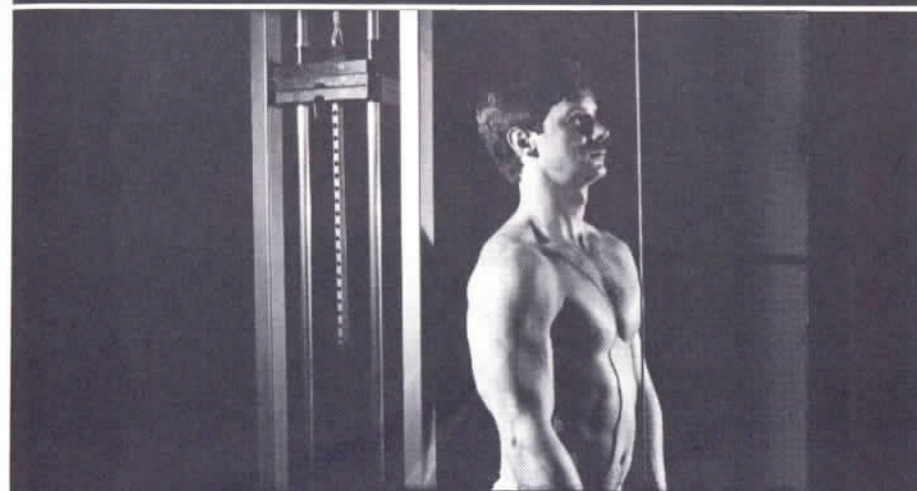

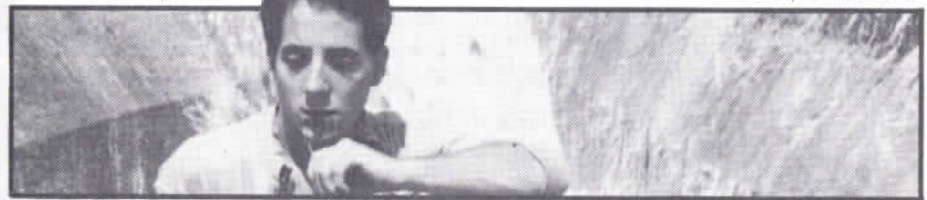

DEDICATION IN FORT WORTH

FORT WORTH — "Myself and a few thinking people welcome you to our city," were the first words spoken by Maurice Oaks, the mayor of Forrest Hills, at the September 18 dedication ceremonies of the new building of Agape MCC. Forrest Hills, site of the new building, is a suburb of Fort Worth. "This city welcomes any church looking for God," the mayor continued. He then received a standing ovation from a crowd of 300 gathered at the ceremony, Buddy Jones of TWT NEWS/Fort Worth reported.

The combined orchestras and choirs of Fort Worth and Dallas performed with rousing music as guest soloist Jimmy Odom of MCC-Dallas, was featured.

Telegrams from different states were read. One was from Fort Worth district Senator Hugh Parmer. Ministers and representatives from most area churches were in attendance.

At the Sunday evening service, Charlene Aires directed the 30-voice choir, Voices of Christ, from UT-Arlington. "Purple Grass" was the title of a sermon given by the Rev. Elder Freda Smith of River City MCC of Sacramento.

The Rev. Don Eastman of MCC-Dallas concluded the dedication ceremonies by anointing the building with oil and unveiling the cornerstone plaque.

"Upcoming band activities include the Fourth Annual Fall Concert which is this November, a special Christmas program, a trip to Austin and a Spring Spectacular.

The young man was found by a passer-by about 12:30am last Sunday morning in the 2300 block of Turtle Creek Blvd. with a gunshot wound in the neck.

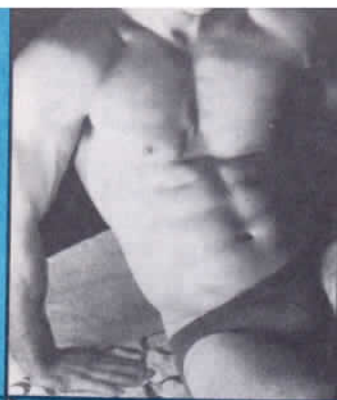
Investigators reported to TWT NEWS/Dallas that they had no suspects or motives as of last Monday.

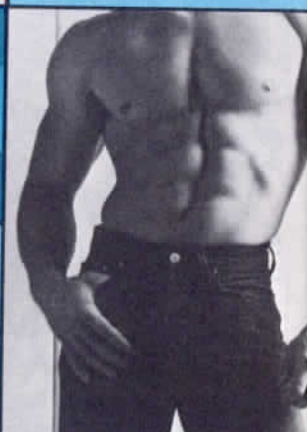

ers will address various issues related to the theme.

ALGPC kicked the series off on September 27, with a program featured by the Austin Peace Justice (APJ) coalition, which is organizing a large-scale march down Congress Avenue on October 22 to protest current national administration defense spending, foreign intervention policies and deployment of missiles in Europe.

The Texas March for Peace and Justice will be one of several activities going on that weekend across the country, TWT NEWS/Austin was advised. "We are strongly committed to representing the local community in the coalition," ALGPC stated, since "we are a member of APJ."

Looking ahead to the October 24 meeting, the guests will be from the Waterloo Counseling Center, newly created as a support group. "It provides a service which ALGPC feels is crucial to our individual communal survival," a spokesperson explained.

The November meeting will deal with the AIDS issue in Austin, and the December general meeting will be a traditional holiday party.

CATHOLICS INVITE NEW MEMBERS

HOUSTON — The local Dignity chapter is placing the emphasis this fall on inviting new people to experience their weekly liturgies and the fellowship that follows.

"People wishing to celebrate mass with us will find us at 7:30pm each Saturday evening at the Rice Catholic Student Center, 1703 Bolsover," president Stan Ford told TWT NEWS/Houston.

Dignity/Houston is a ministry for Catholic gay men, women and their friends joined together to promote the general acceptance and understanding of gays within the church, society and among their peers.

