# MANY KINDS OF POWER

### The 6th Annual Texas Lesbian conference

The powerful, erotic sound of persistent, steady drumming—the drumming of women—followed Houstonian Suzanne Anderson's words—"Let the Texas Lesbian Conference of 1993 begin!"

The Women's Action Coalition Drum Corps entered the hall in full force, led by a woman bearing the organization's flag. It was a dramatic beginning to a weekend of empowerment for over 400 lesbians from all over Texas.

#### MANY KINDS OF POWER— LESBIAN CLOUT

The first meeting of the conference began with the tradition of passing a mike around the room so that anyone who chose could introduce themselves. It was very validating for lesbians to hear and see for themselves that we are everywhere, in all walks of life. It was a fitting prelude to the night's theme—"Lesbian Clout."

When the mike came to the front of the room to Phyllis Lyon and then Del Martin, the featured speakers, the crowd of women present stood almost as one for a rousing standing ovation. Even before their introduction, we knew—these were women who were pioneers in lesbian liberation, and they deserved our deepest gratitude for the path they had laid for us.

As they spoke, Phyllis and Del recounted the founding of The Daughters of Bilitis, the first lesbian-feminist organization in the United States. They recalled the early efforts of lesbians, beginning in the 1950s, to organize and make a difference in a society that would have preferred to believe that they did not exist.

Carrying us into the present, Phyllis Lyon encouraged us today to step up our phone calls and letters to President Clinton, General Powell, Defense Secretary Aspin and others—to support the Human Rights Campaign Fund's effort to end the military ban on lesbian and gay people.

After sharing stories of how they had come to earn the respect of many previous opponents in San Francisco, they closed with a statement that reflected the power

of lesbian gentleness and kindness: "To know us is to love us. We need to give more people that chance." I had never been challenged to come out in such a gentle yet convincing manner.

THE POWER OF LANGUAGE

Saturday morning began with Akasha (Gloria) Hull reminding us of the power of Audre Lord's life and words. (A speech by Lord, made shortly before her death from cancer, had inspired the theme for this year's conference, "Many Kinds of Power.")

Akasha knew Audre Lord both personally and as a literary peer. She recalled to us Audre Lord's words, "Your silence will not protect you." Through Audre's "transformation of silence into language," she made "space for a lesbian, and especially a black lesbian existence."

As a result of her struggle with cancer, Audre Lord came to "scrutinize her life with a harsh and urgent clarity." Akasha challenged us as lesbians to also live our lives as Audre did—to "live each day of our life like it is our life—not a life that is going to be." Audre and Akasha shared with us the power of their language.

**EROTIC POWER** 

The erotic power of lesbians is the one power we have that society has tried so hard to suppress in us. Many of us are grateful to Susie Bright, an ardent advocate of women's sexuality, for her efforts at encouraging us to reclaim that power.

At a noon luncheon on Saturday, Susie admonished those present to "accept no sexual limits from society—only from

our own boundaries."

Susie is a pioneer in her own right—a pioneer in erotic thought and practice. About sexuality, Susie said, "If you're doing it, it belongs to you." Susie gave us inspiration to claim and protect our erotic power as lesbians.

THE POWER OF INFORMATION

Saturday and Sunday at the conference offered many options for us to become empowered with knowledge about a variety of topics. "The workshops were incredible," said Jeanne Rubin of Dallas.

Out of the five seminars I attended, there was not one with sparse attendance or lack of interest. From the entertaining and discussion-provoking "What Are Your Intentions?" given by a Houston-area women's group to the highly informative "Lesbian Legal Reality and the Texas Legislative Agenda" presented by Alice Kleberg Reynolds and Martha Fitzwater of Austin, every workshop proved to be empowering with many kinds of knowledge.

THE POWER OF HUMOR

After a Saturday full of intensity with workshops and speakers, we were refreshed with the power of the laughter afforded by Nancy Ford and Marianne Pendino, and the power of music and humor brought to us by The Therapy Sisters and Girls in the Nose. Denice Franke had lightened our evening with music the night before.

At the dance deejayed by Cherry Wolf, many faces appeared that I had not seen at the conference, further adding to the power of our numbers. For a time, we enjoyed the power of humor and of play.

THE POWER OF UNITY

"I think it [the conference] helped me in further accepting women for who they are...in not judging women the way that I used to, which was a homophobic way," said Scotty of Houston, who attended all three days of the conference. Akasha Hull's "Do not fear multiplicity" had also challenged us to drop the barriers that often divide us, even within our own community. Several speakers and workshop leaders throughout the conference referred to recognizing differences, including those groups we had so readily excluded in the past, like bisexuals, the S&M community, transsexuals, transvestites and others, and uniting for our common survival.

"I think there is some validation in numbers," Scotty added. "It does give us a face, and that's really necessary."

Nearly all women at the conference whom I spoke with commented on the empowerment they derived simply from being surrounded by the positive energy of over 400 lesbian women in a common space—talking, listening, learning, creating and laughing together.

SPIRITUAL POWER

"The speaker that really did it for me was today's speaker." Scotty spoke of Nance-Lee Jose, Director of Discipleship at the Cathedral of Hope Metropolitan Community Church in Dallas. Dr. Jose was the closing speaker for the conference at Sunday's luncheon. "She was empowered in a planned way." Scotty continued. "She had the power to convey that energy to us. She almost reminded me of an evangelist-that kind of charismatic leadership... We need leaders and she does have the right message...She gave us specific solutions. She didn't just give us problems and leave us floundering out there...She gave us direction."

Dr. Jose had given us a spirited call to become more aware of the very real threat from what she called the "Christo-fascists" who advocate hate and even our destruction in the name of "doing God's will."

NanceLee read a very disturbing letter that sent shock waves of reality across the crowd. As we listened to it, we realized—in the name of God, they are organizing to destroy us.

In the name of the Goddess, NanceLee Jose inspired us to unite and draw from our own spiritual resources. She encouraged us to lay aside the things that divide us and to unite our spiritual power, our economic power, our numbers, our visibility, to meet this destructive force with many kinds of power—with lesbian clout.

