## JUDGE DISMISSES HOUSTON ACTIVIST'S DISCRIMINATION SUIT AGAINST HOSPITAL

*Brian Bradley Says He Will Appeal  
Decision Favoring Employer.*

HOUSTON — A visiting U.S. District Judge last Tuesday dismissed activist Brian Bradley's lawsuit against his employer, M.D. Anderson Cancer Center. The suit had charged the hospital with violating Bradley's free speech rights and discriminating against him as a handicapped person.

Bradley condemned the judge's decision as arbitrary and said he will file an appeal with the Fifth Circuit Court.

Bradley's suit, filed in January 1992, charged the hospital with violating his civil rights as guaranteed under the First and Fourteenth Amendments and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

In July 1991, hospital administrators transferred Bradley from his job in the operating room after he spoke out as an HIV-positive person in an article published in the *Houston Chronicle*. He was in effect demoted by being forced to choose from among several positions involving no patient contact.

Bradley expressed frustration at the summary dismissal of his case, saying he hadn't been permitted to make his case.

"I have yet to say one single word in court to a judge," Bradley told TWT NEWS. "I have followed the system as it is, and essentially we're back to the beginning on this."

He also accused M.D. Anderson of dragging out the case.

"Sadly, we find ourselves in another situation in which the issue of HIV is raised in the courtroom, and the opposing side resorts to the tactic of drawing it out, hop-

ing the claimant will become sick, perhaps even die."

In its motion asking visiting Senior U.S. District Judge Milton Pollack to dismiss the case, M.D. Anderson asserted that Bradley could not carry out his job as a scrub technician without endangering patients. But Bradley said the hospital was overreacting.

"They [M.D. Anderson] are willing to sacrifice people like me and my civil liberties for their sense of comfort, a false sense of comfort."

In his appeal, which must be made within 30 days of Pollack's decision, Bradley will ask the Fifth Circuit Court to rule that Pollack erred in dismissing his case and to hear Bradley's suit in a trial setting.

Bradley is still employed by M.D. Anderson, but is on leave of absence for medical reasons he says are not related to AIDS.

## DALLAS CITY COUNCIL CANDIDATE WINS VICTORY FUND NOD

*Hutchison Confident Endorsement  
Will Strengthen Run for District 3.*

DALLAS — Mike Hutchison, one of three openly gay candidates seeking seats on the Dallas City Council this spring, has received the support of the Gay and Lesbian Victory Fund, a national organization committed to helping qualified openly gay and lesbian candidates in their campaigns for public office. Hutchison is a candidate for the District 3 seat on the council, and, if elected, would become the city's first openly-gay elected representative.

Hutchison, a native of Dallas who grew up in the Oak Cliff area that comprises District 3, is building a campaign based on addressing some of the concerns that specifically affect the residents of that neighborhood. Hutchison says he believes issues such as code enforcement, crime



control, economic development and transportation will dominate the campaign.

Hutchison is encouraging the expansion of potential Enterprise Zones as a means of providing economic incentive to area businesses, and supports the creation of mixed-use projects, such as the Oak Cliff Gateway Project, and the development of the highly controversial project to build a South Dallas Satellite Airport to ease the congestion problem at Dallas/Fort Worth and Love Field airports.

Most importantly, perhaps, the candidate says he is determined to replace what he calls the politics of division with the politics of diversity, and says he is particularly sensitive to the needs of the Hispanic and African-American communities in the district.

The endorsement of Hutchison by the Gay and Lesbian Victory Fund is critically important because of the tremendous financial support offered by the organization. Hutchison's race will be recommended to more than 2,000 members of the Victory Fund—members who agree to contribute at least \$100 or more to at least two recommended candidates over a 12-month period. According to William Waybourn, executive director of the Victory Fund, this could prove to be quite a boon to Hutchison's campaign.

"The Victory Fund enjoys a large membership in Dallas, and I am confident that many members will want to fulfill their commitment through Mike Hutchison's campaign," Waybourn has stated.

Hutchison, in commenting on the Fund's decision to recommend him for support, declared, "I am very pleased and honored to have received the Gay and Lesbian Victory Fund endorsement. This will be of great assistance in raising valuable campaign dollars. Also, the Victory Fund is dedicated to backing only those candidates they believe are viable, and this vote of confidence further increases my strength as a candidate."

