## KRUEGER ATTACKED FOR 'WAFLING' ON MILITARY GAY BAN

*After First Declaring Support for Clinton's Move, He Says Issue Should Be Resolved by Military.*

TEXAS — Sen. Bob Krueger found himself in hot water last week over his response to the political issue of the moment, whether gay men and lesbians should be allowed to serve in the military.

Krueger, appointed by Gov. Ann Richards to fill the Senate seat left vacant when Lloyd Bentsen became Treasury Secretary, initially declared his support for President Bill Clinton's plan to lift the ban, then appeared to soften his stance.

Under a six-month compromise plan announced by Clinton last Friday, enlistees will no longer be asked whether they are gay; service people will not be discharged solely because of their orientation; and discharge proceedings already in progress against gay and lesbian military personnel will be suspended, though they may still be removed from active duty.

Defense Secretary Les Aspin has until July 15 to draft an executive order ending the ban.

After earlier declining to take a stand on the issue, last week Krueger released a letter he had sent to the President saying that he favors eliminating the ban on gay men and lesbians serving in the armed forces, but that conduct should still be regulated.

Two days later, however, Krueger appeared to change his position on the matter when he issued another statement saying he believed the issue should be resolved by the military, rather than through a court decision or by presidential order.

Krueger is receiving criticism from gay leaders around the state for his shifting stance on the issue, which may affect his chances of winning the endorsements of gay and lesbian political organizations in his effort to hold onto his Senate seat.

Jim Mattox, who is likely to challenge Krueger in a special election called for May 1, strongly supports lifting the ban, and has been attacking Krueger for vacillating on the issue.

Republican Sen. Republican Phil Gramm has made it clear that he opposes allowing gays to serve, and has threatened to introduce legislation formalizing the ban.

### ACT-UP/DALLAS SLAMS TREATMENT OF PRISONERS WITH HIV

*County's Policies Said to Be at Odds With Most of Rest of Nation.*

DALLAS — Citing numerous complaints from HIV-infected inmates who claim that they have been denied basic prison privileges and adequate medical treatment, members of the Dallas chapter of ACT-UP staged a protest last week outside the Lew Sterrett Justice Center to call attention to what representatives describe as "cruel and unusual punishment" and "violations of human rights."

What ACT-UP means by "cruel and unusual punishment" is the segregation of HIV-infected inmates from the general population; lack of standard medical treatment for prisoners with AIDS and HIV; violation of the confidentiality of these prisoners, including the stamping of "HIV +" in big red letters on the outside of their files; no early release for prisoners with AIDS near death; no access to support groups or other programs for HIV-positive prisoners; no prevention materials available to any prisoner (including condoms, dental dams, bleach for syringes, etc.); and no standard mobility—including the denial of prison trustee status—for HIV-positive prisoners.



Most of these violations have been documented by two Dallas County jail prisoners, Wylie Smith and Mike Fugitt, in prison grievance forms. Smith has filed a lawsuit against Dallas County Sheriff Jim Bowles. No court date has yet been set.

Of greatest concern, from a civil rights standpoint, is the forced segregation of HIV-positive prisoners. According to the American Civil Liberties Union [ACLU], few prison systems in the United States isolate inmates with AIDS from the general population and, according to Jackie Walker, AIDS information coordinator for ACLU's Prison Project in Washington, D.C., Dallas County's policies are inconsistent with trends in other prison systems nationwide.

Bob Dearing, Chief of Jail Operations for the Texas Commission on Jail Standards in Austin, indicates that state law allows this segregation, and that Dallas County is therefore operating within state law and policy. Most other prison systems in the state, however, including the Harris County jail in Houston, follow the practice of housing infected inmates with the rest of the jail population.

This inconsistency in Dallas County's interpretation of state policy, coupled with the apparent disregard of inmates' rights, led to ACT-UP's protest. According to event organizer Clint Packer, the action came off without a hitch.