Dr. Jose reminded us that the power of hate is a self-destructive power that eats away at those who use it. Though it will not survive, it is a very real danger at present. NanceLee closed by urging all those lesbians present "to live a difference in occupied territory." The spiritual power we all experienced that afternoon both drained us and yet gave us the impetus we needed to reluctantly leave our safe space and go out and begin living that difference in our respective occupied territories.

We have left our haven of safety and empowerment in Houston now, but we'll be back for TLC '94 in San Antonio, with all our many kinds of power, stronger and in even greater numbers!

Sliver is one of those films. You know, the ones which arrive amidst an avalanche of hype proclaiming the film's cutting-edge status in expanding the limits of depictions of sexuality and/or violence. Sometimes the hype, for better or worse, is justified, as in The Bad Lieutenant or The Cook, the Thief, His Wife and Her Lover. But more typically, the film turns out to be a rather conventional Hollywood-by-thenumbers movie. Sliver belongs squarely in the latter category.

Sliver, purportedly a "sexual thriller," is neither very sexy nor very thrilling. The ti-

tle refers to the Sliver apartment building, a luxury highrise on the east side of Manhattan. As the film begins, an attractive blonde woman is thrown to her death from her balcony on an upper floor of the building. Why? Good question.

Enter Carly (Sharon Stone), a book editor and, not incidentally, an attractive blonde. Carly moves into the Sliver building-in fact, into the very apartment from which the earlier blonde had been thrown. She is looking to start afresh, she declares, having been through some sort of vague romantic misfortune. So, of course, in true Hollywood fashion, she instantly becomes involved with, not one, but two men.

One of them, Jack (Tom Berenger), with whom Carly's boss tries to set her up, is a macho true-crime writer to whom Carly takes an immediate dislike. But she discovers that he also lives (surprise!) in the Sliver, making him difficult to avoid. We in the audience are already aware that Jack

is one of her neighbors, having seen him lurking about menacingly while eavesdropping on a conversation with another tenant (Keene Curtis) about the mysterious death of the previous occupant of Carly's apartment. Jack begins to overcome her initial reservations and she begins to respond to his interest.

However, Carly is also pursued by Zeke (William Baldwin), an attractive younger man who lives, ominously (and obviously). on the 13th floor. Carly's fear of being hurt again in love doesn't stop her from a lengthy session of athletic, back-arching sex with Zeke following their first date, a trip to the gym. She develops an overwhelming obsession with Zeke, which doesn't sit well with Jack. And to complicate her life even more, Zeke has a few secrets of his own, which are conveniently revealed every time she begins to become teary-eyed at the thought of loving again.

In addition to all this, there are video






1430 NORTH MAIN SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS (210)225-7330 cameras in every room of each apartment in the Sliver, unbeknownst to the tenants, allowing them to be monitored in the ultimate voyeuristic trip. When Carly finds out about this, she is at first appalled, but quickly (a little too quickly) becomes addicted to watching the dramas that unfold. The premise is intriguing, balancing our natural curiosity about the private lives of others against our own desire for privacy, and when Sliver examines this idea, it is at its most interesting. In one scene, Carly finds herself sharing an elevator with a young girl and her stepfather, whom Carly knows to have been molesting the girl. This could have been the basis for a stimulating film, but it is given short shrift amidst the conventional sex scenes and cliched murder plots.

In fact, it is this lack of focus, more than the stories themselves, that finally makes Sliver so uninteresting. Just when the killer seems to be getting close, and some tension builds, we get a long sequence of lovemaking. But before we can be drawn into the romantic conflict, we are confronted with the video monitors. What is this film about? I don't think even the filmmakers have a clue. For instance, Keene Curtis' character is killed off early in the film for no apparent reason. His death doesn't even have any surprise value, since he is so obviously an expendable character. Several other fine actors are wasted in shallow roles, including Martin Landau and Polly Walker (Enchanted

Even the lead characters have no depth. Baldwin, so good recently in Three of Hearts, is all surface here. With no dimension to play, he becomes merely an attractive vacancy, a plot device. Berenger fares a little better as Jack, who at least is given characteristics if not an actual character. Still, we never know, or care to know, much of anything about him. Given very little to work with, Stone is surprisingly effective as Carly. Even when called upon to perform such ludicrous maneuvers as exposing her underclothing in a restaurant, she makes it seem at least halfway plausible. Without equal support from writer Joe Eszterhas or director Phillip Noyce, however, Stone is left stranded, a living creature among stick figures.

With all due respect to Messrs. Branagh and Shakespeare, this is the summer film which should have been entitled Much Ado About Nothing.


# **World War II Tales** Part I

BY PHIL JOHNSON DALLAS GAY AND LESBIAN HISTORIC ARCHIVES

I'm not sure why the few women in Headguarters and Headquarters Company just happened to be lesbians, other than the fact that they were damn good soldiers. Of course, the G.I. Joes speculated (fantasized) that two out of every five WACs were "that way" and in need of a good man to change them. Some insisted the number was much higher. All I know is that of the five WACs who worked with me in the TWX section from time to time, all were lesbians. And none were eager to

The gay men were easier to explain: In those days, sexual divisions of labor were a helluva lot more pronounced than today. Men dictated; women typed, took shorthand and filed. Gay men, those of us beyond that phony "men just don't do that was no wonder that ours was an all-gay privileged positions, referred to us as "Titless WACs."

Oh yes, we were privileged. While the Mighty Men of the Infantry fell out at daybreak with bayonets affixed to their M1 rifles on their shoulders and with heavy packs on their backs, the men of Hq & Hq slept late, then strolled from their unique barracks-the one with curtains on the windows-with a sharpened #2 pencil behind their ears. As a permanent cadre of

At the mess hall, long lines of grunts dutifully parted to allow Titless WACs to go to the head of the line. As we did so, we heard groans of resentment. This was understandable. After all, these men had had to double time it to the mess hall so they could stand patiently in long lines. In Army jargon that's called "hurry up and wait."