"By encouraging a spiritual atmosphere via concerned support and sympathetic understanding, we hope to

facilitate positive growth as individuals and as members of the body of Christ," Ford explained. Call (713) 523-7644 or 528-7644 for information.

TEXAS GAY MEN WITH WIVES

HOUSTON — A local support group, Gay Men/Straight Wives (GMSW), begins its second year of operation this month. Any gay man who is now or has been in a relationship with a woman, or is contemplating such a relationship, may become a member, it was explained to TWT NEWS.

Some members are in conventional marriages, in open marriages, separated, divorced, some with lovers, some without, and some in other varied arrangement situations. "Regardless, all are welcome," a spokesperson explained.

GMSW has a policy of neither encouraging nor discouraging gay men from continuing or forming relationships with their wives or other men. The policy also seeks to assist each gay man to find his own best road to travel in life.

Progress in relationships is accomplished through open, cordial and sympathetic sharing of thoughts, experiences and feelings among members. "We also offer individual sessions."

As GMSW enters its second year, more members are needed who are willing to help organize and operate the group. Interested parties should contact (713) 772-6424 after 7:00pm.

HOUSTON — Three of the four past presidents of this city's GPC reviewed their presidencies at the eighth anniversary meeting of GPC, held at the Holiday Inn on October 21. Gary Van Ooteghem, president at the group's inception, did not attend, but Don Hrachovy, Steve Shiflett and Lee Harrington all gave a short history of GPC under their respective tenures of office, David Fields of TWT NEWS/Houston observed.

When Van Ooteghem was president, Hrachovy was vice president and moved into the office of president when Van Ooteghem vacated the seat. Among things mentioned by Hrachovy about his administration was the March Against Anita Bryant, which drew a crowd of about 500.

Shiflett recalled that his administration directed the organization's involvement in Town Meeting I, held in 1978 at the Astrodome. That event helped put GPC in the spotlight on the political scene. Continued active involvement led to the "No-on-6" Banquet against Briggs' Proposition 6, which was legislation aimed at banning gay teachers and any discussion of homosexuality in public schools. The first Gay Pride Week was also held during his administration.

Among other activities of note was the replacement of Councilmember Frank Mann with Eleanor Tinsley. After the departure of Shiflett, Harrington assumed the presidency and was involved in the election of Mayor Kathy Whit-

mire. With her election, the GPC clearly became a powerful bloc vote in local politics.

UT PROFESSOR ON GAY JAPAN

AUSTIN — The Gay Students' Association (GSA) at the University of Texas at Austin presented Dr. Roy Teele on Tuesday, September 13 as the feature of their first program of the semester. Dr. Teele recently retired from UT's Department of Oriental and African Languages.

Dr. Teele spoke to a crowd of about 85 people about various aspects of what he called "male love" in Japanese culture, both past and contemporary, reported Jay Cherin of TWT NEWS/Austin.

Dr. Teele explained the main differences in Western and Eastern variations of acceptance of the homosexual lifestyle. He said that due to the symbiotic permissiveness and restrictiveness, homosexuality really causes no alarm to

the culture of the Japanese.

The history of Japanese homosexuality was briefly outlined by Dr. Teele, who explained that Shinto priests who traveled to continental China brought back the art of "man love," from which the Samurai and Shogun warriors took up the practice. Even though the members of these two important classes usually wed women, they often kept male lovers.

In regard to the literature of Japan, Dr. Teele said homosexuality first appeared in writing in a long series of love poems. Thirteen of these poems are blatantly homosexual, while hundreds may be, it not being accurately known since the Japanese lack any sex-related pronouns. Additionally, the No and Kibuki arts have their roots in homosexuality.

The male lovers of the warriors frequently composed these plays with their lovers in mind, Dr. Teele explained. Over 250 of the plays in the modern repertory were written by gay men. Dr. Teele finished his discussion on a more contem-

porary note by talking about the twentieth century novelist, Yukio Misima, a gay writer who authored *Forbidden Colors*.

GSA's next general meeting will focus on gay minorities on October 11 in the Governor's Room in the UT Union at 8:00pm, Cherin reported.

"MAGIC" MACHINE ONLY IN SA

SAN ANTONIO — Some are calling it a "magic" machine, a one of a kind, and only Wilford Hall Medical Center has it.

It's an \$80,000 machine that uses a laser beam to count blood cells. The machine is the prime factor in the hospital, having just been named as the treatment center for all U.S. Air Force AIDS cases, Tim Ramm of TWT NEWS-San Antonio reported.

The machine, called a flow cytometer, can count specially marked cells in blood samples, which enables quick

diagnosis because it shows whether a person is deficient in certain blood cells known to be characteristic of AIDS.

"I'd say, without the instrument, we would be at a distinct disadvantage," Lt. Col. Paul Shaffer, assistant chief of Clinical Pathology, said, adding that the hospital's possession of the cell counter machine "would have to assume some importance in the Air Force's decision to send all AIDS patients to our hospital."

To date, two AIDS patients have been diagnosed with the aid of the cell counter. One was Airman First Class Raymond Orsini of Lackland Air Force Base; the other an unnamed captain assigned to Kelly Air Force Base. The two are the only Air Force service members with confirmed cases.

No other machine is as advanced or as easy to use as the one presently at Wilford Hall, a reporter, Mark Linsalta, learned from various medical and military sources.

**FW GAY PRIDE
SOLVENCY**

FORT WORTH — All expenses from Fort Worth's first Gay Pride Week held this past June have now been paid, Buddy Jones of TWT NEWS/Fort Worth reported. In fact, the association announced that a substantial balance remained to kick off next year's event.

Newly-elected officers for the coming year are Pat Summers and Mike Martin, co-presidents and Dale Glen, treasurer.

At the recent investiture of the Court of the Golden Lion, Summers requested that the court assume responsibility for the annual picnic. Emperor Glen and Empress Raina Lea accepted the duties.

In order that community groups such as the Gay Pride Association might have a better place to hold future meetings, the South Jennings Crossroads office building, when remodeled, will make available two large conference rooms. "There will be no charge," Jones stated.

