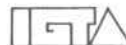

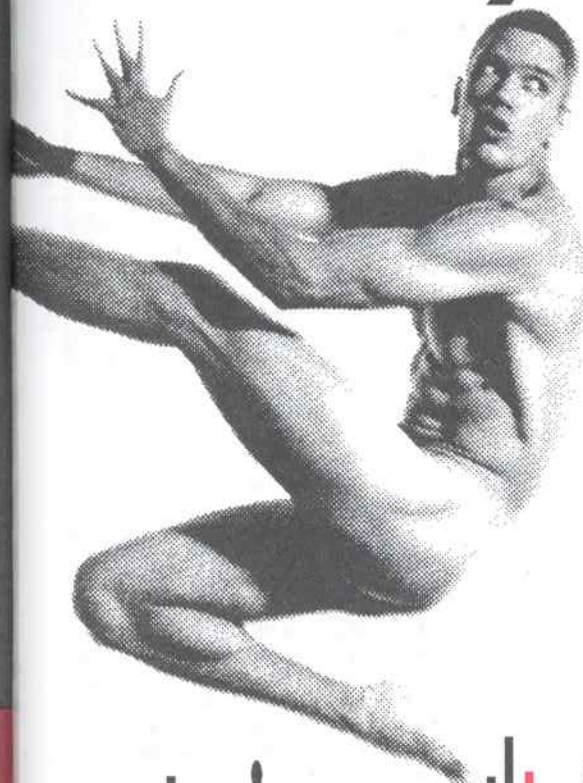

ERIC ROSENTHAL OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS CAMPAIGN FUND



In the second installment of his interview with THIS WEEK IN TEXAS, Eric Rosenthal of the Human Rights Campaign Fund discusses the chances for ending the ban on gays in the military, the positive changes that have already taken place since Bill Clinton took office and the prospects for further advances in gay and lesbian civil rights.

TWT: How do you think the compromise proposal [to segregate gay and lesbian personnel in the military] arose?

Eric Rosenthal: Well, I think politicians, and I don't know that this originated with President Clinton, but politicians, and he is surrounded by politicians in the White House staff, always look for compromise, and this seemed like a possible compromise; not something that anyone was necessarily pushing, but something that was under consideration by some people around the President.

I think, however, that when the report comes to the President, and he gets to the point of having to decide how he's going to implement the Executive Order, he will reject that option. I really think he's a very decent and fair-minded person who understands how harmful discrimination is to this nation. I think we are still enormously fortunate to have him in the White House, and enormously fortunate that we helped put him in the White House... I still have a lot of confidence in where the President is on our issues. There've been some very positive things that have happened, and they really need to be underlined, because they would never have happened under a Bush administration.... The whole way that AIDS research is done at the National Institutes for Health is going to be restructured, and it's going to become systematic instead of haphazard, which is the way it's been done in the past. There's going to be planning, there's going to be centralized budget authority, so that the next most important thing gets funded for research, not whatever some scientist happens to want studied.... That would not have happened if President Clinton hadn't supported the idea when he was a candidate

and supported it as President. [Health and Human Services] Secretary [Donna] Shalala testified in favor of this proposal, and it's going to really revamp the way AIDS research is done. That would never have happened under the Bush administration.

The other thing that's happening... is that there will be significant increases in funding for the Ryan White care program, for AIDS research and for research on women's health issues. Again, that would never have happened under a Bush administration.... This is all new. The military is on the table, thanks to President Clinton, and so are things like the Lesbian/Gay Civil Rights bill. Reproductive freedom is an area in which he's shown a lot of decisive leadership in eliminating some of the restrictions imposed under the Bush administration....

A recent headline in a Houston newspaper suggested that the support Clinton has had for his budget measures in Congress will not be there for his proposal to lift the ban on gay service people, that what support there is for it will eventually evaporate. Do you agree?

I don't think that's true at all. First of all, there are probably between six and ten Republicans in the Senate who will vote to end the ban, and none of them voted with President Clinton on the budget as an issue; people like Sen. [Arlen] Specter [Pa.] and Sen. [Alfonse] D'Amato [N.Y.], Sens. [Bob] Packwood [Ore.] and [Mark] Hatfield [Ore.], [William] Cohen [Maine] and [James] Jeffords [Vt.], are, I think, pretty solid. And then there are [John] Danforth and [Nancy] Kassebaum and maybe one or two others [who] are decent shots. So we'll have somewhere between six or seven and ten solid Republican votes... There are 43

You'll be forever glad you did.

