\$5,000 REWARD IN CONROE MURDERS

CONROE, Texas — The families of two elderly men murdered near this city January 15 have informed TWT NEWS/Houston that a \$5,000 reward is being offered for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons involved.

Lee Walton Leslie, 70, and Raymond L. Mitchell, Jr., 58, were slain in southwest Montgomery County at the country home of Leslie, located off FM 2978 near Magnolia. Both were former merchant marines.

Although Leslie had resided in the greater Houston area, Mitchell lived in nearby Louisiana.

Mitchell was slain on one of his frequent visits to Leslie's home. Both were repeated patrons of the Montrose-area gay clubs and restaurants, Detective R.J. Renfrow, of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Department, explained to TWT NEWS/Houston.

Renfrow said he had several good leads in the case, but needed more concrete information. Anyone who witnessed someone leaving a Montrose bar with the two victims was asked to contact (713) 353-9791, ext. 7876 in Houston, or (409) 539-7876 in Conroe.

BAGNERIS TO SPEAK IN SAN FRANCISCO

SAN FRANCISCO — Larry Bagneris, Jr., current president of Houston's GPC and chair of that city's Gay Pride Week Committee, has accepted an invitation to speak in this city at next summer's gay pride day in the Bay Area on June 24, 1984.

Billed as the Christopher Street Liberation Day Committee Rally (CSLDC '84 Rally), the annual event is now in its fifteenth year. The march and rally have

grown through the years to be one of the largest in America.

In inviting Bagneris, who is known for his vibrant oratory, Ellen Levett, chair of the rally committee, wrote, "We feel that your ongoing and valuable contributions to our community makes yours a voice that will speak clearly and eloquently to the special issues and concerns facing us in this historic fifteenth anniversary year."

GAY STUDENTS MEET IN DALLAS

DALLAS — The Texas Gay and Lesbian Student Organization Coalition (TGLSOC) will hold its fall 1983 conference in this city over this weekend, October 21-23. The conference will feature programs for gay university students across the state, Jay Cherin of TWT NEWS/Austin reported.

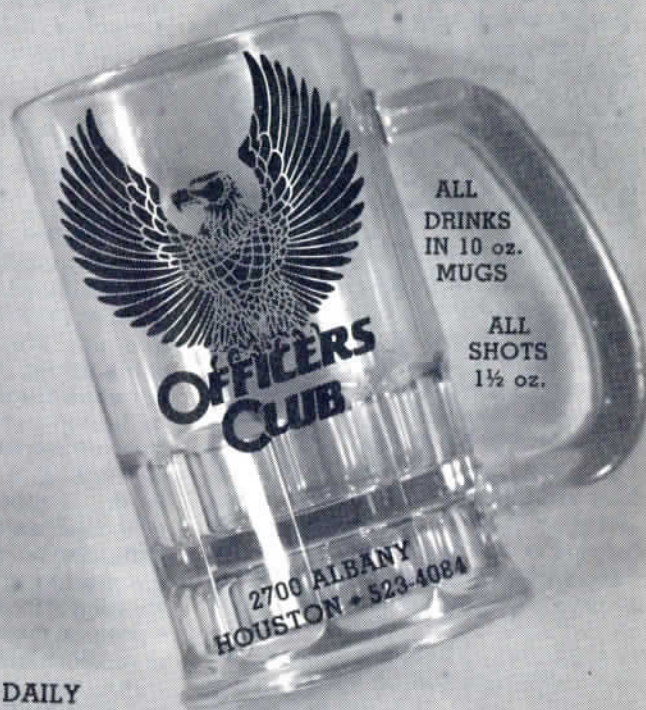
The conference will begin with an officers dinner, followed by a party honoring TGLSOC at the Fraternity House this Friday, October 21. On Saturday, the scheduled events will be held at MCC-Dallas and will include presentations by prominent gay and lesbian activists, a showing of the movie *Pink Triangles*, the trimestral meeting of TGLSOC's board of representatives and a bar-tour organized by the conference's host, Gay/Lesbian Student Support Organization. On Sunday, a picnic will be held at a local park for TGLSOC.

