Good Housekeeping has given its seal of approval to nontraditional families. In 1988, the magazine introduced an advertising campaign that extolled so-called "traditional values." After the campaign was roundly denounced by activists and ignored by advertisers, *Good Housekeeping* commissioned a survey by the Roper Organization that revealed that Americans had begun to embrace a new, more inclusive vision of the family. The new survey found that while most Americans embraced so-called "family values," what they meant by that expression were "a set of values that promote togetherness and unity within the family, regardless of the structure of that family."

Good Housekeeping has responded to the findings of this study by including non-traditional families in their current advertising campaign. So what's missing from this picture? Families headed by lesbians and gay men and families that include lesbians and gay men and their partners. Please write or call *Good Housekeeping* and let them know that we are family, too, and that our relationships also deserve the *Good Housekeeping* seal of approval.

Turning to the funny pages, a nationally syndicated comic strip has let Americans know that the problems of lesbian and gay

teens are no laughing matter. The strip is called *For Better or For Worse* and currently features a gay teenager named Laurence.

Laurence comes out to his best friend Mike, talks about how he came to accept his homosexuality and even broaches the issue of how homosexuality has been dealt with in other cultures.

While a few newspapers have refused to run the gay storyline, most have carried it. But cartoonist Lynn Johnson has come under attack by right-wing bigots who have waged a phone and letter campaign against the strip. Because of the isolation and alienation many lesbian and gay teens face, they desperately need to see their experiences and concerns reflected in the media. After the March:

It's Time to Be Out

Jack Valinski, co-chair of Houston Gay/Lesbian Pride Week '93, took part in the March on Washington for Gay, Lesbian and Bi Equal Rights and Liberation and related activities two weeks ago. Below he discusses the importance and effectiveness of coming out as a way of changing society's attitudes toward gay and lesbian people.



How many are we? The answer differs. The surveys are few and far between. They differ and depend on how the answers are interpreted. Now we ask how many of us were in Washington on April 25. One million? Half a million? Three hundred thousand? The answer depends on whether we believe the Park Police, City Police of the District of Columbia or march organizers.

These numbers matter to us in how seriously we will be taken by the political establishment. Numbers have an effect on how we will go on from here in gaining

greater acceptance in America. Yet one would think that numbers should not matter in a country that believes in equality and justice for all.

We still fight the religious right, who call ours a "deviant" lifestyle. Numbers would help us in that fight.

But on a personal level, the numbers should have no meaning.

The power of one person can bring change. The masses of people at the March, seen from a distance, will not change perceptions of us as one person can.

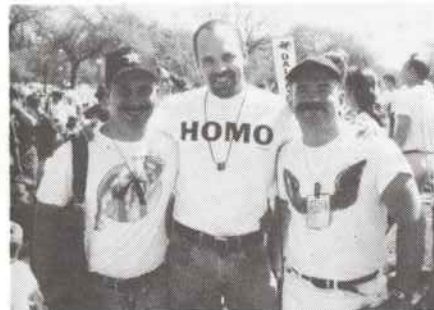
Sgt. Jose Zuniga is the Sixth Army's 1992 Soldier of the Year and was also a medic in the Persian Gulf war. At the March, he came out before the media and told the world that he was a proud gay soldier. What personal courage he had, knowing that nothing would be the same from that point. Yet he is the same person he has always been.

That personal confession may have changed the many people he has associated with over his career. These people may begin to reexamine their beliefs about gay and lesbian people because of the personal contact they have had with him. Their attitudes may have changed. Some, however, may never change.



Some people may think that Sgt. Zuniga is the exception, that other gay men are effeminate, predatory and not qualified for military service. These comparisons parallel the prejudice against blacks, Latinos and women who serve our country.

For too long, Americans have believed that all gay men wear leather or dresses, and that they should never be allowed to be Boy Scout leaders. But if one of those same Americans learns that a college friend has come out, or a co-worker has come out, or the woman who teaches in elementary school has come out, the barriers will fall.

