World War II Tales: Part II

We didn't want her. A woman? We'd have to watch our language. Probably straight! We divas would no longer be able to sing "He's got the Cutest Little Dingy in the Navy." But hard-ass Lt. Donaldson coldly announced that he was assigning her to the TWX section, and that was that. (He was so West Pointish). "Crap, she'll just ruin everything," Patterson complained, but not so loud that ol' Hard-Ass could hear.

A few minutes later she wobbled through the door. She wasn't built "like a brick shithouse, hubba hubba"—more like a plank outhouse, kinda rough and squatty. Furthermore, she looked hot. Her hair was burnt red. Her face and hands were a mass of freckles. Her dumpy body was stuffed into a khaki uniform damp from perspiration. "Well, here she is," we thought. "What will we do with her, a woman?"

Although we tried very hard to conceal our disappointment, I sensed Pvt. Franklin knew. We men soon learned that, as a not-very-attractive woman, she had dealt with rejection all her life and knew well how to overcome it: don't let 'em know you know, smile a lot, be overly friendly and do more than your share. "Well, what needs to be done?" she promptly asked in a voice loud enough to be heard all over Oklahoma. Her "howdy-doo" smile revealed a gap in her two front teeth. Yet her manner was so down-home, so unpretentious, so warm, that our hearts started to melt. Without waiting for instruction, she grabbed a stack of letters, put them in

alphabetical order, opened the top drawer of the filing cabinet and let out a reverberating fart. Mercy, what a rip!

There was an embarrassing moment of silences, but only on the guys' part; Franklin continued her work, totally oblivious. Someone started to giggle, then we all did. This grew into a crescendo of laughter that fed on itself and grew sillier and louder each moment. Seeing this, she joined the laughter, then opened her fat arms, and we rushed into them. What a sight—a huddle of silly-ass queens and an overly-plump woman, standing in the center of piles of work to be done, hugging and laughing over nothing. That did it. Just as a little puppy wins your love even when you don't want to give it, she had won us completely.

Franklin quickly became Frank. It seemed so appropriate, because she was—plain and unembellished. As to cussing, my dear, she could swear like a Master Sergeant and in the next breath quote *Hamlet*. (She had a master's degree in English literature and had taught Elizabethan theatre at some college in Oklahoma.) And as for the "Cutest Little Dingy" ditty, honey, no need to tell her we were gay. That earthy woman had read us the moment she saw our overly neat office, decorated so tastefully with art posters. As for herself, she let us know real quick that she was a lesbian and damn proud of it. And so this down-to-earth dyke and the airy fairies became good friends.

No one had a repertoire of jokes like Frank's or could tell them as well as she did, filling the air with profanity and wildly gesturing arms while acting out all the parts, often in dialect. finished, she would laugh at her own outrageous humor as hardily as we. As the days went by, our love

for Frank grew. Especially mine. When she wasn't looking, I closely watched her and silently swore I loved every freckle on the back of her puffy hands, the space between her teeth and even her khaki shirt perpetually wet in the armpits. But I would soon love her for yet another reason.

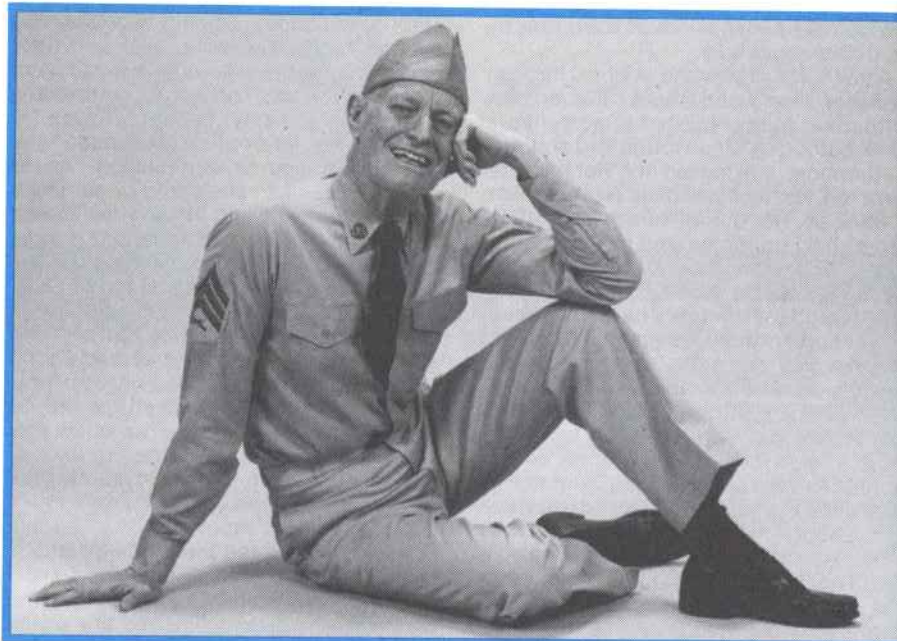
A couple of evenings a week, I would grab a big stack of sheet music and make my way to Fort Ord's "million-dollar" recreation hall, built on the edge of a rocky cliff overlooking the Pacific Ocean. In it was a large auditorium which, when the stairs were stacked and put away, also served as a dance floor. Near the stage was a Steinway Grand welcoming me to play it. In no time at all, a gang of GI's would gather 'round to sing the popular songs of the day.

