UT-ARLINGTON WELCOMES GAY GROUP

ARLINGTON, Texas — Without noise, fuss or fanfare, the University of Texas at Arlington has approved to publicly recognize a new gay group as an official campus organization. The new group is known as UTA Gay/Lesbian Association.

"We approached it correctly," co-founder Luan Green told reporters. "We want our rights and our club, and we want to be cohesive with the university," he explained.

It was back in 1981 that UTA first recognized a gay support group. That group, however, later became inactive, Jeff Sorensen, student organization coordinator, explained.

UTA recognized the new gay group by an overwhelming 8 to 1 vote of a committee composed of students, faculty and staff, after the group fulfilled university requirements.

The rule to be recognized requires any new group to conduct three meetings within 30 days, and to join at least 15 members. The new gay group more than met the required minimum, as it boasted 60 names on its membership role, Jeff McAdams, co-founder, said.

Meanwhile, while UTA easily welcomed its new gay group, nearby at SMU, the noisy public debate continued over that school recognizing its gay group. What a difference, TWT NEWS/Dallas opined.

ANGELO STATE GAYS FACING PROBLEMS

SAN ANGLEO — The recently-formed Gays of Angelo State (GAS), in order to gain university recognition, must have a faculty advisor. Alan Weiser, GAS president, told Jay Cherin of TWT NEWS/Austin that the organization is in the process of recognition, and

hopes the group will be recognized by spring of 1984.

Weiser also explained, "We have been going one by one to professors requesting that they sponsor GAS, but none have agreed to do so." It appears that most of those asked are afraid of being labeled homosexual if they were to sign on as the group's sponsor, but there are other reasons. Dr. Amando DeLeon, an Angelo State professor and civil rights activist of the 60s, told Weiser, "If GAS were accepted as a university-sanctioned organization, then the university would have to recognize the KKK and the Nazis, if they were to apply."

After setting an appointment with ASU's Dean of Student Life, Paul Horn, Weiser said he went to the dean's office and discussed the formation of GAS. Weiser said Horn spoke "through clenched teeth." In conclusion, Horn had no comment to make about the group.

As an alternative to finding a single faculty sponsor, GAS is trying to find a panel of faculty members, all who would act as sponsors. Weiser feels this would lessen the degree to which the faculty members might feel labeled as homosexuals.

TEXAS GAY LOBBY \$5,100 RICHER

HOUSTON — Lesbian/Gay Rights Advocates (LGRA), our gay lobby on capitol hill in Austin, is \$5,100 richer, thanks to the Mr. Texas pageant held December 2 at Rich's in Houston. The annual, statewide contest is owned by TWT and was produced by He & She Productions, both of which donated their efforts.

The money was formally presented in Austin to Bettie Naylor, senior lobbyist for LGRA, on December 7. "I wish to thank Rich's for donating their door money, He & She Productions for pro-

ducing the contest, all the sponsors of contestants who donated their \$50 entry fee to LGRA, the entertainers—Tiffany Jones, Tasha Kohl, Naomi Sims, Donna Day and Hot Chocolate—for donating their talents, and to TWT magazine for deciding to give the money to us," Naylor said. The entertainers performed courtesy of the Copa in Houston.

"The money is most appreciated and badly needed by LGRA," Naylor added. "Some of it will go to help pay the salaries of our three lobbyists, and the rest will be used for the coming session of the State Legislature," she explained to TWT NEWS/Austin.

GALVESTON TO VOTE ON GAMBLING

GALVESTON — Local gay community leaders were pleased to learn that the Greater Galveston Beach Association (GGBA) has been successful in their first step to put the gambling question to a vote in a Saturday, January 21, 1984 election. Earlier stories had predicted an election as late as next spring.

GGBA was able to get the exact wording they wanted on the ballot when city council agreed in a 4 to 3 vote on December 8. The wording will be, "Do you favor government-controlled, legalized gambling on Galveston Island? Yes or No."

Those voting against the issue wanted to divide the question into two parts, in order to separate casino gambling from paramutual betting.

Also against the non-binding referendum was Mayor Gus Manuael, who added he thought "the issue will lose" at the polls.