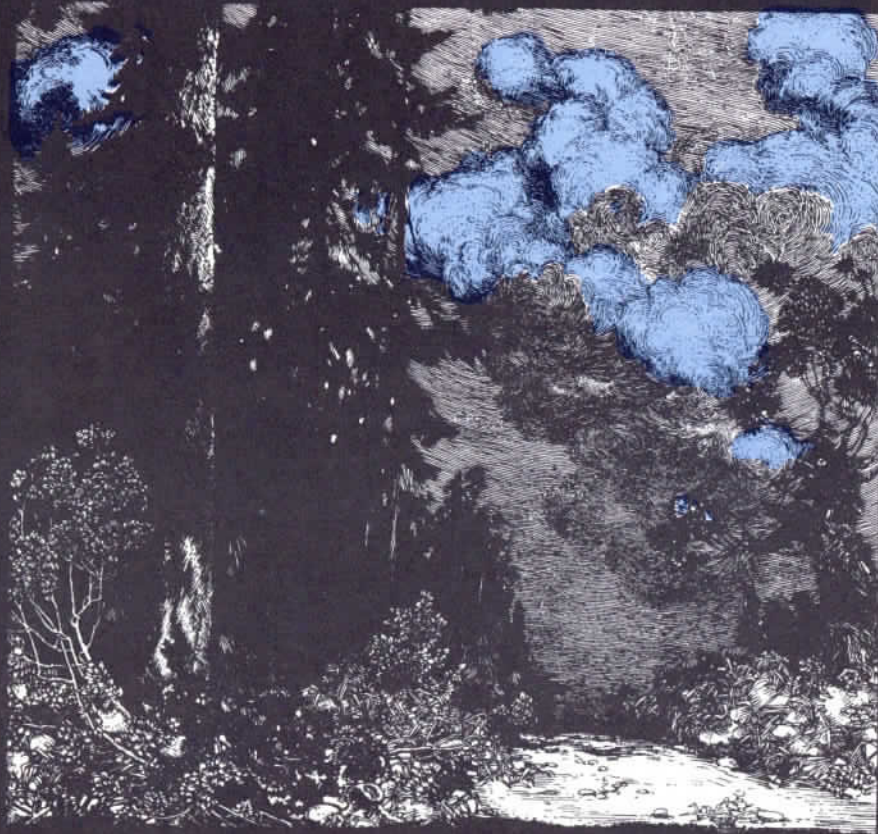

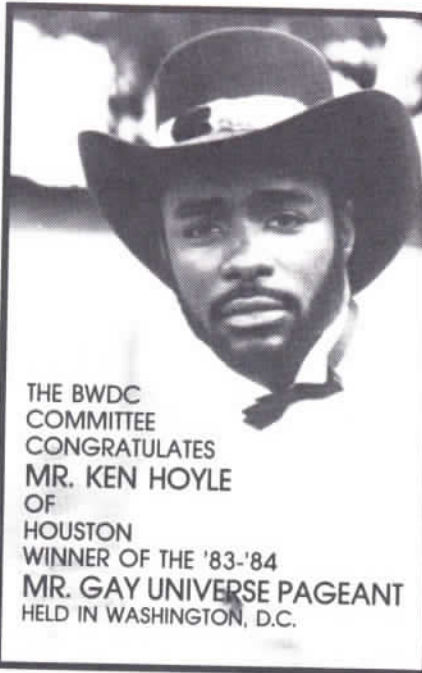

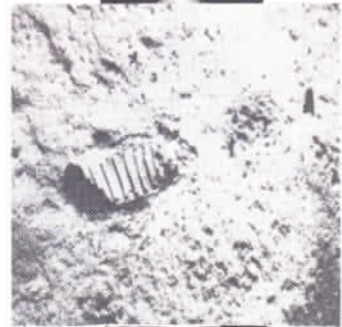
. . . It is not often that one is given a friend without asking and/or seeking. In the City Council At-Large Position 4 campaign, the Montrose community seems to have been offered this gift.

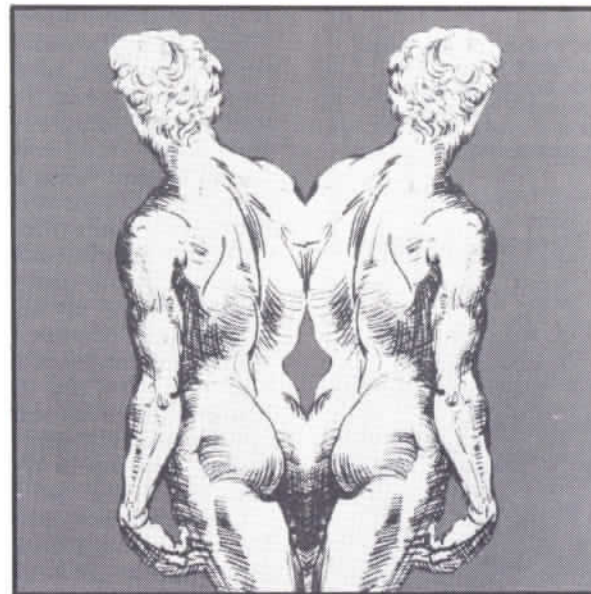

BOOKS
HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVES ON
Homosexuality



Historical Perspectives on Homosexuality, edited by Salvatore J. Licata, Ph.D. and Robert P. Petersen; 224 pp.; notes, index; The Haworth Press, 149 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York 10010; hardcover, \$18.95

Last week, the book *Male Love*, by John A. Symonds, was reviewed in *TWT*. It explored the history of classical homosexuality in the Dorian and Hellenic Greek periods. As promised, an exposition of homosexuality in more recent times is reviewed here. *Historical Perspectives on Homosexuality*, edited by Salvatore J. Licata, Ph.D. and Robert P. Petersen, contains a series of ab-

stracts on male and female homosexuality starting around 1270.

