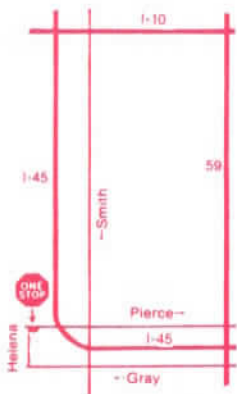

GAY STUDENTS ON UT-AUSTIN RADIO

AUSTIN — The University of Texas radio station, KUT-FM (90 FM), will present a profile on gay UT students and gay life in the Capitol City this Sunday, November 20 at 7:00pm. The segment will air on the program *UT Week in Review*, a weekly current affairs program, Jay Cherin of TWT NEWS/Austin learned.

Correspondent Marty Delfin will focus his report on the typical environment which gay students encounter on campus. Interviews with leaders of the school's Gay Student Association (GSA) and Texas Gay and Lesbian Student Organization Coalition (TGLSOC) will be aired in addition to comments from various students and faculty members.

After receiving negative responses from the Department of Broadcast Journalism for his recent article on transsexuals and transgenderists in Austin, Delfin told TWT NEWS/Austin that he expected a similar response to his radio program this Sunday.

However, to date, the department had shown no negative opinion.

OLDER GAYS FORM NEW GROUP

HOUSTON — This city's oldest gay rights organization, Interact, is now Houston's only organization for older gays. Effective September 25, Interact dissolved as a totally educational organization and was replaced with an agency dedicated to providing social, educational and support services for gays over the age of 40. The initial meeting of the agency took place on Wednesday, October 26, TWT NEWS/Houston learned.

"We see the group providing activities such as rap sessions, group trips, dances and dinners. We also hope to

have support services such as those required by individuals who have lost a spouse to death or other reasons," said the spokesperson.

Although the focus of the organization will be on gays over 40, individuals under that age who have concerns for older gays are also welcome, it was explained. For more information, call (713) 529-7014.

\$1,000 OF AIDS ACTION FOR DALLAS

DALLAS — A contribution of \$1,000 has been made to the Dallas AIDS Action Project by a group of business and professional people who raised the funds at their annual Texas-OU Carnival.

Some 500 people attended the annual event. Those attending were asked to fill out name and address cards in order that they might receive invitations to next year's function, Alan Gellman of TWT NEWS/Dallas learned.

Funds donated from this year's function have been earmarked to be used for AIDS research in the Dallas area. Several scientists have been notified of the available funds, a spokesperson explained.

ALAMO CITY HEALTH FORUM

SAN ANTONIO — The first in a series of community forums on health issues of special interest to gay people will be presented this Sunday, November 20. The event, sponsored by the Health Committee of the San Antonio Gay Alliance (SAGA) in cooperation with Merck, Sharpe and Dohm Pharmaceutical Company, will begin at 3:00pm at the San Antonio Marriott Hotel on the Riverwalk, Jim Halloran stated.

While topics in the series will be of special interest to gay men and women, organizers stress that the event is open

and relevant to the public, regardless of sexual orientation, Tim Ramm of TWT NEWS/San Antonio learned.

At this Sunday's initial forum, infectious disease specialist Frederick J. Buckwold, M.D. will speak. Buckwold's primary topic will be hepatitis B and the vaccine recently developed with the cooperation of the entire gay community of the U.S. to prevent this disease.

Those attending the forum will help determine topics for future forums by identifying health issues of greatest concern to them, John Chambers said.

ANNUAL DALLAS BLACK-TIE DINNER

DALLAS — John Thomas, chair of the Dallas Dinner Committee, has informed TWT NEWS/Dallas of the members of the committee's advisory board who will serve for the next year and who will be honored at the black-tie dinner, the theme of which is "Visions," at the Fairmont Hotel on Saturday, November 19.

Virginia Apuzzo, executive director of the National Gay Task Force and Congressmember Bill Green (R-NY) will share the speaker's platform at the fundraiser.

The Dallas Dinner Committee's annual \$150 per person event will benefit the Human Rights Campaign Fund (HRCF) and the National AIDS Federation Lobby Project, according to Thomas.

