STATE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE RESTORES AIDS FUNDING

*Move Takes Medication, Other
State Programs Out of Jeopardy.*

AUSTIN — AIDS activists and gay and lesbian leaders are breathing a bit easier after a recent move by the Senate Finance Committee to reinstate millions of dollars in funding for state HIV/AIDS programs.

Spurning a recommendation by the Legislative Budget Board, the Committee restored cuts amounting to 94%. The restoration of funding will allow the state to continue receiving federal funds that require maintenance of certain minimum levels of state spending on the disease.

If the Legislative Budget Board's proposal had been approved, the state would have lost over \$18.8 million in federal funding in addition to state funds.

"If LBB's proposal had been adopted, the state's AIDS program would have been history," said Laurie Eiserloh, Executive Director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas. "This is not the last step in the budget process; cuts could still occur, but this is a very important victory."

Under the Budget Board's proposal programs such as the HIV medication program, the state's prevention and education program and the surveillance program, which enables the state to garner federal funds, would have been eliminated. Other state programs such as counseling and testing would have been cut in half.

LGRL lobbies the state Legislature on issues of concern to gay and lesbian people as well as issues like state spending on AIDS. The House Finance Committee was scheduled to take public testimony on the issue of HIV funding on Wednesday.

Eiserloh noted that State Senators Rodney Ellis and Gonzalo Barrientos had taken the lead in proposing to spend an additional \$7.5 million on AIDS in 1994 and 1995.

"We'll have to wait and see about these additional funds," she said. "But I feel optimistic that more funds will become available."

The proposed addition of \$7.5 million for 1994 and 1995 was taken from a study by the Texas Performance Review, *Against the Grain Report*. AIDS was one of three health issues for which funding was in-

creased. The reason cited for this boost was that, in the long term, funds spent on AIDS prevention and early intervention will actually save the state money later.

Texas has the fourth highest number of AIDS cases in the U.S. Among new cases of the disease, women are disproportionately affected.

MONTROSE SHIFTED TO NEW DISTRICT UNDER LATEST COUNCIL PLAN

*Move Would Undermine Influence
Of Houston Gay Community.*

HOUSTON — The latest development in the long-running effort to redraw City Council District lines threatens to undercut gay and lesbian political influence by moving the city's heavily-gay Montrose area into a new Council district.

Two weeks ago, the City of Houston Department of Planning unveiled the proposed City Council District map to be used in the November 1993 elections. The Montrose area, which has been a part of District C for 14 years, is slated to be moved into District D. That district, a majority of whose residents are African-Americans, encompasses south-central Houston and is represented by incumbent Al Calloway. District C is represented by Vince Ryan, who has stated on more than one occasion that he does not plan to run for reelection next November.

The Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus has begun lobbying Council members to move Montrose back into District C. GLPC re-districting committee chair Rob Bridges observed, "Our community has been working for years and years to gain political influence in District C. All that work is now about to be washed away by the new district lines."

Citing other opportunities that would be lost, Bridges added, "This change comes at the worst possible time. With Council member Vince Ryan leaving his district open in November, it would be the best

chance we've ever had to elect a member to our community to City Council in District C.

"If Montrose is moved to a new district, then we can just forget that idea for another ten years."

GLPC is urging the gay and lesbian community to pressure City Council members to put Montrose back in District C. Council will be hearing public testimony on redistricting on Wednesday, March 3 at 8:30 a.m. at City Hall and on Tuesday, March 9 at 6 p.m. at Jefferson Davis High School.

COURT UPHOLDS INJUNCTION AGAINST DALLAS POLICE

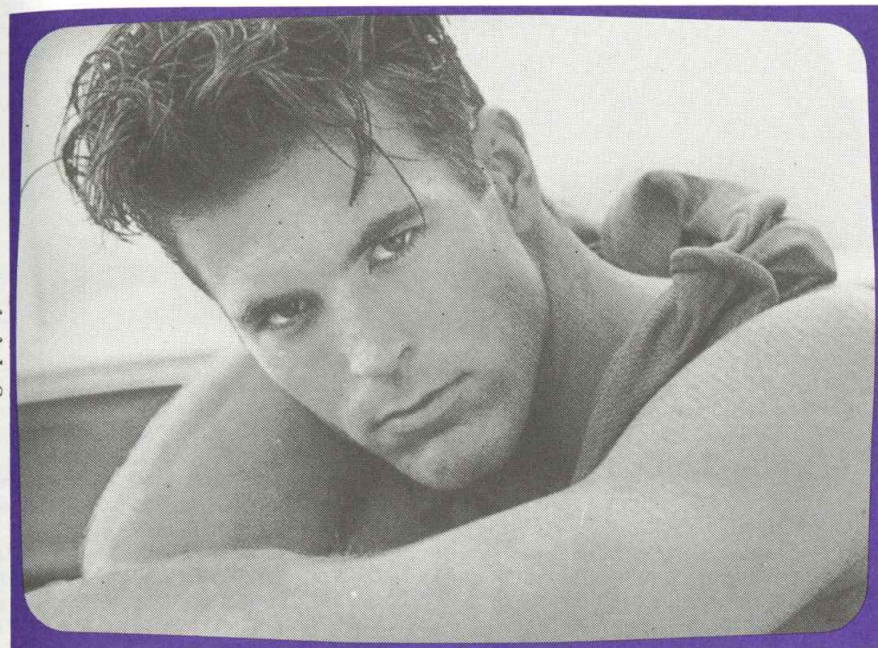
*Applicants Admitting to Sodomy
Placed on Hold by DPD Pending
State Supreme Court's Ruling.*

DALLAS — Just days after being awarded the Texas Human Rights Foundation's Robert Schwab Award for her efforts to gain equal rights for gay men and lesbians in Texas, Mica England, the Dallas lesbian who sued the City of Dallas and the Dallas Police Department for being denied employment because of her sexual orientation, learned that the Third District Court of Appeals had upheld an injunction by the 200th Judicial District Court in Austin prohibiting DPD from using 21.06—the state's antisodomy law—as a reason to deny employment.