Republicans in the Senate, and probably 33 we don't have any chance with, so we can write off a third of the Senate there. But our biggest problem outside of that is southern Democrats. We already have Sen. [Charles] Robb of Virginia, which is extremely important because he was in the Marine Corps and comes from a relatively conservative state. I think there are a couple of others we have decent shots at.

And then there's Sen. Krueger; if he's there when the vote comes around, having him and Sen. Robb and a couple of the others, a sort of core of Senate supporters from the South, will give a couple of the others some courage. And that's really our biggest weakness, because we do pretty well in terms of the West and the Midwest and the East among Democrats and the Republicans I mentioned. But if we could get a little bit more support from southern Democrats, I think we're going to be fine. Things break down largely the same way in the House of Representatives, although all the focus now is on the Senate.

Is the Human Rights Campaign Fund going to sponsor any more activities similar to the recent "Lift the Ban" weekend?

...I think we very well may. We will be doing lots of activities that involve as many people in the lesbian/gay community as we possibly can, because we cannot win it without every person. The Human Rights Campaign Fund has 70,000 paid members, and that's just a fraction of our community, so we need to reach all our members and get them activated to go well beyond that.

Do you think the March on Washington will tie in with the effort to get the military ban lifted, and if so, how?

I think it will be critical, because the media will report this as a march in favor of lifting the ban, so that will become the message of the march, [that it's] a march that's in favor of civil rights for lesbians and gays including in the military....I think we're going to have the largest, certainly one of the largest ever marches, and that will carry a lot of weight....

What about the Lesbian/Gay Civil Rights bill? Obviously Bush wouldn't have signed it even if it had passed. Is there a chance for its passage any time soon?

A lot of it is going to depend on the military issue. If we lose on the military, politicians are going to say, "Why should we spend time on a gay and lesbian civil rights bill when gay and lesbian issues are losers?....I'm not going to do something that's going to subject me to political heat

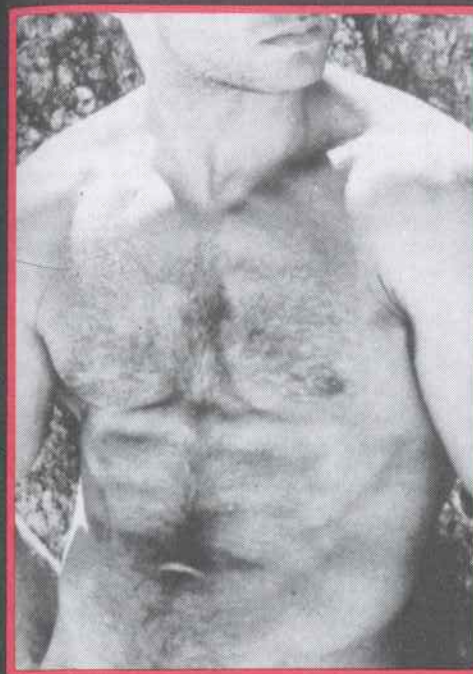
and headaches if it's not going to go anywhere. I'm willing to take the heat if we have a chance of winning." So getting it on the agenda will be largely dependent on the military issue. But if we can do that, I think there's an excellent chance for it, for a couple of reasons. The biggest reason, of course, is having President Clinton in the White House and his commitment to sign a law that would give civil rights to lesbians and gay men. Secondly, our support in Congress has increased. There are 117 House members who have committed to co-sponsoring a lesbian/gay civil rights bill, as well as 21 Senators, and those are good bases of support to begin working something through Congress. Right now, Sen. Kennedy, Congressman Waxman, the Human Rights Campaign Fund and others are rewriting the bill. The bill that had been introduced in the past was 15 years old, and there have been a number of changes in case law and approaches to civil rights. So the substance will be largely the same, but we're totally rewriting the bill, and it will be introduced before the March on Washington so that when people go to lobby, it will actually be there....So when we have a million people in Washington, and tens of thousands of them meeting with their Senators and Representatives, they can go in and demand that they co-sponsor.

So I think we're going to be in good shape, but we've got to get past the military thing....

What do you see happening with AIDS funding, what with the budget crunch and fewer federal dollars to spend?

It's not over till it's over. The President's budget is going to have major increases in AIDS funding. There's going to be several hundred million for the Ryan White Care Act and for AIDS research. That's at a time when much of the federal budget is getting smaller, but I think President Clinton understands that AIDS has been short-changed for years and that we've got to jump-start research efforts and get money out to the cities so that they can provide the kind of care that's needed for people with AIDS and HIV....So I think that AIDS will be in relatively good shape, but it's true that we're going to continue to have to fight for it....The same is true of funding for women's health issues, which have been shortchanged in the past; we expect there will be more for women's health research, and again, we have to work to maintain that once the President's budget gets to Capitol Hill.

