# SGT. JOSE ZUNIGA

On April 24, the day before the historic March on Washington for Lesbian, Gay and Bi Equal Rights and Liberation, Sgt. Jose M. Zuniga publicly proclaimed that he was a gay man. Not just any gay man, but a veteran of Desert Storm and the Sixth Army's Soldier of the Year for 1992.

The day before Memorial Day, I had a chance to speak with the newly discharged Sgt. Zuniga shortly before his appearance at a fund-raiser for the San Antonio Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus.

During the interview, Zuniga described himself as a "Norman Rockwell" sort of young man. On first meeting him, I was struck not only by his clean-cut looks, but by his serious demeanor and the intensity of his belief in integrity and honor.



**What process did you go through to become the Sixth Army's Soldier of the Year for 1992?**

First of all, the Sixth Army is comprised of all Army units in the 12 Western states. I was nominated by my commander, competed against soldiers in my own company, became Soldier of the Month, then went on to the battalion level, the installation level and finally the entire Sixth Army level.

**What were the criteria?**

Your military record, physical fitness test scores, general knowledge, your interview before the boards comprised of seven senior enlisted personnel. I went before six different boards before I got to the top 20 finalists.

**What prompted you to come out?**

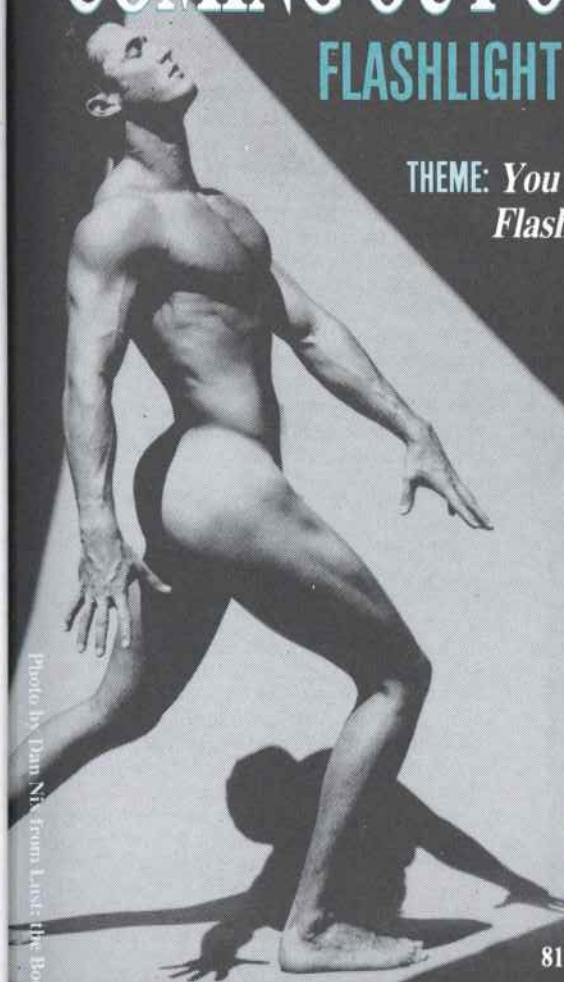
There were a number of factors. When the General was pinning the Soldier of the Year medal on me, I got this sick feeling as I started wondering, "What if he found out I was gay? Would he still be pinning this medal on me?" The answer was crystal clear. Not only would he not... but he'd be signing my discharge papers personally.

Then [there were] the Senate Armed Services Committee hearings, with all these myths being promoted by [Sens.] Sam

Nunn and Strom Thurmond that [gays] couldn't serve in combat because it would be detrimental to morale...the fact that I had served as a gay soldier, I knew better than that.

Then, President Bill Clinton waffling on the issue and saying that he would consider not letting us into combat units. Well, I knew I was gay during Desert Storm and it caused no problems. So all these factors played in and I made my decision.

**What was your family's response to your coming out publicly, and was this their first knowledge of your sexual orientation?**

I had told my sister already. I wrote a letter to my father before I came out, but unfortunately the letter didn't get to him until Monday, the Monday after I came out, and he found out through a relative. I haven't heard from my Dad; my sister has been very supportive. My mother passed away a little less than two years ago. I talked to her about it because I felt that I would not be able to live with myself if I hadn't discussed it with her before she died.

*[Zuniga came out publicly in a speech and reception at the Old Postal Station in Washington D.C. the day before the March. By the time he was ordered to report to his commanding officer four days later, he had already been the subject of a front page article in the Washington Post and had written an Op-Ed piece for the New York Times. His commanding officer asked him, "Are you a homosexual?" Zuniga replied in the affirmative, and discharge proceedings were initiated immediately. He was honorably discharged on May 20.]*