Equally understandable is the fact that the office workers had only an hour for lunch—and God help the poor G.I. who incurred hard-ass Lt. Donaldson's wrath by being late. When the work was so heavy there wasn't time for chow, we privileged soldiers sometimes went without. But of Hard-Ass usually arranged for "a little something" to be sent in for his dedicated Titless WACs.

I should remember what "TWX" stood for, but almost half a century has dimmed my memory. I do remember vividly that we were a small section consisting of six soldiers. But what a musical ensemble we were! Six, count 'em, six first ladies of Grand Opera! We were also fast and efficient workers, so much so that when we were ahead of the work, those busting their butts in adjoining offices would hear in not-so-perfect two-part harmony, We're the reluctant fairies. Heigh Ho.

quite so.

The very reluctant fairies. Oh, very, very don't you know.

They call us the timid fairies. What rot. We're not.

We're just too gay we'd rather play. We know we shan't get hurt that way. Here we go gathering nuts in May. Oops, we're reluctant!

That takeoff on a popular Walt Disney song finished, six Jeanette MacDonalds would assault "San Francisco, Open Your Golden Gate...," complete with outrage-ous falsettos obbligatos.

In no time at all, some of the workers from the other sections would hurry into ours to hear Private Patterson do Mary Martin singing "My Heart Belongs to Daddy" or "Kiss the Boys Goodbye." In time, we'd have 10 or 12 Andrews Sisters swinging "The Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy of Company B." On some occasions, everyone would move back to make room for the prima ballerina of the companylittle ol' me-to dance Pavlova's "The Crippled Dying Swan."

Eventually, almost all of Headquarters Company would be jammed into our office to join in the grande finale ultimo. We were a platoon of Judy Garlands, all singing a pulsating "Somewhere Over the Rainbow."

Once, perhaps in the middle of "The Join Is Really Jumping Down at Carnegie Hall," someone yelled "Attention!" In stormed of 'Hard-Ass, Beautiful (?) music abruptly stopped in mid-measure and the whole company stood rigid, just waiting to get our collective asses chewed. His brow furrowed, his eyes stern, his face threatening, he glared...and then, "Haven't you men any work to do?" With that, he turned sharply and left. But did I catch an ever-soslight twinkle in his eye? In his office next door, hadn't he secretly enjoyed the highclass concert for some time before bringing it to a screeching halt?

Now, does anyone want to tell me that Donaldson, indeed all of Fort Ord, didn't know that Headquarters Company was allgay? Then why weren't we kicked out of the Army with dishonorable discharges. Three reasons: One, we camped inside the building, and only inside the building. Outside, we "butched up."

Two, we never propositioned straight soldiers. Not unless we knew damn well that our advances would be welcomed. (In reality, it was the horny soldiers who sought to be propositioned.) For two soldiers, whether gay or straight, to be caught in mutually consenting sex meant an automatic dishonorable discharge, disgrace, loss of mustering-out pay, loss of Army insurance and often imprisonment. And we well knew it.

Three, and most importantly, Army brass, despite their denials, love closeted gays. Especially in war time. We make damn good soldiers and they damn well know it. (In World War II, gay men and women, for the most part, ran Fort Ord.) The Army just wants to maintain a butch image, even if that so-called butch image is a bunch of crap. After all, not all of us were in Headquarters Company. We were in the Infantry, too. And the Medical Corps. And the Military Police. And we were Drill Instructors. And yes, we were officers! Then, as now, we were everywhere.

As for ol' Hard-Ass, he dearly loved his staff. Otherwise, why would desserts and other goodies left over from the officers' parties often find their way to Headquarters Company? Especially to the talented singers, the Reluctant Fairies of TWX?





# Keith Meinhold and Tracy Thorne Discuss

# **GAYS AND THE MILITARY**

### Interviews with Bob Dineen

Memorial Day 1993 is a particularly poignant one for those gay and lesbian veterans—as well as those gay men and lesbians still in active service—who are challenging the government's 50-year ban on their service in the armed forces of the United States. At stake are the very concepts of equality and non-discrimination—two fundamental beliefs upon which this country was founded over 215 years ago.

Memorial Day honors all those soldiers—from the Revolutionary War through the Persian Gulf war—who gave their lives fighting for those very principles. How ironic that so many of the soldiers who gave their lives must go unrecognized because they were

not, by government decree, as free as their fellow soldiers.

TwT thought it would be appropriate, on this holiday weekend, to provide our readers with the personal perceptions and stories of two individuals who are waging an internal battle against the ban, Lt. Tracy Thorne and Petty Officer Keith Meinhold. The two men were in Dallas recently, Joining David Mixner and the Rev. Troy Perry in an MCC-sponsored seminar on the gay rights agenda. They agreed to speak with the media about their own personal experiences in dealing with the ban, how they've coped with their national coming out and what lies ahead for them.

Tracy Thorne: David [Mixner] talked about dreams this morning. I want to talk about them a little bit, too—and what inspires them. For some of us, it may be our parents—we want to grow up and be just like Mom and Dad....For me, it was a book, a book called Flight of the Intruder.

About six years ago, on a fine summer day at Vanderbilt University, I opened that book—a book about Vietnam naval aviators...in northern Vietnam. And the moment I read the first pages of that book, I knew that I had found my future. That was what I wanted to do, and the very next morning, I was sitting in front of a U.S. Navy recruiter asking how I could pursue that new dream....

But while all those dreams were coming true, I also realized something else. I realized something that wasn't supposed to be a part of any all-American kid's dream. I realized that I was gay. From the moment I made that realization, I knew that I had a choice. I had a choice to lie, or a choice to tell the truth. And I chose to tell the

truth, and that is what this is all about—about ending discrimination and telling the truth. Because I told the truth, the very next day, my name was wiped off the side of the jet that I once flew, and because I told the truth, I was shortly thereafter removed from my squadron and placed in a desk job where, ten months later, I continue to do superfluous duties, now ranging everywhere from planning a chili cookoff for an admiral to working a Xerox machine. Because I told the truth, I am now fighting the very country whose institutions I sought to protect and serve.