In the Broadway musical *A Chorus Line*, we learn of a young dancer who's having difficulty passing auditions. One day she reads on her evaluation card, "dance ten, looks five." Well! She leaves the theatre, calls the doctor and makes an appointment.

*Tits and ass, go out and buy a fancy pair.
Tighten up your derriere.
Do the nose a bit and all that goes with it,
Because tits and ass won't get you tours
Unless they're yours.*

After the surgery, not surprisingly, she had no trouble getting into a Broadway show. It didn't hurt her sex life, either. So, folks, there you have it in song. But we

knew all that before *A Chorus Line*, didn't we? "Them's that got, gets." Yet you and I have heard the beautiful ones complain, "Oh, I get so tired of being a sex object." I always reply, "Honey, worse than being a sex object is *not* being a sex object."

I met Randy when I was a young gypsy trying hard to get into a Broadway show. (We're talking 1949 here.) We were both students at Ballet Arts in Carnegie Hall. The difference between us was beauty, his, and intelligence, also his. He knew all too well that of the thousands who aspire to become professional dancers, very few are successful enough to barely support themselves, much less become rich. Wisely, this young man focused his time and efforts studying law at Columbia University.

He observed, "Dancers begin professional training in childhood, usually at about eight or nine. In contrast, lawyers at that age are still running around in short pants and playing 'Red Rover, won't you please come over.'" "Furthermore," he confided, "if I can graduate near the top of my class, wealth is almost a certainty." I thought, "Well, it must be nice to have everything: hair, face, physique, intelligence, education, charm and an I-know-what-I-want-out-of-life-and-how-to-get-it levelheadedness."

Because law school was so demanding mentally, Randy studied ballet because it was just as demanding physically. It cleared the cobwebs from his mind, and it further enhanced the beauty of his trim body. And that's how the 23-year-old man spent his daylight hours. At night he was a high-priced escort, call-boy, hustler, whore—"a rose by any other name..." (Shakespeare). And everyone in Carnegie Hall knew it. But the poor dancers who might have been interested just didn't have the kind of money this young man could command—a hundred dollars a night. (We're talking 1949 dollars here). Unlike the boys available on 42nd Street, Randy didn't go with just anyone who had the cash; he serviced only one client (male or female), and usually for a long-term relationship. For that kind of money, Randy sold, not just his body, but his devoted companionship. The stud knew his merchandise and his market.

This writer has always envied those who could sell it. Hell, when I was a young man, I couldn't even give it away. Therefore, unable to make it as a dancer—and cer-

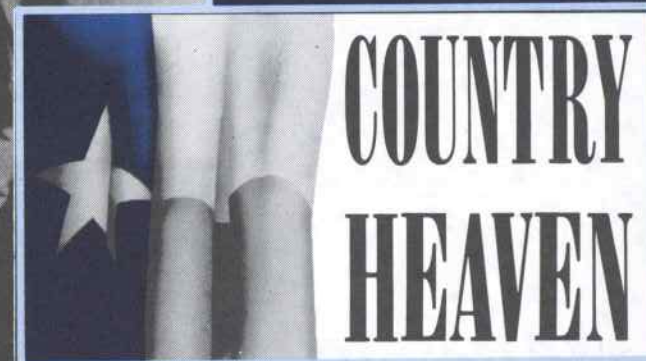

tainly not as a hustler—I bussed dishes at the Automat on 57th Street. That's where I first met Ellen, Randy's client. You see, one who is very, very, very wealthy sometimes enjoys sharing a table with the poor folks of the Automat—it's called slumming. Ellen was a charming lady easily twice Randy's age and so rich that she could afford to be seen in the Automat on the arm of one of New York's most-in-demand gigolos. After that, I saw her often as she came to Ballet Arts to watch Randy (in tights) finish his class, all the while keeping a taxi running at the curb.

While he was unabashed concerning the source of his money, Randy had the good sense not to talk about his professional life. But since I was a trusted friend, he once told me the two would leave Carnegie Hall to hurry to her penthouse to... well, you know. Afterwards, while he showered, she would slip \$200 and tickets to the opera, symphony or ballet into his tux pocket. The first hundred was for services rendered; the second was to allow him to appear to pay for dinner, tips and taxis. After an evening of high culture, they would return to her apartment to spend the remainder of the night entwined. At other times, he accompanied her to social events, ski trips, shopping sprees and, when his classes permitted, luxury cruises to the Bahama Islands. As an added perk, she dressed him in the best money could buy.

