## ED OAKLEY DECLARES RUN FOR SEAT ON DALLAS CITY COUNCIL

*Cites Need for Bringing Unity,  
Coalition-Building Back to Politics.*

DALLAS — While this week's presidential inauguration might lead a casual observer to conclude that the campaign season is behind us, what is expected to be a very hotly contested race for the Dallas City Council seat to be vacated by councilmember Lori Palmer is keeping it very much alive.

Tossing his hat into the proverbial ring last week at Wellington's, a popular Dallas restaurant, was the newest addition to a growing list of candidates for the District 14 race, Ed Oakley. Oakley, a general contractor and president of the Oak Lawn Concerned Citizens' Coalition, made the announcement to an enthusiastic crowd of supporters and well-wishers, citing the need to bring unity and coalition-building back into politics. He joins Sharon Boyd and Craig McDaniels, who have already announced their candidacy, in the race.

"During the past year and a half," Oakley stated, "I found the need for everyone to be included in solving issues and problems. I have an unusual ability to be able to sit and listen to the concerns of all sorts of people, from many different backgrounds, and find the clear path to get through a problem." It is that ability that the candidate hopes to bring both to his campaign and to the City Council, should he win.

Based on the turnout for Oakley's announcement, he appears to have a broad base of support. "We had a good mix of people from across the district and across

the city... a good representation. I was very pleased."

Oakley is seeking the District 14 seat from Palmer, who is relinquishing it because of term limitations now in place for elected city officials. District 14 encompasses an area including Oak Lawn, parts of East Dallas, Love Field and Lower Greenville.

## HOUSTON ACTIVISTS PROTEST SENTENCES IN BROUSSARD CASE

*Decry What They Consider  
Lenient Treatment of Defendants  
In 1991 Hate Killing.*

HOUSTON — Three young men charged in the killing of Paul Broussard were sentenced to 15 years in prison on Tuesday, January 12, and the prospect that they might serve only a fraction of their prison terms has outraged some Houston gay and lesbian activists.

The three young men, brothers Javier Aguirre, 19 and Jaime Aguirre, 20, and Leandro Ramirez, 20, had pleaded guilty the day before in the killing of Broussard, a gay man who was fatally wounded as he and two friends walked to their car in the Montrose area early in the morning on July 4, 1991. The three defendants waived their right to a jury trial, and sentencing was thus left to the judge.

The three were among a group of ten young men, all of them from the community of The Woodlands north of Houston, who were charged in the case. The youth who actually wielded the knife Broussard was stabbed with, Jon Christopher Buice, 19, has already been sentenced to 45 years in prison.

Initial statements to the press by Broussard



sard's mother, Nancy Rodriguez, and some activists indicating that they were not dissatisfied with the sentences gave way to rising anger and indignation at the possibility that the three young men might get out of prison after serving as little as 15 months, or one month for every year of their sentences.

Last Friday, several dozen activists gathered in front of the Criminal Courts Building in downtown Houston last Friday around noon, chanting slogans expressing their anger and attacking Judge Rains.

Activist Brian Bradley condemned the sentences as too lenient and the result of a justice system he characterized as "royally screwed up." He called for the enactment of laws imposing stronger penalties on people convicted of hate crimes.

Activist Ray Hill, however, noted that Rains has no control over how much time the three men will actually serve, and he said he believes they will serve at least three to four years, and perhaps more. Hill, a longtime prison reform activist who anchors *The Prison Show* on Houston's KPFT Radio, noted they will probably spend up to a year in Harris County awaiting transfer to the state prison system, which they will probably have difficulty adjusting to. Hill added that he didn't think the three would take full advantage of educational and rehabilitative opportunities offered to prisoners, a necessary condition of being considered for early release.

Hill urged the protesters to become actively involved in the criminal justice system in a direct way to educate officials and inmates on issues of homophobia.

The remaining defendants in the Broussard killing, whose cases have not yet been prosecuted, are Derrick J. Attard, 18; Paul Chance Dillion, 23; Brian Douglas Spake, 18; Raphael Gonzalez, 19; Gayland Earl Randle, 18; and Jeffery Valentine, 18.