On the agenda for the board of representatives' meeting are the programs of the Women's Issues Committee, the progress of the Gay Publication Recommendation Committee and reports from the 14 member organizations. The board will also vote on new applications for membership. Pending applications include the Gay Academic Union of North Texas.

TEXAS GAY RODEO ELECTS OFFICERS

HOUSTON — Bill Holton, of the Knights of Orleans and the Texas Conference of Clubs, was elected president of the Texas Gay Rodeo Association (TGRA) at a meeting held Sunday, October 9 at Kindred Spirits in this city.

Marion Coleman, owner of Kindred Spirits, was elected vice president; Scott Miller of the Houston GPC was elected secretary; and Cindy Ewing of the Sundance Cattle Company was elected treasurer.

Jerry Kauffman, owner of the Briar Patch, was elected state director, TWT NEWS/Houston was informed.

AIDS CASES UP IN SAN ANTONIO

SAN ANTONIO — When AIDS cases first started being reported in Texas two years ago, it was Houston and Dallas where the occurrence was at its highest. The hill country had remained virtually untouched.

In fact, last year only two cases were reported in San Antonio, one resulting in death. However, this year, 14 new cases have been reported in the first nine months of 1983. Although AIDS rarely strikes a female, one local case is a woman, Tim Ramm of TWT NEWS/San Antonio learned.

"There are untold numbers of suspected cases here," said Dr. Robert

Bell, director of communicable disease control for the local Metropolitan Health District. "We can expect the cases to continue until we find some way to prevent or treat it," he added.

Although the Health District doesn't learn about cases until a confirmed diagnosis of AIDS is made, Bell feels certain many more cases are under observation, *The News* reported.

Dr. Toby Johnson, chairman of the San Antonio Gay Alliance (SAGA), said the local AIDS escalation is "forcing gays to alter their lifestyle."

MAYOR WHITMIRE WORSHIPS WITH MCCR

HOUSTON — On Sunday, October 9, the congregation of MCCR was honored to welcome this city's mayor, Kathy Whitmire, as a special guest. The Rev. Chuck Larson introduced Mayor Whitmire, TWT NEWS/Houston learned.

In a statement to those gathered, Mayor Whitmire stated how happy she was to be able to finally attend services at MCCR, and how she was impressed with the inspiration she felt as well as with the music.

"The music is fantastic," Whitmire stated from the pulpit. "In this church, I see a true spiritual awakening. I see people who love each other and who are here to worship the Lord and make Houston a better place, and I'm so happy to be able to join you. . . . We are so proud to have this church as a part of the family of people who worship the Lord here in Houston," she continued.

Mayor Whitmire remained for the full service and visited with members on an individual basis afterward.

LONGSTAFF DENIED CITIZENSHIP AGAIN

DALLAS — Richard Longstaff of Great Britain, an 18-year resident of the U.S. and owner of the Union Jack clothing stores in both Dallas and Houston, has had his petition for naturalization as an American citizen denied by

the Fifth U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans.

The 2-1 vote by the three-judge panel came after a six-month wait. Longstaff had hoped that the appeal panel's decision would be his final fight in his eight-year struggle to become a citizen.

"Shocked, upset and dismayed" is how he described his reaction to the decision. And rightly so, as Longstaff could face possible deportation.

Longstaff had earlier been twice denied citizenship by a federal judge in Dallas because of his sexual preference. Upon learning of the latest decision, 43-year-old Longstaff said, "All I can say is that gays still have a lot further to go. The laws are Victorian to say the least."

The law in question is the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, which classifies "homosexuality as a psychopathic personality." The law specifically states that aliens with "a psychopathic personality" are not permitted to enter this country.

The battle goes back to 1965 when Longstaff first applied for a visa. Longstaff told TWT NEWS/Dallas that he has been afraid to even visit his home in England for fear that he might be denied reentry into the country he now calls home.

It isn't fair that another non-U.S. citizen of similar sexual persuasion, Elton John, should be allowed free access to this country while Longstaff is rebuffed.

To date, Longstaff has spent over \$20,000 in legal fees, not to mention countless hours of frustration.