In an effort to get more voters registered before the deadline, Tony Smith, GGBA board member, announced several voter registration drives, one of which will be at Trammpps, a gay club at 627 Winnie this Monday, December 19 from 6:00pm until midnight.

All gay business owners with whom TWT NEWS/Galveston has spoken have indicated they are for legalized gambling.

DALLAS GAYLINE NEEDS VOLUNTEERS

DALLAS — "If you would like to help fellow gays in need, then becoming a Gayline volunteer counselor may be just the job you are seeking," David McKinnon, president of Gayline, told TWT NEWS-Dallas.

Gayline is a volunteer peer-counseling information and referral service serving the Dallas/Ft. Worth metroplex. Manned 365 days a year, volunteer counselors answer phones to help with questions of gays, friends of gays, families of gays, and sometimes not-so-friendly non-gays.

"To be a volunteer Gayline counselor you must be at least 19 years old, gay, and must complete the Gayline Counselor Training Course," McKinnon explained.

HALL KEEPS HIS PROMISE TO GAYS

HOUSTON — Late Tuesday night, December 6, on the eve of the monthly GPC meeting, TWT NEWS/Houston learned that City Councilmember Anthony Hall was prepared to introduce to City Council, the next day, a proposal which would outlaw employment discrimination of gay people in city jobs.

Hall explained to TWT NEWS/Houston that he was simply fulfilling a promise he had made to the gay community three months ago when, during GPC screening for candidate endorsement, he had promised if elected to push for passage of the Domestic Privacy in Employment ordinance, which the ACLU supported.

Hall also explained that he also wanted to merely bring city law into line with state and federal statutes, making discrimination in public hiring on "sexual orientation" illegal.

Hall's proposal, as predicted, was introduced the next day to City Council

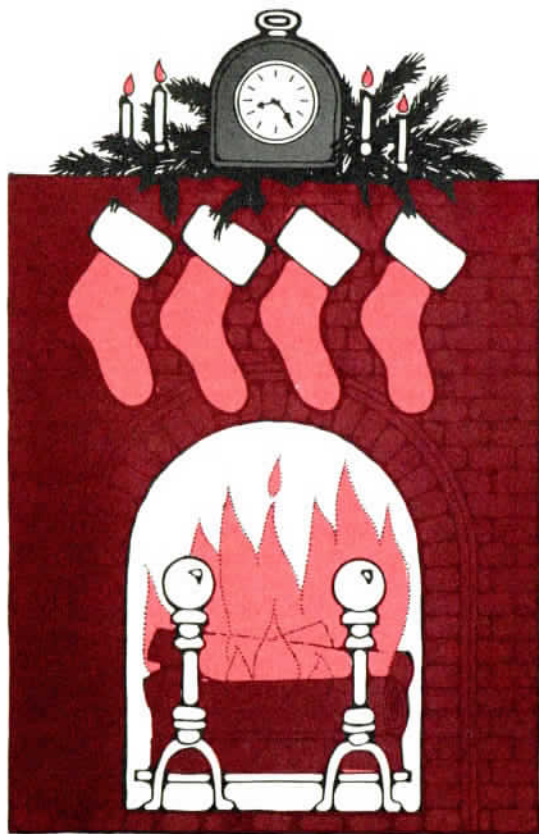

and swiftly, without discord, sent to the city legal department for consideration.

All of this was accomplished without the knowledge of the original ordinance's author, Gregg Russell.

GPC was also not informed of the matter because they had rejected endorsing Russell's ordinance on July 20, saying, "The timing was off," and that such an ordinance was "not necessary" until a need was shown through documented evidence.

Only a handful of concerned citizens were involved in the swift action. Since Hall's landslide runoff victory of November 27, he had been meeting with supporters Neil Isbin, Jerry Vann, Ed Jamail, Jerry Mays and attorney James Kuhn.

Quietly, this political action collective of six had reworked Russell's ordinance under the legal guidance of Kuhn, with Mays chairing the maneuvers. Their plan was to alter two points in the ordinance, which Hall knew wouldn't pass the careful scrutiny of the city legal department. It then was to be presented as an amendment to the already existing Affirmative Action Resolution, amending Chapter 12 of the Houston Code of Ordinances.

