

**DGPC SAYS VOTE
YES ON SIX**

DALLAS — On Monday, October 10, the Dallas Gay Political Caucus (DGPC), the political action committee of the DGA, voted to support passage of question six on the ball for the November 8 election.

Question six is an amendment to the Texas State Constitution to permit the garnishment of wages in cases of court-ordered child support. Garnishment would only be permitted after a parent had failed to make the payments voluntarily. The employer would receive \$5 per month to cover the cost of processing the deduction.

"Currently, the only recourse when a parent fails to pay court-ordered child support is imprisonment," DGPC explained. "This costs the state money and, while in prison, the parent is unable to earn money with which to make child support payments."

At present, Texas and North Carolina are the only states which do not permit garnishment of wages in cases of court-ordered child support. This has contributed to Texas' national reputation as a haven for parents evading child support payments.

The DGPC advised TWT NEWS/Dallas that it encouraged everyone to go to the polls and vote for passage of question six on November 8.

**WHEELER FOR
GAY DELEGATES**

HOUSTON — Anne Wheeler, a candidate for City Council Position 1 in this city, says she is continuing her support for gay delegates to the Texas Democratic Party Convention. "As a member of the State Democratic Executive Committee [SDEC], I have always held to the belief that all communities should have a voice in public policy decisions.

"As an SDEC member for the Montrose area, I will continue to support openly-gay delegates to the Democratic Party Convention," she reaffirmed.

Wheeler, who has continually advocated human rights and public input in police planning, is running a tough, uphill race against incumbent Jim Westmoreland.

She is, however, getting increased support from a broad base of interests. "When you compare the incumbent Westmoreland to the challenger Wheeler, we see no similarities," GPC president Larry Bagneris, Jr. told TWT NEWS/Houston.

In reference to Westmoreland's 40% absentee record from regular council meetings, Bagneris queried, "How can you represent all people when you don't even show up to vote at council meetings?"

Westmoreland, it has been learned, has missed many important votes, including ones concerning Police Chief Lee Brown and the new convention center—both of which GPC endorsed.

Westmoreland is remembered for having strongly rebuffed the gay community in the late 70s election by writing "fuck you" to the gay community and drawing a third finger extended upwards on a letter printed in TWT COMMENT. The letter was in response to a question posed about gay rights.

POSITION TWO AT LARGE

Steve Kirkland, campaign coordinator for Wheeler, said, "With the recent addition of the AFL-CIO endorsement, we can say that Wheeler's campaign has a truly broader base. We have not only labor behind Wheeler, but also GPC."

The AFL-CIO Wheeler endorsement is of extreme importance since the union just took an official position supporting the "civil rights of all persons without regard to sexual orientation" at its recent 15th Biennial Constitution Convention in Hollywood, Florida. Delegates overwhelmingly endorsed a resolution urging passage of gay rights legislation at the local, state and federal levels. AFL-CIO represents 14 million members, the Gay Rights National Lobby reported.

COUNSELING CENTER ELECTIONS

HOUSTON — Eric Liston, Phil Randolph and Jon Reck have been elected as the three new board members of the Montrose Counseling Center at the October 13 election.

New officers, also elected, were Marion Coleman, chair; Steve Umoff, vice-chair; Dawn Dancy, secretary; and Liston, treasurer.

Incorporated in 1979 as a non-profit agency, the center has a 15-member board, 13 staff members and six community volunteers who help to provide administrative support, it was explained to TWT NEWS/Houston.

The center's purpose continues to be "to provide mental health services to gay men and lesbians with the belief that their problems might stem from factors other than sexual orientation," it was said.

VAN HIGHTOWER FUNDRAISER

HOUSTON — In what was termed "a light turnout of about 150 people," Nikki van Hightower was honored in a campaign fundraiser last Saturday night, October 22. The affair, hosted by Rick

Kittrell and Don Elam, was held at the Sheraton-Houston Hotel.