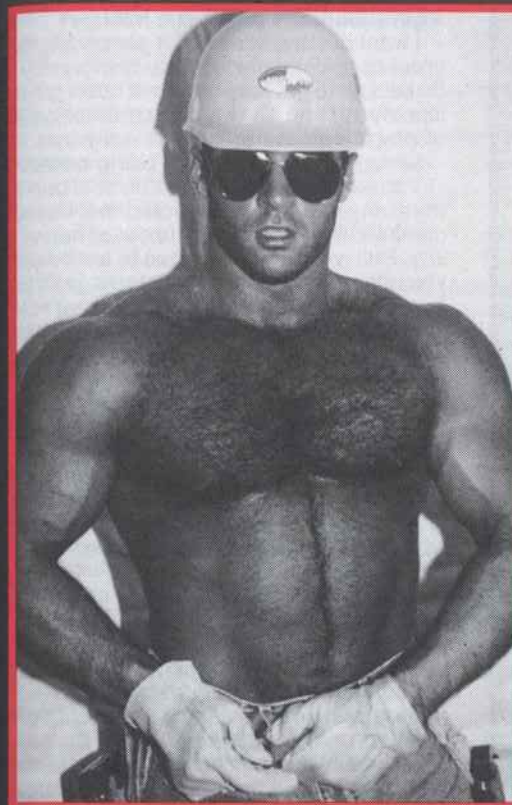
It was clear that they were reluctant to do it. You know, in the military, when someone finds out you're gay and it's not a high profile case, commanders look the other way. First of all, they really don't want to deal with all of the paperwork and the hassle, and secondly, because it's usually a good soldier and they don't want to get rid of a good soldier.

*[Zuniga says he wasn't aware of his true sexual orientation when he enlisted in the Army at the age of 20. Two years would pass before he realized he was gay.]*

It was three years ago. I had a close buddy with whom I served in Desert Storm, and I started feeling an attraction to him. It was one of the most difficult struggles in my life, because all my life I had thought of homosexuals in the same way the rest

of society thinks of them. I came from a very traditional Hispanic family, very religious, who thought of homosexuals as deviates and perverts. So I was in denial for awhile... I finally had to come to grips with it or it was going to kill me.

**How did you go about living your life as a gay man while still in the military?**

I went out and sought out gay people in order to find my place in the community. So I did go to gay bars and meet other gays like myself and saw that the stereotypes of gay people weren't necessarily true.

**Were you ever in fear of being outed?**

You always had to be careful, but I don't think anyone really suspected me. I kept quiet about my personal life out of necessity. Still, you constantly had to look over your shoulder when you went to a gay bar to make sure there was no CID agent following you, or on the outside chance that a straight co-worker might also be there and see you do something which might be construed as a homosexual act.

**What do you think about the "don't ask/don't tell" compromise being promoted by Congress whereby new recruits would not be asked about their sexual orientation and would not be discharged as long as they didn't "announce" their homosexuality?**

I don't think [Rep.] Barney Frank and others are being realistic. Society is predominantly heterosexual, and as gays, we are constantly barraged by it, whether it's someone's wedding band or a loved one's picture on a desk or a discussion of what you did on Saturday night. Barney Frank is saying you should be asexual in the workplace. Is he willing to tell heterosexuals to be asexual in the workplace, too? Number one, it's not a feasible compromise, and number two, he's asking people to continue lying. I asked him that question directly: What am I supposed to do when a friend of mine asks me what I did on Saturday night? Can I tell him that I went to a gay bar? Is that announcing? A straight soldier can receive *Playboy* magazine at the barracks, so what if I decide to subscribe to *Playgirl*? Is that announcing my homosexuality?

So it's not an appropriate compromise and, unfortunately, he threw it in when we were just gaining momentum. It wasn't even in the eleventh hour, and it just shows me that he wanted a quick fix to this. He probably never would have come out [himself] if it hadn't been for his little problem

with the prostitute. So he has no idea what it means to want to live with integrity and honor, and to want to come out and say, "Look, this is what I am," and live like an openly gay man. He was forced to do it.

**Why should lesbians and gays who have nothing to do with the armed forces support you and the lifting of the ban on homosexuals in the military?**

It's not only a military fight. People don't understand that if we lose this fight, we're allowing the government to put its stamp of approval on discrimination against homosexuals. The minute you let government discriminate against one portion of the lesbian and gay community, they're going to want to discriminate against everyone.

**What are your plans for the near future?**

I have this two-month speaking tour across the country. I've gotten a call from a group in Denver, for instance. They're opposed to Amendment 2 [which forbids the passage of antidiscrimination ordinances in Colorado—Editor] and they want me to come out and talk to them about my experience, and hopefully help in some way to repeal that amendment. Surprisingly, the invitations are coming in not only from gay and lesbian organizations, but also from groups outside our community.

**Is this the beginning of a political or activist career for you?**

Maybe an activist career. I'm very interested in ensuring that we get our rights, because it's not fair to treat us as second-class citizens. I'm trying to use my talents in writing to that end. I had an Op-Ed piece in the *Washington Post* not too long ago that was syndicated around the country. I have one coming out in the *Advocate* during Pride Week. I'm just trying to get the word out. If people think that Colorado and Oregon were losses, they're nothing compared to the loss we're going to suffer if we lose this battle over lifting the ban.

People need to understand why we're fighting this battle over the military, why it's so important. You know, the Campaign for Military Service came out with "Operation Lift the Ban," and that was very successful and many signatures on petitions were sent to D.C....but that's not enough. People have almost stopped writing to their Congressmen and women, and now the right wing is mobilizing, doing even more than before, so we need to get off our butts and start doing more.