Each abstract is short (at times) and concise, focusing on some aspect of law or social phenomenon in different countries, cultures and time periods. At one level, the book serves to remind us of the extremes to which ignorance and hatred can reach in mankind. The anger, sadness and horror we feel results from the realization that those same attitudes still exist today.

"Those who do not learn from the lessons of history are doomed to repeat them"—so the advice goes. It is *not* certain that such cruelty and inhumanity will occur again if this history is spread far and wide. Only recently have true

academic, historical research efforts
been made to resurrect and preserve
such information.

This book does not exist to provide
ammunition for scare tactics. What the
book should do is make us aware of the
possibilities, to be weighed rationally
and to be guides in decision-making.

Though this is an academic work, and
the abstracts are detailed, the reader will
find the material to be intriguing, even
fascinating; at times, entertaining. Some
of the abstracts have titles such as
"Writhing Bedfellows" . . . "Share Ex-
travagant Delight," and "Ho Hum, An-
other Work of the Devil. . . ." The editors
also include book reviews of *The Un-
mentionable Vice: Homosexuality in the
Later Medieval Period* and *Coming Out:
Homosexual Politics in Britain, from the
Nineteenth Century to the Present*.

Perhaps the most intriguing aspect of
this work is the questions it tries to
answer. "Why, for example, did the
Napoleonic Code decriminalize same-
sex acts during a period of conservative
reaction? Why did the homosexual
rights movement appear when they did?
Why did the first known protests against
sodomy laws occur in Germany in the
latter half of the 19th century?"

Other questions concern, "Who were
the prominent lesbians of the past and
what was their role in society? Although

Oscar Wilde and his friendship circle
have received considerable attention,
Natalie Barney's Paris salon has not."
A historical view of the Pink Triangle
prisoners in Nazi concentration camps
and the homosexual rights movement
in the U.S. is also included.

Historical Perspectives is the second
volume in the Research Monograph
Series jointly sponsored by The Haworth
Press and the Center for Homosexual
Education, Evaluation and Research
(CHEER, to whom this book is dedicat-
ed); it also composes the first two issues
in the sixth volume of the *Journal of
Homosexuality*.

CHEER, based in San Francisco, is
created to serve professional groups
represented by psychology, sociology,
anthropology, medicine and law. The
Journal is devoted to empirical research,
and its clinical implications, on lesbian-
ism, male homosexuality, gender iden-
tity and alternative sexual lifestyles.

Though it may sound like a cliché to
some, this book will help gay people find
their own roots in the world's great civi-
lizations. History and heritage enrich
and support the presence of gay people
in the world today. The volume is clearly
a scholarly work, complete with end-
of-chapter notes and references, and an
annotated bibliography. It is a history of
our heritage we can call our own. **rw**

THE KING OF IMPERSONATORS

How good is your knowledge of history? Do you vaguely remember what you learned about the pre- and post-depression years? If you do, you may be familiar with the name of Leonard Zelig. But then again, you may not. Zelig was a clear case of a cult hero who bewildered the world with a highly unusual physical trait. The inconspicuous little man had the habit of vigorously changing his appearance to match the shape, fea-

tures and skin pigmentation of the person next to him. The populace at-large celebrated Zelig as a human chameleon; doctors considered him dangerously sick, while buck-hunting agents decided to show him off as a freak in circus sideshows. There was a woman doctor, however, who showed more than medical interest in him. She felt that Zelig, deep down was a sad human being who wanted to please at all costs.

There are interviews with 1983 personalities (Susan Sontag, Irvin Howe

Saul Bellow and others) commenting on the Chameleon and the fad he started; for instance, he inspired a popular dance during the so-called Jazz Age of the late 20s. There are numerous old newsreels with more than a touch of authenticity, which depict a seemingly ever-present yet ever-changing hero chitchatting with political and cultural leaders such as Herbert Hoover or Eugene O'Neill, or behind Hitler during a Nazi rally.

Zelig, of course, never existed in reality, but the phenomenon of Zeligism is nothing new to 20th century society. People, not uncommonly, have the urge "to assimilate like crazy," as Zelig's condition is described, to blend in with, behave and look like others in order to be liked or simply avoid making waves.

Woody Allen has made a marvelous, innovative, intelligently entertaining movie. But is he funny again, you ask.

Oh, yes, there are plenty of laughs in this 80-minute mock-documentary, although on a few occasions the satire lacks credibility. Due to the picture's special flavor, it is impossible to judge the acting of the two leads, Allen and Mia Farrow.

Zelig comes highly recommended, but be warned—this is not your ordinary movie fare. What we have is a refreshing new idea that Mr. Allen has put to screen life with the help of Gordon Willis, who played director of photography on five other Allen pictures. The Metrotone news footage is flawlessly interwoven with the title character's fantastically flexible features. Thanks, Woody, for lending some desperately needed originality and respectability to this year's celluloid scene. Thanks for Zelig, which is the sixth entry on my Top Ten list for '83.

MERRY CHRISTMAS, MR. LAWRENCE

DASHING THROUGH THE RICE ...

Merry Christmas, Mr. Lawrence is just the kind of extravaganza for film buffs who love to chew the fat about a film's philosophy over a glass of chablis and pensively puff cigarettes. It is one of those films that just drips with poignant scenes and symbolism (as did *Chariots of Fire*) and slithers through two hours of action like a snake in heat. Drip, drip. Dribble, dribble. Someone please tell me if I'm chewing my Raisonettes too loud. We wouldn't want to miss a word, would we?

The story is set in 1942 Java, where there is a collection of soldiers held captive by the Japanese during World War II. Jack Celliers (David Bowie) is the latest prisoner to be added to this group and is the most unconventional. There he meets Mr. Lawrence (Tom Conti), who is an unofficial diplomatic liaison between the guards and the prisoners, trying to understand Japanese philosophy and trying to gather understanding for the ways of the British.

