STATE OFFICIALS, ACTIVISTS CONDEMN CUTS IN TEXAS AIDS FUNDING

*Say Reductions Would Jeopardize
Federal Funding, Result in Need
For Greater Expenditures Later.*

AUSTIN — At a press conference held Monday at the state Capitol, state health officials, legislators and AIDS activists condemned proposed drastic cuts in the money Texas spends on AIDS. The briefing was organized by the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas [LGRL], which lobbies the state Legislature on gay, lesbian and AIDS issues.

LGRL Executive Director Laurie Eiserloh opened the briefing. Also taking part were Dr. David Smith, Director of the Texas Department of Public Health; Eugene Sepulveda, Chair of the Austin/Travis County HIV Commission; and Dr. Carolyn Parker, Director of the Texas AIDS Network.

Also on hand were state representatives Glen Maxey and Elliot Naishtat of Austin and Debra Danburg of Houston, and AIDS activist Paul Clover of Austin. Members of ACT-UP and the Women's Action Coalition staged a "die-in" after the press conference.

The Legislative Budget Board has proposed cuts of nearly \$32 million—a reduction of over 90%—in the money spent by the state on AIDS.

Cutting state spending on HIV would not only add to the already fearsome burdens on HIV service and education programs in Texas, but would also jeopardize millions of dollars the state receives from the federal government. Since the Ryan White Care Act requires Texas to maintain its own AIDS spending at current levels in order to be eligible for Ryan White funds, the state could lose over \$7 million in federal AIDS money.

The proposed cuts in AIDS funding would result in the elimination of prevention and education programs, training of HIV counselors, data collection for counseling and testing, and state medication programs, among others.

Steep cuts would also be made in the areas of laboratory testing, pre- and post-test counseling, surveillance, and administrative and support services.

TEXAS NEWS

The prospect of drastically reduced spending on AIDS in Texas comes at a time when a more inclusive definition of AIDS by the Centers for Disease Control promises to dramatically increase the number of newly-diagnosed people seeking services.

State Rep. Maxey told TWT NEWS the cuts in AIDS spending make no sense from an economic standpoint. He said he believes that for every \$100 spent on prevention, thousands of dollars are saved in medical expenses. "We've got to give this problem support or we will continue to see more people die and more taxpayers' money will be spent."

LGRL Director Eiserloh expressed the hope that at least some of the cuts could be rolled back. "The coalition of all who attended [the press conference] has sent out the message that the people have built a base and the Legislature has heard it. We believe we have waylaid these deep cuts and we expect the state to keep up with the demands of HIV and AIDS.

"Now is the time for people to start calling their elected representatives and letting them know that these cuts are not acceptable."

HOUSTON ACTIVISTS OBSERVE ANNIVERSARY OF REPEAL OF JOB PROTECTION LAW

*Defeat of Ordinance in 1985
Compared to Passage of
Amendment 2 In Colorado.*

HOUSTON — A group of local gay and lesbian activists gathered on the steps of City Hall at noon last Tuesday to observe the eighth anniversary of the defeat of a city ordinance protecting gay men and lesbians against discrimination in city employment.

The 20 participants, representing local gay and lesbian political and activist

groups, opened the observance by singing two traditional hymns with newly written, gay-positive lyrics. Law school professor and activist Gene Harrington then addressed the crowd, recounting a brief history of the ordinance, its repeal by voters and the aftermath for the Houston gay and lesbian community.

Harrington noted that the law, which added gay men and lesbians to a list of minority groups protected against discrimination in city employment, received the support of then-Mayor Kathy Whitmire and most members of City Council when it was passed on June 19, 1984.

But a repeal movement was begun by two City Council members who had previously been endorsed by the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus, and it gained the support of the Ku Klux Klan, religious fundamentalists and the Houston Chamber of Commerce, then led by former mayor Louie Welch.

"A campaign aimed at our community warned of bestiality, child rape and atrocities too horrendous to describe in the presence of the ladies. After spending nearly one-half million dollars on the campaign of hate, they defeated the human rights ordinance by a 4-to-1 majority."

Then followed a four-year period during which, Harrington said, "gay rights were abandoned to the politics of expediency... Expediency replaced courage, and gay men and lesbians suffered."

