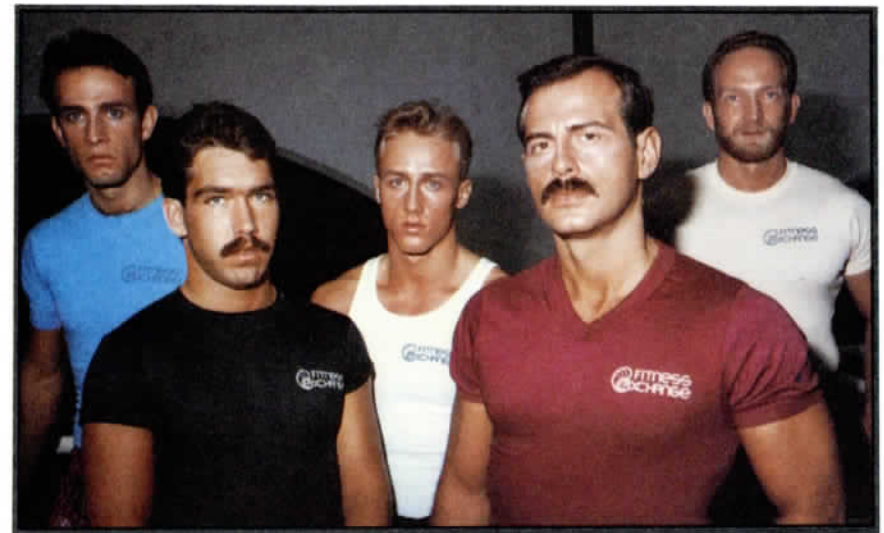

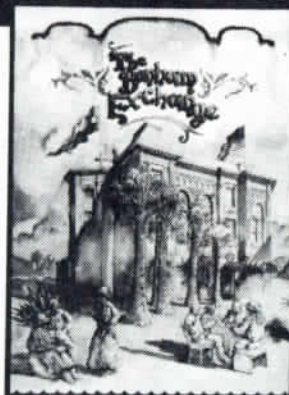

HALLOWEEN ROBBERY AT DALLAS STORE

DALLAS — This year, Halloween turned out to be more of a trick than a treat for David Hilzendager, owner of Oak Lawn Records, as his store was robbed at gunpoint around 1:30pm, Monday, October 31.

Two black men entered his store and shopped for records for approximately 15 minutes. After making their selections, one went behind the counter and pushed Hilzendager to the floor, roughing him up. The robbers then held him at gunpoint and locked him in the back bathroom, threatening to kill him. There were no other customers in the store at the time.

Hilzendager was released about 10 minutes later by a customer who entered the store. The assailants stole around \$175 in cash, two stereo speakers, a receiver, a turntable, plus the records which they had carefully selected. "They also stole my billfold," Hilzendager told Alan Gellman of TWT NEWS/Dallas.

The suspects were observed leaving the scene in a bright orange '76 or '77 Vega. No license number was recorded. Anyone with information regarding the robbery is requested to notify the robbery division of the Dallas Police Department, (214) 670-4413.

AIDS CONTAMINATES AUSTIN'S PLASMA

AUSTIN — Although no illnesses have been reported in the capitol city, health officials have recalled all medication containing plasma, which had been donated by an Austin man who died of AIDS at Brackenridge Hospital.

The man, Christopher Whitfield, 30, died on October 21. Whitfield had sold his plasma over 50 times during a ten-month period, November 1982 to September of this year, to Austin Blood

Components, who in turn supply plasma to Cutter Laboratories in Berkeley, California.

Ironically, Jeri Moore, manager of the Austin plasma center, accidentally read about Whitfield's death from AIDS in the *Austin American Statesman*. After checking her records, she realized that he had been a frequent donor. At that point, she alerted not only her own firm, but all Cutter Laboratories.

The pharmaceutical firm has consequently withdrawn from the market its hemophilia medication, which contained plasma from the Austin AIDS victim.

A spokesperson for the firm determined that the questionable medication has already been distributed to hospital pharmacies, but that a "substantial number of the sixteen questionable lots were still in production or stored in Cutter labs," TWT NEWS/Austin learned.

