Los Cabos Getaway

Almost ten years ago, the government of Mexico announced plans to make a concerted effort to expand tourism south of the border, deciding to pay particular attention to the opening of new resort areas throughout the country. One of those areas was Los Cabos (The Capes), situated at the tip of Baja California.

At the time that Los Cabos was visited by Europeans in the 1500s, the only native inhabitants were a nomadic tribe called the Pericue that early missionary fathers described as dark-skinned and sturdy with a kind and generous nature. Fishing has long been an integral part of life in the region, first dominating the local economy in the 1800s when whaling ships plied the cold Pacific waters off the coast and continuing through the early 1960s, when the town's tuna cannery was shut down. Tourism and the abundance of marine life in both the Sea of Cortez and the Pacific Ocean—which surround Los Cabos—revived fishing as one of the primary revenue sources of the natives.

Today, tourism ranks as the primary industry in both San Jose del Cabo and Cabo San Lucas, with luxury hotels and condominium development bringing transplants and tourists to the region for short and longterm stays.

Getting There

Los Cabos International Airport is located approximately eight miles north of San Jose del Cabo and 16 miles north of Cabo San Lucas. It is served by Aero California, Alaska Airlines, Mexicana and United Airlines from the West Coast. Mexicana also provides service from Ciudad Juarez, Denver, Harlingen and San Antonio.

There is no nonstop service from Texas—connections are necessary in Guadalajara or Mexico City—but fear not, because the dearth of regularly scheduled service has resulted in a booming charter industry, with nonstop flights on carriers such as Aeromexico being offered at rock-bottom rates when purchased either separately or as part of an inclusive tour package.

Where to Stay

More than 20 hotels, offering every level of service and amenity, dot the beaches between San Jose del Cabo and Cabo San Lucas. While most of them are locally-owned properties, or part of a Mexican chain, there is a Howard Johnson's in San Jose, and the Radisson, Hyatt and Marriott chains are all planning major hotel construction this year.

The Melia chain has two breathtaking properties, one just south of San Jose del Cabo, the other on the northern fringe of Cabo San Lucas. Both hotels are large, with commanding views of the Sea of Cortez. The Melia San Lucas, in Cabo San Lucas, has an incredible view of the famous Arch at the tip of the Baja Peninsula. As with many properties on Los Cabos, however, they are somewhat off the beaten path, and at some distance from the nightlife of Cabo San Lucas and San Jose del Cabo. Both do, however, offer secluded beaches and pleasant surroundings.

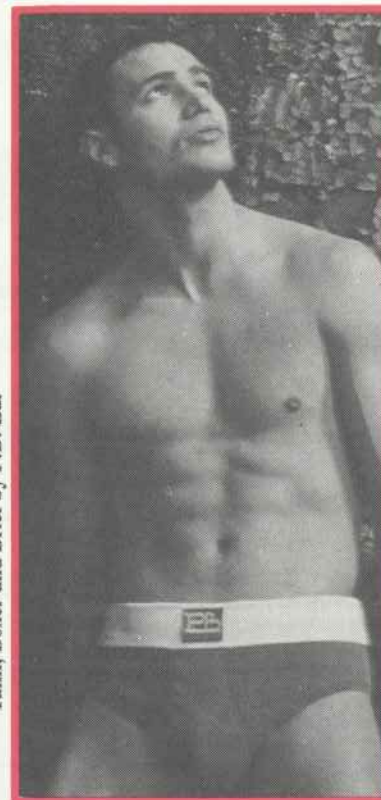
Another popular choice for visitors is the Finisterra, overlooking the harbor and Cabo San Lucas on one side and the Pacific Ocean on the other. It has 63 colonial-style rooms and its own fishing fleet, overlooks a beautiful, wide, white sand beach and is considered the fisherman's hotel.

For convenience and service, the greatest value is the Plaza Las Glorias, located right on the harbor at Cabo San Lucas. With 278 rooms, it is clearly one of the largest hotels in the region. Following the trend of other properties, the hotel is built

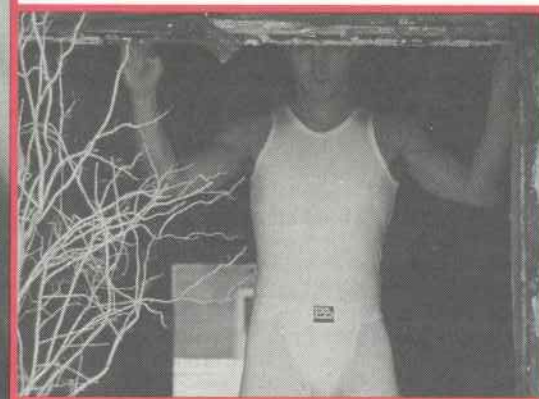

atop a mall featuring gift shops, a liquor store, a grocery store and facilities for boat and fishing charters. Most rooms have an incredible view of the harbor and marina, and are fully equipped with a bar, sitting area and satellite television.

Possibly the greatest feature of this particular hotel is its proximity to everything you might want to do while in Los Cabos. Located on Marina Boulevard, the main street in Cabo San Lucas, it is a short and safe walk to every restaurant and shop in town. And because the hotel is located right on the harbor, water taxis, fishing charters, snorkeling and diving excursions, glass-bottom boats and sunset cruises are all just steps from the door of the hotel. Also located at the harbor are the Plaza Las Glorias' motor launches to the hotel's exclusive Beach Club, located on Cabo San Lucas Bay.

Somewhat surprisingly, we discovered that Cabo San Lucas boasts a gay-owned bed and breakfast, located a short distance from the Melia San Lucas on the Playa el Medano. Villa Alfonso, owned by local celebrity Alfonso Fisher, is a small, intimate hotel that offers the luxury of personal service and private accommodations. Just a five-minute walk into downtown Cabo San Lucas, the facility boasts

12 rooms, all with air conditioning and private bathrooms, and some with whirlpools. A lap pool and outdoor jacuzzi complete the hotel amenities.

What to Do

Because of Cabo San Lucas' location, it should come as no surprise that nautical activities are a recurring theme throughout the course of a visitor's stay. From deep-sea fishing, scuba diving and snorkeling to parasailing, water and jet skiing, sailboarding and kayaking, the clear, warm waters of the area are a natural magnet to adventurers who enjoy the dynamic mixture of sun and surf.

One of the best features of Los Cabos, however, is the area's relaxed and casual atmosphere. Many tourists to the area are drawn, not by the wide variety of sporting activities offered, but by the fact that there is ample time and space to do nothing but lay in the sun. Either by the pool or on one of over two dozen beautiful beaches, sunbathing is definitely the activity of choice for many people. Some of the most beautiful beaches include the one at Hotel Finisterra, popular for its thundering surf and whale watching during the winter months; Lover's Beach, located just before the landmark Arch and boasting beautiful

white sand on both the Pacific and Cabo San Lucas Bay sides; and Playa el Medano, where the Plaza Las Glorias Beach Club is located.

After a morning of sun, many visitors enjoy shopping in one of the many open-air markets and shops throughout both San Jose del Cabo and Cabo San Lucas. As with any tourist destination in Mexico, merchandise offered at any one vendor can also be obtained in the booths or shops next door, or from one of the many vendors who ply the beaches in search of tourist dollars. In virtually all instances, feel free to bargain, as almost all vendors would rather take something over nothing.

