Sweethearts on Parade A World War I Tale

One of the two, a doughboy, died on a muddy battlefield in France 76 years ago; the other lies dying in Dallas' Baylor Hospital today. The nurse explains, "His mind comes and goes." I sit on the side of Wally's bed and fondly hold his fragile, almost-cold hands in mine, hoping that, somehow, some of my warm life can seep

into his failing one. Sometimes, for a few moments, he smiles. Does he recognize me? I think he does. And then he fades out. What can I do? Shall I softly sing to him?


Oh, how they used to sing in the evenings, gathered around the piano in the parlor of the YMCA. Not that modern monstrosity of today over on Ross Avenue, nor even the graceful Art Deco Y that used to stand 13 stories high on North Ervey, but the small Renaissance Revival Y on Commerce, built around 1910. The "sheiks" of the roaring twenties would lift the fifth floor rafters with a lusty

*Runnin' wild, lost control
Runnin' wild, mighty bold.
Feeling gay, reckless too....*

A few of the boys, the bold ones, would dance the naughty Shimmy.

*I may be late, but I'd be up to date,
If I could shimmy like my sister Kate.*

"If You Knew Susie Like I Know Susie," "Yes, We Have No Bananas," "Singing in the Rain."... On and on they went. But not all the songs were contemporary. Sometimes they'd sing the nostalgic songs of World War I. Then, Wally's rich, warm, light-baritone voice would drop out. No "Hinky, Dinky, Parley Voo" for him. No "K-K-K-Katy." Understandably, he couldn't



The teenage sweethearts had met in the swimming pool of the Y. (Perhaps here, the writer should explain to the young 'uns that there was a time—strange as it may seem—when only men trained at the YMCA; women went to the YWCA. And neither would dare "darken the doorsteps" of the other. Here, too, needs to be explained a universal truism. Deny it as Y officials may, and despite their prohibitions, the fact remains that where you have a lot of young men and no women, there are going to be a lot of gay men—be it in the Navy, the CCC camps or the Boy Scouts, especially if the men swim nude. And that's exactly what they used to do in the Y. Since every man's plumbing was similar, swimsuits were unnecessary and simply not allowed. Not ever!)
Although the two young men were drawn to each other at first sight, both were shy and each waited for the other to make the first timid move. But in time, a slick, wet young body slightly touched the other, and nature could not be denied. They became friends and shared their love for band concerts in the park, the Carnegie Library next door to the Y and nature walks along densely-wooded Turtle Creek. But mostly, they just enjoyed being with each other. They vowed their love till death. And then, too soon, one sweetheart marched off to die in the war to end all wars.

But life goes on, as they say, and there's magic. Although untrained, Wally's voice was good enough that he was invited to sing a medley of songs from *Show Boat* from the stage of the Majestic Theatre when the silent movie version of that Broadway show played Dallas in the late 1920s. And he projected that voice several times from the stage of the Dallas Little Theatre when that company was world renowned and said to rival even Broadway.

He was there on the nights when the Majestic and the Palace Theatres opened and applauded the great vaudeville acts. He heard Caruso and Melba sing when the Metropolitan Opera came to town. He attended the opening of the Texas Centennial of 1936. Many a night he sat in the band shell by the lagoon to see all the romantic Starlight Operettas of the wartime 1940s. And he was part of the downtown celebration when World War II ended.



Yet, even in crowds, he was alone. He had had one great love, and for some reason never loved again. By choice? I'm not sure. But I believe he was never lonely. Not really. He had a few friends, but most of the time he enjoyed the solitude of his collected life.

I say "collected," because that's what his life was, collected and organized. How fortunate for the Dallas Gay and Lesbian Historic Archives, as we—you and I as well as thousands to come after us—are the beneficiary of many of his treasures: books and personally signed photos of long-forgotten silent screen stars; original programs of D.W. Griffith's *Way Down East* (1920), *The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse* (1921), Cecil B. DeMille's *The Ten Commandments* (1923), *Ben Hur* starring (gay) idol Ramon Navarro (1926), *Gone With the Wind* (1939) and *Quo Vadis* (1952).