It was not immediately known if any of the medicinal products containing Whitfield's plasma had been used by any hemophiliacs. No illnesses had yet been traced back to the Austin source.

The two brand names, which have as a result been withdrawn from the market, are Koate and Konyne, known scientifically as Factors 8 and 9.

COUNSELING CENTER EXPANDS THREEFOLD

HOUSTON — The Montrose Counseling Center has expanded its staff with the hiring of three new, competent persons, TWT NEWS/Houston has learned.

Brian Guiot has been hired as a part-time therapist. Guiot has a master's degree from Rhode Island College and is a doctoral candidate at the University of Houston's Department of Educational Psychology. Guiot worked at the center between 1980 and 1982, and is returning in part from his commitment to gay mental health. Guiot will maintain his private practice as a therapist.

Another new staff member is Dan Fulmer, who has a master's degree in Psychology and Counseling from Lindenwood College and a doctor of Laws degree from Harvard University. Fulmer has extensive experience in providing services for the aged, as well as chemical dependencies.

Sheila Womack has also joined the staff of the center, bringing with her a diverse background. Womack has her doctorate in psychological anthropology from the University of Texas.

The Montrose Counseling Center, founded in 1979, is a non-profit, tax-exempt counseling center designed to serve the needs of the metropolitan gay and bisexual community. In addition to counseling services, the center offers an alcoholism program funded in part by the Texas Commission on Alcoholism, as well as AIDS counseling and AIDS support groups.

GAUNT HOSTS DR. ARTHUR IDE

DENTON — Dr. Arthur Ide, an instructor at Eastfield College, was the guest speaker last Sunday, November 6, at the monthly meeting of the Gay Academic Union of North Texas (GAUNT). Dr. Ide spoke on the provocative topic of "Male Collaboration Against the Female Sex," a theme on which he has written at length, vice-president and host, Jim Tanner, announced to TWT NEWS/Dallas.

Among Dr. Ide's latest books is *Women: A Synopsis*, which was published this year. Dr. Ide is the recipient of several doctorates at Carnegie-Mellon University in Pennsylvania. His studies of sociology, psychology, history and women's issues have served as a backdrop for his thesis.

FORT WORTH TO JOIN GAY RODEO

FORT WORTH — An organizational meeting was held October 13 at The Office Club for the purpose of organizing a local chapter of the Texas Gay Rodeo

Association (TGRA). Those present were enthusiastic in the response to Terry Clark, state president of TGRA.

A follow-up meeting was held November 2 at The Corral. New members were to be enrolled and officers elected, reported Buddy Jones of TWT NEWS/Fort Worth. Clark was scheduled to meet again with with the chapter on November 16.

ALAMO CITY MAN IS SHOT

SAN ANTONIO — Early last Monday morning, November 7, around 2:20am, Sam Saldonia and a friend were accosted by two strangers behind the Jewish Community Center, Ogden at Laurel, and were subsequently ordered to lie on the ground.

In the attempted robbery, Saldonia made a getaway run. While running, one of his assailants shot him in the upper right shoulder. By then, his friend had escaped, rescued Saldonia, and carried him to nearby Sunset Boulevard, where club management immediately called an ambulance.

Saldonia was taken to a local hospital where he was recuperating. "There were no shots fired from a passing motorist," Marc Comstock of Sunset Boulevard assured Tim Ramm of TWT NEWS/San Antonio.

RELATIONSHIP SEMINAR ALL DAY SATURDAY

DALLAS — An all-day relationship enrichment seminar will be held this Saturday, November 12, at MCCD, TWT NEWS/Dallas has learned from Andre Corley, director of the church's counseling division.

The seminar is designed for couples already in a relationship and who would like more information on how to enrich

their relationship, Corley explained. "The seminar is also intended for singles who would like to know more about getting involved with another in a relationship," he added.