The ruling is viewed by many, including Texas Human Rights Foundation director Suzy Wagers, as "piggybacking" the *State of Texas v. Morales et al.* case currently being reviewed by the Texas Supreme Court. It is felt that if *Morales* is lost, England's case could be used to challenge 21.06 again. If *Morales* is won, England (and all gay men and lesbians in Texas) wins.

Dallas-area attorney Bob Wightman sees it differently. "The ruling's not going to hurt, but, quite frankly, I don't see how it will help. There have already been two rulings on Ms. England's case, both favorable, from the lower courts. What you have

to remember is that the Supreme Court is going to do whatever it wants to do. But most courts in Texas are leaning to the left—more liberal decisions. I think what's important about this ruling is that it is indicative of the future for gays and lesbians in Texas. It indicates an awareness of tolerance by the courts and where we're going in terms of gay rights in this state."



Dallasite Mica England is pleased that Third District Court of Appeals has upheld injunction against Dallas Police Dept. over use of 21.06 to keep gay men and lesbians from becoming officers.

Legalities aside, England is quite pleased with the decision. "Naturally, I'm excited that we won and that we continue to win. Right now, the City of Dallas has 15 days to request a retrial, and 30 days to appeal, which would take the case to the Supreme Court level. I think it probably will be appealed; that's just the way they [the city] are. But I feel very confident that we'll win at that level, too."

"I have legal damage. I have, in fact, been discriminated against because of 21.06. It's hard to believe, but I'm the only one who has that in writing."

"I think it's ironic that the President of the United States, and even the U.S. military, are willing to work with us, but the City of Dallas isn't. But that's just that Texas white heterosexual male—'bubba'—ego."

Currently, applicants to the Dallas Police Department are no longer being asked their sexual orientation. Instead, they are asked if they have ever committed a Class C misdemeanor violation, with sodomy being offered as an example of that type of violation. Anyone admitting to the offense is placed on hold until the Supreme Court rules on the law's constitutionality.

England said she is prepared to go the distance with her case. Meanwhile, a ruling is expected from the Texas Supreme Court in the *Morales* case in two to three months.

OUTREACH CENTER HANDS OUT AWARDS

*Star-Telegram, Thomas F. Beech
Honored at Group's Valentine's
Volunteer Appreciation Party.*

FORT WORTH/ARLINGTON — The AIDS Outreach Center [AOC], the primary AIDS care and referral service in the Fort Worth and Arlington area, recently held their Valentine's Volunteer Appreciation Party. Attending were AOC staff members, and many of the over 700 men, women and young people who donated almost 30,000 hours of volunteer time to people living with AIDS over the last year.

Held at Fort Worth's Worthington Hotel, the event provided an opportunity for AOC to present some special leadership and volunteer awards. Thomas F. Beech and the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram* were among the 23 award recipients.

"When the history of AIDS in Tarrant County is written, it will be one of an enormous community-based volunteer response," stated Thomas Bruner, AOC executive director. "In every program, and in an array of capacities, volunteers work tirelessly and hand-in-hand with staff throughout our agency. With that unique partnership, our ability to serve increasing numbers of people with limited resources is dramatically enhanced."

That comment was substantiated by Viktor Andersson, AOC's volunteer coordinator, who reported that "in 1992, over 700 men, women and teens donated 27,000 hours to programs and services of the AIDS Outreach Center. The estimated dollar value of that time was \$376,000—the equivalent of 13 full-time staff positions."

Thomas Beech, the recipient of the Citizen Leadership Award, was recognized for his extraordinary contributions in increasing awareness, sensitivity and resources for the local epidemic. Sister Mary Fulbright, AOC Board President, stated, "Tom has been on the forefront of AIDS and HIV issues in our community for years. His early recognition and involvement was a critical turning point in our local struggle. 'He is a model of involvement to others in the mainstream business, civic and philanthropic communities.'" Beech is the executive vice-president of the Anne Burnett and Charles Tandy Foundation. He follows Fort Worth Mayor Kay Granger as

The *Fort Worth Star-Telegram* received a special recognition award for its role in the battle against AIDS. According to Bruner, "from columnists to reporters, from the editorial board to promotions department, our local paper has provided a tremendous example of responsible media involvement. We are grateful for the paper's generosity, and recognition of its role in heightening awareness of the health crisis."

In 1992, AOC staff and volunteers provided services and education to 1,118 persons with AIDS or HIV, 1,128 family members and 8,489 members of the general public.

