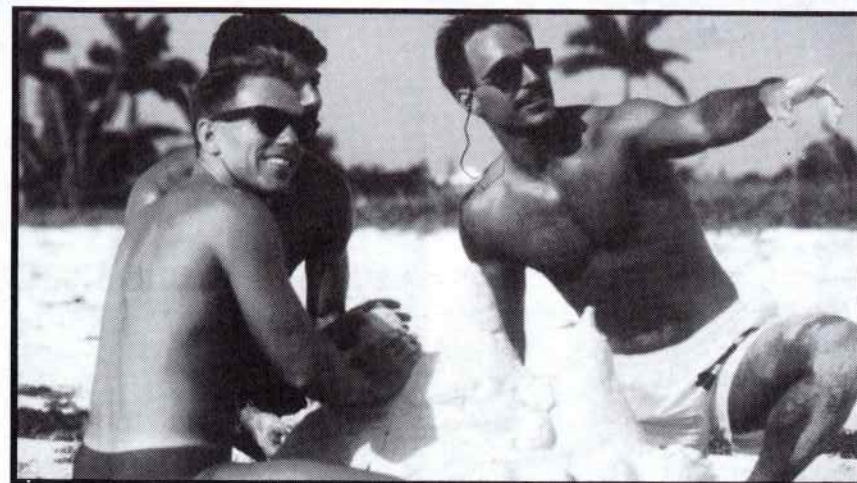

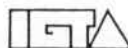

TOP NEWS STORIES OF 1992

In this first edition of TWT NEWS for the new year, our editorial staff, following tradition, has taken its annual look back into the 92nd year of the century.

On the following pages are the top news stories of 1992—a chronicle of the year's most important news developments from the perspective of the gay and lesbian community of Texas. These stories were selected on the basis of how they related to issues of greatest concern to gay and lesbian people in Texas.

TWT NEWS wishes a happy New Year to all of our readers across the state of Texas.

WINS, LOSSES FOR GAY-BACKED CANDIDATES IN NOVEMBER ELECTIONS

Beginning with the Republican National Convention held in Houston last August, and lasting through the final heated moments of the campaign season, the political process that ended with Bill Clinton's election to the highest office in the land was both arduous and sometimes painful—both for the candidates themselves and for the American electorate, which was forced to watch three intelligent men reduce themselves to the juvenile tactics of a schoolyard scuffle.

Texans were particularly susceptible to the effects of the Clinton/Bush/Perot debacle, both because of the GOP's revival-style confab in the Bayou City and because of the importance placed on the Lone Star State's electoral votes. At times it seemed that even candidates for dog catcher were descending upon Texas to make their opinions known, and to court the estimated eight million registered voters living within our state's far-flung borders.

At no time was the separation and disparity between our leaders in Washington and the general populace more obvious than at the GOP National Convention. Speakers ranging from Pat Buchanan and Pat Robertson to Vice-President Dan Quayle and former President Ronald Rea-

gan espoused "family values." These values, while held close to the hearts of conservative Republicans, no more represent the current state of the American family than a family portrait taken in the former Soviet Union. It was this very proselytizing, however, that ultimately proved to be the Republicans' downfall.

A demonstration organized and led by ACT UP the first night of the convention, numbering over 1,000, was confronted by Houston police and corralled into a closed-off area. Several protesters were arrested, and others were beaten in what the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force termed "part of a pattern of violence against gays, lesbians, people with AIDS and other minorities."

While the Presidential race occupied the minds of most voters, there were several significant down-ballot races in Texas whose results will ultimately shape the destiny of the state's gay and lesbian community. Most of the races in question were for all-important judicial positions. Rose Spector and incumbent Oscar H. Mauzy, who had both been endorsed by gay and lesbian political groups in their campaigns for the Texas Supreme Court, were considered vital to the community's efforts to abolish 21.06, the state's anti-sodomy statute, and to stem the tide of negative sentiment toward gay rights legislation.

On election night, it was difficult to mask the euphoria most gay and lesbian Texans felt as the returns were calculated. President Bush was soundly defeated, bringing an end to 12 years of Republican

presidencies with poor to dismal records on gay, AIDS and women's issues. Of particular significance on the state level was the defeat of Judge Jack Hampton, the jurist who admitted he had given a lighter sentence to a convicted murderer because his victims were gay. Spector's election to the Supreme Court, however, was balanced by Mauzy's loss of his seat on the state's highest civil court.

Losses in a number of local and statewide races were not enough, however, to overshadow the general elation created by Clinton's win and triumphs in other races. Rob Bridges, co-chair of the Lesbian/Gay Democrats of Texas, said he expected to see immediate as well as long-term improvements in the status of gay and lesbian people as a result of Clinton's win.

Laurie Eiserloh, Executive Director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, summed it up best when she stated that Clinton's victory was "a tremendous boost for the lesbian/gay community. The Republicans' rhetoric of hatred really came crashing down around them."

CASE AGAINST 21.06 MAKES ITS WAY THROUGH COURTS

The ongoing fight to abolish Section 21.06 of the state Penal Code, the Texas "anti-sodomy" statute, continued in 1992 as *Morales et al. v. the State of Texas* made its way through the court system.

21.06 criminalizes sexual relations between consenting adults of the same sex, with potential punishment of a fine of up to \$500. Though it is rarely enforced, the law has been used to deny gay men and lesbians opportunities in employment, access to public accommodations, and property rights.