Fred Hofheinz, treasurer of her campaign for at-large Position 4 on City Council, spoke first and then introduced Johnny Goyen, a councilmember for 24 years.

"Nikki can communicate with people. . . . most qualified and best versed to ever run for city council," he told the gathering before introducing Dr. van Hightower, who remarked, "We've got big problems in this city and we've got to pull together to solve them [and] utilize the great diversity in this city to make this happen."

Her supporters responded with enthusiastic applause, David Fields of TWT NEWS/Houston reported. Later in the evening, after some socializing, Anne Wheeler and her campaign manager, arrived.

VAN HIGHTOWER AND HALL DEBATE

HOUSTON — Of all the political races facing gay voters in the November 8 city election, none has caused more controversy than the at-large city council seat being contested by the two front runners, Anthony Hall and Nikki van Hightower.

On the night of October 18, at the Shamrock Hotel, the two candidates came face to face in a 40-minute debate moderated by Sue Davis of KTRH Radio before a group of 200 business people, most from Montrose. Safety, city legislation, city transit, parks and taxes made for the basics of the six questions posed to each.

On taxes, Hall said, "The city shouldn't increase taxes until there are more jobs and the economy improves. We'd be best to spend less." Hightower said she would "opt to cut city expenses, to economize and cut the fat, but wouldn't cut vital services such as safety and welfare."

Regarding the goals of MTA, Hightower felt the city should offer a better automobile system since Houston traf-

fic grew up with cars. "More emphasis should be put on streets," she explained.

Hall talked of "the need for a high density transportation system for the southwest section. That extra penny tax is not just to run buses and build a rail system," he said. "It should also go to improve and widen our streets."

When asked, "If elected, what high priority legislation would you strive for first?", the two candidates responded differently.

Hightower said she would seek city legislation to create a commission to study abuse and care of children. "It would be a long range preventative measure to prevent crime."

Hall's high priority is "a long range plan for mass transit. I want legislation to address the city's inability to move people and cars around on major thoroughfares. Houston has over 10,000 miles of streets which are deteriorating," he explained.

As to parks, Hall wants "massive development of safe green space." Ms. van Hightower said parks are a "critically important issue. Parks could be utilized for more after school activities and park beautification is important to city growth."

In conclusion, van Hightower ended the debate by saying, "I want to do more for my city—to keep it safe so we can enjoy it." Hall asked voters "to look at my ten-year record of responsible accomplishment in the public sector."

The debate, which in all actuality was more like a forum, allowed those gathered to observe each candidate's poise and enthusiasm. Clearly, the real debate, however, won't be settled until election night.

If anything about this heated council race is debatable, it's the outcome.

Ms. van Hightower's supporters maintain that her GPC endorsement will carry her to victory, and that the GPC bloc vote will not splinter apart on this race.

Hall's campaign, on the other hand, maintains that their candidate has a

broad and growing base of support in the gay community. They point to a mid-October, Dr. Richard Murray poll which showed their candidate ahead.

When TWT NEWS asked Murray if he had recently appeared on a radio talk show saying "the race is now too close to call," he responded, "I have not appeared on any radio talk show in more years than I care to remember, and I have not said the race is too close to call."

"The only ingredient in this race that has cropped up since the poll was taken is the amount of money the other candidates are spending—over \$200,000. This will cut into van Hightower's anglo vote," he explained.

The real poll, however, will not be taken until 7:00am-7:00pm on election day, November 8.

FIRE MARSHAL EXPLAINS FIRE CODES

HOUSTON — At the October 19 meeting of the GPC, president Larry Bagneris, Jr. introduced District Fire Chief Tommy Burns, Montrose area, who in turn introduced the guest speaker, Eddie Corral, Assistant Chief Fire Marshal of Houston. Corral had been invited to speak to the GPC after meetings between himself, Bagneris and several club owners involved in a series of apparent harassments against bars in the last several months. Corral told David Fields of TWT NEWS/Houston that he was invited to explain and clarify what policies the Houston Fire Department must operate under and stated that there is no policy of harassment or discrimination against gays.