Although it sounded complicated, it really wasn't as only two points needed reworking. One's marital status was deleted because it was not pertinent. Also struck was a clause about not being able to investigate one's financial status because that remains legally permissible.

By removing these two stumbling blocks from Russell's ordinance, it is felt by political pundits that the new city council will approve it and therefore outlaw employment discrimination once and for all in Houston, on the grounds of sexual orientation.

And with the new liberal makeup of city council after the first of the year, its passage is very possible, as Councilmembers Greanias, Tinsley, McGowen, Ellis, Greenwood, Gorgynski, Hall and Mayor Whitmire are all counted on our side in a January vote.

How does Russell feel about it? Although at first upset that he wasn't con-

sulted, he said later that he understood the necessity of the political ploy and was happy that his idea was now closer to becoming law.

Some critics of GPC feel the Hall action is just one more example of incidents where GPC was not in the right camp at the right time, as was also true of the recent van Hightower endorsement over Hall.

AIDS UPDATE ON DALLAS CABLE

DALLAS — Mike Stewart, Dallas Gay Alliance president, was among a panel of experts who appeared last Tuesday, December 13 on Warner Amex Cable. The hour-long program, the first of its kind in the metroplex, was presented by the University of Texas Health Science Center.

Joining Stewart in the live discussion, and fielding answers from questions phoned in by viewers, were Dr. Edward Brandt, Jr., Assistant Secretary for Health of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services; Dr. Kevin Murphy, UT Southwestern Medical School; and Joann Schulte, a medical writer for the *Dallas Morning News*.

Moderator of the panel was Jamie Friar, Office of Medical Information of UT Health Science Center.

ANNUAL CHRISTMAS CONCERT SATURDAY

HOUSTON — The annual Christmas concert, produced by the Montrose Symphonic Band, will be held this Saturday evening, December 17, once again at Cullen Auditorium on the main campus of the University of Houston. The program will begin at 8:00pm, director Andy Mills said.

Among the guest artists will be the Montrose Country Cloggers, Bayou B'lu singers and the New Covenant Singers, TWT NEWS/Houston learned. "It should be an exciting evening of holiday music," it was stated.

Tickets have been available at Mary's, Kindred Spirits, Wilde & Stein, all four

Eagle Leather shops, and from MSB members. Last-minute tickets will also be available at the auditorium door for a \$5 donation.

ARLINGTON POLICE SEIZE GAY VIDEO

ARLINGTON, Texas — Police last week seized video tapes of young boys engaging in same-sex acts and charged two men with aggravated sexual assault. Sergeant Hugh Atwell said his department had received a tip that video tapes were being taken in East Arlington of "children engaging in homosexual acts."

The video tapes were distributed widely in the Arlington gay community, officers thought; however, there was no indication that any of the tapes or photographs were ever sold. "They were copying it and distributing it," Atwell explained.

TWT NEWS/Arlington, however, has been unable to confirm that the distribution of the tapes was widespread among the mainstream of the general gay community.

"From looking at photographs, we do have multiple victims," Atwell said. "From some of the indications, from the hairstyles, it could have been going on for a period of time."

In the course of the investigation, a 16-year-old runaway told of how he was drugged and forced to have sex last March with two men and video taped the scenario. One of the arrested had even taken one of the boys to his own home to live, where "forced sex" reportedly occurred.

KIDS KRISTMAS BENEFIT TUESDAY

HOUSTON — The second annual "Kristmas for Kids" will be held next Tuesday at 9:00pm at the Midnite Sun, 534 Westheimer, show director Will Johnson has informed TWT NEWS/Houston. Co-emceeding with Johnson for the evening will be Hank Swanson of Dirty Sally's.

The show will feature bartenders and bar managers from many of the city's leading clubs. Those participating are the BRB, Chicken Coop, Dirty Sally's, Midnite Sun, Mary's, Numbers, Outlaws, Rich's, the Ripcord, Same Ol' Hole, Twins, Venture-N and West Playland.

"Because of time, we are limiting entries to one act per club," Johnson explained. All participants are required to attend a rehearsal, Monday, December 19 at 2:00pm at the Midnite Sun. "If perchance you have not been contacted by Kids for Kristmas, attend the rehearsal," it was stated.