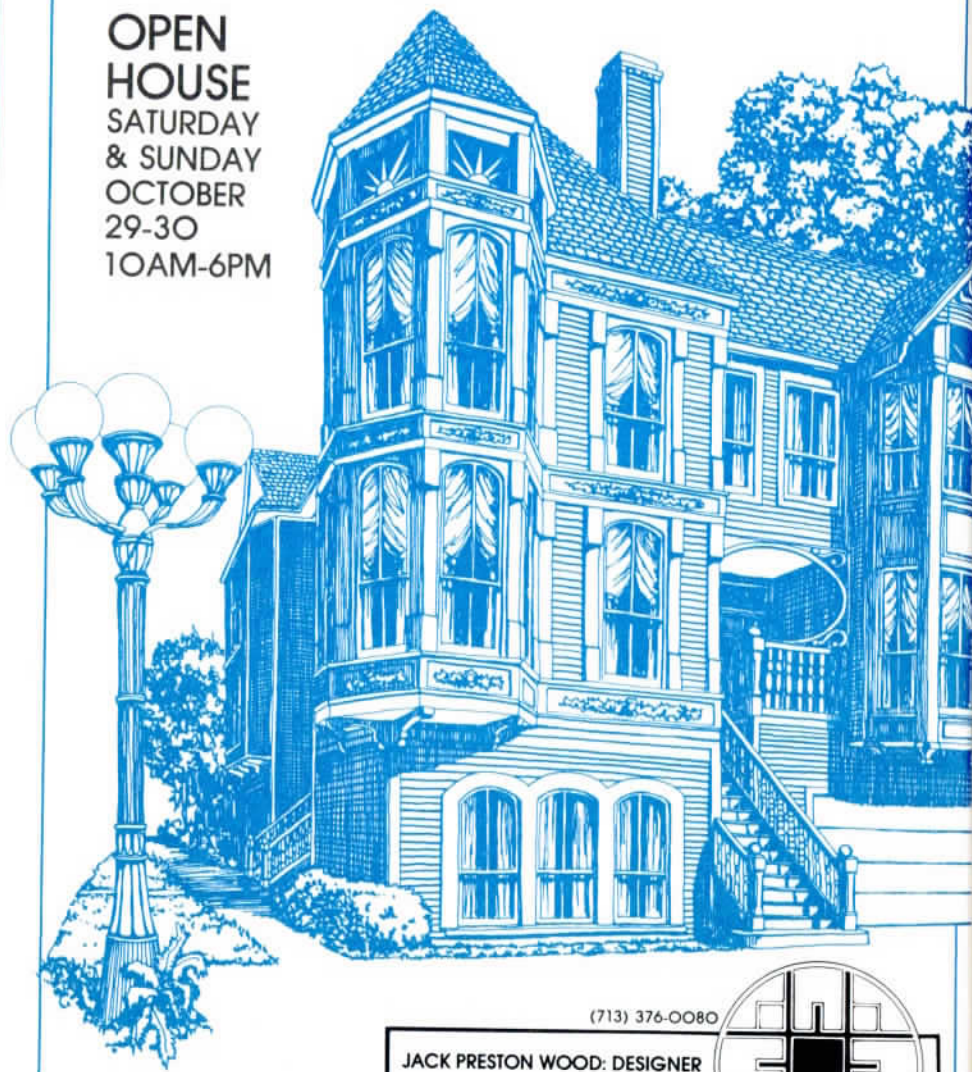

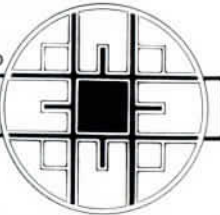

which stands for Program for AIDS Counseling and Evaluation. Although there is no current specific test to detect AIDS, PACE, developed by the clinic, is designed to accomplish five basics of diagnosis.

1) A patient questionnaire to detail past medical complaints plus a risk factor analysis.

2) A physical examination to be performed by a physician.

3) Laboratory tests for blood count, differentials and platelets, plus three skin tests for candida, mumps and tetanus.

4) An assessment of clinical and laboratory finds.

5) Patient counseling and/or referral to another physician or medical center for more extensive testing if warranted.

PACE is currently being offered in two evening sessions. Since the clinic is a non-profit organization with a volunteer clinical staff, a nominal \$25 charge is required in advance of PACE testing.

Since its inception on June 10 of this year, "nearly 200 gay men and lesbians have been served in times of crisis," it was revealed.

