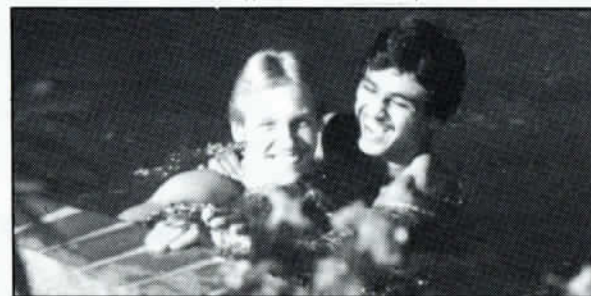

## AHRC HOLDS ELECTION

SAN ANTONIO — The Alamo Human Rights Committee (AHRC), this city's lesbian/gay political action committee, will elect new officers for 1984 at its December meeting, to be held this Monday, December 12 at 7:00pm, at El Jardin, 106 Navarro.

To be elected for a term extending from January 1 until December 31, 1984 will be a chair, vice-chair and seven members of the Steering Committee.

Current chair, Ed Buckmaster, has appointed a nominations committee consisting of five AHRC members, which will present a list of nine members, at its recommendation, to fill these positions. Nominations may also be made from the floor. "Election will be by place and by majority vote of AHRC members present," Buckmaster explained to TWT NEWS/San Antonio.

## HOLIDAY SALE FOR DALLAS CENTER

DALLAS — On Saturday, December 10 from 11:00am-6:00pm, the Apparel Clearing House and JR's Bar and Grill will sponsor a holiday benefit sale for the Oak Lawn Counseling Center (OLCC). Apparel Clearing House will provide "Above The Waist" fashions at outstanding savings, and will donate \$2.50 to OLCC from the sale of each item. JR's, at Cedar Springs and Throckmorton, will host the pre-Christmas sale and afternoon party.

Dan Faulkner of Apparel Clearing House explained that Polo shirts and sweaters by Ralph Lauren and the U.S. Polo Association will be featured, along with Wrangler products and Ocean Pacific fashions by Islander.

Many other crossroads merchants are supporting the benefit by offering ac-

companying savings and donations to help with the many programs that OLCC delivers to persons in need. "Your help is needed now," JR's manager, Drew Fuller, said, "and there is no better way than stopping by our club on December 10 and picking up a Polo, a Wrangler or, who knows, even a Calvin."

OLCC director Howie Daire told TWT NEWS/Dallas, "I foresee 1984 as the beginning of a wider range of services, including intensive alcohol and drug counseling, social service referral, and increased support for persons and families affected by AIDS.

OLCC is also implementing an advisory council that will help study the needs of older gays, drug-dependent young people and support systems for families in crises.

## BISHOP WHEATLEY TALKS OF ACQUITTAL

DALLAS — Bishop Melvin Wheatley, Jr., of the Rocky Mountain Area of the United Methodist Church, was the guest of Affirmation last Sunday, December 4, at Oak Lawn United Methodist Church. The topic of his forum and worship service was the role of gays and lesbians within the United Methodist Church.

Earlier this year, Bishop Wheatley was brought before the Judicial Council of that church on charges of "disseminating false doctrine" and "disobedience to the church's order and discipline," resulting from his appointment of an avowed homosexual to the pulpit of a Colorado United Methodist congregation. He was acquitted of all charges, and continues to support gay causes in the church.

Affirmation, a national organization of gay and lesbian United Methodists, told TWT NEWS/Dallas that interested persons were always welcome to attend, especially those who have United Methodist heritage.

### HALL'S LANDSLIDE OVER VAN HIGHTOWER

HOUSTON — In the November 29 runoff election for City Council, At-Large Position 4, Anthony Hall easily defeated GPC-endorsed Nikki van Hightower, as predicted by most political polsters. What was not predicted by the campaign adherents was Hall's wide margin of victory—a landslide!

Raw vote totals gave Hall 66% of the city-wide vote to van Hightower's 33%—a 2 to 1 margin. Most had thought the race would be much closer.

The key to Hall's victory was two-fold. There was a big voter turnout of blacks at the polls, who turned out about three times heavier than whites. In fact, in one black precinct, Hall picked up every single vote but one.

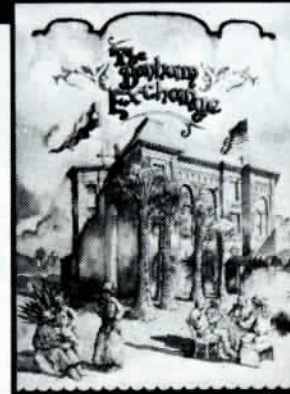
The other key to his victory was that he cut deeply into most white areas of the city. As Dr. Richard Murray, of Rice University, said on election night, "When you carry 97% of the black vote, and much of the white vote, Hall's victory becomes very explainable."

