## HOUSTON CAUCUS ELECTS NEW OFFICERS, BOARD MEMBERS

*Passes Motion Calling on City  
To Join in Colorado Boycott.*

HOUSTON — The city's Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus kicked off the new year by electing officers and board members at its January 6 meeting. Members also took up a mix of old and new issues that will keep the organization very busy in 1993.

With nearly 150 Caucus members casting ballots, Chris Bacon defeated Norm Thompson to win reelection as president, and Rennie Trozzi, who ran unopposed, won a second term as vice-president. Robbie Cavanaugh, also unopposed, was elected secretary, while Patrick McKee defeated incumbent Scott Tillinghast to take the treasurer's post.

Board Chair Kevin Davidson was re-elected to Board Seat 1, while Liz Shuler, formerly Caucus secretary, was elected to Seat 4. David Fowler took Seat 5 and Phil Batdorf, Caucus representative to the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, won Board Seat 6.

The Caucus has a busy agenda ahead of it this year, with the U.S. Senate race, a proposed Houston zoning ordinance, relations with the Police Department and the threat posed by religious bigots all expected to command the organization's attention.

Bacon told TWT NEWS he believes the growing political influence of fundamentalists presents the community and the Caucus with one of their biggest challenges in 1993.

"I think that one of our main tasks will be to develop messages to counter those

that were directed against us in the November elections by the religious right. I think we were taken by surprise by them.

"We need to make sure that we take a pro-active rather than a reactive stance, and we need to get our message across to mainstream Houston."

Bacon said the gay and lesbian community's relationship with city government in general, and the Houston Police Department in particular, would remain a Caucus priority this year, as would the issue of zoning. He added that the Caucus would be involved in screening candidates for the race to fill the Senate seat left vacant by Lloyd Bentsen.

Bacon did not rule out the possibility the group would take an official stand on zoning at some point, and he appointed Rob Bridges chair of a committee to study the matter. The Caucus has scheduled a special open meeting on zoning for Wednesday, January 27 at 7:30 p.m. at the Montrose Palace.

The night of the election meeting, activist Ray Hill distributed copies of a proposed resolution opposing zoning as it is currently being considered. The resolution also called for a binding referendum on the issue.

New board member Liz Shuler said she

wanted to help broaden the Caucus' base of support beyond the Montrose and make it more representative of a wide cross-section of the gay and lesbian community.



"There's a lot of us in the suburbs. Our concerns are similar, but I think there's a lot of strength out there that we haven't tapped."

The Caucus also passed a motion calling on the City of Houston to stop doing business in or with the state of Colorado because of the passage of Amendment 2 by that state's voters in November. Such a move by City Council would place Houston among the growing ranks of cities around the nation, including Austin, that have taken similar actions. Amendment 2 rescinds anti-discrimination ordinances on the books in three Colorado cities and forbids the passage of such measures in the future.

## DALLAS SOCIAL SERVICE PROVIDERS HONOR VOLUNTEERS

### OLCS Hands Out Awards to 16; AIDS Resource Center Recognizes Businesswoman Kim Dawson.

DALLAS — Two of Dallas' largest social service providers, Oak Lawn Community Services [OLCS] and the AIDS Resource Center, held volunteer appreciation ceremonies during the recent holiday season. The events, held annually to recognize the efforts of the city's substantial volunteer corps, were attended by organization representatives and civic and community leaders active in AIDS education and prevention and other vital social services, and included special award presentations to individuals whose contributions to the community are judged to exemplify the true spirit of volunteerism.

At the Oak Lawn Community Services Volunteer Recognition Awards Dinner, held at the Magnolia Lounge of Fair Park, 16 men and women were honored for their outstanding work in one of six agency departments. Scott Abraham, Bob Freeman, Joe Duepree, Paul Pusinelli, Andy Anderson, Robert Quintana and Molly Childs were recognized for their dedication to persons living with AIDS.

Similarly, Pam Yeary, Roger Harmon, Al Madden and T.J. Walters were singled out for their exemplary work with the Daire Center, AIDS Hotline and "The Vision" newsletter, respectively. Receiving special departmental recognition were

Pat Crawford from Counseling and Liane Anderson from Marketing.