Also speaking at the ceremony were Houston activists Annise Parker and Ray Hill, who compared the defeat of the Houston job protection ordinance to the approval by Colorado voters in November of Amendment 2, which repealed gay rights ordinances on the books in three of that state's cities.

Hill referred to the economic price Colorado is now paying in the form of a nation-

wide boycott against that state, and said, "Houston owes [gay men and lesbians] an economic debt for what happened in 1985."

Parker called the need for such an observance unfortunate. "I'm sorry that we have to meet here today, mourning the loss of our rights eight years ago." But she also sounded a hopeful and defiant note in her closing remarks.

"We represent many, many people who care about this issue, and the fight isn't over."

DALLAS COUNTY AIDS FATALITIES AT LOWEST RATE EVER

Officials Urge Continued Vigilance On Part of Gay Community.

DALLAS — The Dallas County Health Department, in a recently released surveillance report tracking the HIV virus and its impact on Dallas and its citizens, has documented 137 new cases of infection in the two months since the November reporting period. While this figure is lower than the total new cases reported in the same period last year, it represents half of the cases reported during the second half of 1992. To date, the Health Department has recorded 4,104 cases of AIDS, with 2,802 persons, or 68%, succumbing to AIDS-related infections.

The most striking aspect of the report is the case-fatality rate, which, with only 21 deaths reported during the second half of the year, stands at 9 percent—the lowest rate ever documented by the county.

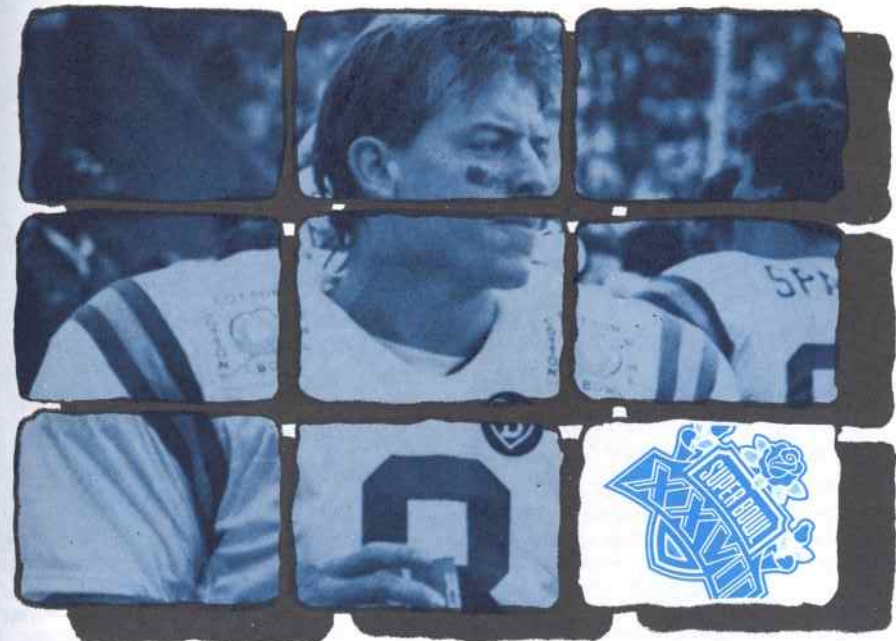
Officials cite early detection of the disease and improved treatment programs for the dramatic change in this rate.

The picture of a typical individual living with AIDS in Dallas continues to be dominated by white homosexual or bisexual men, aged 30-39. These people will most likely die as the result of pneumocystis carinii pneumonia [PCP] alone, or in concert with another infection.

The latest figures indicate that 77% of those infected are white—the same percentage as in the November reporting period; 81% are gay or bisexual men—down from 84% in November; 49% have been between the ages of 30 and 39—up slightly from 48% in November; and 74% have died as the result of PCP—the same

percentage as in November.

County officials continue to urge caution and continued vigilance as the most effective ways to curb the spread of HIV. They stress that the gay community cannot afford to backslide in its prevention and education efforts, particularly as the rate of infection continues to rise in non-gay-identifying groups.

The County Health Department has begun a study to measure the effects of the media on non-gay-identifying groups who are not connected to the gay community and its outreach programs. Many experts believe that this lack of information will cause a dramatic rise in the incidence of infection among non-gay segments of the population.