"The police were very polite, very receptive. In fact, we gave them hamburgers at the end of the protest because they were such good little boys."

Only one counter-protester was on hand, a religious zealot Packer said tried to convert ACT-UP members. He came by later in the protest, however, and apologized for his behavior and, according to Packer, "was given three hamburgers for his Christian behavior."

The demonstration, which lasted about an hour, was dedicated to the memory of the late Bill Hunt, long-time community activist and civic leader who recently died as the result of complications from AIDS. It was called at this time to demonstrate the urgency of the situation, especially since, Packer noted, "the rate of HIV infection in prisons is higher than in all other institutions in the U.S. A recent survey by the Centers for Disease Control showed a 5.8% rate of infection in prisons, compared to 5.3% in drug treatment centers and 2.9% in STD clinics.

"HIV is being readily transmitted from

prisoner to prisoner every day, since it is a crime for prisoners to be found in possession of either condoms or bleach for sterilizing syringes. Drug abuse and sexual activity are undeniably commonplace in prisons. It is misleading to segregate prisoners known to be HIV-positive because not all prisoners know their HIV status, Lew Sterrett does not know every prisoner's status, and antibodies to HIV may not be detected for as long as six months."

"And even if a prisoner's status is known, it doesn't make it right to deny them their civil rights."

## HOUSTON AIDS SERVICE REPS

### VOICE OPPOSITION TO STATE SPENDING CUTS

*Governor, Legislature Condemned  
For Endangering Lives of PWAs.*

HOUSTON — Representatives of AIDS service agencies and others involved in fighting the disease in Houston expressed their outrage recently at a proposal by the state Legislative Budget Board to slash nearly \$32 in spending for HIV/AIDS services.

The spending cuts would force the elimination of HIV prevention and education programs, training of counselors, data collection and state medication programs. Other services would be sharply curtailed, and the state's share of federal AIDS funds would be jeopardized.

At a press conference called last Tuesday evening, AIDS activists and others roundly condemned the proposed cuts, saying they would endanger the lives of people with the disease and would only multiply the costs of dealing with the epidemic later.

Terri Richardson of ACT UP/Gulf Coast pointed up the urgency of the issue. "...During the two weeks since the Legislative Budget Board's proposed cuts were announced, Gov. Richards and most of this state's legislators have been silent about HIV and AIDS. Over 4,000 Americans died of AIDS during that two-week period, many of them Texans..."

Houston City Council member Ben Reyes said cuts in the state's AIDS spending would increase local spending to the breaking point and beyond. The state, he said, "is totally mistaken if it assumes that local governments can take up the slack. If state spending is cut... You're either going to pay now, or you're going to pay later."

Chris Bacon, president of the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus, echoed Reyes' warning. "...Ultimately, Texas will pay a much higher price for the Legislative Budget Board's penny-pinching. In particular, by reducing the amount spent on testing and counseling, Texas is setting itself up for a disaster of epic proportions..."

Rep. Craig Washington, State Sen. Rodney Ellis and State Rep. Garnet Coleman sent statements of support which were read at the press briefing.

Activist Brian Bradley, who is on the board of the Greater Houston HIV Alliance, pointed out that the proposed spending cuts would worsen the state's already miserable record in AIDS spending. He noted that the state ranks high in the number of AIDS cases, but spends proportionately less than other major states.

Much of the anger expressed at the briefing was directed at Gov. Ann Richards, who attracted strong support among gay and lesbian voters in her successful run for the state's top office in 1990.

Bradley said Richards' apparent lack of concern on the issue of AIDS funding had caused him to reconsider his support for her. "I can't at this point vote for Gov. Richards again."

Maurice (Mo) Jones, who has AIDS and is chair of the board of the Greater Houston HIV Alliance, summed up the im-

mediacy of the issue for those affected by the disease. "...We will live or die as a result of what the Legislature does."