GPC WINS ALL BUT TWO RACES

HOUSTON — In the November 8 city election, all city council candidates endorsed by this city's GPC easily won their respective races except two. Only Anne Wheeler in a race for the At-Large Position 1, and Nikki van Hightower in a race for At-Large Position 4 were not victorious. Van Hightower, however, will be in a runoff against Anthony Hall on November 29.

"The gay community can be proud of itself for the tremendous election turnout," GPC president Larry Bagneris, Jr. exclaimed to TWT NEWS/Houston. "But, we have to do it again, and better, for the November 29 runoff election."

Bagneris explained that "we need the three V's: volunteers, votes and victory!"

At the top of the GPC winner's list was Mayor Kathy Whitmire, who won reelection by a city-wide landslide of 64%. In Montrose, Whitmire ran even stronger where the gay vote pushed her slice to 83%. In the Heights, Whitmire ran with a 60% victory. In Memorial, she gleaned 57%. Clearly, Whitmire ran strongest in gay areas like Montrose.

George Greanias, who just two years ago in his bid for a Montrose-District C council seat and narrowly winning that seat by only 2%, coasted to an 87% win in this year's reelection. Eleanor Tinsley stampeded to an 82% victory for her At-Large Position 2 seat. In the At-Large Position 5 election, Judson Robinson, Jr. won by 66%. Jim Greenwood took 76% of the vote for At-Large Position 3; Ernest McGowen, Sr. rallied with 87% in District B; Dale Gorczynski eased to victory with 73% in District H; and Rodney Ellis won with 52% in District D.

In the City Controller's race, Lance Lalor, although not officially endorsed

by the GPC but still well-liked by most gay voters, walked away with 70% of the vote.

The GPC-endorsed Convention Center, Proposition A, was approved by 58% of the city. However, in Montrose, the issue ran strongest, with 77% voting favorably. In the Heights, 62% voted yes and in Memorial, 54% voted yes. The GPC endorsement gave the ballot issue its widest victory in Montrose.

Lee Harrington, past president of GPC and orchestrator for "a gay vote for the Convention Center," said that Montrose delivered the highest vote percentage of any area for Proposition A. "It's estimated that some 40,000 to 45,000 gay voters supported the proposal of a convention center," Harrington added.

VARIABLES IN THE GAY BLOC VOTE

HOUSTON — Did the GPC bloc vote hold tight and secure throughout the ticket in the recent election? It appears that, for the most part, it did. However, voting inconsistencies became evident as gay voters got further down the ballot, TWT NEWS/Houston analyzed.

To cite a key GPC precinct such as No. 34—Felix's Restaurant at Westheimer and Grant, where 1,079 votes were cast—the gay vote begins to diminish and splinter as one goes down the ticket. At the top of the ballot, Whitmire racks up a healthy 86%, while Lalor drops to 68%, van Hightower slipping to 65% and Wheeler taking only 63% of the vote.

Such variable voting patterns of drop-off percentages indicate to TWT NEWS/Houston that about 20% of the gay voters did not vote a straight GPC ticket. Statistics show that in the November 8 election, about 20% of the gay voters who voted for Mayor Whitmire didn't vote for all the other GPC-endorsed candidates further down the ballot. Of course, Precinct 34 is composed of 70% gay voters—not 100%.

Although all GPC-endorsed candidates won in their "home-turf" Montrose

precincts, there were still about 20% "individual thinkers" among the gay electorate.

VAN HIGHTOWER AND HALL IN RUNOFF

HOUSTON — As expected, two pro-gay candidates, Nikki van Hightower and Anthony Hall, will be in a runoff election on Tuesday, November 29 for the At-Large Position 4 city council seat. The runoff was anticipated by both candidates, and both were prepared for three more weeks of heated, emotional electioneering as they both campaign fiercely for the gay vote.