I really don't know how to say how disappointed I am that my country is fighting us...is fighting our civil rights. Our freedoms are being taken away from us, and it's not right. Because in America we grow up knowing that our dreams can come true—that the doors in this country are all open to us, so long as we're willing to work, and work hard. And America is the land of opportunity, and I will never stop fighting this battle.... Because in America,

so long as you are willing to stand up for what is right, your dreams can always come true.

Keith Meinhold: I am, in fact, a gay man. Those were the fateful words that started my discharge process. I joined the Navy when I was 17 years old.... I spent the first couple of years in the military peeling potatoes, washing airplanes-what everybody does when they first join the military. And I performed very well and was advanced through the structure as quickly as the Navy could legally advance you. They gave me more responsibilities than I was supposed to have for my rank, and I excelled and I continued to excel. Finally, after a couple of years in the military, I started coming to terms with my sexuality and who I was. It was a very difficult thing, because I also became aware of what the U.S. military does to gays and lesbians.

I'd grown to know a friend who I had flown with for almost two years. We became very close, and finally the pressure inside built up to where I had to tell somebody, and I had to tell somebody in the military that I worked with. And I told my best friend in the military. I told Shawn. I invited him over for dinner and said, "Look, Shawn, I'm gay." And his face turned white for a second, and then back to a more natural color, and he said, "Oh, thank God, so am I." And Shawn, who is actually subordinate to me, showed great leadership, and taught me to accept myself-he taught me to be very proud of who I am.

....I was a leader, I was a role model. I couldn't stand by. I was sworn to support and defend the Constitution of the United States, which says, "all men are created equal."

And so, on May 19, 1992, I said, "I am, in fact, a gay man." Within a half hour of making that statement, the U.S. Navy called me and told me I was no longer on the flight schedule for the next day. I don't think they get airplanes off the ground that fast, but it's amazing how fast they react to something like this.

The Navy discharged me—I was out of the Navy for three months. During that discharge process, which lasted two days, five minutes was the prosecution where they just played the tape, where I made that statement which I will continue to make—"I am, in fact, a gay man." I would never have had to say that if the military

didn't persecute gay and lesbian servicemembers and if they didn't encourage gay and lesbian servicemembers to live in the closet and deny who they are, who their humanity is, and force them to lie. If they didn't encourage people to attack, not only gay and lesbian servicemembers, but gay and lesbian civilians. I think that all I ever wanted to do was be who I was. It couldn't happen.

i filed a suit in Federal court, and [was] reinstated into the service. Initially, the service resisted, stating that the judge didn't have that kind of authority. Well, apparently he did. I've been back since November 12....And, every day when I put on the uniform, I'm prouder to put it on every day, to go back to work with the service-members that I worked with before I was discharged, and have continued to work

with since I was discharged ....

Recently, the Pentagon has been circulating a memorandum trying to say that my co-workers have been unable to do their job. That is not true. And I can tell you that some of my co-workers were upset with me when I started talking about what they do when they go to the Philippines-my heterosexual co-workers-what they do when they go to the Philippines or other ports...I'm sure everybody knows what the Navy reputation is and, of course, they've also heard of Tailhook-and they don't like for me to describe that the slightest bit. And I don't do that anymore. And I'm hoping that people like Sam Nunn will get the message, because otherwise, I'm going to have to start describing his private life.

I will no longer, as a gay man, allow somebody else to describe what it's like to be a gay man unless they are a gay man. I don't think black Americans would allow the Ku Klux Klan to describe what it's like to be black any more than we should allow Sam Nunn to describe what it's like to be gay...We have drawn a line in the sand and they have crossed it.

I don't know if everybody's aware...that we are in the process of a new civil rights movement—a civil rights movement where we will define who we are, where we will be able to tell the truth. Soon there will be hearings...We've looked at who is going to be testifying, and although some of those people are on our side, I don't see any gays and lesbians on that panel....

When I look back to Stonewall, and I look back to what Leonard Matlovich and

Joe Steffan have done, I cannot help but be proud to stand on the shoulders of such brave Americans. I hope that myself and others will be able to live up to the standards of those brave Americans so many years ago who have been able to set the model for us to continue doing what we're doing.

How does it feel to be shouldering so much of the role of activist in this battle?

Thorne: I just feel like I'm doing my job. I took an oath as a naval officer to defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies both foreign and domestic. I'm supposed to defend the Constitution, which...demands that all people are created equal. "We the people." This is the right thing to do, and I could no longer continue to stand by and watch this blatant discrimination—and that's what this is, make no mistake about it. This is discrimination, and I will continue to fight it.

I hate wearing my sexuality on my shoulder. I want to go back to the job that I was trained to do by the taxpayers-at enormous expense, I might add. I hate having to wear my sexuality on my shoulder because that is a part of us that we should not have to drag out into the public light. I want so much to go back to being Lt. Tracy Thorne, navy flight officer, as opposed to Tracy Thorne, the gay bomber. I am so tired of having to fight this battle, but as long as America condemns us for stereotypes and misconceptions, we have to stand up and say, "Look at us! We're your sons and daughters. We're your next door neighbor; we're your firemen, your policemen, your doctors and your lawyers, and you've known us for so long but you've never noticed us at all. We've got to stand up and let America know who we are, because until we do, how can we expect them to stand up for us if we won't stand up for ourselves?

Meinhold: I have to agree with everything that Lt. Thorne said. But I think this pales in comparison with what you're asking those members of the military who put their lives on the line for their country. And I'm doing just that—putting my life on the line and dragging my private life out for my country to see. And I will continue to do that until we—gays and lesbians, heterosexuals, blacks, whites, whatever—can just be Americans.

What about the argument that straight soldiers are concerned about having to

shower with gay soldiers?

Meinhold: It's so funny, I've been in the military for almost 13 years now, and I've been showering with men for longer than 13 years. It's no big deal to me. I think that it's a totally ludicrous argument. Right now the military says, "Well, we would have to have separate showers and separate private facilities." If you look at civilian society-nowhere in the civilian society do we separate gays and lesbians from their heterosexual counterparts in private facilities. But if we look back to 1947, when the services were integrated with African-Americans, civilian society did separate African-Americans from the private facilities, and yet the services were still able to integrate with no problems. There are always going to be some problems no matter what the military does, but this will be a lot easier, I think, than what it took to integrate African-Americans because society has progressed ahead of the military.