Highlighting the evening was the presentation of the Howie Daire Award, to Barbara O'Brien for her dedication to OLCS, and the Dru Howlett Award for Volunteer of the Year to John Norton. Receiving the award for OLCS Employee of the Year was Emilia Menthe, Assistant Director of Health Services, for her devotion to the clients of OLCS.

The AIDS Resource Center, meanwhile, chose to use its Annual Volunteer Party as a means of expressing its thanks to Dallas businesswoman and fashion maven Kim Dawson, who has been active with the Center since the early 1980s. Dawson, who heads one of the country's top modeling agencies, was one of the first Advisory Board members of the AIDS Resource Center, and has been dubbed the "Elizabeth Taylor of Dallas" for her leadership and fund-raising endeavors.

In a tribute from William Waybourn, former President of the Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance, Dawson was lauded as a beacon to encourage and motivate others. "Kim has championed the sick, comforted the grieving and held the dying. She has raised her voice against bigotry and intolerance. Her actions demonstrate a deep and abiding feeling for those whose opportunities have been limited by circumstances, or by cruel conditions beyond their control. More than a symbol, she has moved a city."

"Dallas is richer for her contributions in the fashion and talent industries, as well as the industry of human dignity and worth."

## STATE SUPREME COURT HEARS ARGUMENTS IN 21.06 CASE

*Texas Human Rights Foundation  
Pleased with First Day in Court.*

AUSTIN — The Texas Supreme Court heard oral arguments on Tuesday, January 5 in *Morales et al. v. the State of Texas*, the case challenging Section 21.06 of the state penal code, the sodomy statute.

Patrick Wiseman, the attorney representing the five named plaintiffs, argued that the sodomy law clearly discriminates between homosexual and heterosexual conduct, and is a violation of an individual's right to privacy and equal protection under the Texas Constitution.

Wiseman was retained by the Texas Human Rights Foundation [THRF], which originated the lawsuit challenging 21.06 and is paying court costs and attorneys' fees.

The State's primary argument is that 21.06 must be retained in the interest of "upholding public morality." Wiseman countered that, although homosexuality was considered a disease in the past, for nearly two decades it has not been considered such by the American Psychological Association. He further contended that the State could not find a credible expert witness to support its arguments. Harry Potter, who argued the State's case, conceded the point.

Amicus curiae ("friend of the court") briefs were filed on behalf of the plaintiffs by the American Psychological Association, the National Association of Social Workers, the National Abortion Rights Action League, the Texas Abortion Rights Action League, Planned Parenthood Federation of America, Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays, Log Cabin Republicans of Texas and other local and state-wide organizations.

An amicus brief condemning homosexual conduct as "per se contrary to society's morality and decency" and leading to "other antisocial activities" was presented in support of the State's case. It was signed by three state senators and 27 representatives.

THRF Director of Development Suzy Wagers said that the Foundation was pleased with the line of questioning on the opening day of arguments.

## HUD AWARDS DALLAS FUNDS FOR PWA HOUSING

*AIDS Services of Dallas Selected  
As Project Sponsor.*

DALLAS — The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development [HUD] Office of Congressional Relations has announced that Dallas has been selected as one of only five U.S. cities to be awarded federal funding in the form of HUD Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS [HOPWA]. The grant, totaling \$400,000, will bring Dallas an additional 12 units of multi-family housing for PWAs.

According to HUD spokespersons, "the funds will provide for the construction of a multi-family community residence and will provide an exemplary medically supportive housing alternative to hospice and inpatient care for families with AIDS. The application process for these funds included efforts from the staff of AIDS Services of Dallas and the City of Dallas Department of Housing and Neighborhood Services."

"The project will offer an appropriate range of supportive services for families with AIDS and will emphasize client involvement through residents' councils."

The City of Dallas has selected AIDS Services of Dallas [ASD] as the Project Sponsor for the new facility. ASD currently operates two special care facilities, and is in the process of developing a third facility which will provide an additional 64 units of housing for individuals, in addition to the 50 currently available.