The Houston press conference followed on the heels of a similar briefing held by AIDS activists, state legislators and health officials in Austin a week earlier.

## AIDS FOUNDATION HOUSTON NAMES NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

*Joyce Yost Sets Long-Term Goal of  
Developing Independent Source of  
Funding for Organization.*

HOUSTON — AIDS Foundation Houston has announced the appointment of Joyce Yost as its new executive director. Yost had served as the Foundation's interim executive director since November of last year.

Yost has more than four years' experience with AFH and brings to the position a varied range of experience and valuable skills. In 1988, she first volunteered with the Speaker's Bureau at AFH, coordinating speaking engagements and working closely with board members and the Foundation's volunteers.

Yost also brings to her new position a strong background in nonprofit experience, having worked in a fund-raising capacity with KUHT, the Alley Theatre Guild and the Houston Symphony.

Yost said she sees the focus of AFH to be two-pronged: prevention of HIV infection through education, and the providing

of services to those affected, with the ability to change focus as the demographics of the disease change. It is her long-term goal to develop a complementary and independent source of funding for AFH.

"This endowment would begin small and be based initially on fund-raising activities like our annual Walk, corporate grants and a direct phone and mail campaign. Funding is critical and all available sources must be tapped," Yost said.

AIDS Foundation Houston, a nonprofit corporation, was founded in 1982. AFH provides social services to those affected by AIDS as well HIV prevention education, and promotes community involvement in HIV issues through volunteerism.

## AIDS SERVICE GROUPS RECEIVE SHARE OF AUSTIN WALK FUNDS

*\$50,000 Will Help 15 Organizations  
Fight Disease in Capital City Area.*

AUSTIN — AIDS Services of Austin [ASA] distributed over \$50,000 to representatives of 15 other area organizations that provide HIV-related services during an informal reception held at the ASA office on Monday. The \$50,273.55 represents 25% of the net proceeds from the fifth annual 5K pledge walk held last October 25, which raised over \$274,000 in gross revenue for AIDS care, education and research in the capital city area.

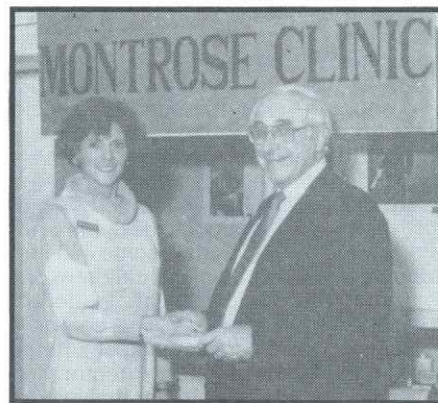
The 15 recipient organizations, each receiving \$3,351.55 from the recent fundraiser, are ALLGO/Informe SIDA; the Austin Center for Attitudinal Healing; The C.A.R.E. Program; the Central East Austin Community Organization [CEACO]; Christopher House; Community Action, Inc.; The HIV Study Group; HIV Wellness Center; Out Youth Austin; the Pediatric AIDS League; the People's Community Clinic; Planned Parenthood of Austin; Project Transitions; the Regional AIDS Interfaith Network [RAIN], and the Waterloo Counseling Center.

ASA hosts the annual From All Walks of Life pledge walk to increase awareness of AIDS and raise much-needed funds for responding to the AIDS epidemic. Approximately 4,500 people participated in the 1992 pledge walk, making it the largest AIDS fund-raiser to date in Central Texas.

## DRUG COMPANY DONATES \$50,000 TO MONTROSE CLINIC

*Gift from Burroughs Wellcome  
Will Support Agency's  
Ongoing Educational Programs.*

HOUSTON — Burroughs Wellcome Co. has donated \$50,000 to the Montrose Clinic, executive director Ralph Lasher announced in a statement released Monday. He said the money would be used to support the Clinic's ongoing educational programs. The check was presented to Lasher by Beverly Constant, Houston-area antiviral liaison for Burroughs Wellcome.