Two of the singers I will always remember, Tyson and his Buddy. They were the type of rednecks who would announce their entrance into a room with a loud belch and then look around to make sure everyone was laughing. They reeked of stale sweat and beer, and were loud and obnoxious, bulky and bombastic—in a word, crude. However, they seemed fond of me and kept buying me beer while insisting I play their favorites, "Pistol-Packing Mama," "You Are My Sunshine" and

"The Man on the Flying Trapeze." At times they were so loud and pushy, other soldiers stopped singing and left.

One night, after playing for more than an hour, I stood up to stretch. A small doll-like soldier, surely weighing no more than 125 lbs., slid onto the piano bench. Fin with me; I needed a break. With the introductory chords, I recognized "Ah, Sweet Mystery of Life" from Victor Herbert's *Naughty Marietta*—romantic operetta, not the type of song Tyson and Buddy would appreciate. The youth started singing *false* *setto*. The crowd became silent. For him was not the campy falsetto we used in the privacy of TWX. No, his was a beautifully trained voice, a silver soprano. Perhaps just perhaps, he could have gotten away with that had he not kept crinkling his nose and singing over a shoulder like a naughty Deanna Durbin.

The GI's didn't know what to make of a man so foolish as to open himself up to what he should have known would be hatred and brutality. When he finished the song on a roaring, beautifully controlled D above high C, he smiled as if expecting applause. Instead, Tyson grabbed the small man by his fatigues and yanked him from the piano bench, while the soldier was screaming, "What are you going to do

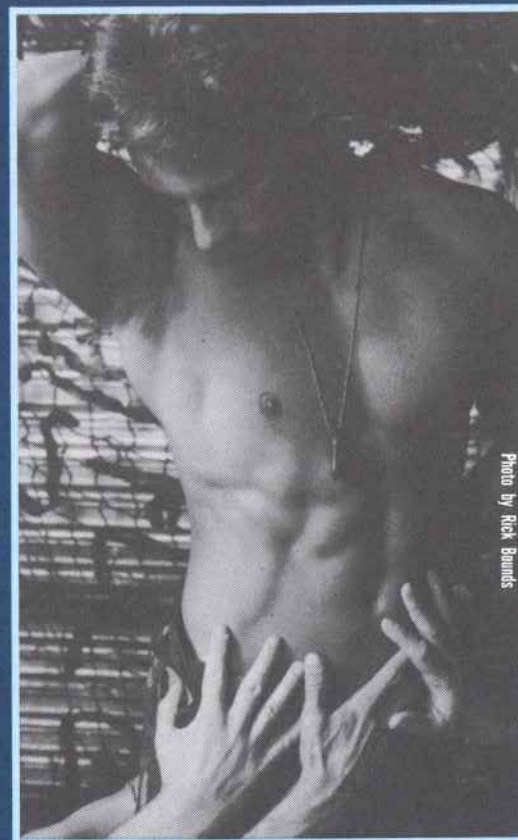

to me?" We heard a sickening crunch to the doll-face, an agonizing scream, then saw the poor guy fall to the floor, bleeding and crying.

All this happened so fast that none of us knew what to do. We didn't have to wait for an answer. Buddy apparently thought this was just a helluva lot of fun, and why shouldn't he enjoy it? He grabbed my shoulder and spun me around, yelling, "You want some too?" Before I knew what was happening, I was on the floor, my mouth bleeding.

Well, I'm no fighter, but I sure as hell was going to do something. Although I don't remember the next few moments, those who saw it said I sprung up from the floor like a tiger, running at my attacker as fast as I could, and caught him in the gut with my shoulder. This barely budged the blob, but it did rock him back a bit, and I started swinging wildly, furiously, not knowing shit about how it was supposed to be done. Caught by surprise, Buddy backed off while trying to block my amateur punches. I plowed forward, swinging madly, and I landed a few blows.

In a GI fight, the crowd always pulls for the underdog, the smaller man who has the balls to fight back. Although I was too busy at that point to hear what they were saying, the crowd was yelling "Hit him, Johnson!" and every time I landed a punch, a mighty roar went up. As Buddy moved backwards, the crowd parted to make way for his retreat. Soon the thought occurred to me that I was not only holding my own, but maybe even winning.

Since the thin youth on the floor wasn't fighting back, Tyson came to the defense of his pal. Out of the corner of my eye, I saw him clamp his huge hands together and swing, hatchet-like, at the back of my neck. I don't recall feeling any pain from the cowardly blow, but I remember my knees buckling, and I could feel myself going down and out.