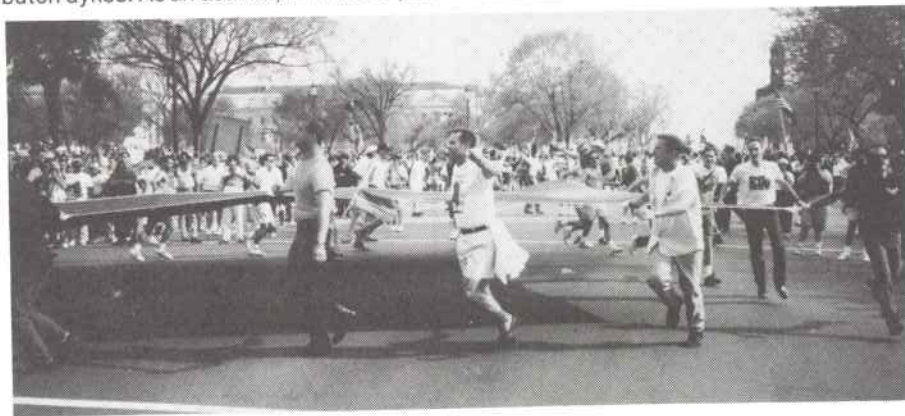

A small trickle begins to wear down the stone of prejudice.

Our world will begin to change when lesbians and gay men, with the power of one at a time, alter the straight world's perception of us. You can do what we as activists have not been able to do and will never be able to do. All the demonstrations, petitions, lobbying and press conferences won't change middle America's attitudes. It is the one-by-one that will change attitudes. As powerful an effect as coming out has on the person who does it, it is what it will do to our families' and friends' attitudes that will have a lasting effect.

By any count, the March was one of the biggest civil rights demonstrations in the history of America. It reflected both the numbers of us and the diverse spectrum of our community. There were the drag queens, the leather community and the butch dykes. As an activist, I will never put

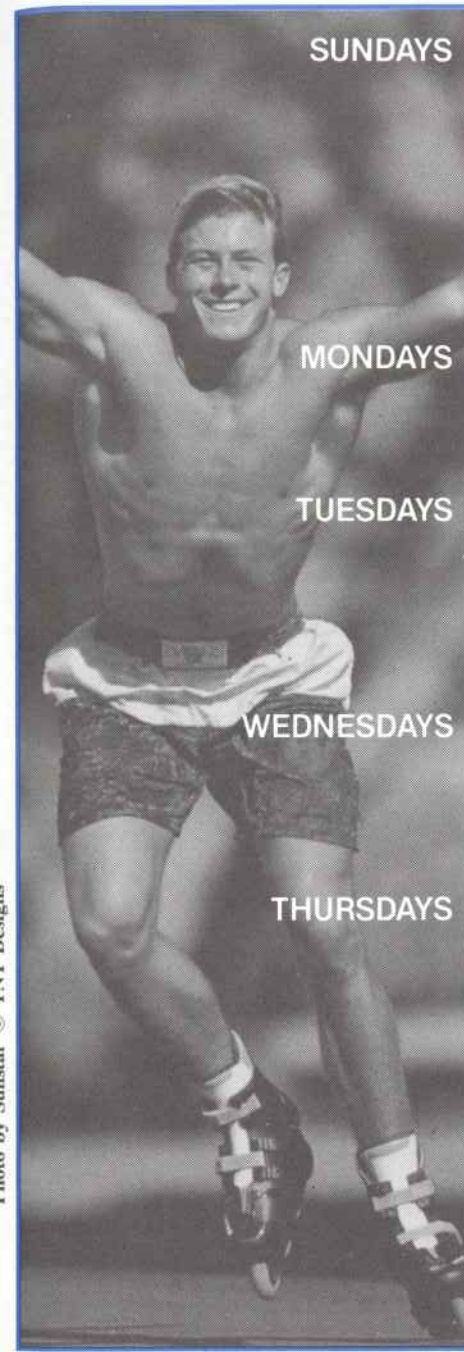

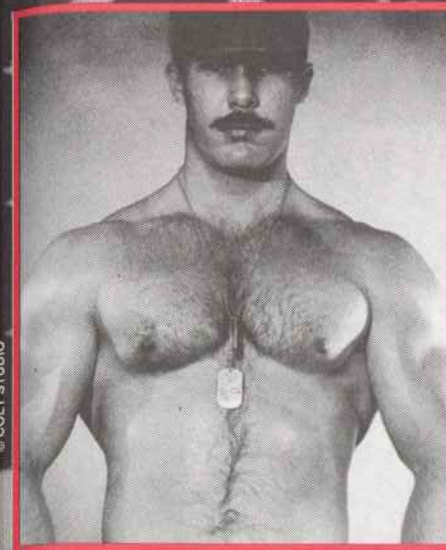
these people down because they are the ones who started this movement when everyone else, including me, was too afraid to say, "enough is enough." These people continue to work in our community to raise money year-round for our cause.