The stage show will, as always, benefit the autistic children at Avondale House, 216 Avondale. Patrick Cox, executive director, and Beverly Braman, program coordinator, will attend the show to receive the toys. "Your toy donated at the door will be your admission to the show," Cox said.

Last year's event raised over \$2,000. "We expect to double that this year," Swanson predicted.

GMBG PREPARES FOR ELECTIONS

HOUSTON — At the December 6 meeting of the Greater Montrose Business Guild, the nominees for officer and vacant board positions were announced. A total of 14 members are running for 10 positions, Greg Havican of TWT NEWS/Houston reported.

Elections were scheduled for Tuesday, January 10, 1984 at the regular meeting room at Liberty Bank. Members were requested to note the change from the regular meeting date of January 3, 1984.

Another important item on the election ballot is to be a referendum designed to change the meeting date to a day that will be of greatest convenience to all members and will promote a maximum attendance. In addition to the current date, there are three proposed dates. The date receiving the greatest number of votes will be announced later in the evening.

Among other announcements at the December meeting was a progress report of the Members Discount Committee. Following the progress report, seven additional members volunteered discounts to be included in the program. Once the program is set up, the GMBG promised an announcement concerning discounts given in other cities to GMBG members.

CLINIC OFFERS NOMINAL FEE PLAN

HOUSTON — The Dryden Clinic, which opened last September as a comprehensive medical care facility specializing in AIDS evaluation and also in the diagnosis of sexually transmitted diseases (STD), began a new program on December 3.

The new program is described as a nominal fee STD clinic designed to include evaluation of patients with respect to the need for more indepth AIDS work-up, the clinic explained to TWT NEWS/Houston.

"Since this new program is a public health service, the clinic will utilize its own financial resources to offset the usual and customary service charges, which would normally be incurred by the patient during regular clinic hours," administrative director Frank Berrier explained.

There is a nominal registration fee and additional charges needed for laboratory, which cannot be done in the clinic's lab, he added. All or part of these charges are health insurance reimbursable, it was learned.

The STD clinic will try to accommodate patients during the day and on weekends by being open by private and confidential appointment. Call (713) 795-0385 or visit 1709 Dryden, Suite 1002 in the Medical Center complex. **W**

Witchcraft Response

Dear TWT:

Steven Keller voiced his strong objections to my comments in my review of *Witchcraft and the Gay Counterculture* by Arthur Evans [Vol. 9, No. 32] in his letter in the TWT COMMENT section [Vol. 9, No. 35]. This letter is to clarify those comments in my review.

Clearly, politics and religion are inextricably intertwined. Religious institutions ultimately become political ones, e.g. the Roman Catholic Church. So, there really cannot be a totally "non-political history of gays and witchcraft (or religion)." To rid a historical work completely of subjective bias is impossible, and Evans states in the introduction he is not trying to be objective. I overlooked his warning. My objection to some of his views is my opinion, which has little to do with my own supposedly objective analysis, and which I included in my review in error.

As to Keller's statement that I missed the whole point of the work, I can only say that the "point" of a work varies between the author's intent and the readers' interpretation. The balance of his ideas I agree with completely.

**That Other Realm
 of Freedom**
 Barry Nonweiler



That Other Realm of Freedom, by Barry Nonweiler; 324 pp.; fiction; Gay Men's Press, P.O. Box 247, London N15 6RW, England; soft-cover, \$8.50.

In *That Other Realm of Freedom*, the reader will immediately realize this is a "dark" novel. Not that the pages of the book are dark or that the colors described in the book are obscure, but that Simon Palmer's perceptions of the world are received through a dark filter. His positive feelings and successful experiences are spoiled and stymied by fate, his homosexuality and/or the programming of his upbringing, he concludes.

His non-gay friends look upon him with a wistful gaze, a gaze equally sad

and pitying. Simon feels alone and isolated where he lives in Glasgow, not knowing other gay people. He knows of only one other like himself, but feels unable to reach out and make contact. Only when he sees Norman again at a party does he see his opportunity to escape his dismal existential prison.