Then, out of dimming eyes, I saw two fat legs flying through the air, a khaki skirt pulled up to her hips. That plump projectile was heading straight for Tyson's chest. In my semi-consciousness, all this seemed to take place in very slow motion, and I remember telling myself, "Don't black out, don't black out, not now." Two feet struck Tyson solidly, and he flew backwards against the piano bar and fell to the floor. Surely, he was injured, but not so much so that he couldn't yell "God damn!" The crowd had grown to a frantic mob and

soldiers came running from all over the mess hall to see a good fight. Too late. Tyson scrambled to his feet and ran for the exit with his Buddy following him.

The entire fight had lasted only a few minutes, but it was just too delicious to be done with. The GI's hoisted Frank and me onto their shoulders as if we were conquering heroes and paraded us all around the dance floor.

By morning, news of the fight between the two bullies, a smaller soldier and a flying WAC had spread all over Fort Ord. When Frank and I entered the mess hall for breakfast, we were greeted with applause. A soldier stood, a few others joined him, and then everyone was on their feet cheering. We were celebrities—to everyone except one.

Lt. Donaldson called us into his office. What did he want? Were we to be disciplined for "conduct unbecoming"? Frank and I hoped we would get off with an ass chewing. But one could never read Donaldson's face. The Lieutenant closed the door behind us and coldly ordered, "Sit." "Now," he demanded, "just what happened?" (He was so West Pointish.) In our anxiety, Frank and I kept yammering on top of each other, while the officer's face never gave a hint as to what he was thinking.

Story finished, Donaldson told me to remove my tie and shirt so he could examine the purple bruise on my neck and shoulder; he could already easily see my swollen mouth and hands. Finally, after making sure he knew the truth, he went to the door, opened it...and merely said, "Well, I think you know what to do." With that remark, we did.

You'd think that in a big fort like Ord ("Overseas Replacement Depot"), a Major, a Captain or at least a Lieutenant would make the decisions as to who would be sent overseas and who was to be stationed near a beautiful beach on Monterey Bay not far from San Francisco. You'd think so, wouldn't you? No. A lowly corporal made that decision. And what do you know? He was gay. But then, almost everyone in Headquarters and Headquarters Company was.

A few days later, over their protestations, Tyson and Buddy were shipped out, on their way to some mud island in the Pacific.

Like one of Aesop's fables, this story has a moral: Never, never hit a gay person. For we are everywhere.

MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING

*"Sigh no more, ladies, sigh no more,
Men were deceivers ever,
One foot in sea and one on shore,
To one thing constant never:
Then sigh not so, but let them go,
And be you blithe and bonny,
Converting all your sounds of woe
Into Hey nonny, nonny."*

From these lyrics to Balthasar's song from Act Two, Kenneth Branagh takes his tone in adapting Shakespeare's romantic comedy, *Much Ado About Nothing*, for the screen. With its warning of the inconsistency of love, and an exhortation to transform sorrow into revelry, it is the ideal encapsulation of Branagh's take on the tale. The song is heard not only in its usual place in the script, but also during the celebration which closes the film. *Much Ado* even opens with these lyrics projected onto the screen against a black background as we hear them recited by a woman's voice.

As the recitation continues, the black screen dissolves into a sunny Tuscan tableau. Beatrice (Emma Thompson), the sharp-tongued niece of Leonato, the governor of the province, is reading the lines



Emma Thompson is Beatrice in Kenneth Branagh's film version of Shakespeare's romantic comedy *Much Ado About Nothing*.

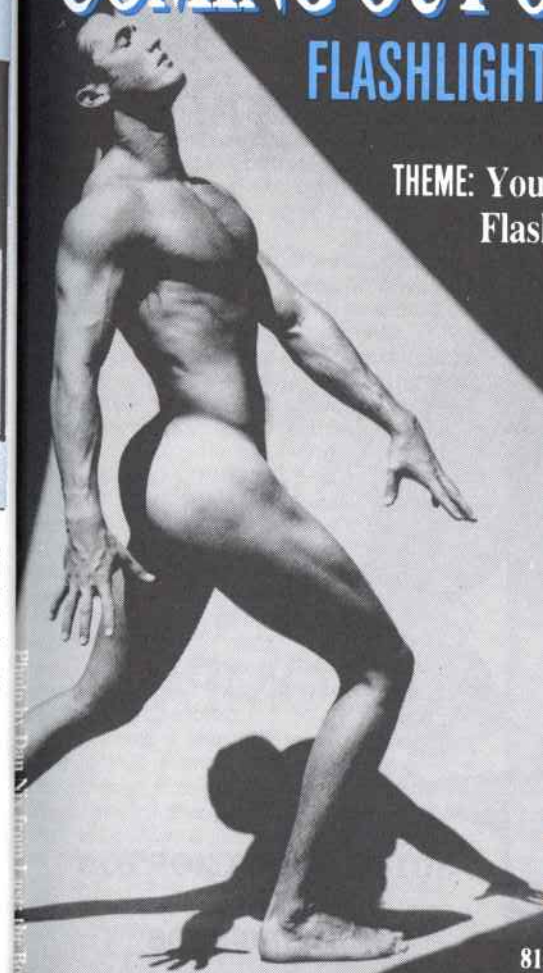
to entertain an appreciative, if leisurely, crowd when word arrives that the dashing Don Pedro (Denzel Washington) and his men are coming. In the theatre, this announcement is usually followed by the immediate entrance of the players on stage, but here it becomes a panoramic spectacle under the opening credits, with both the residents and the new arrivals rushing to prepare for their first meeting.

