OUR HEROES:

A Personal View of
"Operation Lift the Ban"

The next six months are going to be very difficult times for gay men and women in America. Let's steel ourselves for it. The radical religious right, strongly organized and a helluva lot better financed, has tremendous political power. Smarting from the demise of the hateful Reagan/Bush era and frustrated at being unable to close abortion clinics, they have seized the emotional issue of gays and lesbians in the military to solidify their ranks. We must stop them in their tracks. For if they are able to thwart President Bill Clinton's efforts on our behalf, they will be even more empowered to roll back every gain we've made over the last 40 years. Every state will eventually become another Colorado. In time, we will be driven back into our '50s closets. We must never allow ourselves to become complacent; we must never underestimate our enemies' strength.

Surprised by the vehement, well-orchestrated efforts of the homophobes, gay leaders recently staged "Operation Lift the Ban" rallies in Dallas and 21 other cities nationwide in a desperate attempt to catch up. Fortunately, unlike in previous years, we have grown too strong for the media to ignore, and they were there. Seated before their cameras and ready for their probing questions were our big guns: David Mixner, a close friend and advisor to President Clinton; Navy Lt. j.g. Tracy Thorne, bombardier-navigator; the Rev. Michael Piazza, senior pastor of the MCC Cathedral of Hope; the Rev. Troy Perry, founder of the Universal Fellowship of the MCC; and Navy Petty Officer Keith Meinhold. All of them had strong voices and spoke with strong logic, brief and to the point.

Meinhold pointed out that through the years, the bigots have frantically tried to rationalize the prohibition of gays and lesbians in the military. First, they labeled us psychologically unfit, abnormal. It worked for decades. Thousands of our people, loyal and dedicated, were given dishonorable discharges and even prison terms. But in

1973, the American Psychological Association declassified homosexuality as a mental illness. That chapped their butts.

They then accused us of being security risks, subject to blackmail. But how can an avowed homosexual be blackmailed? The Pentagon was unable to come up with a single instance of gays betraying their country.

Desperate for a last straw, they then said that "avowed" gays would undermine morale and good order. There would be riots and mass resignations if heterosexuals were forced to live in close quarters and shower with known gays. But as Meinhold pointed out, that was the same argument used in 1948 in an effort to prevent President Truman from desegregating the services. "I've been showering with men in the Navy for 12 years," Meinhold said. "It's never been a problem." Thorne asked, "Why do heterosexual men have a tendency to overestimate their attractiveness?"

Hoping to prove that gays working alongside straights would pose a problem, the Navy moved Meinhold and Thorne several times. Each time they were disappointed to find that co-workers were very supportive of the men.

When all else fails, thump the Bible. But Troy Perry warned, "Every time they quote a verse, we will quote three." Concerning the suggestion that gays soldiers be segregated, he countered, "Discrimination is discrimination, no matter how you slice it. If this policy is implemented, the gay-designated barracks will be empty. There will be no platoons of hairdressers or stevedores. This policy is totally unacceptable."

With a staggering national debt, sluggish economy, dangerous trade imbalance and a national cry to "cut spending," you'd think taxpayers would be alarmed at how much we spend to hound proficient gays out of the military. In Lt. Thorne's case alone, it cost U.S. citizens \$2 million to train him to be a pilot and an equal amount to train his replacement. Wouldn't that be

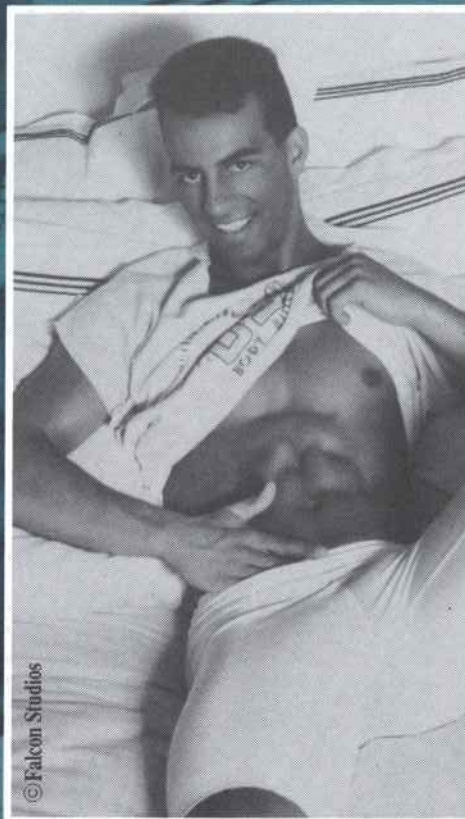

a sensible place to cut spending?