Victory Fund candidates must withstand a comprehensive screening process to determine viability. Upon recommendation, members support the candidates with sufficient early funding to move them from fringe to front-runner status. The Fund does not endorse any candidate if there are more than two openly gay candidates in any given race.

## PRESS CONFERENCE AT STATE CAPITOL URGES LEGAL GAY MARRIAGE

*Participants Call for Passage of House Bill 615 Recognizing Same-Sex Relationships.*

AUSTIN — "I cannot issue a marriage license to two persons of the same gender—Texas law prohibits me from doing so. And I think the law is wrong," said Travis County Clerk Dana De Beauvoir as she spoke to a handful of people gathered last Friday afternoon in front of the State Capitol.

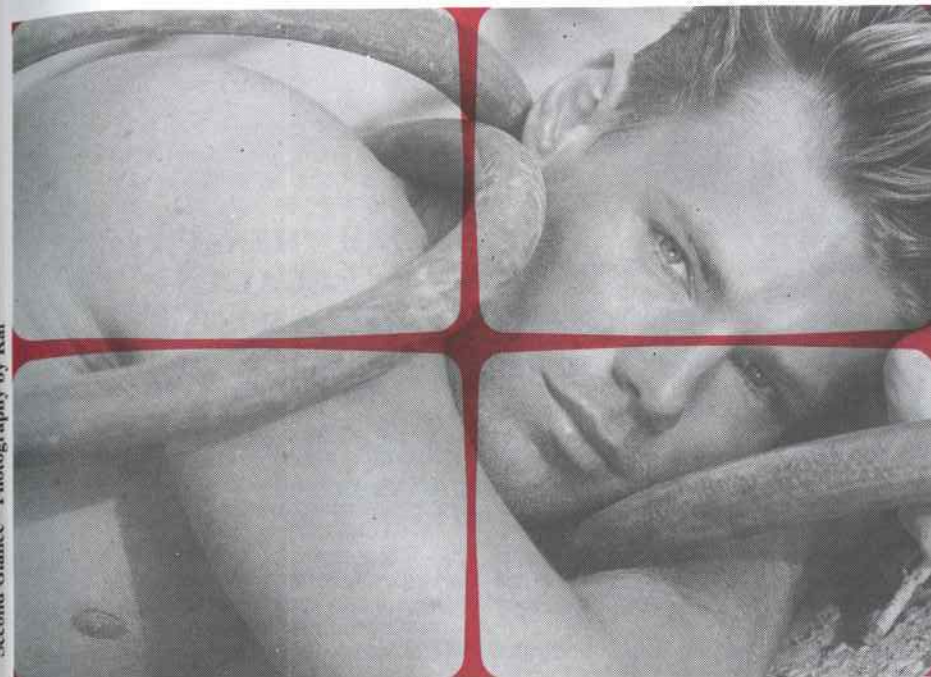
The event, organized by the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, was held the last business day before Valentine's Day to point out the injustice of state laws prohibiting marriage between members of the same sex, and to show support for House Bill 615, which would legalize same-sex marriages. In keeping with the Valentine's theme, participants carried pink roses.

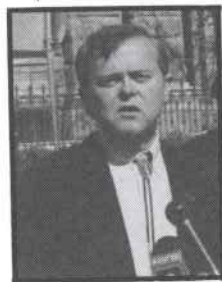

LGRL Executive Director Laurie Eiserloh, who authored HB 615, opened the briefing by pointing out that nonrecognition of same-sex relationships has wide-ranging legal, societal and personal implications.



State Rep. Glen Maxey is co-sponsor of House Bill 615, which would legalize same-sex marriage.

State Rep. Glen Maxey of Austin, who is co-sponsoring the bill with Rep. Debra Danburg of Houston, told the crowd he would like to be able to marry his companion and have the same legal rights as heterosexual couples.

"One thing that stands in the way of gay and lesbian couples is their right to be legal, loving and nurturing couples," Maxey said. "Public opinion is changing, just as it is in the military. Justice is not something you put on the back burner." Maxey noted the difficulty he had experienced recently in trying to have him and his lover placed on the same insurance policy.