Where to Eat

With fishing such a major aspect of the area's attraction and economy, seafood restaurants are prevalent, and seafood is available in every eatery in both Cabo San Lucas and San Jose del Cabo. Campy names are a staple throughout the area, with monikers like Senor Sushi and Tai Won On Bar being common.

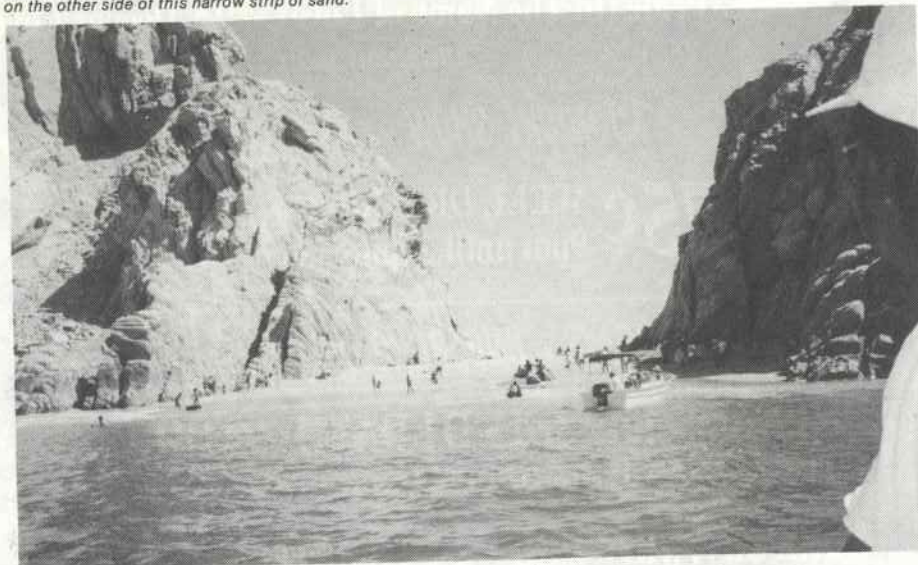
Some of the best seafood—and food in general—can be found in the hotel restaurants. The Blue Marlin restaurant in the Finisterra offers American and Mexican breakfasts and varied lunch and dinner menus in the air-conditioned restaurant or

on the patio. The Baja Cantina, in the Plaza Las Glorias Hotel, offers views of the marina, as well as the best buffalo wings in Mexico and Cabo's best happy hour from 3-6 p.m.

Italian restaurants also play a big part in the local dining scene. Romeo and Julieta, off Marina Blvd. near the entrance to Pedregal de Cabo San Lucas, features authentic Italian cuisine served by an attentive staff in a romantic setting. Equally good is the Galeon restaurant, further down Marina Blvd. near the Solmar Hotel entrance. Its Neapolitan-style gourmet cuisine includes pizzas, seafood, fresh pasta and more, and its piano bar lounge and second-floor views of the harbor and town offer pleasant ambience to the delicious food.

New to the restaurant scene, and featuring gay owners and management and a friendly and attentive staff, is Myla's Bistrot, located between Carlos and Charlie's and the Giggling Marlin on Marina Blvd. Owned by the same man who offers the gay and lesbian tourist Villa Alfonso's—the only gay bed and breakfast on Baja—this charming new eatery offers chicken, beef and seafood entrees with a continental flair at reasonable prices. Alfonso Fisher, the proprietor of Myla's Bistrot and Villa Alfonso, offers another fine dining choice, and this one is in the

oldest traditional restaurant in Cabo San Lucas. Restaurant Alfonso's offers intimate and elegant dining in a relaxed atmosphere—all with the grace and sophistication that Alfonso Fisher is noted for.

Nightlife

Partying is as important to Cabo's visitors as fishing and sunning are, and the town's residents are more than happy to accommodate. All the town's restaurants and hotels feature bars and club facilities—many with dance floors—so finding a place to unwind or wind up should be no problem.

For our readership, however, we wholeheartedly recommend El Squid Roe. While there are no exclusively gay nightspots in Los Cabos, Squid Roe comes the closest to it. Here, locals and tourists mingle for the good food and drink provided by its

unique and gregarious staff. "Squidbusters" circulate throughout the place, squirting tequila shots and force-guzzling sangria into the mouths of unsuspecting patrons. Tablecloths substitute for trampolines as gorgeous waiters bounce captive diners in the air in a ritual acrobatic routine. It's hard to tell the players without a score card, especially since almost any man (or woman) is fair game until their dates or spouses return.

We were also advised that San Jose del Cabo does possess a gay bar, *Senor Baco*. Pepe Rosales, the manager of Myla's Bistrot, advised us that safety would be a concern, however, so we opted against it.

Special Considerations

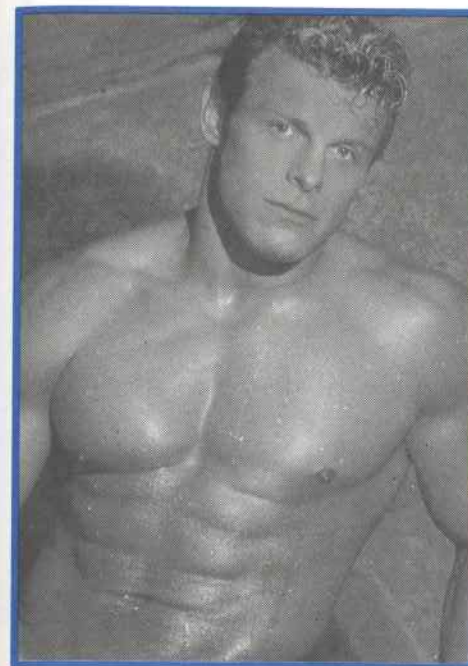
* Mexico is currently undergoing a currency conversion. While the basic conversion rate is simple (3 new pesos = \$1 vs. 3,000 old pesos = \$1), not all Mexican currency reflects the change yet. As a result, you may still be given change in 20,000 old peso notes (which only equals a little less than \$7), necessitating not only a dollar-to-peso conversion, but an old peso-to-new peso conversion as well. It is not necessary to convert your American money to pesos; all establishments we patronized took both pesos and dollars.

* Los Cabos is located on the Tropic of Cancer, so the sun is stronger than just about any place else in North America. Sunning only during the morning hours is advised, and even then, use strong sunblocks.

