## THE OAK LAWN HOLIDAY GATHERING

DALLAS — The Dallas Gay Alliance held their annual Oak Lawn Holiday Gathering on the grounds of the Dallas City Library, Oak Lawn branch, on Saturday evening, December 10. Highlight of the event was the lighting of the 15-foot Christmas tree, donated to the Oak Lawn community by DGA.

Mike Stewart, president of DGA, presided over the festivities, which included the playing of seasonal music by the Oak Lawn Symphonic Band and speeches by City Councilmember Paul Fielding and by Rev. Don Eastman, minister of the Metropolitan Community Church. It was a very impressive and festive sharing, Alan Gellman of TWT NEWS/Dallas reported.

A presentation of toys which had been collected was made to Mack Hazley, representing The Family Place. The DGA had once again sponsored the annual "Toys For Tots" campaign, which benefits The Family Place, a home for battered women and their children.

At the gathering, Hazley pointed out that the toys collected last year by DGA "were enough to be used at Christmas as well as for birthdays of children for six months."

After the community Christmas tree was lighted by Fielding, with the assistance of Stewart's two children, those in attendance joined in singing carols, led by members of the Turtle Creek Chorale, Alan Ross, DGA director, described.

## COUNCILMEMBERS AID AUSTIN AIDS

AUSTIN — City councilmembers Mark Spaeth and John Trevino have been recognized by the Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus (ALGPC) for facilitating the local AIDS resolution approved by the City Council on November 3.

"The timely resolution came after Austin experienced its first AIDS-related death, and called for increased federal funds for research into the causes and possible cure of AIDS," ALGPC explained to TWT NEWS/Austin.

In an effort to further provide accurate information to both the gay and non-gay public of the capitol city, ALGPC announced it will sponsor an AIDS Awareness Week, most likely in March 1984. A secondary goal of the week will be to raise funds for the local fight against AIDS, Janna Zumbrum explained.

"All local lesbian and gay organizations and businesses are invited to participate with the caucus in a variety of activities being planned for AIDS Awareness Week," Mary Summerall stated.

Some of the ideas under discussion have included an educational forum, a women's blood drive, AIDS programs on local television and radio talk shows, and a cocktail party/silent auction fundraiser. For participation, contact Zumbrum at (512) 441-1130.

## M. ROBERT SCHWAB SUCCUMBS TO AIDS

HOUSTON — M. Robert Schwab, Ph.D., noted civil rights attorney, died December 15 at his home in Houston, of AIDS. Schwab, 36, as founder of the Texas Human Rights Foundation (THRF), was the chief strategist behind the landmark case of Baker vs Wade, in which the Texas Homosexual Conduct Statute was ruled unconstitutional.

Schwab was a national leader in the gay rights movement, and held many positions, including co-founder of the Houston Gay Political Caucus, co-

founder of the National Education Foundation for Individual Rights, co-founder of the Gay Rights National Lobby, and co-founder of the American Bar Association Committee of Gay Rights.

Schwab is survived by his mother, Mrs. Esther Schwab of Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and a sister, Mrs. Charlene Touby of Miami, Florida.

A memorial service is planned for Sunday, January 8, 1984 at the Rothko Chapel, 3900 Yoakum. Contributions, in lieu of flowers, may be made to THRF, 3128 Lemmon Ave. East, #304, Dallas, Texas 75204.

## AHRC ELECTS 1984 OFFICIALS

SAN ANTONIO — The Alamo Human Rights Committee, a political action group formed earlier this year to endorse pro-gay candidates, held its election of officers Monday, December 12 at the El Jardin club.

The chairperson for the new year is to be Tony Zule, with Lollie Johnson being elected to the position of vice-chair, Tim Ramm of TWT NEWS/San Antonio reported.

Other elected members are Toby Johnson, Place 3; Lin Murrey, Place 4; Michael Stevens, Place 5; Ed Buckmaster, Place 6; Clint Harris, Place 7; Doug Richardson, Place 8; and Barbara Habard, Place 9.

The next AHRC meeting will be Monday, January 16, 1984 at LZ's, beginning at 7:00pm. Topics to be discussed at the outset of the new year will be a membership recruiting drive and the strategy for a six-month game plan. Past achievements, along with past problems, will also be addressed.

AHRC said they are looking for "mature, thinking individuals" who are interested in politics or who would like to become more informed about local politics.