ASD Executive Director Don Maison said he feels the new facility will demonstrate the level of cooperation currently being enjoyed by AIDS organizations and local governmental agencies. "This grant award is a perfect example of public and nonprofit partnerships working to bring essential services to people with AIDS in our community. We appreciate the expertise of the city staff that helped with the preparation of the application, and Methodist Hospitals of Dallas' important donation of one of the parcels of land to be developed with these funds."

According to the Project Abstract submitted to HUD, the new facility will include 12 family-sized units, composed of eight two-bedroom units and four three-bed-

room units, accommodating up to 40 individuals in families. In addition, on-site day care will be provided for children, and a round-the-clock home health care program—facilitated by a staff of ten personal care aides—will be expanded from current ASD facilities. Also provided will be food, household and clothing items, as well as limited supplemental transportation services to collaborating agencies.

Professional services will be enhanced with the addition of on-site substance abuse and professional counseling services, a full-time on-site Registered Nurse Liaison provided by Parkland Hospital, a vast network of community-based service providers and volunteer support.

"The addition of these 12 units of multi-family housing," declared Maison, "will greatly enhance our ability to meet the growing needs of low-income families affected by AIDS in our community."

Construction on the project will begin approximately two months after disbursement of funds from HUD, with a targeted completion date within 14 months of start-up.

## 'FORT WORTH FORMAL' RAISES NEARLY \$6,000

*Proceeds to Be Shared by  
TCLGA, Alan G. Calkin Fund,  
Agape MCC & NAMES Project.*

FORT WORTH — The Tarrant County lesbian/gay community's third annual New Year's Eve party, "fort worth formal," raised nearly \$6,000, most of which is being awarded to nonprofit community organizations.

Donations by corporate sponsors Charter Hospital of Grapevine, American Express Financial Planners and Caremark contributed to the success of this year's fund-raising efforts.

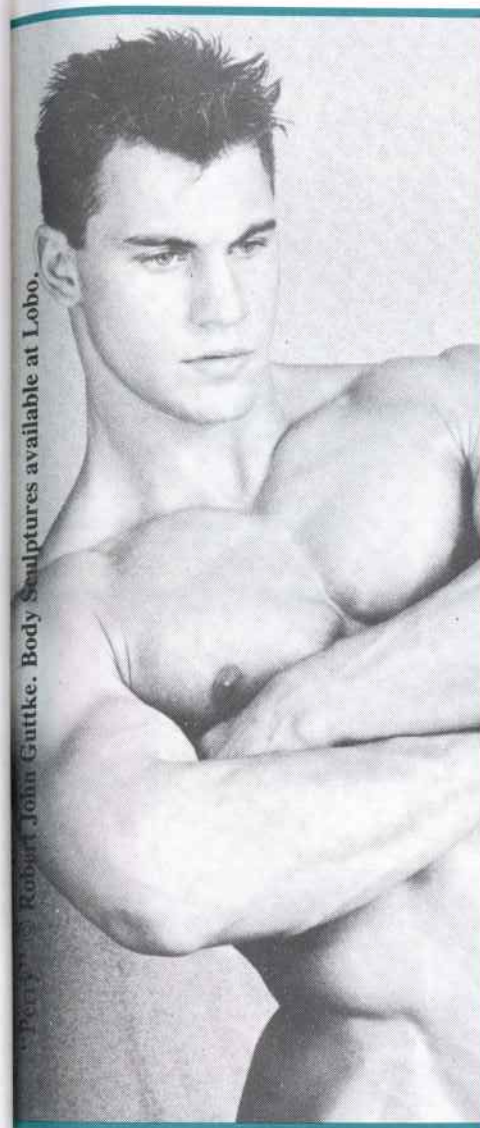

### More Help with Insurance Payments

Dear TWT:

I wanted to make your readers aware that an additional \$30,000 in funds has been made available to help pay health insurance premiums for people with HIV/AIDS. This program, administered by the AIDS Resource Center, is funded through a grant from the Ryan White Care bill. Premiums can be paid up to \$200 per month, depending upon income.