Karen Umminger and Sara Strandtman, a lesbian couple whose "wedding" notice and photo was published in the *Austin American Statesman* last year, spoke of their affection for and commitment to each other.

"We know the basis of our relationship is love, respect and deep mutual trust," Umminger said. "We know the core of a marriage, including ours, is held in the heart and lived in daily challenges and joys. We know that we are life partners—that we are spouses to each other, and that the wedding of our lives is recognized spiritually."

"We know that, in spite of our commitment, maturity and integrity, in spite of being tax-paying adult citizens of this state, we cannot purchase a \$25 marriage license which would allow us to legally name each of us to be the other's next of kin."

"We know that this is unjust. We ask for equal application of the law."

"Homosexuals are often condemned and vilified for not maintaining lasting,

stable relationships, for having what critics consider 'too much sex,'" Toby Johnson said. "If it is in society's interest to reduce the amount of sex homosexuals have, there could be no better approach than to recognize and validate lesbian and gay relationships." Johnson and his partner, Kip Dollar, have been together for nine years.

Maxey conceded that House Bill 615 will have a hard time getting passed, but said he is determined to keep trying. Asked if he thought such a bill stood a chance in the "land of Bubbas," he responded, "Our time will come." At present, same-sex marriage is illegal in all 50 states.

## SOUTHEAST TEXAS LEGAL CLINIC TO ASSIST PWAS

*Nonprofit Corporation Will Provide  
Free or Low-Cost Services.*

HOUSTON — A new organization has formed to serve the special legal needs of people with AIDS and other terminal illnesses in the Houston area as well as their loved ones.

Organizers of the Southeast Texas Legal Clinic, who hope to have their service up and running shortly, say the nonprofit group will provide direct legal services to clients for free or at reduced cost, depending on financial status. The Clinic also hopes to work other agencies to avoid duplication of effort.

Clinic development chairman George Burch noted that members of the organization's board of directors were chosen to represent a wide variety of backgrounds and experiences. Board members are Larry Cain, Erich Glasbrenner, Leticia Guzman, Mark Canfield, Jim Graham and Horace Thomas.

The Clinic is in the process of applying for grants, and an office will be opened as soon as finances permit. Burch said the organization had been granted 501(c)(3) status in January.

The group's executive director is attorney Robert Vivito, who first conceived the idea for the Clinic a year ago. A paralegal may be hired to assist Vivito as the Clinic builds a solid funding base.

Discussing the Clinic's mission and his own motivation for getting involved in the effort, Burch told TWT NEWS, "I've seen so

many people with AIDS with nowhere to turn, and instances where they've had problems with insurance, attorneys, doctors and employers, and they didn't realize they had recourse, and in any case didn't have the money to pay for it.

"We hope to help them retain their rights and their dignity."

The Southeast Texas Legal Clinic is currently seeking volunteers, both in and out of the legal profession, to help with a variety of tasks. Those interested in volunteering may call (713) 846-1590.

## DALLAS COUNCIL CANDIDATE OPENS CAMPAIGN OFFICE

*Ed Oakley Hopes to Bring Business  
And Homeowners Together to  
Confront District's Problems.*

DALLAS — Beginning what he hopes will be a successful campaign season for himself and for the other openly gay candidates in the city's elections, District 14 City Council candidate Ed Oakley officially opened his campaign headquarters recently and began a petition drive to ensure himself a spot on this year's ballot.

Oakley, a general contractor and the President of Oak Lawn Concerned Citizens Coalition [OLCCC], joins Sharon Boyd and Craig McDaniels in seeking the Council seat to be vacated this year by eight-year incumbent Lori Palmer, who is ineligible to run for reelection because of term limitations.

The candidate intends to utilize the experience he has garnered in working with City Council over the years to build coalitions of home and business owners who, together, will seek solutions to the problems affecting both groups. "I want to bring businesses and homeowners to-

gether to resolve the issues," he said. "I think that people operate out of fear—fear of what goes on inside some of the area's businesses, fear of the unknown. I want people to see that there's nothing to be afraid of."

District 14 encompasses an area including Oak Lawn, parts of East Dallas, Love Field, Lower Greenville and parts of Turtle Creek. Its constituency is multi-ethnic and both gay and straight in make-up, and the area includes a heavy mix of residential and business properties. Many of the problems in the district stem from this mix and the conflict that arises out of their opposing goals and purposes—homeowners want a peaceful quality of life; businesses, particularly area nightclubs, demand a less tranquil setting.