HOUSTON ATTORNEY HONORED FOR SERVICES TO PWAS

*David Hunter Named
Volunteer of the Year by
Houston Bar Foundation,
Volunteer Lawyers Program.*

HOUSTON — Attorney David Hunter was honored recently by the Houston Bar Foundation and the Houston Volunteer Lawyers Program as their Volunteer of the Year for his substantial contribution of pro bono (free) work for persons living with AIDS.

Hunter, whose practice is concentrated on personal injury and criminal law, drafts wills, durable powers of attorney for health care, living wills and durable general powers of attorney—all in an effort to help people who truly need his legal services. He does this, he says, because he feels it is extremely important for terminally ill people to have their financial affairs in order, and their health care decisions pre-planned.

"When I moved to Houston two years ago," Hunter said, "I went to an HVLP seminar on AIDS [and the law]. Then I started doing wills for persons with AIDS. They were so hard-hit by this disease. As a lawyer, this was all I could do to help."

"This is the priority in my business. Everything else gets dropped," adds Hunter. "Especially if these people have kids, it's more important than anything else I've got going on."

Hunter's efforts have resulted in some

touching experiences. One memorable one, he says, happened when a man confined to his hospital bed called him over just as Hunter was leaving. "He had everything he owned with him. He wanted to give me the last thing he had—a fountain pen. That pen is now my official will-signing pen."

Even though his caseload is already full, Hunter plans on significantly increasing his output in pro bono cases. "It's really worth the effort. The satisfaction is better than winning a case, because you're doing something for people who really need it."

GAY REPUBLICANS REVISE STRUCTURE

*State Log Cabin Reorganization
Intended to Foster Growth.*

TEXAS — The Log Cabin Republicans, activists supporting nondiscrimination on the basis of sexual orientation within the framework of the Republican Party, have restructured their Texas organization to expand medium and small city membership.

State President Paul von Wupperfeld said inquiries from Republicans interested in joining local Log Cabin groups had greatly increased recently. "We think it's because Texans have heard of our movement through expanded media attention," he said. "Gay, lesbian and straight Republicans are becoming fed up with the antigay rhetoric used by much of the Republican leadership."

"We think we've found a structure that fosters the growth of small-city groups while preserving the relative autonomy of groups in the great population centers," von Wupperfeld added.

The new structure includes a state steering committee with the authority to appoint leaders in, and regulate, small local groups as well as set statewide policy and oversee candidate endorsements. "Home rule" branches in larger cities elect their own officers.

In addition, a congressional, state senatorial, county and precinct caucus system has been created to match the boundaries used by the Republican Party to elect its officers and delegates.

"Log Cabin is becoming involved at every level of the party process, and our in-

'LAMBDA WEEKLY' PLEDGE DRIVE HUGE SUCCESS

*Dallas Gay Radio Program
Reaches 150% of Goal.*

DALLAS — "Lambda Weekly," Dallas' only weekly gay and lesbian radio program, has exceeded the goals set for its 1993 Winter Pledge Drive. This is the first time in recent memory, according to the show's producer and host Steve Walters, that "Lambda Weekly" can make that auspicious claim.

In addition to reaching and surpassing the mark set to enable "Lambda Weekly" to fund its planned programming schedule, the weekly broadcast also logged impressive totals for the size of the pledges made by listeners, and for the record numbers of large pledges made. For the first time in the program's ten-year history, \$120 and \$180 pledges were offered, with satin staff jacket and guest-deejay opportunities being used as incentives for those larger pledges. Many of these large pledges were taken by the program's listeners.

According to Walters, each of the programs on KNON Radio—the station that carries "Lambda Weekly"—was given goals to achieve during the annual pledge drive. "Lambda" was given two Sundays to reach its goal, and by the end of the second Sunday, listeners had pushed the pro-

gram's total pledge to approximately 150% of the goal.

"Station management is pleased with 'Lambda Weekly' anyway," declared Steve Walters, "but they were really impressed with our performance on February 7 [the second Sunday]. We certainly secured our spot on the schedule with this pledge drive."

MONTROSE CLINIC TO OFFER FREE TUBERCULOSIS TESTS

*Part of Effort to Counter
Growing Threat of Disease.*

HOUSTON — In an effort to help combat the growing epidemic of tuberculosis across the nation and in Houston, the Montrose Clinic is offering free TB skin tests every Tuesday in February, March and April.

Testing will be done on a walk-in basis on Tuesdays from 1-4 p.m. and 6-9 p.m., with no appointment needed. Patients are asked to return two days later, on Thursdays, for test results.

Clinic Executive Director Dr. Ralph Lasher noted that the reappearance of tuberculosis as a serious health threat over the last decade called for a timely and effective response, especially in light of the spread of AIDS.

"Early in this century, TB was a major cause of death in the U.S., but this was brought under control and the situation remained stable until 1984, when it re-emerged as a significant threat to health," he said.

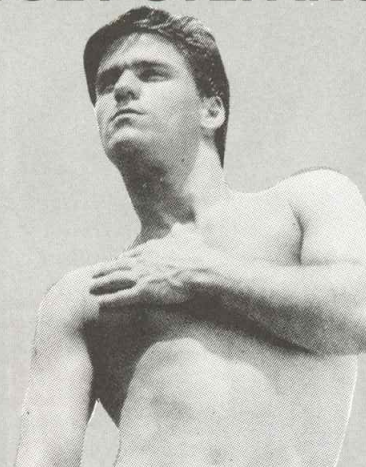
"The risk has increased and projections are gloomy unless prompt action is taken. Persons with HIV are especially vulnerable to TB, and if infected require special treatment attention. TB is again a serious public health threat in Houston and needs to be taken seriously. We want to do our best to alert people and offer testing."