Role Model And
Spokesperson In The
Fight Against AIDS

Ever since the first Miss America pageant was held in Atlantic City over 60 years ago, the young woman who proudly wears the crown has been both a role model and spokesperson, championing important social and civic causes of the day. Reflecting the tremendous changes our society has undergone as the result of the AIDS pandemic, this year's Miss America, Leanza Cornett, has committed her life to increasing awareness of the disease through educational forums across the country.

Since becoming Miss America last September, Leanza has traveled over 20,000 miles each month presenting "AIDS Affects All," and distributing her own AIDS prevention guide, which is entitled "Choose to Be Safe." According to Cornett, "To date, much has been done in the areas of research and treatment. But attention to prevention is long overdue. Prevention is the only effective weapon to combat the spread of this disease."

While Cornett's primary focus this year has been on AIDS issues pertaining to women and teens, she realizes that, with more than 1.5 million Americans infected with HIV, the disease does not discriminate. "This is a deadly disease that favors no one," states the 21-year-old Jacksonville, Florida native. "All races and genders are at risk."

Prior to capturing the Miss America crown, Leanza was a volunteer for several AIDS organizations in central Florida. As Miss America, she has helped raise more than one million dollars for AIDS causes. She was recently named to the Board of Trustees for the Design Industries Foundation for AIDS [DIFFA], and is working closely with the American Red Cross HIV/AIDS Awareness Program, the American Foundation for AIDS Research [AmFAR] and the NAMES Project AIDS Memorial Quilt.

While the numbers are staggering, Leanza is convinced that preventive measures and compassionate support can be effective tools in dealing with the health crisis. In her speaking engagements across America, she will work to "replace fear with knowledge, despair with hope and helplessness with self-empowerment."

Ms. Cornett brings her message of hope to Dallas this weekend, participating in a press conference tomorrow, Saturday, at the White Rock Community Church at 4 p.m., and in a reception in her honor at the home of Mike Hutchison. She will also share in the morning worship services of the Church, which are being held this week at the historic Lakewood Theatre at 10 a.m. The reception is a benefit for the Dallas Metroplex chapter of the NAMES Project, and for the AIDS Ministry of the White Rock Community Church.

Leanza plans to continue AIDS service work even after her reign is over, brightening the future of people living with AIDS. "It is my dream to put a face on this disease in an effort to convince the public that AIDS affects all."

For those of you from my generation (I watched *Lost in Space* and *The Munsters* when they were still original broadcasts, if that gives you any clue!), you're bound to agree that one of the most difficult things about being and growing up gay was the absence of a parent in whom we could confide our "secret." A mother or father who accepted us just as we were. Someone who could tell us what color shirt to wear to impress the captain of the football team enough so that he'd forsake the drill team and ask us to the Homecoming Dance. Someone like Dad, one of the central characters in David Stevens' *The Sum of Us*, now in production at Moonstruck Theatre's Hickory Street Annex Theatre.

While I realize that the times they are a-changin', you must remember that Will Robinson and Eddie Munster no more thought about going to their fathers and telling about the gorgeous guy they had a date with than the man in the moon, so if I see this play as somewhat phantasmagorical, you'll understand why. But that is the basis of the story—the incredibly

warm relationship between a widowed father and his gorgeous, bright and gay son, Jeff. Not only does Dad accept Jeff's homosexuality, he virtually promotes it, even going so far as to buy some safe-sex erotic magazines for his son so that he'll be aroused and protected.

At 24 years of age, Jeff's nesting instincts are taking hold, and the focus of his life becomes the search for the perfect mate—a search he believes has ended when he meets the delectable Greg. They seem the perfect couple, but the night they hope to consummate their love turns sour when Greg discovers that he can't cope with the domestic side of life with father. In his words, home life with his family is what he runs from whenever he has a gay tryst. He doesn't equate a gay relationship with a "normal" family. So he does what any well-adjusted young gay man would do—he runs, leaving Jeff confused and crestfallen.