AHRC, still in its first year, has chalked up a 100% batting average of endorsing candidates who won all 1983 elections, a spokesperson said.

WATERLOO CENTER**

AUSTIN — A Halloween party at the Sheraton Crest, hosted by Jim Amick, Mark Bible, Patrick Carew, Milton Casady, Paul Clover, Jim Johnston, Bill Lowke, Scott Michaud, John Schiro and Bud Twilley, netted \$800 for the new Waterloo Counseling Center, Inc. in Austin.

Clover, trustee of the center, told Jay Cherin of TWT NEWS/Austin that the center is being modeled after the Oak Lawn Counseling Center of Dallas and the Montrose Counseling Center of Houston. The thrust of Waterloo is to supply the mental health needs of the gay community in this city. Clover said, "The center will try to get away from the peer counseling type work, and work directly with people's personal needs."

Waterloo is presently involved with other organizations in Austin, such as Womenspace, Austin Lambda, area gay churches and the Lambda Speakers Bureau. Clover also explained that the center wished to become part of the Austin/Travis County AIDS Task Force, which consists of representatives from local organizations, community leaders and health department officials.

Waterloo is currently searching for a permanent location, looking to do so in the early part of the new year, Cherin reported. Clover added that another fundraiser will be held next spring. For further information about Waterloo, contact Clover at (512) 451-4222.

**MONTROSE CLINIC  
NEEDS DOCTORS**

**AIDS FORUM  
ON DALLAS TV**

DALLAS — Much praise has been extended to the University of Texas Health Science Center of this city, and Warner-Amex cable television, for their live discussion of AIDS on Tuesday, December 13.

The program, a first for the Dallas/Fort Worth metroplex, featured a panel of experts. It was an opportunity for viewers to call in their many questions about the health issue that has affected so many gays.

Unfortunately, Qube Cable of Dallas did not start transmitting the program on channel 9 until it was well underway. Therefore, many viewers missed part of the forum, Robert Araya of TWT NEWS/Dallas reported.

The questions from the viewers were very pertinent and of much interest. Dr. Kevin Murphy was both frank and direct in his responses, making very enlightening statements. Moderator Janier Friar was expert in her balancing of viewers' calls with formal discussion, many observers noted.

The program, TWT NEWS/Dallas learned from Warner-Amex, is to be repeated several times. "It should not be missed," Dallas Gay Alliance, a sponsoring agent for the forum, insisted.

**TWO FRIENDS  
WANTED GAY VOTE**

HOUSTON — The real difficulty facing the gay community in the just-concluded Hall/van Hightower campaign was the plain fact that "two friends" were campaigning for our vote.

For many, this was hard to handle emotionally. For the first time, we had two friends to choose from, who were running for the same office. In the past, it had been different and clear cut. Usually, only one candidate had emerged as being pro-gay.

This time, both candidates were pro-gay, pro-human rights, and pro-minority rights. Both had sought the GPC endorsement. Both had come to GPC's endorsement meeting. Hall had scored higher, but van Hightower had received a majority endorsement by the membership.

It was, to put it clearly, "a fortunate predicament." There remain those in the GPC who still maintain that the only politically wise thing to have done was to have issued a dual endorsement.

But the deed was done. What was unfortunate in this campaign was that some supporters tore down one friend in order to hopefully boost the stature of the other. That was wrong.

What was fortunate, however, in this campaign, and what many have failed to realize, is that, win or lose, either way with either candidate, the gay community still won because both candidates have always had the best interests of minority rights, human rights and gay rights in both their hearts and their platforms.

Was the GPC pleased with the election? "Yes," responded GPC president Larry Bagernis. "We carried our own precincts." And that is true. Although Hall won the city, van Hightower still took two-thirds of the Montrose vote.

"I, too, was proud of the gay bloc vote again," said past GPC president Lee Harrington. "It always sends the clearest of messages, even to friendly politicians, that lots of voters expect attention."

It must be remembered, however, that in this sometimes bitter campaign, there was a sizeable slice of the gay community—likely one-quarter to one-third—who stood stalwart and voted contrary to the GPC bloc. Therefore, on election night, while many gays were disappointed in van Hightower's loss, there were still many others who were jubilant at Hall's victory.

The days of always having only one clear-cut endorsement are over. As more and more pro-gay candidates seek the gay vote, we will have even more friends from which to choose.