Against a backdrop of war, homosexuality becomes the force for motives

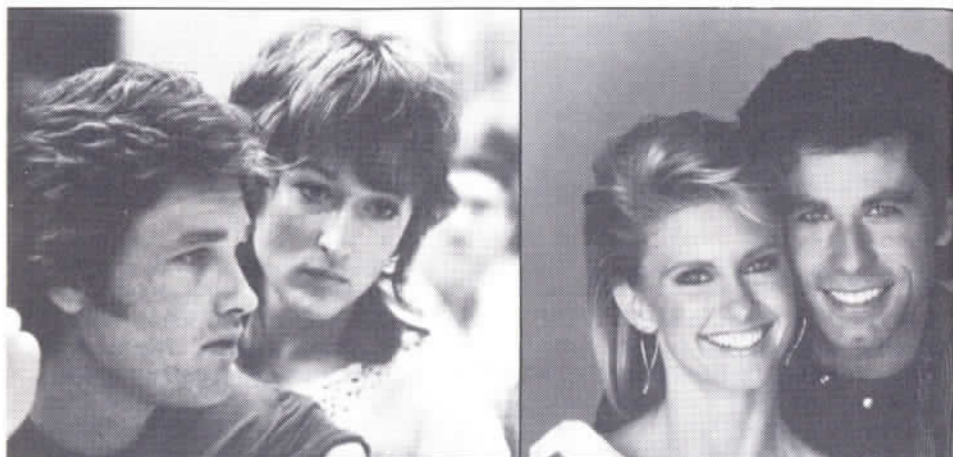
and action. Regardless of Java's murderous intolerance toward homosexuality, the blond tresses of Jack catch the attention of a top Japanese official who begins creating a situation where he and Jack can, let's say, get to know one another better. Much of the film is brimming with latent gayness to a frustrating point, and the "big kiss" is rewarded with death. Java is obviously a zipper-up, wrists-straight place.

The film presents the philosophies of individualism versus collectivism, which is an old debate that will never be resolved. The makers of the film understand this and present equally forceful viewpoints. The problem in doing so is that there is no (dramatic) catharsis to relieve the sexual tension that was created. Not only are the conflicts and tensions of the characters unresolved, but their futures remain oblique.

The cast did a fine job in this artsy-craftsy adventure from the East, but unless you are really serious about going to the movies, *Merry Christmas, Mr. Lawrence* is not going to be your cup of coffee—which is exactly what I needed after seeing it.

Does anybody remember a 1942 black comedy which featured **Jack Benny** and **Carole Lombard** as Shakespearean actors involved in trying to outwit the Nazis? It was called *To Be or Not to Be*, and if you missed the old version, keep your eyes open for the new one. It stars, for the first time together, real-life husband and wife **Mel Brooks** and **Anne Bancroft**. *To Be or Not to Be* was directed by **Alan Johnson**, who created the "Springtime For Hitler" sequence for Brooks' 1968 film *The Producers*.

Grease may have been the abomination of 1978 (it was also the top money-maker), but may be it's time we gave **John Travolta** and **Olivia Newton-John** another chance at each other. *Two of a Kind* Travolta plays a would-be inventor named Zack, and **Fi** Newton-John plays **Deb**, a bank teller—some how the fate of the entire world is in their hands.

WHERE EXACTLY IS THE LIMIT? — It has always bewildered me that movie-makers sometimes take a best selling or critically acclaimed novel and, after adapting it for the screen, *change the title!* For instance, do you remember *Who'll Stop the Rain* and *Head Over Heels*? No—not many people do, and they both were fairly good films and fairly big box office flops. *Who'll Stop the Rain*, a 1978 film which starred **Nick Nolte** and **Tuesday Weld**, was based on *Dog Soldiers*, a National Book Award-winning novel by **Robert Stone**, but many admirers of the book probably are unaware that it was ever filmed. The same may be true of 1979's *Head Over Heels*, which starred **John Heard**, **Mary Beth Hurt** and the late **Gloria Grahame**. Not many people knew that it was based on **Ann Beattie's** *Chilly Scenes of Winter*, but at least it was recut and had limited release under its original title. Now we have the film version of **Graham Green's** *The Honorary Consul*, a top best seller of 1973. That title really wasn't sexy enough for a **Richard Gere** movie, so the title was changed—apparently at the last minute—to *Beyond the Limit*. **Michael Caine** also stars in this "political thriller" set in a violence-torn South American province, and the film might actually turn out to be one of the year's most exciting entertainments. Still, I can't help feeling that we should rate it according to how many times Mr. Gere shows his cock or his ass.

APPROACHING THE LIMIT — Due to an overabundance of sex symbol hype, **Pia Zadora** has become much too easy a target for ridicule. Her last film, 1981's *Butterfly*, was mediocre at best, but it did win a few foreign awards, and Ms. Zadora really wasn't bad in it. She has more potential than most people are willing to recognize—in fact, compared to **Bo Derek** Pia is **Dame Judith Anderson**, **Saint Ingrid Bergman** and **Yvette**

Mimieux all rolled into one! And I, for one, am *dying* to see her latest film *The Lonely Lady*, which is based on **Harold Robbins'** sexy novel (sexy novels usually hit the screen with their titles intact). In *The Lonely Lady*, Pia portrays **JeriLee Randall**, a prize-winning writer who has "plunged through an emotional hall of mirrors." Harold Robbins has said that the character is based in part on the career of *Peyton Place* author **Grace Metalious**, who died at the age of 39 in 1964.

WAY PAST THE LIMIT — Well, it's about time! We're finally going to get to see *Brainstorm*—the final film of **Natalie Wood**, one which has had an uncertain fate since it was completed in early 1982. Director **Douglas Trumbull** has said that he was able to complete the film "without resorting to a single illusion to fool the audience. . . . Natalie's performance in this film will speak for itself." *Brainstorm* is only the second film to be directed by Trumbull; his first was 1971's *Silent Running*, but he is probably best known as the special effects technician behind *Close Encounters of the Third Kind*, *Star Trek: The Motion Picture* and *Blade Runner*. In addition to Natalie Wood, *Brainstorm* features **Christopher Walken**, **Louise Fletcher** and **Cliff Robertson**. It's about exploration of the human mind—inner space instead of outer space—and with Trumbull's particular magic it could be the visual treat of the year.