The strength of this novel is the imagery of the land, and the people within the context of the lands he travels to in search of an answer to his emotions and his situation. Nonweiler is adept at using evocative words and phrases to reproduce for the reader Simon's internal, as well as external, landscape. Much like *Pilgrim's Progress* does, *That Other Realm of Freedom* charts Simon's progression to a higher level of awareness and happiness.

Simon's brooding and philosophizing

about his life seems in keeping with the setting in which the book begins. Europe has its share of brooding philosophers; France's Sartre (existentialist) and Germany's Kierkegaard (existentialist). The Gay Men's Press is the publisher and distributes gay novels and non-fiction in the U.S. European word spellings and terms are to be expected here, also.

The opening scene is in the prologue, where Simon is retreating from the world and its issues, his issues, to find comfort in the primal beginnings of the wilderness and lakes and bays of the vacation site of his family. His musings have that stream-of-consciousness quality, sometimes presented as him saying these thoughts to himself, and sometimes as seen by a totally separate observer.


The plot and structure of the book is concisely put in the four section titles, "Coming Out," "Coming to Grips," "Going Back" and "Going Forward." Generally speaking, this is the basic outline for the whole process of coming out. The time of the book is set in the late sixties, where Simon discovers the Gay Liberation Front building in America. Occasionally, the leaps forward in time in Simon's life are disconcerting, but necessary to summarize the progress of his life.

That advantage of gay people coming

out is ever-constant, for each time a gay person comes out, there are no guidelines. The first steps are often done without help. Each person sees people and relationships anew. Simon learns this and thinks, "It was indeed time for him to look at the relationships between women and men more closely, in order to understand the relationships amongst men."

Though some gay novels contain all gay characters, some with gay and non-gay characters, few often develop the depth of interaction between those characters. Nonweiler extensively includes the feedback from non-gay characters to Simon's progress of enlightenment. He recreates, for Simon to see, the "possession of object" attitudes men feel about women, when Simon dresses as a woman at a costume party.

Nonweiler, like many others, taps the infinite capacity in human affairs for drama, big and little. His understated approach intensifies the impact on the reader. In keeping with the dark tone of the novel, Simon maintains his lingering dissatisfaction and unease, always searching for "the answer," vaguely sensing the futility of reaching a final solution.

Simon does realize that "... he was still learning, still coming to understand. And from understanding came strength. And a strength to be shared."

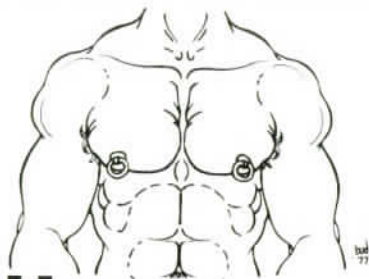

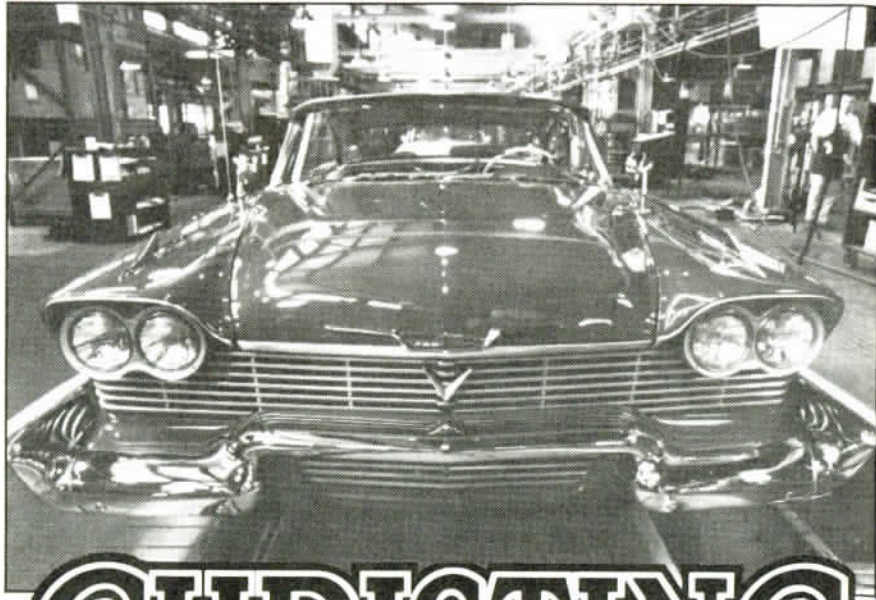

A PLYMOUTH FURY FEMME FATALE

Christine is this year's car movie. And one more in a long line of "teenage thriller" films out this season. *Christine* is a little better than most. Not by much, but just a little.