Last January, the Third District Court of Appeals in Austin heard oral arguments in the case. On March 11, the court handed down a unanimous decision upholding an earlier ruling by Judge Paul Davis, in December 1990, that 21.06 is unconstitutional.

Texas Attorney General Dan Morales then filed a motion for rehearing on March 26, asking the court to reconsider its decision. That motion was unanimously rejected by the court on April 8.

Morales then filed appeals with the state's two highest courts, the Texas Supreme Court and the Court of Criminal Ap-

peals, asking the courts to find that the Third District Court of Appeals had made an error in its decision upholding the unconstitutionality of 21.06.

In May, the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals, the state's highest criminal court, declined to hear the Attorney General's appeal, saying it did not have jurisdiction in the case.

The Texas Supreme Court, the state's highest civil court, is scheduled to hear oral arguments in *Morales et al. v. the State of Texas* next Tuesday, January 5. A decision by the court is expected to resolve the case once and for all, since the lawsuit alleges that 21.06 violates the Texas Constitution.

The court case against 21.06 was initiated by the Texas Human Rights Foundation, which is paying associated court costs and attorneys' fees. Co-plaintiffs in the case are Linda Morales of Houston (named plaintiff), Tom Doyal and Pat Cramer of Austin, and John Thomas and Charlotte Taft of Dallas.

'EVENT IN 3 ACTS' MAKES STOPS IN TEXAS ON NAT'L TOUR

Heart Strings, the musical and variety show that has inspired audiences across the country since its debut in Atlanta in 1986, made stops in Dallas, Houston and San Antonio as part of its 1992 tour of 35 cities. Portions of the NAMES Project AIDS Memorial Quilt were displayed in each of the cities in conjunction with the musical, and funds raised through the event remained in the host cities and were distributed to local AIDS service and educational agencies.

Billed in full as *Heart Strings*The AIDS Memorial Quilt*And You: An Event in Three Acts*, the traveling show was designed not just to raise money, but to create energy in the fight against the epidemic.

Act I was the "pep rally" portion of the event, a new production of the extravagant musical variety show staged by dozens of singers, dancers and technicians. Act II was the free public display of the panels from the AIDS Memorial Quilt, during which the names of people lost to AIDS were read aloud. Visitors were invited to inscribe the names of deceased loved ones on signature panels, or create panels

and dedicate them during the display.

Act III was a call to action. At each Quilt display, representatives of local AIDS service organizations were present to those interested in becoming more actively involved in the fight against AIDS in their communities.

In Dallas, 3,000 turned out for *An Event in Three Acts* on April 26 at the historic Majestic Theatre. The AIDS Memorial Quilt was displayed at the Tower Building at Fair Park. Funds totaling \$95,000, raised in conjunction with the Dallas stopover of *An Event in Three Acts*, were distributed to 12 local AIDS service agencies.

In Houston, *Heart Strings* played at Jones Hall on April 29. Act II, the Quilt display, was held on the campus of the University of St. Thomas May 2-4. The Houston stopover of the national touring show brought in over \$1,000,000, thanks to a broad range of community and corporate support.

In San Antonio, the Majestic Theater was host to a performance of *Heart Strings* on May 4, and the Quilt was displayed at the Henry B. Gonzales Convention Center. Local proceeds were divided between the San Antonio AIDS Foundation and the Bexar County AIDS Consortium.

OAK LAWN COALITION FORMED TO ADDRESS COMMUNITY ISSUES; ZONING PROPOSAL RAISES QUESTIONS IN HOUSTON'S MONTROSE

The Dallas City Council's decision to effect a sweeping set of changes in zoning regulations and restrictions in the Oak Lawn Special Purpose District forced a number of concerned Oak Lawn residents and business owners to take action against the City for its apparent exclusion of affected persons and businesses from the negotiation process for the new guidelines. Of particular concern were the Special Use Permits proposed by the City, which would have imposed severe restrictions on "dance halls" only in Oak Lawn.

Believing that they had been left out of the 30-month process which resulted in ordinance changes affecting them, residents

and business owners began meeting to develop strategies for countering the influence and power of the Oak Lawn Committee and Oak Lawn Forum, the two groups pressing for the restrictions on dance halls. The result was the formation of the Oak Lawn Concerned Citizens Coalition [OLCCC].

According to OLCCC treasurer Alan Ross, "The purpose of the OLCCC is to involve the neighborhood residents and businesses in issues affecting the Oak Lawn community rather than by the current methods of the select few people of the politically powerful neighborhood/business groups."

What started out as a response to exclusionary tactics by the City has since become a powerful unifying force in Oak Lawn to protect its businesses and residents, beautify the neighborhood and make it more livable for everyone. OLCCC has created an effective crime patrol, utilizing off-duty Dallas police officers, that has cut police response time and greatly reduced overall crime in the area.