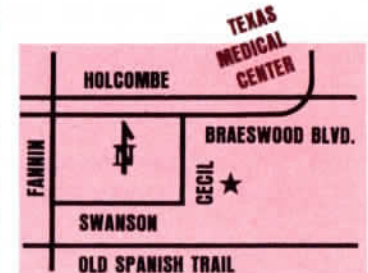
For instance, what if the next election, Whitmire, Lalor and Tinsley all decided to run for mayor. Which of our "three" friends would we endorse?

In rebuttal and clarification of the misrepresentations presented by Mr. Scotty Roberts [TWT COMMENT, Vol. 9, No. 38], the following must be said.

On October 26 I was taken to District Court #174 of Harris County, Texas. I was

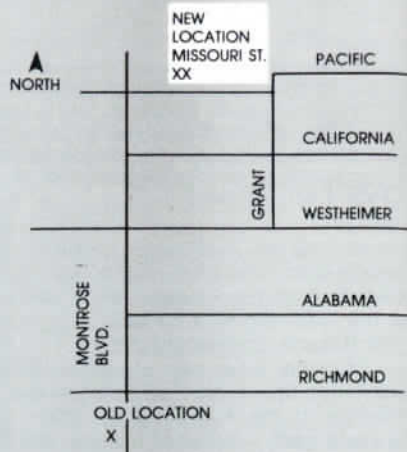

approached at that time by [a] Deputy (Bailliff) . . . in regards to performing oral sex on him. I was quite shocked and fearful and complied with his demands at that time.

After careful consideration and forethought, I decided to file a complaint after my attorney . . . would not do anything in regards to this. I dismissed my attorney . . . and retained [another attorney]. The first occasion I was to see [my new] attorney was when I was called to the Professional Standards Unit of Harris County Sheriff's Dept. I asked that [the] Deputy not be notified as to my complaint (because I was going to court again on November 17).

On my return visit to P.S.U. I was given a polygraph, during which no one was present to represent me, and I was informed I was lying. I was by this time terribly distraught and extremely worried that my life might be in jeopardy at that time.

The officers in P.S.U. told me that nothing would be said to the officer until I gave them permission to continue the complaint.

November 17, on my return visit to Court (Dist. #174) the officer bailiff . . . once again approached me. This time he left his gun on and I complied. When the officer climaxed I kept his semen in my mouth and spit it into some paper towels. I then turned over the evidence to P.S.U. I was then placed in solitary confinement. My court date was reset to December 1.

On December 1, I was given three years in TDC after my attorney told me he felt sure my probation would be reinstated. I have put my case on appeal and asked for an appeal bond. So at which time upon my release I can return to work and make good my restitution for the original case and also to file a civil suit against Harris County.

I would like to appeal to the gay community at this time for assistance. The people of Harris County have every right to know what goes on and I feel that my calls to the National Gay Rights Lobby and the National Gay Task Force will be positively answered.

I have always searched for the truth and always felt the gay community deserves better from those we employ (city employees and county employees). I am available for further comment. Pedro Tijerina IV

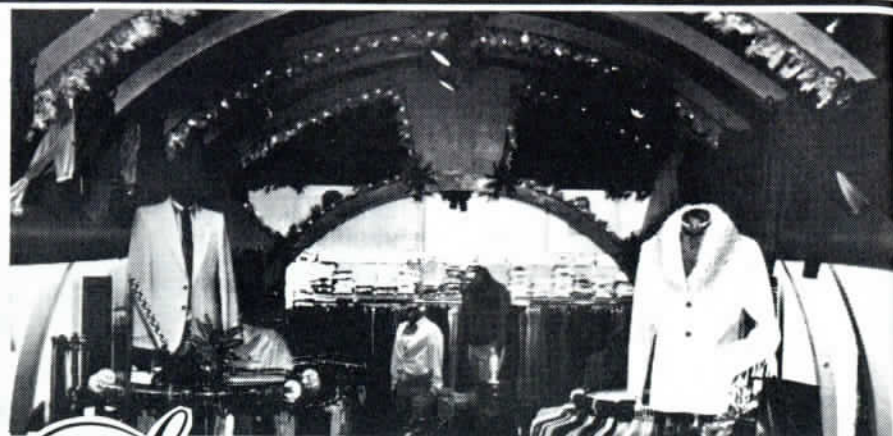

Potpourri—2.) a miscellaneous mixture; a medley; a hodgepodge. This is a more accurately descriptive word to use for the book edited by Michael J. Smith than anthology, because of its wide variety of literary and artistic forms contained within. It is "an anthology of short stories, personal reminiscences, interviews, political articles, poems, photos

and art—from the most scholarly to the most explicit, by 43 writers and artists."