There are also early recordings of the great voices of opera; a wealth of memorabilia of the Texas Centennial and Pan-American Expositions; an almost-complete collection of the Starlight Operetta programs; and yellowed newspaper clippings of great historical events and famous people (Bonnie and Clyde, for instance). And finally, there are the delightfully charming against-the-law-in-those-days fading photos of the nude Ritter brothers (1932). There, on the shelves, neatly sits the sum of Wally's life, 92 years.

And what about the sweetheart? Any love letters? Any photos? None exist that I know of.

I looked into the dying face, lined and blank. The hair—there's still lots of it—all white. The eyebrows, white and bushy. The delicate hands, almost cold. Yet, somehow, despite the 92 years, Wally is still a handsome man. The eyes, looking at nothing, are still blue. Intense blue. Holding his hand, I wondered, "When music no longer means anything, does life?" And so I began... a World War I song:

Nights are long since you went away.

I think about you all through the day.

My Buddy, My Buddy.

Your buddy misses you.

His head slowly turned toward me. His eyes seemed troubled. His trembling hands tightened slightly in mine. What was he trying to tell me? Should I go on? I couldn't. Though his lips weren't moving, I got the feeling he wanted to say, "Phil, I've lived a long life. Let me go."

INTERVIEW

DR. F. KEVIN MURPHY

PART II

BY BOB DINEEN

The Ninth International AIDS Conference was held in Berlin recently, attracting members of the medical community from around the world. Much of the news received in America left the feeling that there had been little or no progress in the battle against AIDS.

Dr. F. Kevin Murphy, an infectious disease specialist practicing in Dallas, attended the conference, and his perceptions of the information disseminated there are radically different than those reported on by the media. We spoke with Dr. Murphy, and discovered that there is, in fact, reason for optimism.

There is a lot of concern about the ramifications of infecting volunteers with the virus—the mortality issues, safer sex issues and, of course, the issue of discrimination by employers and society against persons challenged by AIDS. How do you think the medical community is coping with those issues?

I have a sense of the kinds of research problems and the appropriate approaches for dealing with them. I really doubt that it needs to be a problem and, in fact, I'm encouraged by the fact that a fairly aggressive approach to vaccine development has been developed. It's not the linear approach that's been applied to the development of other vaccines. For example, with polio we basically took advantage of the newly-developed technology for growing viruses in the laboratory. We grew a whole bunch of polio viruses up, killed it and injected it into volunteers and it worked and protected them against polio.

With Hepatitis B vaccine, they had to go through a long period of investigating the immunology of the response to Hepatitis B in order to figure out how to make a reasonable vaccine. In other words, elucidating the immunopathogenesis had to come first, and then they had to turn around and figure out how on earth to test it. They really were not prepared once they had the vaccine in hand.

What's happening now is really multiple tracks all being pursued at the same time. There are half a dozen different vaccine strategies that are being approached empirically, all at the same time, by different investigators with different theories. Then, in addition, there are people who are studying the immune response of HIV and immunopathogenesis to HIV so that if all six of those don't work, by the time we know that we will understand why, instead of having to start over, basically, to figure out why. And at the same time, they are also studying how to set up vaccine testing sights ready so that as soon as there is a vaccine available to test, they will be able to proceed.

One of the controversies, actually, in Berlin, was whether or not vaccines should be tested one at a time in separate studies. There's a very strong argument put forth for testing multiple vaccines at separate arms of a single trial and, depending on whether vaccines arrive ready to test at the same point in time, that may very well be done.

In terms of the ethical problems, remember that there are two different kinds of vaccines that we're talking about—a vaccine designed to prevent HIV infection, and a vaccine designed to modulate the immune response so that it's more effective in dealing with an existing HIV infection. So, we're talking about two entirely different kinds of populations, and the ethical issues are completely different.