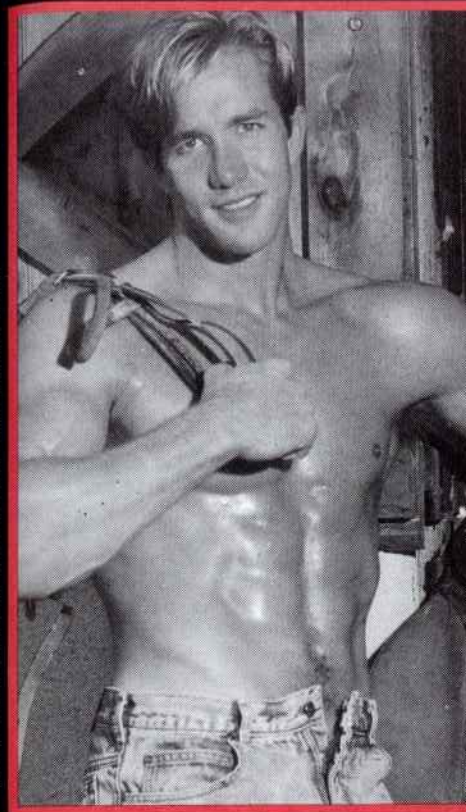
In addition, the Coalition, with the cooperation of concerned businesses, has intensified beautification efforts in the neighborhood, and has worked closely with a local elementary school to find better ways to transport and protect its students.

Future goals of the Coalition include increasing the number of officers in the crime patrol and the area they serve, and fostering closer cooperation between member and non-member businesses and individuals.

As the year came to an end, owners of gay clubs and other businesses in Houston's Montrose faced some of the same questions about their future that had earlier concerned residents and businesses of Dallas' Oak Lawn.

According to maps drawn up under a proposed zoning ordinance now under consideration by Houston City Council, some Montrose-area clubs would lie in officially designated residential areas, and would not be able to renew their alcoholic beverage licenses once they expire. Other clubs, while not faced with that problem, would still have to comply with burdensome and expensive restrictions that might threaten their existence.

In response to the threat posed by zoning restrictions, owners of gay and straight clubs in the Montrose area joined together to form the Neighborhood Business As-

sociation, to insure that their voices are heard on the issue. And they and other business and property owners attended public hearings on the zoning proposal in December, asking zoning commissioners to amend the maps and reconsider some of the restrictions the measure would impose on establishments selling alcoholic beverages.

A drive is in progress to obtain enough signatures on a petition calling for a referendum on the zoning issue. While many are convinced Houstonians will get a chance to vote on the proposal, the Neighborhood Business Association is concentrating its efforts for the moment on grandfathering existing businesses and calling attention to the severe financial burdens zoning would impose.

GREATER HOUSTON HIV ALLIANCE SURVIVES LOSS OF FEDERAL FUNDING

The Greater Houston HIV Alliance [GHHA] lost most of its federal funding in 1992 when Harris County Commissioners voted last July to place under County control nearly \$6 million in Ryan White Emergency Care Act funding. The County also hired away the group's Executive Director, Sue Cooper, and took control of files and computer equipment.

The move, engineered by Harris County Judge Jon Lindsay, created concerns about the agency's viability. But the TDH Care Consortium, a group of local AIDS service providers, voted to allow the Alliance (then known as the Greater Houston AIDS Alliance) to continue to administer \$2.3 million in state and federal grants, thus enabling the agency to survive, though in scaled-down form.

Lindsay attempted to justify his move by claiming that conflicts of interest among Alliance board members endangered federal funding for AIDS in Harris County. He also charged that some board members were trying to "micromanage" the Alliance's day-to-day affairs.

Alliance members retorted that Lindsay was playing politics, and had no real interest in helping people suffering from AIDS.

In August, newly-elected Alliance chair Maurice (Mo) Jones and interim Executive

Director Nancy Pomeroy held a press conference to reassure the agency's clients and funding sources that it was still very much in business. Jones claimed that, since assuming his new position, he had discovered that the agency's financial records for the previous 20 months were in disarray, making it difficult to determine the source of funds in GHHA accounts.

Concerns arose that client confidentiality might be breached while Harris County was in possession of patient files. The files in question were removed along with computers and other equipment from Alliance offices after the County took over the Ryan White funding. Activists responded by forming the Fair AIDS Action Committee.

In November, Judge Lindsay demanded that GHHA provide the County with copies of Ryan White Title 1 files, and threatened to sue the organization if the records were not produced. Alliance officials insisted that they were within their rights to hold onto the files until the completion of an outside audit of the group's financial records, and that in any case Harris County auditors had unimpeded access to Ryan White Title 1 grant records in the Alliance's possession.

GHHA also made public the results of a Texas Department of Health audit that provided evidence of fiscal and programmatic mismanagement under Cooper. Jones said the findings of the audit vindicated moves by Alliance board members to restrict Cooper's authority. He also called for an investigation by state and federal officials into earlier mismanagement of the Alliance's financial affairs.

GAY, LESBIAN TEXANS WALK, RUN, ROLL FOR AIDS FUNDING

As they have in years past, gay and lesbian people showed their generosity and dedication by walking, running, skating and rolling to raise funds for AIDS service and education organizations in the state's major cities.

On October 4, over 2,500 people took part in "LifeWalk '92," the largest single fund-raiser for AIDS programs in the Dallas/Fort Worth metroplex. Over \$50,000 in underwriting expenses was raised before the first step was ever taken, and post-walk figures put the total at over \$200,000, nearly double the previous year's figure.

proceeds went to the AIDS programs of Oak Lawn Community Services.

On October 25, the fifth annual AIDS Services of Austin "From All Walks of Life" walkathon brought together a diverse crowd of 4,500 people to raise money for the fight against AIDS in the capital city area. The event, believed to be the largest of its kind in the state, brought in well over \$250,000, most of it going to ASA's AIDS service and education programs. Twenty-five percent of the proceeds was shared with 15 other local organizations that provide AIDS care, education and research in the Austin area.