This is a rich cross-section of experiences of black and white gay men. The depth of "the black and interracial gay experience in White America" is great. The stories record how extensive these relationships are in America, and includes a historical record of the beginnings of the gay interracial experiences in Harlem during the Roaring '20's. This is the first article, "T'aint Nobody's Business," by Eric Garber.

This is an excellent sourcebook that taps the interracial consciousness of black and white gay men, and includes a couple from South Africa discussing

apartheid in that country. The editor, Smith, also writes of Glenn Burke, the baseball player on the Los Angeles Dodgers, who came out involuntarily when it was clear most of his teammates and the organization knew he was gay.

The abstract issues some may hear about are personalized here as Thom Beame talks of "Racism from a Black Perspective." Joe DeMarco writes about "Gay Racism." Unfortunately, being gay does not sensitize many oppressed white gay men to the equal oppression black men experience due to the color. Smith writes of racism in the gay press in a story entitled "No Blacks."

The spirituality of the gay experiences is captured in the poems present. Leonard Patterson writes of his life as a gay person trying to live a religious life at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia, where he listened to the sermons of Rev. Martin Luther King, Sr.

This anthology would not be complete without an interview of Smith, who is also the founder of Black and White Men Together (BWMT), by Beame. Smith is a white gay man whose awareness of racism was raised by *The Autobiography of Malcolm X*. He discusses racism in the gay community and society at large, and a short history of the International Association of BWMT and its present status and composition.

Smith is also the editor of *Quarterly*, a magazine "which promotes the interests of the more than 100 interracial and Third World gay and lesbian groups." It is only natural that BWMT would gain members, owing to the facts that the black civil rights campaigns were the pattern for the gay civil rights campaign and that religious leaders spoke up for gay people, even down to the slogans, e.g. "Black Is Beautiful" and "Gay Is Good."

The wide assortment of short stories record a life or make a point, some with a stream-of-consciousness style, no punctuation or capital letters, simply thoughts as they float by in the writer's mind. Some are explicitly sexual, some are fantasies, some are action sequences. What is curiously absent in the short stories is the raw anger evoked by racism and discrimination.

This is a very valuable beginning and exploration of the issues surrounding interracial gays and black-on-black couples. Rather than providing one side to the issues, these works give us a multi-dimensional view. It is illustrative of the talent in several mediums to evoke gay imagery in words, pictures and poetry. It makes a statement that can be clearly presented to the gay and non-gay world in an effort to inform and help others understand, and accept. **W**

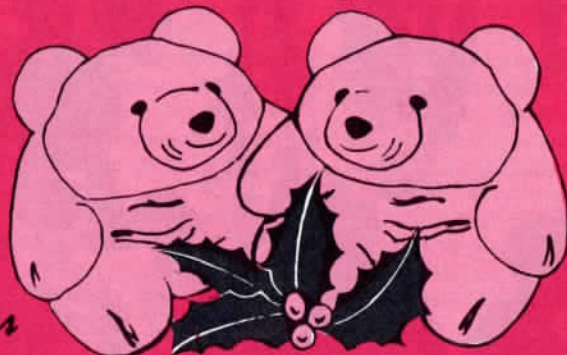

# YENTL

## A PIECE OF THE SKY

Barbra Streisand may have produced, directed, co-written, and starred in *Yentl*, but the movie is Mandy Patinkin's show from start to finish.

Broadway's Che Guevara in *Evita*, Mandy Patinkin is outstanding as Avigdor in *Yentl*. He is funny, loving, beautiful, sensual, charming, aggressive, and out and out perfection. I haven't seen an actor give such an appealing performance since Paul Newman was 30.

Avigdor is Yentl's ally, friend, study partner and object of desire. One look

at Avigdor and I was in love too. If you see *Yentl* and don't come away impressed with Patinkin's looks, talent, and charm, pinch yourself because you are most likely dead.

Barbra, of course, gives a good performance as the title character, and any less powerful actress would have been blown off screen by Patinkin's presence, but Streisand held steady.