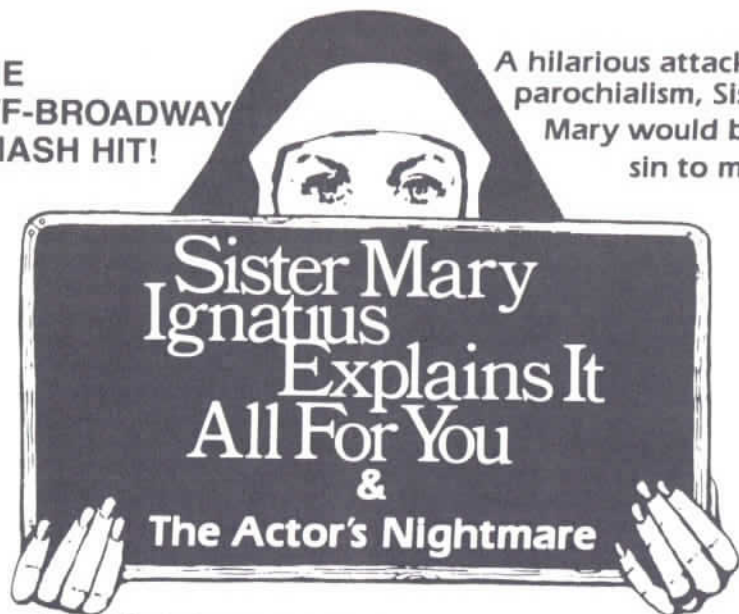

TEXAS by Rob Clark

ROSE TATTOO — Dr. Laurel Keating, who directed Jane Chambers' *My Blue Heaven* for Community Productions in the spring, is back in Austin to direct yet another play at the Capitol City Playhouse in Austin, TWT's Jay Cherin told me. Keating is presently directing the late Tennessee Williams play, *The Rose Tattoo*. The not-frequently performed play is described by Keating as "the Valentine that Williams left to the world."

The play takes place in a small American-Sicilian community and evolves around Serafina della Rosa's mourning for her husband, who died in an auto accident. Melba Martinez-Mishler, who is debuting in Austin as Serafina, depicts a woman who loses the reality of the past through her husband's death. This loss is replaced by the troubles she has with adjusting to being a widowed mother. The combination of Serafina's discovery that her husband was far from faithful, and the fact that her daughter, Rosa, has reached the age at which innocence disappears, furthers the troubles Serafina faces. Nevertheless, the audience is kept aware that reality exists, even in the face of disaster, by the facetious mocking of the Strega, artfully interpreted by Lana Dieterich.

Under Dr. Keating's direction, the performers in Williams' play surpass a recitation of the plot by displaying the anguish-ridden forces which drive these strong characters into believable existence. The combination of Keating's perfectionist direction and intense magnification of human emotions forces the audience to think about change and prepare for transition no matter how devastating the circumstances under which they are created affect us.

Dr. Keating holds degrees in psychology, theatre arts and communications, and is currently a juror of the American

Film Institute and a professor of theatre arts at Yeshiva University in New York City. Before returning to New York, she will direct another play, *My Other Voice*, as part of the Capitol City New Theatre Festival in October.

CRISP — Community Productions of Dallas will be bringing the infamous **Quentin Crisp** to Texas during the month of November. The performance, entitled "An Evening with Quentin Crisp," will be presented in Lubbock November 10, Austin November 11-12, San Antonio November 15, Dallas November 18-19, and in Denton on November 21.

Mr. Crisp, at 75 years of age, is best known for his book, *The Naked Civil Servant*, and the documentary based on that novel.

For several years now, he has been taking his one-man show around the world, sharing his philosophy on life, individuality and freedom of expression, seasoned by his notorious sense of wit, charm and honesty. His performance is indeed a rare entertainment opportunity.

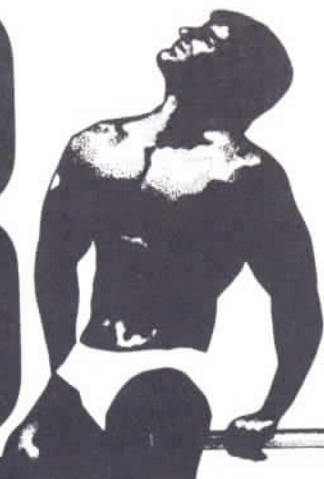

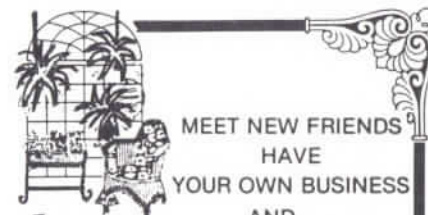

INTERVIEW

ANDY MILLS Conductor Montrose Symphonic Band

by Dean Malone



THE BAND'S BEGINNING — The band got started in February of 1980 after the Montrose Marching Band collapsed. We started with 13 members. We now have approximately 60 members.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS — We've done three concerts at the Tower Theatre in Houston, three concerts at Cullen Auditorium at the University of Houston, we've performed at the Houston Festival for three years, the Heights Festival two years, and three parades in Dallas. The year before last, we performed at Mardi Gras in New Orleans. We hope to do Dickens on the Strand in Galveston this year.

NEW YORK — We had to have our money in for plane tickets and our \$50 a person registration in by June 1, at which time we did not have that much money. The band was going with the Montrose Chorale, but the chorale was not big enough yet to work with the band. The funds that were raised for that project, however, will be used toward our trip to Los Angeles the week of June 29-July 1 for Gay Pride Week. Christopher Street West, which produces Gay Pride Week in Los Angeles, has rented the Hollywood Bowl. All of the gay bands in LA will combine for a concert on Friday night, Saturday afternoon and Saturday night; each band will play an individual concert at the LA Festival Grounds, and Sunday, all nine bands will march separately in the parade. They'll have buses at the end of the parade to take the bands back to the beginning of the parade to all march as one to finish the parade. There will be 600 individuals altogether.