Mixner brought everyone to their feet cheering when he declared that Meinhold, Thorne and all the other gay men and lesbians fighting to stay in the military "... were the Rosa Parks of this issue. This is our Selma. We must not sit back and rely on the efforts of President Clinton. We can depend only on ourselves. This is *our* battle, and we must fight it!"

How? First, we must be honest with ourselves and with others. If we truly wish to end hypocrisy and inequality, we must come out to our friends, relatives and acquaintances when possible. This is our strongest weapon.

Furthermore, "We cannot allow the religious right to flood the switchboards to the White House and our congressional representatives. All of us must make those calls; we must all write those letters."

As responsible citizens, we must always vote. Tomorrow, May 1, it is imperative that we defeat the homophobic Joe Barton and elect Bob Krueger.

After the cameras and reporters had left, I approached the now-alone and reflective Petty Officer Keith Meinhold. This man is decidedly good-looking and has the graceful body of a panther. Coming out before 13 million viewers on TV and facing the wrath of the U.S. Navy eyeball to eyeball, he is certainly strong. And yet, he has a slim frame, actually delicate. I heard myself asking, "Why are you so skinny?" He smiled. "I've been that way all my life."

As he spoke, I secretly admired and examined this hero. From a distance, he wears the mantle of greatness. But up close, he is a mere mortal. His shoulders are thin, frail. Silently, I vowed, "I will not allow this man to shoulder my part of the battle for me. He is one of several leaders I've been looking for all my life. I will take my stand beside him."

There are more than 20 million of us in this nation. If all of us support our heroes, if we dedicate ourselves over the next several months to fight as we've never fought before, will we not become heroes ourselves? If, on the other hand, we shirk our responsibilities and allow the bigots to take away our hard-won civil rights and the rights of generations who will follow us, can we ever forgive ourselves?

We have the option of making a difference. *We must* do it.

That pride welled up in me when *Common Threads* won the Academy Award for best documentary. I felt it when Jerry Birdwell was appointed to the Court by Gov. Ann Richards. I felt it again when the Dallas community helped Justice Barbara Rosenberg defeat Jack Hampton.

That wonderful feeling came home again recently when I heard Craig McDaniel, a candidate for Dallas City Council, Place 14, speak at a community forum. At the end of the meeting, the outpouring of cheers and applause for Craig brought that "lump in the throat" pride back to me. How wonderful that in Craig McDaniel Dallas has a candidate who obviously does his homework, learns about an issue, is willing to hear all sides and then work with all parties to find a solution that works for everybody.

Here is a candidate in whom anybody can take pride. I can support Craig because he will do a good job and has spent years working behind the scenes to learn how to create opportunities for District 14. I, too, have held my nose and voted for candidates who pretended to support (or be a part of) the gay and lesbian community, only to have them betray that trust. It is refreshing to feel real enthusiasm and genuine pride again.

Craig has run an issue-oriented campaign, never resorting to name-calling or rumor-mongering. He doesn't twist arms or threaten those who support someone else.



He insists on a campaign that remains honest in all respects. It invigorates my faith to have a candidate that doesn't have to shovel dirt to win.

No Excuse for Ban

The following letter was sent to Sen. Sam Nunn, Chair of the Senate Armed Services Committee.—Editor

I am writing to express my strong interest, as a gay person, in ending the exclusion of gay men and women from the U.S. military services.

Friends of mine have watched your hearings on CNN. They tell me that you have had numerous professional witnesses who have said that there is no psychological justification for excluding gay men or women from the military services. It is to your credit that you have had witnesses who are in opposition to your publicly expressed stand, and I thank you.