He further explained that due to personnel shortages, including inspectors, it is very difficult to make a significant dent in the \$55 million in losses per year, of which \$25 million are arson-related. They must also follow-up on all calls received about fire code violations, and have no control over people who telephone HFD merely to "get back at" a particular bar.

"When bars accept more people than is allowed in the occupancy certificate, the HFD is required by law to vacate the bar," Corral said. "Occupancy is determined by the number of people compared to the number of exits, pre-established building codes and, more recently, by the number of toilets available in the building for 'sanitary' reasons."

GAY ALLIANCE CHANGES MEETINGS

FORT WORTH — The Tarrant County Gay Alliance (TCGA) has voted on an offer to unite with the Center for the Community on a combined agenda, president Frank Gordy told Buddy Jones of TWT NEWS/Fort Worth. All meetings will be held at 7:30pm at the Center, 2412 Lipscomb.

"We would like your input on an offer from the Center staff to have a Center/TCGA potluck supper and social on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:30pm," Billie Moon explained. Jim Henley advised to bring a variety of food.

September marked the third anniversary of TCGA, which was formed by the Rev. Jim Norwood, out of concern for the New Right. At the turn of the decade, when gay rights in larger cities was making great strides, this city's gay community slept.

Only during that hot summer of 1980 did Fort Worth finally realize that if they just did nothing, a growing force known as the "New Right" would make its presence known in the city by taking away even the most basic rights of gay people.

It was for these reasons that the TCGA was formed, and has successfully, henceforth, grown to be a vital election force of cohesiveness in Tarrant County.

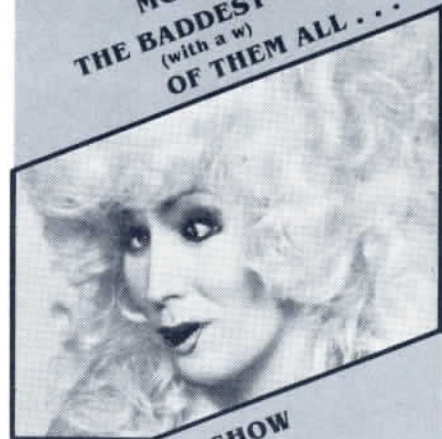

ceeds to benefit the Human Rights Campaign Fund (HRCF) and the National AIDS Federation Lobby Project, John Thomas, chair of the committee, told TWT NEWS/Dallas.

The 1982 dinner at the Fairmont Hotel is remembered for raising more than \$6,000 for HRCF. Patrons heard keynote speaker, Los Angeles mayor pro-tem Joel Wachs, and were entertained by a revue entitled "Our Time." The theme for this year's affair will be "Visions."

"Due to the impressive response after last year's dinner, several national speakers have expressed an interest in appearing at the 1983 dinner, and those persons have been contacted regarding their availability on November 19," Thomas said. "Once the committee receives acceptance by one of the invited speakers, an announcement will be made and ticket orders, which will be limited and sold on a first-come basis, will be accepted."

The Dallas Dinner Committee has been holding weekly planning meetings and will do so until the dinner in November.

All proceeds from the dinner will be used by HRCF to elect candidates determined to work to secure the civil rights of all persons, particularly gay men and women, and by the National AIDS Federation Lobby Project to urge the Congress to appropriate more federal funds to find a cure and determine a course of action regarding AIDS.

Terry Tebedo, Dallas coordinator for the project and a member of the national steering committee, said contributions will be used to hire a lobbyist to ensure that federal funding is appropriated for AIDS research and the treatment of patients, and to provide a network for all AIDS-related groups in the U.S., including maintaining a library of information.

