NAT'L MEETING NEXT WEEKEND IN DALLAS TO HELP PLAN '94 MARCH

*Over 1,000,000 from Around World
Expected for Event at U.N.*

DALLAS — On a hot June night in 1969, New York City police and agents from the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board raided the Stonewall Inn, a gay bar on Christopher Street in the city's Greenwich Village. Allegedly there to look for violations of the alcohol control laws, the agents and officers levied the usual homophobic epithets and then, after checking identification, threw the patrons out of the club.

For enforcement officials, it was just another routine raid on a gay bar. But this time, there was one very important difference. People fought back. Instead of quietly slipping into the night as they were expected to do, hustlers, drag queens, students and other patrons of the club held their ground. An uprooted parking meter was used to barricade the front door of the Stonewall, and police officers and ABCB agents were trapped inside. The officials wrecked the interior of the bar and called for reinforcements. Crowds grew on both sides. For the first time, after innumerable years of oppression, the chant "Gay Power" rang out...and Christopher Street was ablaze for three days and three nights.

This event, in all its mythic proportions, is the basis for gay pride celebrations throughout the world. These celebrations have grown from commemorative events in Los Angeles and New York in 1970 to a global remembrance today, with events planned in hundreds of cities around the world.

June 1994 will be the 25th anniversary of the Stonewall uprising. In recognition of this milestone, representatives of the International Lesbian and Gay Association throughout the world have approved a proposal for the first ever International March on the United Nations to Affirm the Human Rights of Lesbian and Gay People. The March, to be held on Sunday, June 26, 1994 in New York City, is expected to attract in excess of one million people.

One of the primary purposes of the March, other than the effort to draw atten-

tion to the human rights nature of the gay/lesbian rights movement, is to lobby intensely the United Nations, its agencies, its member states and its affiliated non-governmental organizations to take all necessary action to assure that the promises of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights not be denied to lesbian, gay and bisexual people; that any denial of those rights be reported to the United Nations; that the global effort to combat HIV/AIDS be intensified; and that the rights of lesbian, gay and bisexual people to create families be recognized and protected, and that their family relationships with each other and their children be celebrated in 1994, the International Year of the Family.

Representatives from lesbian, gay, bisexual and AIDS service and awareness organizations throughout the United States will meet in Dallas next weekend, January 15-17, to help organize the March. One of the tasks of the Dallas Conference will be to select the individuals who will comprise the U.S. delegation to the International Advisory Committee meeting being held in Barcelona, Spain to plan the March program.

Although a number of major decisions are being made on the international level in Barcelona, there are many things that must be done in Dallas. According to Stonewall 25 Conference Committee members, it is not logistically feasible for an international body to define, implement, coordinate and oversee the myriad tasks that must be undertaken. The Dallas Conference must develop a structure within which this work can proceed and under which international coordination can be maintained. The structures developed in Dallas must also enable organizers to mobilize the largest possible number of representatives from the United States.

Another function of the Dallas meeting will be to disseminate information about other events planned for June and July in New York. There will be a vast array of other activities besides the International March and Rally, the largest of several hun-

dred events. Activities in New York will include Gay Games IV, the annual International Lesbian and Gay Association conference, the Stonewall History Project, a mass concert by the Lesbian/Gay Bands of America and a mass worship service organized by the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches. There will also be athletic, cultural, educational, health-related, political and religious/spiritual/humanist events organized by lesbian/gay/bisexual communities around the world.

It will take a massive and united front to change the societal attitudes that have oppressed gay and lesbian people for far too long. The International March on the United Nations to Affirm the Human Rights of Lesbian and Gay People can be the proper instrument to effect change, but it cannot be accomplished by just a few—it will take the combined effort of every gay, lesbian and bisexual man and woman. It is important that representatives from all facets of the diverse community be there. According to Conference committee members Rob Appel and Gary Wells, "We must all work together to build a march that is a fitting observance of the 25th anniversary of the Stonewall Rebellion."