As in the general election, van Hightower's best support came mostly from the inner city—from precincts in Montrose, Rice University and the Heights.

In analyzing the Montrose vote, it becomes apparent that, as van Hightower lost ground, Hall cut deeper. Fact: In the general election of November 8, van Hightower picked up 67% of the Montrose vote. In the runoff, her percentage dropped somewhat to 64%.

Van Hightower's loss was Hall's gain. Whereas, Hall got only 19% of the Montrose vote in the general election, he zoomed up to 36% in the runoff. Obviously, Hall picked up most of the undecided vote, and much of the swing vote, from those who had voted for one or the other six candidates, who had been eliminated after the general election.

Even on GPC's home turf, the raw vote tally shows that Hall cut sizeably into the gay vote. In a key Montrose precinct, such as 34 (Felix's), Hall got 156 votes to van Hightower's 308, city secretary Ms. Davis informed TWT NEWS/Houston. In other words, one out of three voters did not vote the GPC party bloc ticket.

To cite another example, in Precinct 39 (Martell Auditorium), Hall picked up 161 votes to van Hightower's 280. In the general election, Hall got only 18% of that vote. In the runoff, three weeks later, Hall increased his margin to 36%.

Although the GPC was still able to deliver a majority vote for its endorsed candidate, van Hightower, on its home turf of Montrose, it was not enough to offset Hall's overwhelming strength among blacks, his ability to attract sufficient numbers of affluent whites, and his untiring support among some gay voters who had campaigned for their friend Hall against GPC.


## GPC's MELTON UPSETS JONES

HOUSTON — While the Hall/van Hightower race was overshadowing most other races, some good news for the gay community was emerging on election night in a lesser media-hyped campaign—the race for District 4 of the HISD school board.

In that race, GPC-endorsed Herbert Melton upset incumbent J.C. Jones by a sweeping 2 to 1 margin in the November 29 runoff. The retired Principal Melton, 61, had sought the gay endorsement, and GPC delivered a strong Montrose vote.

In the city-wide vote, Melton racked up a 69% plurality. In Montrose, his victory was equally impressive.

In Precinct 34 (Felix's), Melton tallied 295 votes to Jones' 68. In Precinct 39 (Martell Auditorium), Melton took 123 votes to only 36 for Jones, HISD's Leonard Sturm informed TWT NEWS/Houston.

Clearly, GPC delivered a knock-out punch with its endorsement of Melton for school board member.

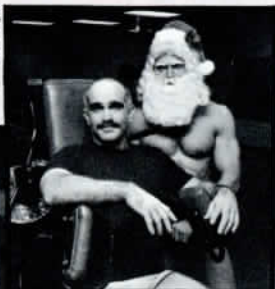

I have been proud to have been associated with this annual effort of our community. The support for Toys for Tykes by my gay sisters and brothers represents the true spirit of Christmas and gay SA. It is with deep regret that I have decided not to organize the Toys For Tykes campaign for 1983.

Some people have spread the story that I have decided not to organize Toys For Tykes this year because of personal health reasons, or that I am too busy with business. While it is true that I am recuperating from surgery on my knees and operating two new businesses—Bogart's and Cahoot's—I have made my decision to step aside this year because Toys For Tykes has become a source of community dissent rather than community cooperation.

As Toys For Tykes has grown in size and success, it has also become involved in community conflict. Some argue that money raised in the gay community should be used to support gay causes. Neither Santa nor Elf Louise have ever asked a needy child whether he or she was gay or straight before bringing them a Christmas gift.

Some have complained that the gay community does not get enough credit from Elf Louise for the money it raises, but generating positive publicity is not the point of Christmas, and is the responsibility of the gay community, not Elf Louise.

But, even more divisive has been the competition between the community's bars over the business advantages of holding benefits on desirable nights and locations. Unfortunately, the spirit of giving toys to kids has been lost as bar owners bicker over who will get to host the final benefit night. Some bar owners have refused to participate if it is held at another club. Last year, checks donated by four clubs to Toys For Tykes were returned, marked insufficient funds, and never made good; pledges from three other bars were not honored after the final benefit; and one club held its own Toys For Tykes benefit and never made a donation to Elf Louise.