Nevertheless, there is no excuse for the resistance to change that is common in this country. Nearly all West European governments have ended any exclusion of gays from their armed forces, many more than 20 years ago. No one's dire predictions came true—the new policies have been found to be satisfactory. No country has reverted to a policy of exclusion.

The present policy of exclusion is a government seal of approval on homophobic prejudice. The Department of Defense is, after all, a large and important branch of government. Military training undoubtedly plays a big part in molding many young men's characters, and the present policy is a major reinforcement of homophobia.

I have known many gay men, probably hundreds, who have served in a branch of the armed forces. I have also known a

number of gay women who have served. The vast majority of them seem to have adjusted well enough to military life—maybe better than some straight people I have known. It is not just my own observation, but is generally acknowledged that many gay men and women have in fact served in this country's armed forces, in spite of this country's official policy of exclusion.

There have been outstanding military leaders in various times and places in history who were gay. One was Frederick the Great, King of Prussia. Another was Baron von Steuben, who trained the troops for the American Revolution—this country owes much to him for the success of our struggle for independence.

PHYLLIS FRYE
SPEAKS AT
THE MARCH ON
WASHINGTON



EMBRACE EACH OTHER'S STEREOTYPES

Phyllis Randolph Frye of Houston shared the podium with other distinguished speakers at last Sunday's March on Washington for Lesbian, Gay & Bi Equal Rights and Liberation. TWT is proud to reprint the text of her speech.

"The transgendered community includes cross-dressers and transvestites, passing women and male impersonators, drag queens and female impersonators, and pre- and non- and post-operative transsexuals. We definitely include females-to-males, as in Joan of Arc, George Sand, Leslie Feinberg and the transgendered women who fought bravely as soldiers in our colonial and civil wars. We embrace all races and sexual orientations, creeds and religions, ethnicities and nationalities, ages and physical impediments.

"This is a very unforgiving society for transgendered persons and their loved ones. While we were reared in one gender identity, we have a definite, true-but-opposite gender identity which must express itself. The empirical data show that being transgendered is not a matter of mere choice. Rational people do not take upon themselves such unrelenting and often hate-filled social pressures for a mere fling!

"We are here today in a grand effort to change law and social understanding. The First International Conference on Transgender Law and Employment Policy revealed that the transgendered have no legal protection and no employment protection. The transgendered require legal protection on the basis of "gender iden-

tification." Together, we must seek legal protection from discrimination on the basis of *both* "sexual orientation" and "gender identification."

"One of the ten legal strategies that we will develop at the Second Transgender Law Conference this upcoming August in Houston will be to resist those surgeons who demand that heterosexual couples divorce as a condition to surgery, even though both partners wish to remain married. Sex reassignment surgery on one half of an ongoing heterosexual marriage yields a same-sex marriage. Yes, the transgendered will lead in the same-sex marriage struggle.

"Our history reveals that the majority of those who died at the beginning of the Nazi Holocaust while wearing pink triangles were the transgendered of all sexual orientations. Our history also reveals that the real heroes in the Stonewall uprising were the transgendered, the leather cultists and the street hustlers who stood up to the bully cops and presented in-your-face resistance to being pushed around further. Sadly, their reward in both cases is often condescension and stereotyping.

Pitting lesbians, gays and bisexuals against the transgendered has often been the bigot's ploy. Many resent being stereotyped as "cross-dressing effeminate"

simply because the bigots have successfully cast such with a pejorative label. Others resent being stereotyped as "homosexual/bisexual" simply because the bigots have successfully cast such with another pejorative label. While we quarrel amongst ourselves over stereotypes and labels, the bigots that fire us, the bigots that resist our marrying, the bigots that refuse us our citizen's share, continue to win hands down.

"In order for us to resist the bigot's ploy, we must *embrace* each other's stereotypes and labels with pride. We must unite. We must go into the Congress and into the statehouses speaking for lesbian and gay and bisexual and transgender—and transgender—rights. We must seek legal language that protects us on the basis of both "sexual orientation" and gender identification—and gender identification. Thank you.

"And tell Sam Nunn that I am an honorably discharged army officer!"