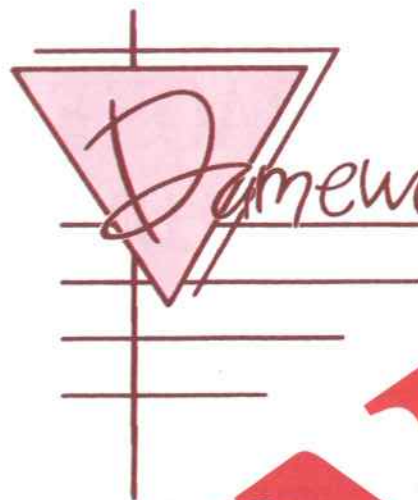

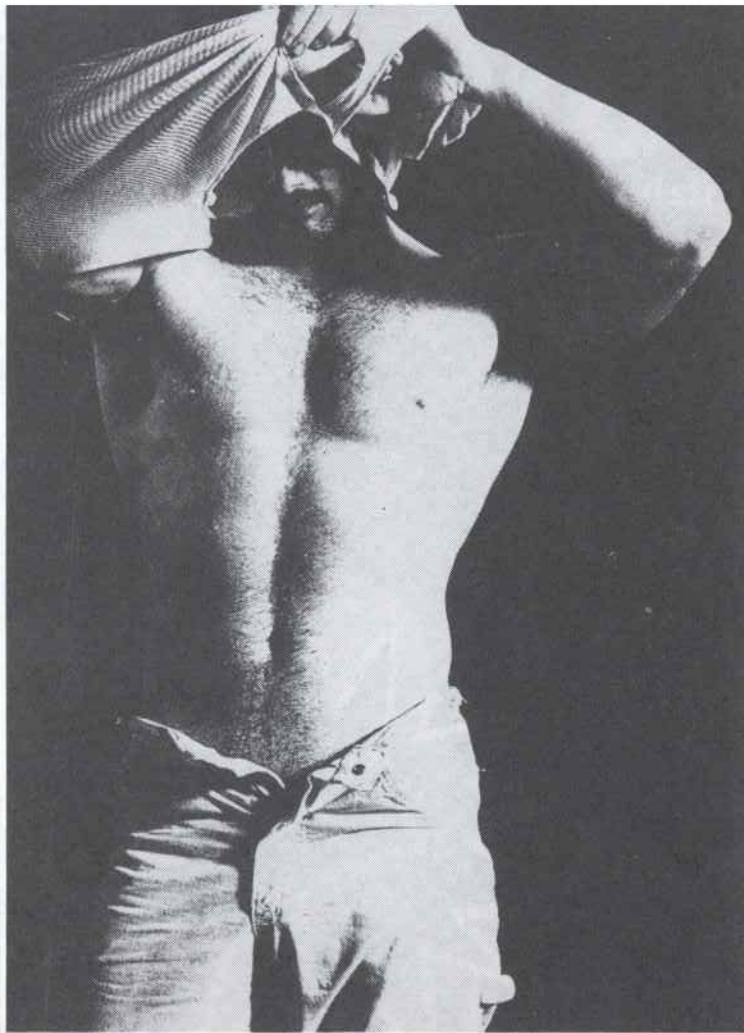

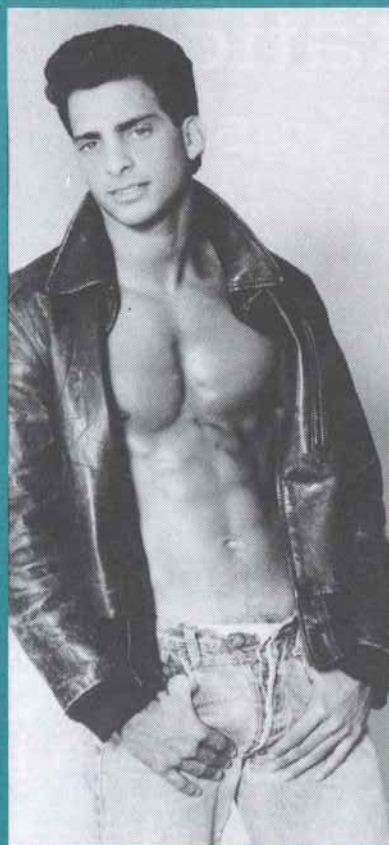

# COMING Out:



## That Sultry Summer Night in 1977 Marked a BEGINNING...

BY NANCY FORD

June 20, 1977. It was on that sultry, sticky summer night in a small town in Ohio that I, overcome with desire at watching my theretofore best platonic friend mow her lawn, became a lesbian.

Just kidding. I was a lesbian long before I had my first actual *experience*. Being a graduate of the *nature, not nurture* school, I believe I was born a lesbian, just as surely as I was born with green eyes, big bones and an inquisitive attitude. The addiction to chocolate and expensive perfume came later. I just didn't act on my sexual orientation till June 20, 1977. Only against it. But that's another story for another therapy session. Back to that fateful night in Ohio.

I can still smell the freshly cut grass. Maybe it was the way the sweat glistened on her newly-tanned body, trickling down the crevasse between her breasts. Maybe it was the way her arm muscles bulged and vibrated as she pushed the power mower....

Whoa! I'm sorry—I got carried away there. For a minute, I thought I was writing for *On Our Backs*.