Qualifications include: HIV/AIDS diagnosis; currently insured; resident of Collin, Dallas, Ellis, Hunt, Kaufman or Rockwall counties; unemployed; authorization to verify eligibility.

These additional funds are available to pay premiums due in February, March and April. As this is a grant, continuation of premium payments is contingent on funding after April.

The last time this notification was made in TWT, we were able to disperse all of the funds available.

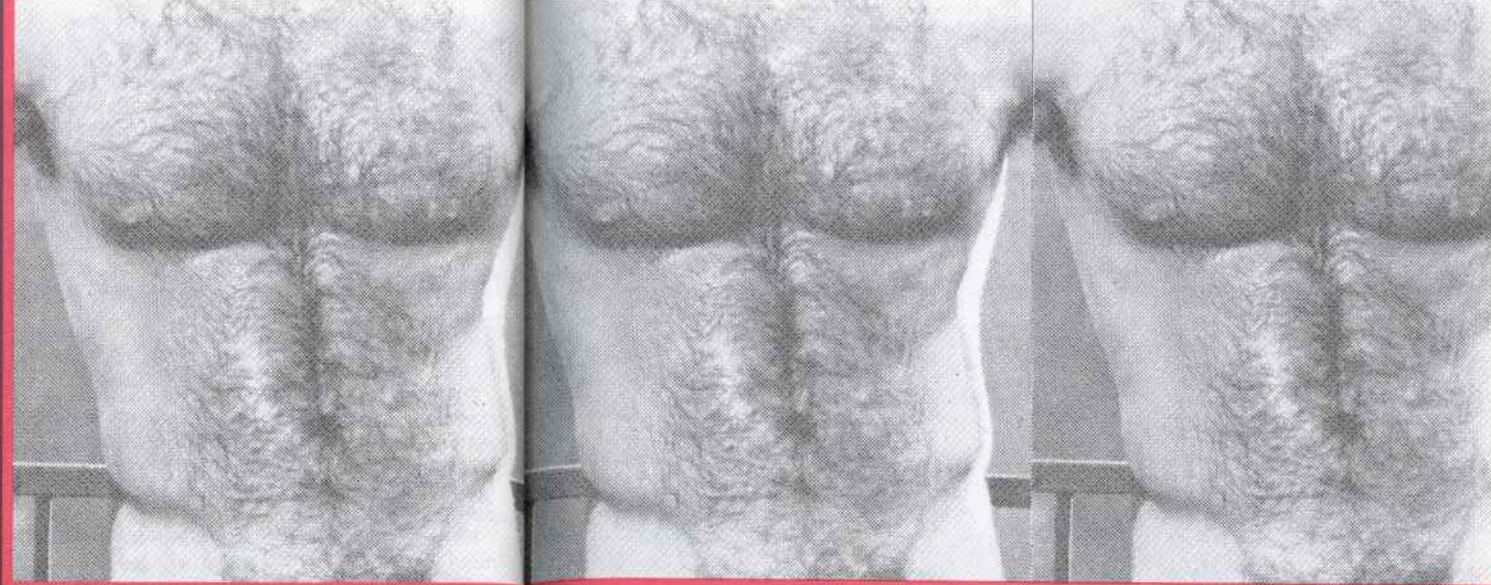

amused at the situation in which my Democrat friends found themselves as they watched their messiah, the Governor, as she seriously considered appointing a United States Senator who has the worst record among the Democrats in Congress on gay and lesbian equal rights.

A student also finds it entertaining that, despite her reputation among traditional gay and lesbian leadership, our Governor has declined to support the correct side on the appeal of 21.06 before the Texas Supreme Court, as she has failed to lend her name to the amici curiae brief; but then, neither has that other hero, Lt. Governor Bob Bullock, nor, for that matter, any other current Democrat officeholder.

Indeed, outside of seeing to it that every possible vacancy in the bureaucracy is filled with a lesbian, our Governor has taken no public leadership on the subject of gay and lesbian equal rights, certainly none in the area of legislation.