Frye is an attorney, engineer and activist for the rights of transgendered persons.

THROUGH THE YEARS**

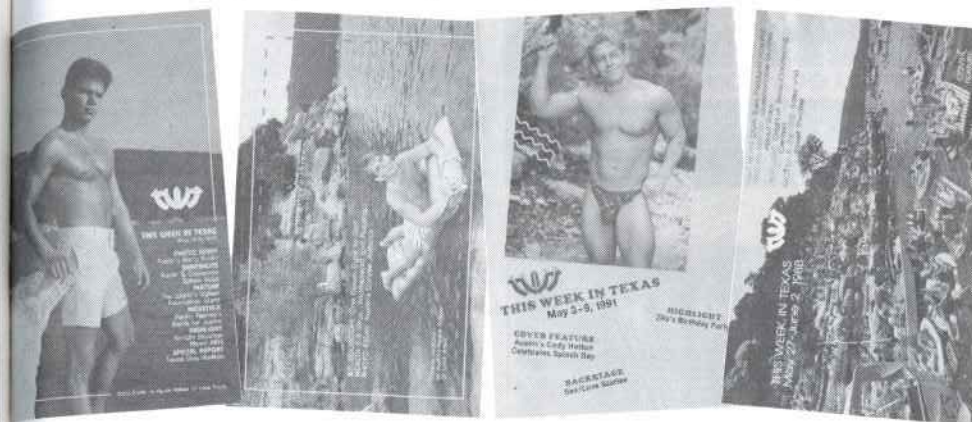

RUNOFF LIKELY AFTER CROWDED MAY 1 SENATE ELECTION

*Race Being Watched for
Potential National Importance.*

TEXAS — Voters across the state go to the polls tomorrow to choose a Senator in a race whose results are likely to be looked at closely for their impact on the course of gay and lesbian issues on the national scene. There are also down-ballot races that have attracted the interest of gay and lesbian voters.

With a crowded field of 24 candidates vying for the seat left vacant when Lloyd Bentsen became Treasury Secretary earlier this year, most observers believe a runoff will be necessary in the Senate race. Recent polls have shown Democrat Bob Krueger at the head of the pack, though far from obtaining the 50% plus he would need to win election outright. Republicans Kay Bailey Hutchison and Jack Fields appear to have the best chance of making it into a runoff with Krueger, who was appointed to fill the Senate seat by Gov. Ann Richards.

Krueger's campaign was slow in appealing for and receiving support from gay and lesbian organizations, and he has been perceived as vacillating on some issues of concern to the gay community. He and Democratic opponent Jose Angel Gutierrez have each been endorsed by gay and lesbian political organizations.

The Senate race is being watched both in Texas and across the nation for the effect its outcome may have on President Bill Clinton's plan to lift the ban on gays serving in the military. Krueger and Gutierrez have declared their support for lifting it, while other major candidates have come out in support of the ban. GOP candidate Joe Barton has used the military ban issue in his campaign, running homophobic TV and radio ads attacking Krueger for his support of Clinton's proposal to lift it.

Tomorrow's balloting also features a number of down-ballot races in Austin and Dallas in which gay and lesbian political organizations have issued endorsements. In Dallas, openly gay candidates are running for seats on City Council.

In the Senate race, the Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus [ALGPC] and the Dallas Gay Political Caucus [DGPC] have

endorsed Democrat Jose Angel Gutierrez, while the Political Action Committee of the Lesbian/Gay Political Coalition of Dallas [LG-PAC] has endorsed Bob Krueger. Krueger also has the support of Lesbian/Gay Democrats of Texas as well as of the Eleanor Roosevelt/Harvey Milk Democratic Club, a newly formed Houston group whose declared aim is to back Democrats who support freedom of choice and civil rights for all people. Houston's Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus declined to endorse a candidate in the Senate race.

In local races, ALGPC has endorsed Max Nofziger for City Council Place 1, Jackie Goodman for Place 3 and Ginny Ballard for Place 4. In Dallas, the race that has attracted the most attention is for City Council District 14, in which two openly gay men, Ed Oakley and Craig McDaniel, are among those competing for the spot. Oakley has been endorsed by DGPC, the political arm of the Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance, while McDaniel has received the support of LG-PAC. Other openly gay candidates in Dallas races are Mike Hutchison, who is running for City Council District 3 and has the endorsement of both DGPC and LG-PAC, and Jack Borden, who is running for District 2. Borden did not receive the support of any gay groups issuing endorsements.