GAY STUDENTS MEET IN DALLAS

DALLAS — The Texas Gay and Lesbian Student Organization Coalition (TGLSOC), at their Fall Trimestral Conference in this city on October 22, decided that one of their goals was to have a gay student organization in both Lubbock and San Antonio. Presently, those cities have no such organization. The TGLSOC Outreach committee, consisting of representatives from various parts of Texas, will spearhead this new proj-

ect. The committee asked that anyone interested in being part of a student organization in either city contact TGLSOC, Jay Cherin of TWT NEWS/Austin reported.

Representatives from 14 organizations in the state attended the conference. Also decided was to research the advantages of the organization seeking non-profit status. It is hoped that revenues brought in by this status, if decided positively, would build a scholarship fund for outstanding gay students in the state. Such a resolution was presented, but after receiving attacks from representatives of the Lambda Christian Fellowship of Brazos Valley, a College Station organization, it was removed from the floor.

Sometime soon, the coalition's Gay Publications Recommendation Committee will have available a bibliography of books relating to gays, from which a list of books will be chosen and sub-

mitted for purchase by the university libraries around the state. So far, the collection of such books remains limited.

Representatives did decide that the Spring Trimestral Conference would be held in Denton in April 1984. The Gay Student Group of Northwest Texas State University will sponsor the event.

OAK LAWN BAND GALA IN FORT WORTH


FORT WORTH — For the first time, all three metroplex Courts will combine their talents in a special fundraiser for the Oak Lawn Symphonic Band (OLSB) of Dallas. The event will be held at the Other Place, 200 N. Vacek in this city at 9:00pm next Wednesday, November 16.

The emcees are to be Jackie O, Empress VIII of San Fernando Valley and Jack Guthrie, Emperor IV of Fort Worth. Entertainment will be provided by Raina Lea, Empress V of Fort Worth; Sherry

Powers, Empress II of Dallas; and Brandy Roberts, Empress V of Dallas. Joining the festivities will be the various courts of each of these people.

Special guests will include Carlotta, Empress IV of Fort Worth; Ginger Taylor, Miss Gay Dallas; Dion Martell, Miss Gay Fort Worth; and the "PEP" band of OLSB.

OLSB has sent letters to 22 organizations in the Dallas/Fort Worth metroplex asking for their support and for additional new band members in their project to take the band to Los Angeles to represent the metroplex at the first annual Lesbian Gay Band Festival in 1984.

The first response to this request came from the Emperor and Empress of Fort Worth. The band is hoping that this will be the first of many community activities. "Come out for a great evening of entertainment," Jack Guthrie told TWT NEWS/Fort Worth. "It's time we pitched in to help our band."

I work from 7-3am and catch the 6:40am, #39 Love Field Bus. I live on Throckmorton, south of Cedar Springs but catch the bus on the north side. Since it is so early in the morning, I have an opportunity to see the Gay Crossroads area deserted, with the exception of the occasional street bums, and the cleanup crew hired to clean the bars and parking areas surrounding them.

It really upsets me to see the trash we leave in the streets. Broken bottles, cans, cigarette butts, newspapers — it is really disgusting. Walk or drive by the Sam Houston School when it is dark and the lights in the yard are on. Notice the reflection from all the broken glass on the section that is paved. Children play on this every day! On the southeast corner of Cedar Springs and Throckmorton, there are so many cigarette butts in the gutter the water can't drain properly when it rains.

I don't understand how we can say we are proud to live and work in the Oak Lawn area, when we can't even dispose of trash properly. You would swear the bar patrons didn't know, or were never taught, that trash belongs in the trash can, not on the ground.

Is it that we don't care? Or can we not control our drinking enough to realize we are throwing the trash on the ground, instead of in a trash can? There are large trash cans clearly visible to dispose of the trash properly, although they are usually full. I have lived in Dallas for a year and a half, and still have failed to see the pride and unity the gay population so often speaks of.