*Yentl* is based on the story "Yentl, the Yeshiva Boy" by Isaac Bashevis Singer and follows Yentl as she strives to study (something that was denied to women in turn of the century Eastern Europe). After her father's death, Yentl disguises herself as a man and enters a Yeshiva (a Jewish school). There she meets Avigdor.

Avigdor introduces Yentl to Hadass, played by the angelic, poetic-looking Amy Irving. Hadass and Avigdor are sup-

posed to be married, but Yentl ends up being the "man" Hadass falls in love with.

Irving is really the image of beauty as she flutters around, straightening things on the table, putting Avigdor's napkin on his lap, being all the things that she is supposed to be, which as Yentl observes is only beautiful and quiet.

Yentl is neither beautiful nor quiet. In one of the few songs in the movie that are worth listening to, "No Wonder," Yentl examines the difference between being a person concerned with the reality of life and being a mindless, but beautiful bimbo. Thankfully, Yentl chooses to be a person.

There are a few things wrong with the movie. The music for starters. Most of it is only a device to move the story along. Voiceovers would have done as

well. The father, played by Nehemiah Persoff, is rather underwritten.

And Streisand never, ever looks like a boy. Not even close. Plus I really expected something like *Gone With the Wind*, *The Wizard of Oz*, and *Showboat*, all wrapped into one, after Streisand spent so much time and money on this project. Instead it's just a good movie, much better done than most, but just a very good movie.

It is one of the best movies out this year, and Streisand should get a few nominations for all the quality craftsmanship that went into it. Patinkin, too.

Applause for Streisand, who directed, produced, and co-wrote and did it all very, very well. Her acting is, of course, strong and polished. There isn't a weak spot in her performance either behind or in front of the camera. *continued*

# SCARFACE

## PACINO IS PERFECT

Wanna see a perfect movie? See *Scarface*. If you only see one film this season, you must see *Scarface*. Pacino is perfection.

The film was given an X rating earlier because of the extreme violence, but has been edited to a rather mild version of a "gangster" movie. I was expecting guts, gore and blood; instead, a couple of people get slapped around and a few guys get shot. Nothing any stronger than an old *Starsky and Hutch* rerun.

Around Pacino is one of the strongest casts to be assembled in years. No one is weak or underplayed. First is Steven Bauer, who captures all the style, flash and dim-witted brilliance that a drug dealer needs. He is too good looking and really portrays the essence of Manny Ray, Scarface's right-hand man and best friend with just a look or a sigh. He, along with Scarface, goes from being a rough, coarse Cuban peasant to being Mr. Cool with a mansion and a Porsche. I believed him every step of the way.

Next, and too quickly, is Pepe Serna, last seen in *The Ballad of Gregorio Cortez*. Serna is the embodiment of a puppy-like eagerness that plays so well on screen. He is killed early in the film, but makes his mark as another one of Pacino's sidekicks.

The three come to America as part of

the Cuban crime-wave that hit Miami when Castro let thousands of Cubans immigrate during a few crazy weeks in 1980. Most of the Cubans were hard-working people who came to join family or friends already in America, but a few were criminals, dregs of a bitter society. One of the worst was, of course, Scarface.

Scarface comes to Miami and gets a job washing dishes, but quickly moves on to being a hit man and drug dealer. He has a perverse version of the American dream and goes after it with both barrels.

Pacino is perfect from start to finish. His accent, his growth as a gangster, his walk, his complex set of laws outside the law, his halfway incestuous relationship with his sister, his sense of humor, his paranoid fear, the look in his eyes, his view of truth ("I always tell the truth,

even when I'm lying, I'm telling the truth.") all come together to make Scarface a real, breathing, living person.

Never are Pacino or Bauer or the men around them stereotypes. They are the men that many of us, Hispanics who left the barrios, thought we left behind. Pacino's Scarface is real and true to life. The cast is able to capture the spirit of Cuban drug dealers without making them cartoon characters or stereotypes. Even the women are played down to the smallest detail: The color of fingernail polish or warrior makeup were obviously researched and portrayed with respect to a culture that is different and intriguing.

This is *the* movie of the year, and if you miss it, you'll be missing the best performances on screen to come your way in a long time.