In the case of a vaccine for prevention, it turns out, unhappily, that it is not difficult to find a population in which one can expect a high annual incidence of HIV infection, and so one can immunize a portion of that population and see what happens



to that incidence. Obviously there could be an ethical problem if you design the study so that there is no other intervention to prevent HIV infection, but I think we all believe that even with other interventions there is still going to be a sufficiently high annual incidence of HIV infection in certain populations that it will be easy enough to show a statistically significant difference with a comparison population. So, you can counsel people even more intensely than the general population on how to avoid infection, and yet there's still going to be a proportion who will get infected anyway.

Well, there are some new opportunistic infections that have been discovered that explain some of our mystery cases, so that will help us to deal more effectively with some of the complications of HIV infection and that give us more support for some of the preventative measures that we take for opportunistic infections.

I mentioned gene therapy, and this conference has been the beginning of this 21st century approach.

One of the most important immunologic insights in Berlin is really an extension of a theory put forth by Jonas Salk in Amsterdam last year. There was a tremendous amount of support for his theory this year. It may give us significant insights into some adjunctive ways in which to strengthen the immune response against HIV in people who already have it.

The theory goes like this. CD4 cells are what are called T-helpers. What help means is that these cells facilitate other immune responses. There are two basic kinds of immune responses: antibody responses, in other words the production by B-lymphocytes of proteins that are fashioned in such a way as to combine specifically against the target or antigen—molecules of a virus, or a microorganism or a tumor cell. The other response is called a cellular immune response, or a cell mediated immune response. Those are the direct actions of the other kind of T-cells, namely the cells with the CD8 marker or the T-suppressor cells. These are the one that move in and directly attack the things that are sensitive to and at the same time they call in other immune troops in the form of macrophages. It turns out that there are two sub-sets of T-helpers cells: TH1 are the first set and they contribute to the cell-mediated responses, including activation

of the macrophages and the kind of delayed type hypersensitivity that makes a skin test for TB positive. The TH2 cells facilitate the anti-body responses.

What's interesting is the group of 97 individuals that Salk has identified who are long-term survivors with high CD4 counts, barely or un-detectable antibodies to HIV, but strong cellular responses to HIV. In other words, if you take the CD8 cells from one of these individuals and brew them up in a culture, then throw in the HIV antigens, they get excited and respond vigorously—someone without HIV infection would not do that. So it looks like there is a tiny minority of people with HIV infection who not only have very little in the way of an anti-body response, but may even think they don't have HIV infection because their antibody test is negative and who are infected and are handling it unusually well.

What that tells Salk is that what you want is a TH1 predominant response rather than a TH2 predominant response. And the TH2 response is the usual one, the normal one. And it's the less effective one. So what you really want is to develop vigorous cellular immunity to HIV with almost no antibody response.

It turns out that the TH1 response—the good response—is associated with a secretion by these cells of gamma interferon and IL-2. TH2 cells, in contrast, produce alpha interferon, IL-4, IL-5 and IL-10. By modifying these responses in various ways, you can convert genetically susceptible mice into resistant mice and generally resistant mice into susceptible mice.

It looks experimentally as if it's real. So if that's true in HIV disease, then you may be able to favorably shift a TH2 response to a TH1 response with such things as gamma interferon and IL-2. So it really gives new credence to the thoughts that people have had in augmenting the immune response with things like gamma interferon and IL-2 and it tells us that is probably was a bad idea to give people alpha interferon which is what has been used in most of the drug trials.

The usual high dose vaccine tends to produce a transient cellular response and a more slowly-developing but ultimately predominating antibody response. Salk thinks that what you want is a lower dose vaccination that elicits almost no detectable antibody but does illicit vigorous cellular immunity.

I feel, though, that my rights as a citizen were violated due to Dr. Pilatovsky's ignorance of the gay community and that his ignorance is a threat to my health. Luckily, he did give me an antibiotic that cured my bladder infection, but not my injured pride and self-dignity.