HOUSTON TO HOST REGIONAL MEETING ON NAT'L AIDS AGENDA

Findings to Become Part of Comprehensive Report to President.

HOUSTON — The Houston Department of Health and Human Services [HDHHS] announced last week that Houston is one of 25 cities selected to host regional meetings around the country to help set the foundation for a new national AIDS agenda for the Clinton Administration. HDHHS is encouraging participation in the meeting by AIDS service providers and individuals living with the disease.

The regional meetings are being sponsored by the AIDS Action Council, the National Minority AIDS Council and the AIDS National Interfaith Network. Anthony Rios, local program coordinator for HDHHS, explained that one reason gatherings are being held in so many locations is that different cities are expected to have different priorities and perspectives on AIDS issues.

The Houston meeting is scheduled for next Saturday at the George R. Brown Convention Center, 1001 Convention Center Blvd. After an introductory session, participants will break up into four roundtable groups facilitated by health professionals and dealing with research, discrimination, prevention and care issues.

A comprehensive summary of the results of all 25 regional meetings will be compiled by the sponsoring agencies and presented to President Clinton to begin

immediate federal initiatives to combat the AIDS crisis.

Rios stressed that the Health Department was seeking participation by a broad cross section of those affected by HIV. "We encourage not just HIV service organizations, but also their clients and other people living with HIV to attend and provide input."

The meeting will be held next Saturday from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. at the George R. Brown Convention Center. Child care, signing for the hearing-impaired and Spanish translation will be provided.

AIDS OUTREACH CENTER TO PRESENT DISCUSSION ON WOMEN & AIDS

Focus on Risk Factors in Women, Difficulties in Making Diagnosis.

FORT WORTH — Next Friday, February 5, the AIDS Outreach Center of Fort Worth will present a discussion on "Women and AIDS: Risk and Diagnosis" as part of its Friday Forum series. Guest speaker for the event will be Dr. Patricia Wetzel, Director of HIV Outpatient Services at John Peter Smith Hospital.

The program will focus on both the risk factors for HIV infection in women and the difficulties in making an AIDS diagnosis. It has been determined that women represent the fastest-growing group with HIV infection in the U.S. AIDS is now the fifth leading cause of death among American women aged 25-44; however, due to insufficient funding and research, there is less information about HIV infection in women than in men.

While women with AIDS may exhibit some of the same symptoms and opportunistic infections as men, early manifestations of the disease in women are usually gynecological complications. Currently, women are twice as likely as men to have opportunistic infections which are misdiagnosed because HIV infection is not suspected. In 1991, 11% of women diagnosed with AIDS died the same month as their diagnosis.

The discussion program will be held at AIDS Outreach Center, 1125 West Peter Smith in Fort Worth. A light lunch will be

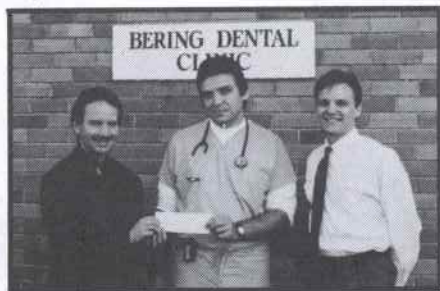

BERING FOUNDATION RECEIVES \$1,500 FROM LIFETEC

Ken Stein, Director of Development for Bering, said the funds will be used to purchase computer equipment that will allow the Foundation to more easily assist clients of its Care Center and Dental Clinic.

Bill Clevenger, RN, BSN, the company's Director of Nursing, said, "We feel that giving back to the HIV community is very important."

"We are all going to have to pull to-

gether. AIDS is far-reaching and it should be everybody's concern."

Stein said the Bering Community Service Foundation assists over 2,500 people with HIV or AIDS. The Foundation currently operates an adult day care center, financial assistance program, meal program and dental clinic. The Foundation also provides funding for the Bering Support Network offered through Bering Memorial United Methodist Church.