"Burroughs Wellcome has generously supported our HIV educational programs for the past several years and we are pleased that they still have confidence in us," Lasher said.

Fred Gregg, HIV Community Liaison Manager for the pharmaceutical manufacturer, commended the Clinic for its role in the fight against AIDS. "We are pleased to support the education programs of the Montrose Clinic because they play an important role in assisting people who are living with HIV disease as well as providing support to their caregivers."

The Montrose Clinic's Thomas Audette Memorial Clinic provides HIV and STD testing and counseling, aerosolized pentamidine treatments and other health services. The Clinic's Houston Clinical Research Network coordinates trials of



new HIV drugs in the Houston area, and its innovative deaf outreach program works to spread awareness of HIV among the hearing-impaired.

Since 1987, Burroughs Wellcome has provided more than \$5 million to national and community-based organizations that provide HIV-related services and programs.

## DALLAS FOOD PANTRY UNDERGOES FACE LIFT

*Improved Storage Capabilities, More Efficient Layout Will Help Meet Needs of Larger Case Load.*

DALLAS — Faced with an increase of almost 350% in the total number of clients served in just the last three years, the AIDS Resource Center Food Pantry—the place many people living with AIDS come to know as their only source of sustenance and support—recently underwent a major face lift designed to improve its storage capabilities and to maintain the efficient and orderly processing of those it serves.

In 1990, 115 people—primarily single gay men—walked through the doors of the Pantry each week. Today, some 400 individuals—men, women and children; gay, bisexual and straight; black, white and Hispanic—turn to this very vital service to obtain food and personal hygiene items. It is, in the words of Pantry Director Mary Franklin, “one of those things that bridges all communities, all socioeconomic backgrounds and races, and brings them together for a common purpose—to live.”

The primary goal of the Food Pantry is to provide the most basic food and hy-

giene items to those affected by HIV, in an environment that is both compassionate and supportive—one in which clients may shop without fear of discrimination. Clients are given approximately \$95 worth of items, including two pre-prepared, high-calorie meals, and additional food items which bring the total daily calorie count for the client up to approximately 3,000.

Many of the facility's clients are young children whose parents are infected with the virus. It is these young children, and their parents, who have brought the center's case load to such tragic levels, and it is those all-time-high levels that precipitated the need for a more efficient layout.

Experts performed time and motion studies on the Food Pantry to determine areas that could be re-designed to improve traffic flow and maximize storage space. The renovations, according to Franklin, “have allowed us to open up and move through—remember, we're still faster than Tom Thumb, with six lanes open at all times. We can see 100 people a day and not have it feel like it's a big deal.”

One additional reason for the increased space needs has been the tremendous response from the community for the Pantry's Wish List program. During the month of December, for example, over 25,000 items were donated by individuals, businesses and organizations. In fact, statistically, donations have gone up almost in direct proportion to the increase in clients, and now come from many main-line contributors, including Southwestern Bell and several area churches.

Now, the Food Pantry represents a model program for the efficient assembly and distribution of products in a nonprofit setting. Bright, clean and staffed almost entirely by volunteers, the facility provides a shining example of the wonders that can be achieved through a cooperative civic and community effort.

Franklin sees it another way.

“It's a fun place to work. I want to be here. My volunteers want to be here. The clients want to be here because they know that they'll be served with understanding and a smile. There'll be interaction with the volunteers.”

“We're a little lavender, a little yellow and pink and blue. We're a little Easterish. We thought green would tone it down just a bit. Short of moving into an abandoned Safeway, we had to look at the best use of

## GHHA ELECTS NEW OFFICERS

HOUSTON — The Greater Houston HIV Alliance (The New Alliance), defying predictions last year that it would not survive the loss of federal funds to Harris County, begins the year with new officers, a newly expanded board of directors and new offices in the Montrose area.