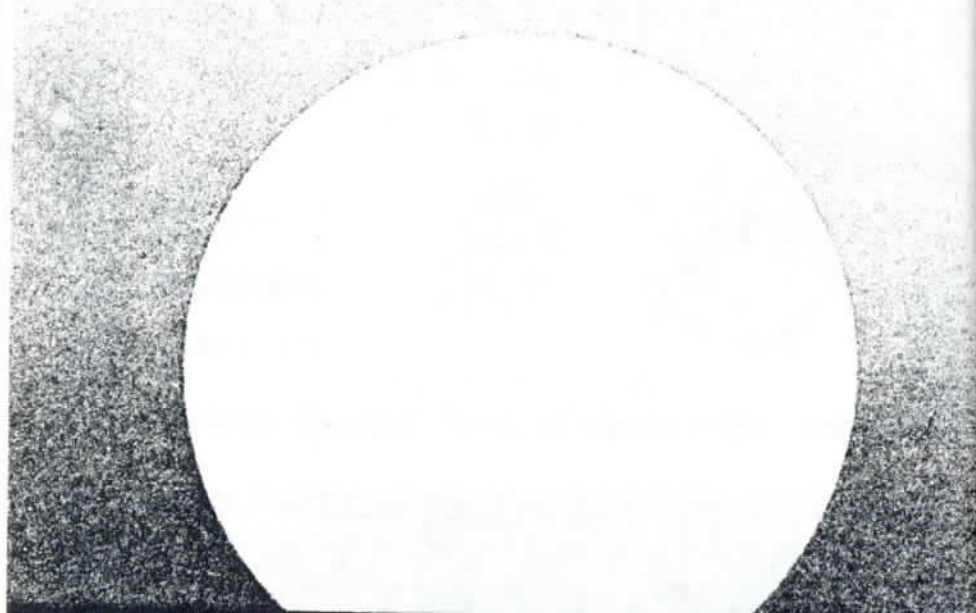

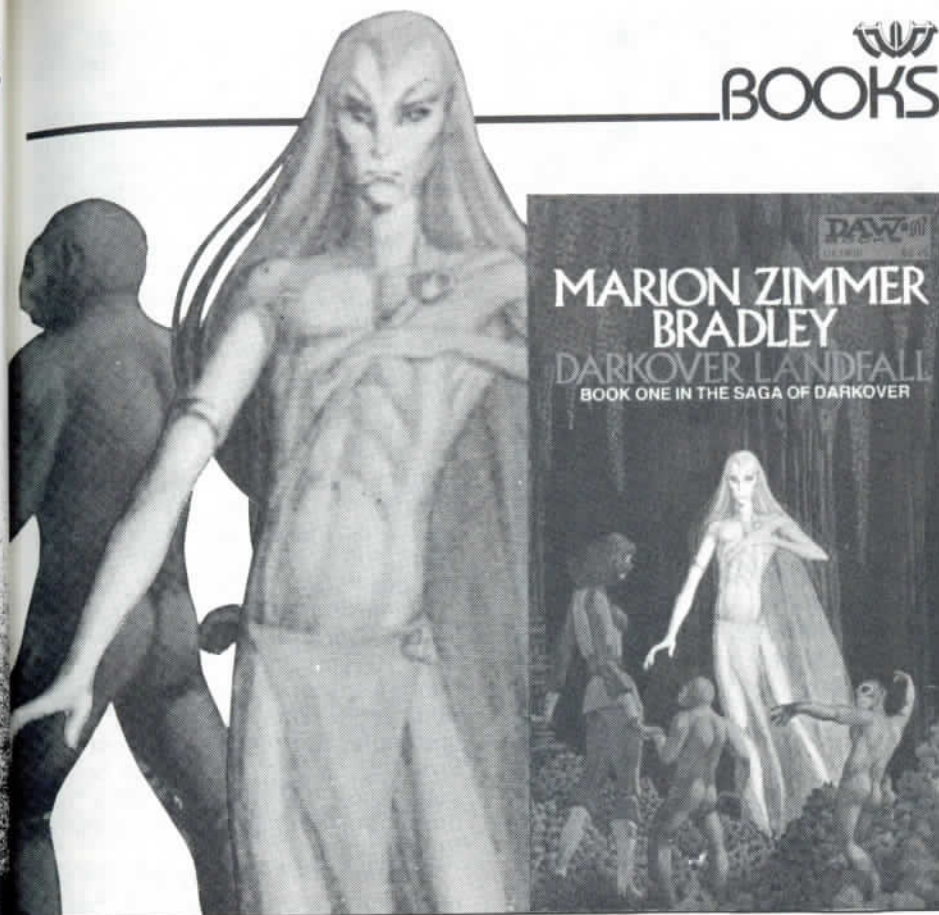

Darkover Landfall, by Marion Zimmer Bradley; 160 pp.; science-fiction; Daw Books, Inc., 1633 Broadway, New York, NY 10019; paperback, \$2.25.