Clinic staffers will refer persons found to be positive for tuberculosis to a city clinic or private physician for further education and treatment. Staff members will also offer counseling concerning HIV or other testing that might be indicated.

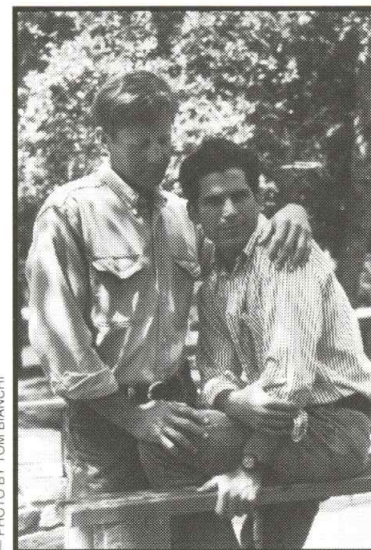

The second annual 1993 Magic Mile event is scheduled for Saturday, April 3 and we would like to invite every Texan to join us in our battle against AIDS in the Coastal Bend. Come spend a weekend in the beautiful "Sparkling City by the Sea" while helping us raise money for the Coastal Bend AIDS Foundation, The Passage care facility and The Loving Spoonful hot lunch program.

We expect more than 1,200 racers this year from throughout the state to line up at 7 p.m. in front of the Cole Park

Amphitheater near downtown Corpus Christi. We have planned 10K and 5K runs plus a two-mile walk. Feel the Magic. Help support the 1993 Magic Mile. After all, "The real magic is life."

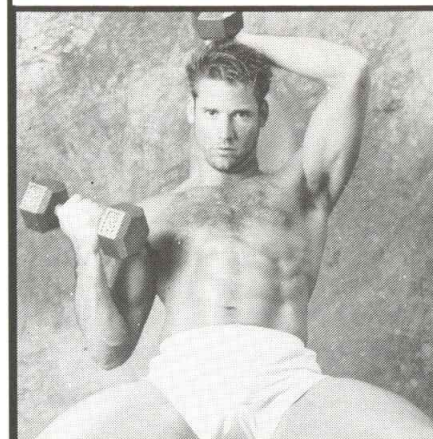
As for Gen. Powell threatening to resign if the ban is lifted, let him; he isn't God. I am sure Clinton can find a better replacement, one who shares his views.

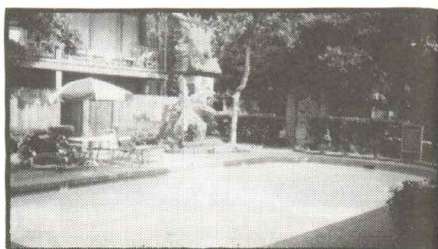

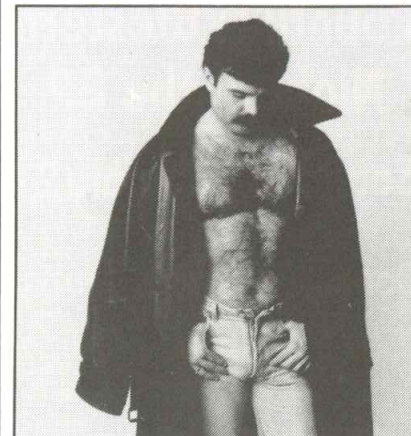

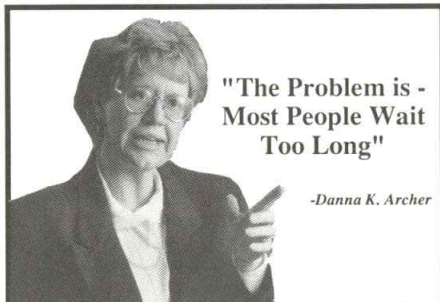

Women's Action Coalition Drums, Graphics, Chants and Actions

by Jan Lee

A new group of activist women are taking Texas by storm with a vigorous and creative approach to demanding attention to women's issues. Insistence on "an end to homophobia" is included in their mission statement and is a vital part of their action agenda.

A thundering echo of drums resounds in downtown Houston and again on the steps of the Texas State Supreme Court Building in Austin. The drumming announces a new and exciting approach to feminist activism. They're WAC, Women's Action Coalition, and they're calling attention to women's issues with drums, multimedia presentations, chants, whistles—whatever it takes.

It seems to be working. WAC in Houston, now only five months old, is already gaining frequent notice in the media. Readers may have seen the group's Drum Corps on the local television news as they drummed, chanted and carried banners against domestic violence during the Super Bowl game. The *Houston Chronicle* has already run a feature article on the organization (Sunday, January 27, 1993).

WAC in Austin was covered in newspapers around the country when they rallied in front of the State Supreme Court Building to support the repeal of 21.06, the state sodomy law.

"WAC is here! (Boom! Boom!) Some are queer! (Boom! Boom!)"