On November 8, 1,500 walkers, runners and skaters helped raise over \$170,000 in AIDS Foundation Houston's fourth annual "From All Walks of Life" fund-raiser, doubling the amount raised by the 1991 event. Walk co-chairs were Mayor Bob Lanier and his wife Elyse. Highlighting the event was a guest appearance by actor Keith Carradine.

And on November 15, more than 1,500 people made the five-mile trek through downtown San Antonio for the second annual "Walk for Life," organized by the San Antonio AIDS Foundation. Organizers were very pleased with the larger-than-expected turnout, which helped bring in \$40,000 for AIDS in the Alamo City area.

WORLD'S LARGEST GAY CHURCH MOVES TO NEW SANCTUARY

The Metropolitan Community Church of [MCC] Dallas, the world's largest gay and lesbian congregation, began spreading its spiritual message from a new sanctuary located near Dallas Love Field in 1992, capping a three-year effort to find a larger, more permanent home for its ever-growing flock.

The construction of MCC's new Cathedral of Hope—the largest construction project ever undertaken by any organization in the metroplex lesbian and gay community—was not exempt from the stumbling blocks often associated with any large-scale building effort, however. There was a six-year search for an older or abandoned church to purchase, a protracted delay in selling the old sanctuary, plus difficulty in finding financing to purchase the land and design and build the new structure, thanks to homophobic

banks and mortgage companies.

In the end, the burden fell on the congregation itself to raise over \$1,850,000 of the construction cost—a feat that was accomplished in exactly one year.

The problems didn't end there, however. Because of errors in city maps, abandoned sewer lines and water mains were not located until construction had already begun, necessitating multiple delays in the ongoing project.

Prior to the Cathedral's opening last month, the Rev. Michael Piazza told TWT NEWS, "It has been a daily battle. But that building is standing today... in spite of all the obstacles that homophobic bankers or bondspeople or city inefficiencies (did); they delayed us, but they didn't stop us."

"You know," continued Piazza, "I often wonder what it would have been like if we weren't there for the community? In the Book of Esther, Mordecai says to Esther, 'Perhaps it is for such a time as this that you have come to this place.' Perhaps that's why the Metropolitan Community Church universally exists for a time such as this. For a lot of people in this community, MCC has been all the family that they've had."

GAY & LESBIAN TEXANS CELEBRATE PRIDE

Once again, gay and lesbian communities across the state held their annual celebrations of pride, reveling in their strength and diversity.

In Houston, the community had a wide range of events to choose from in celebrating gay and lesbian pride, from the gala AIDS fund-raiser "That's What Friends Are For III"; to "Making Our Voices Heard," sponsored by the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby and the AIDS Equity League; to performances by the Lone Star Symphonic Band and the MCCR choir; and Baile '92, the largest indoor Houston Pride Week event. Pride Week culminated on June 28 with the Pride Parade and Rally, sponsored by Lesbian/Gay Pride Week.

In Dallas, Razzle Dazzle Dallas, held June 20 at Market Hall, drew thousands of people to what has become one of the single largest fund-raising parties in the country. Proceeds from the event went to local AIDS service organizations. The 1992 Alan Ross Texas Freedom Parade, held September 20, marked its ninth year with

nearly to 10,000 spectators and participants. The huge rally held in Lee Park following the parade featured speeches by community leaders and politicians, as well as awards presentations.

In Austin, over 2,500 took part in a newly expanded two-day pride celebration September 19 and 20 featuring seminars, workshops and a "Dance Under the Stars" at Fiesta Gardens. The Main Event, also held at Fiesta Gardens, included entertainment by the Baptist Women, the Lone Star Male Revue and others.

For the fourth year, San Antonio celebrated Lesbian/Gay Pride Month in June. Highlights were a pride picnic; an all-day conference on June 13 organized by the San Antonio Lesbian/Gay Assembly; a "Community Party" held at the home of local activists; "Out at the Movies," and the Fourth Annual Lesbian/Gay Art Show.

CITY OFFICIALS MAKE BIGOTED REMARKS

Comments by elected officials around the state last year reminded us that there is still a great deal of misunderstanding about and prejudice toward gay and lesbian people. City Council members in San Antonio, Houston and Corpus Christi made bigoted remarks about gays and people with AIDS.

In San Antonio, the controversy began with comments made by Dr. Fernando Guerra, Director of the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District, in an interview published in the *San Antonio Express News*. Commenting on a recent decision by the Bexar County AIDS Consortium to cut AIDS funding to the city, Guerra appeared to imply that the decision was influenced by the AIDS-related dementia some of its members might be suffering.

Reaction to Guerra's comments included calls for his resignation and a rally to protest his remarks. Guerra apologized for his comments and pledged to work more closely with the AIDS Consortium.

A day later, City Council member Weir Labatt revived the controversy when he was quoted in a *San Antonio Light* interview as saying that PWAs are to blame for their illness. "I'm real tired of the AIDS community having this notion that something special is due them. The reason they have AIDS is their lifestyle, the majority of them being IV drug users or having engaged in male-to-male intercourse...."

AIDS activists responded by demanding Labatt's resignation.