Laurie Eiserloh, Executive Director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, attended the demonstration to show her organization's support for the demonstrators and outrage at the sentences. In a statement released the day of the protest, she said, "Our community will not tolerate gay-bashing in the street or discrimination in the courtroom."

Eiserloh called on parents to educate their children to respect and understand differences among people, and said LGRL will be urging the Legislature to pass laws mandating harsher penalties for hate crimes.

## DALLAS GROUPS HONOR GAY VETERANS

*Triangle-Shaped Wreath Placed  
At Memorial in Fair Park.*

DALLAS — Members of several political, service and activist organizations gathered recently to honor American gay and lesbian soldiers who have died serving their country. Joining Deb Elder, president of the Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance, and Timothy Jernigan, president and co-founder of Texas Gay Veterans, were representatives from Men of All Colors Together, Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays, Beth El Binah, the Gay and Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation [GLAAD], Metropolitan Community Church Cathedral of Hope, ACT UP and the Gay Urban Truth Squad [GUTS].

The groups gathered at the Texas Vietnam Memorial, inside the main gate of Fair Park, to lay a wreath, fashioned in the shape of a pink triangle, dedicated to those gay men and lesbians who have served their country.

"Men and women of the gay and lesbian community have proudly served this nation and have died defending the freedoms that they, themselves, did not have," Elder said in her remarks to those assembled. "We have placed this wreath to pay fitting tribute to these lesbian and gay heroes who have fallen in defense of a country that does not want them. In doing so, we have affirmed their lives, their patriotism and their deaths."

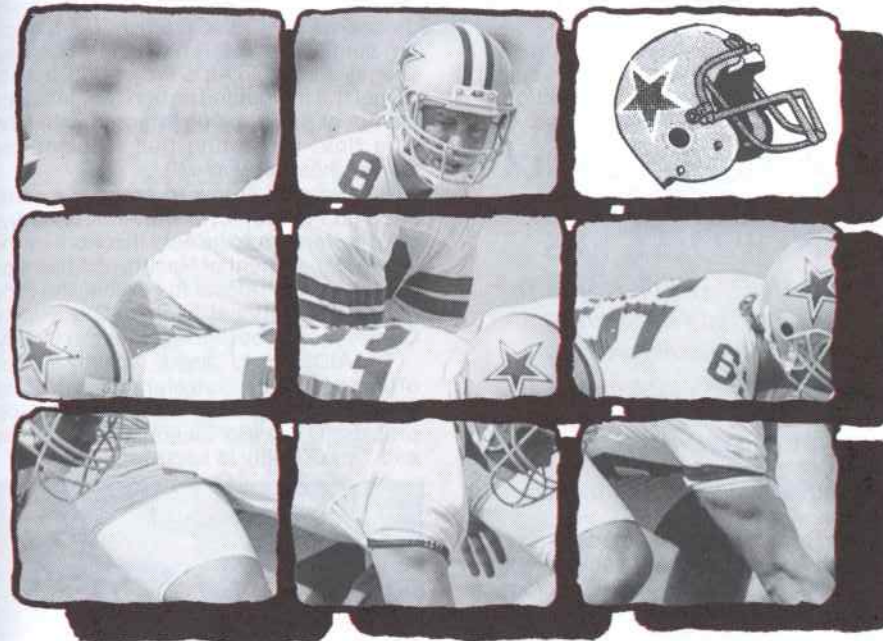


Joining Elder at the podium was First Lieutenant Heidi De Jesus, a lesbian currently being prosecuted under Article 124 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice. The statute prohibits gay men and lesbians from serving in the United States armed forces. De Jesus' case goes before a federal judge in Dallas on February 5.

ington, D.C., was an attempt to give much-deserved recognition to that segment of the military forgotten by most Americans. It is one way that gay soldiers can heal the pain they often feel because of governmental and societal denial and rejection.

According to Timothy Jernigan, president of the gay veterans group, "It is a national disgrace that gay and lesbian veterans should be denied basic rights and protections." The wreath-laying, at least, does not deny them their recognition.