Thorne: My sexuality has never, ever interfered with my job in the U.S. Navy. It is not an issue, nor should it be. Anybody who drags their sexuality—misconduct in the workplace-should be axed out in a heartbeat. But misconduct does not necessarily mean that you are a heterosexual or a homosexual. There are good gays and there are bad gays, there are good straights and there are bad straights, and those who cannot control their conduct don't have any place in the armed forces. I think we've seen that there are a lot of heterosexuals that have problems with controlling their conduct, and that needs to be addressed by the system.

[In an interview this week, Keith Meinhold advised TWT of the current status of Tracy Thorne's battle with the military, his post-reinstatement life and his feelings about the "don't ask, don't tell" compromise proposal currently being considered by some lawmakers.]

What do you hear about Tracy Thorne what's his current status?

Well, I know he's been discharged, but that's about all I know. Tracy and I have never kept in contact; we don't see each other that often.

Your opinions on the "Don't ask, don't tell" proposal and Rep. Barney Frank's support of it?

From the perspective of a gay man, I'm insulted. It's amazing that we, or anybody that's gay, could compromise our moral

high ground or our civil rights under any circumstances. I mean, we're not fighting this to compromise ourselves. But, I think. more importantly, and part of the reason I said this is because, being a professional in the military, I have to go back to that, and from a military perspective, any compromise would be inefficient and require an awful lot of cleaning up. I just think that. from a practical viewpoint, trying to work out some sort of compromise is terribly unworkable. I've even discussed this with some of my co-workers and their feeling is "do one or the other," either lift the ban or don't, but don't pussyfoot around and make us clean up after your political compromise.

Do you consider Clinton friend or foe at this point? Do you see his hands pretty much being tied since there seem to be enough votes in Congress to override any Executive Order, and is this a lost cause as some have stated?

I would consider President Clinton a friend. I'm not sure where his hands are. and I believe he'll do what's right. I just have that feeling. And I disagree wholeheartedly that this is a "lost cause." First of all, if he writes an Executive Order lifting the ban, and if someone tried to codify the ban with a law, I believe he would veto that. Then, Congress would be required to override the veto-and I don't think they have the votes or the stomach to go through all the hatred that would be reguired to override his veto. Even if it was written into law, it would still have to stand up to Constitutional scrutiny, and there is no way they can write a law that excludes people only on their sexual orientation that would ever stand up to Constitutional scrutiny.

Isn't the ban a law that excludes people based on their sexual orientation?

I don't think the ban will stand up to Constitutional scrutiny. I'm not so optimistic about the ban being lifted, but I have very strong feelings—all or nothing. My personal feelings, too, are that even if they override his Executive Order, do they think that that's the end of the story? Do they think that the gay community is going to say, "Oh well, we lost this, we'll just move on to something else and not worry about this"? This will not be the end. If anything, it will become much more heated.

How are you faring? Is everything going well for you?

Things have gone very well for me. As you know, I've been back since November 12, and initially there were some problems, mostly perpetuated by the Navy brass trying to treat me differently and trying to turn me into some special case. Playing with fire, basically. When we reiterated enough times that I would be treated with due respect and rights that all sailors have, then things calmed down. And now that the Navy treats me equally, things have gone much better.

We were concerned recently because I was told I would not be going to Hawaii after I had been scheduled to teach there. The immediate response by some people was that they assumed that it was because I was gay. I have since been informed by my executive officer that that is not the case, that I will be testifying at hearings, and they don't want to send me to Hawaii and turn around and have to pull me all the way back.

So things have changed since you were in Dallas—the list of those testifying does include gays and lesbians?

Well, there have been some gays and lesbians finally testifying, but I still think it's one-sided. I don't know if I'll be testifying at the House or Senate hearings, all I know is that my command has been informed that I should be prepared in early to mid-June to testify.

What do you think of the media images of Sen. [John] Warner and Sen. Nunn talking with the sailors bunking under the torpedo tubes?

I have Newsweek in my hand here, and I'm looking at that picture. I've been on submarines before and I haven't seen quarters guite this cramped. These are probably auxiliary bunks. I think if anybody was smart, they'd take these images of what Sam Nunn has here about the military—these images he portraved on television about all these hardships—and I would plaster them outside of every recruiting office in this country to show what the horrible conditions are. Then the recruiters would be forced to tell the truththat those are auxiliary bunks, they're not used all that often. This was just showing the absolute worst. I haven't been on this particular submarine, so I don't know if they use them a lot, but I think this would make a great recruiting poster. I'm sure there's a lot of people who'd go, "Oh, I want to go live in those conditions for six months."







# SURVIVING AND THRIVING WITH HIV

# Testing Positive Can Be the First Step in Taking Charge of Your Health and Life

In July of 1986, I received a phone call from my best friend, Mark, who had just moved to San Francisco. He called to tell me he was in the hospital after having been diagnosed with AIDS-related complex. I was shocked, since I had until then not known anybody who had been diagnosed with the disease. It was something very distant that only seemed to happen to other people. AIDS didn't happen to people like Mark and me.

I realized that if Mark could be infected, maybe I could as well. I went to the Montrose Clinic to get tested, not seriously expecting to be HIV-positive myself; after all, I was the most energetic and healthy person I knew

So getting the positive result from the counselor hit me like a bat. My shock was soon followed by a torrent of emotions: anger, fear, panic, regret, depression, etc. I didn't know where to turn nor what to do next. At that time, a doctor told me "nothing could be done" until I got sick.

Since I had no health insurance, I basically did nothing for about three years, other than try to keep it off my mind. Eventually, I joined a support group through Body Positive to examine what I was doing with my life and to take some action. I knew that the denial I was living in was

probably detrimental to my health. I decided to get a T-cell test and looked into treatment options. I was shocked again and scared to find my immune system to be weakened, even though I've always been so healthy (never even catching colds, for instance).