In case you haven't figured it out yet, Christine is a killer car. But you knew that by the previews and ads, didn't you? What you didn't know was that this one is almost worth watching. Christine can (a) drive herself, (b) make people choke, (c) rebuild herself, and most importantly (d) never forgets an insult.

Christine's owner is Arnie Cunningham, your typical Wally the Wimp until Christine comes into his life and makes him into a walking imitation of Elvis Presley with a bad attitude. Arnie is played by Keith Gordon, a 22-year-old New Yorker who has some nice credits to his name. *Jaws 2*, *All That Jazz*, *Dressed to Kill*, lots and lots of Broadway, off-Broadway, and repertory theatre. You don't like Arnie in this film, and that's too bad because if you don't like Arnie, you don't care what happens to him.

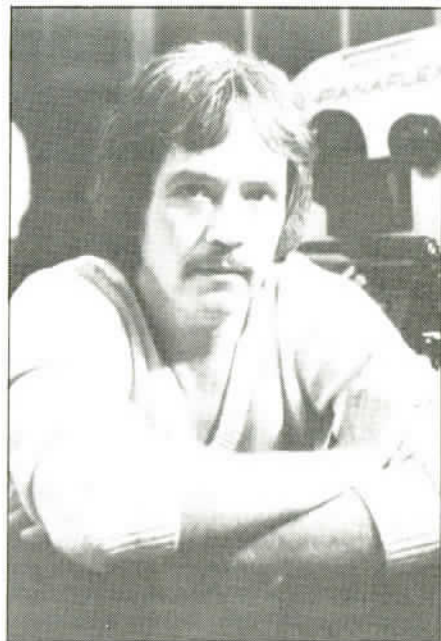
You do care about his friend, Dennis, though. Dennis is Galveston's own John Stockwell. Nice-looking guy who does a good job. Stockwell is believable in a role that's not real easy to do. He doesn't have a whole lot of credits to flaunt yet (the soap *The Guiding Light* and the Houston Shakespearean Festival were the top two), but he can act. Hopefully he'll move on to better roles.

None of the other actors are worth a mention; they didn't do much, and what they did they didn't do well.

The director of photography should get a pat on the back, though. One of the things that lifts *Christine* above her competition is the nice photography. Sleek shots of Christine about to cream someone or driving along the road while she's on fire, or the scenes where she rebuilds herself are really nice pieces of work.

Overall the film rates only a C-, despite the national reviews that it's getting which claim it's slick, funny and scary. It is slick, but only in spots, and I didn't laugh or jump once.

SUDDEN IMPACT

BLEEDING-HEART LIBERALS BEWARE!

It was the most excitement Houston had seen since Travolta busted his balls on the bull at Gilley's. Two girls in the theater row behind me reiterated throughout *Sudden Impact* how Clint, live and in person, had shaken their very hands. Their male companions repeatedly exclaimed, "What a cool dude. And wow, those eyes are steel blue." I'm not actually in the business of monitoring other folks' conversations, but there was little else to do. The film's dialogue was not the deep and intricate kind, so listening to my neighbors melting away did not exactly put me in danger of miss-

ing out on major plot shifts.

At a time Sean Connery considers ripe to don the Bond wig again and a time Herr Schwarzenegger deems appropriate to re-flex his muscles for a Conan encore, can we blame Clint Eastwood if he wants to throw dirt over his recently developed mellow-man image of *Bronco Billy* and *Honkytonk Man* that proved equally tame at the box office? After 13 years he's Dirty Harry again, for the fourth time. And in 13 years the concept hasn't changed. Any individual is capable of making Dirty's day if he gives him a chance to blow him away.