"Because Ellen is so hot for you, doesn't she want to marry you?" I once asked. "Oh, no," he smiled. "Many men would love to

marry into her fortune, but she's too smart. She'd rather just pay for a couple of nights a week. In that way, she can always discard old lovers and take new ones whenever she wishes." So this young man knew that eventually he would be replaced just as those before him had been. "I'm just trying to make the lady happy for as long as I can, hopefully until I graduate."

To those of the moon-June-spoon, you-and-me-baby-till-the-end-of-time school, all of this may sound too commercial. But who are we to judge? The two—one unusually handsome, the other fabulously rich—fulfilled each other's needs admirably and hurt no one, and they both knew what they were doing.

Being a sentimental slob, I often like to retrace the steps of my youth. A few times, I've returned to Manhattan to catch some Broadway shows and take classes at Ballet Arts. Once, I looked in the yellow pages under "Attorneys." Sure enough, I found what I was certain I would: Randy was a partner in a big law firm. By then, he was pushing 50. I asked his receptionist if he could see an old friend. Yes, he remembered me, but of course, could only give me a few minutes.

So, how did this man who once had everything look? I'm reminded of a scene in another Broadway show: Daisy Mae complains that she's past her prime at 16, having spent the best years of her life chasing Li'l Abner. Marrying Sam is sympathetic. He observes, "That may be true, honey, but what you've got left over is more than most folks had to begin with."

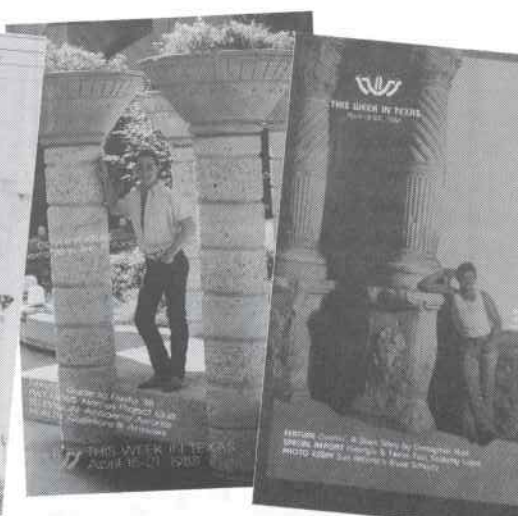

We weren't even thanked for funding the bar's refurbishing in previous years, doncha know.

One establishment that was perfectly willing to accept the gay community's money—besides all the fabulous clubs in the city—was and is Earl Abel's, and during Fiesta week the restaurant added extra late night staff to cope with the hordes of club set members who descended after the bars closed. From about 3 a.m. until well after dawn, Mrs. Abel's favorite son's eatery resembled Spago or the Brown Derby, where you could see well-known Texassexuals knocking on everything from scrambled eggs to T-bone steaks. For the record, the renowned restaurant is the one establishment that actually refused ever to serve Dolly Madison again.

And so it was, Fiesta through the years.

"Tonight... tonight, I am asking for your help. I call upon you to draw from the depths of your being to prove that we are a human race; to prove that our love outweighs our hate; that our compassion is more compelling than our need to blame; that our sensitivity to those in need is stronger than our greed; that our ability to reason overcomes our fear; and that at the end of each of our lives, we can look back and be proud that we have treated others with the kindness, dignity and respect that every human being deserves."

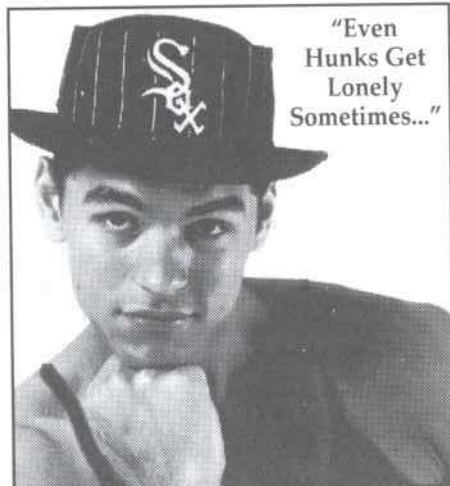

Urging Sen. Nunn to Keep Open Mind

The following letter was sent to Sen. Sam Nunn, chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, concerning the military ban against gay men and lesbians.—Editor
Dear Sen. Nunn:

I served my country as a dedicated and loyal soldier for 23 years, including two tours in Vietnam. A wreath-laying ceremony was recently conducted at the Texas Vietnam Veterans Memorial. I am certain some of those honored that day were also gay, but that fact should make them no less deserving of recognition nor less of a champion for defense of our country and Constitution.