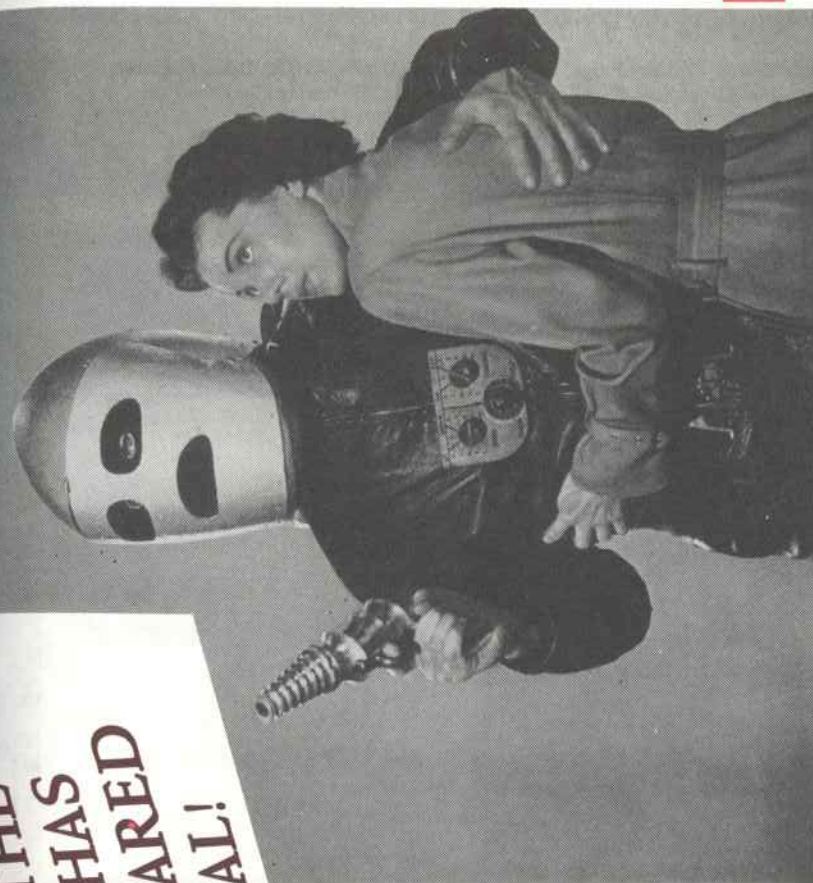

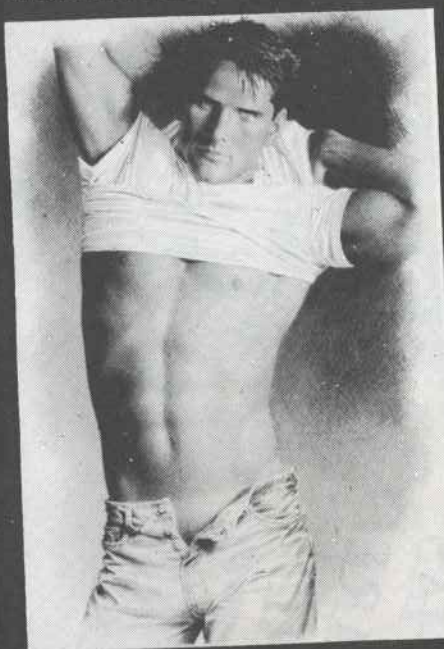

Under the Southern Cross



Claire McNab, Detective Inspector Carol Ashton's Creator, Moves from Mystery into Romance With Her Newest Novel

Under the Southern Cross by Claire McNab; 180 pages; fiction; The Nalad Press, Inc., P.O. Box 10543, Tallahassee, FL 32302; \$9.95.

"Best-selling author" was enough to grab my attention at first. Now that fiction about women in the lesbian community is becoming more readily available, I can afford the luxury of being more selective. After reading *Under the Southern Cross* by Claire McNab, I was not disappointed. McNab has a writing style that is easy to read yet adds a dimension of greater literary quality to lesbian fiction.

Fans of McNab are already familiar with that style from her first four Detective Inspector Carol Ashton mysteries, *Lessons in Murder*, *Fatal Reunion*, *Death Down Under* and *Cop Out*. They appreciate the author already for the talent she has shown for bringing passionate encounters into her tightly woven plots.

McNab's new novel should not be a disappointment to those fans. Her first attempt at romance writing still has all the suspense of mystery writing, minus the murder. Instead of wondering "whodunit?" I found myself anticipating whether these two women from very different worlds would ever be able to resolve their differences and get together. It's good, suspenseful reading, even as a romance.

Claire McNab is an Aussie who un-

abashedly loves her country and "believes that every person should explore the beauties of Australia for herself and find out if Aussies really do say, 'G'day!'"

Some critics have accused McNab of turning her latest novel into a travel brochure for her beloved and indeed beautiful-sounding country. However, after one learns that the two main characters are in the tourism industry and that the plot necessarily leads them to many of the scenic vistas available to tourists, McNab's descriptions of the Australian countryside seem entirely justified.

The story is told in the first person by Alexandra Findlay, who works for a large Australian travel agency and has the responsibility of tapping the tourism potential of other countries. Alex is also a woman who has problems coming to terms with her love for women and has views about commitment that are very different from those of her love interest in the story.

Lee Paynter, on the other hand, is very open about her sexuality and is not accustomed to making commitments in her relationships...or to falling in love. Lee, an American, has built her small travel agency into a tour company with an international reputation.

When the two women from different continents with different values and different levels of comfort about their gay lifestyle collide, the reader is left wondering whether this will be a case of "love con-

Lee comes to Australia as a tour wholesaler to explore the possibility of expanding her company's presence in the Pacific region. Alex's boss gives her the special task of courting Lee's interest. "Alexandra, I want you to regard Lee Paynter as your special responsibility," he tells her. "You'll be her minder, and I want you to keep her happy. Do whatever she asks...within reason, of course."


Though their first encounters are uncomfortable, I could tell right away they were interested in one another. Still, Claire McNab saves their first kiss for the sixth chapter and their more amorous encounters for chapter eight. It's not until the end of *Under the Southern Cross* that we find out whether they will really be able to be together in a more meaningful way. For me, McNab's artful use of anticipation made the book an especially good read.

For readers who love depictions of spectacular scenery, Claire McNab's writing is a visual delight. In one scene, the women look down on a rainforest. "To me the lush vegetation seemed to seethe in a relentless struggle for existence. Trees, vines, ferns, palms, scrabbled for space and light. Insects hummed, the moisture rose like a palpable mist, the very earth seemed voluptuously alive. Far below us was a narrow coastal plain and then the brilliant aquamarine of the Coral Sea, blurring where the green snake of the Daintree River blended with it."

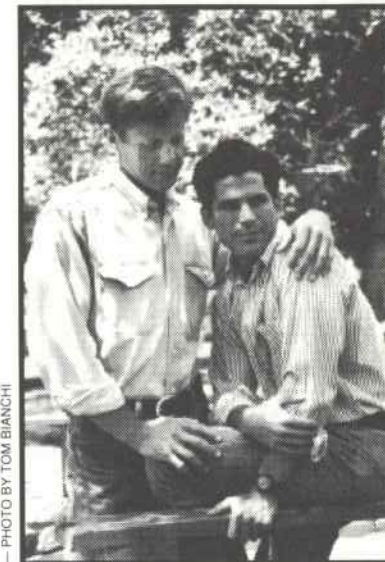
There are several interesting subplots interwoven with the romance building between Alexandra and Lee. One of these involves a friend of Alexandra's at work who comes out to her and struggles over whether to let an ambitious co-worker manipulate him with a threat to out him to their boss. When he finally decides to tell the boss himself, he tells Alexandra, "This could be hello world—and goodbye job."

These interesting little conflicts within the major plot of the story are another reason this book makes especially good reading.

Under the Southern Cross may not be the next Carol Ashton mystery that Claire McNab's faithful fans were waiting for, but I believe readers won't be disappointed in this well-written romance.

For those who like, McNab has recently promised us that another romance is already in the works and will be called *Silent Heart*.