## SLOW-MOVING MYSTERY

*Gorky Park*, an Orion Pictures production starring William Hurt, Lee Marvin, Brian Dennehy and Joanna Pacula, is a slow-moving mystery with few surprises. In fact, the only real mystery is how Joanna Pacula got a part in a film in the first place. With Hurt, Marvin and Dennehy all doing credible jobs as cops, militiamen or smugglers, Pacula stinks as a "beautiful girl" (what a role description).

*Gorky Park* is about the murder of three young people who are buried in the middle of Moscow's version of Central Park. They are murdered, KGB-style, and buried with their faces and fingerprints scraped off. Hurt plays Arkady, the mili-

tiaman, who is investigating the crime. Along the way he meets Marvin, as Osborne, an American intent on smuggling live sables out of Russia. Dennehy is the brother of one of the murdered and a New York detective who has come to Moscow on his own revenge mission. Pacula was friends with the three dead people, and is at the center of the circle of lies and untruths that surround and confuse Arkady, as he tries to find the murderer.

Hurt's portrayal of Arkady is cool, uncomplicated; he's just a militiaman doing his job. As convincing as Hurt is, Arkady lacks the intense, passionate, raw power that other screen ice men (Eastwood, Pacino, Bronson, Newman) can bring to their characters. Hurt is able to make Arkady vulnerable and handsome, but not appealing.

Marvin and Dennehy come closer to the mark as they make their characters real and respectable. You may not like

Osborne, but you have to admit that he does his job very, very well. Dennehy, too, makes his New York cop, Kirwill, believable.

Only Pacula is miscast. She can't act, and worse yet, she isn't even very pretty. Her version of Irina is terrible. She comes off as a sniveling, stubborn, ignorant little idiot whose main goal in life (amidst murder, KGB spy rings and attacks on her life) is to get Arkady or Osborne or anybody in bed. Even after Arkady makes love to her, she doesn't trust him and won't help him in the investigation. Finally, Arkady loses his temper and slaps her around; I felt like cheering.

Based on the novel by Martin Cruz Smith, the movie is slow. Don't expect intrigue or mystery. Do expect Hurt, Marvin and Dennehy to give solid, though not outstanding, performances. You should also expect to see Pacula give one of the worst debut performances of the season.

The play is **Noel Coward's *Private Lives***. Put quite simply, the storyline is this. There's this couple. They break up and "remarry." This leads to the inevitable confrontation of the two newly-revised couples, and the problems which ensue. This is all somewhat comparable to the

My only really generous complaint with the play is not with the cast, but rather with the way the characters were portrayed. Once again, we have the stereotypical limp-wristed faggot staring deeply into his equally nelly lover's eyes and pleadingly begs, "Kiss me." "Yuk-pooey," I expertly say.

The staging of the show was masterfully done, and the directing was superb.

The catch to all this wonderment is

The two organizations' theatrical network will encompass **PACE's** theatrical operations in **Houston, San Antonio, Dallas, Nashville, Memphis and Louisville**, and **Bufman's** operations throughout Florida and the **Lunt-Fontanne** on Broadway. It will also include the **Bufman-PACE** jointly operated **Saenger Performing Arts Center** in New Orleans.

Their combined theatres will represent nearly 100,000 season subscribers with a strong 1984 anticipated gross of approximately \$40 million. They will also provide financing and be involved in the production and booking of major national touring companies which, during the first year, is expected to include co-productions with the **Nederlander Organization of Nine, On Your Toes** and **Jerry Herman's** musical revue, *Jerry's Girls*, with an all-star cast headed by **Carol Channing**, all three of which are penciled into **Nederlander** subscription series in LA, San Francisco, San Diego and Detroit.

At the heart of the operation lies the concept of a 13-theatre chain that by 1985 is anticipated to grow into 20, as each of the two companies continue to acquire additional venues across the country. Plans already on the drawing board for the group's combined network will ultimately provide playing time for

over 40 weeks for the average touring musical.

Most of the theatre's yield a seating capacity of between 2,000 and 3,000, including **Jesse Jones Hall** and the **Music Hall** in Houston. Smaller theatres, such as Houston's **Tower Theatre** and Dallas' **Majestic**, can also offer 12 to 15 weeks for straight plays and smaller musicals.