A strong contingent in the Women's Action Coalition are members of the lesbian community. Both in Austin and in Houston, their Lesbian/Bisexual Issues Caucus

(affectionately called "LIC") has a reputation for being one of the most active committees within the organization. So what is WAC?

WAC is Women

WAC is an alliance open to *all* women and is committed to direct action on issues affecting the rights of women.

Many women within the lesbian community have found WAC especially appealing because WAC is *all* women and because WAC insists on an end to homophobia and violence against women.

In WAC/Houston, the Lesbian Issues Caucus "works to end the violence, invisibility and inequality that lesbians have long endured. [It] focuses on homophobic violence and harassment; bias crime; domestic partnership legislation; moralizing taxation; equal protection under the law; discriminatory health care and insurance policies; and biased media representations" [WAC New Member's Orientation Packet, "Committees in WAC/Houston," September 9, 1992].

In a world where women are searching for a productive channel through which to vent their anger about the wrongs they see and experience, WAC gives women like Pauline in Houston that avenue of expression. "I can't let it go unaddressed anymore," says Pauline. "I can no longer be witness to the violence, the hatefulness that I see in terms of destroying people." Pauline is a member of both the Family Law Committee and the Lesbian Issues Caucus. She recalls the destructive hatefulness toward lesbianism and the pain

she experienced as a young woman growing up in the 1960s. "You reach a point where you want to strike back," she says. WAC offers Pauline and other women like her a place where they can strike back for positive change.

WAC is also younger women like Benae, an active member of both the WAC Drum Corps and the Lesbian Issues Caucus in Houston. "I am actually a novice activist," says Benae. "Aside from Q-Patrol... this is the first group I've ever gotten into, and what I've put into it has given me back personally—I can't even measure it..."

"...I got into it [because] I have strong feelings," Benae continues. "I know there are problems out there, and I never knew quite how to fix them... I was like, 'Oh no, I'm not one of those type of people that gets out and screams and stomps and holds signs. I'm not, I'm not, I'm not.' But knowing that that's the only way that things are going to get done and fixed in the world, I kind of made that leap... Seeing WAC from New York doing what they were doing and thinking, 'Well, maybe it's not going to be so bad. Maybe people aren't going to say that I'm some 'femi-Nazi'. ... It's an image thing that I really had to overcome and now, I'm a totally different person."

"I now know how to vent these things in me that I know need to be fixed, these concerns I have for society... What I've put into it [WAC] has three-fold, four-fold come back to me... it actually has become a personal growth for me and I didn't mean for it to be that. So I actually have become an activist because of WAC. I'm in a lot more things now. I used to sit on the couch with the remote. I'm a reformed couch potato." Benae finishes her statement with a content, self-confident air.

WAC is women.

WAC is Action

In WAC, women exercise their "full creative potential to launch a visible and remarkable resistance" against pressures that limit women's lives.

As mentioned earlier, WAC-Austin and a few members from WAC-Houston participated in an action protesting the state's sodomy law. The Drum Corps created so much attention, even inside the court building, that people were coming out to comment on the noise. "Keep the law out of our bedrooms" and other, more graphic signs and visual aids were displayed to illustrate the absurdity of a public law that tries to regulate something so private.

On World AIDS Day (December 1), WACers in Houston shrouded some of the statuary downtown in honor of brothers and sisters who have died of AIDS.

A spontaneous WAC action with very little planning is called a ZAP action. Marianne, who has been with WAC-Houston since it began, recalls when, during one of the regular WAC meetings, someone announced that the Houston Independent School District was going to meet that same night to discuss reports of children being molested in HISD schools. "To me, that was WAC at its best. When we were going down the freeway with our lights flashing, I was so inspired. The action is the empowering."

Other women in WAC prefer actions to which more time can be devoted in advance. For Lynn, an artist on the Lawndale Artists' Board, the appeal that makes WAC unique is the graphics and the drumming. "I was really attracted to the way they used graphics and art on the street." The group of 25 WAC women from New York who visited Houston during the Republican National Convention last August included several prominent women artists. "This was like a commercial for women," says Lynn. "A lot of women artists have learned to use Madison Avenue techniques to get their own message out. One of these techniques was a slide-show presentation displayed on the side of a parking garage building. Many women who later joined WAC-Houston had been inspired by these WACers from New York."

The other unique aspect of WAC demonstrations is the powerful drumming and creative chants. A group of about 15 women from Houston joined the Drum Corps from New York during their visit to Texas. "I have never experienced a group of women being able to take public space like the Drum Corps can," says Lynn. "We drowned out Operation Rescue [an anti-abortion group]. I mean, they accused us of inciting a riot! I was thrilled!"

The drumming may sound very intimidating to passers-by during an action, but the drummers themselves perceive the experience differently. Lynn, who was a drummer in high school, says, "In WAC's case, it's not militancy. It really has a kind of erotic power about it that I think makes it quite exciting."

"Something gets in your soul when you drum," reflects Marianne. "It's something very empowering and cathartic at the same time."

"Women's Action Coalition, patriarchal demolition," WACers chant as they click their drumsticks to the rhythm of the words. "We're chicks!" [Boom! Boom!] "With sticks!" [Boom! Boom!] "Get used to it!"

WAC is action.

WAC is Coalition

"Because Austin is so small, we have a better chance to coalition-build and to do things with other groups," says Lisa of WAC-Austin. "It also helps us publicize WAC because people see the Drum Corps and think, 'Wow, this is really great!'"