The Dallas Conference will be held next Friday, Saturday and Sunday, January 15-17, at the Sheraton Mockingbird Hotel, near Dallas Love Field. For information, please call the Stonewall 25 Conference committee in New York at (718)499-8984.

TELEVISED 'HIV/AIDS TOWN MEETING' IN HOUSTON THIS MONDAY EVENING

*Alternative Broadcasting Service's
'Destroying the Myths' to Feature
Panel, Audience Participation.*

HOUSTON — HIV education efforts will mark a first in Houston this Monday with the broadcast of "Destroying the Myths: An HIV/AIDS Town Meeting."

The program, produced by Houston's Alternative Broadcasting Service [ABS], will be shot and televised this Monday, January 11 from 6:30-9 p.m. in Rice University's Hamman Hall. Those unable to attend the taping can view the show on the

Warner and Storer cable systems' Educational Access Channel.

Executive Producer Mike Stubblefield said, "This is the first of what we like to call our live 'interactive' television shows. It allows the audience and the panel of guests to exchange ideas on a more personal level than just putting a guest in front of a camera."

The show will consist of a mix of taped segments and live dialogue. Stubblefield said the program will bring together some of the city's most best-trained minds on the subject of HIV and AIDS. "They are professionals who have been dealing with treating people with AIDS, as long as the virus has been around in some cases. We will have them all under one roof on January 11 to attempt to better educate the public at large about this urgent matter of public health."

Microphones will be set up in the audience to enable people to ask questions during the show.

There will be eight panel members and a moderator. Panelists include Dr. Adan Rios, immunologist and HIV researcher; Dr. Patricia Salvato, immunologist and researcher; Tory Williams, MSW, social worker with the Foundation for Interfaith Research Ministry; Paula Hebert, social worker and psychotherapist; Michael Crawford, gay/AIDS activist and member of ACT-UP; Bart Loeser, safe sex educator with AIDS Foundation Houston; John Paul Barnich, attorney and past chair of the board of AIDS Foundation Houston; and Ray Hill, longtime gay activist.

Scott Lewis, longtime gay activist and currently co-host of the late-night Saturday radio program *After Hours*, will be making his debut as moderator of the show.

The broadcast will be shot before a studio audience. Stubblefield encouraged people to attend. "We are cordially inviting... everyone to come out on January 11 to participate in this show live.... This will not be another boring talk show. People will have the opportunity to ask questions of the guests and get real answers."

He added that tickets are free and available through local organizations. He stressed, however, that no one would be turned away the night of the taping for lack of a ticket.

Tickets may also be obtained by contacting ABS at (713)526-3425. ABS is still looking for volunteers to help with "Destroying the Myths," and those interested may call the above number.

*Strauss, Altshuler Head Campaign
To Raise Funds for Nelson-Tebedo.*

DALLAS — John Thomas, Executive Director of the Foundation for Human Understanding, recently announced that former Dallas Mayor Annette Strauss and Dr. Kenneth Altshuler, Chair of the Psychiatry Department at UT Southwestern Medical Center, would serve as honorary co-chairs of the 1993 LifeSupport funding campaign for the Nelson-Tebedo Community Clinic, a project of the Foundation. The Clinic is devoted to the early detection of HIV and subsequent low-cost care for those testing positive. Through its efforts, which are unique in North Texas, and those in 25 other U.S. cities, the period between a positive HIV diagnosis and the onset of AIDS has increased from five to ten years of quality life.

The Counseling Center will not begin serving clients in its new headquarters until January 25, just two days after the doors close at the old 900 Lovett location. So open house guests will sample refreshments and tour a near-empty building.

The \$495,000 building purchase was made possible, in part, by a \$100,000 grant from the Houston Endowment, former owners of the *Houston Chronicle*.

The Counseling Center was forced to move when the 900 Lovett building, which has been home to many gay and lesbian organizations over the years, was sold several months ago and scheduled for demolition February 1.

Executive Director Ann Robison said the new location will offer twice as much office space for the 15-year-old Counseling Center, one of the Houston gay and lesbian community's oldest institutions. Only minimal renovation was required at the new location, but Robison said volunteers are needed to put up a few walls.