The Dallas Gay Political Caucus is also supporting Domingo Garcia for City Council District 1, Chris Luna for District 2 and Roger Kallenberg for District 9. LG-PAC has also endorsed both Luna and Kallenberg, and is supporting Fred Blair for City Council District 4, Cedric Davis for District 8, Jim Ball for District 12 and David Zareie for District 13. LG-PAC has also endorsed Dana Huffman for Irving City Council.

EMPLOYEES ACCUSE AMERICAN AIRLINES OF DISCRIMINATION

*Gay Leaders Demand Explanation
From CEO Bob Crandall, Advise
Travel with Other Companies.*

DALLAS — During the past week, TWT NEWS has been contacted by employees of Fort Worth-based American Airlines concerning incidents of apparent discriminatory policy and decision-making on the part of airline management. The first such

incident, reported last week, concerns the airline's ban on the wearing of the familiar AIDS awareness ribbon by its employees. The ban covers all public-contact personnel, from agents to flight attendants, and, according to one employee who asked to remain anonymous because his union is in contract negotiations with the airline, was enacted because the ribbon is a "political statement," despite the fact that passenger response to the ribbons has been mostly favorable. The same employee claims that American did not enact a similar ban when company personnel wore yellow ribbons during the Gulf War.

Early this week, another airline employee turned over to TWT NEWS a copy of a "flight operations irregularity report" detailing a 13-minute delay which occurred at Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport last Sunday, April 25—the day of the March on Washington for Lesbian, Gay and Bi Equal Rights and Liberation. The information contained in the report—which, according to the employee, is purged from the airline's computer system after 24 hours—indicates that the crew of flight 701, which arrived at DFW from Washington, D.C. at 10:11 p.m., requested a "complete [change] of all pillows [and] blankets due [to] gay rights activists group [onboard]." This action resulted in a 13-minute delay on outbound flight 279 to Ontario, California which, according to the employee TWT NEWS spoke with, could have resulted in re-routing of the flight since Ontario restricts flight operations at its airport to certain hours of the day.

What the report didn't document, according to the employee, was that same flight crew's request to have the seats that had been occupied by the "gay rights activists" removed or cleaned before departure. That request was denied, since it would have necessitated removing the aircraft from service.

Both employees expressed disappointment over the two incidents, claiming that American Airlines is insensitive to the AIDS crisis—which has had a great impact on the company's employee ranks—and to gay and lesbian issues in general.

Repeated calls to American Airlines' Corporate Communications Department at the company's headquarters outside Fort Worth were not returned as of press time.

Response from gay and lesbian leaders to the documented incident was both swift



and decisive. "The Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance demands an explanation from [American CEO] Bob Crandall for this incident," stated DGLA Vice-President David Taffett. "Until we have received a satisfactory response, we will not recommend travel on American." Any action by the DGLA could prove costly to American, since many gay and lesbian organizations—not just in the airline's hometown, but nationwide—use American as their designated carrier.

TWT NEWS contacted several area travel agencies for their reactions to the incident and to ask if they had planned any response. Many agents said they support the idea of booking no American flights in retaliation against the airline, but Destination Tours' Randall Vickers said that, at the very least, "the gay and lesbian community needs to give careful consideration to which airline we choose. When it comes down to a choice between American and Delta, why support American when they're going to attack us?"

Gay rights issues aside, the incident concerns many because it seems to indicate that there is still misinformation among the general population about how HIV is transmitted. Additionally, American's policy outlawing the wearing of AIDS ribbons because it is viewed as a "political statement" seems to indicate that American views AIDS as a moral, rather than a health, issue.

"It's sad that a company as large as American Airlines, with as much information about the disease as is available, has that much ignorance within their employee group," declared Vickers.

"I can understand that type of behavior in Waxahachie, but you hope it won't happen here. American needs to be aware of the educational opportunities that are available to their employees. As a community, we should demand that American get on the bandwagon and educate their employees."