I realized I couldn't sit around doing nothing anymore. I saw a doctor, began AZT therapy and investigated other ways to have a positive impact on my life. I began to focus attention on some of the issues facing me: stress, mortality, legal and financial considerations, nutrition and exercise, and finding a path to happiness and fulfillment.

This was a different way for me to look at this disease. Trying to maximize your chances for good health is a concept known as "wellness." There are many components of wellness—physical, mental, emotional spiritual aspects—that, when added together, can modify, strengthen and maintain your total health. I strongly feel that my attempts to achieve an overall wellness have helped me in dealing with HIV disease. It's probably the main reason my immune system has done pretty well over the last few years.

This may not be a revelation to many people, but I want to make the point that we can have a lot of control over our lives


at many levels. Practicing safer sex and getting tested are just two of the first steps vou can take against HIV disease. Once you know where you stand, you can make informed decisions. If you're HIV-negative, you can learn how to stay that way by attending a safer sex workshop or house party. These workshops also help teach HIV-positive people how to lower the possible risks of transmitting HIV to others or of reinfecting themselves.

Over the years, so many of us have lost many friends, acquaintances and lovers to AIDS. Unfortunately, even today there are people in the community who live in deep denial. Some have not yet been directly touched by AIDS, so they cannot see themselves as being at any "real" risk. For this and other reasons, many people still have unsafe sex.

Others risk their lives by refusing to get tested. Some try living "as if they were positive," while others hope that their good health might indicate that they're HIVnegative. Of course, these are only myths that indicate a dangerous level of denial. You can't begin to deal with any issue unless you know what you're up against.

In 1993, you don't have to wait until you end up hospitalized with an AIDS-related illness before you find out you're HIVpositive. At that point, your immune system may already be shot and you will have thrown away many of your options. The earlier you detect HIV infection, the better are your chances against the disease. Finding out you're HIV-positive is not the end; rather, it's a beginning, offering you time to come to terms with the issues. You can have time to explore your options, learning to take control against this disease and get on with living! You can learn more about these options through the various programs, workshops and support groups offered by the AIDS service organizations in your city.

### Park Service Undercounted

Dear TWT:

As an eyewitness who attended the March on Washington, I can assure you that the Park Service in Washington (which estimated the crowd at 300,000) grossly underestimated the number of people taking part.

When the Cowboys came home to Dallas, I saw what 400,000 people looked like on Commerce Street. If that number was near 400,000 people, then what I saw in Washington was easily three or four times that. The Washington police admit



that there were a million people there.

In the parade, I wore my uniform from the Korean War and marched with the Veterans' unit. The crowds-who were often 12 and 14 rows deep on the sidewalks and streets-reacted to us, in uniform, with wild enthusiasm, cheering us on and sometimes surging out into the street to touch us or take our pictures. These huge crowds were continuous all the way down Pennsylvania Avenue to the Capitol.

The "right wingers" were out in force also, but the Washington police stood with them, almost man per man, with their billy clubs drawn, daring them to touch us or throw anything. I have never seen such hatred and anger in people's eyes. We took their verbal abuse with our heads held high and kept on marching. All in all, it was perhaps the most exhilarating event I have ever witnessed. But there was only one thing missing: the President of the United States, whom we had come to support!

### Power Is in the Vote

Dear TWT:

Only 1.2 million votes are expected to be cast in the June 5 Senate race.

Assuming 10% of Texas' 8.4 million registered voters are gay or lesbian, it is completely within the power of the gay and lesbian community to dictate the outcome of this race.

The religious right constitutes only 4% of the registered voters in Texas, yet it is a political powerhouse. This is so because the religious right is organized and because it votes.

The gay and lesbian community can likewise be so empowered. In our country, power resides with the vote. On May 1, only 25% of the registered voters in the predominantly gay and lesbian Houston Montrose precincts voted. This low turnout (72% voted in the Bush/Clinton presidential race) is in spite of the huge stakes inherent in this race for the gay and lesbian community—the lifting of the ban on gays and lesbians in the military may hinge on the results of this race.

There is no historical precedent where those who possess power or privilege have voluntarily surrendered that power. Power must be taken; it is not freely given over.

On June 5, the gay and lesbian community of Texas needs to send a resounding message to Washington that we are not to be sloughed off lightly. I think Arthur's mother (in the movie Arthur articulated it perfectly: "Don't f\_\_\_\_ with us, Arthur, we're ruthless." I think we need to send this same message to Washington on June 5: "Don't f\_\_\_ with us, Sam Nunn, we're ruthless." Gays and lesbians across the nation need to

empower themselves at the voting booth so that Sam Nunn's orchestration of these demagogic hearings about lifting the ban on gays will cost him very, very

# COMMITTEE RETAINS SODOMY LAW IN REVISED PENAL CODE

Hate-Crimes Section Provides For Enhancement of Penalties.

AUSTIN — After several days of wrangling that included a proposal to criminalize heterosexual sodomy, Senate and House representatives to a Conference Committee considering a proposed new state penal code finally voted last Monday to retain Section 21.06, the statute that targets only homosexual behavior. They also voted to include a hate crimes statute that will provide for penalty enhancement.

The vote came after Senate conferees, led by Sen. John Whitmire of Houston, dropped their effort to keep the so-called sodomy statute out of the revised penal code. The penal code now goes to the full House and Senate for consideration.

Senate and House representatives to the Conference Committee vote separately, and a bill must receive a majority in each group in order to come up for consideration by the full Senate and House.

The vote among Senate conferees was 4–1 in favor of dropping 21.06. In addition to Whitmire, Senate conferees voting to keep the sodomy statute out of the code were Sens. Jeff Wentworth of San Antonio, Carl Parker of Port Arthur and Royce West of Dallas. Sen. Ken Armbrister of Victoria cast the lone vote against.

The House votes in favor of repealing 21.06 were Reps. Sherri Greenburg of Austin and Patricia Gray of Galveston. Voting to keep the law were Reps. Allen Hightower of Beaumont, Allan Place of Gatesville and Toby Goodman of Arlington.