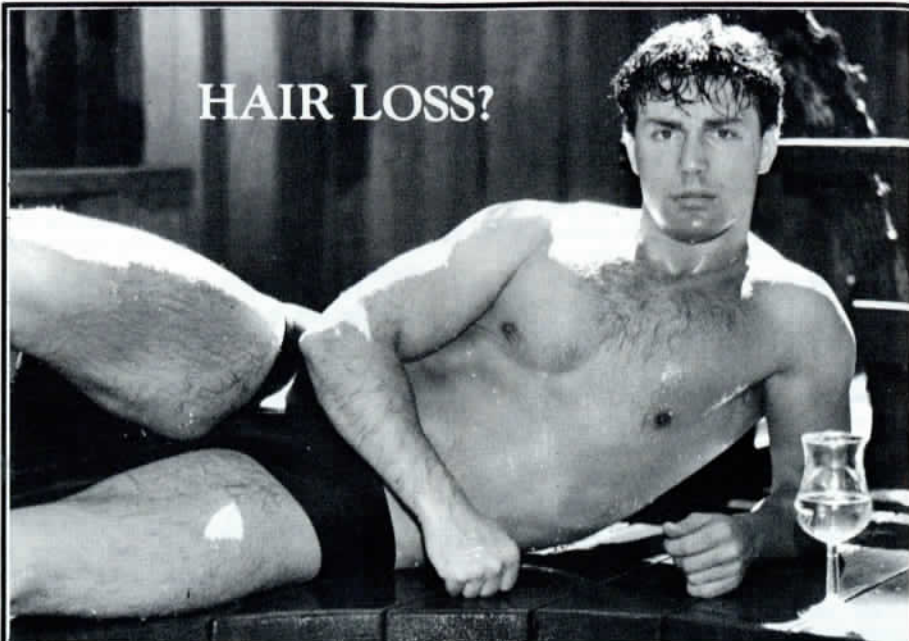
To answer the vicious rumors that always arise after any benefit, alleging that more money was raised than actually donated, I have kept complete records of last year's campaign.

The name Toys For Tykes is registered in my name, and I hope that anyone who wishes to hold benefits for Elf Louise this year will feel free to do so. I support Elf Louise. I only wish the spirit of competition within the gay community could be put aside for the spirit of Christmas.

# Whose Child Cries

Children of Gay Parents

Information and reason are the first two things that go out the window when Anita Bryant and others shout the rallying cry, "Save Our Children" from those nasty old gay people. Fairness and the willingness to hear both sides are sacrificed as well. Possibly the most important voices to be heard are those of the children themselves who are involved in

the conflict.

This is the premise of *Whose Child Cries*, by Joe Gantz. He interviews the members of five openly gay couples and their children, to discuss the issues and problems they encounter. Originally, he collected and interviewed 23 families, and chose these five for inclusion in the book.

The book is not a sociological work; there are no psychological analyses to wade through. Gantz simply records whatever each family member wishes to say about his or her life. To save the reader the experience of reading boring transcript, Gantz has edited the text to simulate a novelized format. His writing

makes the material quite readable and seldom tedious.

Though the feelings of children ten years of age or less should be considered, the children here are mostly teenagers, so they have an advanced, less abstract, understanding of the problems of such a situation. Few things are common to these children, but they all seem to share one characteristic: They are estranged from their peers in maintaining the "secret" about their parents.

The title refers to a quote by Thomas Fuller, circa 1732, a Scottish proverb: "He cares not whose Child cries, so his laughs." The definition of "family" is changing, from the nuclear family (with 2.2 children) to the extended family, including "significant others," such as the gay lover of the parent. But the essential needs of the child remain the same: love, order, discipline, support, security.

The parent-couples in *Whose Child Cries* are two male couples, one female couple, and two couples of a gay man with his lover and his wife, who has her lesbian lover. In the interviews, the parents are willing to show the real conflicts and stresses of their lives. Gantz is careful not to idealize or edit out their problems. After the initial nervousness, the children's question, "What are you going to ask me?" changed to, "I can talk about whatever I want?"

The inevitable question arises of how

this affects the child's "orientation," and the children feel free to answer that for themselves. Many don't know yet, but there does not seem to be a great deal of fear and trepidation about it in their comments. What is also instructive here are their perspective and thoughts about their parents' orientation, not rhetoric or judgments, but feelings.

The problems of being a family, and the solutions to those problems, are highly individual and unique; but *Whose Child Cries* presents for others to see the similarity of the issues that apply across the board. The solutions to these problems are based on the individual family's experiences and role models from other relatives.