TEXAS SENATE DEFEATS PROPOSAL TO RETAIN 21.06 IN PENAL CODE

**Sen. John Whitmire Leads Fight
Against Republican Amendment
To Keep Anti-Sodomy Law.**

AUSTIN — Last week the Texas Senate voted down a proposal to keep 21.06, the state's so-called "sodomy law," in the newly revised penal code set to go into effect later this year. Senators voted 16-12 against an amendment by Sen. Jane Nelson [Rep.-Flower Mound] that would have retained the statute.

21.06 criminalizes sexual relations between consenting adults of the same sex, with potential punishment of a fine of up to \$500.

Laurie Eiserloh, Executive Director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, had high praise for Sen. John Whitmire [Dem-Houston], who led the fight against Nelson's amendment.

"Sen. Whitmire...is a real hero. He understands this as a basic human rights issue. He argued passionately against the amendment to place 21.06 back into the penal code."

The elimination of 21.06 was just one of a number of criminal justice reforms Whitmire has sponsored to overhaul the state's penal code, including proposals to lengthen prison time for dangerous criminals.

Eiserloh also commended Senators Steve Carriker, Carl Parker, John Montford, Rodney Ellis and Mike Moncrief, as well as Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock, for their help in defeating Nelson's proposal.

The fate of 21.06 will next be taken up by the Texas House of Representatives. Eiserloh was cautious in evaluating the prospects for such a vote in that chamber, which she described as harder to lobby because it is more conservative and has more members.

Paralleling the legislative fight to eliminate 21.06 from the state Penal Code is the judicial case of *Morales et al. v. the State of Texas*, which is now before the Texas Supreme Court. The five co-plaintiffs in *Morales* claim that 21.06 violates the Texas Constitution. The case was initiated by the Texas Human Rights Foundation,

which is also paying associated court costs and attorneys' fees.

CONCERT TO BENEFIT SAN ANTONIO AIDS FOUNDATION

**Nell Carter, Lou Rawls Featured
May 13 at Municipal Auditorium.**

SAN ANTONIO — A benefit concert starring entertainers Lou Rawls and Nell Carter is scheduled for Thursday, May 13, with proceeds earmarked for the San Antonio AIDS Foundation [SAAF].

"Our goal is to sell out the auditorium to demonstrate to these two incredible performers what a great concert town San Antonio really is," said Sharen Rupp, executive director of the AIDS Foundation.

Carter is perhaps most widely known for her role on the television series *Gimme A Break*, which brought her two Emmy Awards. She has also appeared in several Broadway shows, including *Ain't Misbehavin'*, *Dude, Don't Bother Me*, *I Can't Cope*, *Jesus Christ Superstar* and *Bury the Dead*, and has received numerous awards, including an Outer Circle Critics Award, a Drama Desk Award, an Obie, a Theater World Desk Award and a Soho. Her most recent appearance was on the Academy Awards show.

Rawls, a philanthropist as well as entertainer, recorded his first album, *Lou Rawls Live*, in 1966. He has garnered one platinum and six gold albums plus a gold single, and has been nominated for a Grammy Award. He continues to perform hundreds of concert dates a year, and is well known for his involvement in raising money for the United Negro College Fund.

Rupp said that proceeds from the May 13 show will supplement the funding SAAF obtains from events like "Heart Strings," which made a stopover in San Antonio on its national tour last spring.

"Since 'Heart Strings' is biennial, we elected to stage our own concert. The needs of the HIV and AIDS community are so great, fund-raising is a day-in and day-out proposition. With generous, local corporate support and underwriting from area businesses, this concert has become a reality."