I appreciate your time and attention in evaluating these points. It gives me a small sense of satisfaction knowing that I can report a case of discrimination to your readers.







KEITH EMERY







The Degrading Applications of Indecency Exposure Charges

Busted! Frequently, secluded areas attract folks interested in engaging in intimate acts. When there is little to do on a dull shift, or the intensity of crime and violence is such that a cop seeking real criminals could get shot prowling for crack monsters or store robbers, police look for alternatives—both in immediate attention span gratification and, sadly, sometimes predatory stalking of those thought to be lifestyle offenders. One of the more popular diversions for some officers appears to be lurking about a lovers' lane for a little light voyeurism. Back at the station, cops can regale each other with stories about sneaking up on the window of a bucking Bronco and shining their flashlights in, only to discover a hapless straight couple caught *in flagrante delicto*. Typically, little is said and nothing official is done to the heterosexual duo making the Bronco buck. After all, the cops have had their fun at the expense of the occupants.

However, if the lovers' lane is known as a popular gathering spot for same-sex couples, a much harsher view and formal criminal charges are the rule. Such has been the case for many years in the vicinity of the cemetery, park and jogging trails near Allen Parkway at Dunlavy in Houston, as well as other public parks in the city.

For ten years as a police officer and now as an attorney, I have watched with dismay the tolerance of prejudiced enforcement involving sexual behavior occurring in planned privacy by two members of the same sex at a location that only intrusive cops construe to be a public place. These same cops will later piously raise their right hands in court and testify that they were alarmed and offended by the behavior they struggled so hard to discover. Homophobic police antics are not likely to change in the foreseeable future. The psychological strain and financial cost of getting caught up in an arrest for Indecent Exposure can be burdensome. An awareness of the methods and intensity with which this "crime" is pursued may be the best

preventative for an "unwarranted" arrest.

According to the Penal Code, Indecent Exposure occurs when a person "...exposes his anus or any part of his genitals with intent to arouse or gratify the sexual desire of any person, and he is reckless about whether another is present who will be offended or alarmed by his act." Simply and loosely stated, the line of demarcation between indecent exposure and more serious criminal charges is sexual activity done to or with another. For example, an individual masturbating himself, even when in the company of another, would typically be charged with indecent exposure rather than a more serious charge. If this offense is prosecuted under the Penal Code, the punishment range for this Class B Misdemeanor includes up to 180 days in jail and a maximum fine of \$1,500. The City of Houston has a Disorderly Conduct ordinance tracking the same language as the Indecent Exposure statute in the Penal Code. Violation of this ordinance is a Class C Misdemeanor, punishable by fine only in an amount not to exceed \$500. At the discretion of the arresting officer, the same set of facts will allow him or her to file either a city ordinance violation or the more serious Class B Misdemeanor charge.

On May 25, I represented a client charged in Houston Municipal Court with violation of the city ordinance proscribing Disorderly Conduct/Indecent Exposure. My client violated the first police stereotype concerning those charged with Indecent Exposure: he wanted to go to trial and face his accuser in court. Police officers do not like that response, since there's a very real risk that they and not the defendant will end up the goat.

My client and another man were in a parked car, during the hours of darkness, at the dead-end of Dunlavy. Both were alleged to have been masturbating. There was no through traffic, either vehicular or pedestrian. The jogging trails do not cross or parallel the street. A cemetery and public park are on either side of the street.

There were two contested issues at trial: (1) Was my client exposing his genitals in a public place? Arguably, he was; and, (2) Was my client reckless about whether another person was present who was offended or alarmed by his act? He was not.

Before the arresting officer in this case could be offended and alarmed, he had to first creep up on the car, taking care not to alarm the occupants. Once he reached the car, it was still impossible to be offended or alarmed. He could not see inside; it was too dark. Only by shining his flashlight into the car could the officer be alarmed and offended, and that was his testimony.