Maurice (Mo) Jones returns as chair of the board, John Paul Barnich was chosen vice chair, Alan Hodges is treasurer and Jeff Hallauer is secretary.

New board members include Sundra Spears, Family Judge of District Court 246; Barry Mandell, Executive Vice President of Mandell Industries; Lee Virgilio of Planned Parenthood, and psychotherapist Jim Anderson of Home Nutritional Services.

Also on the board are Anne Helton, a public health consultant; Tracy Brown, Executive Director of the Houston Institute for the Protection of Youth; Tom Schnorr, president of I.V. Team Therapy; Alan Hodges, CPA, comptroller of ENRON Power Corporation; and Pat Strong, assistant to City Council member Vince Ryan.

Michael Springer, Program Director with the Alliance and previously a program manager in the HIV Services Division of the Texas Department of Health, has been named Acting Executive Director. He re-

places Nancy Pomeroy, who has returned to school at the University of North Carolina School of Public Health.

Jones said the makeup of the Alliance's new board was especially significant, in that the members both represent a broad cross-section the communities affected by the disease and bring to the Alliance the financial and other skills it needs to carry out its mission.

## AUSTIN RALLIERS URGE MORE AIDS FUNDING

### *Call for Action on Commission's Request for \$280,000 Increase.*

AUSTIN — Responding to what they consider inadequate levels of spending on AIDS by the city, several hundred people rallied at Austin City Council chambers last Thursday to call for funding increases. But the day's Council meeting had already adjourned before the protest began.

Austin City Council has budgeted an increase of only one percent increase in AIDS funding for this year, and refused to consider a recommendation by the Austin/Travis County HIV Commission that an additional \$280,000 be spent on HIV.

The AIDS Alliance for Funding, a coalition of local AIDS organizations, presented City Council with a letter urging action on a recommendation by the Austin/Travis County HIV Commission that \$280,000 be added to the city's AIDS budget.

Alliance spokesperson Diana Gorham said the spread of AIDS in the Austin area made it crucial that government spending on the disease be raised to and maintained at adequate levels.

"Every 24 hours, another Austinite is diagnosed with AIDS. Since we were last here 48 days ago, 48 more Austinites have been diagnosed with AIDS. The public health of this city and its citizens demands this additional \$280,000."

The rally was timed to coincide with a meeting of Austin City Council, but that meeting ended shortly before the protesters arrived. Before adjourning, Council approved additional emergency AIDS funding of approximately \$45,000.

# The Presidential Inauguration A Proud Texan's Perspective

Celebrities, Democratic party faithful and activists like Sen. Ted Kennedy, Barbara Streisand, Michael Jackson, Peter and Mary (without Paul), Mary Steenbergen, the Arkansas Travelers, Charles Armstrong, Kate Clinton, Tom Henderson, Michael Mitchell, Sue Lovell, David Mixner, Roberta Achtenberg, Eric Chiarizio, Tim McFeeley, William Waybourn, Barbara Alexander, Lynn Greer, Dr. Gary Brewton, Jim Richardson, Mary Morgan, k.d. lang, Larry Bagneris, Jack Campbell, Carol Migden, the Governor of Oregon, Darryl Hannah, John Kennedy Jr., Joe Garnett, Bob Hattoy, Bob Gee, Ann Richards, Linda Hudson, Garry Mauro, Glen Maxey and many more were among the hundreds of thousands I saw in Washington at the most historic inaugural event since John Fitzgerald Kennedy. The week was a montage of people, a cacophony of sound. The mood: euphoric, thoughtful, grateful, thankful, gracious, harried and most of all, filled with hope for a changing America.

I was there from Sunday until Friday. The air was cold, but charged with the electricity of change and with the knowledge that at last we had a friend in the White House. As San Francisco City Supervisor Roberta Achtenberg said, "We must learn how to deal as friends. It will be a new experience for all of us."