During Oakley's tenure as OLCCC president, he has worked hard to involve businesspersons and homeowners in the process of improving the quality of the Oak Lawn neighborhood. OLCCC, in cooperation with these individuals, has been involved in a beautification project in Oak Lawn, and has worked diligently with Sam Houston Elementary School to improve conditions for the students.

Oakley says he wants to bring this cooperative style to City Council. "As City Councilman, I want to have two meetings a month in various locations within the district—at the Metropolitan Community Church and at JR's (a local nightclub). This way, people can face their fears, that fear of what goes on behind those doors, and say to themselves, 'What I thought was going on here isn't. These people aren't anything like what I thought they'd be.' Once they're past their fear, the businesses and homeowners can work together to deal with problems affecting them both."

**Getting Ready for Houston  
 Town Meeting II**

Dear TWT:

1978 was a remarkable year for Houston's lesbian and gay community. That year marked the beginning of the Montrose Counseling Center, Gay Hispanic Caucus (now Gay and Lesbian Hispanic Unidos) and the Montrose Clinic. That same year, the Gay Switchboard, Montrose Sports Association and Gay Political Caucus (now GLPC) all experienced significant growth.

What brought about all this significant burst of activity was Town Meeting I. Four thousand of us met at the Astro Arena on a Sunday afternoon and passed a series of resolutions to accomplish the above and other things.

The magic was not in the resolutions. Many of those things were going to happen anyway. But TM-I provided a springboard from which they were successfully launched. TM-I provided the opportunity for interested parties to get together and develop a plan to get the support of the rest of the community. That planning, and the support it generated, made each project a sure success.

The whole thing cost about \$15,000; on reflection, it was well worth it.

A subsequent fight over the pictures and videotapes would prove to be the best organizing tool for lesbian groups in the city's history (they got the still pictures; I still have the videotapes). But they came up with the best name ever for an organization: "Lesborados."

Old battles now past, it is time to do it again. Fifteen years is a long time. 1993 presents a different world for our community than did 1978. More of us are further out of our closets; we are enjoying more acceptance; and some of the battles we anticipated with fear have been won.

There is still much to do and we will do it better with unity and planning. One of the

things that we can work on is an organized economy. If we can better pool our economic resources, capital for community business development can become available for future generations of our community, giving them the independence we can only dream of. We already have bankers, investors, business people and professionals. With a little organization, we could wield some real economic power.

We can plan a brighter future for our senior citizens and help our young people prepare for their futures. We can bring our diversity to focus and dissolve the lines between us. Fifteen years ago, the copy in TWT said, "It will work, if we all participate." We did and it worked. It will work again, with your support.

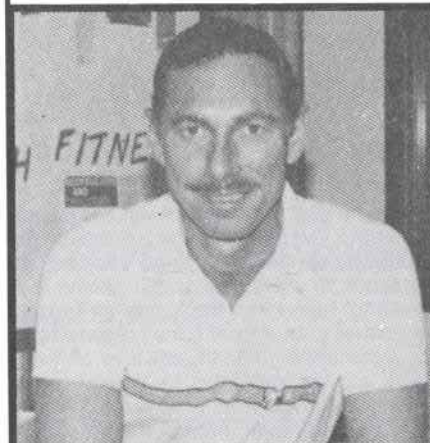

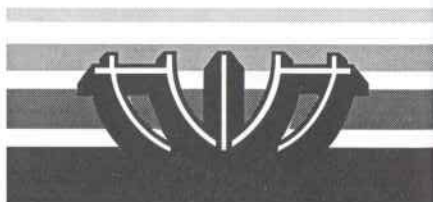
Dear Dr. Nichols:

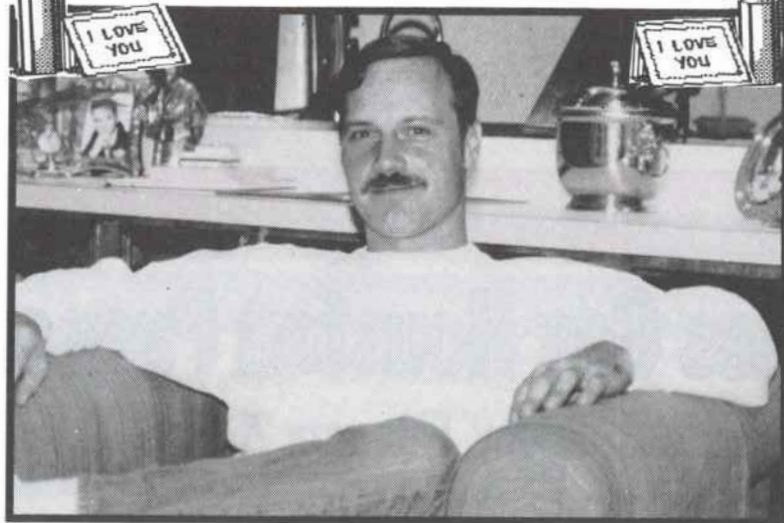

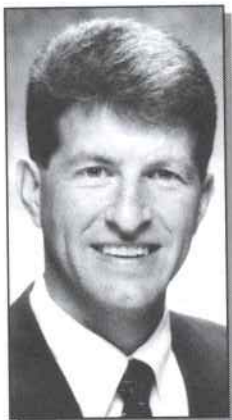

Marky Mark Defends Homophobic Remarks by  
Rap Artist Shabba Ranks

Media Coverage of Gay Military Ban Issue  
Focuses on Opinions of Antigay Minority

Pop star Shabba Ranks says lesbians and gay men deserve to be "crucified." Rap artist and underwear model Marky Mark says Shabba Ranks is okay by him.

During a recent appearance on Britain's teen program *The Word*, reggae singer Shabba Ranks was asked to comment on the lyrics of "Boom Bye Bye," a reggae song that advocates shooting gay men. He responded by saying that he felt that these lyrics were "absolutely right," that "anyone who forfeits the laws of God almighty deserves to be crucified."

Shabba Ranks' sentiments were horrible enough, but equally troubling was the conspicuous silence of fellow guest star Marky Mark. In fact, Marky Mark's only response was to perform a rap song with Shabba Ranks, during which he praised Shabba Ranks for his candor and announced to the audience that "all you all got a problem with that can step the f--- back."

Shabba Ranks recently brought his sounds to New York's Madison Square Garden, under the sponsorship of Budweiser Beer. Anheuser-Busch, which makes Budweiser, has refused to distance itself from Shabba Ranks' statements. Let

The result is that the media—with a few notable exceptions—has created the impression that the views of a small number of homophobes represent the majority of Americans.

One of the notable exceptions was a recent edition of *The Today Show*. In an unusual move, the program devoted an entire half hour to three segments on lesbians and gay men in the military. The show was singularly fair, informative and enlightened. The segments included a profile of gay veterans and a debate among six heterosexual service personnel on both sides of the issue. In the final segment, Katie Couric interviewed gay soldier Crae Pidgeon, the most recent casualty in the military's crusade against lesbians and gay men.

# DREAMS DO COME TRUE

## World's Largest MCC Congregation Dedicates New Facility

**T**he structure that is nestled back on the creek at 5910 Cedar Springs in Dallas is more than just a building. It houses one of the most extraordinary congregations in Christendom. The fact that the building exists at all is a testament to the power of God to enable people to triumph over adversity.

The Cathedral of Hope is dedicated to the memory of those who have died of AIDS, and to the hundreds of women and men who have given their love, time and compassion to care for those who are living with the disease. By the time the building was completed in December, over 500 members of our church family had already died of AIDS.

For seven years prior to the construction of the new facility, the Metropolitan Community Church of Dallas was overcrowded, often to the point of turning people away. The building was constructed out of an absolute resolve that none of God's children should ever be excluded for any reason. It was especially painful when people struggling with HIV were not able to attend worship services because there was no room.

For a number of years, the Board of Directors and Building Committee sought to purchase existing space for the church. Hundreds of pieces of property were examined and over a dozen contracts to purchase were written. For one reason or another, none of the purchases ever materialized. Congregations would often refuse to rent their buildings to a church whose primary outreach was to lesbian

and gay people. One congregation went so far as to tell the Realtor they would burn their building down before selling it to MCC.