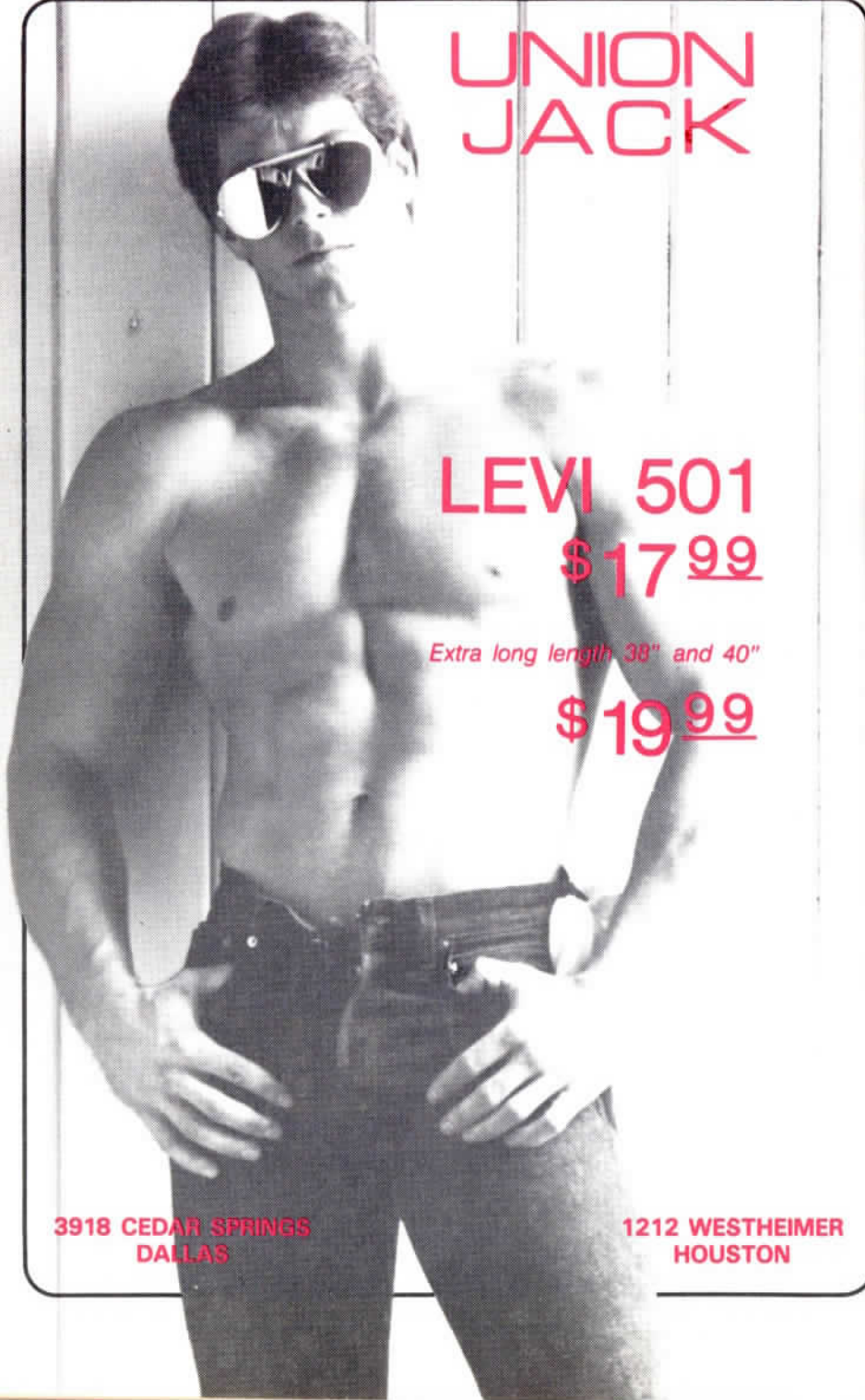
In the November 8 election, van Hightower got only 31% of the city-wide vote to Hall's 37%. Hall, TWT NEWS/Houston learned, ran about 17% stronger across the city than he did in Montrose.

However, in Montrose, van Hightower ran stronger than Hall. She also ran twice as strong in Montrose than in the city-wide vote. Montrose cast 67% for van Hightower to 19% for Hall. Remaining candidates—there were six others—got 14%. Hall ran stronger in the Heights than Montrose, where he got 21½% to van Hightower's 44%. As expected, Hall ran best in black districts and van Hightower ran best in affluent white, low-income white and gay districts.

In analyzing the gay vote, it becomes apparent that Hall cut into the GPC bloc vote by about 19%. Van Hightower supporters don't find this a serious inroad. Hall supporters feel, on the other hand, that the inroad will be deeper in the runoff.

The raw data from several key GPC/gay precincts shows about a 20% decline in bloc voting, from the top of the ballot to the bottom.