I began my week with a visit to JR's Washington, where the talk of freedom from oppression rang loud and clear, and it was obvious that the South had truly risen again. The bar was filled with people saying "Y'all" as only folks from Texas and Arkansas can say it. On Monday, Sue Lov-

ell, Charles Armstrong and I stood in line with people from every state to get into the official inaugural souvenir store, waiting, if you can believe this, for over an hour to spend money, to buy buttons for people like Brian Keever, who stayed at home. Without Brian and people like him and the hard work they all did, none of us would have been there.

To illustrate the mood of trust, just as I started into the store, a man stopped me and said, "Ma'am, would you buy me a pair of those saxophone earrings when you get inside? Here's my credit card." I looked down. This stranger had handed me his platinum American Express card. How's that for trust?

We stood in line with some Arkansas Travelers. They're the people who left their homes and jobs, got on buses and traveled all over the country at their own expense for their friend Bill Clinton. I met no one in Washington who didn't feel as if they weren't a personal friend of Bill's.

From there we went to the Fireplace, which we needed by this time, to the Gay and Lesbian, Texas/Arkansas party. Some of the Texans were originally from Arkansas, so it was a double thrill for them. For the rest of us, it was exciting to meet each other. Almost all of us said the same thing, "Can you believe we won?"

On Tuesday, most of the Texans in Washington went to the fund-raiser put on by the Victory Fund to honor our friend David Mixner, and what an tribute it was. Movie stars, Broadway stars, politicians and gays and lesbians from all over the nation joyously honored one of their own.

David Mixner is the leading gay person in the Clinton inner circle. Many of you will remember him as the man who introduced Bill Clinton to a thousand gay and lesbian supporters, where he promised to name an AIDS Czar and end the discrimination in the military.

The ballroom was shoulder to shoulder, and all of us stood with pride in who we are. Of every benefit that we will receive from Bill Clinton, perhaps, in the long run, this will be the most important. To all of our brothers and sister who have had the courage to be out and open before this administration, each of us owes an unpayable debt of gratitude. Perhaps more of us will find the courage to come out and experience the sweet breath of freedom. The more of us who do the easier it will be for us all.

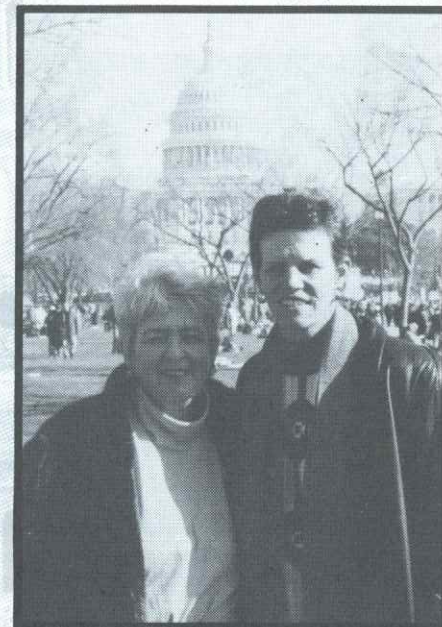
We should be equally proud that so many of the votes cast for Bill Clinton were ours. Without us, he would not have been elected. We gave our time, our money, our hearts and our love, and we should all feel that we have contributed and are contributing to the greatest change in civil rights in thirty years.

On Tuesday night, we joined with at least 3,000 other gays and lesbians in rocking the night away at Club Zei, a three story, laser lighted, high tech club of the future.

On Wednesday, we stood side by side with other Americans and watched Bill Clinton assume the mantle of leadership. The day dawned bright, crisp and beautiful. Charles took pictures, Sue and I talked with other people around us. Two hundred fifty-thousand of Gov. Clinton's closest friends stood watching, waiting for the moment when he became the 42nd president of the United States, and the bells of freedom began to ring for us. In that giant crowd, we saw Blanca O'Leary, a good Democrat from Houston, and her parents, and she shared her binoculars. We met a family from Michigan and a gay man from Provincetown, Massachusetts. We saw native Americans dressed in tribal regalia, posing for pictures with Vietnam veterans, and a Japanese-American man arm-in-arm with a beautiful African-American woman.