An attempt was made to remain on the property the church owned at 2701 Reagan. In order to build a larger sanctuary, however, more parking was required. But the city refused to grant MCC permission to pave the vacant land the church already owned.

In the end, there was no choice other than to move. The problem then became

one of trying to sell a church building in the heart of Oak Lawn. MCC put its property on the market at a time when absolutely no commercial property in the area had been either bought or sold for over a year. Few people believed there was any chance of selling the Reagan Street property.

One day I invited William Waybourn, at that time president of the Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance, to lunch. That day I planted the seed of an idea—that the

Reagan Street facility could serve as a great community center. Financing would have been impossible to acquire at that time, so the church agreed to hold the mortgage.

Soon the details of the sale of the Reagan building were worked out with the Alliance, and on July 8, 1990, the congregation voted to sell that property, buy the land on Nash Street and build a new facility. Although the decision was a scary one, it was made with great unity and enthusiasm. That might not have been the case at all had anyone known the details of what lay ahead.

What seemed a fairly simple project instead turned into two years of nightmares. The trauma of construction was compounded by inaccurate city records, homophobic financial institutions and the ever faithful Murphy's Law.

In November of 1990, the church moved into a pink-trimmed office building at 5353 Maple. The intention was that the new facility would be completed in nine months to a year. But the office building became our home for the next 25 months.

Those two years were challenging ones for the church. Many people found it difficult to worship God in an office building with low ceilings, folding chairs and hot-pink trim. Even so, MCC continued to grow. Attendance increased, giving soared and more ministry was carried out in that pink building than had ever been accomplished before.

When the church finally moved from the office building, we had almost 1,000 mem-

bers and over 700 people involved in ministry, and were serving more than 360 persons living with AIDS.

It was while MCC Dallas was in that office building that the church changed its name to Cathedral of Hope MCC. We also sold \$2,000,000 in bonds to finance the construction of the new facility. Since no bank would loan the church the money, bonds were the only option. It was hoped that 25% of the bonds would be bought by members of the lesbian and gay community and that 25% would be marketed by the bond company to other clients. In the end, 90% of the bonds were bought by members of the church, something almost no one had thought possible.

Each step of the way, the congregation, Board, Building Committee and Staff overcame obstacles that could easily have stopped our plans. Over the four years spent on the project, the Committee met 232 times and four of the original members died, three of them due to AIDS. The Board of Directors devoted thousands of hours to property negotiations, capital funds campaigns, bond sales, budget crisis management and goal setting. The staff built a great church while the church built a great building.

The structure that stands at 5910 Cedar Springs is valued at over \$3,000,000 and is the largest building project ever undertaken by this denomination or any organization in the lesbian/gay community. It stands as a testimony to the power of a God-given vision and the indomitable spirit of the people of God.

- A Pastoral Counseling Center, which will provide free or low-cost counseling to people who want their faith to be a part of their recovery process. The morning after the dedication, Phil Mathews will join our staff as the Director of Pastoral Counseling.

- A nationwide outreach to people in rural areas and a response to the homophobic poison being spread by the religious right. Dr. Mel White has been named as the new Dean of the Cathedral. In the next few months, he will begin organizing Circles of Hope in small towns across the U.S. Dr. White is the ghostwriter for nearly every major Christian leader, and he will organize a media response to the abusive attacks by people like Pat Robertson and Jerry Falwell.

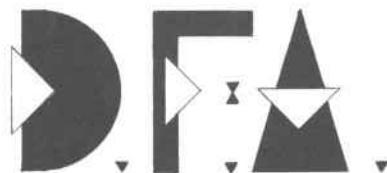
- Plans for a shelter to house lesbian and gay teenagers who have been disowned or abused by their parents.

- A wellness center, retreat center and retirement center.

In calling itself a "cathedral," the Metropolitan Community Church wanted to convey the message that the work it intends to do will reach beyond Dallas. All too often, the images people have of gay men and lesbians come only from stereotypes or costumes worn at gay pride parades. Those things are certainly a part of who we are, but we are also corporate executives, parents, soldiers, teachers and people of faith.

Our hope is that the visibility created by the completion of the new building will help to create a more balanced image of our community. We are already a diverse and beautiful people, but a major portion of that picture has remained hidden.