Safeplace-Dallas is a temporary haven for those gay brothers and sisters who need a safe place to sleep in time of trouble. Available on a first-come, first-serve basis with operating hours between 6:00pm-8:00am, it is not affiliated with or a part of any other gay or lesbian organization.

To be a founder, simply purchase a share for \$36 which will provide bed and bath for one person each month for the first year.

Dear TWT:

Once again, as the elections draw nearer, the Montrose community is again barraged by a series of bar raids conducted by the HPD. Anyone familiar with the history of the Houston gay community can attest to the fact that these raids are particularly common at election time.

I have never been an advocate of wholesale violations of various sorts which occur *in gay bars* (i.e. public sex, liquor, and age violations, etc.) but, for those who prefer to rationalize that these violations are the cause of such raids and, therefore, provided justification for bar raids, I must

ask — why do these raids primarily occur only at election time? Are we to believe that there is a sudden increase in these violations during October and November of each year?

Any reasonable thinker must conclude that these raids are politically motivated.

For years we have been told that the villains behind these raids are the leaders of the HPD. We have been taught, like Pavlovian dogs, to react to these raids by marching down to the polls and mindlessly voting for any candidate who utters the correct political rhetoric. Still, after having a significant amount of success in placing a majority of city council members into position, these raids continue, attesting to the fact that little *real* change has been made. One must stop to wonder if the gay community is not being taken for a joy ride.

Above all else, the HPD recognizes the significant effect that a large voter turnout in the gay precincts will have in the Mayor's race. Why, then, do they actively seek to awake gay voters from their slumbering and apathetic state? They have learned before that to do so results in a greater voter turnout. I do not believe that they are so ignorant that they have forgotten this lesson.

Could it be that they are acting as henchmen for a higher authority in an effort to activate this community, and that we are being manipulated and exploited by those who would play on our fears at election time? If not, why are these raids allowed to continue and why are officers who are involved in them never disciplined for their actions beyond the superficial level?

Furthermore, who benefits the most when the gay community is angered at election time? We must begin to examine the possibility that we are being used and manipulated by the current administration. Although we find ourselves in the position of not having a great deal of choice in this election, we would do well to begin to look for alternatives for competition in future electoral races.

It has been a personal dream of mine to provide this added measure of entertainment for my deaf brothers and sisters.

Occasionally, a dream becomes reality and the feeling of joy and fulfillment is so

Last Thursday, September 22, I was afforded the opportunity to provide sign language interpretation at the AIDS benefit show that was held at E.J.'s. It was a night that I will treasure forever. We need to start by forgetting ourselves and realize that there is a world around us, including many persons in worse situations than ourselves. Let's stop being paranoid about persecution. And let's not let the myth about persecution become our crutch. Let's instead develop a positive attitude, faith in ourselves, and take a tolerant initiative to assimilate with the straight society. I don't advocate doing everything. But we can do something. The elderly lady you take to church next Sunday or the someone you visit in a lonely hospital room next week won't remember or even care about your sexual orientation, just your love for mankind. "When I was a child, I spake as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child: But when I became a man, I put away childish things." (1 Cor. 13:11) We've come out of the closet—let's not stop in the ghetto, but get out into the world. Let's expand our horizon beyond a steady diet of white wine, track lights and quiche and do something constructive and compassionate for our fellow men while we're still on this earth.