And what a meeting. Within a few minutes, Branagh sets up all the crucial relationships with reaction shots amplifying the usual text. Leonato's beautiful daughter, Hero, returns the longing gaze of Claudio (Robert Sean Leonard), Don Pedro's handsome younger follower. Don John (Keanu Reeves), Don Pedro's bastard brother, reacts icily to mention of reconciliation with his sibling. And from first fierce glances exchanged, there is quick confirmation of the longstanding war of wits between Beatrice and Benedick (Branagh), another of Don Pedro's men, and an avowed bachelor. When Don Pedro predicts that Benedick must eventually succumb to love, Benedick retorts, "If I do, hang me in a bottle like a cat and shoot at me...." For her part, Beatrice claims, "I had

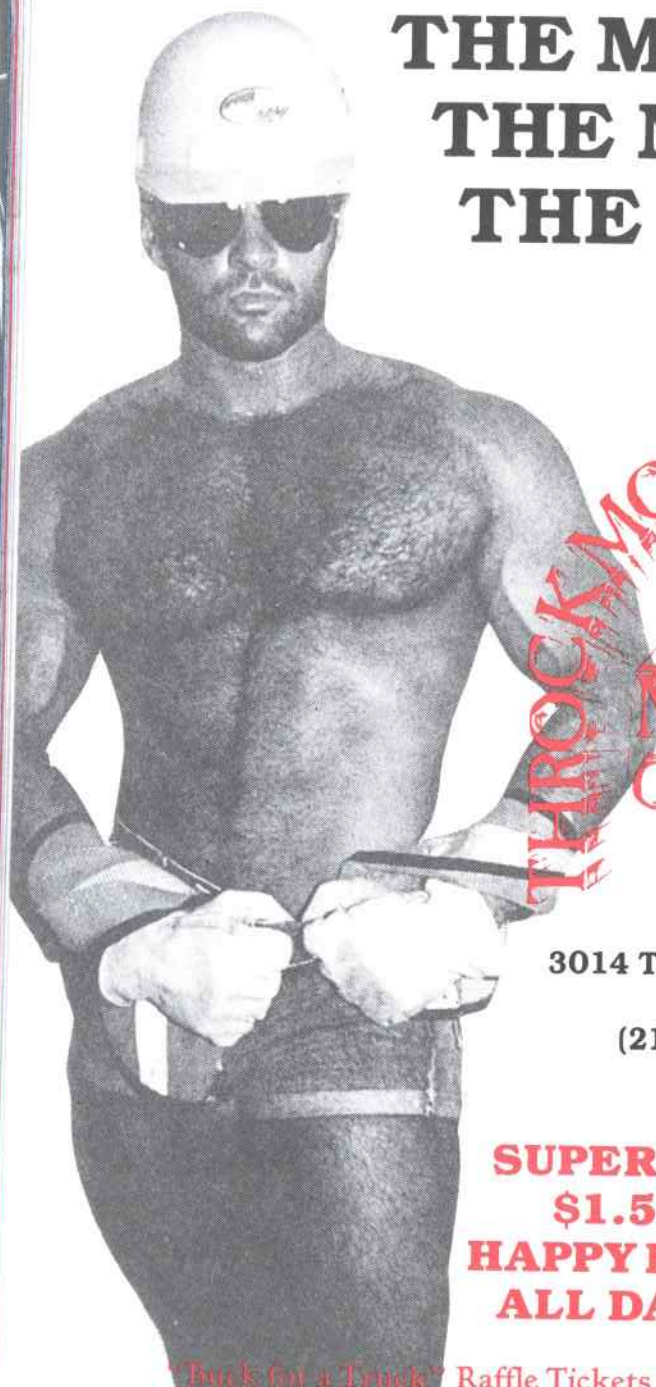

rather hear my dog bark at a crow than a man swear he loves me." In no time at all, the battle is joined.

This "merry war" between Beatrice and Benedick provides most of the fun in *Much Ado*. Beatrice on Benedick: "In our last conflict, four of his five wits went halting off, and now is the whole man governed with one." Benedick on Beatrice: "If her breath were as terrible as her terminations, there were no living near her; she would infect to the North Star." Yet Don Pedro senses that behind those passionate feelings may be... passionate feelings. In the romantic glow of the betrothal of Hero and Claudio, he launches a plot with the young lovers and Leonato to bring together the sparring opponents.