Since I found the policeman's behavior morally and socially objectionable, I was delighted when his response to specific questions proved to be legally objectionable. Asked, "Were you out at that location in response to a specific complaint?," his response was a diatribe intended to justify homophobia generally rather than a short and truthful "no." The judge repeatedly slapped this officer on his legal wrists.

When the prosecutor attempted to bail out a sinking case on redirect examination, the officer allowed that he did not need his flashlight to peer into the car. 

HOUSTON PRIDE WEEK CULMINATES WITH PARADE LAST SUNDAY

Mud Forces Cancellation of Most Events at Rally.

HOUSTON — Over a week of pride celebrations came to a close last Sunday when thousands of Houstonians turned out for this year's Gay/Lesbian Pride Week Parade. Nearly 100 entries representing a wide range of nonprofit organizations, businesses, religious groups and others moved down Westheimer in a spirit of pride and fun as thousands lined the streets cheering them on.

Unfortunately, muddy ground and uncooperative city officials forced the cancellation of most of the festivities scheduled for the post-parade rally in Spotts Park.

"This was the largest, the best-run parade we've ever had," said Jack Valinski, co-chair of the 1993 Pride Committee of Houston. This year's parade was organized by Dean Walradt and Daryl McDearman, also on the Pride Committee. Preparations for the event began last summer.

Over the past week, participants agonized over constantly changing weather forecasts. Would it "rain on our parade" or not? It did, but the rain was limited to little more than an intermittent drizzle that did not seem to matter much to bystanders or those in the parade.

Undaunted by a few sprinkles, the procession began on Westheimer at Woodhead and proceeded at a steady pace past Montrose Blvd., ending at Whitney, where participants waved, honked, cheered and continued celebrating as they either returned to join the onlookers or made their way back to their various meeting points.


Many participants said the event had helped reinforce their sense of pride in themselves and their community, as well as bring a greater awareness of the diversity among gay and lesbian people.

"When you see that many people out there marching out openly, proud of who they are, and you see all the people along there being excited, it makes you realize that you're not alone," one marcher, Pat, told TWT NEWS.


"We focus on ourselves too much, and I think this way, you can see all the different facets of our community," said

Michael, a clarinet player with the Lone Star Symphonic Band.

The tradition of celebrating gay and lesbian pride is commonly traced back to the events of June 27, 1969, when a small group of New Yorkers rioted in response to police raids on the Stonewall Inn, a gay club in the city's Greenwich Village area. The riots are considered to have marked a turning point in the fight for civil rights by gay men and lesbians, and the rioters are honored as pioneers in the movement.

A modest crowd gathered at Spotts Park for the post-parade rally, looking forward to an evening of live entertainment, speeches, exhibits and fireworks. But recent rainy weather had left the ground wet, and Sunday's intermittent drizzle made the mud even more of a problem. City officials refused to allow a sound stage to be set up, so rally organizers were forced to cancel most of the evening's official program.

Even the much-anticipated fireworks display, which had been scheduled for 9 p.m., was called off when the trailer carrying them got stuck in the mud.

When it came time to present awards for the best parade entries, co-chairs Jack Valinski and Carol Clark conducted the

ceremony from atop a wooden jungle gym. The Grand Marshals' Award went to the Women's Action Coalition, the Spirit of Montrose trophy was won by the Brazos River Bottom, while the Pride Award went to Sober and Free. Winning the Unity Award was the Houston NAMES Project, while the Texas Award went to Charles Armstrong Investments. The Gay Men's Chorus won the Houston trophy, Krewe of Olympus won the Stonewall Award and the Silver Sabres of Dallas were honored with the Out and Proud Award.

Judging parade entries were City Controller George Greanias, County Treasurer Katy Caldwell, State Rep. Garnet Coleman, Dignity representative Stan Ford and Cathy Lenahan, parade organizer in charge of judging.

After the awards presentation, Laurie Eiserloh, executive director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, led off a short list of speakers by calling on those present to apply more of the caring and compassion that has carried gay and lesbian people through so many trials against their enemies to each other. "We need to start loving each other a lot more," she closed.