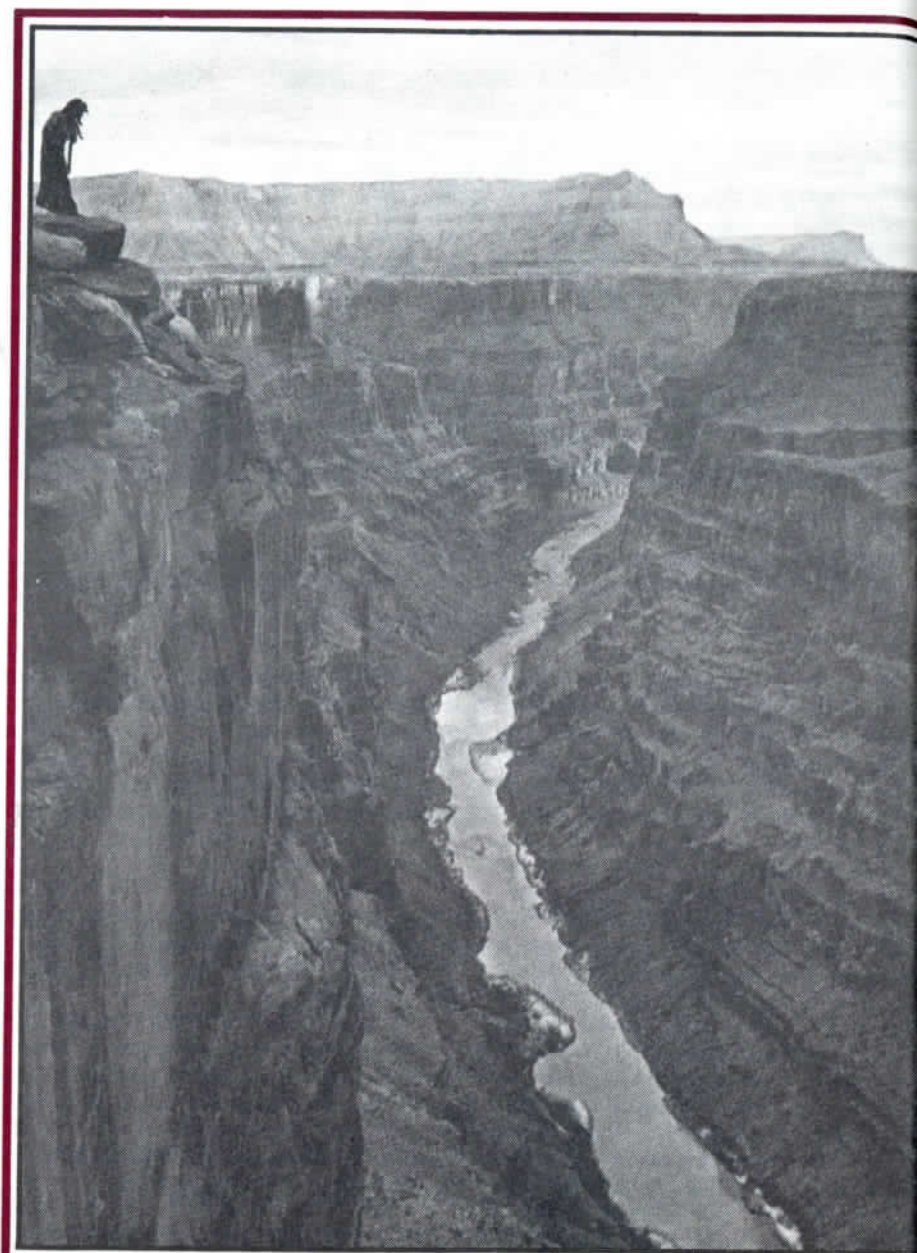
**WHERE HE LIVES**—I live in San Francisco. I'm from there. I've lived there 30 years now.

I also keep finding friends who show me how to be honest, sincere, conniving, resourceful and climb back up on the cliff.

Living on the edge of the world isn't easy, but I gotta admit—the view is wonderful.

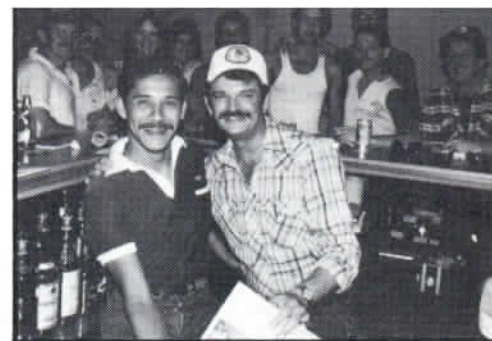