We heard the Gay and Lesbian Bands of America play for the inauguration and heard Marilyn Horne sing. Maya Angelou thrilled us with the words of her poem when she used the word "gay." We heard

for the first time the President of the United States say the word "AIDS" in his inaugural address. Then we watched the presidential helicopter take off and head for Andrews Air Force Base, where Air Force One stood waiting to take the Bushes back to Texas, and a resounding chorus of goodbyes from the crowd drowned the roar of the helicopter blades.

We then walked up Pennsylvania Avenue, stopping along the way to munch hot dogs and bask in the moment, and then went to 10th and Pennsylvania, where gays and lesbians were congregating to watch the parade.

That night, we went to the first Gay and Lesbian Inaugural Ball. Prior to the Ball, the Human Rights Campaign Fund hosted a dinner at the Hotel Washington and, from there, we went to the Triangle Ball at the Washington Press Club where comedienne Kate Clinton entertained the crowd.

In my heart I could hear the echo of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s words, "Free at last, free at last, thank God Almighty, we're free at last."

I know I speak for all of us when I say that, like Bill Clinton, I believe in a place called Hope.

## Dallas' Moonstruck Theatre Company Gives Voice to Gay & Lesbian Playwrights

Dallas' Moonstruck Theatre Company presents its production of Harvey Fierstein's *Safe Sex*, a trio of plays about love, laughter and loss in the age of AIDS, beginning next Thursday, February 11.

Like so many other industries hard hit by the economic downturn America has experienced over the last four years, theatre in Texas continues to feel the effects of spending cutbacks by a populace whose primary focus is on the basics of living, rather than on cultural pursuits. Theatre, in general, is a low priority in most families' budgets.

When theatre becomes specific, however; when it narrows its focus to the interests of only a small segment of society, it becomes an even less-affordable commodity and makes survival in a restructuring economy even more difficult. Such is the predicament that Dallas' Moonstruck Theatre Company finds itself in.

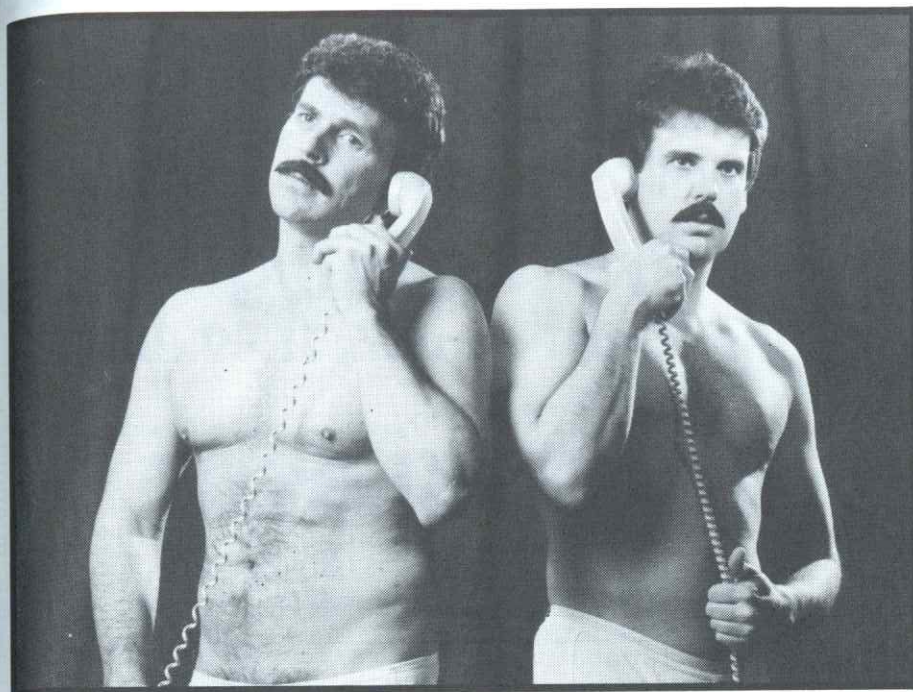
Formed in 1991 to showcase the works of gay and lesbian playwrights, Moonstruck found quick fame with the debut of Robert Chesley's *Jerker*, an erotic neopornographic character play which toured Texas and made the company an overnight sensation. But with a depressed economy and a lack of plays appealing to more