For too long, religion in the hands of the right wing has served as a weapon wielded against our community. It is understandable that many lesbian and gay people have chosen to live their lives without that kind of faith. Our goal at the Cathedral of

# OBITUARIES



Uvaldo (Val) Najar Garcia (above)  
August 23, 1944 - January 31, 1993

Val died at the age of 48 in the company of his family. As a loving son, nephew, cousin and friend, he protected others from his hurt and never stopped giving. He particularly wanted his family to use his case to teach his nieces, nephews and others about HIV and AIDS.

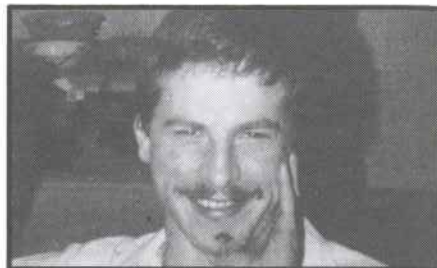
Val grew up in South Texas and graduated from the University of Houston with a B.F.A. in 1968. During his lifetime, he mastered a diverse range of artistic forms from, among others, sculpture to watercolor, weaving, porcelain dolls and Garden Party costumes. 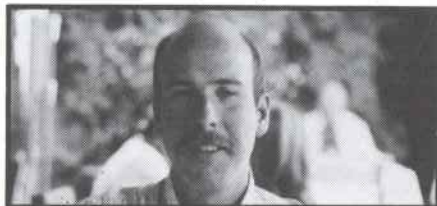

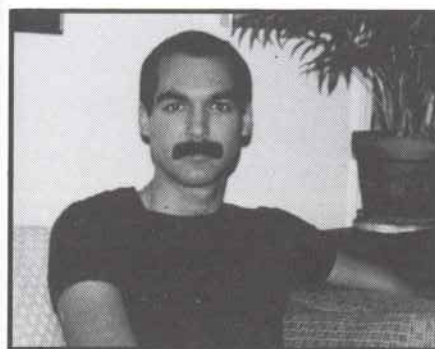

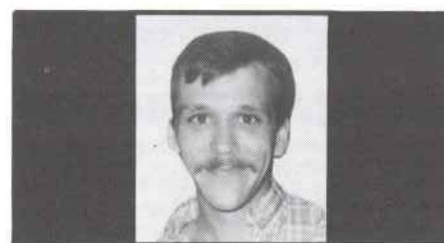
Rudy Gonzales (above)

Jimmy was born in Raleigh, North Carolina to

nephew, Mr. Christopher Dillard, all of Raleigh,  
North Carolina; his niece, Miss Pamela Hunter  
of Decatur, Georgia, and a host of dear friends  
across the country.

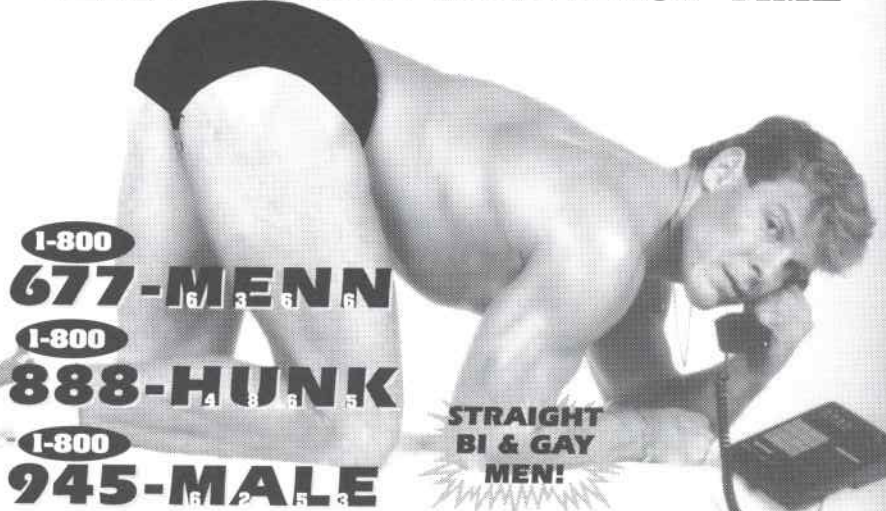