The Rev. Carolyn Mobley expressed her appreciation for having been honored as a parade grand marshal with a "hat off to Houston," which she said is the first city to honor her in such a big way.

Male grand marshal Brian Bradley thanked the Women's Action Coalition for nominating him for the honor and issued a strong plea for gay men and lesbians to unite for their common good.

"We're a very diverse group of people," he said. "We have more not in common than in common, and it's important that we all make the best of our talents and our abilities."

The crowd enjoyed the refreshments and exhibits of over 30 businesses and organizations, as well as the only live entertainment left on the evening's schedule, the musical group Quintessence. Unbothered by the lack of a stage and sound system, the quintet began to "sing in the rain," drawing a crowd of 30-40 who laughed often at their barbershop "quartet"-type antics.

Although many participants expressed disappointment at the cancellation of the rally events, others said they had found entertainment enough in just being together on the last day of Houston Gay/Lesbian Pride Week '93.



NEW DALLAS GROUP TO ADDRESS ISSUES AFFECTING WOMEN

Candy Marcum Institute Hopes to Empower Women Toward Healthier, More Positive Lives.

DALLAS — A recent national study has uncovered an alarming fact: as many as one out of three lesbians has a chemical dependency. While this alarming rise in drug and alcohol abuse can be partially attributed to the social climate in this country, researchers believe that a combination of male bias and homophobia work together to create insurmountable obstacles in gay women's search for identity and esteem—obstacles frequently cited as being at the root of chemical addiction.

In the past, very little attention has been paid to lesbian mental health issues. In the Dallas area, that has all changed with the formation of the Candy Marcum Institute for Women's Studies. Named in honor of Candy Marcum, the first female therapist at Oak Lawn Counseling Center, the Institute was formed to address current and on-going issues that affect women and the

people who care about them. It is, according to its founders, a chance to "empower women on their journey toward wholeness, advancing women's issues and enhancing the quality of life."

In a ceremony honoring Marcum and the opening of the Institute recently, personnel provided information on their plans to use educational forums, retreats and conferences to focus on issues of self-esteem, mentoring, physical health, healthy relationships, abuse, parenting and cultural/gender sensitivity, among other programs of interest to gay women. Organizers said they believe these efforts will help to halt and possibly reverse the negative factors affecting lesbians, and provide them with a basis for developing healthy and positive patterns for living.

DALLAS' DAIRE CENTER CELEBRATES FIFTH ANNIVERSARY

Staff, Volunteers Acquaint Visitors With Organization's Services.

DALLAS — In the ongoing battle against AIDS, more and more individuals are forced to rely on community-based organizations for the social, medical and financial support that is not readily forthcoming from state and federal agencies. While it is true that community organizations are often more skilled in the special needs of HIV-positive gay men and lesbians than governmental agencies anyway, the strain on staff-workers and volunteers—plus the increasing difficulty in raising the money necessary to fund many local programs—makes it increasingly difficult for a community organization to continue the work it started in the early days of the crisis.

That's what makes the recent Daire Center anniversary celebration such an impressive milestone. Opened in 1988 to help increase the quality of life for persons living with AIDS, the Center continues its tradition of providing a much-needed service to Dallas' AIDS community, despite current trends in budget and funding reductions nationwide.

At the reception, commemorating the milestone event recently, volunteers, staffers and invited guests were reminded just how important the Center's programs and

activities are to the community. In discussions with board and staff members, visitors learned about the special needs of those with AIDS and what the Daire Center can offer them to address those needs.

Because PWAs often experience isolation and loneliness as the result of their illness, many of the programs at the Center focus on social interaction with structured activities, discussion groups and field trips. These activities reduce the isolation and loneliness and enhance the self-esteem of the client. In addition, the increased socialization aids in the development of personal skills and broadens the client's support system. All of these contribute to an improved mental outlook on the part of the PWA—a well documented factor in improved quality and longevity of life. As a daytime activity center, the facility often provides people with AIDS the structure they would otherwise not have, and fills the void created if an individual's caregiver or significant other is maintaining a regular daytime work schedule.