What is most effective about the book is that it makes a far stronger statement than saying gay parents *can* be good parents, and that they *should* be allowed to raise the children they love. The book says there *are* gay parents that are good parents already, that they *are* raising the children they love.

If we talk with children about these issues with hysteria, the children will very possibly never be able to think and decide rationally, or discuss it in an informed way. If parents recognize their part as role models, in thinking and discussing the subject, their children will have an advantage, to think and to understand.

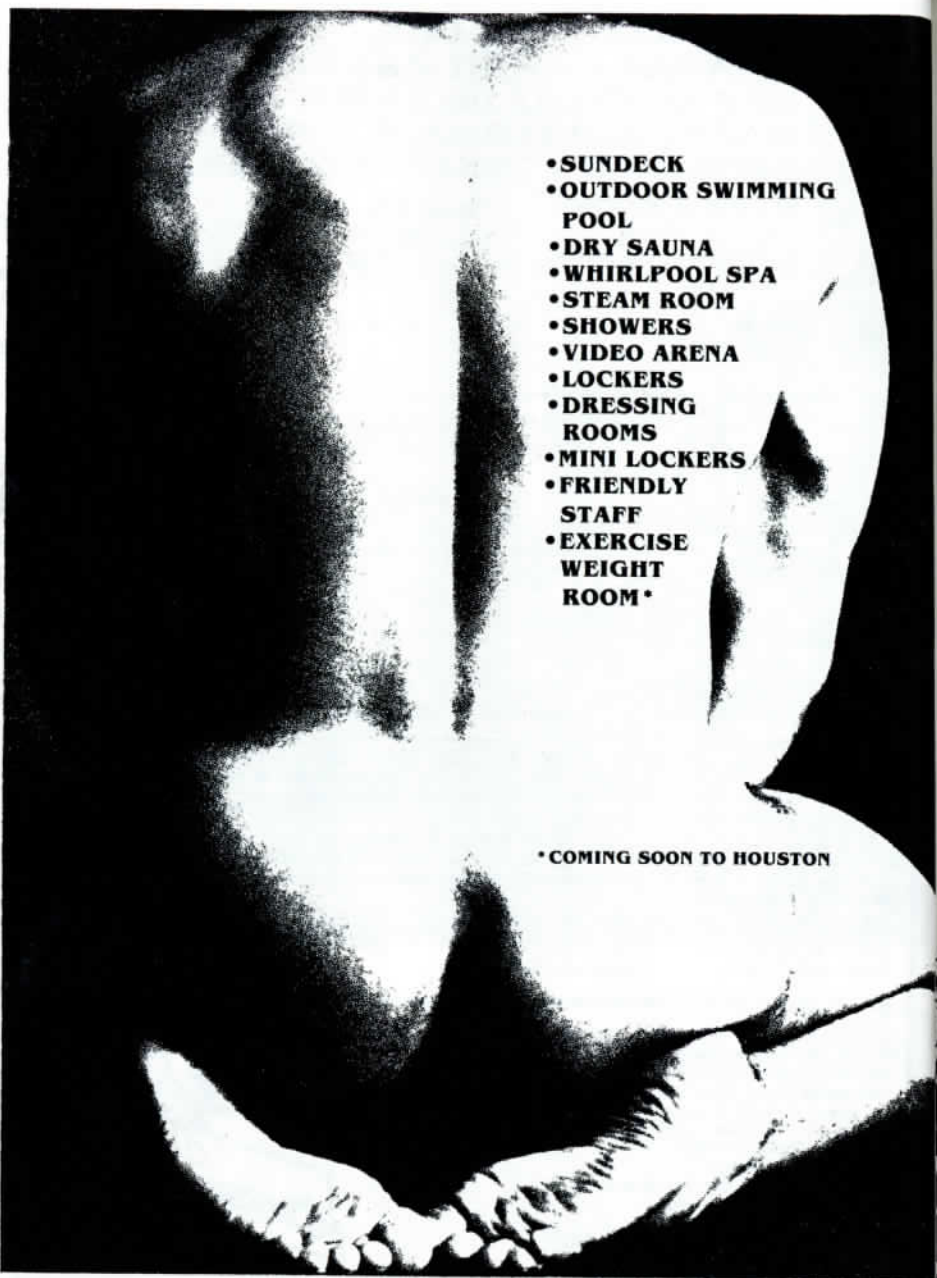

**A Preview of Movies for the Holiday Season**

As usual the Christmas season brings with it a barrage of films, all designed to go after your movie dollar. The hype, hoopla, and hooley may be a bit confusing, so here's a guide to help you cut through the nonsense and identify the movies you'll be sure to want to hit—and the ones you'll want to miss.