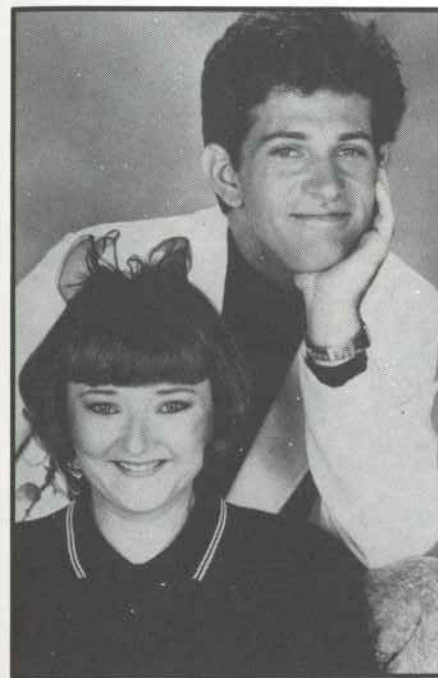

If you're familiar with the famous 1940's *Life* magazine photo of a couple locked in a victory smooch, then you'll immediately place the time and situation of *Dating Ourselves* from its opening image. The year is 1945 and Douglas, a recently returned sailor, sweeps Grace almost literally off her feet. These are two of the characters portrayed by Michael Caldwell and Rachel Winfree, who also wrote this brisk comedy which follows one Houston family from this postwar chance beginning to the present in 20 brief scenes.

After their marriage, workaholic Douglas throws himself into the gasoline business, eventually establishing a successful chain of service stations. Grace, having tasted a bit of freedom as a munitions worker during the war, somewhat regretfully but efficiently fulfills her expected role as wife, and mother to three children, though she never loses her independent spirit. Grace and Douglas watch with varying degrees of bewilderment as their kids begin to make their own ways in life.

James, the oldest son, like his mother, takes the conventional path, marrying his high school sweetheart Diane, producing

a son and chasing success in the advertising business. Middle child Valerie is a spitfire whose first defining moment comes while running the cash register at her father's station. A second moment comes when she accidentally drops acid at a concert in the Astrodome, an experience which she claims sets her free by reaching to her inner core (though until that moment, she says, "I didn't even know I *had* an inner core!"). Bill, the youngest, dismays his father in 1971 by going out on Halloween dressed as his sister. Six years later, he zaps in for one last dance at the hot new disco, telling how his current boyfriend is likely the one with whom he's fated to spend the rest of his life... unless it's the guy he just tricked with in a van.

Soon the seeds of dysfunctionality take root. James sacrifices his marriage to his ambitions, and then loses at business as well. Valerie finds climbing the corporate ladder more difficult than imagined, and even after having gained some measure of success in her work, she can't seem to fit a personal life into her busy schedule. Bill, on the unending quest for his one and only

love, seems to find it, only to come face-to-face with the reality of the '80s. Still, they each plow ahead, senses of humor frayed but intact, through marriages and divorces, births and deaths.

These are no terribly new dramatic notions in *Dating Ourselves*, nor any great insights imparted. This is pretty familiar ground by and large, in some ways reminiscent of Rob Nash's *12 Steps to a More Dysfunctional You* in its quick sketches of a "typical" American family, or even (shudder) Thornton Wilder's trapped-in-amber slice of life, *Our Town*. However, Winfree and Caldwell, with strong backgrounds in comedy, wisely play to their strengths. The laughs are delivered at a consistent pace. The humor serves to balance, but not overwhelm, the pathos, so that *Dating Ourselves* is neither too frothy nor too mired in stale melodrama.

As performers, Caldwell and Winfree serve their material well. Ms Winfree's Valerie is a force of nature, and she imbues practical Grace and unsure Diane with believably jittery life. Mr. Caldwell is more successful in delineating his various characters, from the quiet stoicism of Douglas, to the ineffectual rage in James, to the sequins-over-steel perseverance of Bill. Though both performers do well in their monologues, they shine most in interaction, especially between Valerie and a lecherous faux-Continental co-worker named Deeko ("My father is Italian and my mother is... international."), and in a crisis intervention hotline call from Diane to Bill, who may be the worst hotline volunteer ever. And together they manage to bring off the sweet ending with unforced grace. The two share an obvious chemistry (which seems to continue offstage: having just celebrated their first anniversary, this production is part of "the honeymoon tour").

All in all, you would do well to explore "family values" with Grace and Douglas and their brood. It's probably more fun than spending 90 minutes with your own family.

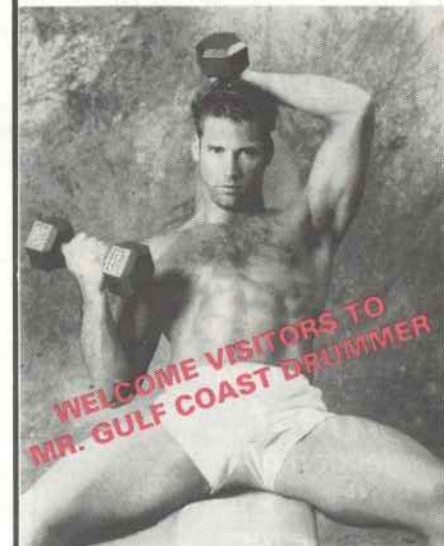

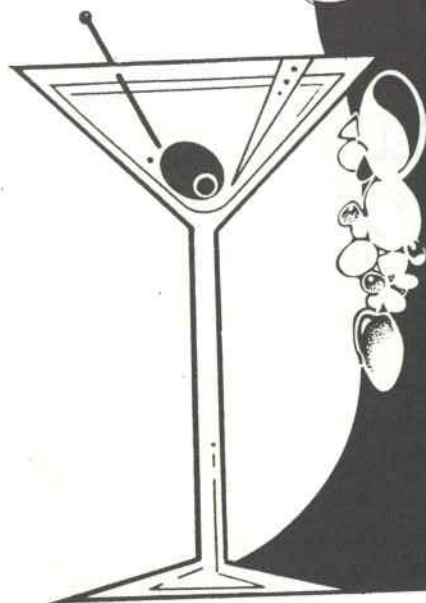

Grateful to Stone, Others

Dear TWT:

It goes without saying that there are high levels of alcoholism, drug addiction and other addictive behaviors which get in the way of the lives of those of us within the gay community. We often become overwhelmed by these behavior patterns, and feel as though there is nowhere for us to go for help; so we spend a long time doing nothing, and thinking that there is no one who could possibly ever understand our plight. What a miserable way of life.

Recently I felt this way, but I remembered a friend, Sharon Stone, and I gave her a call. Sharon suggested that I enter West Oaks Hospital for treatment, which I did, and she followed me there.

Four days later, my significant other of several years also entered the same hospital, to my surprise, and after talking with Sharon Stone himself. I had left her numbers with him when I entered the hospital. Sharon and her staff were able to talk and work with the hospital administration, clinical and medical directors, and hospital staff, to accommodate the hospital stay for both my significant other and me. From a patient's viewpoint, there was total and complete cooperation between West Oaks Hospital and Sharon Stone and Associates. Never once was anything negative brought out concerning our lifestyle or the fact that we were lovers. This simply was not an issue affecting the fact that we were there to seek help. However, relationship issues were a need that had to be addressed, and these issues were also confronted while we were there.

I'm not sure what life has in store for me, but, being sober, it's got to be better than where I was headed before. I can't answer all the questions concerning my relationship, but I am at least able to cope today, and I am relieved to know that he, too, is also sober. We both have a chance at life today that we were throwing away a month ago, so, together or not, we are



both a lot better off as a result of our decision and the intervention of Sharon Stone.