Unfortunately, news of the engagement also leads to another scheme, hatched by the villainous Don John, with near-tragic repercussions for both couples. This change of tone is a challenge for the performers, and this cast shines, carrying the audience's sympathies forward, despite the incredible and abrupt nature of the plot twists. Thompson, following her Oscar-winning role in *Howard's End*, is glorious as Beatrice, spicy and emotionally charged. Branagh's Benedick balances her well: though he seems more buffoonish at first (as men are wont to be), he rises to the occasion when his true feelings surface. Their scene together following the spoiled wedding is unexpectedly honest and moving. Washington makes a sly Don Pedro, and Leonard is a fresh and pretty (almost too pretty) Claudio.

There are a few missteps. Reeves as Don John is all sneers and twitching eyes, too obvious for the others to trust as they must do for the plot to continue. And Michael Keaton delivers a truly bizarre turn as constable Dogberry, part Monty Python and part bawdy Disney cartoon, the character's verbal humor getting lost in an unintelligible dialect.

But overall, this is fine work from a splendid ensemble, refreshingly free of the staid pose-and-declaim style which spoils many of the classics. Branagh's cameras take full advantage of the new setting (the play is set in Sicily), and his pared-down script eliminates unnecessary stage conventions and Elizabethan in-jokes, making this a very accessible film. Whether you are a novice to the Bard, or a veteran, this *Much Ado About Nothing* will prove a sunny, earthy, joyful oasis in a season of mindless big-budget flicks.

Lesbians, Gays and Bisexuals Carry the Hurt

All lesbians, gays and bisexuals have experienced enduring in silence with the fear of being rejected, harassed or physically assaulted because of their sexual identity. For some, these are memories from childhood or adolescence; for many these experiences continue to be a part of their lives. Homophobia, or the hatred and fear of people who are attracted to the same sex, is not just an attitude that straight people have. Gay, lesbian and bisexual people in Western culture are damaged by homophobia to some degree, and we can carry these harmful attitudes and experiences with us like mud on our shoes. This is called internalized homophobia.

Internalized homophobia can be so great that some people may be unable to get into a relationship with someone of the same sex, even if they have accepted their sexual orientation. However, internalized homophobia can also be as subtle as feeling awkwardness and shame with one's lifelong love when that person dresses or acts a little too "butch" or "nelly," or when one feels the need to play down the significance of a relationship with a lover—even to other gay people. Internalized homophobia can be one of the reasons some people are always concerned about what other people, straight or not, are thinking about them.

It can interfere with our sexual behavior, our self-esteem and our ability to share our thoughts and feelings with friends. How great is your fear? Are you angry at yourself or others for acting "like a dyke (or a fag)," or for being "too queer?" This can also appear as the cynical attitude contained in comments like "Gay people are all alike! ... All they think about is sex and partying." You may even believe that to such an extent that you are unable to meet people without using alcohol, drugs or sex to relate to them.

So what do we do? The first important step is twofold: First, we must take responsibility for our own homophobic behaviors; second, we must not blame ourselves or others, because it is not our fault. It is not our fault because before any of us was aware of our same-sex attraction as a child, our caretakers and society had already begun giving us sexist messages about what it meant to be "a good little boy" or "a good little girl." Like a computer that has been programmed with a virus, homophobia has been preprogrammed in us, our parents, our grandparents and others. Blaming is often ineffective. So it does not do much good to assume a "more out than thou" attitude. We can express our anger, but instead of blame, it can be more effective to suggest that people take responsibility for how they perpetuate homophobia in their current behavior.

It's important to take time to explore your ideas about what you believe people think about your sexuality, what you believe they would think if they found out, and how you feel about coming out. Make a deal with a group of friends not to be judgmental and then talk with each other about your fears and angers about being bisexual, lesbian or gay, and what it was

like growing up. During these talks, look for the beliefs that you have about your sexuality that do not seem to be helpful for encouraging self-esteem and getting close to other gay people. Explore your beliefs about what it means to you to be a "real woman" if you are female, or a "real man" if you are male, then see how compatible these are with your sexual orientation.

Last but not least, involve yourself in the growth of the lesbian and gay community, work for your civil rights, and learn about lesbian and gay history. Putting your efforts into these organizations or activities cultivates a feeling of personal achievement and pride about one's sexuality, and helps us develop a sense of belonging that spans history and our country's development. Homophobia has hurt us all, but each of us can, collectively and individually, heal and become empowered if we are willing to explore our pain and discover our pride.