GAY SWITCHBOARD OF HOUSTON SETS VOLUNTEER TRAINING

*Two Weekend Sessions Include
Study in Active Listening, Referrals.*

HOUSTON — The Gay & Lesbian Switchboard Houston has set the dates for its next training class for telephone volunteers. The Switchboard is a nonprofit, all-volunteer organization that provides information and referrals to callers on matters of interest to the gay and lesbian community.

The training program will be held on the weekends of February 6-7 and 13-14, with a brief overview meeting on the night of the first Friday, February 5. Training consists of 30 hours of intensive study and group interaction dealing with active listening, giving information and referrals to callers, and much more.

Volunteers must be at least 18 years of age and be able to work a three-hour telephone shift with other volunteers for a period of at least six months. Calls to the Switchboard range from questions concerning community events and establishments to situations that require the volunteer to listen actively to the caller's concerns about gay and lesbian issues and other matters.

The training session will cover both days on two consecutive weekends, and prospective volunteers are asked to attend both weekends in order to successfully complete training. New volunteers begin their shifts with experienced telephone volunteers.

To the dream.

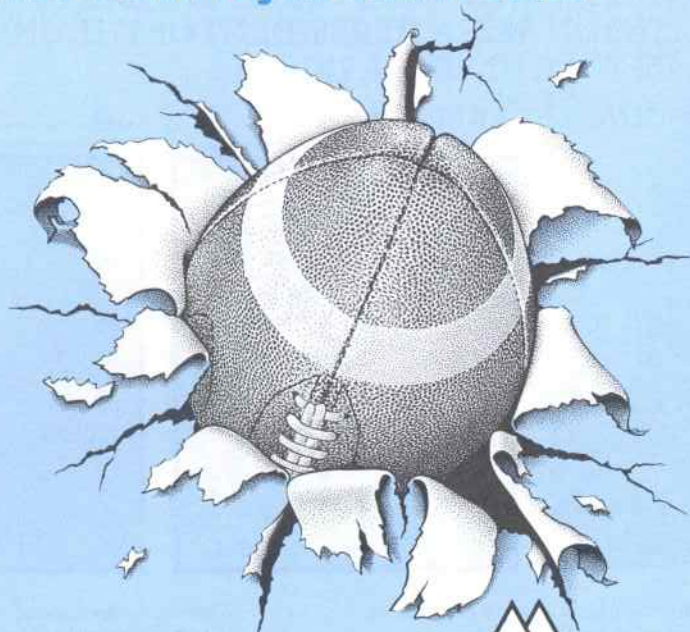
Women, children, men,

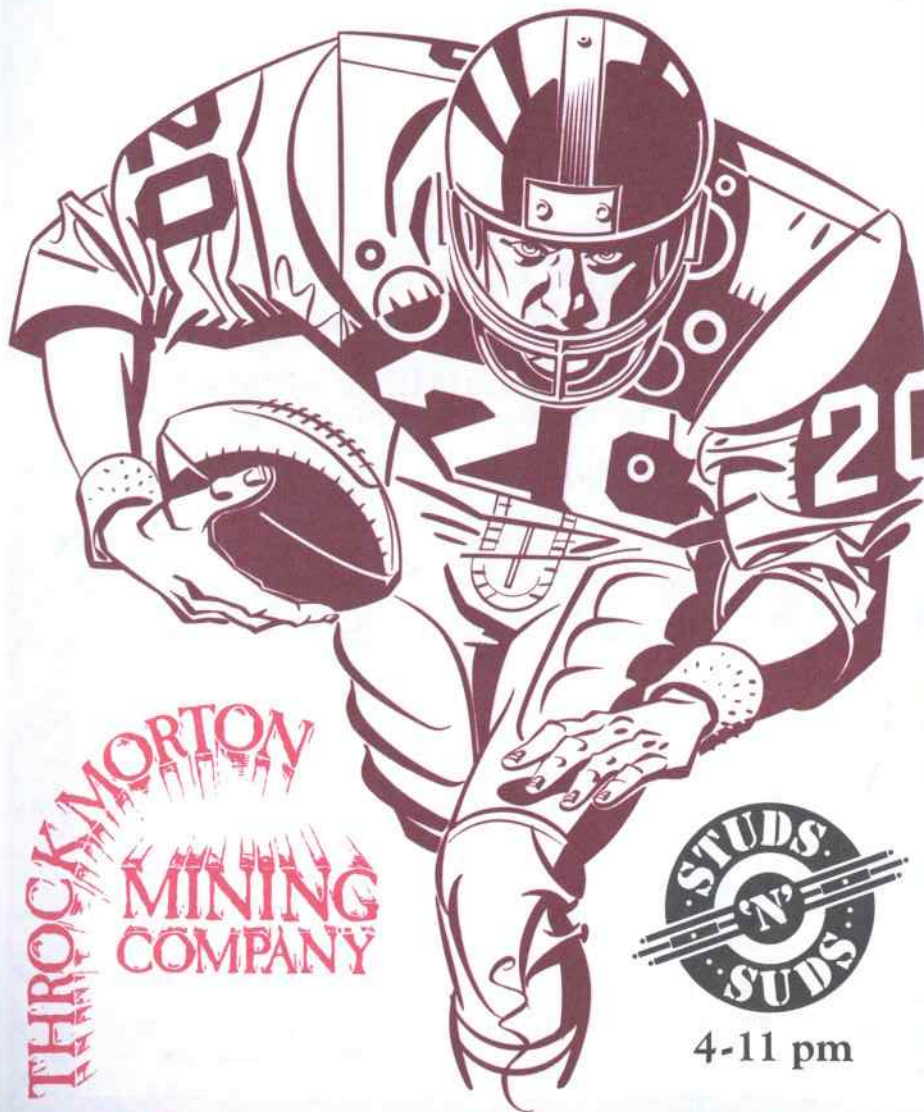

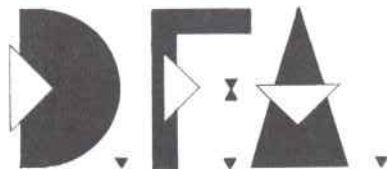
HIV Wellness Center Offers Services on Sliding Scale

Zoning Us Out of Existence

I know what it is like to be infatuated with a house. I lived in New Orleans once and did that scene. I have even fallen in love with other possessions as well. It has always been easy for gay people to become infatuated with the things they own in their search for acceptance. "People will love me for how I look, what I drive or where I live, but no one will love me for who I am, because I am gay." That is the best explanation I can imagine for the gay supporters of the draconian effects on our community of the proposed Houston zoning plans.