Additionally, the Daire Center offers its clients nutritious meals and health monitoring. This combination, coupled with the client's improved attitude, often results in a substantial weight gain as well as increased energy and a reduction in symptoms.

The Daire Center is a program of Oak Lawn Community Services [OLSC], a nonprofit community-based organization providing mental health services for gay and lesbians, as well as a comprehensive program for any person challenged by AIDS. It is funded through OLSC and fund-raising events such as Dallas' annual LifeWalk.

HOMECARE ASSOCIATES OFFERS AFFORDABLE HEALTH CARE

Fort Worth Company Seeks Higher Quality, Reduced Costs for People with AIDS.

FORT WORTH — Despite President Clinton's anticipated efforts to legislate affordable health care for all Americans, experts are predicting that health care spending, which reached \$670 billion in 1990, will approach the \$1 trillion mark by as early as 1999. Much of that increased spending will come as a result of newer and more costly methods of treating AIDS. With over 43% of this spending paid to hospitals, Medicare and many private insurers are expanding out-of-hospital treatments as a means of reducing escalating costs.

With recent advances in medical technology, an increasing number of procedures for the care of people with AIDS can now be performed in the home. Many patients are taking a more active role in their care, and are opting for home health care over the more expensive and impersonal option of an extended stay in the hospital.

Despite its advantages, however, home health care is not subject to the same stringent guidelines and regulations that health care facilities must abide by. As a result, the quality and cost for home health care is not guaranteed to be the best or the most economical. And with most insurance companies now placing a lifetime cap on benefits for catastrophic illness, cost often becomes a more important issue than quality.

One Fort Worth-based company hopes to change the outlook for quality and affordable health care for persons challenged by AIDS. Managed Homecare Associates was, according to CEO Scot Skinner, "formed in 1991 by experienced professionals to improve health care services while reducing costs for patients who often use up all their insurance benefits on expensive treatments. The company administers reduced cost products and services for clients dealing with many life-threatening and terminal illnesses, and has developed a program specifically designed to assist the AIDS community.

"Our program educates people living with AIDS and their loved ones in the strategies of cost-effective care and informs them of their health care benefits and limitations."

In addition to analysis and counseling of a patient's needs and benefits, MHA has developed a diversified network of health care providers across the country that provide products and services to persons challenged by AIDS. Through MHA, home care patients can receive pharmaceuticals, infusion therapies, home medical and rehabilitation equipment and home nursing care—all at substantially reduced costs.

Skinner considers this type of service as essential to the well-being of his clients. "People with AIDS and their loved ones are often headed for financial despair because of the overuse of some services and because some companies charge up to ten times the reasonable rates for those services. Each MHA client is handled personally by a highly experienced Nurse Manager who coordinates all necessary treatment by working with the patient and his or her doctor.

"We also coordinate health care benefits with the patient's insurance company to ensure costs are kept within usual and customary ranges, while preserving the lifetime maximum cap on policy benefits."

The plan seems to be working. In one case, according to Skinner, MHA saved more than \$92,000 in home health care expenses over six months. The most important argument for home health care is found in several studies that show that many patients respond better to treatment in the home as compared with patients experiencing similar illnesses who receive care through a hospital or other health care facility.

MHA officials said they hope to foster this trend in health care by providing people with AIDS with quality health care at reasonable prices.

"In an industry rife with those who would take advantage of people with AIDS," said MHA's Craig McDaniel, "we have a sterling reputation for integrity and caring. The company has the Better Business Bureau's most favorable rating and is staffed by an experienced team of medical and insurance professionals.

"Our service can mean the difference between a person receiving the care they deserve and being priced out of life-sustaining treatment."


Haldon is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Brown of Chico, California, two brothers and a sister. He was especially proud of his niece Amanda.