## AIDS EQUITY LEAGUE BEGINS 1993 WITH NEW OFFICERS

*Executive Director Hopes for  
Expanded Outreach to  
Women, Minority Groups.*

HOUSTON — The AIDS Equity League, whose goal is to ensure that people with HIV and AIDS have a voice in public policy-making on the issue, heads into the new year with a new Executive Director and officers.

Judy Rogers, who assumed the post of Executive Director on November 1, previously headed an HIV-prevention program that covered a five-county area in central Texas. She hopes to bring that experience and a firm sense of commitment to her new position in Houston.

"I see myself as someone who has to be actively involved in the HIV and AIDS-infected and affected communities and where we stand in Houston in addressing the needs of these people," Rogers told TWT NEWS.

Asked what she thought the League's primary goals should be, Rogers said, "In simplest terms, we see ourselves as a 'watchdog' whose role is to see that everyone in the community is being fairly represented and equitably treated.

"We try to make sure that services are being delivered and that people in the gay at-risk community know they have a voice in us."

From her perspective as an AIDS educator and activist, Rogers has taken an interest in the current court battle over Section 21.06, the state's anti-sodomy law. A group of state legislators signed an amicus curiae brief filed with the Texas Supreme Court asking that the statute be upheld.

Rogers wrote a letter to four Houston-area legislators among that group, attempting to educate them on the AIDS issue. To date, she has received a response from only one.

Rogers said she would like to see the League expand its outreach to HIV-infected and affected members of minority groups as well as to women. On the latter point, she said she hopes that the League's Lesbian AIDS Project will help to dispel the misguided notion that lesbians are not at risk of being infected with HIV. "I'm tired of hearing that lesbians are God's chosen people."

The League hopes to present a workshop on the Project at the Annual Spring HIV Conference to be held this April by the Texas Department of Health, and has also submitted a proposal to present the Project to the National Lesbian/Gay Health Conference to be held in Houston in July.

The AIDS Equity League recently elected officers for 1993. Bob Hergenroeder was chosen president, Doug Moon is vice-president, Brenda Caillouet is treasurer and Tim O'Reilly is secretary.

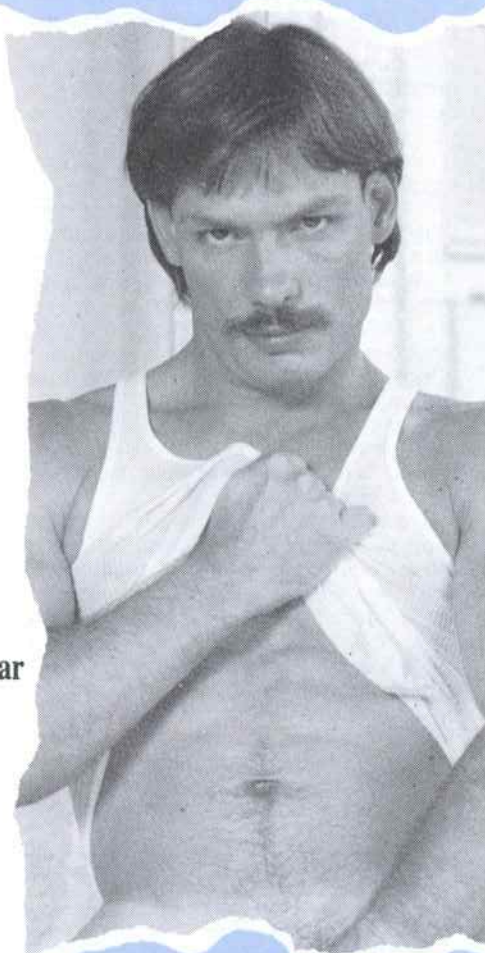

## AIDS CARE FACILITY OPENS IN ARLINGTON

*Office of AIDS Outreach Center Will Provide Referral, Counseling, Buddy Support & Other Services.*

ARLINGTON — In the decade since AIDS first burst on the scene as the century's greatest health threat, much of the media and medical attention the disease has garnered has focused on minority groups in large cities. But the AIDS epidemic doesn't exist just in San Francisco or Dallas or New York. It is pandemic, affecting young and old, black and white, in big cities and small towns.