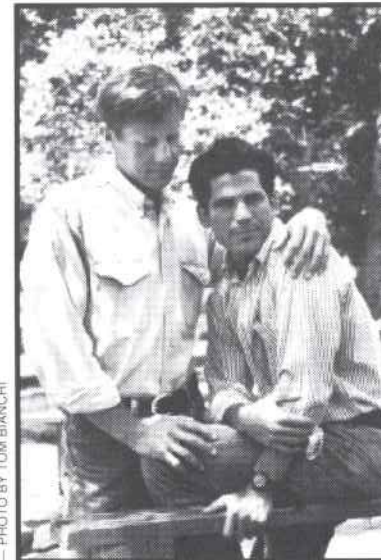

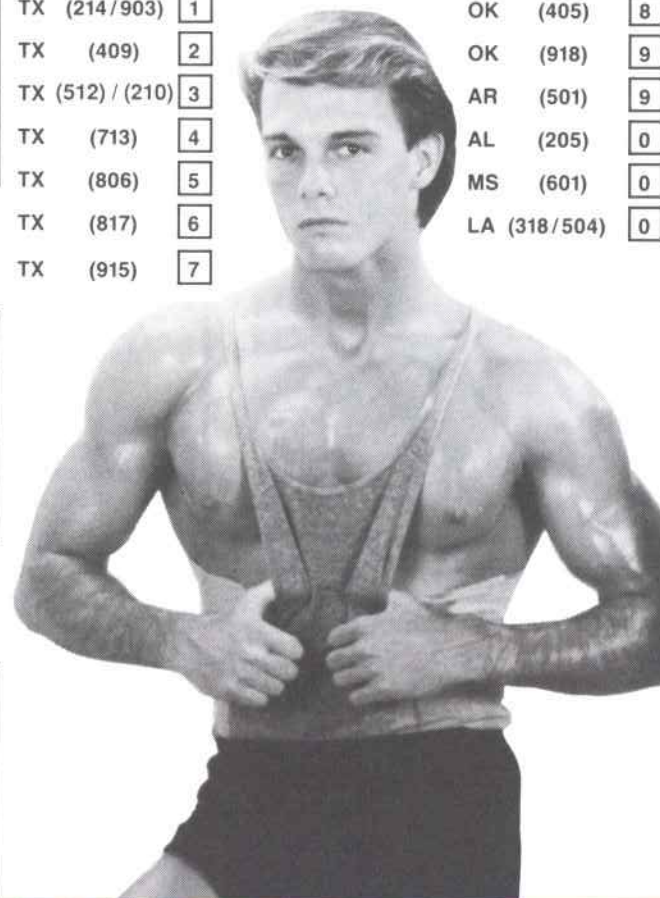

Fight Anti-Gay Campaign

JOINT PRESS BRIEFING CONDEMNS RETENTION OF 21.06 IN NEW PENAL CODE

*Speakers Call on Legislature,
Governor to Reject Measure.*

AUSTIN — At a press conference held last Friday outside the state Capitol, representatives of local and statewide organizations called on Gov. Ann Richards to reject a proposed new state penal code that retains 21.06, the so-called "sodomy law" contained in the present penal code.

Among those present were members of P-FLAG [Parents & Friends of Lesbians & Gays], Log Cabin Republicans, the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, the Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus, the Lesbian/Gay Political Coalition of Dallas and the Rev. W. Douglas Ensminger of the Community of the Reconciling Servant.

Local activist Jeff Garrett, who conducted the press conference, told TWT NEWS those in attendance were united in their opposition to the new law.

"Although the crowd had very mixed social and political goals, in common their desire was to see discriminatory laws removed from the penal code and to seek equal rights legislation where discrimination persists.

"Toward this end, we share the view that the current legislation before the Texas House and Senate designed to replace the penal code contains laws which criminalize gay men and lesbians, laws which attempt to marginalize lives by keeping them separated from the mainstream America in the areas of employment, privacy rights and dignity."

Garrett called on the Governor and the Legislature to keep hate and prejudice out of their deliberations on the new penal code.

Frances L. Pearson, President of P-FLAG, noted that gay men and lesbians are not the only people who should oppose the retention of 21.06 in state law.

"The 'sodomy statute' in the penal code of Texas is a slap in the face, not only to those who are gay themselves, but also to their families and friends. This law is not on the books for criminal prosecution, but only for bigotry and prejudice.

"It would be well for those elected to

state office to remember they are discriminating against fathers, mothers, sisters, brothers and friends of those they choose to stereotype...."

Rev. Ensminger, pastor of the Community of the Reconciling Servant, added a religious perspective to the issue. "The central concerns of the Scriptures, both Hebrew and Christian, are with justice and compassion. The Bible suggests that a society will be judged, not by how rigidly it enforces a particular sexual ethic, but rather by how well it treats the poor, powerless and marginalized in its midst."

The Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus and the Log Cabin Republicans issued statements last week calling on the Legislature to reject the revised penal code, and Gov. Richards to veto the measure if it reaches her desk.

RAZZLE DAZZLE DALLAS' 'BIG PARTY' TO BE HELD NEXT SATURDAY

*Proceeds from 15th Annual Event
To Benefit AIDS Service
Organizations Across State.*

DALLAS — Fifteen years ago, a small group of friends—14, to be exact—got together and decided to throw a party. The concept was simple—host a big party for the gay community in celebration of just being who and what we are.

As often happens when ideas of this sort are hatched, each friend told two friends, and they told two friends and so on, and so on and so on. Some of the hosts of the party even took to the street, passing out leaflets to anyone who would listen. By the time the night of the first Razzle Dazzle Dallas event arrived, nearly 500 people converged upon the Hall of State building in Dallas' Fair Park for what would eventually become one of Dallas' premier gala events. Joining some of the city's prominent citizens attending the first event was entertainer Eartha Kitt, who was appearing at Fair Park that weekend in the musical *Timbuktu*.