For example, in Precinct 39, Martell Auditorium at the Greek Orthodox Church on Yoakum, Whitmire's slice of the vote was a whopping 82%, Lalor's was 65%, van Hightower's dropped to 58%, Wheeler's slipped to 54%, while Hall's was 18%.

To cite another example, in Precinct 36, van Hightower took 27%, Hall 13%, but the other six candidates amounted to 48%. This big, undecided vote is critical as to which way it will swing.

In most gay precincts, Wheeler did not run as strong as van Hightower. In Precinct 123, west of Sears on Main, Wheeler took 63%, while van Hightower raked up 68% to Hall's 18%. In Precinct 38, Wilson Elementary School, van Hightower got 574 votes to 177 for Hall.

Both sides predict victory in the run-off. Hall supporters cite Marylu Rumfolo's last-minute endorsement of Hall and feel her 6.6% will swing into the Hall column. Van Hightower's supporters cite last Monday's HPPU endorsement and feel they will pick up some of Robinson's 11% white vote.

Clearly, it could go either way. One thing remains certain: It will be a close race, "down to the wire."

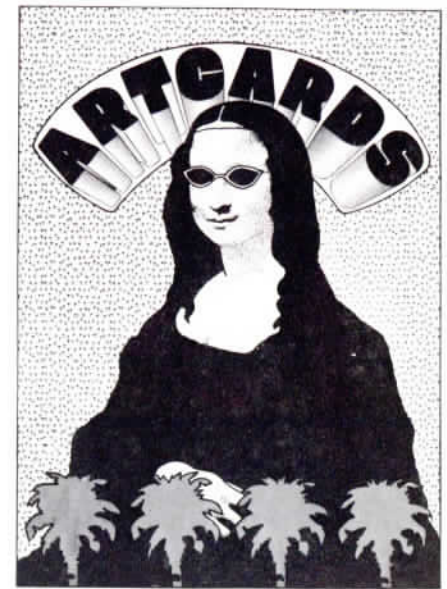
GAY CATHOLICS ON SPEAKING TOUR

SAN ANTONIO — New Ways Ministry, a national Catholic gay ministry group, will sponsor and conduct a tour of one-day workshops on "Homosexuality and Family Ministry" in six cities in Texas and Louisiana during November and December. The first workshop is scheduled for this city after Thanksgiving.

Sr. Jeannine Gramick, SSND and Fr. Robert Nugent, SDS, a nun and priest who have been engaged in ministry with gays since 1971, will conduct the workshops. Both workshop leaders have been assigned this ministry by their religious congregations, and both have lectured and written extensively on the topic.

Fr. Nugent's latest book, *A Challenge to Love: Gay and Lesbian Catholics in the Church* and Sr. Gramick's new book, *Homosexuality and the Catholic Church* are now available, spokesperson Blyth Batten told TWT NEWS/San Antonio.

The workshops will explore the sociological and pastoral dimensions of

Gays and Witchcraft

Dear TWT:

In the recent review of Arthur Evans' "Witchcraft and the Gay Counterculture," [TWT, Vol. 9, No. 32] I disagreed with David Fields' finding "objectionable" the ideas of the author and that they were in such a book. Mr. Fields felt that the analytical content of the book was a "betrayal to the reader who wanted a non-political history of gays and witchcraft," and that seems to miss the whole point of this work.

I believe this book to be an important and serious contribution to gay liberation precisely because of its analysis of political repression which has strangled gay sexuality and spirituality over the ages. Arthur Evans, a founding participant in New York's Gay Liberation Front, has written this description of a truly gay-affirming, spiritually and sexually integrated world prior to and during the imposition of our modern system of feudalistic, Christian and Roman values of elitism, hierarchy, self-denial, and obedience to patriarchal family and state. That history and politics of man's alienation of self, repression of female nature by a conquering mentality and cruelty has brought us to our disharmony with our being and with our earth.

That analysis is the heart and meaning of the book, not a contrived state-oriented socialism, but working creatively to seek gay liberation through an egalitarian process that is seeking social justice, ecological sanity, and spiritual meaning of respect for life and in harmony with the earth.

This book is impressive for what it says about us, about gays' historical role in spirituality, and that gay liberation is what we need to seek, not an empty life of materialistic, uninvolved, privileged, elite urban gays convenient to the straight world and its oppressive values.