The peaceful San Francisco Bay area is disturbed by a string of brutal slayings in which the hapless slayees ritually receive the first gun blast in the gen-

tal area—that's what I call a low blow—before they graphically get their brains blown out. The neutering maniac is a female (Sandra Locke), who 10 years after a gang rape ordeal, presents her violators with the bill. And no, she does not accept check or charge or mercy pleas. Harry Callahan, the tough cop and walking combat zone, meanwhile is on her track. In the process he encounters over a dozen ugly thugs whom he politely greets with his magnum.

Whenever we feel they should have run out of villains in that part of the country, director Eastwood introduces a new group of hoodlums if only to splatter their guts five minutes later. *Impact* is predictably violent and dramaturgically predictable. The acting of Mr. Eastwood and Ms. Locke is one-dimension-

ally sternfaced.

In addition, you'll have the chance to encounter the ugliest dog ever seen on screen. The repulsive looking pet appears injured after one altercation which triggers the only outburst of sorrow by Houston's world premiere audience. How's that for priorities?

Impact's gala opening benefitted the American Paralysis Association. The movie itself seemed sponsored by the National Rifle Association. By the way, Mr. Eastwood, in his black-tie premiere attire, did not shake my hand, a fact for which I blame the pushy, enthusiastic crowd. Allow me to confess, however, that I had hoped, deep down inside, from one Dirty Harry to another, for a gentle dry kiss on the cheek.

Can you believe this?—Film director **Peter Bogdanovich**, who directed Miss Stratten in 1981's *They All Laughed*, is preparing a book called *The*

Killing of the Unicorn—a memoir of Dorothy Stratten. I can hardly wait for the TV series!

PLAYLIST — If you are in the market for a new **John Lennon** and **Yoko Ono** album, be aware that *Heart Play—Unfinished Dialogue*, released recently by Polygram, consists of 42 minutes of conversation edited from a 22-hour *Playboy* interview conducted shortly before Lennon's death in 1980. IN MEMORIAM — **Perez Prado**, the "Mambo King" of the fifties, died December 5 at the age of 57. A Cuban who adopted Italy as his second home, Prado hit the top of the American pop charts in 1958 with "Patricia"—four years later he gave us "Patricia Twist." . . . Film director **Robert Aldrich** also died December 5—he was 65. Best known for the 1962 Bette Davis/Joan Crawford vehicle *Whatever Happened to Baby Jane?* and the 1967 action classic *The Dirty Dozen*, Aldrich early in his career assisted several of the screen's greatest talents—among them **Charlie Chaplin**, **Jean Renoir**, **Joseph Losey** and **Orson Welles**. . . . It is perhaps doubtful that anyone with a name like **Louis Bert Lindley, Jr.** could have become one of the most instantly recognizable and beloved character actors of all time, but **Louis Bert Lindley, Jr.**, who became **Slim**

Pickens, did. As a child he began performing in rodeos, eventually becoming one of rodeo's top riders. In 1950 he made his film debut in an Errol Flynn horse opera called *Rocky Mountain*. Although Pickens was frequently typecast in western "sidekick" roles, it is his performance as the missile-riding General T.J. "King" Kong in 1964's *Dr. Strangelove* that will be remembered as long as there is movie history. . . . Speaking of movie history—and particularly *Hollywood* history—now might be a good time for us to respectfully salute the passing of the legendary Schwab's drugstore, which closed its starusted doors in October. Regardless of whether or not **Lana Turner** was discovered sitting at the soda fountain, Schwab's was a bonafide American institution which had witnessed and played host to Hollywood's golden era.