**Silkwood** — Starring Meryl Streep and Cher, directed by Mike Nichols. A docudrama based on the now famous Karen Silkwood case involving a plutonium plant worker and her mysterious death. Count on Meryl and Cher to give good, solid performances with Kurt Russell adding to the high quality of acting.

**Yentl** — Barbra Streisand produced, directed, wrote, and stars in this film. What more do you want? A must-see for Streisand fans. Streisand, 40, plays a teen-aged, Jewish boy/girl at the turn of the century. The sound track is getting tepid reviews, but Streisand is sure to blow you away in this. She took several years and big bucks to bring this project to the screen. Amy Irving and Mandy Patinkin also star.

**Scarface** — A violent, bloody saga starring Al Pacino as a Cuban emigre trafficking in Miami's drug business. Directed by Brian De Palma, the film had to be cut in order to get its R rating; it got an X the first time out because of the guts and gruesome action. It's about power and money; Pacino's character is hungry for both. Be prepared for blood and guts and a great performance by Pacino.

**D.C. Cab** — Max Gail, Mr. T., and Gary Busey star as cabbies in what is being called a "good-natured comedy." In movie lingo, that usually means it's not too funny. I haven't seen the film and as much as I like Max Gail, I'm not going to. **The Man Who Loved Women** — Well, it

certainly sounds heterosexual, doesn't it? It stars Burt Reynolds, directed by Blake Edwards. Reynolds is a sculptor who can't stay away from women. Imagine two hours of Reynolds chasing every skirt in town, and you have a good idea of the story line. Reynolds can be appealing, and Edwards has certainly proved to have a biting sense of humor, so I expect more than a little fun and a lot of sarcasm.

**Two of a Kind** — John Travolta and Olivia Newton-John. There's something about John being an inventor, Olivia being a bank teller, somebody being a thief, and good vs. evil. I'm confused. I'm also staying home.

**Sudden Impact** — The fourth Dirty Harry installment with Clint Eastwood at the helm as director and star. The first *Dirty Harry* film was more than enough for me, but Clint keeps making them and somebody keeps shelling out \$4.50 to see them.

There are some films that have been out for a while now that deserve your attention if you haven't seen them yet: *Terms of Endearment*, *The Big Chill*, *Educating Rita*, *Never Cry Wolf*, and *The Right Stuff* are all HITS.

On the other hand there are also some movies that you will do well to stay away from. Among the films that MISS the mark are: *A Night in Heaven*, *Mortuary*, *Amityville 3D*, *Dead Zone*, *Escape 2000*, *Legend of the Bayou*, *Frightmare*, *Nate and Hayes*, *Deal of the Century*, and *Porky's # anything*.

There's lots to pick and choose from this Christmas, some great movies and some big flops. If you pay attention, you can avoid the flops. And if you're willing to stand in line you may be able to see some of the good ones before 1984 rolls in.



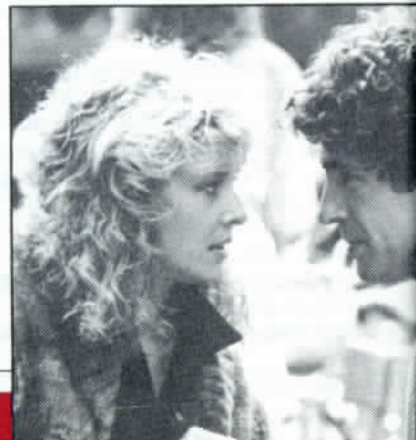

**CHER CROPPING** — I think it may be a little too soon for someone to publish *The Films of Cher*, but isn't this incredibly versatile performer (long thought of as a bimbo in some camps) turning out to be one of the more interesting big screen actresses? In a mere two decades, **Cher** has gone from singing backgrounds in **Phil Spector's** echo chamber to portraying a lesbian in *Silkwood*, a new **Mike Nichols** film which also stars **Meryl Streep** and, pant, **Kurt Russell**. If her current film *Windy City* doesn't put her over, then we can at least have higher hopes for her next two projects. Next spring she will be on screen with **Harrison Ford** in **Steven Spielberg's** *Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom* and later she'll be seen with **Dudle**

Kate Capshaw and John Shea in *Windy City*.



