973—Jamerson's distinctive sound helped make stars of Diana and the Supremes, Martha and the Vandellas, Stevie Wonder, the Four Tops, the Temptations and all the others who took credit for the Detroit sound. He was 45 when he died on August 2—his contributions will live much longer. . . . **Jan Clayton** also did not have a very famous name, but any kid who survived the fifties will remember warm-hearted and sensible Ellen Miller, whose son Jeff owned Lassie. Prior to appearing in *Lassie* (from 1954 to 1957), Jan Clayton had appeared with John Raitt in the original Broadway cast of *Carousel*. After *Lassie*, she toured in such shows as *South Pacific*, *Auntie Mame* and *Guys and Dolls*, and she continued to make TV appearances. Hardcore trivia buffs may remember her as a regular on *Pantomime Quiz* in the 1953-54 season; she later returned for the 1962-63 season. Jan Clayton died August 28 at age 66.

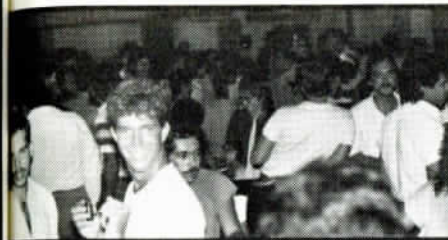

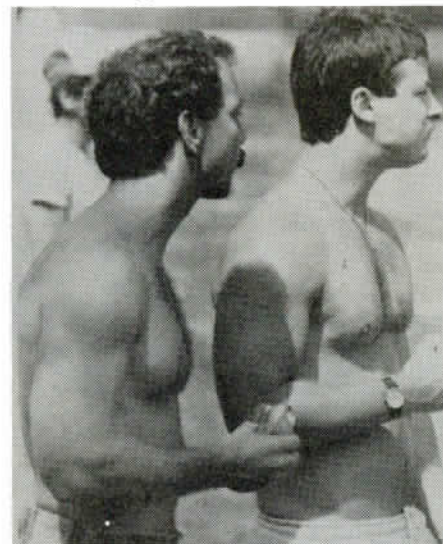


Southern New England congratulates Dirty Sally's after losing to Houston by only one run (score 2-1). It was Houston's only victory.