It is the infected living in small-to-mid-size cities across the country who experience the most difficulty in obtaining the health and counseling services they so desperately need to cope with the disease. Medical costs are so prohibitively high that most clinics and hospitals simply cannot afford to fund programs designed to treat HIV-infected individuals. And transportation systems in many rural areas are not extensive enough to guarantee easy access to care facilities in neighboring towns and cities.

In a bold move designed to counteract such isolation, the AIDS Outreach Center of Fort Worth has opened an ancillary office in Arlington to address the needs of the 1,022 reported AIDS cases in the North Texas town. Local officials are welcoming the new facility with open arms.

In remarks made during the center's opening last week, former Arlington mayor Tom Vandergriff—now a Tarrant County Judge—stated, "I'm thrilled at the prospect that people won't have to go too far for help anymore. The need is great here—probably greater than we realize."

Greater, perhaps, than many people realize. Public health officials assume that for every case of full-blown AIDS, there are 10 people with the HIV infection. This means that, potentially, 10,000 people living in and near Arlington will at some point have a need to contact the new center.

If that need arises, a prospective client will find a full-service referral and counseling center, staffed by two full-time employees and supported by 35 volunteers. Support groups, case management, legal services, a buddy support system and educational programs are offered. All serv-

ices are free except for counseling, which is provided on a sliding scale based on a client's income and insurance coverage.

Funding for the nonprofit center, which is administered by a 15-member board of directors presided over by Sister Mary Fulbright, is derived primarily from private donations and grants from the United Way, but center officials are hoping to obtain more funds through government grants.

Over 100 people attended the official ribbon-cutting ceremony opening the Arlington facility last week, including Mayor Richard Greene, who praised the new center as a welcome addition to the city. Dr. Patricia Wetzel, the physician who was infected with HIV last when she was accidentally stuck by a contaminated needle, cut the ribbon with a huge pair of white cardboard scissors. Dr. Wetzel continues to work with HIV and AIDS patients.

Despite the warm welcome given the new center by Arlington officials and residents, one person can't wait to see the facility close its doors. That man is Thomas Bruner, Executive Director of the AIDS Outreach Center. In words delivered to the assembled crowd, Bruner stated, "The ultimate success of this center will come when you and I gather at this location and celebrate not its opening but its closing."

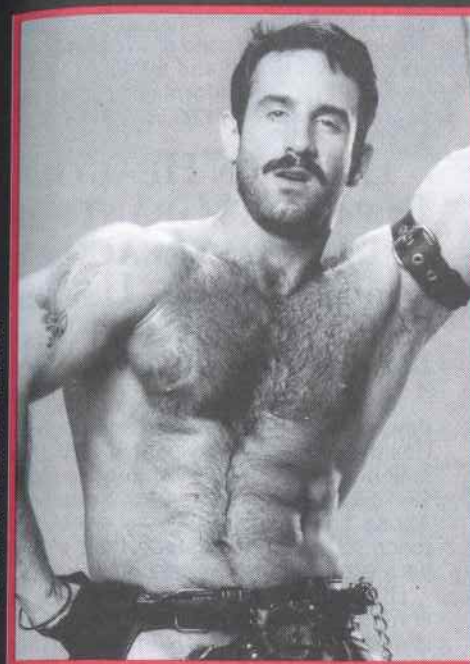
## NAMES PROJECT OF HOUSTON MOVES TO LARGER QUARTERS

the Quilt Houston, Inc., rented space in a building occupied by a health club. The NAMES Project then moved to a member's home, and later to a small space on Fairview.

"We've grown so much thanks to the generosity of the community that we needed a larger space and a more visible outlet," co-chair Keith J. Crawford told TWT NEWS recently as NAMES Project members hurried about the new space putting things in order and getting ready for an upcoming garage sale.

Workshop manager and Pete Martinez said the group had gotten a warm reception at its new headquarters. "We've had people in the neighborhood come by and welcome us here."