During the Republican Convention in Houston, WAC-New York and future WAC-Houston members joined a large number of local groups in the huge Unity March for Peace through River Oaks.

In support of ACT-UP women who were injured and/or arrested during their march to the Astrodome, site of the GOP convention, WAC-Houston drummed up support to reopen the investigation into allegations of police brutality.

WAC is Coalition.

"WAC is watching. We will take action."

This WAC motto emphasizes that WAC is an activist group.

For Susan Palmer, a veteran activist, WAC was easy to join simply because it was a women's activist group. Since Queer Nation meets on a night when she is busy at her teaching job, she decided to give WAC a shot and see "how really involved they were."

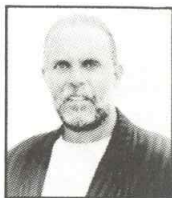
Diane, a WAC-Houston member who is also involved in other activities within the gay and lesbian community, encourages all women to get involved. "There is a space for everybody, in WAC especially."

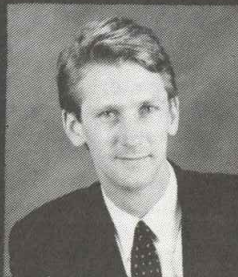

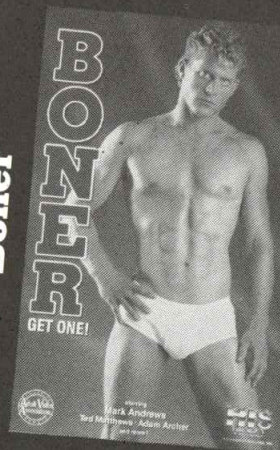

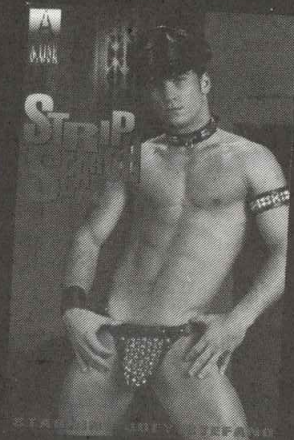

Is There A Place for Us in the Military?

Deep in their hearts, gay and lesbian soldiers know what high-ranking brass cannot comprehend: We are an indispensable part of the U.S. military. Throughout history, we've done our part and usually a bit more in the defense of our nation. We've done this even as the brass were conducting witchhunts against us. Get rid of gay and lesbian patriots and our nation's defense will most certainly suffer.

"Hell, it's the gays and lesbians assigned to Headquarters and Headquarters Company that run Fort Ord."

—Lieut. Donaldson, World War II.

"That's all right. We wouldn't have a medical service without gays."

—A commanding officer in Operation Desert Storm, when told most of his staff were gay and lesbian.

"The stereotypical female homosexual is hardworking, career-oriented, willing to put in long hours on the job and among the command's top professionals."

—Vice Admiral Joseph Donnell, commander of the U.S. Atlantic fleet. Paradoxically, he wrote this memorandum while urging his commanders to force lesbians out of service.

Such is the logic of military brass! If they only knew....

In late February, 1778, a bulky, bulbous-nosed, balding man, resplendent in a blue uniform and gleaming with military medals, rode into Washington's camp at Valley Forge with two aides, a servant, a greyhound and a 17-year-old French translator named Duponceau. This youth must have had other talents useful to the general, because it soon became apparent he had no linguistic skills.

The impressive man was introduced to Washington as Baron Frederick William Augustus Henry Ferdinand Steuben and recommended by Benjamin Franklin, who described him as a lieutenant-general in

the service of King Frederick of Prussia. In reality, Steuben, as he wished to be called, had been a captain years previously and was now unemployed and broke. Aware that Congress would turn up its nose at a mere captain, Franklin had elevated his rank. At first Steuben declined to come to America. But when he learned that church authorities were planning to try him for homosexuality, he wisely reconsidered.

The baron could speak only a few words of English, and even this caused him to turn red with embarrassment. But, never mind, he was a well-educated, expert drill officer, and Washington was in dire need of someone to drill and train his pitifully undisciplined rag-tailed army. Steuben had impressed the general with his offer to "...serve without rank for no other reason than to help the cause of liberty."

To Steuben's astonishment, he found the Continental Army half-naked, ill-disciplined and hardly worthy to stand up to the well-equipped, well-trained British. In addition, there was no drill manual, no book of army regulations. Furthermore, the ragged troops knew nothing about bayonet practice; most used their bayonets as nothing more than cooking spits.

To make matters worse, the men were not used to instant obedience to crisp orders. But Steuben was a patient man and wrote his own manual which his aide, Benjamin Walker, and Duponceau translated into formal French, then into formal English, and then into the plain English the raw soldiers would understand.

It was Steuben's language barrier, however, that endeared him to the troops. In the painfully slow process of training, he would curse them in German, sometimes bellowing at them for up to five minutes, red in the face, his huge hands gesturing, almost overcome with frustration over his limited English. A ripple of good-natured laughter would go through the ranks. The men liked this blustering, butterball

foreigner who was willing to admit his own mistakes. And Steuben, not lacking a sense of humor, would laugh with them. Then, turning to his translators, he would say, "My dear Walker, my dear Duponceau, come swear in English for me."