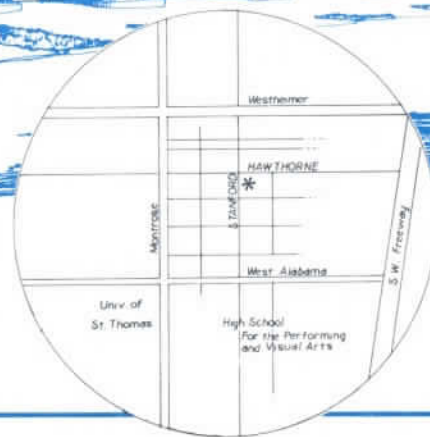

Fired . . . AIDS?

Dear TWT:

I would like to relate a recent happening that cost me my job and maybe my reputation. . . . Until last Tuesday (10/18), I was employed by Heritage Title Co. as Senior Acreage Abstractor and manager of Customer Service. Heritage Title is one of the newest and most prestigious and progressive title companies in Houston. . . . I was truly honored to work for them and took great pride in my work.

. . . I called in sick because of some problems I was having with an absessed tooth. Later that same morning, my supervisor called me at home to tell me that they were letting me go. That evening I went in to pick up my severance check, clean out my desk and find out why. He told me that it was in no way connected with my job performance, but instead, my lifestyle.

Thanks to the gossip spread heavily by the president's daughter who works there, there was, among other things, a genuine fear of contracting AIDS from me, and that no one wanted to touch anything I touched or came in contact with. Therefore, they were forced to restore a working atmosphere by eliminating the fear. Furthermore, according to the accusations, I flaunt my lifestyle, and that I was unfit to be working with the prestigious clientele. . . .

First of all, I don't have AIDS. . . . Second, I asked the few friends there who were supposedly the only ones who knew, including my supervisor, and they all agreed that I don't flaunt my lifestyle. . . . Finally, I already had a very good reputation with the customers I deal with directly, as well as the escrow officers I work closely with on matters for their customers.

Nevertheless, the edict came directly from the president of the company, who is known for his "redneck" morals, which left my supervisor totally helpless, other than to follow his instructions to terminate me immediately. . . . Because of my

experience and the glowing recommendation promised by my supervisor, I shouldn't have too much of a problem finding another job. . . .

I am appealing to the gay investors to avoid doing business with Heritage Title because of their discriminatory practices and irrational decisions. If a company is capable of making an irrational decision such as this, based on the moral standards of one person and the careless ignorance of a few, why should they be trusted to make a rational decision regarding your investment?

of publications that is contrary to common sense and hopefully the law. The question will be primarily, "What is a graphic depiction of homosexuality?"

My intent is to obtain an inflow of publication samplings from as many gay-based publications as possible to give the censors the opportunity to pass or deny. Those publications that are denied will be the basis for possible further litigation to clarify the wording of the new ruling, or to establish the simple fact that the denials are primarily a harassment of gay publications by the homophobic prison authorities. Those publications that are allowed will be used in that court presentation as part of the same argument.

Several years ago I did attempt to receive copies of *twt*, and those were rejected at that time; I would like to attempt the transmittal under the new rules.

Thus far I have received copies of *GCN* and the *BWMT Quarterly* with no more than stalling at the review level. The supposed 72-hour review limit has been stretched to as much as three weeks! The only denials have been of reprints from *Blueboy* copy, with the pictures removed, but the words

were called "Graphic depictions of illegal sex acts" and not permitted. That could prove to be legally wrong as the publications are permitted in the U.S. Mail, and the only law I know of in Texas on that concern (and the written representation would be shaky anyway) was 21.06 and that is dead.

I would appreciate a copy of *twt* sent in the normal mailing manner, and if possible an indication of when it is sent so that I may determine the stall time through the review process. I will respond to the passage or refusal....