It was not until I retired that I realized how much our military is an organization that has institutionalized hatred and bigotry toward gay and lesbian service members. They are routinely discharged for homosexuality based on unsubstantiated or even manufactured evidence, or the uncorroborated allegations of a single, often anonymous, informant. The administrative discharge board, purportedly an impartial investigation into the facts, is purely a show for the appeasement of Congress, which has mandated at least the appearance of due process. On the court martial side, the injustices under color of law are even grimmer. Threatened with the humiliation of a public trial and up to five years imprisonment, most service personnel accused of being gay waive trial and accept less than honorable discharge, even if they are not actually gay. Criminal charges are sometimes brought when no trial is intended to get the accused to "rpl over" and accept uncontested discharge.

The same article of the Uniform Code of Military Justice frequently used against gays also proscribes heterosexual sodomy,

but no charges are ever brought regarding a consensual act between heterosexuals. The presumption of innocence in cases involving gays is pure fantasy. Statistics on hate crimes due to sexual orientation have never been gathered by the military, and never will be, as long as the system of military injustice I have described remains in place.

Military of all ranks hear the message loud and clear—gays are criminals; gays are unfit to serve their country. It should surprise no one that some service personnel embrace this message, believing hate is acceptable, even encouraged. No victim of gay bashing in the military (and there are many) will ever report it, because they know they will be victimized a second time, subjected to investigation, harassment, character assassination, persecution and prosecution, all officially sanctioned by the Department of Defense. This is a system in which victims are punished and perpetrators are rewarded.

All Americans who serve their country in the Armed Forces have the right to feel proud of their service and receive recognition and honor for their service regardless of their sexual orientation. There is no basis in nature, human reason or the U.S. Constitution for excluding gay and lesbian Americans from serving in the military services or otherwise discriminating against them during or after their service. Gay men and lesbians who serve their country have the same human and legal rights as their non-gay comrades. They have fought in all of the wars and all of the battles which have been necessary to defend the American way of life. They ought to be able to share equally in the fruits of that life.

It is unrealistic to hope we can ever vanquish hate on our streets, on our military bases and in society at large, unless we have also banished official hate espoused by government institutions. We