I am grateful to Sharon Stone and Associates, but also to West Oaks Hospital, Dr. Eugene Degner, M.D., and Dr. Walter J. DeFoy, M.D. for their care, understanding and support. I am grateful that there was a house at the end of the block for a person such as myself who happens to be gay, and that my lifestyle and relationship did not prevent me from getting the help I needed. I am relieved that I was able to feel comfortable, and that the issues that I needed to deal with were, in fact, addressed. I am grateful that I had a friend in Sharon Stone, who led me to the place that I needed to be, and that through her intervention and devotion she was able to cut out a lot of the red tape and homophobic ways that I might otherwise have had to encounter.

Turtle Creek Chorale Takes Dallas To the "Movies" for Season Finale

Despite the incredible technological advances mankind has made in the last 100 years, the human animal remains very much a superstitious entity, guided as much by myths and misconceptions as it is by reason and intuition. We are cautioned not to walk on cracks in the sidewalk, and the number 13 is banned from airline flight numbers and elevator boards because of its supposed power to destroy.

Given our adversion to the number 13, one would expect that the 13th season of the Turtle Creek Chorale just ended would be rife with challenges and conflicts. But if the chorus is nothing else, it is the penultimate debunker of outdated myths. From the brilliance of the Chorale's and Lay Family Organ's stunning duets at the Mort last October through the standing ovation offered for the group's debut performance at Carnegie Hall in New York, Dallas' musical ambassadors to the world proved once and for all that 13 is merely the number that comes before 14.

No performance better exemplified the growth of the Chorale this season than its finale, "Movies," presented at the Morton Meyerson Symphony Center last week. This multimedia presentation—featuring celebrity lookalikes and film clips from some of Hollywood's greatest cinematic events—captured all the glamour and excitement of a world premiere, while retaining the simplicity and beauty of an aria.

As always, Artistic Director Dr. Timothy Seelig's mastery of camp and satire—coupled with his compassionate and humanitarian countenance—transformed what in someone else's hands could have been a routine musical experience into a breathtaking symphony of sight and sound. With the simple addition of the aforementioned film clips, Seelig was able to provide a visual stimulus to comple-

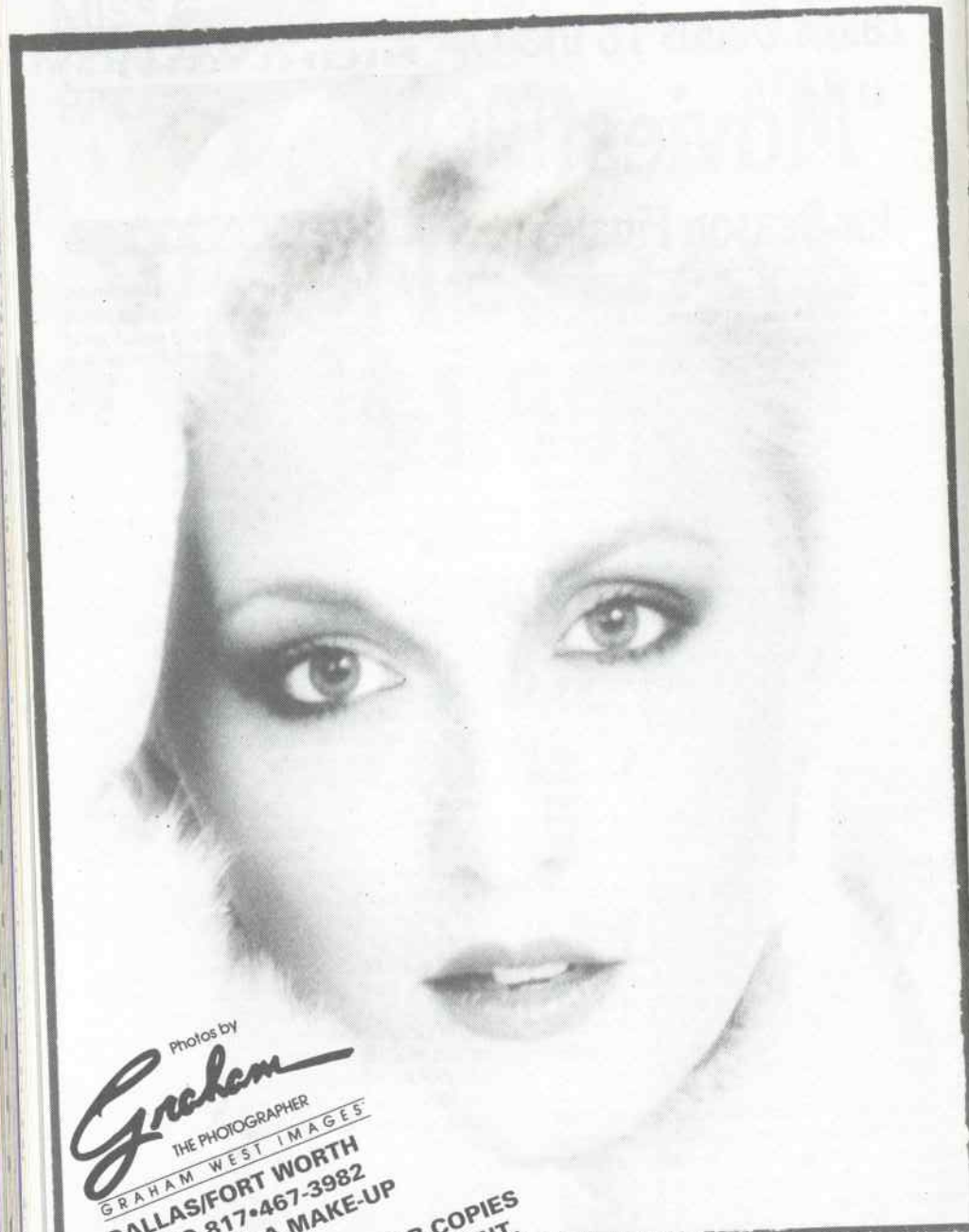
ment the intoxicating harmonies achieved by the Chorale. And with drag-inspired choreography and lip-synching an integral part of the concert, "Movies" became a complete expression of gay entertainment.

If one were asked to choose particularly satisfying moments in the show, it would be difficult, just as it would be difficult to pick a favorite painting or sculpture in the Louve—each element is an integral part of the whole. For this reviewer, however, there were a few standouts. Gabriel's "Oboe," "Alleluia" and "On Earth as It Is in Heaven"—comprising "The Mission" segment of the concert—were majestically inspiring, and "I Will Follow Him" from *Sister Act* was properly irreverent.

It was the entire "Romance" segment, arranged by Anne Albritton, however, that left me awestruck. Featuring "Moon River" from *Breakfast at Tiffany's*, "Somewhere My Love" from *Doctor Zhivago*, "A Time for Us" from *Romeo and Juliet* and "My Secret Love" from *Calamity Jane*—and highlighted with scenes from those films plus *Longtime Companion*—it was the most moving and breathtaking aspect of the total experience. So moving, in fact, that audience and Chorale members alike were spotted dabbing their eyes during the group's much-deserved standing ovation.

It was this genuine emotion that exemplifies the caring and concern that the Turtle Creek Chorale has become famous for. As the group has faced the loss of so many of its members to AIDS, supporters and fans have not been excluded from the group's grieving—we have been included because, as family members, our support is essential and healing. And in this sometimes cold world of myth and legend, there are still people who genuinely love and care and feel.

That, quite possibly, is the greatest debunked myth of all.