Stephen Airey Messer Rondo

Messer Rondo, by Stephen Airey; 159 pp.; fiction; Gay Men's Press, P.O. Box 247, London N15 6RW, England; softcover, \$6.50.

Other people's lives—their lessons are often our own. Why read this fiction, *Messer Rondo* and others? Because fiction is based on or imitates life? Because we learn lessons otherwise unattainable due to immutably different circumstances? Here in *Messer Rondo & Other Stories by Gay Men* lies an opportunity to explore some of these questions in the short stories found within.

Messer Rondo is a novella written by Stephen Airey, and is the longest of the

works here. There are twelve other shorter works, including one by David Rees entitled *Aiming High*. His novel, *The Estuary*, was reviewed here several weeks ago. The publishers of this collection, the Gay Men's Press, is centered in London, England; the authors are all English as well.

For those familiar with London, the tales will be a pleasant revisit. For those not familiar, you will learn just how different, and how much the same, gay men are in America and England. The authors have a statement to make, an emotion to provoke in the reader, an observation about their lives or life in general. Their quality of writing is adequate and remarkably consistent from

The title work is the last of the collection and starts out like something from *The Lord of the Flies* by William Golding. In that novel, the teachings of a civilized society have been "injected" (at a boy's school) but did not "take" in the boys stranded on the island. The thin veneer of civilization was stripped away to reveal the animal barbarity beneath.

The dissonance dissolves in *Messer Rondo* soon after, though, as we discover two school boys who have found a book touting gay civil rights. The fun begins as Barden and Sutcliff carry the revolution to the student body in the middle school, with kids ranging in ages from twelve to fourteen. Airey demonstrates great wit and color in his writing about their improbable campaign, a war of words led by the phantom "Messer Rondo."

Messer Rondo is written with kids as characters, but is not written especially for kids. It is a humorous story and at times an interesting drama about how elementary and junior high school kids might react to the controversy. Of course, the seriousness and variety of the stories of the other authors is wide-ranging. One story deals with feelings of revenge and what people might do to reach satisfaction, in *Tea at Fortnums*, by Tom Clarkson.

For those who sculpt their body at a

gym, David Rees has written another story set in a local workout place, *At the Gym*, initially non-gay. Besides the "intrigue" of who is into what, there is the meeting of the minds and the bodies as gay and non-gay alike come to a mutual understanding of each other's lives.

Jack Frost, by Michael James, documents how one gay man faces his later years and eventual passing. The characters are not melodramatically drawn; false cheer is pre-empted by happy acceptance and courage. Probably it is the most powerful and positive short story in the collection.

In our lives there are paths untaken, so it is for John and his brother-in-law George. They share a business together and are good friends. *Never Had a Dream Come True*, by John Gowling, details the conversation George and John have about circumstances they faced together and the choices they made in response to those circumstances.

In writing as in art, often the most powerful message is that one which is stated, or drawn, simply and without gaudy complexity. Just as in the careful juxtaposition of idea with background, as the simple curve can intimate a powerful image, the short story can be a powerful medium to convey an idea in full clarity, reinforced by the reader's own experience or thoughts. Such is the case in this anthology.

HEAT AND DUST

LONG DISTANCE LOVE

Heat and Dust is a trip. We observe and experience a mysteriously difficult culture as we accompany a young British woman while she discovers and slowly falls for the beauty and magic of India. Julie Christie plays Anne, a mature, independent lady who is fascinated by an ancient family affair that occurred 60 years ago. Her great aunt Olivia (Greta Scacchi) was the pretty, seemingly fragile bride of a British civil servant whom she joined in the 1920s at his Indian post. Colonial life itself was not terribly exciting for Olivia. An essentially dull husband and the exotic surroundings coupled with customs of the strange kind might have been the reasons that she became a clear case of black sheep and caused shame and scandal in the family.

The movie spends half its time in the 80s with Anne trying to reconstruct and occasionally relive what her ancestor went through. The natives repeatedly in-

quire from Anne, in broken English, "Why not married? Why no man?" The modern lady has no particular urges for traditional mating habits. She actually seems mesmerized by Olivia and secretly in love with her through time.