Maybe it was simply that I had 23 years' worth of lesbian libido waiting to explode.

Whatever it was, one thing led to another, as they say, and that evening marked the beginning of the first day of the rest of my life on the outside of the closet door.

It was the beginning of a lot of other things, too.

Coming out is kind of like squeezing toothpaste out of the tube.

Once it's out, it's pretty hard to get it to go back in.

Some gay men and lesbians are so confident about their sexual orientation that they throw caution to the wind, slamming the closet door open so hard that the doorknob crashes into the wall and gets stuck in the plaster. Others weigh the consequences very carefully before walking through their door. And with good reason. It's kind of like squeezing toothpaste out of the tube. Once it's out, it's pretty hard to get it to go back in.

For me, coming out was an inevitability. But, as in all other pivotal aspects of life,

Your letter to Mr. Crandall has been given to me for response. Thank you for sharing your thoughts on the incident which occurred on April 25. Like you, our company views these events as deplorable. On behalf of American Airlines, I apologize for the unfortunate actions of the few employees involved in this unhappy incident. Their actions do not reflect American Airlines policy or practice.

American has a long and proud history as one of the most progressive and enlightened companies in the nation. We have an aggressive policy of nondiscrimination against any individual or group of individuals. Such a policy is especially appropriate because we have one of the most diverse work groups in America.

Standing behind this policy is a very active program of AIDS education for employees. We conduct this program in cooperation with the Red Cross, and fly Red Cross people to the cities we serve—at our own expense—when that is necessary. During the past two years, we have conducted these courses for many hundreds of American employees. In addition, we have taken a very proactive

position towards training our ground and in-flight people to respond with sensitivity and understanding to situations that might involve contact with disease-causing agents.

We do desire to preserve our designation as Official Airline for Project: Red Ribbon and regret that you wish to terminate this agreement based on the fact that our personnel may not wear any non-airline symbols while they are on duty. Permit me to explain that we will not "choose sides" on issues unrelated to the airline industry, political or otherwise. While our employees are encouraged to support those causes for which they have strong feelings, we do not feel it is appropriate for them to wear pins or any other symbol when they are in uniform. We wouldn't want our customers to construe an employee's personal views as the official position of American Airlines, no matter how worthy the cause. After all, our business is providing transportation, and we feel we have no business "mixing in" at a corporate level regarding issues unrelated to the airline industry.

Mr. Latimer, please be assured that we give you our full support in your worthy endeavor. We will also do all possible to ensure that lapses in judgment do not recur. Still, I hope you will understand why we must take this noncommittal stance. It would be our pleasure to continue our relationship.

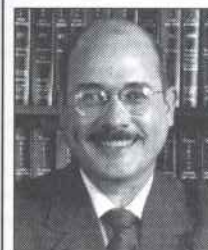

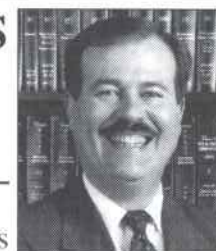

# No Special Rights, EQUAL

The clarion call to arms of those who are fighting to keep us from obtaining equal rights has been, "They want *special rights*!" And these two words have been repeated over and over again from Oregon to Colorado to Washington, D.C., from coast to coast. "Special rights" are the two words that always seem to lead the way in the campaigns of fear-based propaganda designed to convince the public that there is a hidden agenda behind our quest for equal rights.

A friend recently pointed out to me that he was thoroughly disgusted with gay leaders for not having hit back with "equal rights, not special rights" often enough, and for not communicating to the public just what that means. I had to agree, and I am sure there are many others who do so as well. Perhaps our leaders have ignored, for the most part, the lies that the opposition keeps repeating because to gay leaders it is so apparent that they are lies.

But these lies are not so apparent to many in the general public, and they have been used effectively for years. It's foolish for our side to take this for granted and not to repeat the truth at every opportunity.

It is a well known fact that, given a free hand, bigots, police officers, firefighters, courthouse clerks, the military, school officials, transportation providers, medical service providers, landlords, employers, insurance companies and many others have discriminated against us, still do discriminate and will continue to discriminate against us. Are we asking for special rights if we ask for the same protections, treatment and opportunities in these areas that anyone else would get? Well, if you believe that gays and lesbians are inferior, equal rights could be considered special rights.



# RIGHTS

This is especially so if you have been brainwashed all your life to think so.

What did conservatives say of blacks when they were asking for equal rights? "They're demanding special rights! They want advantages we don't have!" This has been said of women, Hispanics, Asians and others when they have also worked for equal rights. The propaganda campaign against equal rights for black people was very similar to what we are experiencing now. Opponents said that blacks would weaken the military, spread disease and want our women (in the case of gay and lesbian people, we're supposed to want their children), that they were mentally defective and morally degenerate and would get special rights and thus undeserved advantages over everyone else. Opponents of equal rights for gay people are saying the same things about us now. The capstone of this propaganda is the idea of "special rights."

I ask our leaders to stop using the words "civil rights" and replace them with the words "equal rights" at every opportunity. They mean basically the same thing, and "equal rights" defines exactly what we are after. "Civil rights" sounds legalistic; "equal rights" has a more human feel to it. Furthermore, by using this term, we can render the fear propaganda less effective.