In Houston, City Council member John Goodner, commenting on AIDS funding, said, "Money is simply going down a one-way tube, and it does not return in the economy." Goodner also suggested that quarantining people with HIV might be a good idea. Local activists staged protests at City Hall, and one of them, Brian Bradley, was arrested.

In Corpus Christi, City Council member Leo Guerrero stated on a Spanish-language radio program that he wanted to keep "homosexuals" out of the sea wall area of the city as well as away from Bay Fest, a citywide festival. Guerrero later insisted that his remarks were aimed at child molesters and not gay people. Local activists, not satisfied with Guerrero's explanation, called on him to apologize.

TEXANS OBSERVE WORLD AIDS DAY

Texans joined the nation and the world in observing World AIDS Day/Day Without Art on Tuesday, December 1.

In Austin, artwork was shrouded in state offices and other buildings around the city in observance of Day Without Art, and at 7:45 p.m. the lights of the Capitol were turned off for 15 minutes. Hundreds of people took part in a "Body Count" ceremony on the Capitol grounds, symbolizing those lost to the disease.

In Houston, the Houston NAMES Project, Body Positive/Houston and the Garden Party presented the fifth annual lighting of the "Tree of Remembrance," decorated with ornaments representing loved ones lost to AIDS. ACT UP/Gulf Coast erected a large two-sided canvass "AIDS wall" on Montrose Blvd. bearing the names of people lost to the disease in 1992. More names were added to the wall throughout the evening, and at the close of the event, activists staged a "die-in."

In Dallas, "A Community Commitment" offered guest lectures by health and community leaders and open forums showcasing the programs provided by the city's leading AIDS service agencies.

At the Daire adult day-care center, a "Badge of Courage" was handed out to each client who used the facility that day, and a huge red ribbon was on display in front of the group's offices.

Texas Gay & Lesbian Political Leaders Reflect on the Events of 1992 and Look Ahead to the Future

The year 1992 presented gay and lesbian people across Texas and the nation with many challenges and opportunities. The elections provided the community a chance to exert its political power and further the cause of gay and lesbian rights on the local, state and national levels. The continuing battle against AIDS and discrimination brought further heartbreak but left us still hopeful for the future. TWT invited lesbian and gay leaders around the state to recapitulate the events of the last year and comment on the challenges and opportunities the community faces in 1993.

1992: ONE STEP FORWARD, TWO STEPS BACK

What a year! The gay and lesbian community made some very significant advances this past year. These gains were primarily on the national front; we in Texas got a mixed bag.

Let's start nationally. George Bush is outta there, and Bill Clinton is in! The significance of Clinton's election should not be underestimated by our community. For the first time, we were courted openly by a presidential candidate and our issues were addressed. Many people—and I am one of them—are waiting to see if and how Clinton makes good on his campaign promises, for example, to end the military's ban on gays and lesbians. We'll have to wait and see, but there is no denying that we as a community will benefit from Clinton's winning. For the first time in my life, I voted for the winning candidate, and I'm thrilled that I won't have to deal with George or Dan's "family values" crap or AIDS being ignored any longer.

Without a doubt, the elections were the big story of the year. A record number of gay and lesbian candidates ran for office, and of 52 hopefuls, 27 won election, increasing the number of openly gay and lesbian elected officials around the nation from 64 to 75. Of course, these gains were largely balanced by the passage of antigay measures in Colorado and Tampa, Florida.

How about Texas? On the positive side, Glen Maxey won reelection handily and Barbara Rosenberg defeated State District Judge Jack Hampton in Dallas. Many remember that in 1988, Hampton gave a man convicted of two execution-style murders a light sentence. He defined his actions by saying that since the victims were "queer," they were criminals under Texas law and therefore "less innocent" in their deaths than other victims.

On the negative side, Jerry Birdwell, an openly gay attorney who was appointed as a state district judge last May, did not win election to a full term.

How about the Texas Supreme Court elections? The outcome will definitely affect our community, because the high court will hear the THRF-sponsored case challenging 21.06 next Tuesday, January

5. Oscar Mauzy, who has always been a defender of gay and lesbian rights, was defeated by Republican Craig Enoch. However, Rose Spector of San Antonio defeated incumbent Republican Eugene Cook. So, again, a mixed bag. Democrats still maintain a 5-4 majority on the court, but we simply do not know enough about certain justices at this point to make any sort of educated guess about the court's ruling.

1992 has been a very important year for the lawsuit the Texas Human Rights Foundation brought in 1989 to challenge 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code. In December of 1990, District Court Judge Paul Davis ruled 21.06 unconstitutional from the bench. On March 11, 1992, the Third District Court issued a unanimous decision affirming Davis' decision that 21.06 violates the Texas Constitution's right to privacy.

On May 8, 1992, Attorney General Dan Morales appealed the Third District Court's ruling to the Texas Supreme Court, which agreed to hear the case.

There has also been work on the legislative repeal of 21.06 this past year. Gov. Ann Richards appointed a special commission to rewrite the Texas Penal Code, which has removed 21.06 altogether. The Lesbian Gay Rights Lobby of Texas and its Executive Director Laurie Eiserloh have been working with Rep. Glen Maxey to eliminate 21.06 through legislative action. THRF has been working on accomplishing this same task through the courts. So Texas has two statewide organizations working on two different fronts, coordinating efforts to remove this archaic law.