In her defense, one should say the Governor is relying upon the reform of the Penal Code to take care of the matter. Nevertheless, such a subtle reform does not deal with the ongoing homophobia in

Texas society and the fear and reluctance of those in the political establishment who fail to publicly support non-discriminatory initiatives.

One then must note that, over the Governor's shoulder, the Republicans are coming! And while we read in article after article from Texas gay and lesbian leadership how wonderful it is that Bill Clinton has been elected, political reality is knocking at the door.

Last November, Texans saw Republicans gain seats in the U.S. House and the Texas House, and come within three votes of being the majority in the Texas Senate. The most supportive Democrat on the Texas Supreme Court lost to a Republican, leaving that body in Democrat hands by one vote, with the Chief Justice being a Republican. And, of course, George Bush, the Republican, carried Texas, not Bill Clinton.

Serious political observers know that the U.S. Senator from Texas elected next May will probably be a Republican, making zero Democrats from Texas in the U.S. Senate. And the Governor herself has no assurance of reelection if the Republicans run a candidate unlike Clayton Williams in 1994.

Since at least half the Texas Senate and all the Texas House as well as the Governor and Lt. Governor will be up for election in 1994, it is not too great a stretch to imagine Texas within 24 months with a Republican Governor, a Republican Lt. Governor, a Republican Senate, a working majority of Republicans in the Texas House, a Republican majority on the Texas Supreme Court and two Republican U.S. Senators.

In other words, advocates and activists in favor of non-discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation must wake up and smell the roses: that a one-party strategy has failed, especially when their heroes are so squeamish in carrying out what they say they support.

Unfortunately, the student in me says that true partisans are incapable of reform. I define a partisan here as one who is so personally associated with the success of a particular political party that he or she cannot disassociate from the party when it is in the best interests of the theoretically primary cause for involvement in the first place, in this case, the cause for gay and lesbian equal rights....

It is up to a new generation of leader-

ship to grasp the importance of full participation in both major political parties if we are to change the attitudes of America and to accelerate the dissipation of their fear of the unfamiliar.

I am proud to support the activities of the Log Cabin clubs, groups of persons who work within the Republican Party toward change in favor of non-discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation. Log Cabin has a hard row to hoe because of the social ostracism by the politically correct, who sometimes are as close-minded and cruel a group as you can find, not to mention the intolerant minority (i.e., the religious right) within the Republican Party. In a clarion act of nonpartisanship, Log Cabin had the courage to withhold its support for the President last November.

Today, in many areas, Log Cabin is providing the leadership required to wrest control of the Republican Party from the forces of darkness that have attempted to use our party to take over this country. They need all the help they can get.