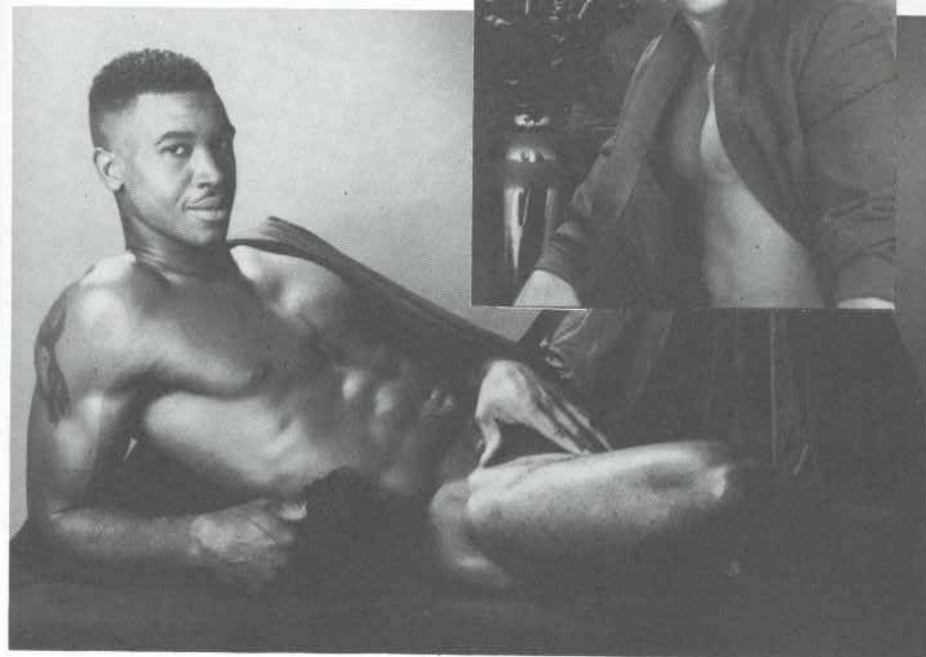
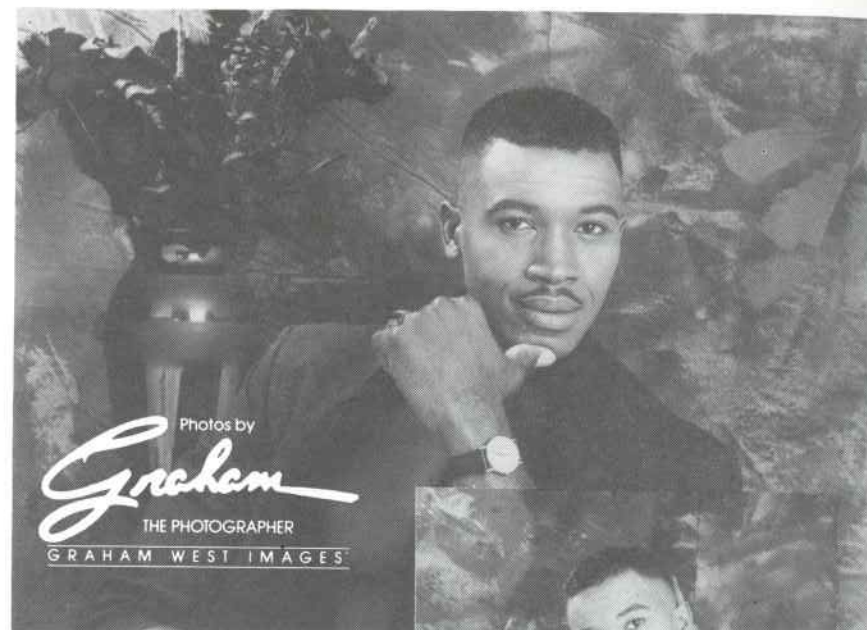