I am very optimistic that 21.06 will fall in 1993, if not in the courts, then through the legislature. With Bill Clinton in the White House, the military ban will be revoked and we will see the development of a national AIDS policy. Of course, these are just first steps, the beginning of what will hopefully become an era of tolerance for all people, gays and lesbians included.

Sixth, I want to thank the members of the Greater Houston AIDS Alliance for having the balls to do battle with a powerful county government.

Finally, I want to thank County Judge John Lindsay, Steven Hotze and Police Chief Sam Nuchia for your unique talents at unifying the gay and lesbian community. We couldn't do it without you. I wish you all a gay (and lesbian and transgenderal) New Year.

UNITING AND CREATING TOGETHER

In Dallas, 1992 began with the Dallas City Council open hearing on whether or not to hire lesbians and gays in the Dallas Police Department. More than 750 people showed up to speak before City Council and support Mica England [an openly lesbian woman who had applied to become a DPD officer]. What a gorgeous and articulate group we are! And the Council certainly showed their true colors, which is why in May of 1993 we will have four openly gay candidates running for City Council.

In February, we made a historic change when the membership of the Dallas Gay Alliance voted to change the organization's name to the Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance. Then the "Power Lunches" were initiated by George Harris and Jack Evans. These gatherings have brought a very diverse group of 100 or more people in Dallas together in the Stonewall Business & Professional Association.

The gay and lesbian community of Dallas is not only uniting but doing some creating together, too. In fact, this year marked the first time that men attended a roundtable discussion held at the end of the fifth annual Texas Lesbian Conference, co-chaired by Susan Melnick and Sheila Coughlin.

In July, the second woman in 17 years was elected president of DGLA. Yep, that's me. Thanks to everyone for all their support. But, wait, there's still more.

A group of people representing various organizations, including Cathedral of Hope MCC, DGLA, the AIDS Interfaith Network, FHU, MACT, OLCS, Caven Enterprises and Beth El Binah began meeting twice a month to create an Anti-Racism Task Force in Dallas. The Task Force has a voice mail number, (214)761-3806, to accept complaints from anyone experiencing racial discrimination from an organization or business in the community.

Another group of gay and lesbian political leaders, many from the Lesbian/Gay Political Coalition, created Community Victory '92, the driving force in this area for the Clinton/Gore campaign. Obviously they did some wonderful work.

In the midst of all this, meetings between the Dallas Police Department and representatives of the gay and lesbian community came to a head when it was

revealed that DPD was maintaining files containing the names and addresses of innocent citizens visiting one of our local city parks which happens to be located near the gay/lesbian area of Cedar Springs. The last meeting with DPD representatives was attended by members of DGLA, the Oak Lawn Concerned Citizens Coalition, GLAAD and the Dallas Tavern Guild.

A request by DGLA for the appointment of a police liaison met with success, and Cpl. Lynne Albright now keeps her finger on the pulse of the gay and lesbian community to help avoid any future "miscommunication" with the Police Department.

As for the coming year and the future, Section 21.06 of the state Penal Code is under attack from all sides, with the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby and the Texas Human Rights Foundation moving diligently forward and needing all the financial support we can give them. There's also the military issue as well as helping Colorado get back on its feet and placing gays and lesbians in the ministries. We will also be trying to get good people elected to Dallas City Council in May.

Most important, we must mobilize all our communities so the March on Washington for Lesbian and Gay Equal Rights will have us in its lap on April 25, 1993 as we proudly march together on the streets of Washington, D.C. with one million other gays and lesbians.

Yes, 1993 and the future for the gay and lesbian community is filled with hard work, tears, laughter and a need for people of all types to come forward and stand strong, together!

We are becoming more visible to the San Antonio community as a whole, and in keeping with the theme that "Out is In," we continue to make our mark and effect change within our city.

The San Antonio Lesbian and Gay Assembly, which serves as an umbrella organization for more than 40 groups, also continues to sponsor the annual Pride Celebration, which remains an excellent opportunity for us to get together and be visible, bringing together thousands of San Antonians. The Lesbian and Gay Media Project monitors our local media in an effort to raise consciousness and awareness. As a result, local newspapers and television stations have come to utilize positive language and features on the progress of lesbian and gay civil rights.

It is my sincere belief that as we come out of the closet, we personalize what it means to be a lesbian and gay adult and allow others the opportunity to get to know us and be educated about the importance of human rights for all people.

Various colleges and universities are expanding their student groups. UTSA had its first university-sanctioned Pride Week this year. San Antonio also has gained a lesbian and feminist bookstore, Textures, which was sorely needed. ELLAS has grown and is now starting a scholarship project for latina lesbians. A San Antonio chapter of Gay/Lesbian and Bisexual Veterans of America has formed, which is particularly significant in this city with five military bases and the largest security training base in the nation. The women's community continues to sponsor discussions for lesbian and gay men on a bi-monthly basis. The Federal Club Membership in the Human Rights Campaign Fund has also risen substantially this year.

For 1993, I hope San Antonio will work towards a domestic partnership ordinance and open a lesbian and gay community center. We see the barriers starting to melt away, but we cannot be complacent and we must continue to push for change at the city level as well as at the state and national levels. We must be visible; we must be "out there." We must continue to empower ourselves, whether it be through our political involvement, the arts, fund-raising, AIDS awareness, our religious organizations or in our respective professions

1992: A YEAR IN THE CRUCIBLE

Throughout the 22 years since the Stonewall riots signaled the birth of the modern movement for gay and lesbian equal rights, our communities have faced a variety of dangers and opportunities. We have been severely tested many times, but there is no question that 1992 will go down as a year in which we stood more in the eye of the storm than ever before, and survived.