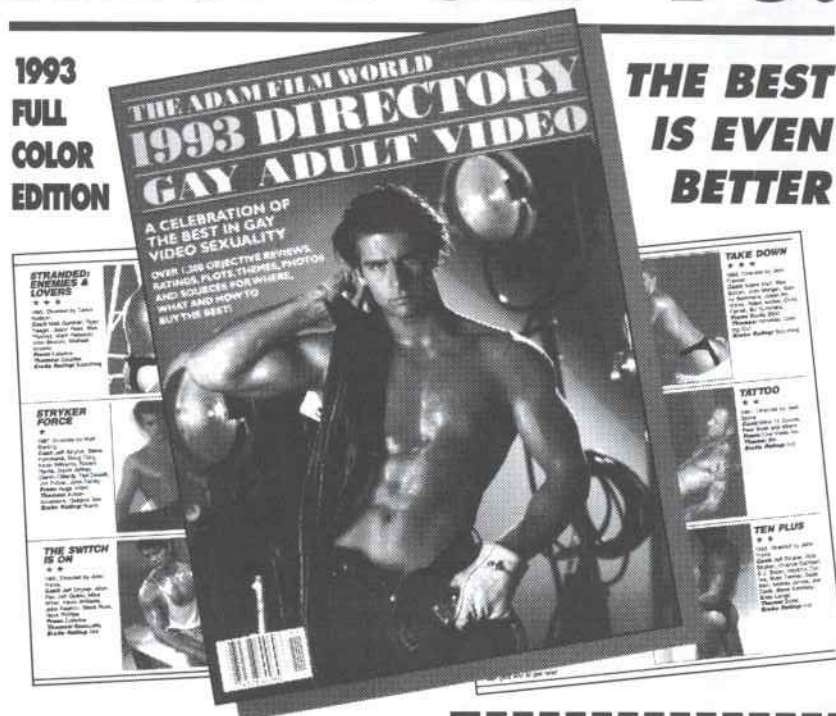

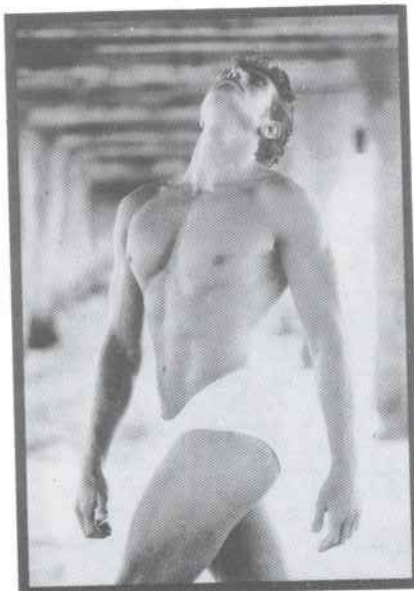

LGPC OF DALLAS ENDORSES CANDIDATES

Coalition Backs Krueger for Senate, Issues Warnings on Box, Barton.

DALLAS — As the May 1 general election draws closer, activity among those candidates seeking office in several key local races—as well as those organizations from which they might draw some of their greatest support—is heating up, and many longtime observers agree that the campaign will be remembered as either an incredible victory for the gay candidates in the race, or a resounding and possibly humiliating defeat.

At stake in the Dallas elections are 14 available city council positions, as well as the hotly contested race for the seat vacated by former Sen. Lloyd Bentsen, who left Congress to assume the role of Treasury Secretary in the Clinton cabinet. Gov. Ann Richards appointed Bob Krueger to fill that seat on an interim basis.

Dallas' Lesbian/Gay Political Coalition recently screened those candidates seeking election—many of whom openly sought the group's support—and has issued endorsements in nine of the 15 key races. Many of the endorsements were seen as a political triumph for the group, because this election will mark the first time many of the candidates have seen the vote-getting ability of LGPC as an asset to their campaigns.

For U.S. Senator, the Coalition has endorsed Krueger, despite his recent vote to uphold the ban on immigration of HIV-infected people into the U.S. Many gay and lesbian leaders perceive Krueger's vote as an example of "waffling" on the issue of gay and lesbian civil rights, despite the fact that he appears to support President Clinton's plan to lift the ban on gays and lesbians in the military. The LGPC endorsement of Krueger marks the first time a candidate for the U.S. Senate has openly and actively sought the group's backing.

In City Council elections, LGPC candidates in eight of the 14 available seats. In District 2, incumbent candidate Chris Luna received the group's nod, while Mike Hutchison received the group's backing in District 3. Both Luna and Hutchison are openly gay. The group also endorsed Fred Blair for District 4; Cedric Davis for District 8; Roger Kallenber for District 9; Jim Ball,



Jr. for District 12; David Zareie for District 13 and Craig McDaniel for District 14. McDaniel is also openly gay.

LGPC also issued warnings against two candidates in the upcoming elections, Glenn Box, candidate for District 9, and Joe Barton, who is seeking the U.S. Senate seat. Box—who once sought a conditional Coalition endorsement only to renounce it on the advice of conservative constituents—has been a vocal supporter of the Dallas Police Department's fight to retain a ban on the hiring of gays and lesbians by the force. Barton has been targeted by LGPC because of his current campaign emphasis on maintaining the ban on gays in the military. Barton's television advertisements feature prominent Texas conservatives stating, "Joe Barton will make a great U.S. Senator," immediately following the candidate's anti-gay remarks.

AIDS EQUITY LEAGUE HANDS OUT MACADORY AWARDS

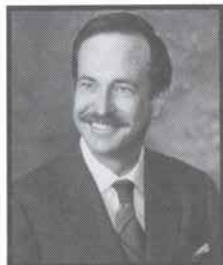
Houstonians Honored for Dedication in Fight Against HIV.

HOUSTON — In a reception held last Monday evening, the AIDS Equity League of Houston honored local individuals and organizations who have shown exemplary dedication in the areas of HIV/AIDS services, education and advocacy. The 1993 Michael MacAdory Awards ceremony was held at Cody's Rooftop Jazzbar & Grill in the Montrose area.

Maurice (Mo) Jones, chair of the board of the Greater Houston HIV Alliance, was honored with the Michael MacAdory Award, given to the individual whose contributions to AIDS services have had an outstanding effect upon those infected and affected.

The Medical Award, given to the health care professional who has provided leadership in health care delivery and support, went to Dr. Susan Miller of Thomas Street Clinic. The Journalism Award, which honors the journalist whose coverage of HIV/AIDS issues in Houston has been outstanding for its balance, accuracy and compassion, was given to Tim Fleck, previously of the *Houston Press*.

Greater Houston HIV Alliance chair Maurice (Mo) Jones honored with AIDS Equity League's Michael MacAdory Award.