Meanwhile, Dad begins a relationship with Joyce, a woman who, he hopes, can fill the void left when his wife died 15 years before. She, like Greg, seems the perfect mate, until Dad's open acceptance and promotion of Jeff's lifestyle drives her away, too. Joyce, like Greg, it seems, cannot fathom such unconditional love. But there is a happy ending... of sorts, and we are able, once again, to see Jeff's bright smile of happiness as he dreams of a life with Greg.

The acting in Moonstruck's production of *The Sum of Us* is good, natural. The actors seem comfortable in their roles, at ease with the characters and the audience. But of the four, the most powerful performance comes from Moonstruck newcomer Todd Terry, who plays Jeff. His portrayal of the lovestruck and lovesick young man is first-rate. He captures all the emotions and all the feeling of the rollercoaster ride of love and relationships and creates a character so three-dimensional that the requisite tears we shed over love stories flow naturally, honestly and unashamedly. And he speaks for all of us when he tells his father, "I don't want to live in a world that begins and ends with being gay. I like having other people in my life... I don't want to be limited by other people's ideas of what I am." Jeff is, truly, the gay everyman.

We had heard through the grapevine that Mr. Terry is not gay. Don't get me wrong, I'm not one of those who intend to

practice the same type of stereotyping prejudice used by Hollywood that dictates that a gay man can't play a straight man. The point becomes important only because it illustrates just how good an actor Todd is. He was able to overcome prejudice and portray a gay man. When Greg leaves, his pain is the same that any gay man would feel—the same that any man would feel over a lost love. What a novel idea.

And just maybe that's the point. That feelings are not gay or straight. They're just feelings, and we all have them.

Now I realize that there are just a few of you—all right, us—who factor in the number of body shots in a play or movie before deciding whether or not it's worth seeing. For the record, Mr. Terry dons a towel in the first scene. He's a great actor....

TEXANS JOIN OTHER AMERICANS FOR MASSIVE SHOW OF STRENGTH IN NATION'S CAPITAL

*Marchers Take Away Sense of
Empowerment, Unity from
1993 March on Washington.*

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Texans joined with massive numbers of other Americans in the nation's capital on April 25 for the 1993 March on Washington for Lesbian, Gay and Bi Equal Rights and Liberation. The historic event was staged to demand full recognition of equal rights for gay and lesbian Americans, and it served to demonstrate the unity and strength of the community.

Hundreds of thousands of marchers

made their way in contingents to the rally area on the Mall, where speakers addressed the crowd. Marchers were grouped by state or by affinity group, representing the diversity of the community. There were units representing street activists, transgender and drag, people of color, religious groups and others. There were so many marching units that it took hours for them all to reach the rally area.

Speakers at the post-March rally ran the gamut from supportive mainstream politicians including Rep. Pat Schroeder of Colorado and New York Mayor David Dinkins, civil rights leaders like the Rev. Jesse Jackson, show business figures like Cybill Shepherd and openly gay politicians including Congressmen Barney Frank and Gerry Studds of Massachusetts.

There was some disappointment that President Bill Clinton had decided not to address the marchers, instead sending a letter of support that was read to the crowd by Rep. Nancy Pelosi of California. But most participants appeared to believe that the President remains open to gay concerns.

How many people actually took part in the March? The National Park Service estimated that the event drew 300,000, while March organizers stuck to their claim of one million, which was backed up by the city's police department. In any case, the disagreement over numbers did nothing to dampen the spirits of participants, convinced that it was their day to impress

the nation's leaders and the rest of the country with the strength and determination of the national gay and lesbian rights movement.

A long schedule of events covering the spectrum of gay, lesbian, AIDS and other issues was held several days prior to and after the March itself. The Human Rights Campaign Fund and the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force sponsored Lobby Days on Thursday, Friday, Monday and Tuesday, providing training and the opportunity for concerned citizens to express their opinions directly to their elected officials.

On Friday, over 2,000 members of ACT-UP staged a peaceful but spirited demonstration in front of offices of the Pharmaceutical Manufacturers' Association to condemn profiteering by drug companies at the expense of people with AIDS.

Saturday, "The Wedding" brought together 5,000 gay and lesbian couples in a ceremony of union and commitment conducted by the Rev. Troy Perry and other clergy. The ritual was staged outside offices of the Internal Revenue Service to symbolize the call for government recognition of same-sex unions.