DGLA CREDIT UNION RECEIVES GRANT FROM NATIONAL GROUP

Award Will Be Used to Fund Part-Time Position.

DALLAS — The Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance Credit Union has been awarded a grant by The Credit Union National Association [CUNA] for use in 1993. The grant, one of only eight awarded by CUNA, will fund a part-time employee position at the Credit Union.

The DGLA Credit Union submitted its grant application to CUNA in September and was notified of the award in late November. The application, containing

historical background and financial information, was praised for its strength and for the widespread support from Dallas' gay and lesbian leaders to members of the U.S. House of Representatives that accompanied the proposal.

According to Jeffery Campbell, Credit Union Chairman, "We are just delighted and a little bit amazed. This really demonstrates the credibility and respect the Credit Union is achieving at the local, state and national levels."

The addition of the part-time employee made possible by the CUNA grant will allow the Credit Union to build on the strong base of operations provided by its volunteer staff. The new staff position will help the agency offer more services to its members. "It was a chicken-and-egg problem," states Campbell. "We couldn't fund this position without a lot of income growth, but we couldn't forecast significant growth without the addition of a staff person. The CUNA funding allows us to have it both ways."

The Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance Credit Union was chartered on October 31, 1988 and has more than 1,300 members. Total assets as of November 31, 1992 were \$385,000. The Credit Union offers share savings accounts, certificates of deposit and a variety of lending programs. Additionally, the Credit Union offers its own MasterCard.

The Credit Union is currently looking for someone with financial institution experience to fill the newly-funded position. Campbell believes "it should be an excellent part-time opportunity for a person living with AIDS or for a retired person."

SAN ANTONIO AIDS FOUNDATION ELECTS NEW OFFICERS

*Buchanan Replaces Outgoing
President Bearden.*

SAN ANTONIO — The San Antonio AIDS Foundation [SAAF] recently chose Board officers for the new year. The Rev. Mark Buchanan, pastor of Oak Meadow United Methodist Church, was elected

Board president. Buchanan replaces outgoing president Bill Bearden, who resigns from the Board of Trustees to devote more time to his role as Executive Director of the Alamo Area Resource Center.

Also elected to board positions were Theresa DeLaHaya as vice-president, Bill Hudson as secretary and Pat Day as treasurer.

In a statement issued Monday, December 28, Buchanan commended Bearden for his efforts on behalf of the organization. "The Board of SAAF is grateful to Bill for his year of service as president of the Board and his years of leadership in helping SAAF grow."

The Foundation was founded in 1981 and has grown from a "Casa de Care" serving seven PWAs that year into a multi-service agency with 16 full-time and 11 part-time employees serving hundreds of HIV-positive clients.

Among the many services it offers to people with AIDS, SAAF runs a 40-bed residential facility licensed by the Texas Department of Health as a Special Care Facility, and a dental clinic for PWAs operated in collaboration with the City of San Antonio Metropolitan Health District.

AUSTIN PWA DENTAL CLINIC AWARDED \$9,842

*Funds Will Be Used for Purchase
Of Dental Equipment.*

AUSTIN — The Jack Sansing Dental Clinic, established a year ago by AIDS Services of Austin to provide dental care to people with AIDS, has received a grant of nearly \$10,000 from a local foundation.

The funds were awarded in November by the Lola Wright Foundation, which supports charitable and educational programs in the greater Austin area.

The money will be used for the purchase of dental equipment for the clinic, which first started treating patients a year ago. The clinic provides free primary dental care as well as treatment of oral conditions associated with HIV disease. Last year the Clinic received the American Dental Association's 1992 Community Prevention Dentistry Award.