We're working with the Oak Lawn Symphonic Band in Dallas to raise

funds. We need \$30,000 for transportation, about \$23,000 for equipment. A concert costs \$8,300 to produce and we take in an average of \$5,300 per concert. Which means, at the end of the year, we will use that money to produce three concerts.

NUMBERS CONCERT — The money from the show with the lasers at Numbers in Houston on Friday, September 23, for Play SAFE Week, will go toward paying off the \$3,000 debt the band still owes from the recent Gay Pride Week concert, and also toward our trip to LA. We have other fundraising projects coming up that we'll let you know about.

ANDY'S CREDITS — I have a bachelor's degree in Music from Ohio State University and my master's degree in Music from the Mannes Conservatory in New York City.

WHY THE NEED? — The bands and choruses are two groups the gay community have nationwide which present a total positive image of our community.

HOW TO JOIN — People wishing to join the band can call me [Andy Mills] at (713) 527-9454, or come to Bering Memorial Church, 1440 Harold, on Tuesday evenings from 7:30-10:00pm. You can sit in for one or two rehearsals and see if you like it or not, and then you can audition for whatever part you want to play. We also need a large support group to help with ticket sales, ushering, etc. These folks are called the "Band Aids," and should call Lou Hondors at (713) 528-6776. We're always open for new members.

DIRECTOR Sidney Lumet

Interview and Photographs by Blase DiStefano

Sidney Lumet is an interesting man, who never seems to be at a loss for words. Here he discusses a variety of subjects, including his latest film, Daniel. If there had not been a time limit on the interview, he might still be talking. Though there is not enough space for a complete list of Mr. Lumet's films, a partial list consists of: The Verdict, Deathtrap, Prince of the City, Equus, Network, Murder on the Orient Express, Serpico, The Group, The Pawnbroker and Long Day's Journey into Night.

DANIEL

I think it's my best movie. It's as complicated a piece as I've ever done from many points. It was a real labor of love for all of us, because we didn't have much money. We did it for union minimum, so that all the money could go up on screen. . . . The kids were the only difficult casting part, because for some reason—I don't know why it happens—once kids have done a movie, they're never the same again. . . . I spent three months looking for those kids. I didn't settle for them until two days before [we started shooting].

TIMOTHY HUTTON

He's remarkable. I had never met him before, and I didn't want him for the part originally, because all I knew of him was *Ordinary People* and a real dumb movie he did called *Taps*. And he just looked like the quintessential WASP kid to me. I didn't know how in the world he would ever fit into the world that we were going to portray. So when his name came up at first, I said no. And then he wanted it so badly, he had read the script, without my knowing it, weeks before. He had been letting his hair grow, and he grew a beard, and then he just arrived on my doorstep. We sat and talked for two hours, and that was it.

COMPARISON OF THE MOVIE DANIEL TO THE ROSENBERG TRIAL

I'm mystified by it. It [the movie] is very clearly totally fictional. The only thing I can put my finger on is that there's something about that case that just won't rest, and that people want a definitive answer of some sort, and in a funny way they were hoping the movie would give it to them. They almost feel frustrated that it hasn't. They wanted a nice, simple guilty or not guilty or sentimental evocation of it, and when they don't get that, it makes them a little angry. . . . There's been nothing about the case for thirty years. . . . Their [the Rosenbergs'] sons wrote a book about ten years ago. . . . There's a book that came out saying they [the Rosenbergs] were innocent and there was a frame-up; that came out about seven years ago with not much of a fuss about it. But there sure is now. . . . There's a particularly obsessive connection with the actual case.

HEROES AND VILLAINS

I don't believe in heroes and villains, because I don't think people behave heroically or villainously. I do believe in indestructibility and survivability, which is what this picture [*Daniel*] is about. That *Daniel* makes it is a miracle; but he



makes it for a logical reason, and he makes it because he tried something, because he's got enormous courage about facing his own past, and delves into it, and starts by wanting to know the facts. . . . and finds out . . . that the facts are completely unimportant, and had nothing to do with whether he'll be able to continue his life. That decision is his own, regardless of the facts. . . .

PARENTS

Parents are such mysterious figures to us. . . . Starting from the first time we know where babies come from when we say, "Oh my God, did my parents do that!?" You can't believe it. . . . They're never really around; they're certainly never around when you need them, or when you *think* you need them. . . . So, when you compound that with the fact in this instance that the lives themselves [of *Daniel's* parents] are quite mysterious, and then you add on top of that the parents are . . . publicly removed by the state, the number of traumas you're dealing with is enormous. And it's that part of the story that originally interested [E.L.] Doctorow [screenwriter of *Daniel*] and of course interested me.

LUMET'S PARENTS

Terrific. My father was an actor, a passionately committed man. Never there



when I wanted them—all the things we've been talking about. And, like all of these things, none of it is good or bad; it's simply the way it is. None of this is perjorative or to put a label on anything. There are valuable things, enormous things I got from them, including my present career. There were also tremendous inadequacies. So, we all essentially go through the same thing. It's one of the reasons I'm hopeful that *Daniel* will find a fairly wide audience. You may not know the culture specifically, but you . . . sure know that experience, not in this extreme a form, but that's what drama is. Drama always heightens the experience. And we accept that heightened version and can apply it to our own lives.

ACADEMY AWARDS

I never know about Academy Awards, 'cause that's like catching lightning in a bottle; that's like trying to figure out what audiences are going to do.

HIS OWN WORST CRITIC?

The Group could have been a lot better. I did a picture—I doubt you would have seen it—*Bye Bye Braverman*, which was a wonderful script, but stylistically, I screwed up completely. *Equus* and *The Fugitive Kind*, I could have done better. [Of the 31 films I've

made] I could have done a better job on about a third of them. [When asked if he was his own worst critic, Lumet replied, "No, Pauline Kael is my worst critic."]