**Moore** and **Eddie Murphy** in *Best Defense*. . . . Most of us are tickled fuchsia that **Dolly Parton** and **Sylvester Stallone** are starring together in *Rhinestone* (it's a country/western version of *Pygmalion*)—so are you ready for **Jane Fonda** and **Barbra Streisand** in *Triangle*? It's in the "development" stages. . . . Australia's **Peter Weir** (*Gallipoli*, *The Year of Living Dangerously*) will direct **Jack Nicholson** in *The Mosquito Coast*. . . . Look for 1984 to also be a good year for **Mickey Rourke**. He received excellent reviews for his work in *Body Heat* and *Diner*, and he was just about the only reason to see *Rumble Fish*. Next year Rourke will star with **Eric Roberts** in *The Pope of Greenwich Village*, and he will also be attempting to bring some of his own productions to the screen—among them a film about the prohibition gangster Legs Diamond. Her current biggie is "Harmony/I Got It," which she performed with gusto for her Dallas audience.

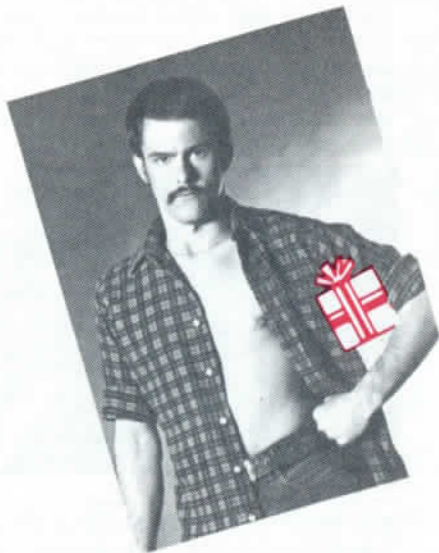

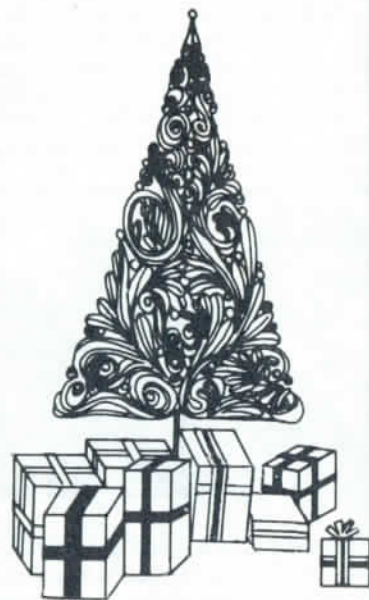

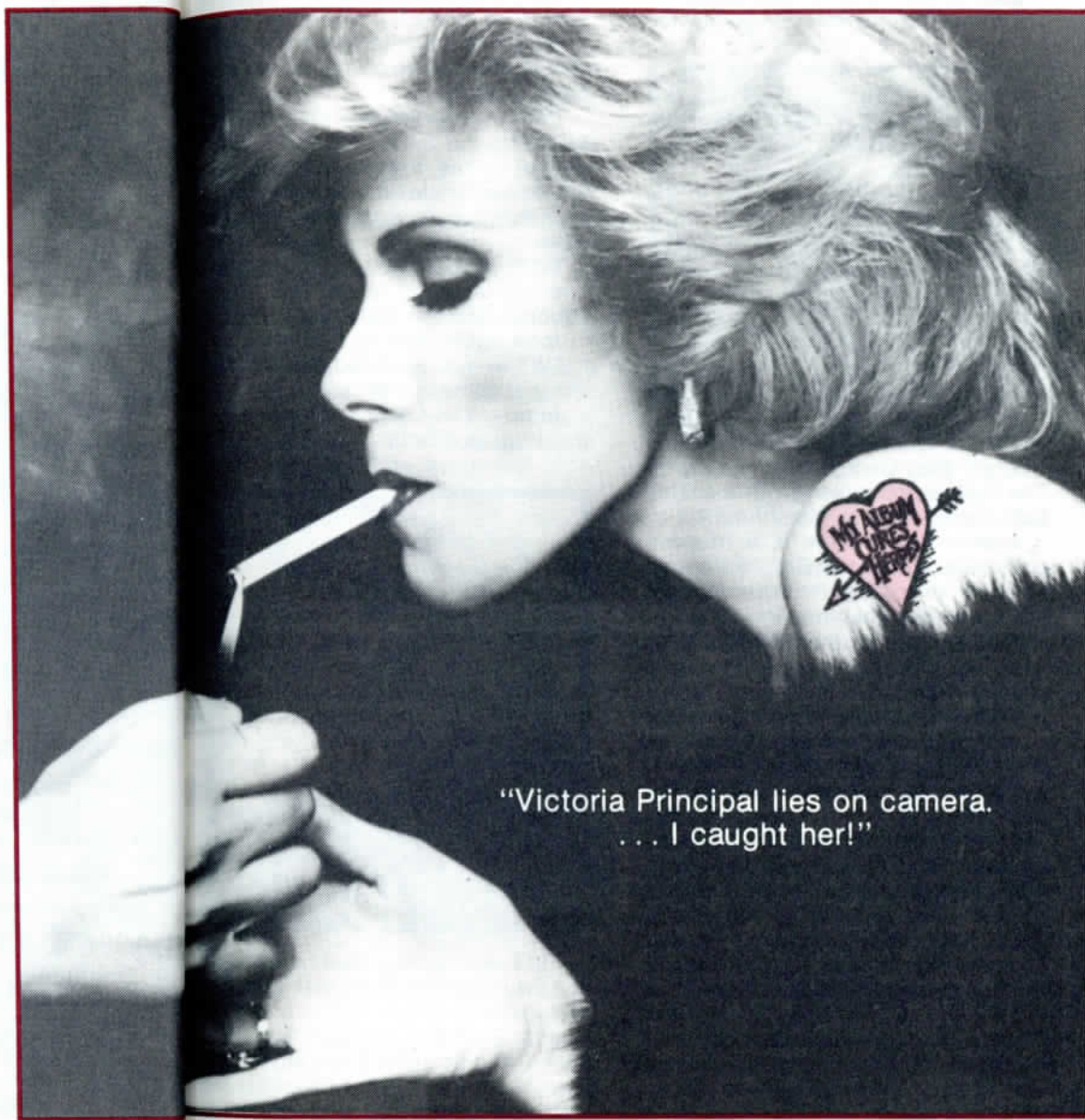

**Joan** — Hello, hello. How are you?

**TWT** — Fine. And you?

**Joan** — Very good. What's the weather like in Texas?

**TWT** — It's kind of warm and humid [Friday, Dec. 2].

**Joan** — Don't tell me that! If I can't wear my furs to Dallas, what's the point of life?

**TWT** — Did they tell you this was a gay publication?

**Joan** — No. Great! Good.

**TWT** — Did you have a large gay following in your beginning?

**Joan** — Oh, yes. And I still do. They're my strongest supporters. The gays found all of us. They found Bette [Midler], they found Barbra [Streisand], and they found me.

**TWT** — Do you ever go back to the Village, in New York?

**Joan** — Yes, all the time. It's not the same now. It's changed. I was there in the late '60s and early '70s. It was more fun then.

**TWT** — How's your album doing?

**Joan** — It's gone gold, now. It's also on the charts in Australia. Figure that one out.