Become Part of the Solution

The following was sent to Dallas City Council member Chris Luna.—Editor

Dear Councilman Luna:

On November 3, 1992, Colorado voters approved Amendment 2, which "repeals gay rights ordinances in Denver, Boulder and Aspen, and prohibits statewide future passage of such laws. The amendment passed by a vote of 54 to 46 percent despite opposition by the majority of the state's elected officials including Gov. Roy Romer" [*Dallas Voice*, 12/18/92]. I am writing you to ask you to introduce a resolution forbidding official travel to Colorado by city employees. And if the resolution is introduced and passed, I ask that a copy of it be sent to the Governor [of Colorado] and the mayors of all the major cities. So far, resolutions to this effect have been passed by the cities of Atlanta, Philadelphia, New York, Los Angeles, Seattle, Austin and Boston.

A great number of companies have canceled planned conventions in Colorado, as well as business ventures there. Further, thousands have called and written state officials in Colorado letting them know they have canceled their vacations to the state. According to the Vice President of Public Information for the Greater Denver Chamber of Commerce, tourism is the state's largest industry and brings in \$5.4 billion a year to their economy.

The XChange computer company canceled a move to Colorado. The 3M Company will more than likely not follow through with a planned expansion there. If Colorado does not repeal Amendment 2, many other companies will follow these examples.

Nineteen states and more than 100 cities and counties have laws barring discrimination against gays and lesbians. These laws do not give special rights. They insure that gays and lesbians have the same rights as everyone else. If the

truth were to be told, the same people who promote the idea that such laws give special rights also feel that other laws protecting the rights of women, blacks, people with AIDS and others give special rights. The reality is that such laws are needed because there will always be among us those who seek power and personal advantage by the oppression of others. It is the concept of majority rule with minority rights that our system needs to function.

Another assertion of these people who would deny gays and lesbians equal rights is that we are not a legitimate minority. All a minority is is a group of like individuals who number less than the larger group they are within. Being a minority can be as simple as being a Texan living in New York City. Laws that protect the rights of minorities help create cohesion in our society by which many groups and the society as a whole can benefit.

Fear of change, which is born of ignorance, is being manipulated by the leaders of those who oppose laws protecting the rights of gays and lesbians. Thomas Jefferson said on this subject, "I am not an advocate for frequent changes in laws and constitutions, but laws and institutions must go hand in hand with the progress of the human mind. As that becomes more developed, more enlightened, as as new discoveries are made, new truths discovered and manners and opinions change, with the change of circumstances, institutions must advance also to keep pace with the times. We might as well require a man to wear still the coat which fitted him when a boy as civilized society to remain ever under the regimen of their barbarous ancestors."

If we do not seek to become a part of the solution in Colorado, we become part of the problem. Councilman Luna, I know what the problem can lead to. On October 26, 1991, my lover Thanh Nguyen and I were stood against a wall and shot execution-style because we were gay.

While standing in a persistent icy Houston mist a few days before this last Thanksgiving, an aged and weathered old man approached us pushing a rusted and very bent shopping cart. His head was bowed and his fragile frame—obviously drenched and cold—was poorly covered with dirty, rank rags that were once a coat, shirt and trousers.

He stopped in the street when reaching the [Stone Soup] pantry and lifted out a small, torn cardboard box which he carried to the front stairs. About to enter, he stopped when a pantry volunteer asked, "Can I help you? Did I call your number?" I heard him [the old man] reply, "No, I don't have no number, but one of the grocery stores gave me this box of Infamil [baby formula] and maybe you've got someone with a baby who needs this."

Grateful, but apparently rushed by the cold and crowd in front of him, the volunteer accepted the donation and turned back to his tasks, probably unable to hear the old man mumble while leaving, "I had a son—not a baby, but grewed-up, you know. He was like 'you people' are, but he took me in when I couldn't care for myself. He was all I had, but he died. AIDS. And here I am out here in the streets."

I think his mumbling continued while the cart rattled and shook as he pushed it towards Montrose Blvd. I didn't follow and don't know if anyone else had paid attention to his mutterings. I stood there, paralyzed at what I'd heard, and was more ashamed than ever at my own situation and need for assistance (as nicely put as having "to beg") and more embarrassed at my need to "shop at the pantry," although qualified. But not so deserving, since it seems to me that the only times when my lover and I ever contributed to Stone Soup was by halfheartedly tossing a couple cans of food in a dance club's barrel so we

could avoid a cover charge and continue on with one of many "get-down-and-party-baby" weekends.