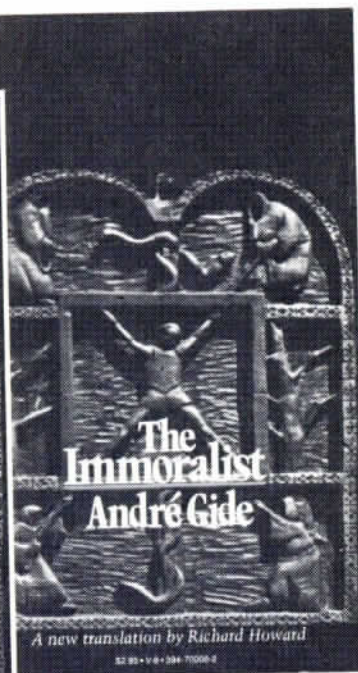
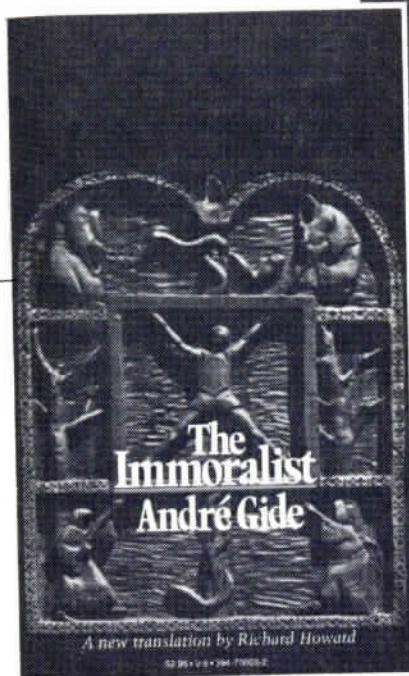

The Immoralist, by Andre Gide; 171 pp.; fiction; Random House, Inc., Order Dept., Westminster, Maryland 21157; paperback, \$2.95.

Andre Gide was a French novelist, essayist, critic and playwright, who was born in Paris in 1869, was educated there and died in 1951. During that time he wrote several other major works, as well as plays, essays, short stories and travelogues. In 1947, he won the Nobel Prize for Literature.

He usually drew from his own experiences in his novels and concerned himself with the search for new ethics

to replace what he considered prejudices. In *The Immoralist*, Gide's hero, Michel, harkens back to Harry Haller in Hermann Hesse's *Steppenwolf*. Both sneer at the hypocrisy and emptiness of conventionality. Though Hesse was from Germany and Gide from France, each held a common world-view.

Michel and his friends met one evening to hear Michel speak of how his life has become different after the events of the past months. One of his friends writes a letter to his brother telling about what Michel said. Michel's friend therefore sets up the novel and introduces him to the reader. After awhile, as Michel tells his story in first person

and in present tense, we may forget he is speaking to his friends. Only once does he remind us of this.

Michel spent most of his life in thoughtless existence. Only when his father was about to die did Michel realize what he was to inherit and the responsibility accorded to him. Indifferent to the event, Michel married Marceline to make his dying father happy. Only when Michel endured the prolonged danger from death with tuberculosis, helped by Marceline, did he begin to question the unquestioned proprieties and waste of his wealthy family.


As a historian, Michel could only see now the fixity of death in the ruins and archives he studied and researched. He began to study the life behind those ruins, the poets, dreamers and philosophers who knew something about life and reality that he felt he did not know. Those who populated "high society" and his fellow academics now bored him, for he saw their preoccupation with this "fixity of death," the superfluous, superficial aspect, empty of the vibrancy of life ever renewing itself.

Gide was expressing a philosophy of life, appreciated and sometimes endured. But his only true philosophy was the philosophy of *experience*. Life is not to be just read about, analyzed, record-

ed or researched, but lived for itself. This was the message of Hermann Hesse and the *Steppenwolf*, though more cynically put.

Though Michel is married and "devoted" to his Marceline, he pays special attention to the beautiful men and boys as they tour throughout Northern Africa in the Arab states and in Europe. Though Gide does not dare to record any "dalliances" Michel may have, *The Immoralist* was finished in 1901, he reveals his appreciation for the rough-hewn strength and beauty of men.

Because of Gide's experience with travelogues, he fills his novel with entrancing, descriptive passages of Europe, Tunis, his native France. Their travels are not much related to the plot, but they do signify the distance that Michel goes in his new awareness of life, "... And day by day there grew within me the confused sense of untapped wealth lying hidden, smothered by culture, propriety, rules."

The Immoralist is rich in ideas, in the savoring of the new discovery of life left unstrangled by convention. In 1909, Gide founded a monthly magazine which deeply influenced the literature and youth of France, called *La Nouvelle Revue Francaise*. It is clear the rejection of convention lay at the heart of Gide's appeal to the youth of France.