*About two years ago, *twt* received instructions from the State Dept. of Penal Institutions that *twt* would no longer be allowed inside prison walls because recipients of a gay publication might be open to harassment and hazing by non-gay inmates.*

*Under separate mailing, *twt* will try one more time. Perhaps the rules have been relaxed. Hopefully, you will be able to subscribe once again to *twt*. Our lawyers are hopeful, too.*

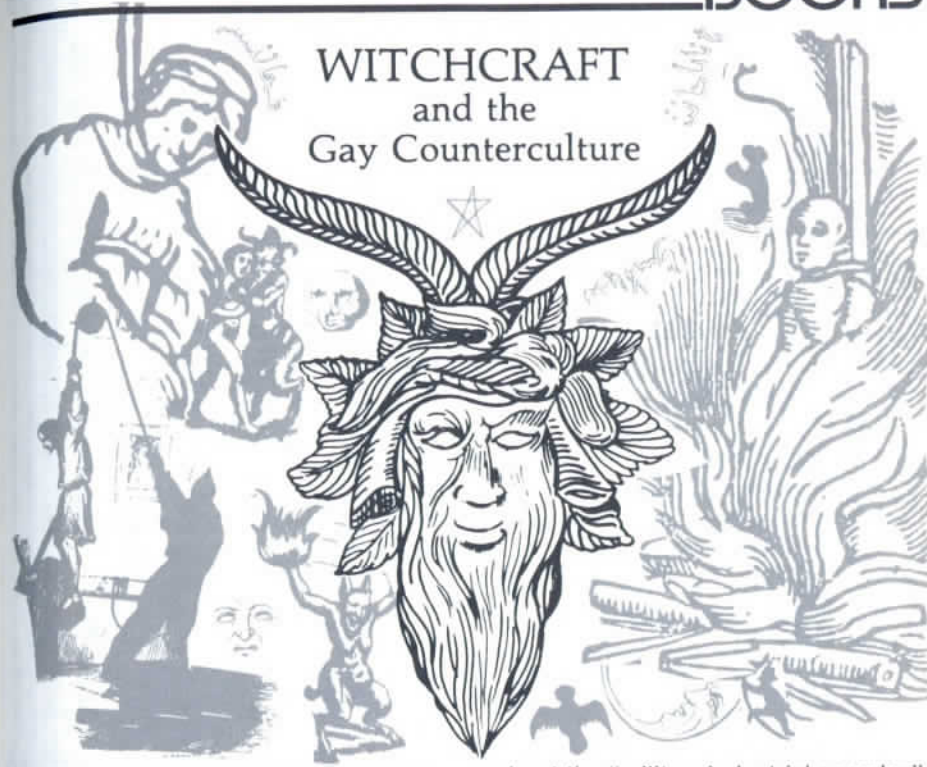

Witchcraft and the Gay Counterculture, by Arthur Evans; 180 pp.; appendix, bibliography, index; Fag Rag Books, Box 331, Kenmore Station, Boston, Massachusetts 02215; softcover, \$5.95.

All those who have been persecuted by religion for their personal religion or beliefs and practices would be interested in reading *Witchcraft and the Gay Counterculture* by Arthur Evans. His best and most fascinating contribution is tracing the roots of "pagan"-nature polytheistic religions and their destruction by organized Christian religion as it spread throughout the Roman Empire.

The most objectionable part of the book is the last, where Evans rails on

about the "military-industrial complex" and that the solution to the problems in America lay in socialism. I find this objectionable not because of his ideas, necessarily (this is a free country), but because these ideas appear at the end of an exploration of homosexuality in the pagan religions and in witchcraft.

True, organized religion and its missionaries have done some horrendous and indefensible things to those it has tried to "help to salvation," and Evans records that. But to turn around and say that this means we must embrace socialism as the solution is a betrayal to the reader who wanted a non-political history of gays and witchcraft.

The history Evans traces, barring the non-gay subjectivity that blindly ignored the "gay interpretation" and facts, is fascinating for its uncovering of the

true nature of "fairies," and what really happened to get Joan of Arc burned at the stake. She wore men's clothes and slept with women. Her friend and confidante was Gilles de Rais, well known for his sorcery and suspect for sodomy. Both were thought to be members of a lingering pre-Christian religion.