Back then, neither he nor I ever paused to catch the urgency of "the moment," let alone even acknowledge each of our unquestionable seropositivity and his unpersuasive excuses for not being tested. If either of us was paying attention then and raised a "what-are-we-going-to-do-if/when-it-happens-to-us?" question, the other would either indignantly snap, "I'm trying to have a good weekend, OK?" or dodge reality with "What do you want to drink?" or "Do you wanna dance?"

That was then and I couldn't draw on anything from my past to deal with my now, except thinking to myself, "You stupid... All you do is complain and feel sorry for yourself! You just experienced what Thanksgiving is all about. Do you 'get it' now?"

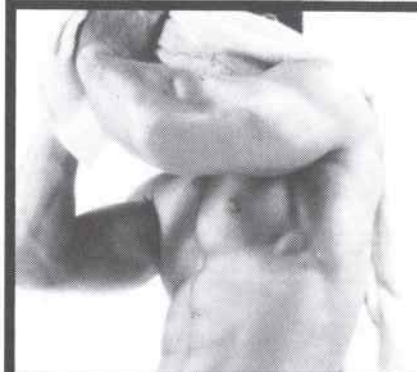

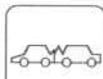

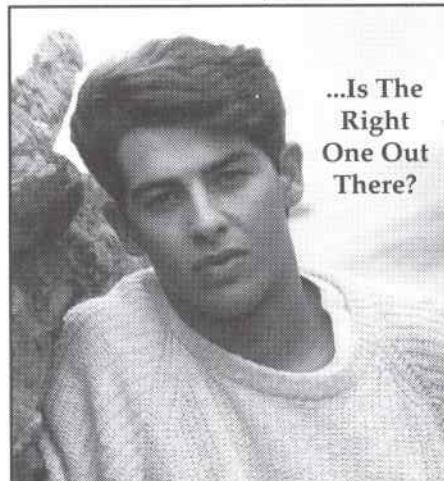

Hollywood is starting to put its money where its mouth is.

The state of Colorado recently enacted Amendment 2, a ballot measure which voids all existing ordinances across the state that prohibit discrimination based on sexual orientation. In support of the global economic boycott of Colorado, a group called Coloradans and Californians for Fairness in the Nation has called for the entertainment industry to forgo its annual holiday ski and schmooze fest in Aspen.

Celebrities such as Whoopi Goldberg and Martina Navratilova have come out in support of the boycott. Others like Cher and Robert Wagner have issued anti-boycott statements.

Caught in the middle is Barbra Streisand, who brought the issue to Hollywood's attention at a recent AIDS Project LA benefit where she said, "If asked to, we must refuse to play where they discriminate." After much public criticism from other Hollywood movers and shakers, Streisand clarified that she had only said that she planned to honor the boycott "if asked."

So let's ask!

Tell Ms. Streisand that we need her support. Let her know that it's important that we don't give our money to a state that leaves lesbians and gay men wide open to discrimination. And alert her to the fact that, given the success of the Colorado initiative, there are likely to be similar initiatives proposed all over the country. Write to Barbra Streisand, c/o Lee Solters,

David Mazingo and Houston's A Better Way Hope to Establish After-Care Facility for Chemically Dependent, HIV-Positive Men

Those people unfortunate enough to be living with drug and alcohol dependencies often see their entire worlds turned upside down when the news of a positive HIV diagnosis further compounds their problems. But if the dreams of David Mazingo are realized, those problems may soon be a bit easier to deal with. He hopes to open a facility that will deal specifically with chemically dependent men who are HIV-positive or have AIDS.

Houston's A Better Way Inc. operates an after-care facility for chemically dependent men who have gotten off drugs and alcohol but are not yet ready to rejoin society at large. The supportive, caring and structured environment helps these men return to being productive citizens.