In the first years of Razzle Dazzle Dallas, party hosts weren't as focused on fund-raising efforts as they are today. In fact, that first year, organizers realized only a

few hundred dollars in profits—all of which was donated to the Dallas Gay Alliance. That amount, while greatly appreciated by members of the DGA, pales in comparison to the thousands of dollars the event now raises each year.

With the advent of AIDS and its devastating effects on the gay community in Dallas and across Texas, Razzle Dazzle Dallas, a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation, realized that, while the community still had reason to celebrate, more had to be done to help those affected by the disease. According to Michael Blackstock, who has been associated with the organization since its inception, "the party hosts realized that AIDS was a disease that would not go away, so we needed more of our proceeds to go to charity."

It was that realization that made the Razzle Dazzle Dallas board decide to emphasize the fund-raising aspects of the organization. Today, the primary focus of the group is to raise funds for AIDS service organizations in Texas, a purpose which has seen well over half a million dollars contributed by Razzle Dazzle Dallas to organizations statewide.

Through the years, Razzle Dazzle Dallas has afforded party hosts and guests alike with some interesting and unique moments. On several occasions, no air-conditioning was available in facilities used by the organization for the Big Party, such as in the second year, when the event was held in the Centennial Building at Fair Park.

The same thing happened in the ITT-Trinity Building—now the cornerstone of the West End Development downtown—where it took over 30 minutes to ascend or descend the staircase to the second-floor location of the party due to the enormous crowds in attendance. Despite minor problems, however, Razzle Dazzle Dallas has introduced some of the finest entertainment events and spectacles yet seen in the city, including the Mr. and Miss Razzle Dazzle Dallas contests and one of the first uses of laser light shows for an indoor event, to Dionne Warwick's successful concert at the Morton H. Meyerson Symphony Center.

This year, major changes have been undertaken by the planning committee of Razzle Dazzle Dallas. While both the bazaar and Big Party features of the event were held on the same day in years past, they have been separated this year. The



Oak Lawn Arts Festival took place several weeks ago, while Razzle Dazzle Dallas' Big Party, which attracts thousands of gay men and lesbians, making it the largest gay and lesbian celebration in the Southwest, will be held next Saturday evening, June 12. HOUSTON'S 'AGORA' STRESSES IMPORTANCE OF POSITIVE PR FOR GAY COMMUNITY

*Group Plans Speakers Bureau,
Projects with Cable Access TV.*

HOUSTON — Is it important for the gay and lesbian community to present positive images to the rest of society? Should gay people work to ensure that the news media are aware of the gay perspective when doing stories of interest to the community? AGORA, a recently formed gay and lesbian media and public relations-oriented community service group, believes the answer to those two questions is a definite yes, and is doing something about it.

"Agora," a Greek term, means "marketplace," which in ancient Greece was also the traditional gathering spot for exchanging news and information.

"We're trying to offer gay and lesbian organizations an assist mode," says Ron Dalton, acting Media Relations Director, "to offer them a better and more professional format to get their message out in a positive way, and secondly to offer positive role models for the community and the media at large."

Ways that AGORA plans to do this are multiform, according to Denay Hudson, president of the group. "We hope to be the hub of a wheel that other gay groups can contact—a central point for all of the groups to use." Among the actions and groups planned will be a press advisory, a speakers group and contact with Houston media.

In addition, fun but informative projects with Houston Cable Access stations are also planned.

"There're a lot of good causes that never get media exposure, [like] health organizations and support groups; that's one of the things we're trying to overcome. We hope to be able to get interest generated in local community papers throughout greater Houston, not just in Montrose," Hudson said.

"We want to present ourselves and our stories to publications who've never been approached, to let them know that we're here, we're productive citizens, responsible members of the community, and yes, we're gay and lesbian."

"How many gay father stories did you see for Father's Day? Lesbian Mother's Day?" asked Dalton. "I know I have a lot of ideas, but I'm not a writer," says Hudson. This is the crux of AGORA's mission to the community. "We want to allow gay groups a way to become more media-accessible and media friendly—to help them get their story across."

Members of AGORA believe that media coverage of gay issues should not start and end at Pride Marches and gay rights demonstrations, important as that coverage is. "There's no median, it's either one extreme or the other," says Hudson. What AGORA wants to provide is positive, polished media accessibility for all the gay and lesbian stories in between.

AGORA's base of membership is a cross section of the gay community at its best—lawyers, teachers, and accountants as well as writers and public relations specialists. It includes members of the heterosexual community, too. "We have a few members from P-FLAG, and we're try-

ing to get more people from the straight community involved."

SAN ANTONIO AIDS FOUNDATION To SHIFT EMPHASIS To HOSPICE CARE

*Greater PWA Assistance by Other
Organizations A Factor in Decision
To End Outpatient Services.*

SAN ANTONIO — Increased availability of social services for PWAs in the San Antonio area, along with an increased demand for hospice care, has prompted the Board of Directors of the San Antonio AIDS Foundation to refocus the organization's mission and resources. The new emphasis will be devoted to residential hospice and inpatient care services for people with AIDS and related support services for their families and loved ones.