At the base of all goals of the gay/lesbian movement is the hope to keep government out of our lives. We seek to legally and politically challenge section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code because it allows government intrusion into our lives and criminalizes what we do there. At its base, zoning is the authorization for government to control the use of the private property of citizens. The principle is the same. Anyone claiming to support rights is being inconsistent if he or she also supports zoning.

But zoning as presently proposed in Houston is more dangerous than that for our community. The proposed map for Montrose originally threatened every bar in the neighborhood. After an initial forceful reaction, the zoning commission retreated partially.

Now the situation allows most of the bars to remain, but on a short leash. At any time in the future, 30% of the residents in the area may successfully challenge a liquor license and close any bar. Not 60%, but 30%, which in many cases may be only two or three people. Further, no place that receives more than 25% of its income

from liquor sales may cover more than 3,500 square feet in total area. That would eliminate any present or future large disco frequented by gay men or lesbians.

Yes, there are gay bars in cities with zoning, but they became gay bars by dealing with the local zoning commission. And in those cities, the commission did not set out to close existing bars, including those frequented by gay and lesbian clientele.

In the '50s and '60s, zoning laws in many cities and states specifically forbade liquor licenses to bars frequented by "homosexuals." Many of those defending the Houston zoning commission are too young to remember the battles others of us have fought in the past. With zoning in place, a referendum could be forced by the same people who helped outlaw gay and lesbian city employment in 1985, to change the rules so that our community would not exist as we know it.

When you hear gay and lesbian advocates of zoning say, "We have nothing to fear from zoning," ask them to have guarantees written into the law that specifically forbid the closing of existing businesses and prohibit discrimination on the same basis as existing anti-discrimination laws that include "sexual orientation." You will find that they are unwilling to add such protection.

The Houston Gay and Lesbian Political Caucus will consider the zoning issue at its next meeting on Wednesday, February 3 at 7:30 p.m. at the Montrose Palace, Commonwealth at Nevada.