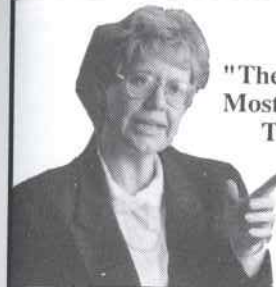

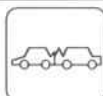

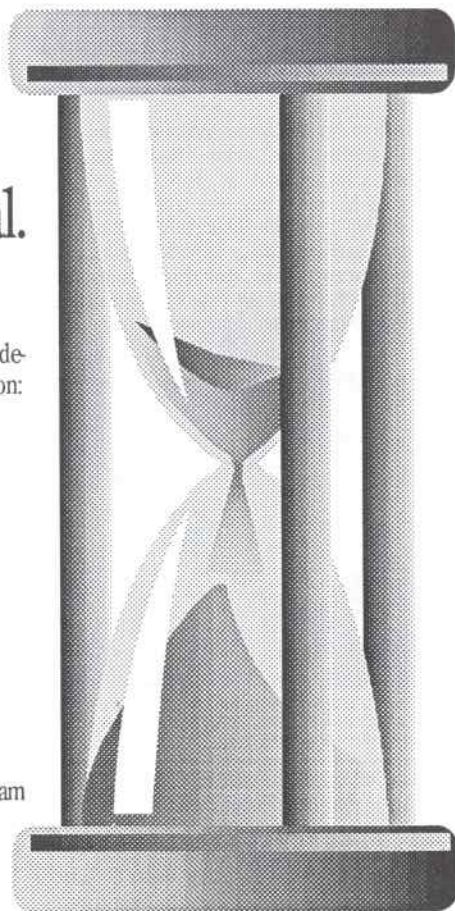

# NOW, MORE THAN EVER

## The Stakes Are High As We Gear Up For April 25 March on Washington

**W**e are less than four months away from the third national March on Washington organized by our community. Now, more than ever, it is imperative that nothing stop every member and supporter of the lesbian, gay and bisexual communities from being in Washington, D.C. on April 25, 1993. We are poised on the brink of irrevocable change in our lives, and we must rise to the challenge that will push us to the side of equal rights and liberation.

The Clinton/Gore victory, hard fought and won by many of us, cannot be treated as the ultimate prize. The battle for our lives is far greater than that. Indeed, our imminent freedom is still too tenuous to pin much hope on the president-elect. Clinton, for example, campaigned hard for our votes and even uttered the "g" word (but not the "l" word) in his acceptance speech at the Democratic National Convention. However, in the campaign that ensued, he repeatedly insisted that he was not condoning our "lifestyle" nor did he favor the right to legal recognition of our partnerships (a right he, assuredly, takes for granted.)

Even as I write this, Clinton's biggest promise to our community may not occur with all good speed. There are open rumors that he may not lift the ban on gays in the military in his first 100 days, or even his first 100 weeks. It may go, instead, to some murky presidential commission where, experience shows, it will surely sink.

If one believes, nonetheless, that Clinton will be supportive of our needs in his days as President, we have to be there at the beginning to support him in the tough battles ahead. The March on Washington is on the 95th day of his presidency.

While many of us rejoice at winning the White House, we cannot forget that we lost in Tampa, Florida and in Colorado. These defeats only give the bigoted, anti-human homo-haters hope that they can take their referendum to 49 other states (Oregon homophobes are rewriting their ordinance to resemble Colorado's) and countless municipalities. One federal bill can act as an immediate dam to a watershed of fights that could only sap a generation's worth of our community's strength. We have a President who will sign such a bill, but we have to convince Congress to pass it.

Obviously the Clinton victory, and other victories last year, give us reason to hope that we will finally be heard. But we can't let this attitude lead to complacency. We must come to the March on Washington just as angry as ever. Witness how precarious our lives are:

- This past year the mainstream press finally asked politicians and polled straight America on their views of gay rights and the "gay lifestyle," but they failed to ask us how we feel, what we need.

- More celebrities are out of the closet than ever before, but their personal lives are treated like private shames rather than declarations of love and pride.

• We are popping up as characters on prime time television in unprecedented numbers, and yet we remain marginal, one-time-only characters.

• More and more straight celebrities are supporting AIDS causes and decrying AIDSphobia, but they are silent on the homophobia that is the root of the disease's stigma.

• We are beginning to enjoy a host of support from liberal and moderate politicians, while simultaneously the right wing is organizing against us.

The scale tips in our favor and then is counterbalanced against us. Even so, we have never been so close to ensuring that our loves and our lives are accorded the inalienable rights supposedly granted to us. April 25 is the chance for us to tip the scales to our side.

The Clinton victory, and other victories last year, give us reason to hope that we will finally be heard. But we can't let this attitude lead to complacency.

For a year we have debated the racial and gender composition of regional representation, we have debated the platform, we have debated the March's name. The debates we have among ourselves are healthy and welcome; they are a testament to what a diverse, vibrant community we are. When we march, however, our voices and presence will focus on the real enemies—anyone or any law that stands in the way of us achieving our rights.

I urge you, therefore, to take every step to attend the April 25, 1993 March on Washington for Lesbian, Gay and Bi Equal Rights and Liberation. The stakes are too high, and our lives are too important, for us not to be in our nation's capital for this most serious and vital occasion.