PAULINE KAE—CRITIC

Don't ask me to explain anything that Pauline ever says. She's a lady who can write 5,000 words about nothing or one word about everything. She makes no sense to me at all, obviously. Wait until you read what she said about *Daniel* ["The movie doesn't move—it agglomerates."]—it makes *Serpico* look like a rave ["... the movie turns this hero (*Serpico*) into a mere freak..."]. ... She gets great favorites. She falls in love, then she falls out of love. She used to be in love with me, and then she fell out of love. I keep warning Bob Altman—I think he's a brilliant director, whom Pauline loves—"Bobby, wait, don't bend over in the shower, baby."

MONEY AND THE MOVIES

I think the only reason movies are financed by studios is because they might make money. I think you could do a musical about Stalin or Hitler, and they'd back it if they thought it would make a dime—if Burt Reynolds would play either part. So, I think the fact that last year there were a number of pictures on serious subject matters [*Sophie's*



Choice, *Gandhi*, *The Verdict*, *Tootsie*, *An Officer and a Gentleman*) that made a little bit of money to a great deal of money ... is what's affecting the movies you're seeing this year. They stopped being afraid of more serious subject matters, and we began to realize that audiences are beginning to get tired of what used to be only the "summer movies," now existing all year long. What was it about three or four years ago, when the biggest grossing Christmas movies were, uh ... what was that dumb movie? ... *9 to 5*, which I thought was just silly, and the other one was with Richard Pryor running around dressed as a chicken ... *Stir Crazy*. That was pretty depressing that those were the largest grossing movies of the year. It's not that I'm plugging for any particular kind of movie ... I think seeing my kind of movie—*Daniel* or *Prince of the City*—would be pretty boring to look at all year long. I think the healthiest movies are when you've got everything. And, so, this year, I'm much more encouraged because at least there are more serious movies; there are loads of comedies, there's sci-fi; I wish there were musicals thrown in, too; I wish there were animated films. The more varied the movie life, the better and healthier I think it is. ...

in Casablanca, where their father was stationed, Michael was kidnapped and held for ransom, before he escaped.

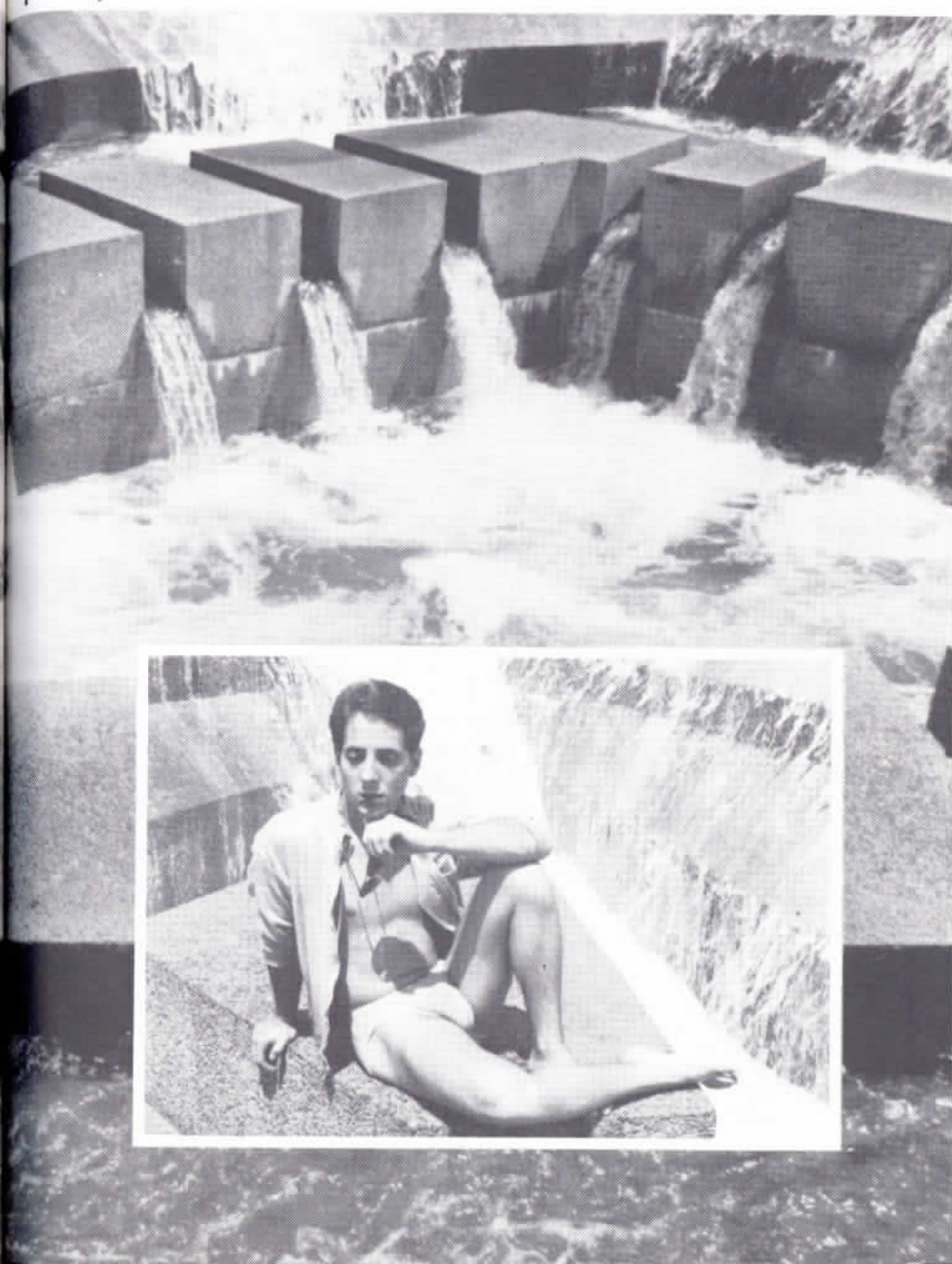