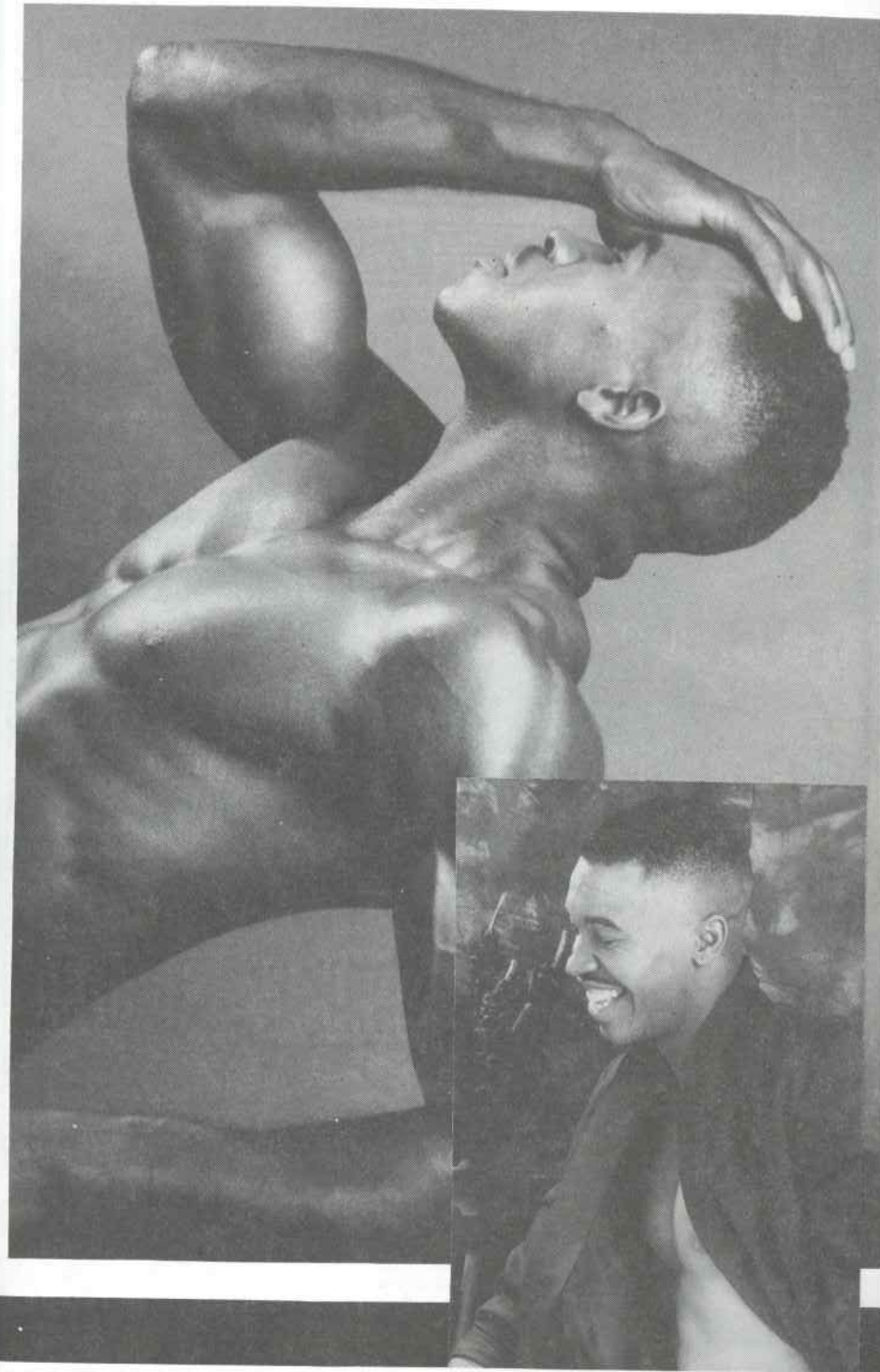
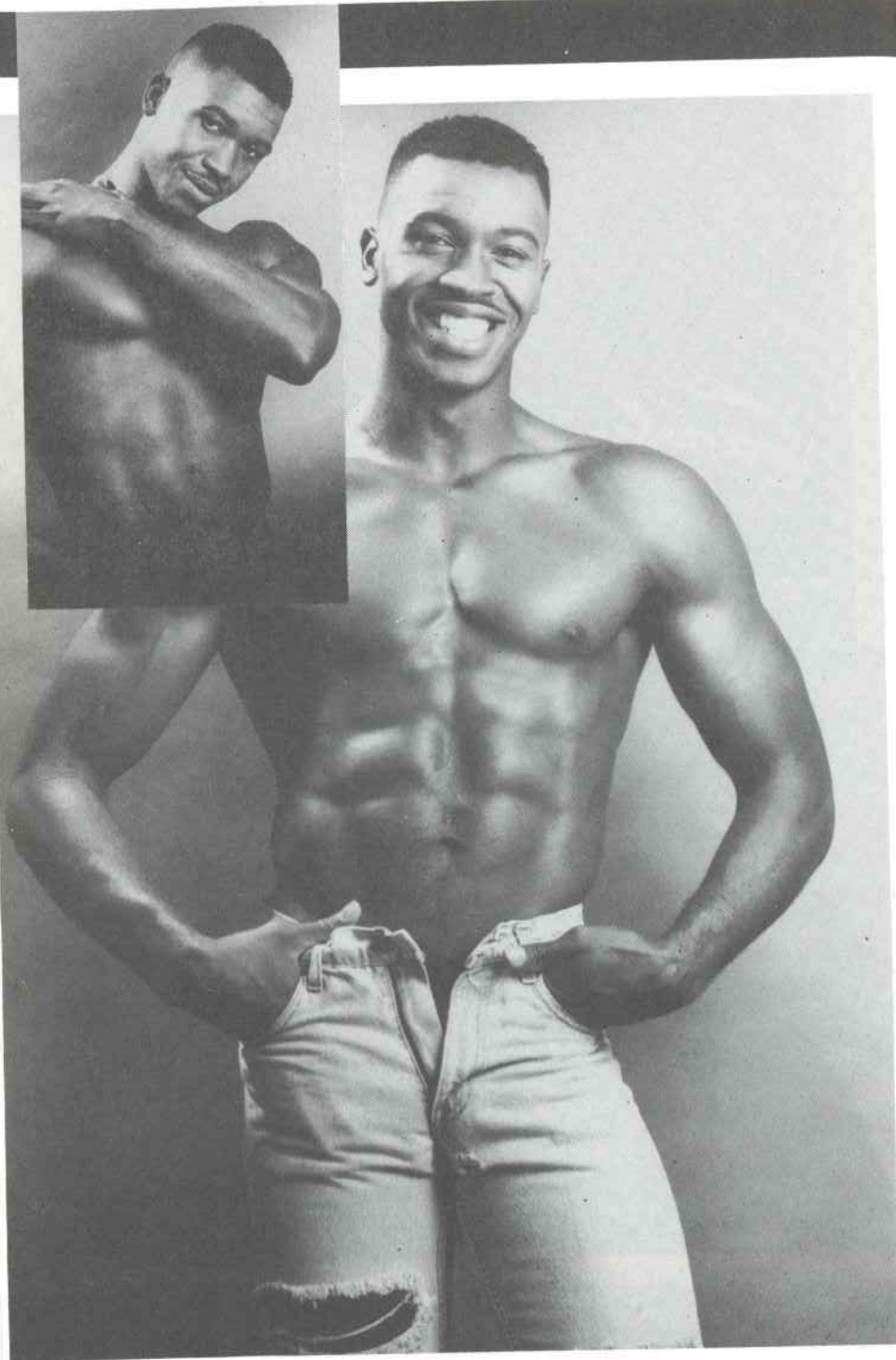
ON OUR COVER LARRY L. YOUNG

CANDLELIGHT VIGIL HELD AT CAPITOL TO PROTEST INCLUSION OF SODOMY LAW IN NEW PENAL CODE

*Activists Pledge Continuing Effort
For Full Civil Rights.*

AUSTIN — Carrying lit candles and chanting "We will be free," a group of over 100 people gathered at the state Capitol last Monday evening to protest the inclusion of an anti-homosexual conduct statute in the revised state penal code. Organizers said the vigil was the first of several such events that will be staged throughout the state.

"Gays and lesbians are tired of second-class citizenship and will become increasingly visible, increasingly noisy and increasingly demanding that we have equal civil rights," attorney Tom Doyal of Austin told reporters before the vigil started.

Doyal is one of five plaintiffs in a civil suit now before the Texas Supreme Court challenging the sodomy law. The plaintiffs contend that the law, which applies only to gay men and lesbians, violates the right to privacy contained in the Texas Constitution. The court heard arguments involving the case at the beginning of this year and is expected to rule on it soon.

The sodomy law, Section 21.06 of the current state penal code, is considered a serious impediment to the attainment of full civil rights by gay and lesbian Texans because, even though it has rarely if ever been enforced, it is used to discriminate against gay and lesbian people in the areas of housing rights, employment, education, public policy and insurance. Early versions of the revised penal code did not contain

a sodomy provision, but a joint House and Senate conference committee considering the proposed penal code voted narrowly to retain the law.

The vigil was organized by the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas [LGRL] and the Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus. LGRL Executive Director Laurie Eiserloh told TWT NEWS several more such events are planned for different cities around the state.

Sonny Hood, an assistant city attorney and ALGPC co-chair, said his organization is working to get people elected on all levels. Hood also cited the fact that gay and lesbian dollars have gone a long way in helping elect officials, and those who have received such support in the past should be aware of this power.

Gov. Ann Richards is expected to sign the new penal code into law.

Paul Clover, an activist for gay and lesbian civil rights, declared, "We will keep fighting and keep coming back because we're unwilling to continue to be hurt."

DALLAS GEARING UP FOR LIFE WALK '93

*Kickoff Party for OLCS Fund-raiser
To Be Held Next Wednesday
At Loews Anatole Hotel.*

DALLAS — Take thousands of committed participants; the corporate sponsorship of some of Dallas' largest companies, in addition to several Fortune 500 companies; and a goal of providing compassionate care to the growing numbers of people challenged by HIV/AIDS in the Dallas area, and what you will create is

LifeWalk '93, a 10K walkathon benefiting the AIDS-related programs of Oak Lawn Community Services [OLCS]. Last year's event increased walker participation by 364% and total monies raised by 276% over 1991 totals. This year's walk is scheduled for Sunday, October 3.

For the second year in a row, Carolyn Roney and Bruce Russell will co-chair LifeWalk. In 1992, over 2,600 walkers raised more than \$240,000 and, according to Roney, attracted teams from all over the Metroplex and from as far away as Oklahoma. In all, over 215 teams participated in last year's walk. One reason for the success of the annual event is the enthusiasm shown by its volunteers. In fact, LifeWalk is organized and staffed by an all-volunteer committee.