Much of the drama of 1992 had its origins in Pat Buchanan's challenge to George Bush in the Republican primaries. In misleading and inflammatory campaign spots, the arch-conservative labeled Bush as "soft" on homosexuals for inviting openly gay people to the White House for bill signings and for permitting the National Endowment for the Arts to give support to art exhibits and films depicting gays.

Fearful that Buchanan's call was being too well received by the Republican Party's none-too-loyal fundamentalist faction, and determined to nail down Bush's right flank against the mercurial Ross Perot, the Bush/Quayle campaign hardened its already tough stand against "gay rights" and picked up on Buchanan's cry of "family values."

With summer came the political conventions and the climax of the hate-filled "family values" campaign. At the national convention in Houston, while Americans waited to hear intelligent talk about the economy, jobs, and health care, Bush/Quayle spewed forth heavy judgments against working mothers, gays and any segment of society that did not fit their unreal, idealized conceptions of "normal." Fundamentalists predicted that Bush's hard turn to the right would give him an enormous "bounce" in the polls after the convention.

But post-convention polls did not show the bounce Bush had hoped for, and the campaign began to realize that the hateful attacks on gays and lesbians were actually costing Bush support. In cynical desperation, Bush and Quayle abruptly tossed aside what had been the centerpiece of their campaign and floundered for new weapons against the increasing popularity of both Bill Clinton and H. Ross Perot. But it was too late. On November 3, 12 years of Republican ascendancy came to a crashing conclusion.

In a way, the gay and lesbian communities should be pleased that Buchanan, Bush/Quayle and a variety of other political figures gave our issues the visibility they did. Never before this year was the "gay question" so much in the news, on the editorial pages or in the public mind.

Another result of 1992 is an increased awareness of the need for bipartisan efforts to achieve gay and lesbian equal rights. One of the reasons the Republican Party was allowed to become so extreme in its attacks on homosexuality was the lack of a pro-gay presence within the party. It became painfully clear during the 1992 election cycle that the gay political establishment's one-party strategy had put all of our eggs into one basket and gambled everything on a Democratic victory. They may not be as lucky in the future. Strong, visible, vocal supporters of our equal rights are needed in the Republican Party every bit as much as, if not more than, in the Democratic Party, for therein lie our most dangerous opponents.

At this point, the future of our movement for equality is still unclear. In all likelihood, Clinton will alter the status of gays and lesbians in the armed forces in a way that allows us to remain and serve—but not on the front lines or in close quarters with nervous heterosexuals.

On another front, pressure for a boycott against Colorado is rapidly building following the passage of the anti-gay Amendment 2, which overturns all of the state's anti-discrimination ordinances. It will take a nationwide effort for our communities to marshal that much support, but it can happen if we set clear goals and avoid the turf battles and politically-correct bickering that undermine so many of our efforts.

Closer to home, it appears that 1993 offers the best chance in years to see the removal of Texas' sodomy law, Section 21.06 of the Penal Code, from the books.

1992 has been a year of mixed blessings and painful growth. We passed through the crucible of the "family values" campaign stronger, wiser and better organized. It is a good thing we did, because we shall need all of that strength, wisdom and organization as we go forward towards a better future.

Rethink Zoning

The following letter was sent to Houston City Councilmember Jim Greenwood concerning the proposed Houston zoning ordinance which is currently causing a great deal of controversy.—Editor.

I live on a predominantly residential street in the Montrose. There are a number of bars (and restaurants and shops) within a few blocks of my home. Sometimes it's hard to find a parking place, sometimes there are not-nice people on the street, but I want to tell you that those bars have just as much right to be there as I do.

I don't go to bars much, and these aren't my type, anyway; but I do know that the owners and staffs of these small businesses are very involved in projects beneficial to the community and I respect them as good neighbors. Perhaps the property owners and developers with dollar signs in their eyes do not feel the same, but I am the person who lives here, I am the person who sleeps here and I am the person who is registered to vote at this address.

Every town in America has the same shops in the same malls. Our neighborhood businesses are what make our city interesting. These neighborhood small businesses are the unique places that people write about, talk about and go out of their way to visit; and they don't belong in malls or commercially developed shopping centers.

Houston has always had "zoning by natural law": if you open your business in the wrong location, it will not survive.

I have been to The Woodlands and seen a master-planned community. I tell you right now that you will never see an interesting little Thai vegetarian restaurant, a cozy used book store or a really unique beer joint pop up in the Woodlands.

I don't expect my neighborhood to be silent at midnight. It's not that kind of a neighborhood. All residential areas are not populated with nuclear families who go to bed at 10 p.m. I work the night shift and

appreciate living among people who don't expect me to keep regular hours. We live and let live. This is a very tolerant area. Nobody, particularly not the voters, authorized you to start decreeing who can do what where. If you damage these small businesses, you should be personally liable—because no one authorized you to do this zoning.

I hope you rethink the whole business of implementing zoning without a referendum, but if you continue with it, please consider the plight of these bars (some of which are Houston institutions), which are flourishing, existing small businesses our community needs.