mainstream audiences, Moonstruck found itself playing to empty houses and lukewarm reviews.

Which is a shame, because the group is committed, like few companies today are, to providing gay works to a gay audience. They are also committed to presenting quality works at reasonable prices—something that is unheard of as those of us who have attended performances on and off-Broadway can attest to.

According to Jack Presley, Moonstruck Theatre Company's Artistic Director, "We are just a group of people who want to 'put on a show.' With the demise of Theatre Gemini (another Dallas-based company devoted to gay and lesbian works), it is now up to Moonstruck to produce plays that showcase gay/lesbian playwrights, themes and authors. [But] the financial failure of our last three productions has just about put us out of business."

Which has led to speculation about what, if anything, can be done to save the fledgling arts group. Presley has come up

with what he believes is a viable solution, the VIP Season Pass. Each pass entitles its holder to four admissions to any of the three shows in the remaining season with reserved seating and a complimentary champagne reception with the cast after each performance. Presley said he feels the passes, which are priced at only \$38, "are very affordable and will enable the theatre to continue to produce works which are focused on gay and lesbian entertainment."

The remaining season is just that—entertainment, and of the highest caliber. Premiering next Thursday, February 11, at the company's performance space at 2121 San Jacinto near downtown Dallas is Harvey Fierstein's newest classic, *Safe Sex*, a trio of plays about love, laughter and loss in the age of AIDS. The play, by the author of *Torch Song Trilogy* and *La Cage Aux Folles*, runs through March 6. Then, *Jerker*, the play that put Moonstruck on the map, returns February 19. It also runs through March 6. The final production of the 1993 season will be David Stevens' Obie Award-winning *The Sum of Us*, which focuses on the touching relationship be-

tween a father and his gay son. All three productions are considered by many to be consummate works of gay theatre, and are highly recommended for their entertainment and thought-provoking messages.

While it seems almost as clichéd as a line from *Torch Song*, it is more important than ever that we, as a community, support those businesses and organizations that support us. Hollywood continues to present stereotypical depictions of gay men and lesbians, and the current political climate is creating the most intense debate on our lifestyle yet seen in this country. It is imperative that we have venues to present positive images of our community, both as self-affirming entertainment and as enlightening outreach to other segments of society.

By supporting Moonstruck Theatre Company, you send a message that gay theatre is not dead and that our voices will not be silenced.

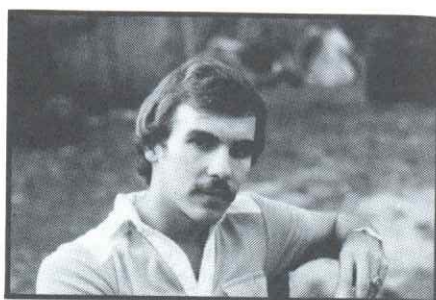


Larry G. Niblett (above)

September 28, 1952 - January 6, 1993

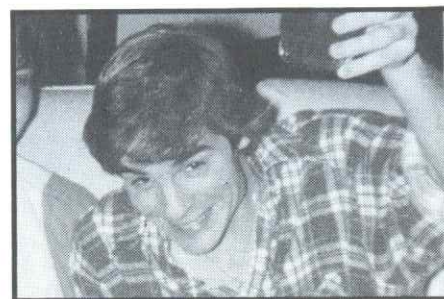