An event of special interest to Texans was held on the eve of the March, when over 1,000 people partied at the Texas Two-Step, a country and western party featuring barbecue, dancing, entertainment and speakers.

The fund-raiser was held at Tracks, a popular dance club in the South East area of Washington, from 6-10 p.m. One thousand pre-printed tickets sold out, and others were purchased at the door, bringing the total attendance to approximately 1,500.

On hand for the event were Suzy Wagers, Development Director of the Texas Human Rights Foundation; Nancy Molleda, President of the board of trustees of the Texas Human Rights Foundation; Laurie Eiserloh, Executive Director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby; and honorary hosts state Rep. Glen Maxey of Austin and Dallas City Council member Chris Luna.

The Two-Step raised over \$15,000, which will be divided among the Texas Human Rights Foundation, the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas and the National March on Washington.

KRUEGER, HUTCHISON IN RUNOFF FOR TEXAS SENATE SEAT

*Gay-Endorsed Candidates Win
Or Make It into Runoffs
In Some Local Races.*

TEXAS — While the campaigning and the race to fill the seat vacated by Lloyd Bentsen when he was appointed Secretary of the Treasury did not match the glamour—not the mudslinging—of last year's Presidential race, there was sufficient animosity between the front-runners in most campaigns to ensure at least some level of acrimony and to reassure voters that, at least in the short term, issues will not be the deciding factor in most elections.

On the state level, the Senate race—possibly the bitterest and most hotly contested contest in Texas—was destined for a runoff from the start, both because of the crowded field of 24 candidates and because of the traditional party lines most of the state's electorate follows.

Republican Kay Bailey Hutchison's well-orchestrated and well-financed campaign landed her in a runoff election with interim Sen. Bob Krueger, who was endorsed by several gay and lesbian organizations throughout the state. While Hutchison's record on gay and lesbian issues has not been documented, her election to the Senate could have a negative impact on President Bill Clinton's efforts to lift the ban on gay men and lesbians in the military.

While Krueger has publicly expressed support for the gay community, he has also been seen by many community leaders as not very strong on some gay issues, and was slow in seeking and receiving sup-



port from gay groups. One of his Democratic opponents, Jose Angel Gutierrez, attracted a degree of support in the community, and was endorsed by the Austin Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus and the Dallas Gay Political Caucus, while Krueger received the support of the Political Action Committee of the Lesbian/Gay Political Coalition of Dallas [LG-PAC], the Lesbian/Gay Democrats of Texas and the Eleanor Roosevelt/Harvey Milk Democratic Club of Houston.

One positive outcome for gay Texans of last Saturday's polling was the defeat of Joe Barton, the Republican candidate who aired homophobic television and radio commercials.

In local races, the Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus received a 50% return on its endorsement investment, realizing a win in the City Council Place 1 race as Max Nofziger pulled 67% of the vote; a runoff election in the City Council Place 3 race between ALGPC-endorsed candidate Jackie Goodman and Mark Tschurr; and a loss in the City Council Place 4 race, in which Bob Larson and Brigid Shea will square off, leaving Caucus-supported candidate Ginny Ballard a distant third.

Dallas voters were faced with a wider array of races and candidates, but incumbency, name recognition and definitive stands on the issues seemed to be the deciding factors in most races. Other issues—including Proposition 1, in which voters were asked whether they supported the 14 district/one representative City Council plan, and Proposition 2, dealing with an increase in Council salaries—also seemed to galvanize voter interest in some districts. Proposition 1 passed, while City Council pay will not be increased.

In District 1, DGPC-endorsed City Council incumbent Domingo Garcia was unopposed for reelection. District 2 incumbent Chris Luna, a longtime ally and friend of the gay and lesbian community in Dallas, ran on his record of code enforcement to garner 74% of the vote, defeating Jack Borden. Luna had the support of both DGPC and LG-PAC.

The District 3 race, which included openly gay businessman Mike Hutchison, saw Bob Stimson take the council seat with 55% of the vote, despite a crowded field of candidates. Hutchison was supported by both DGPC and LG-PAC. Larry Duncan, the incumbent in the District 4 race, defeated LG-PAC-endorsed candidate Fred Blair with 65% of the vote.

District 8 voters will return to the booths on May 29 for a runoff between Sandra Crenshaw and Darren Reagan, neither of whom was endorsed by either of the two gay endorsing groups. Glenn Box returns to his District 9 seat, much to the dismay of gay and lesbian voters, easily defeating Roger Kallenberg, who had won the support of both DGPC and LG-PAC.