In a statement issued Monday after the vote, Laurie Eiserloh, Executive Director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, said, "This is an issue that is important to all Texans. This law is never used, except for discrimination, It is unenforceable. It is clearly a violation of the right to privacy....This country was founded on individual rights; the right of law-abiding, taxpaying citizens to be left alone. Today, everyone's civil rights were harmed."

"We will continue to fight this in the courts," Eiserloh concluded.

On the plus side, the proposed penal code contains a section prescribing harsher penalties enhancement for violent crimes motivated by prejudice based on race, religion or sexual orientation.

# DALLAS CITY COUNCIL WON'T APPEAL RULING ON POLICE GAY BAN

Applicants Admitting to Homosexual Behavior No Longer Placed on Hold.

DALLAS — The Dallas City Council last week decided not to challenge the Texas Supreme Court's decision to let stand a lower court ruling which states that Dallas' ban on admitting gay men and lesbians to the ranks of the Dallas Police Department is unconstitutional. The Council's decision apparently brings to an end three years of political posturing that has polarized both gay rights activists and those who oppose them.

At issue was the police department's practice of asking its applicants whether they had ever committed a Class C misdemeanor violation, with sodomy being offered as an example. Prior to the City Council's decision, anyone admitting to the offense had their application placed on hold until the Supreme Court ruled on the constitutionality of section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code.

There were seven applicants to the Dallas Police Department last year who responded "yes" to interview questions concerning a Class C violation. Those seven applicants, along with any new applicants, will now be placed in an applicant pool, in the order in which their paperwork was received, for employment consideration.

One person who will benefit from the Council's decision is Mica England, the Dallas lesbian who gained national attention when she sued the City of Dallas and DPD for being denied employment because of her sexual orientation. England, a Texas Human Rights Foundation Robert Schwab Award-winner for her efforts to gain civil rights for gays and lesbians, is the only person in Texas who has documented proof indicating that she was discriminated against on the basis of 21.06.

Upon hearing of the Council's decision, England was enthusiastic. "They're [the City of Dallas] giving up the fight. I think that's fabulous." When asked about her plans, England declared, "I just need to

reapply; I'm just waiting for the go-ahead from my attorney. I don't think it's realistic, though. Because of the notoriety surrounding my case, I don't think I'll be able to do it [join the force]. But it will pave the way for other gays and lesbians who want to be Dallas police officers."

While reaction from DPD administrators has been uncharacteristically reserved, Dallas police officers wasted no time in commenting on the city's decision. Most officers reportedly are completely against gays and lesbians serving on the force, citing an increased risk of AIDS transmission and the fact that, technically, homosexual behavior is still a criminal act in the state of Texas and they believe it's a mistake to allow "lawbreakers" on the force.

While the city's decision not to appeal the state Supreme Court's ruling follows a national trend which supports police hiring to reflect community standards and makeup, many observers feel that the only reason Dallas City Council lifted the ban on hiring was because they saw the writing on the wall. According to one City Hall source who asked to remain anonymous, "They really had no choice. The courts had already ruled on it, so, in essence, they were fighting a losing battle."

# DALLAS AIDS GROUP MOVES TO NEW FACILITY

AFA Holds Reception to Honor Late President Dennis Darcy.

DALLAS — In the ongoing battle to provide medical and social services to persons affected by HIV and AIDS, service agencies and personnel are constantly being challenged by the far-reaching effects of the devastating disease.

As a person's immune system is impaired, things that would seem insignificant in association with other diseases become, at the very least, inconvenient, and at the worst, life-threatening. People with HIV infection or full-blown AIDS, for example, are more likely to have problems affecting their eyes or teeth than those whose immune systems are intact.

Coming to the aid of those individuals in the Dallas area is the AIDS Funding Association. Incorporated in 1988, this organization has endeavored—through grants and local fund-raising efforts—to



serve as a source of greatly needed eyeglasses and dentures for HIV-affected individuals in the Dallas area. And as the AIDS crisis has grown, so has the caseload that the all-volunteer staff of the Association must deal with. Last year, 57 clients received over \$11,000 in client services; during the first four months of this year, the organization's caseload has already exceeded that number.

Realizing past president Dennis Darcy's dream that the AIDS Funding Association's become a fully-funded and fully-staffed service organization, AFA recently opened its first permanent office facility at 3100 Carlisle. According to Jon Schmidt,

AFA Executive Director, this new facility will benefit the organization and the community in many ways.

"In the past, volunteers have been operating from their homes. The new facility provides a central location for the Association's files, paperwork and resources. And it's more accessible to volunteers for work purposes. Also, to get funding in the future, we're going to have to have a full-time staff person to handle the administrative functions, as well as our clients' case management. Our new offices provide a home base for that person."

Thanks to the generous assistance of

Maple Avenue Office Supply, the new facility is up and fully operational, and was the site of a reception in Darcy's memory last week to introduce AFA members—and the new offices—to the community. These new offices are expected to handle more than three times the number of clients in 1993 as were handled in 1992.

The AIDS Funding Association has received \$20,200 in title one federal dollars through the Ryan White C.A.R.E. Act. These funds are earmarked specifically for denture purchases, and cannot be used for any other purchases or for administrative costs. For these purposes, AFA will hold a fund-raising buffet dinner at Buddies in June, in addition to its annual Dinner with Daddy auction at the Hidden Door in July.

# HOUSTONIANS FORM GROUP TO ENCOURAGE GAY PARTICIPATION IN DEMOCRATIC PARTY

Local Caucus' Failure to Support Bob Krueger Was Impetus.

HOUSTON — Giving the Houston gay community the impetus and opportunity to make changes within the Democratic Party is the aim of the recently formed Eleanor Roosevelt/Harvey Milk Democratic Club.

"The club is devoted to working within the Democratic Party to promote the civil rights of gays and lesbians, and supporting policies that do that," said Pat Gandy, the club's co-chair.

Its goals? To encourage more gays and lesbians to participate in the affairs of the Democratic Party. "Our organization was upset that the Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus did not support [Sen. Bob] Krueger. That was the impetus; not to serve as any kind of rival, but to present to the Houston gay and lesbian community as positive a message as possible about the Democratic Party."