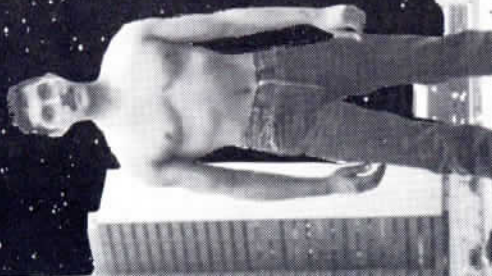

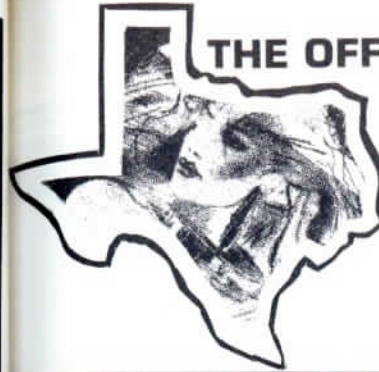

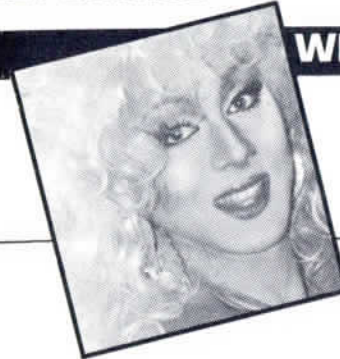

THE BALLAD OF GREGORIO CORTEZ

The true story of one man
who made a difference.

LONESTAR LEGEND

Seeing *The Ballad of Gregorio Cortez* is like seeing an old, long lost friend. Westerns, of course, have been out of fashion for almost a couple of decades, and I can't even say I missed them... This fine serious portrait of a turn of the century cowboy landscape, however, possesses the power to make you nostalgic.

The ballad in question is authentic and still being sung in Tex-Mex-Borderland. This is where the real Gregorio Cortez lived peacefully near the five-horse-town of Gonzales, Texas. An impromptu visit by the local sheriff ends this scene of serenity. The lawman bites the bullet and Cortez hits the road as a cunning fugitive. There are hordes of Texas rangers on the Mexican's track as they engage in a historic 11-day manhunt. The good guys chase the bandito during half the movie, but it is always evident that *Cortez* is deeper than the usual tube-size western fare, and at its core is more than the simple question of whether Cortez is indeed a coldblooded killer.

Director Robert M. Young (no kin to the Sanka Guy) does not shy away from exploring human behavior in the face of an apparently clear-cut ugly crime. There is outright prejudice and the unleashed emotionalism of an unruly mob which is determined to fulfill its wet dream of seeing the dreaded killing suspect hang high from a healthy tree.

For the most part, the shooting of *Cortez* took place at the locale of the real shooting. The same courthouse even served as setting for the film trial. Director Young (whose prison picture *Short Eyes* you may remember) presided over a labor of love. If you allow your eyes to graze over the brilliant cinematography (Ray Villalobos), you would never guess that this is a low-budget production. The leading actors certainly have megabuck quality (and this is supposed to be a compliment). Edward James Olmos as the Spanish-speaking title character faces the distinct challenge to get to an audience with predominantly American sets of ears with his eyes and through facial

expressions and gestures.

He does just that exquisitely. James Gammon as the tobacco chewing Sheriff Fly seems a person in danger of being overrun by the rapidly changing times, yet he has the backbone to stand up for the letters and principles of the law. Mr. Gammon is outstanding. Another fine performance comes from Barry Corbin (the general in *Wargames*) as the defense attorney. The score by Arthur Coburn and John Bertucci is a tad too synthesized for my taste but it works effectively. The generally captivating story is not without a few mildly tearjerking phases. As a good Texan, however, or as a soon to be naturalized import from Yankeeland, you should put on your shitkickers and ride over to see *Cortez*, provided it is playing near your home on the range.

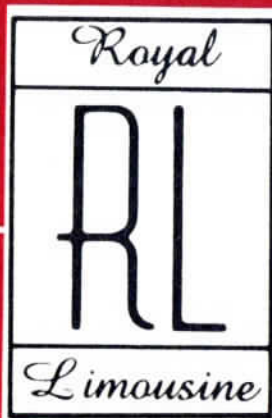

Never Say Never Again is the snappy adventure comedy one comes to expect from the 007 series. Sean Connery's well publicized James Bond return as the man with a woman in every port, nook and cranny was an unexpected pleasure. As I sat there praying, "Oh, dear God, please don't let his toupee blow off," I was delightfully surprised by the Swiss-timed wit, quick tempo action and lush photography.