The new workshop, in a house the organization has rented on Woodhead, provides two spacious rooms for assembling the panels that commemorate those lost to AIDS. There will also be a permanent merchandise sales area for NAMES Project T-shirts, buttons and other paraphernalia.

Martinez said a Quilt panel will be kept on display in the large picture window of the sewing room at the front of the house. Panels will be changed weekly as new ones are brought in.

The Houston NAMES Project also recently elected a new slate of officers. Michael Bongiorno and Keith J. Crawford are co-chairpersons for 1993; Clay Fischer is secretary/historian; Judy Hollins is treasurer; Martinez is workshop manager; Gloria and Rex King are outreach coordinators; and Crawford is in charge of public relations.

## HOUSTON HEALTH DEPT. GETS GRANT FOR HIV OUTREACH AMONG DRUG USERS

*Mobile Unit Will Take Services  
Directly to Affected Communities.*

HOUSTON — The Bureau of HIV/STD Prevention of the Houston Department of Health and Human Services [HDHHS] has announced that it was recently awarded \$317,608 by the Center for Substance Abuse Treatment to provide street outreach to IV drug users and their sexual partners in a targeted area of Houston.

HDHHS says the award, which may be continued through 1995, will be used to identify, recruit and make referrals for persons at risk for HIV disease because of drug use. Clients will participate in a three-level intervention program that offers HIV education and testing; treatment for sexually transmitted diseases and tuberculosis; and support for drug users who are not being treated but wish to enter or re-enter treatment.

Treatment services will be offered through a referral network consisting of city health centers and city tuberculosis clinics. Inpatient and outpatient drug treatment will be offered through a local general hospital and a detoxification center.

The grant also allows for the purchase of a mobile unit which will be staffed by two outreach teams, each of which will consist of two outreach workers and one HIV educator/counselor. HDHHS says the mobile unit will permit HIV-related services to be provided directly to people in communities which are most affected by drug use.

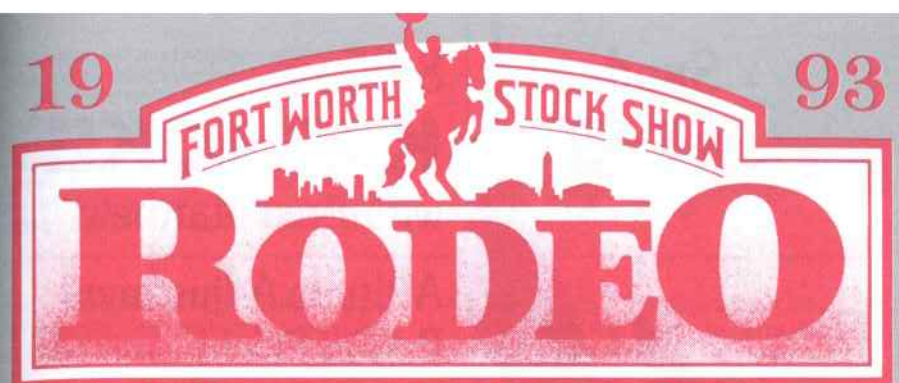

## COMMENT

*The following letter was submitted to TWT, which solicited and received the two replies which follow.—Editor*

Dear TWT:

In early November, Sazarac Celebrity Grille advertised that the door charge of \$10 would benefit AIDS Foundation Houston, specifically Stone Soup. Since that date, I have scoured the pages of TWT and other local gay publications to find out whether AIDS Foundation Houston has received this donation.

Every time I go out, I am asked to contribute money to many worthy organizations. I am concerned with this matter. Recently, every Tom, Dick and Harry advertises that they are raising funds for the purpose of helping people with AIDS. At the same time, there seems to be no community accountability regarding the raising and distribution of these funds. It would seem to me that if an individual or organization is holding a fund-raiser benefiting a particular organization or person, that the fund-raiser be required to promote it as an event specifically sanctioned by the donee.

In the current climate and economic situation of the gay community, every fund-raising dollar is a terribly precious commodity, and the thought of even one charitable dollar going into the pocket of some unscrupulous person or organization causes me to cringe.