The Houston Institute for the Protection of Youth [HIPY] won the Community Award, given for outstanding community service in the area of HIV/AIDS prevention education and service.

The Individual Service Award, which goes to the person who demonstrates courage and dedication in the HIV field through his or her voluntary work, went to Steven Bradley. Montrose Counseling Center Executive Director Ann Robison received the Professional Service Award, which honors an HIV professional working in the area of AIDS services and dedication.

Houston City Council members Ben Reyes and Judson Robinson won Politician Awards, which honor elected officials who speak out and take action in local government.

TEXAS SENATE PASSES HATE CRIMES MEASURE

Sexual Orientation Included in Bill Providing for Harsher Penalties; Must Still Pass House.

AUSTIN — Last Wednesday, the Texas Senate passed a bill that would provide enhanced penalties for those convicted of committing crimes against people on the basis of their race, national origin, religion or sexual orientation. It would also require minimum prison terms of 10 years in cases of murder, first degree aggravated assault

or first-degree arson. The legislation must still pass the Texas House.

Commenting on the Senate's action, Laurie Eiserloh, Executive Director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas [LGRL], said, "This is a real victory for the lesbian/gay community. But we need to be cautious. The legislation still needs to pass the House."

Eiserloh praised Sen. Rodney Ellis of Houston, sponsor of the measure, for his efforts. "Sen. Ellis' strategy on this bill was very good," she said. "He is a real hero."

The LGRL director cited several recent Texas cases involving crimes against gay people that indicate the need for tougher hate crimes legislation. In 1988, John Griffen and Tommy Trimble, two Dallas gay men, were murdered in that city's Reverchon Park. The murderer in that case, Richard Bednarski, was given a reduced sentence by Judge Jack Hampton, who was later reprimanded by the State Judicial Review Committee.

In the summer of 1991, Paul Broussard was killed by a gang of 10 young men in the Montrose area of Houston. Broussard's killing sparked a massive protest in Houston which led to the passage of a hate-crimes statistics act during the last legislative session.

In 1990, San Antonio schoolteacher Charles Perez Resendez was beaten to death by a Marine, Nicolo Giangrosso. Giangrosso was indicted for murder but charged with manslaughter. He made a plea bargain agreement with prosecutors and was sentenced to probation with deferred adjudication. Giangrosso is now a free man.

COMMUNITY URGED TO PRESSURE VIDEO RETAILERS FOR MORE GAY TITLES

Portion of Rental Receipts from 'Lost Language of Cranes' Will Go To Video Industry AIDS Coalition.

TEXAS — CBS/Fox Video Corporation, leading an unprecedented charge into the gay and lesbian market, is urging the gay community to contact local video stores and national chains to request copies of the family drama, *The Lost Language of*

Cranes.

Based on David Leavitt's highly-acclaimed novel, the BBC production of *Cranes* tells of a family facing crisis after both the father and son reveal they are gay. When it aired on selected PBS stations last June, *Time* magazine praised its "absolute lack of sentimentality." The film stars *thirtysomething*'s Corey Parker, as well as Eileen Atkins, Brian Cox and Angus MacFadyen.

According to Sal Scamardo, CBS/Fox's Director of Promotions, "We know the demand's there for gay and lesbian titles all over the country, not just in New York and San Francisco. Now we need gay and lesbian consumers to help us prove it to retailers. Our ultimate goal is to better serve gay and lesbian consumers by integrating titles that speak to them into more stores in more places. We've always recognized the importance of the gay market, and *The Lost Language of Cranes* gives us the chance to work directly on the community's concerns."

Scamardo points to demographic figures indicating the gay community has been aware of for a long time to support his company's decision. These figures indicate that gay and lesbian consumers boast a higher household income and that they spend more on disposable items, including videos, than the average consumer. One survey shows that gays and lesbians tend to rent an average of 4.1 videos each month, with 28% renting six or more.

For the home video industry, the CBS/Fox Video campaign could lead to major changes in how it markets to gay and lesbian people. "It's not a question of politics for us," states Mindy Pickard, Vice-President of Marketing for CBS/Fox. "It benefits everyone for video stores to carry more gay and alternative titles—the stores win, distributors win. This is a market that offers true growth potential if its needs are addressed."

The Lost Language of Cranes will debut in video stores on June 2 at the beginning of Gay Pride Month. CBS/Fox is urging every member of the gay and lesbian community to mobilize behind the film and contact their favorite video store to request the tape, not just because it will spotlight gay and lesbian demand for videos, but also because portions of the rental receipts will be donated to VIAC, the Video Industry AIDS Coalition.