The role of the saga has a long and respected history in American literature. It is a form in which a series of stories, not necessarily in strict sequential order, are based on the lives of a stable of characters and with a unique, fully developed culture all its own. In science-fiction, another such example would be the *Dune* series by Frank Herbert.

Marion Zimmer Bradley has been more prolific with her series of *Darkover*

novels, more than ten now. As in all books of this type, each novel can stand on its own, revealing at the beginning only the necessary information that links it to the others. Her first in this series, *Darkover Landfall*, finds a wayward starship stranded on an apparently peaceful, beautiful and uncharted planet on their way to colonize another planet.

This is the first contact those of Earth have with the planet (and its people), later to be called *Darkover*. The atmosphere is breathable, the water drinkable. But other elements of flora and fauna are not so compatible. Elements exist which the colonists have no defense against. As a colony geologist,

Rafael MacAran narrates the tale, providing his inner thoughts and observations of the unfolding drama.

Science-fiction has a long and not-so-respected history of male chauvinism in the writer, and the dashing male hero, who saves the helpless and endangered heroine. Fortunately, since the sixties, that has changed a great deal. No longer is the female regularly exploited in fantasies where she is the object of adolescent lust, one-dimensional and serving only as a sexual interest.

Women have been more active and successful, such as Ursula K. Le Guin with her *Left Hand of Darkness*, infusing feminist ideas and ideals into the science-fiction field. Gays and lesbians have been represented as real, positive and multi-dimensional persons in recent years, and a philosophy of acceptance has been stated in *Darkover Landfall*.

Bradley's male character writes, "... That forever after, any time I saw those men, I'd remember the time when our minds were completely open to one another and we knew each others' minds and bodies and hearts in the most total love and sharing any human beings could know." The novel is not a "gay novel," but the characters are sensitive to the subject.

Bradley writes the story well, the narrative flows and the plot is not heavy-

handed. Her stories are not highly technical, do not use gimmicks to dazzle the reader or terminology that confuses them. The basic components of science-fiction are there though, the technology of the starship, the computers, the dangerous creatures, the inner logic of the world Bradley creates.

What she chooses to emphasize is the human interest and drama, the interaction among characters, the evolution of thought and feeling, and new awareness of a changed reality on Darkover. The planet has the ability to "open" latent physical powers in the humans who stumble upon the planet. The madness that precedes it is the clearest threat to their survival there.

Though other Darkover books stand alone, this is the one which begins the series and introduced the planet Darkover. In the evolution of the story over several books, a strong feminist code of independence from men is developed, reflecting a major step in equality and legitimacy of women in a field traditionally chauvinistic against them.

Science-fiction has long had a reputation of advancing new ideas, often hidden in analogy and alien symbology. It is only fitting that the author's hopes for a better world would, and could, be stated here, in a non-threatening manner and form.