This is certainly a mission, given the current administration's waffling on critical gay and lesbian issues, but Gandy, who has been active with the party "since I was old enough to vote, in 1952," is not daunted.

"No, the Democratic Party is not perfect—no institution made up of people ever will be. But if we as gays and lesbians are involved, we'll become influential and make things happen. Long-term, we want to get elected to interior party positions and, of course, support candidates who support the gay and lesbian agenda."

Gandy feels certain that this is the formula for change. "Look at [presidential advisor and friend] David Mixner—he became influential because he raised money for the Party. Politicians listen to three things: money, votes and party workers. If gays and lesbians aren't doing at least one of these three things, then they're not being as influential as they could be."

Currently, the club is organizing for the Democratic primaries in March of next year. "One of our goals is to double participation in the upcoming Democratic Party Convention, first locally and then [at] the state convention," said Gandy.

# 'MAJOR ARTERY' EXHIBIT OPENS IN DALLAS

Portion of Proceeds Goes to Nelson-Tebedo Community Clinic.

DALLAS - When local artist and burgeoning impresario Patrick McReynolds began formulating plans for his first major exhibit of artwork, Major Artery, he did so knowing that, in order for a showing to be successful, it must (1) be displayed in a functional yet trendy venue; (2) include a prominent and diverse guest list; and (3) feature popular, if not controversial, pieces by famous, if not newly-discovered, artists. So when members of Dallas' arts and civic community arrived at the Centrum Sports Club last week to view the new workd of some of the city's brightest young painters and photographers, it came as no surprise that the event was a triumph.

Bust last week's opening was more than just an opportunity for Centrum members and invited guests to stretch their minds as well as their bodies—it was also a benefit for the Nelson-Tebedo Clinic, whose wellness and research programs have greatly extended and enhanced the gual-

ity of life for persons living with AIDS in the North Texas region. All proceeds from the sale of six donated auction pieces, plus 15% of the purchase price of all other artwork, was earmarked for the Clinic, with a 3-1 matching grant from the American Foundation for AIDS Research being allotted for capital improvements for the facility.

McReynolds assembled over 150 original works ranging in style from the primitive to the industrial, from cartoons to the surrealistic. The pieces represented some of the finest pieces from the collections of Frankie Arreazola, whose works can be seen in galleries and private collections statewide; Brian Cook, whose Keith Haring-influenced deco pieces reflect the "industrial side of post-war America"; and Cathey Miller, whose freelance illustrations have graced the pages of both the New York Times and L.A. Style.

While some of these works formed the cornerstone of the live auction, it was the personal letter and photograph donated by Elizabeth Taylor that garnered the most enthusiastic response. While Miss Taylor could not be present at the event because of her participation in an AIDS fund-raiser at this year's Cannes Film Festival, she sent warm regards and thanks to McReynolds and his staff for their efforts to provide comfort and support to the AIDS community of Dallas.

Special guests for the evening included the stars and film crew of Solomon Mondane's new film, *I Won't Go Alone*, scheduled to begin production in and around Dallas this summer. The film, a portion of whose gross receipts will also benefit the Nelson-Tededo Clinic, concerns living with AIDS.

Over 1,000 people have already viewed the assembled works at the Centrum, and the opening night reception raised over \$3,200 for the Nelson-Tebedo Clinic—a fact which makes Patrick McReynolds very happy.

"We're pleased with the results," declared McReynolds. "We have had nothing but compliments about the artwork and the way it is displayed. And people are talking about it. Whether they like it or hate it, they're definitely looking at it."

The exhibit, according to McReynolds, is ongoing, and will feature more works by existing artists in the collection, as well as a rotation of pieces by other artists in the future.

# GAY MAN DECLARES RUN FOR HOUSTON MAYORAL POST

Candidate Attempts to Dampen Controversy Caused by Remarks On Homosexuality and Bible.

HOUSTON — An openly gay man went before Houston City Council last week to declare his candidacy for the office of Mayor, and later found himself having to explain why he had apparently acknowledged at the press conference that homosexuality is a sin.

Brian Bowen announced his intention to run on Tuesday, May 18, calling for major changes in the structure of city government and saying that if elected he would call for an audit of city finances. But it was his response to a question about running for office as an openly gay person, and specifically the issue of the Bible and homosexuality, that has gotten most of the attention since his announcement.

A story in the Wednesday, May 19 edition of the *Houston Chronicle* reported on Bowen's announcement, and said that he "acknowledge[s] that he believes homosexuality is a 'sin.'

In speaking with TWT NEWS, Bowen admitted that he had acknowledged that certain Biblical passages condemn homosexual behavior. He explained his press conference remarks as a hasty reaction, saying that he was raised as a Baptist in a very religious and homophobic atmosphere.

Bowen said that, after discussing his remarks with his male spouse and others in the gay community, he is now convinced that there are no Biblical passages in which Christ himself condemns gay people or homosexual behavior.

"I apologize for offending or confusing anyone...and I hope that this clears the air on this issue...."

Bowen said that if he were successful in his run for the city's highest office, he would push for passage of a domestic partnership ordinance.

In a statement released the day he announced his run for mayor, Bowen proposed changes in the city's charter that would do away with the strong-mayor form of government Houston currently operates under and that, in Bowen's view, would make city government more responsive.

"Three million people in the City of Angels, easily half of them up to something they don't want the other half to know."





Benn died at Roosevelt Hospital in New York City of AIDS-related pneumonia. A native of Lancaster, Texas, he was practically legendary for his escapades in Dallas throughout his teen years. After colege, Benn worked in Methodist youth and music ministries, the exploits of which he penned in an unpublished novel, *The Stained Glass Closet*. In the late '70s, the Methodist Church dismissed him from the work he loved and he returned to Dallas.

Benn was an early member of the Turtle Creek Chorale and was briefly music director at MCC Dallas. He then worked several years in New Mexico before the AIDS battle called him to New York

in the mid-'80s.