Evans' scope is vast. He covers much ground without going into boring detail. He tries to establish a "people-oriented context for Gay history . . . by exploring certain themes of sexuality and religion from prehistoric times, through the middle ages, and up to modern time."

Since pagan-nature religions emphasized fertility and sexuality as part of their worship, the Christian religion attempted to distance themselves from these religions by condemning all forms of sexuality that differs from that required for procreation. What is also very intriguing is the wide use of symbols from these pagan religions assimilated into the dominant Christian religion.

The "Three Mothers," or a mother goddess known throughout the European continent, was incorporated into the image of the Virgin Mary, Mother of Christ. The god Pan was transformed into the Devil of Christian religion. Pan, or horned creatures like him, were

painted black in most of the pictures and drawings of him, and so black became associated with evil and darkness. This probably was the basis of religious support for slavery of blacks in the South.

Evans shows us the dynamic dimension of religious evolution and man's change in thought about his place in the world and how he should act. Evans documents the "objectification" of the natural world, where man has cut himself off from communing with nature, being one with it. Geographically, Evans roams far and wide, from the berdaches (Indians who took the woman's role and were regarded as shamans) of America to the pagan rites in Europe and Africa.

The author has provided ample appendix material—a calendar of events in the history of heresy and witchcraft, five pages of bibliography and an index. Moreover, he provides a depth and context with the perspective that history gives us to understand what exists today and what has been lost in the process of man's religious and spiritual "progress."

Arthur Evans gives the reader a far greater understanding of the overwhelming momentum of historical persecution by religion of the free thinker, of the individual with his/her personal spirituality.

UNDER FIRE

SANDINISTA SERENADE

When you hear someone say "sandinista," do you find yourself responding "gesundheit"? Then you might be the kind of person who'd have serious difficulty locating Nicaragua. "Just drive to New Orleans and turn left," are the directions given by one of the stars of *Under Fire*. This is an action-packed thriller with a frighteningly real background—that of a classic banana republic whose ongoing growing pains erupt in a nasty clash between militia and guerrillas.

Wars are not what they used to be. In addition to the two usual parties, the good and the bad guys, there is now an ever-present third group which aims to play objective observer, namely the international press corps. One such veteran who has shot his high-speed camera in many a third world war is played by Nick Nolte. We see him in Chad as he clicks a cover photo for *Time* magazine while under fire. The next assignment is Nicaragua, where all the media frontliners assemble again, like vultures over a target, to file firsthand reports to their home offices. Nolte is joined by Gene Hackman, a newsmagazine editor who's considering a step up as network anchorman, and by Joanna Cassidy, a radio reporter who starts out as Hackman's lady friend and ends up in Nolte's arms. The three believe they are covering just another neat little war, but things slowly get ugly and dangerous.

The movie has a slow start, and it takes a while for the viewer to get involved. But we sort of go through the same traumatic change the press correspondents experience.

for dramatic effect, but the general story properly captures events from the 1979 Nicaraguan revolution.

The acting is impressive, starting with Mr. Nolte, who managed to surprise me the second time in a row (after *48 Hrs.*). He is fully convincing as the snapshot hunter who develops scruples after having seen "one too many bodies" and not only takes pictures, but eventually takes sides. Ms. Cassidy is ideally cast as the pretty and mature woman who made her job a career, yet has not stereotypically lost her feminine sensitivity. Mr. Hackman in his supporting role gives a strong performance, and so does Ed "John Glenn" Harris as an American mercenary. Mr. Harris has only a few scenes; however, his portrayal of a money- and blood-hungry soldier who doesn't care whose side he's on and doesn't know how to spell "mercy" is Oscar-worthy. Jean-Louis Trintignant who, with his thick French accent surely knows how to spell "*merci*," is excellent as a smart and dangerous double agent. Rene Enriquez is fine as Nicaragua's dictator, Prez Samoza.