Our opposition is quite fond, as was Adolf Hitler, of the political propaganda axiom "If you tell a lie long enough and often enough, it becomes the truth, and the truth becomes irrelevant." And our opponents have found Hitler's own axiom "the bigger the lie, the better the lie" very useful. The only way to combat this is to keep hitting back with the truth. Equal rights; no more, no less!

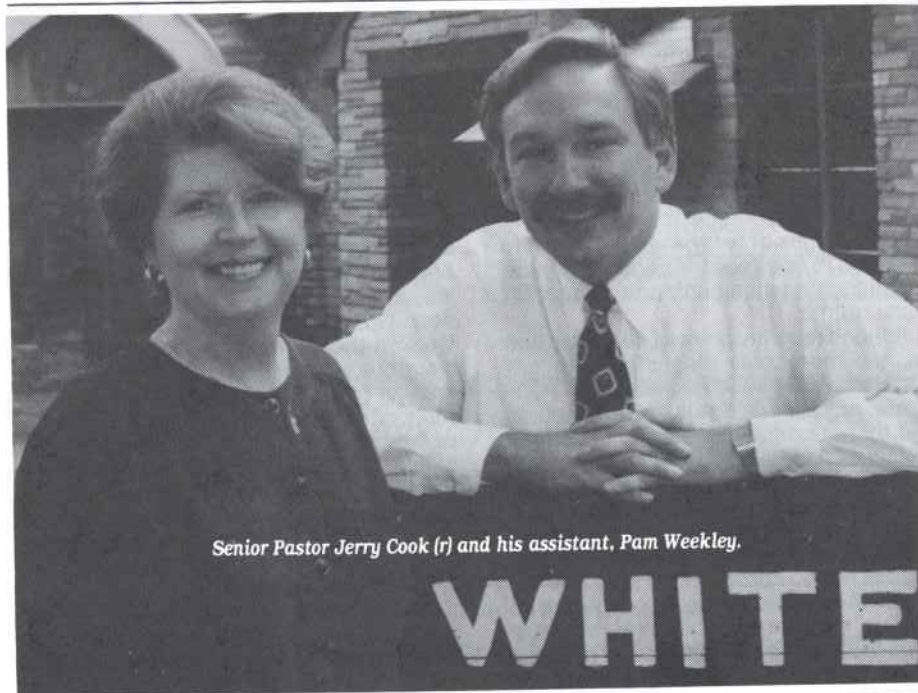

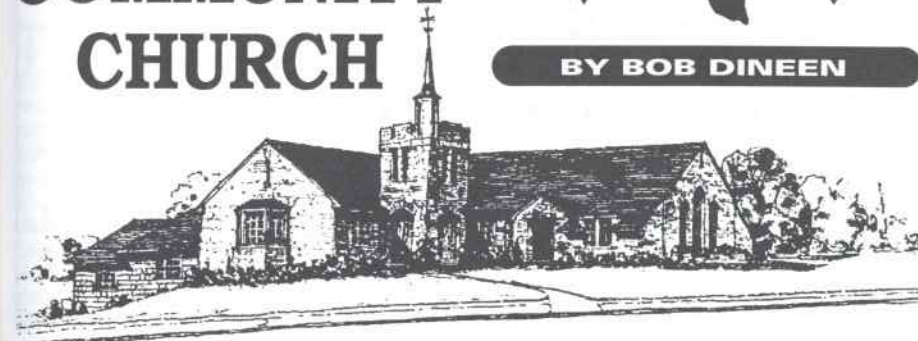

## The Wall of Masculinity World War II Tales Part III

There is a wall that separates men. More so, I think, for straights than for gays. Straight men can never praise another man's good looks, not out loud. Straight men can never embrace or cry in each other's arms. But they can play grab-ass in the shower. They often find it difficult to say, "I love you," even to their own children, and never to a buddy. But they can have sex with each other if they call it "just messing around." Especially if each can claim, "Well, I was so snookered out of my mind, I didn't know what I was doing." In short, straight men can be deeply fond of each other and never give voice to their feelings. Like ol' Hard-Ass.

"Hell, it's the gay and lesbian soldiers than run Fort Ord," Lt. Donaldson once roared in defense of his staff. It was the only time I knew him to acknowledge that we were an all-gay unit. But then, being "all man," he rarely expressed any emotion, other than anger.

He was a West Point graduate and acted the part 24 hours a day. I often wondered if he didn't sleep at parade rest. His haircut was West Point, although after graduation haircuts that short were no longer required. The way he carried his hard, trim body was West Point. Even his stern eyes were West Point gray.

He demanded West Point perfection of himself and of his staff. His cold eyes

assured it. "Make damn sure you never get your ass chewed by ol' Hard-Ass," we used to caution newcomers.

As far as I could tell, I was the only one who knew how deeply this man grieved for his wife years after her death in an automobile accident. Somehow I learned that she had died while he was trapped behind enemy lines in Warsaw. I have no idea how he came to be in Poland, but I do know that one night I went into his office without knocking—as his secretary I was allowed to do so—and found tears in those gray eyes. The music coming from his radio was the *Warsaw Concerto*. Seeing me, he immediately turned his back to look out the window into a black night. Silently, I about-faced and hurriedly left. Neither of us ever spoke of that brief moment. And I never saw a touchingly-tender Donaldson again. Except one last time.