The District 14 race, which includes the Oak Lawn and East Dallas sections of the city, drew the greatest attention from members of the gay and lesbian community. With two openly gay candidates in the race, it was seen as a watershed campaign, one in which gay organizations would have to choose between "community" loyalty and the issues. Craig McDaniel and Ed Oakley, the two gay candidates, each received the support of gay political groups (McDaniel from LG-PAC and Oakley from the political arm of the Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance), but divisiveness between the two organizations was seen by some community leaders as a contributing factor in splitting the vote between Oakley and a third candidate, Sharon Boyd, forcing Boyd and McDaniel into a runoff.

In all, candidates endorsed by local gay and lesbian organizations fared poorly in the Dallas city elections, with only two of the eight endorsed candidates (Luna and Domingo) winning outright and one (McDaniel) now facing a second round of campaigning.

HOUSTON HEARING TO TAKE INPUT ON HIV SERVICES IN HARRIS COUNTY

*Forum Sponsored by Lawmakers
Set for Saturday, May 15.*

HOUSTON — A hearing sponsored by state and federal lawmakers has been scheduled to take public input on HIV issues in Houston and Harris County. The hearing, to be held next Saturday, May 15, will focus on the problems facing HIV planners, government grant offices, HIV service providers and other agencies involved in local HIV service and education.

Organizers said they expect issues specific to Harris County to form a major part of the day's testimony, but issues that

have both a local impact and broader significance—like state HIV reporting rules and the adequacy of the current federal Ryan White Care Act—may also be a part of testimony.

The forum, sponsored by Rep. Craig A. Washington, state Sen. Rodney Ellis and state Rep. Garnet Coleman, will be held next Saturday, May 15 from 9 a.m.-noon at the Metropolitan Multi-Service Center, 1475 West Gray. The hearing will be moderated by the Rev. Chris Steele, who served as chair of the Texas Legislative Task Force on AIDS in 1989.

The forum is open to all interested persons, organizations and governmental agencies who have suggestions or constructive criticism aimed at improving HIV planning and implementation. All testimony will be categorized by issue and area of government responsibility. A compilation of testimony will be forwarded to the appropriate agencies, and a condensed summary of the hearings will be made available to the public.

Oral testimony will be limited to five minutes. Written testimony is also welcome and will be limited to five single-spaced pages. Speakers must register to speak. Forms will be available at the hearing for those wishing to speak.

Representatives from the federal Human Resource Services Administration, the State Health Department, the County Health Department and the City Health have been invited to testify or be present as observers and resource persons as needed.

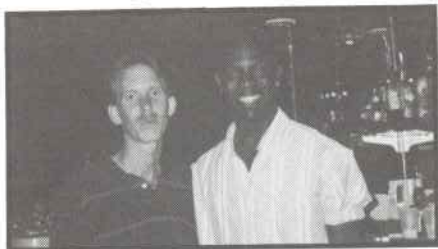

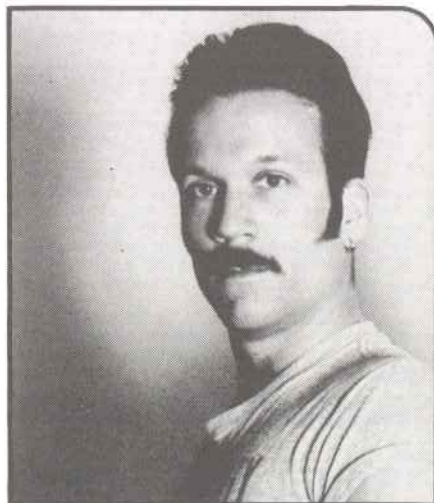
Tim was born and raised in Georgia. After moving to Texas he was involved in the building and lumber business.

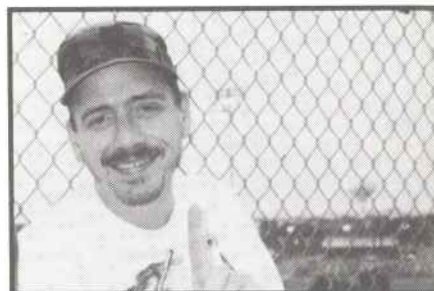