English-born director Roger Spottiswoode, in his first major feature effort, has filmed on location in Mexico an often fascinating thriller. Mr. Spottiswoode has worked together with Sam Peckinpah, and he made sure that cinematographer John Alcott's action shots are captivating and, at the same time, avoid excessive gore.

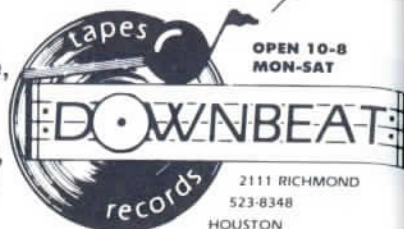

Rumble Fish

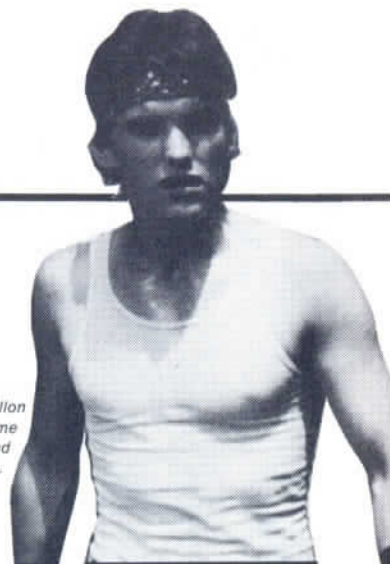
SENTIMENTAL SEAFOOD

Before I assumed the assignment to review *Rumble Fish*, I commissioned a major pollster to do an independent survey in order to find out how many Americans actually know what rumble fish are. Equal shares of respondents confessed they (a) had no clue, (b) didn't give a damn or (c) couldn't care less. Maybe Francis Ford Coppola should have considered that the obscure title of his latest picture might hurt its marketability. However, there are plenty of other rea-

sons for this fish story to develop a distinctly unpleasant odor. After he bombed with his recent *The Outsiders*, Mr. Coppola proved his genuine stubbornness by also basing this project on a schmaltzy novel by S.E. Hinton. In her youth-oriented books, which are as successful as they are sentimental, Ms. Hinton (whose sex had long been hidden

behind a pair of initials) seems fascinated by street fighting kiddie gangs. *Rumble* centers on an abdicated and disillusioned former king of the streets, the Motorcycle Boy (Mickey Rourke) and his adoring and immature, punkish kid brother (Matt Dillon).

The characters are not only incredibly phony, they manage to be undeniably boring as well. Hinton's dialogue is solidly dumb and in some cases so all-out asinine, it might drive you up the theater wall. Sample: The Motorcycle Boy: "Hey, hey, hey, hey, hey, why, hey, why?" Rusty-James: "Why what?" TMB: "Hey, hey, why?" R-J: "What? What?" TMB: "Why you fucked up?"

The latter expression adequately describes the film as a whole. The only somewhat intriguing aspect in this largely black and white picture is Mr. Coppola's flair for clouds and time-lapse sequences which soon become an obsession with him, and the gimmick gets old. Unless you're helplessly in love with heartthrob Matt Dillon and get sheer satisfaction out of seeing him in a t-shirt, be sure to skip *Rumble Fish*. In case you care: They are a type of tiny Siamese fighting fish which, if put together, try to annihilate each other. I'd have done better to find that out by reading my *National Geographic*.

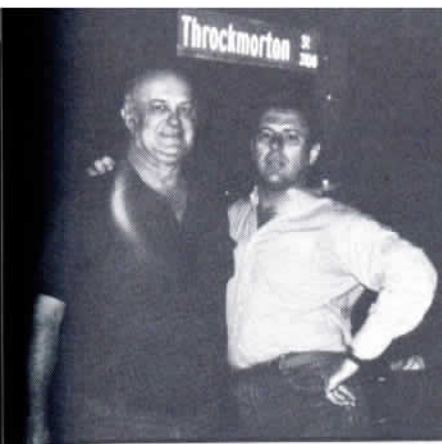