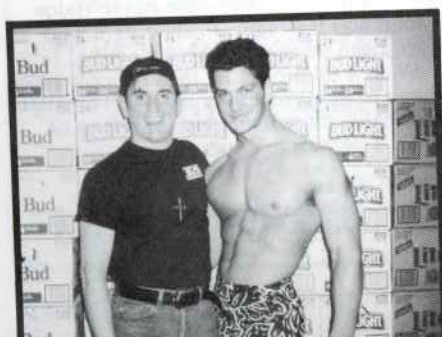

Robert will be greatly missed by the family, his many friends and Sissy.

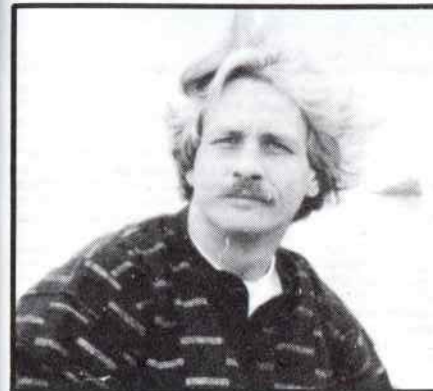
Ricardo Rodriguez Martinez

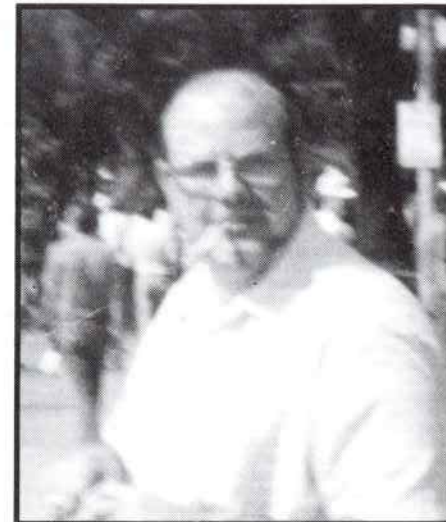

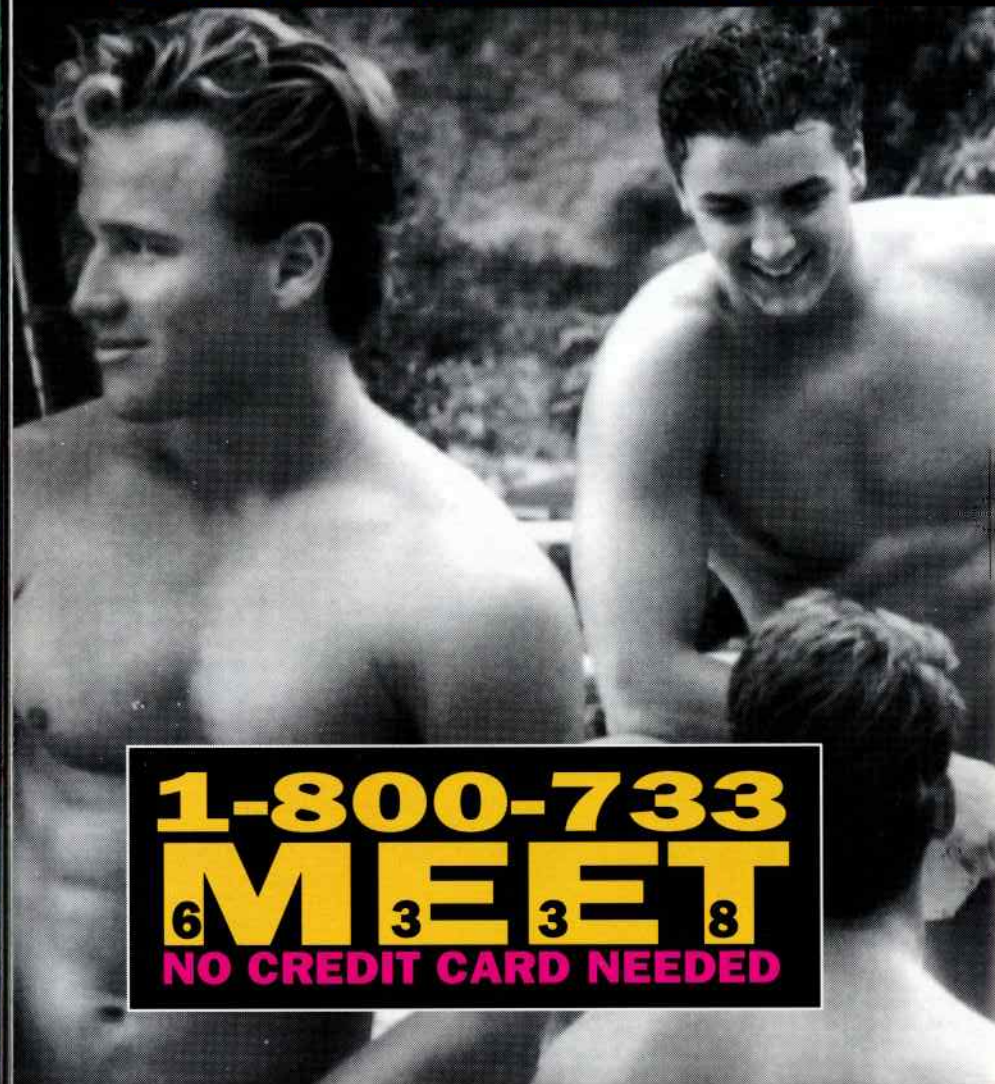