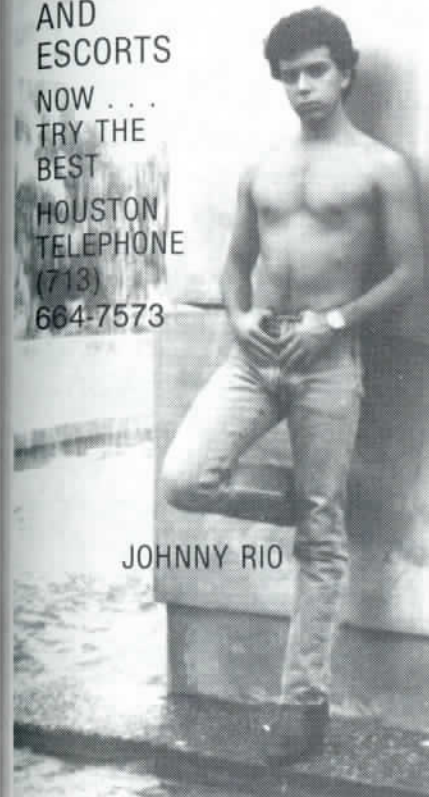

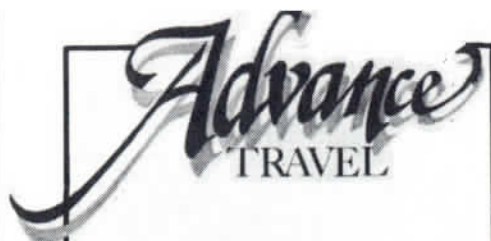

TESTAMENT

BIG BANG THEORY

The threat is real, damn real. In a world full of Afghan, Lebanese and Grenadian subplots, an ultimate grand scale fireworks display featuring mushroom clouds of all colorations is no longer unthinkable. Who cares in the end where the initial button-pusher sits, whether he's behind that neatly ironed curtain or way out West, in the camp of the good guys.

Testament, originally conceived for Public Television, never dwells on why or how the atomic apocalypse comes about. The story concentrates on a typical nuclear family—pardon the pun—living happily in a little California town. Mom, dad and three children are portrayed as if they were part of the antique

Father Knows Best. The scenario no longer fits sterilized sitcom requirements when all of a sudden the daytime trivia on the family's TV is interrupted by the announcement that a nuclear blast has occurred. And no, this is not a dramatization; this is real. Soon after this discomfiting bulletin, the tube loses its will to live. Then there is this second-long radiation flash.

What this striking array of lights, accompanied by powdered fallout means, is anybody's guess. Ground Zero is many miles away and does away with San Francisco, an incident which in one big bang, proves all the earthquake theorists wrong. Other centers of gruesome destruction appear to be sys-



challenged when they must come to terms with an unthinkable crisis in Paramount Pictures' *Testament*.

tematically scattered across the nation. The townspeople behave astonishingly calm and civil in the face of ongoing inconveniences such as no power, no water, no communication from the outside, not enough canned food. Far more unnerving is the fact that some people get sick and sicker over the weeks. The funeral business could well be the most lucrative in town, but the cemetery fast runs out of vacant lots, and besides, money isn't what it used to be. Priorities change quickly after you've been nuked.

That is one of the lessons of *Testament*, a feature-film first by director Lynne Littman, whose talents were behind a number of award-winning PBS documentaries. *Testament* records the

aftermath of a nuclear nightmare come true with distressing images yet never graphically detailed. The gloomy no-way-out situation is described as seen through a mother's eyes.

Jane Alexander gives an engaging performance as the resolute woman of the house who has to take over after the father (William Devane) doesn't return from an ill-timed biz trip to Frisco. Ross Harris, Roxana Zal and Lukas Haas are okay as the sketchily portrayed kids.

Testament is not without flaws. The message it sets out to address could have been driven home more powerfully and with less predictability. The movie does have occasional shock effects that will send shivers down your spine. *Testament* is ultimately depressing, an aspect it has in common with the concept of atomic warfare.