Despite the fact that he was devoted to his wife and was extremely proud of his strength and fitness, I often wondered if Donaldson were an embryonic gay man. He worked too damn hard at being butch to be all that straight. And he was very fond of his men. But always in a military way, of course.

With so many men being discharged at the end of World War II, he was swamped with work. So he took me out of the TWX section and made me his personal secretary. Truth is, I was his unofficial assistant. As a gentleman, he did not want to order me to work after retreat (1700 hours).

As an officer, he sure as hell wasn't going to ask me. But he didn't have to do either. He needed me, so I was there. And we both knew, without a word ever being said, that we enjoyed working beside each other, even late into the night.

He learned that I was a dancer and frequently asked about my training, performances and future plans. There were other questions, probing questions, but he cautiously avoided the word "gay." I, of course, was in no position to ask him about his personal life. So I knew little about him other than the fact that he, for some reason, was almost always alone. I could feel the respect he had for me, and he surely must have felt mine. Under different circumstances, we might have been friends.

As my discharge date grew near, he asked me to re-up; he'd make me a sergeant if I did. I thought, "Honey, I wouldn't reenlist in this man's Army if you made me a five-star general!" (But now that almost half a century has passed, I look back sentimentally and find that Army life wasn't all that bad. Actually, I have many memories of the good people I met and the

good times we shared.)

The day I left the Army with an honorable discharge, I saw a package, gift-wrapped, lying on top of Donaldson's file cabinet. With all that blah olive-drab (the Army's favorite color) around, the rainbow-colored package seemed incongruous. Was the gift for me? How unmilitary? How unmanly?

I was certain it was, indeed, for his all-time favorite secretary. Yet, this butch man, who had seen so much combat, whose broad chest was cluttered with medals, couldn't screw up the courage to hand it to me. Stiffly, he shook my hand and wished me good luck. Then he turned towards the gift and...nothing. Did I see moisture in those cold, hard eyes. Or was it wishful thinking on my part? If we were so damn fond of each other, why, at this moment, did it have to go unsaid? But he was an officer and very West Pointish. And I was a damn good, hard-working, dedicated secretary—but still an enlisted man. I didn't want his gift. I merely wanted him to say, "I like you." Seeing his discomfort, I silently about-faced and hurriedly left.

## GAY GAMES IV & CULTURAL FESTIVAL

New York City — Gay Games IV & Cultural Festival to be held June 18-25, 1994, is expected to attract more than 15,000 athletes and 500,000 spectators from around the world. It will be the largest athletic event ever held, with attendance surpassing that of any of the Olympic Games. The Cultural Festival, which will be a part of the Games, will have its own draw of thousands of spectators and participants.

Large numbers are also expected to be in New York to celebrate Stonewall 25, the 25th anniversary of the Stonewall riots in New York. This event signaled the beginning of an era of gay rights and visibility for gays and lesbians.

"Gay Games IV & Cultural Festival is a powerful vehicle for attacking homophobia and for displaying our power and pride," tennis superstar Martina Navratilova said recently. "The Games are about the triumph of all gay men and lesbians, individually and collectively, in sports, culture and spirit. Gay Games IV will change the way the world thinks about us."

Dr. Tom Waddell conceived of and promoted the idea of a "Gay Olympics" in 1980. The first Games (Challenge '82) were held in San Francisco in 1982 with 1,300 athletes.

In 1986, Gay Games II (Triumph '86) was held again in San Francisco with 3,500 participants. Most recently, in 1990 Vancouver B.C., Canada, hosted Gay Games III (Celebration '90) with 7,300 athletes, 1,200 cultural participants and 200,000 spectators.

There are 31 sports included in the Games for 1994: aerobics, badminton, basketball, billiards, bowling, cycling, diving, figure skating, judo, marathon, martial arts, physique, powerlifting, racquetball, soccer, softball-slow pitch, softball-women's fast pitch, sport climbing, squash, swimming, table tennis, track & field, triathlon, volleyball, water polo and wrestling.

The cultural events scheduled so far include architecture & design, cabaret, classical music, comedy, dance, drag, film, folk art and crafts, gay history and cultural heritage, a Gay & Lesbian Bands of America concert, literature, painting and sculpture, performance art, photography, pop music, theatre, video, and many social events.

## HUTCHISON LANDSLIDE BURIES KRUEGER IN SENATE RACE

*Republican Win Cause for Concern  
On Military Ban, Other Gay Issues.*

TEXAS — By the widest margin racked up in a Texas Senate race in decades, Republican Kay Bailey Hutchison overwhelmed Democrat Bob Krueger's effort to stay in Congress by taking two-thirds of the vote in last Saturday's runoff election. Hutchison and Krueger were forced into a runoff when each emerged with less than a third of the vote in the first round of voting on May 1.

Hutchison's win marks the first time both of the state's Senate seats will be held by Republicans in over 100 years, and increases the number of women in the Senate to seven. It also means the Democrats' margin in the Senate has been reduced to 56-44, which may make it more difficult for President Bill Clinton to get legislation passed. And gay and lesbian people have reason for real concern over the election of a generally conservative candidate who made it clear during her campaign that she was opposed to lifting the ban on gays serving in the armed forces. After at first appearing to vacillate on the issue, her Democratic opponent came out in favor of lifting the ban.