Mazingo, a former client of A Better Way, praises the organization's facility, describing it as having more of a home-like atmosphere than other more conventional halfway houses. "The people are more caring, more open-minded here than at other places."

Now Director of Special Events for A Better Way, he proposes going one step further, however. He says that most of the chemically dependent men he has met are HIV-positive, and though they are welcome at A Better Way and not turned away as often happens at other after-care facilities, he believes there is a genuine need for a housing facility to serve those faced both with staying free of drugs or alcohol and with the demands imposed by a serious illness.

As Mazingo conceives it, the new facility would house around a dozen men, providing them with individual and group counseling, special education in health maintenance and living with HIV, and job training if necessary. An overriding goal of the program would be to provide partic-

ipants with crucially needed support and encourage a positive attitude in dealing with HIV.

Mazingo explained that a lot of chemically dependent heterosexual men who become HIV-positive are afraid others will think they're gay.

"It comes down to the fact that there's a lot of prejudice in the heterosexual community where HIV is concerned. But AIDS isn't a disease just of gays, or men or women. It's a community disease, and it needs to be brought out and dealt with."

Mazingo, who also acts as unofficial liaison between Better Way and the Houston gay community, said he believed his proposed facility would be the first of its kind in the city.

Mazingo has come up with a budget outlining the costs that would be associated with opening and operating the house, and is now in the process of spreading the word throughout the community and seeking funding. To that end, A Better Way is holding a special open house and raffle tomorrow, Saturday, January 9 at 1 p.m. at their facility located at 4802 Caroline, with proceeds to be used to hire an experienced grant writer and as seed money for future fund-raising efforts. Mazingo said he hopes to hold joint fund-raisers with other community organizations dealing with the HIV epidemic.

Gifts donated by the Wyndham Warwick, the Alley Theatre and Olive Garden Italian Restaurants will be raffled off at the benefit, and complimentary hors d'oeuvres and beverages will be served. For more information, call Mazingo at (713)524-0838.

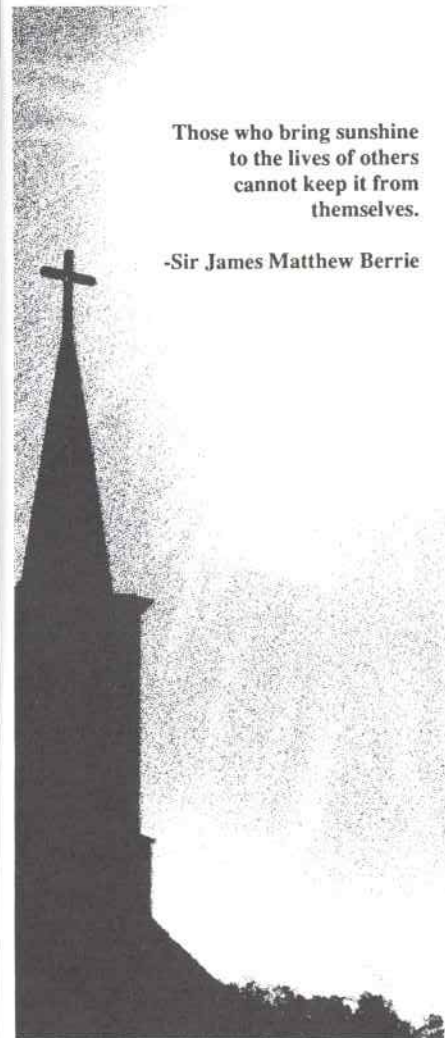

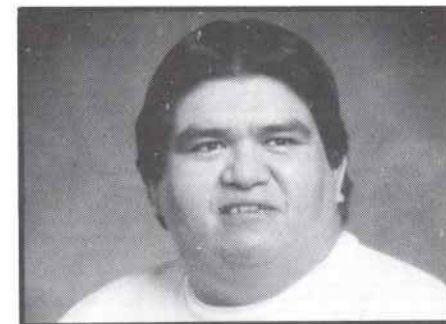