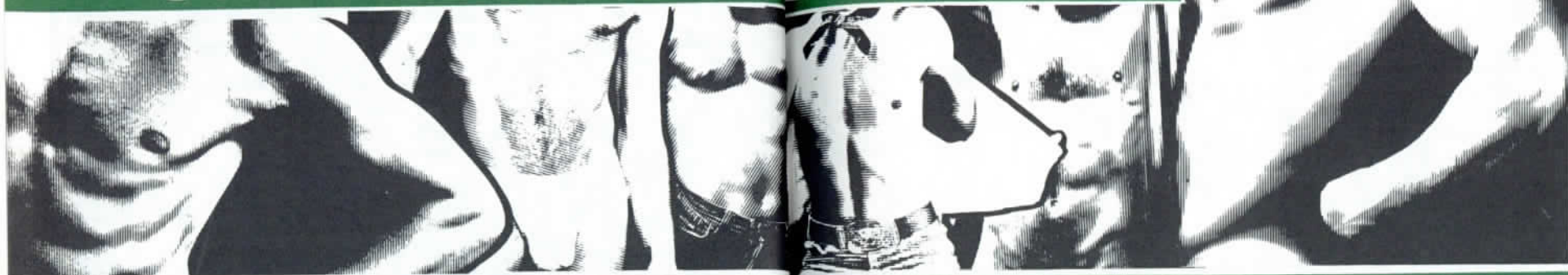

RETURN ENGAGEMENT — Since the movie industry isn't exactly bombarding us with great pictures these days, I'm really delighted that there is a new trend, however small, toward re-releasing classic and overlooked films of the past. In the past year or so, some cities have seen reissues of the 1954 **Judy Garland** version of *A Star is Born* and **Luchino Visconti's** 1963 film *The Leopard*, both of which were restored to their original uncut versions; there have also been revivals of **George Steven's** *Giant* (1956) and **Fred Zinnemann's** *Oklahoma* (1955). Now it's time to welcome back **Alfred Hitchcock's** *Rear Window*, a 1954 master suspense starring **James Stewart**, **Grace Kelly**, and that queen of character actresses **Thelma Ritter**. Stewart plays a photographer who, while confined to a wheelchair, amuses himself by spying on his neighbors. Result: he sees evidence of a grisly murder. Hitchcock once said: "If you do not experience delicious terror when you see *Rear Window*, then pinch yourself—you are most probably dead."

TSK TSK — It's no argument that **Dionne Warwick** possesses one of the

greatest pop voices of all time, but now that her reputation for possessing a sou temperament is catching up with her musical reputation, her theme song probably ought to be "Don't Rake Me Over." During her long career, Dionne has often been quite vocal about material which she believed to be either wrong for her or not up to her standards. For instance, during her Scepter Records era she was reluctant to record "Do You Know the Way to San Jose," the **Baruch and David** tune which became a top ten smash and earned her a Grammy. More recently, she made no bones about disliking "Heartbreaker," the hit given to her by the **Bee Gees**, and she even had the audacity to express her disapproval to concert audiences. Primarily, Dionne also had to be coaxed by producer **Luther Vandross** into recording some of the material on her new album *How Many Times Can We Say Goodbye*, a set which has already provided her with another hit. As if all of this weren't enough, she recently managed to offend most of the 4,000 or so fans who attended her concert in Charlotte, North Carolina. After making a 45-minute-late

entrance, she immediately pitched a hissy fit over the presence of a candy vendor who was working the front rows, and spectators complained that she made unflattering remarks about the city of Charlotte. A local radio personality later commented on the air: "If she ever returns to Charlotte, it will be too soon." No wonder Dionne has gray hair these days.


MAKING TRACKS — Oh Lord, does anybody remember **Helen** ("If I have to, I can do anything") **Reddy**? Kidding aside, Miz Reddy always had an interesting vocal style, and she has even on occasion been able to turn up with some fairly original material (which Miz Ronstadt has almost never been able to do—have you heard that **Nelson Riddle** album of hers?). Anyway, Helen Reddy is back. Her latest single is "Little Boys," a **Henry Mancini** tune from the upcoming **Burt Reynolds** film *The Man Who Loved Women*. . . . **Billy Joel** fans will be ecstatic to learn that his extremely rare early '70s album *Cold Spring Harbor* is being reissued on Columbia Records. . . . The soundtrack for the **John Travolta/Olivia Newton-John** film, *Two of a Kind*, features songs by **Chicago**, **Journey**, **Boz Scaggs**, **Patti Austen** and **Neutron Bomb** herself, who sings "Twist of Fate." . . . I never would have believed this if I hadn't heard it with my own eyes, but **Emmylou Harris** sings **Donna Summer's** "On the Radio," and also "Diamonds Are a Girl's Best Friend" on her latest album. —