It is good to see Miss Christie (*Darling*, *Dr. Zhivago*, *Heaven Can Wait*) again. She is fully at ease as the searching, caring woman who gives up modern comforts to find answers to important inter-personal questions. Newcomer Greta Scacchi is loveable as the precious young thing with a will and desires of her own. Nickolas Grace plays the only person allowed to survive the six-decade time span, but doesn't look his old age in the present-day footage. Charles McCaughan is memorable as a left-over hippie turned into a horny Hindu. In addition, there is a fine cast of Indian actors.

Producer Ismail Merchant and director James Ivory are no strangers to

movies centering on India. Together with writer Ruth Praver Jhabvala, they have successfully collaborated on a

number of films, and 1983 marks their 20th anniversary. *Heat and Dust* will not attract a wide audience. It is sometimes longwinded and, at first glance, not a whole lot seems to happen. However, if your brain's antenna is rolled out all the way, you'll take a classy journey to one of the few fairy tale countries that are left, and you'll be introduced to a friendly people whose clocks tick differently.

REAR WINDOW

GREAT VIEW FROM ANY ANGLE

If you ever wanted to see Grace Kelly climb over a fire escape in a flowing chiffon dress, you must see Alfred Hitchcock's *Rear Window*. Originally released by Paramount Pictures in 1954, Universal Studios has re-released the Hitchcock classic.

Rear Window is a simple story. Jeff (James Stewart) has a broken leg and is confined to a wheelchair; so, to pass the time, he watches his neighbors through the rear window of his apartment. His nurse (Thelma Ritter) and girlfriend (Grace Kelly) alternately scold him for

watching, yet help him watch.

Jeff gives his neighbors "names" (Miss Lonely Hearts, Miss Torso, etc.) and watches their lives unfold. Little by little, he becomes convinced that one man (Raymond Burr) has killed his wife. There is never any doubt in the audience's mind that the murder took place, but the masterful Hitchcock makes *Rear Window* a mystery anyway, as Jeff tries to piece together enough evidence to prove the homicide. Armed with a pair of binoculars and a telephoto camera, Jeff, of course, does just that. But not before he gets his girlfriend arrested, a neighbor's dog killed and his nurse highly upset.

Stewart is substantial in his portrayal

of Jeff. Without any of the nervous fumbling that marked so many of his previous characters, Stewart convinces the audience that Jeff is a likeable fellow, even if he is too stupid to appreciate his girlfriend. Jeff is full of the frailty that Stewart wanted to portray in many of his characters throughout his career, and Hitchcock was a genius at drawing it out his actors.

It's no secret that Hitchcock admired

Kelly, and *Rear Window* shows us why. Kelly is beautiful, cool, intriguing, sophisticated and captivating on screen. Hitchcock's camera is very kind to her, surrounding her with crayon colors that are realistic and unreal at the same time.

But the real star of this film is Hitchcock. His trademark angles are everywhere. Because the setting is the backyard of a Greenwich Village apartment building, Hitchcock uses windows as the frames for much of the action. In

total, he uses 31 apartments, a labyrinth of fire escapes, roof-gardens, an alley, a street and the skyline to create the world Jeff sees out of his window. True to form, Hitchcock leaves no detail unintended: The street is always full of

busy people and playing children; the alley populated with stray cats and trash; passing shots of other windows show us bits of families and their lives. As Jeff uses his binoculars, Hitchcock is careful to show the reflection of the

opposite building in the lens. Two beautiful scenes stay in your mind. One is of Burr, lying on his couch; but through the window, all Jeff can see is the back of the couch and the thin stream of Burr's cigarette smoke curling toward the ceiling. The other is of Jeff and his girlfriend; as Kelly tries to seduce him, all Jeff can talk about is his neighbor and murderer, Burr. (I told you he was stupid.) But the film is well worth seeing, anyway.

DEAL OF THE CENTURY

PEACEMONGER'S PARADISE

What comes to mind first when you see the names of William Friedkin and Chevy Chase prominently in the credits of the same movie? The *Odd Couple*? That's what I thought. Somehow this combination of the controversial filmmaker and the beagle-faced good humor man leaves you guessing what on earth this may lead to. Could Friedkin, the man behind the thrillingly fast-paced *The French Connection*, the queen-size *Boys in the Band*, the peasoup-spitting *The Exorcist* and the abominable *Cruising* possibly be

funny? Or could Chase actually be following in Pacino's footsteps and perform, straight-faced, some grim, serio

comic undercover task?