Every day for many hours, Steuben was out on the drill field, painfully putting the men through their paces, his voice booming over the sound of shuffling feet. The men learned to march in columns, then into tight formations, and were soon proficient in bayonet combat, too. Within two months, despite hunger, cold weather and lack of warm clothing, a new spirit slowly arose in the soldiers. In their hearts, they knew that their jovial Prussian teacher had taken a motley crew and transformed it

into a highly disciplined fighting force. They were soon to be tested.

On June 28, 1778, at the Battle of Monmouth, one of Washington's regiments faltered and started to fall back. Steuben's men couldn't comprehend his hoarsely shouted German, but they knew his gestures. They wheeled around with the ease and speed they had learned on the drill field. Moving in formation, firing on command and using their bayonets with deadly skill, they won for Washington his first major victory against the British. Again on July 16, 1779, the men captured the British fort at Stony Point on the Hudson River without use of muskets. Steuben's men had learned bayonet combat very well.

In 1781, Steuben was placed in command of all the Virginia troops. When independence was won, Steuben became President Washington's most trusted military adviser.

Steuben retired to a country house in Manhattan on what is now East 55th St. He opened his doors to friends and freeloaders who drank his liquor, ate his food and borrowed his money. Had it not been for Alexander Hamilton and George Washington, this good-hearted man might have languished penniless and forgotten. Eventually, after much prodding by Washington, Congress granted him \$2,500 a year for life.

Steuben never married, but adopted one of his former aides, William North. His other aide, Benjamin Walker, was like a son to him. Both were beneficiaries of his will when he died at the age of 64 in 1794. On a boulder near his grave in Steuben Memorial Park in Oneida County, New York, is an inscription that reads, "His Services Were Indispensable to the Achievement of American Independence." In 1802, Steuben's plans for a military academy became embodied in the U.S. Military Academy at West Point.

So isn't it ironic that today the military brass are determined to hound gay men and lesbians out of the service in the name of "good order and discipline," when good order and discipline in the military were the creation of a gay man?

On April 25, when you and I become part of the 1,000,000-strong 1993 March on Washington for Lesbian, Gay and Bi Equal Rights and Liberation, let's all make it a point to visit the bronze statue of Steuben in Lafayette Park. For without Steuben and the combined efforts of all Americans, we might still be a colony of England.

RP: I'm from Atlanta, birthplace of civil rights and mecca for drag queens.

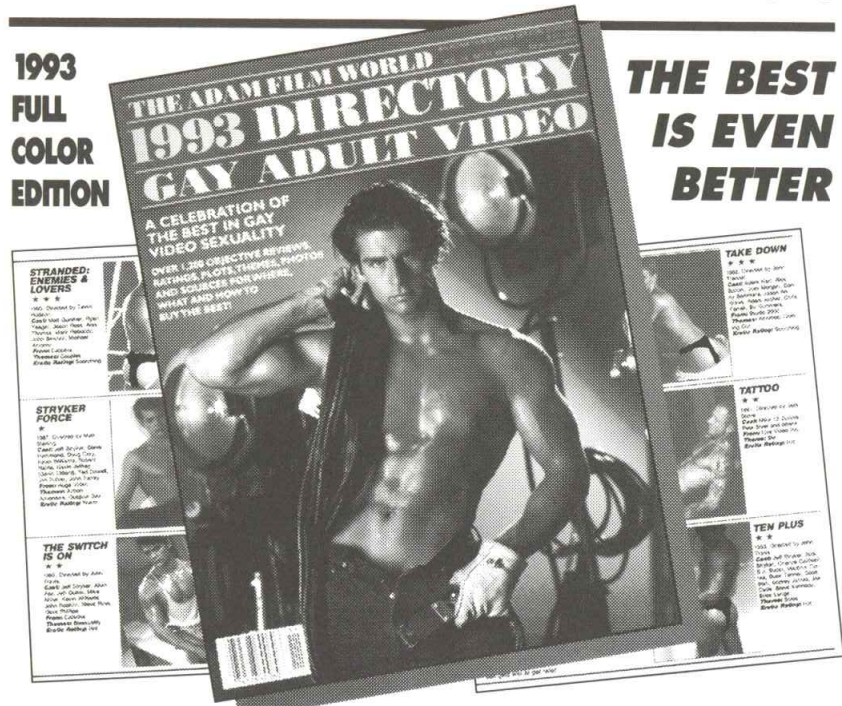
LC: How did you get your start?

Neighborhood." At that time, I was in a band.

LC: How do you feel being a new role model for people coming up?

RP: It's a great honor and a lot of responsibility. Young people are getting to see someone live out their dreams without compromising them, because a lot of young people feel there is no place for them in this society.

I feel this is the greatest thing I can give to people. It's about living your life; you're here for such a short time. It's about learning to love yourself and giving that to other people. Not everyone will be accepted as a 7' drag queen, but each of us has something to offer to the party. All are welcome to the party; just bring something of yourself.

That's the thing I'm most proud of—it's great to break new ground. When young people see me, a lot of them say, "If RuPaul can do it, I know I can." They see themselves in me. When they see me, what they like or don't like about me is what they like or don't like about themselves.

LC: Where did the name "RuPaul" come from?

RP: From my mom. RuPaul is actually a combination of southern Louisiana and a name my mom saw in *Ebony* magazine.