According to SAAF board chairman Mark Buchanan, "The past months have seen an unprecedented jump in the need for hospice care, with as many as ten [clients] on the waiting list to get in. This increased need was the catalyst for a three-month self-evaluation by the board of directors of programs and priorities provided by SAAF."

On May 25, the board convened a meeting at Brady Green Clinic to brief representatives of eight AIDS service agencies on SAAF's decision to phase out most outpatient services currently provided by the Foundation by July 1. The organization has provided services to PWAs since 1986, including case management, entitlement assistance, food and clothing banks, home health care, counseling and emergency assistance.

In a conversation with TWT NEWS, Buchanan described the response by other agencies to the SAAF announcement as very positive and cooperative. He said the meeting had been called to ensure that no client would be left without an agency to turn to as SAAF phased out outpatient services.

A recent comparison of client files revealed that up to 60% of SAAF clients

were being served by other agencies in the same area. This was a determining factor in prompting SAAF's redirection of emphasis.

Asked by TWT NEWS how long it would take to increase the number of patient residential spaces, Buchanan said his organization's aim was to convert some spaces in 30 to 60 days, but that complete conversion of up to 40 rooms from the current 23 would depend on how quickly other agencies could completely fill the service needs of SAAF clients and how soon extra nursing care dollars could be obtained. He also stressed that programs such as the Dental Clinic and Early Intervention Clinic housed at the Foundation will continue to operate there. These programs are not funded by the Foundation.

In addition, SAAF will continue to provide education and information programs, especially those aimed at middle school and high school students in partnership with the United Way.

Clients will be notified of the changes individually in one week to ten days, Buchanan said.

FORT WORTH COMMUNITY HONORS THOSE LOST TO AIDS

*Founder of NAMES Project
Attends Ceremony for Tenth
International Candlelight Memorial.*

FORT WORTH — Members of Fort Worth's AIDS community—most of them wearing white accessorized with the now all-too-familiar red AIDS awareness ribbon—gathered on the lawn of the Kimbell Art Museum in Fort Worth recently to remember those people who have lost their battle with AIDS. The faces of those in the crowd reflected the pain that comes from losing a loved one, but in their eyes one could see a glimmer of the hope that springs from the comfort of being among those who have suffered similar losses.

Fort Worth was among 370 cities in 55 countries around the world who joined in this, the 10th International AIDS Candlelight Memorial. In 1986, the first year Fort Worth participated in the event, only a handful of people attended. This year, despite inclement weather in the area, over 800 joined AIDS Outreach Center Exec-

utive Director Thomas Bruner and NAMES Project AIDS Memorial Quilt founder Cleve Jones in the 90-minute commemoration that featured a reading of the names of those people who have died from the disease, as well as song presentations and poetry readings specially written for the event by various members of the community.

According to Linda Adams, AOC staff member and organizer of the memorial, the event was very moving for everyone who attended. "I participated in the Memorial last year, and I just knew that it had to happen again this year. I don't know how to put it into words, really. It was quite a powerful experience to see all the faces, to see the candles. It was really very emotional for me."

While the AIDS Outreach Center was the primary sponsor of this year's Candlelight Memorial, the event could not have taken place, according to Adams, without the invaluable assistance of volunteers and supporters from throughout the community.

"The support from the community has just been amazing. People were coming out of the woodwork, wanting to read poems, perform music and read the names. Out of all the AIDS events that I've participated in this year, this service was the most empowering."

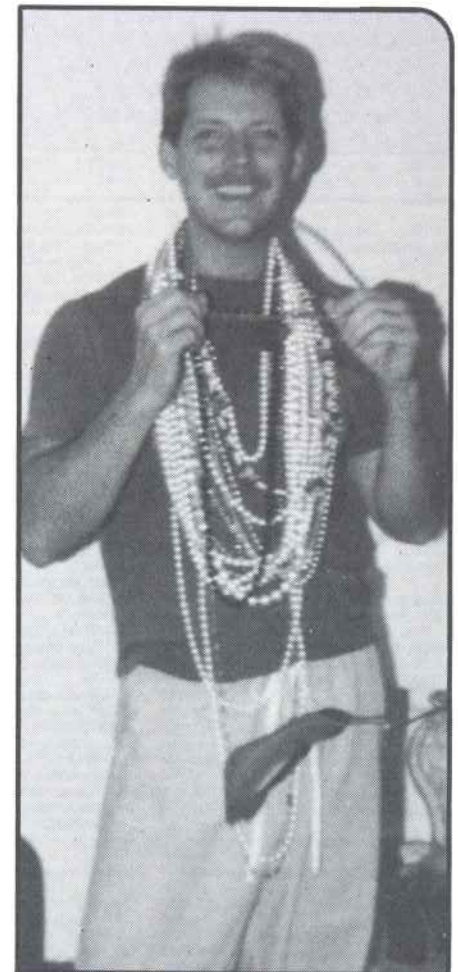