**TWT** — What did you think of Boy George? [Boy George was recently on *The Tonight Show*, along with Joan Collins. Ms. Rivers was guest host.]

**Joan** — Boy George is a friend. I adore him. We call him Boy, by the way. I met him in London. He asked to meet me. I just loved him on sight.

**TWT** — Were you intimidated at all by Joan Collins?

**Joan** — Oh, no.

**TWT** — Does anyone intimidate you?

**Joan** — Everyone does, but not Joan. She's fun. I love having her on the show.

**TWT** — Have you ever really pissed someone off?

**Joan** — Victoria Principal. She was on the show twice, and both times I cornered her. She lies on camera. The first time, she lied about being engaged to Andy Gibb, and the next time she lied about her age. I caught her. She doesn't want to come back to the show. Fine.

**TWT** — You're writing a book called *Getting Started*, which is about your career up until your first appearance on *The Tonight Show*. Would you tell us about the book?

**Joan** — I played in some very sleazy places in the beginning. We were all in the Village together. Me, Richard Pryor, Bette, Streisand. We were struggling together. There'll be stories about our experiences. It's a book about everyone going through a lot to get where they are.

**TWT** — When should the book be out?

**Joan** — In another seven years. I don't know. I keep putting it aside for other projects.

**TWT** — Have you ever met Elizabeth Taylor?

**Joan** — Yes, I met her twice. Both times were before I started talking about her. She was very, very beautiful in those days.

**TWT** — Would you be interested in directing another movie? [Ms. Rivers directed 1978's *Rabbit Test*.]

**Joan** — Oh, sure. In a second.

**TWT** — You financed *Rabbit Test*. Did you come out ahead?

**Joan** — Yes, I did, which made it all the more wonderful.



**TWT** — You were grand marshal for the Gay Rodeo in Reno last year. How was it?

**Joan** — It was so much fun. It was just dynamite. I didn't see anyone roping steers, but it was a lot of fun. The parties were great.