"Since the title is being launched during Gay Pride Month and after the March on Washington," declared Scamardo, "we think it can open dialogues about coming out, families and what parents and children expect of each other. These are very powerful issues that relate to us all."

HOUSTON CLINICAL RESEARCH NETWORK STARTS WAITING LIST FOR DRUG TRIALS

Upcoming Studies to Look at Ranitidine, AZT/3TC Combination In Those With Lower CD4 Counts.

HOUSTON — The Houston Clinical Research Network [HCRN], an arm of the Montrose Clinic created to provide access to experimental therapies and HIV research to persons living with HIV/AIDS in the Houston area, is compiling a waiting list for drug trials scheduled to begin in the near future. One trial will involve the use of Ranitidine in persons with cd4 cell counts between 400 and 700.

Another trial will test a combination of AZT and 3TC in persons with cd4 cell counts between 100 and 300. Those interested in getting on the HCRN drug trial waiting list may call (713)520-2011.

HCRN has participated and enrolled over 600 patients in nearly 20 research studies since 1989. "We are currently the only viable organization dedicated solely to providing access to HIV research in the Houston area," Chris Jimmerson, HCRN Director of Operations, told TWT NEWS. "We identify compounds and drugs that may be of benefit to persons with HIV/AIDS and seek funding to cover the costs of conducting research to investigate their effectiveness," he continued.

Most of HCRN's funding comes from pharmaceutical companies that are looking for research on new HIV/AIDS drugs. The Network has also received grants from the American Foundation for AIDS Research [AmFAR] and private contributors.

HCRN has a Funding Committee made up of dedicated volunteers who raise money to cover operating costs that aren't funded and to pay for drug trials that HCRN conducts without pharmaceutical company funding. "The Funding Commit-

tee allows us to offer far greater research opportunities than we would otherwise be able. There are no federal research sites in the Houston area and HCRN receives no federal money," Jimmerson added.

The HCRN Funding Committee is currently selling a line of locally designed March on Washington T-shirts. They are available at Basic Brothers, 1232 Westheimer, and the Houston office of THIS WEEK IN TEXAS. Proceeds will help finance HCRN's activities.

A new face on the LIB board is vice-president Cookie Davenport, who has been involved with LIB from the start as a member and volunteer on various committees. She is a licensed massage therapist and is the organizer of the Rainbow Riders Bicycle Club.

Rounding out the board are Janet Langham, serving as treasurer for her second consecutive term, and Judith Meyer, who is now in her second consecutive term as secretary. Both women have provided countless hours of support for the group during the past years. Langham is a CPA and owns an accounting service, while Meyer is co-owner of Crossroads Market.

Board members and the heads of each of the group's standing committees have formed a steering committee which will provide coordination between the various interest groups within LIB.

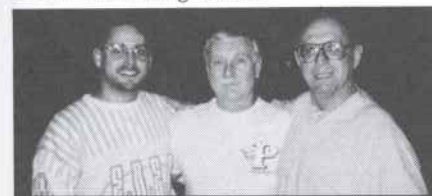

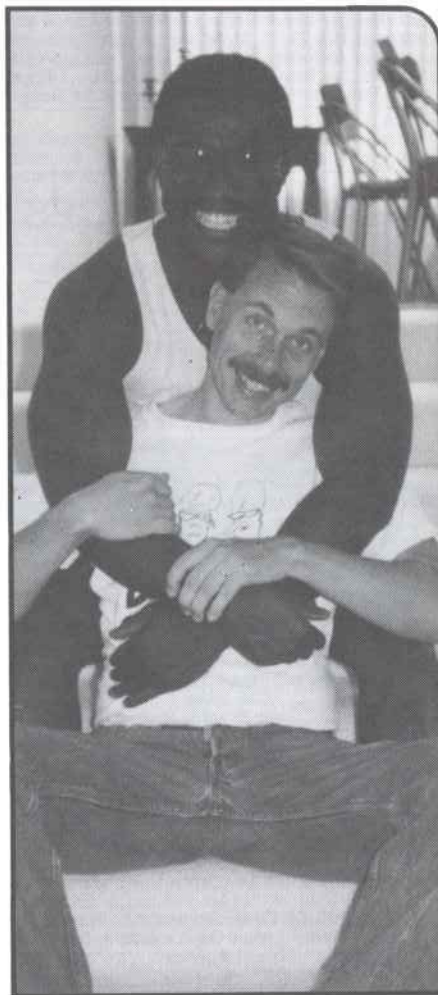
Jerry A. Lankford