I am not indicting Sazarac Celebrity Grille; in fact, I hope they have made a sizable donation to AIDS Foundation Houston. But if they have not, I, and I would hope the entire gay community, want to know why, and this goes ditto for every supposed fund-raiser in Houston. It would seem to me that TWT and other gay publications would follow up on the events for which they have accepted advertising dollars and determine whether or not those dollars were disbursed. Additionally, the charity should bug the hell out of the fund-raisers and report to

the community if funds are not disbursed.

Something has got to be done. Please help the community by making sure that your individual donations are actually benefiting the charity that you have chosen to support.

## Blanket Boycott Bad Idea

Dear TWT:

I have become convinced that the Boycott Colorado movement is a hasty and self-defeating response to a very real threat.

As everyone must know by now, three of the communities most affected by this boycott—Denver, Boulder and Aspen—have gay rights ordinances. "They'll just have to sacrifice" is the usual response of boycott supporters, often with the implied

accusation that residents of these cities (which voted overwhelmingly against Amendment 2) are at fault for not having done even more to stop it.

This is great hindsight, but lousy politics. The fact is, we're hurting our supporters in hopes that a little of the economic pain will trickle down to our opponents. Sound familiar? Trickle-down punishment is even goofier than trickle-down economics.

Amendment 2 came about, in large part, as a backlash against the gay rights ordinances of these three cities. A blanket boycott of Colorado sends out a dangerous message: Your support of lesbian and gay rights is now going to cost you.

In a perfect world, voters might flock to vote their conscience, and to hell with their wallet. In the real world, we invite disaster if we start rewarding our supporters with an economic boycott. A targeted boycott, aimed at businesses and cities that supported Amendment 2, would be a far smarter approach.

The boycott movement has quickly taken on an aura of political orthodoxy. On this (as on so many other issues), debate should be encouraged, not squelched. Perhaps the time will come when a

blanket boycott of Colorado seems our only option. But it should be a last resort, not a knee-jerk first response.

Jim, 52, a 25-year resident of Austin, passed away January 10, 1993 after a brief illness.

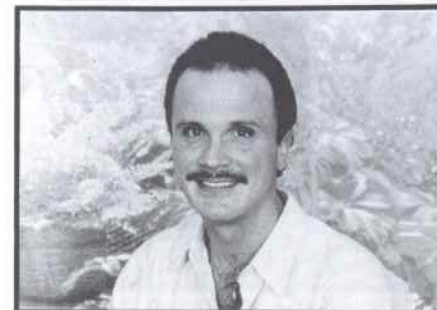
Originally from Birmingham, Alabama, Jim owned the Clip Joint, where he cut hair.

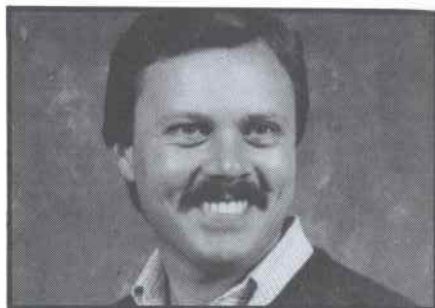

Monte's parents preceded him in death. He is survived by his brother Milo Mike and many friends around the country.

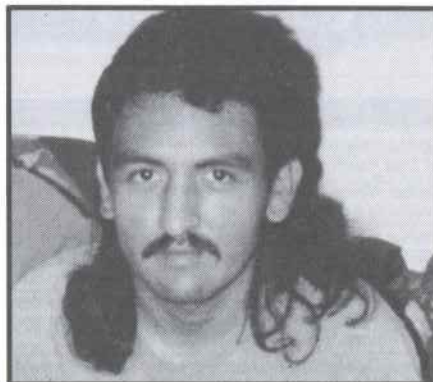

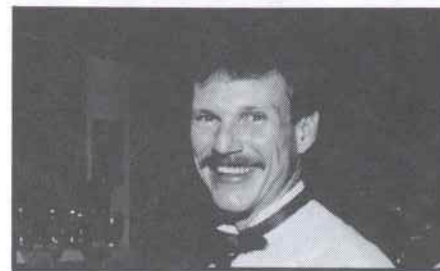