The dilemma of James Bond is an old standard: Save the world. Two U.S. nuclear warheads have been stolen by an underworld group whose nefarious activities include detonating those little suckers unless the world coughs up about 25 billion smackers (a rather disturbing thought if you just paid for your aerobics class). Although it would seem Bond's mission is to find out whether this group wants their money in traveler's checks or money orders, 007 is sent off to find the bombs.

Our favorite sleep-around, 007 makes his way into several bedrooms before finding the blond mistress of the man who stole the bombs. At a swank soiree

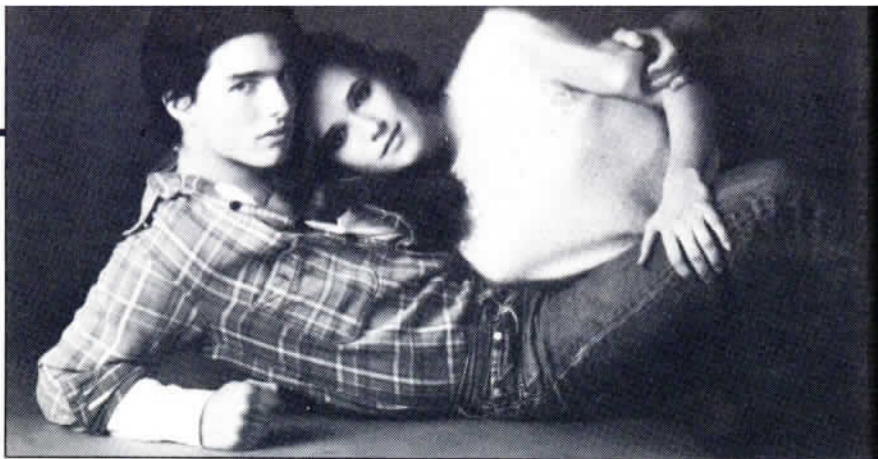

Having fun is what *Never Say Never Again* is about, and certainly worth the price of admission. Of course, I've always been a fool for a successful good guy.

IN MEMORIAM — After a mildly successful stage career, actress **Joan Hackett** made her film debut in 1966 in Sidney Lumet's *The Group*, and there-

after was one of America's most versatile and generally underrated film performers. Among her other films were *Will Penny* (1968), *The Rivals* (1972), *The Last of Sheila* (1973), and *Only When I Laugh* (1982), for which she received her only Oscar nomination. She also appeared in several better than average TV films, notably 1974's *Reflections of Murder*, which was based on the classic French film *Diabolique*. She died October 8 at age 49. . . . Needless to say, **Sir Ralph Richardson** was one of the most distinguished of international actors, with a career that took him from Shakespearean roles at London's Old Vic to both supporting and leading roles in a variety of films. Making his film debut in 1933's *The Ghoul* (which starred Boris Karloff), he later appeared in more prestigious films such as *The Lion Has Wings* (1939), *The Heiress* (1949), *Breaking the Sound Barrier* (1952) and *Long Day's Journey Into Night* (1962). More recently he appeared as a wizard in the 1981 film *Dragonslayer*. He died October 10 at age 80. . . . Actor **Pat O'Brien**, one of Hollywood's most familiar and beloved faces, died October 15 at age 83. Best remembered as star of 1940's *Knute Rockne—All American*, his career spanned the history of talkies. His last appearance was in 1981's *Ragtime*.

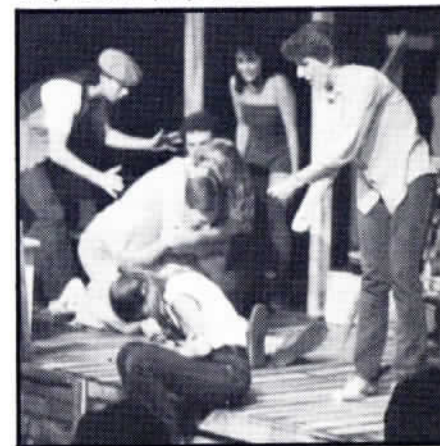