**TWT** — Are you political at all?

**Joan** — No, not at all.

**TWT** — Any comment about the ERA?

**Joan** — None. My life is ERA.

**TWT** — You were rather heavy as a child.

**Joan** — Ugh! A pig!

**TWT** — Are you really that unhappy with your figure today?

**Joan** — Yes, but there's nothing I can do about it.

**TWT** — Sure there is.

**Joan** — What? What, what? A boob transplant? If I were single, I would. But I'm married, so what's the point?

**TWT** — Have you ever been at a party and had to endure someone telling you a joke you've heard ten times before?

**Joan** — Oh, sure. I listen politely. Wouldn't you? Of course you would. I just say, "Oh, isn't that funny? That's wonderful. Ha, ha, ha." I do listen to everything. Who knows, it might really be good. People write me jokes, and if I use one, I pay them \$10 a line.

**TWT** — If you had a talk show of your own, who would be your first guest?

**Joan** — I don't really have any one particular favorite. I have the ones I adore on the *Carson* show. I loved Joan Collins and Linda Gray. I loved Boy George. I talk with them on the *Carson* show.

**TWT** — On the recent "Johnny Carson's Practical Jokes," you slapped him for what he did to you. Was that staged?

**Joan** — Oh, *no!* He told me to hit him, but I didn't mean to do it so hard.

**TWT** — I'm curious to know, after he flew you over and you got all dressed up, what did you do after the joke was revealed at the airport?

**Joan** — No, I did not turn around and go home. Edgar [her husband] and I met Johnny for dinner. I was in full drag. I would have died if we went home.

**TWT** — In the movie you wrote, *The Girl Most Likely*, the girl has plastic surgery and gets even with everyone who had put her down. Is that what you would like to do with some people you

know?

**Joan** — Not anymore. There was a time when yes, yes, yes, yes. I can't hold a grudge. Since I was fat as a child, the other kids made fun of me. But in doing so, they helped form the person I am today. My way of getting even is to be a success.

**TWT** — How do you cope with your hectic schedule?



**Joan** — I only go out with people I adore. They make it all bearable.

**Joan** — No.

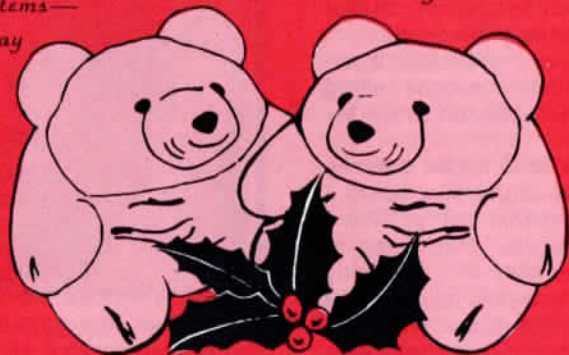

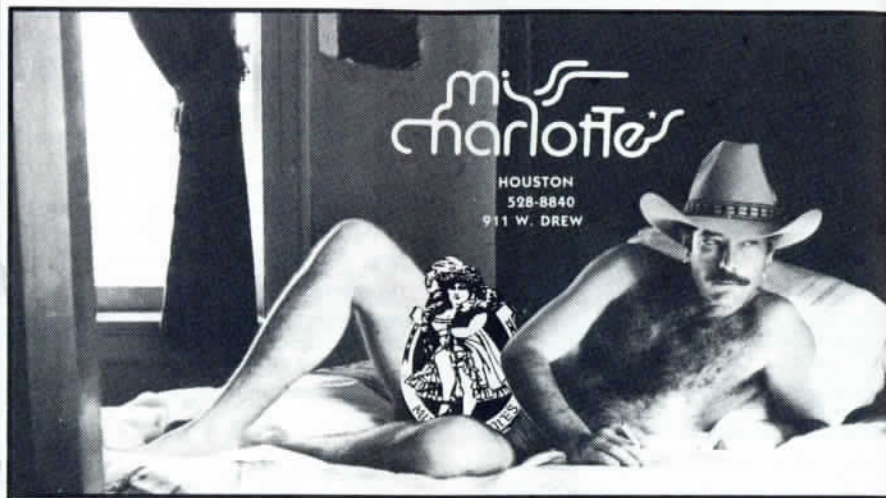