This year's Honorary Chairpersons are John Criswell, KDFW-TV4 news anchor, and Congresswoman Eddie Bernice Johnson. Returning as presenting and corporate sponsors are Caven Enterprises, Curaflex Infusion Services, EDGE-94FM Radio, KDFW-TV4, Miller Lite Beer, Sabre Travel Information Network and the Dallas Morning News. Joining as sponsors this year are the Loews Anatole Hotel and Transportation Display, Inc.

OLCS and its six primary AIDS care service programs have greatly benefited from the success of LifeWalk through the years. While funded by government grants, private foundation grants, private donations, client fees and fund-raising events such as LifeWalk, the organization has seen its services and facilities stretched because of the enormous increase in the numbers of persons with AIDS that it serves.

A community-based, nonprofit organization founded in 1981, OLCS provides counseling to persons affected by AIDS and their families and friends; AIDS education programs to educational, business and religious groups; adult day care for PWAs through the Daire Center; free transportation to medical and social services for people with AIDS; 24-hour information and referral services in English and Spanish through its AIDS Hotline; and trained volunteers who support people with AIDS through the Buddy Project.

HOUSTON — Organizers of the fifth annual Houston Pride Awards are calling on the community to submit nominations for this year's awards, which will honor outstanding members of the community at the Pride Awards Ceremony to be held in October.

The Pride Awards are sponsored by Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection and the Montrose Activity Center.

Changes have been made in the process used to select nominees and winners. Last year, Awards nominees were chosen by a committee of community representatives. Winners were chosen through a vote open to the entire community. This year, anyone may nominate one or more individuals, organizations, businesses or community events, and a panel of judges chosen by the two sponsoring organizations will select the honorees based on their achievements or contributions in any three of a wide range of areas.

While noted guest speakers have been a part of past awards shows, this year planners have decided not to bring in a celebrity keynoter, primarily out of a desire to refocus the spotlight on the honorees. Cost was also a factor in the decision.

Winners will be selected on the basis of their achievements in a broad range of areas including financial success and economic innovation, philanthropic contributions or voluntary service, cultural contributions, legal reform, academic leadership or accomplishments, and moral and religious leadership. As in the past,

awards will be presented in several different categories, including "Promoting Pride by a Local Business," "Promoting Pride by Community Service Provider," "Promoting Pride through Political Action (Individual)" and "Promoting Pride by Entertainment (Individual)." A Lifetime Pride Award will also be presented.

AIDS SERVICES OF AUSTIN CHOSEN AS COMMUNITY PROJECT BY JUNIOR LEAGUE

Charitable Group to Provide Volunteers, \$55,000 to Food Bank, Jack Sansing Dental Clinic.

AUSTIN — The Junior League of Austin, Inc., has selected AIDS Services of Austin [ASA] as a 1993-94 League Community Project. The decision means that the League will provide the agency with over \$50,000 in financial assistance as well as volunteers to assist with the ASA food bank and PWA dental clinic. ASA, the city's largest AIDS service organization, was one of 15 local agencies designated as community projects by the League this year.

ASA submitted a grant requesting that League members work as volunteers in the food bank and hold canned food drives. ASA's request for \$23,222.40 to buy liquid nutritional supplements was also approved.

The League also approved a request for support of the Jack Sansing Dental Clinic, which provides dental and oral medical care at no cost to people with HIV and AIDS who cannot obtain care elsewhere. The Clinic will receive \$33,040 as well as volunteers to assist with Clinic operations.

The League's decision makes this the second year that the charitable organization, whose members are committed to promoting volunteerism and to improving the community through the efforts of trained volunteers, has provided assistance to ASA. Last year the group designated ASA as a 1992-93 Community Project, providing funding and volunteers to the food bank.

League members are scheduled to begin their volunteer placements in September, with the program running through May of next year.

NELSON-TEBEDO CLINIC PRESENTS LESBIAN HEALTH FAIR NEXT SATURDAY

Address by Charlotte Taft, Workshops & Exhibits to Highlight All-Day Event.

DALLAS — Faced with statistics indicating that as many as one out of every three lesbians has a chemical dependency problem or may eventually develop breast cancer—in addition to the fact that studies have shown that lesbians receive less preventative or screening health care than their heterosexual counterparts—activists submitted a proposal on lesbian health issues to Secretary of Health and Human Services Donna Shalala during March on Washington activities last April. And while those who met with Shalala are optimistic about the potential for eventual action on those proposals, most are realizing that there is no time to await action by the Federal government to deal with the issues facing the lesbian community. More, it would seem, must be done on the local level.

The Nelson-Tebedo Community Clinic's Women's Health Program is just one of many agencies in Texas that aren't waiting for Federal assistance in the fight to improve health care for lesbians. Staffworkers at Nelson-Tebedo realize that education is one of the most effective methods of safeguarding health and, with that in mind, will present the Second Annual Lesbian Health Fair next Saturday, June 26, at the Cathedral of Hope Metropolitan Community Church. The Fair will be dedicated to lesbian health issues with an intended goal of providing a safe, friendly and sensitive environment in which gay women can learn more about preventative care. Organizers hope to present a holistic approach to a productive and healthier life.

This year's theme is "Greater Awareness = Greater Choice," and, according to organizers, "reflects the greatest hope for health and wellness in our community. We

cannot change who we are, nor would we want to. However, we can make changes which will support our health and wellness."

Highlights of the event will include a keynote address by Charlotte Taft, who will deal with issues of being female and lesbian in American culture. Taft will also explore how internalized oppression can manifest itself in neglect of one's health.

Workshops will also be offered to participants, covering a wide spectrum of topics including safer sex; emotional and love addiction; women and spirituality; breast cancer; battering; chemical dependency; health empowerment; and wellness and holistic health. All workshops will be conducted by community members who are considered experts in their fields.

In addition to workshops, an exhibit area will offer networking and informational opportunities available to lesbians. Breakfast and lunch will be provided.

The Lesbian Health Fair begins at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday and runs until 5 p.m. that afternoon. Cost of the fair is \$10. Following the event, organizers will hold a dance at the Gay and Lesbian Community Center, 2701 Reagan at Brown, from 8 p.m.-midnight.

HOUSTON PHYSICIANS TO GIVE UPDATE ON NINTH INTERNATIONAL AIDS CONFERENCE

Monday, June 28 Event at Wyndham Warwick Open to Public.

HOUSTON — Has any real progress been made in the last year on developing anti-HIV vaccines? How has the spread of drug-resistant tuberculosis affected the fight against AIDS? What is the significance of recent studies that question the effectiveness of AZT in the early treatment of HIV disease? Houstonians interested in the latest thinking on these and other HIV-related issues will have an opportunity to increase their knowledge on June 28, when the Houston Clinical Research Network presents a Houston Community Update on the recently concluded Berlin Ninth International Conference on AIDS.

The update will feature a panel of local physicians, HIV researchers and commu-

nity members. Scheduled to speak are Wayne Bockmon, M.D.; Steven Bradley; Roderick Frazier, M.D.; Richard Grimes, Ph.D.; Chris Jimmerson; Charles Manner, M.D.; Amjad Najjar, M.D.; Scott Sawyer, M.D., and Edward Stool, M.D. Dr. Joseph Gathe will serve as moderator.

Panelists will speak briefly on a variety of HIV-related topics, after which questions will be taken from the audience.

The Community Update is sponsored by the Houston Clinical Research Network, an arm of the Montrose Clinic that coordinates trials of experimental HIV treatments in the Houston area.