LC: How did the video for "Supermodel" come about?

RP: It was a dream come true. They gave me my own trailer, and it was all shot on location in New York City. It was the biggest thrill of my life. It was shot in two days. I wanted to have a lot of elements in the video from some earlier films I had done. I've done some successful underground films full of camp. I was influenced by *Grease*, *Mahogany* and *The Wizard of Oz*. I just wanted to put in a lot of camp and show just how much fun drag is.

My favorite part of the video is walking down the streets of New York City with the four little girls.

I enjoy the fact that the video is shown on MTV and kids enjoy it with their parents. I hope my video will help kids to realize they can do anything they want, whether it be drag or anything else.

LC: Who does your costumes?

RP: A team in New York, two lovers. They're in the video and they play themselves. They're geniuses with hair, makeup and costumes.

LC: What's coming up for RuPaul?

RP: I signed a record contract with Tommy Boy Records out of New York a

year ago. In the spring, we're releasing an album, *Supermodel of the World*. Right now, I'm touring, promoting my single "Supermodel." It's #1 this week on the *Billboard* Dance Chart and #16 on the Pop Chart. The album is a reflection of how I feel about love, people and myself; a fun, feel-good type of record.

LC: Just for the record, how tall are you?

RP: With hair, heels and attitude, I'm through the roof! My height depends on which hair and heels I'm wearing, but with all the above-mentioned, around 7'4" sounds right.

LC: How does your family accept your life and career?

RP: They love it. I went to my family reunion last summer and performed my nightclub act. They just loved it, they were screaming, because they're a bunch of cut-ups, too. That's where I get it.

I wanted to attend the reunion to show the kids in my family that just because you're gay, freaky or straight, whatever, it's your family and it belongs to you.

A lot of times, we exile ourselves from our families. We need to show them what our lifestyles are like. Otherwise, they never know. No one knows what it's like being gay. I felt really proud to go back to my family and expose myself to them and let them see me.

Everyone on this planet wants to feel loved and respected, feel like they belong somewhere, and everyone deserves that.

I love my family. I wish everyone had the opportunity to share their lives with their families, but they don't. I feel very lucky to be able to share my life with my family.

LC: Who helped to inspire you as you were growing up?

RP: Diana Ross, the Jackson Five, Michael Jackson. I'm a queen, I love them all.

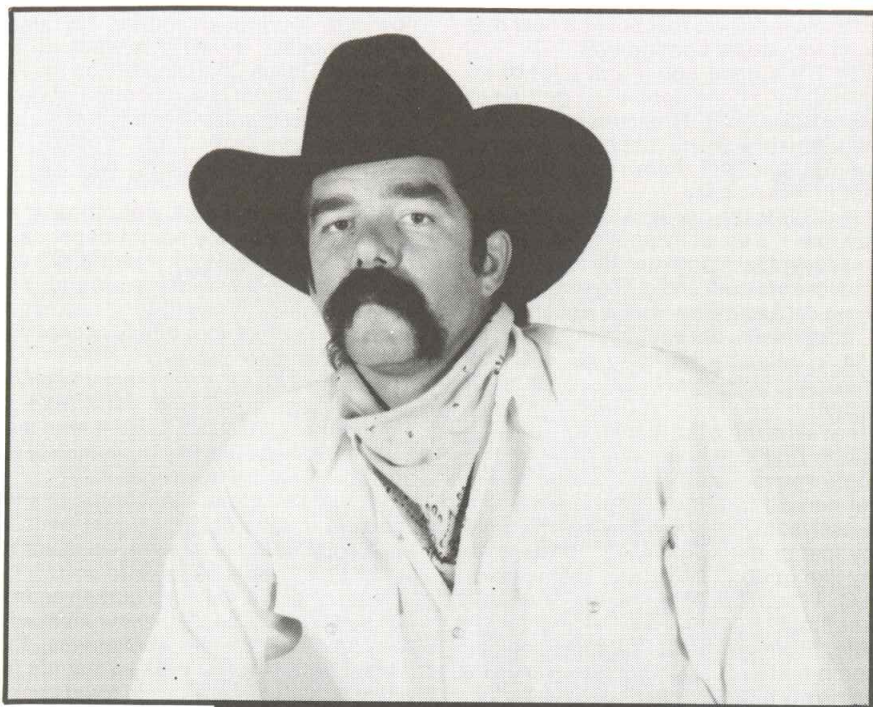
LC: Who inspired your mode of dress?

RP: Hookers; they're the ones who had all the fun stuff on. I've always been inspired by hookers. When I'm asked what I call my "look," I say it's an "uptown call girl" look. That's the look I like. It makes me feel hot!

You're born naked and whatever you put on is drag—three-piece suits, construction, cowboy—you just have to wear whichever costume works best for you.

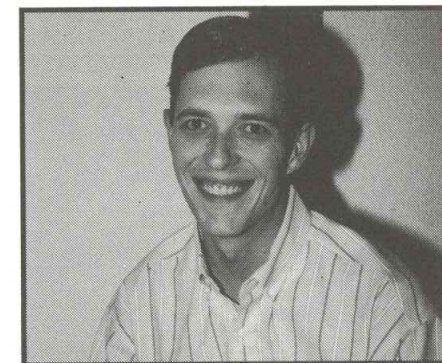