Krueger, who agreed with most people's appraisal of him as a less-than-adequate campaigner, had to overcome apathy and even outright opposition among gay activists and political groups in the earliest stages of his campaign. Several gay political organizations either endorsed other Democratic hopefuls or issued no endorsements at all for the first round.

Disenchantment with Clinton, who polled only 37% of the Texas vote in last November's presidential elections, may have been a factor in Krueger's defeat last Saturday. There was also speculation that Republican women, a significant number of whom apparently abandoned their party to help vote Richards into office two and a half years ago, returned to the fold.

The Senate seat Hutchison will now fill became vacant when Lloyd Bentsen was appointed Treasury Secretary by President Clinton earlier this year. Gov. Ann Richards named Krueger to the post after a long list of other appointees didn't pan out. Hutchison's term expires in 1994, and she will thus have to start running for reelection in less than a year. Speculation has already started on who the Democrats will choose to run against her.

DALLAS — Dallas begins its Lesbian/Gay Pride events this Saturday with two events that affirm the positive lives of gays and lesbians: the 15th annual benefit extravaganza, Razzle Dazzle Dallas; and an Oak Lawn Community Services-sponsored seminar, "Living With Pride and Power," that will focus on our positive gay and lesbian identities. Razzle Dazzle Dallas is the major highlight of Dallas' Pride events in June, while the Alan Ross Freedom Parade concludes the second week of Dallas pride activities held on September 19.

Under the national motto, "Family of Pride," 23 events, seminars and public television broadcasts are scheduled during the next two-and-a-half weeks. The full schedule of events is printed on page 32 of this week's issue of *THIS WEEK IN TEXAS*, courtesy of the Dallas Tavern Guild. Television stations KERA (Channel 13) and



KDTN (Channel 2) have scheduled five broadcasts to take place during the month as part of the Lesbian/Gay Pride celebration. The Turtle Creek Chorale will be featured on Channel 13 with the premiere broadcast of *After Goodbye: An AIDS Story*. The one-hour documentary will include the performance of their "When We No Longer Touch, A Cycle of Songs for Survival."

Oak Lawn Community Services is sponsoring three seminars and three events including the opening of the Candy Marcum Institute For Women's Studies. The Cathedral of Hope/MCC will hold two entertainment events as well as two special worship services, their annual Juneteenth Celebration and their Lesbian/Gay Pride service, which is MCC's second most heavily attended service each year. Three bar-hosted benefit shows will take place, as well as a one-man show of western music and stories at the Anatole Hotel that will benefit the AIDS Resource Center.

Rounding out pride festivities will be a diverse range of events including the Miss Gay Dallas Pageant; a happy hour/social mixer of the Stonewall Business and Professional Association; and the Maple Avenue Carnival, sponsored by the Dallas Tavern Guild as a benefit for Dallas' pride parade in September.

Information regarding the parade, including applications, will be sent to organizations and businesses in mid-July. This September marks the tenth anniversary of the change of pride events in Dallas and the move of the parade to September. The Dallas Tavern Guild, sponsors of the parade, will be asking for information and pictures from the community for consideration to be included in an anniversary publication to be published for the parade. This commemorative publication will include a history of the community, information on why Dallas celebrates two pride weeks (with the parade in September), and



photos of past parades, events and the physical changes that have taken place on Cedar Springs Road and in other areas familiar to the gay and lesbian community.

## FIVE MORE HOUSTON TEENS SENTENCED IN BROUSSARD CASE

*Boot Camp, Community Service Await Youths Convicted in 1991 Killing of Gay Banker.*

HOUSTON — Two years after they took part in an incident that led to the death of a gay man in Houston's Montrose neighborhood, five young men last week became the latest to be sentenced for their role in the crime. Derrick Attard, Raphael Gonzalez, Gayland Randle, Brian Spake and Jeffery Valentine will serve time in the Harris County Boot Camp and devote 500 hours of service to local gay and lesbian organizations.

The five pleaded guilty to murder and were sentenced to 10 years probation. Spake, Randle and Valentine received 10 years deferred adjudication, which means that if they meet the terms of their probations, their records will contain no reference to their convictions.

The five were among a group of ten young men charged in the murder of Paul Broussard, a gay man who was fatally wounded as he and two friends walked to their car in the Montrose area early in the morning on July 4, 1991. Four other youths have already been sentenced in the case, while the one remaining defendant has not yet been brought to trial.

Jon Christopher Buice, who actually wielded the knife used to stab Broussard, was sentenced to 45 years in prison in May of 1992. In January, three other defendants, Leandro Ramirez and Javier and Jaime Aguirre, were sentenced by a judge to 15 years and one day.

The tenth and final defendant, Paul Chance Dillion, is currently serving a 15-year sentence on an unrelated burglary charge. He is scheduled to go on trial for his part in the Broussard killing in August.