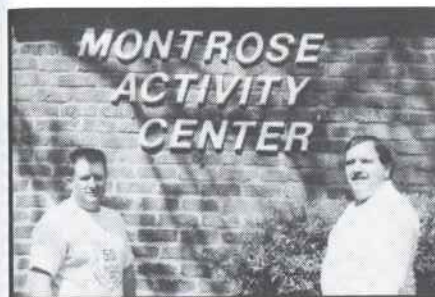

March 28, 1960 - April 7, 1993

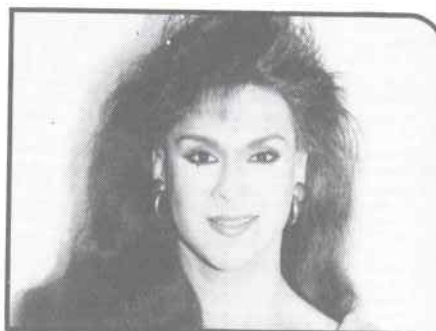
Proprietor, Daniels Furniture, Longview, Texas; graduate of Southern Methodist University; winner of several blue ribbons in the Most Identical Twin Competition at the State Fair of Texas. (His brother, Kerry, was fatally injured in a 1981 accident on the Dallas North Tollway.) Kelly fought the battle for several years, using most of the weapons in the arsenal at one time or another. He often thought that the treatments were killing him a lot faster than the virus was.

The last movie we went to see was *Aladdin*...now he's in that whole new world they sang about. Kelly loved to take us places we'd never been. We'll never forget him.

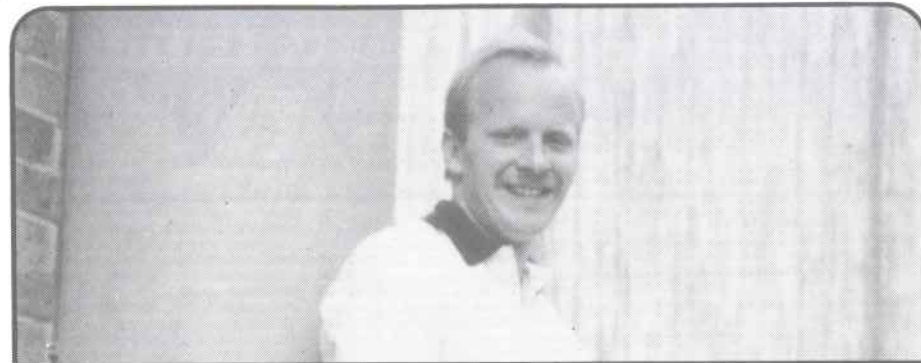

Dan Kiesgen, age 33, passed away on Sunday, March 7, 1993 at St. Joseph Hospital in Chicago, Illinois, after a long battle with AIDS. Randy, his lover of eight years, was at his side. Services were held March 11 in Detroit, Michigan. A memorial celebration of Dan's life will be held in Houston with specifics to be announced at a later date. Memorial contributions may be made to the Bering Dental Clinic or the Stone Soup Pantry.

Dan was born in Detroit, Michigan and attended the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, where he studied business management. A resident of Houston for 13 years, Dan worked as an accountant for M&N Advertising and Ogilvy & Mather Advertising. Dan was on the executive board of the PWA Coalition, on the board of the Ryan White Committee, participated in food drives for the Stone Soup Pantry and was actively involved in many other causes for AIDS, including the "Shopping Spree for All" sponsored by the *Houston Post* and *Foley's*. In the early years of his illness, Dan participated in experimental drug trials so that he and others might benefit from new drug therapies. In so doing, Dan hoped that the long-term outcome for people with AIDS would improve and that they would be provided with a longer and better quality of life. Dan and his lover moved to the Washington, D.C. area in 1989 and just recently moved to Chicago, Illinois.

Dan's sense of spirit and love was so great. He touched so many lives and will be missed by his many friends. His wit and humor spiced our lives with joy. Let's remember the smiles he put on our faces and how he could brighten our day.

Dan was such a fighter and conquered so many battles in the last seven years. His positive attitude and willingness to live are what kept him strong. He inspired others to fight and never to give up, and taught them that life was worth living, even if there was pain and suffering in the process. Dan gave meaning and purpose to life and was always willing to help others. I am so thankful he was part of my life and that we were able to share our lives together. I will miss him so much.

Houy and I will never forget you, sweetheart, and all the things you did for us and for all the love you gave us. We miss you so much. We will always treasure the memories. I know you're waiting on the other side, and I look forward to the day we'll meet again.