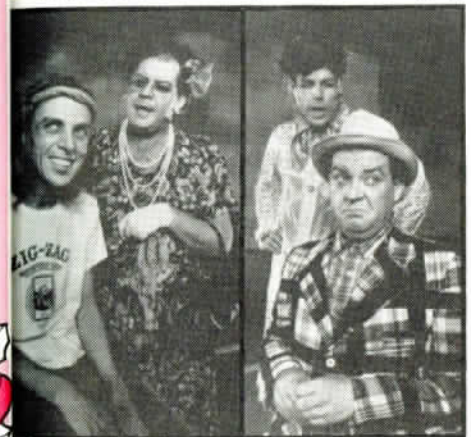

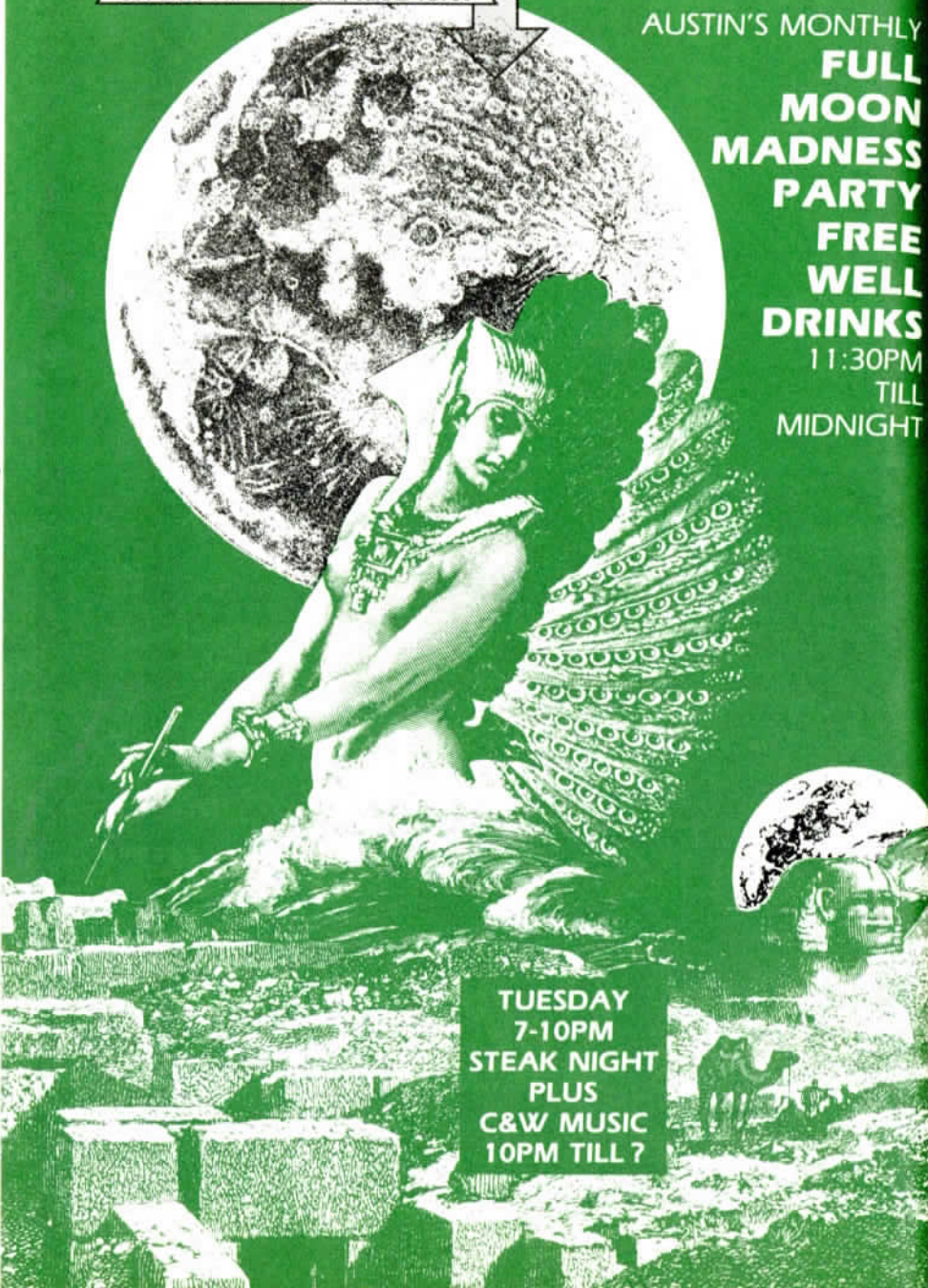

The Week of Dec. 16-22

LUNAR ECLIPSE: Next Monday, December 19, there will be a penumbral eclipse of the Moon which means the Moon will pass only through the penumbra—the partially illuminated outer portion of the earth's shadow. This will be the last eclipse—partial and total—of the Moon visible in the U.S. for several years to come.