The Boot Camp, run by the Harris County Probation Dept., places inmates aged 17-25 in a highly structured and regimented environment similar to that faced by recruits in the military. The five young

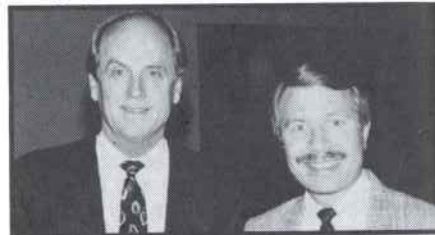
men, who are currently being held in the Harris County Jail, will enter the camp as space becomes available, with no two of the defendants serving in the same platoon.

The five will also be required to attend meetings of the group Parents of Murdered Children for a year and perform 500 hours of service each—at a minimum of 12 hours per month—for the Montrose Activity Center, the Q Patrol and the Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection. In addition, they will be required to pay \$1,600 to Paul Broussard's family and \$300 to one of his friends who was injured in the gay-bashing incident.

## DR. MEL WHITE TO BECOME DEAN OF CATHEDRAL OF HOPE

*Prize-Winning Author Calls on Gays To Join Fight Against Right Wing.*

DALLAS — Dr. Mel White, who will be installed as Dean of the Cathedral of Hope Metropolitan Church on Gay Pride Sunday, was introduced to the congregation of MCC last week during an informal reception in his honor at the church. Dr. White is a best-selling author and prize-winning filmmaker who has moved to Dallas with his partner, Gary Nixon, to launch the Cathedral's national ministry to lesbians and gay men.

According to Dr. White, "This is the moment of truth for our community. The religious and political right are mounting an incredible campaign of hate and disinformation against us. Our freedom, our human rights and even our lives are at stake. The Cathedral of Hope has a wonderful opportunity to lead the way. If we sit out this revolution, it will be a disaster; but

if we mobilize our forces, we can help heal the nation."

Dr. White emphasized the healing theme throughout his visit with the assembled congregation, using film clips from the religious right's film "The Gay Agenda" and other anti-gay propaganda to inspire those in attendance to join him in the "bigot-busting" strategy being adopted by the Cathedral in its ministry.

According to the Rev. Michael S. Piazza, senior pastor at Cathedral of Hope, Dr. White is a welcome addition to the staff and goals of the church. "Dr. White is a passionate and creative new member of our Cathedral team. He is most definitely a valuable asset to our family."

## ACT-UP CALLS FOR BOYCOTT OF HOUSTON DENTAL CLINIC

*Protesters Demand that Castle Accept HIV-Positive Patients.*

HOUSTON — ACT UP/Gulf Coast called last week for a boycott against Castle Dental Center, a local chain of dental treatment clinics that is the target of a lawsuit filed by Harrison Totten, a Houston man who says his treatment was interrupted last year when the clinic found out he was HIV-positive. Castle defended its decision to stop treating Totten as necessary "to protect the health of Castle Dental Center employees." ACT UP counters that the company "has capitulated to AIDS hysteria rather than using education to solve the problem...."

Saturday morning, approximately 30 members of the direct action group gathered in front of the Castle location at 5356 Westheimer. Some of the demonstrators—identified as "OSHA dentists"—wore blue

medical gowns, masks and other protective clothing symbolizing the precautions generally recognized as necessary to protect health care workers and patients from the transmission of HIV and other disease-causing agents.

Other protesters were garbed in torn, dirty, red-streaked gowns that an ACT UP spokesperson said were intended to dramatize Castle's claim that accepting HIV-positive clients would endanger the safety of its employees. An ACT UP spokesperson noted that Saturday marked the 12th anniversary of the first diagnosis of AIDS in the United States.

After deciding he wanted orthodontic braces put on his teeth, Harrison Totten visited a Castle clinic in September of 1991. He was accepted as a patient and informed that his treatment would take approximately two years.

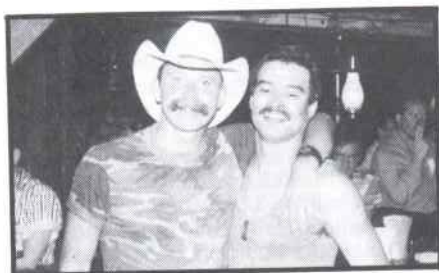
In May of 1992, Totten returned to the clinic for a scheduled teeth cleaning. He filled out a form on which he revealed his HIV-positive status. After a long wait, he left the Center. In June, Totten was given a letter informing him that the clinic had decided to stop treating him "in order to protect the health of Castle Dental Center employees."

Last February, Totten filed suit in the 269th Judicial District Court of Harris County against Castle Dental Center; its owner, Jack H. Castle; and a dentist employed by the chain, charging that they had violated the public accommodations section of the Americans with Disabilities Act [ADA].

In a brief filed with the court, the defendants deny Totten's allegations and further claim that neither Castle Dental Center nor its owner, Jack H. Castle, can be sued. They also insist that Totten lacks standing to sue because he is not a person with a disability as defined in the ADA.

In a letter sent to Castle this week, ACT UP/Gulf Coast threatened to continue its actions against the dental chain unless certain demands are met. The group called on Castle to immediately discontinue its practice of refusing to treat HIV-positive patients; to remove all references to HIV from its patient information forms; to guarantee the confidentiality of each patient's HIV status, if known; and to provide all patients with information on the precautions health care workers are advised to adopt as well as on the low incidence of transmission of HIV to patients in dental treatment settings.