Deal of the Century starts out like an elaborate sketch for *Saturday Night Live*. The patented Jerry-Ford-imitator is seen pushing all sorts of destructive devices onto a bunch of illiterate third world people who are eager to play the favorite game in town, guerrilla and militia. Chase is a man who doesn't have an ounce of scruples as to which party to sell what and why. If folks like to blow each other up, he sees it as his duty to provide them with the proper tools. By some absurd twist of fate Chase is able to make the jump from used gun dealer to promoter of the real thing, a sophisticated remote-controlled killer plane dubbed the Peacemaker. No, this name is not dreamed up by Ronald Reagan (who christened his MX Missile Program "The Peacekeeper"), but by Luckup, a fictional multinational bomb-breeding concern.

The current occupant of the White House, incidentally, stars in selected press briefs describing his views on the

arms race. These and other clips could have lent an aura of diabolic authenticity to the subject matter. Could have, but don't. My guess is, Mr. Friedkin intended this to be his *Dr. Strangelove*. He succeeded partially in that the movie is strange. It is also confused, unfunny and sometimes embarrassing.

Paul Brickman, who scripted the over-rated *Risky Business*, does not generate enough biting cynicism and black humor to make this *Deal* fly. Mr. Chase much of the time avoids unnecessary slapstick, but never seems in full command of his role, and no one taught him to practice consistency. Gregory Hines as his born-again partner remains a caricature. The special effects involving the fast-flying Peacemaker are never too convincing.

The biggest disappointment of all is not the shabbily told story; it is not the largely lackluster acting, either. No, the biggest letdown is the uninvolved, unimaginative cinematography. One could almost assume that Mr. Friedkin has lost his touch. **W**

In the last few weeks we've seen the openings of several provocative and entertaining films, including *The Right Stuff*, *Under Fire* and, more recently, *Heat and Dust* with **Julie Christie**. Now, I'm happy to announce, we're finally going to get to see *Terms of Endearment*, the film adaptation of **Larry McMurtry's** 1975 novel. Partially set in Texas (some scenes were filmed in Houston's River Oaks and Heights areas), *Terms of Endearment* is a comedy drama which explores a complex mother and daughter relationship over a 30-year period. Starring **Shirley MacLaine** and **Debra Winger**, and, get this, co-starring **Jack Nicholson**, the film marks the theatrical movie directing debut of **James Brooks**, the creator of *The Mary Tyler Moore Show* and *Taxi*. Look for *Terms of Endearment* to be a top contender at next year's Oscar ceremonies.

TAKE 84 — Fans of the old *Saturday Night Live* cast will probably be frequent moviegoers next year, since a number of the former Not Ready For Prime Timers will be appearing on theatrical screens in a variety of projects. **Bill Mur-**

ray, already firmly established as a comic, is making his dramatic debut in a remake of **Somerset Maugham's** *The Razor's Edge*. From that, he segues to a lead role with **Dan Aykroyd** in something called *Ghostbusters*. Their leading lady is **Sigourney Weaver**, who's currently on screen with **Chevy Chase** in *Deal of the Century*. Meanwhile, **Gilda Radner** is co-starring with (and being directed by) **Gene Wilder** in *Boys Will Be Boys*, which also features **Charles Grodin**. And **Jane Curtin** will turn up in a **Robert Altman** movie called *O.C. and Stiggs*. Among her co-stars: **Dennis Hopper**, **Martin Mull**, **Melvin Van Peebles** and, uh, **Tina Louise**. . . . Whatever happened to **Sally Field**? She's working with director **Robert Benton** (*Kramer vs. Kramer*) on a movie called *The Texas Project* (sounds like a working title). . . . You might also be wondering what **Liza Minnelli** is up to. Her next film is *A Great Wind Cometh*. . . . 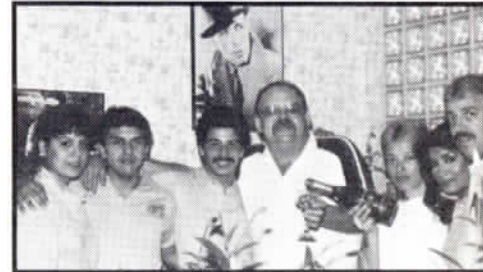
