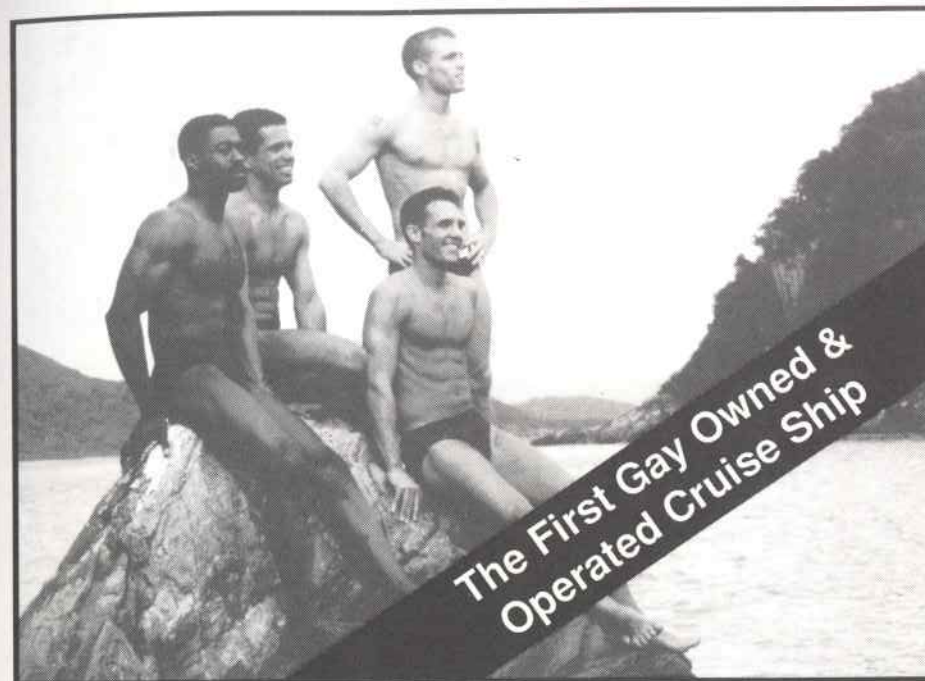

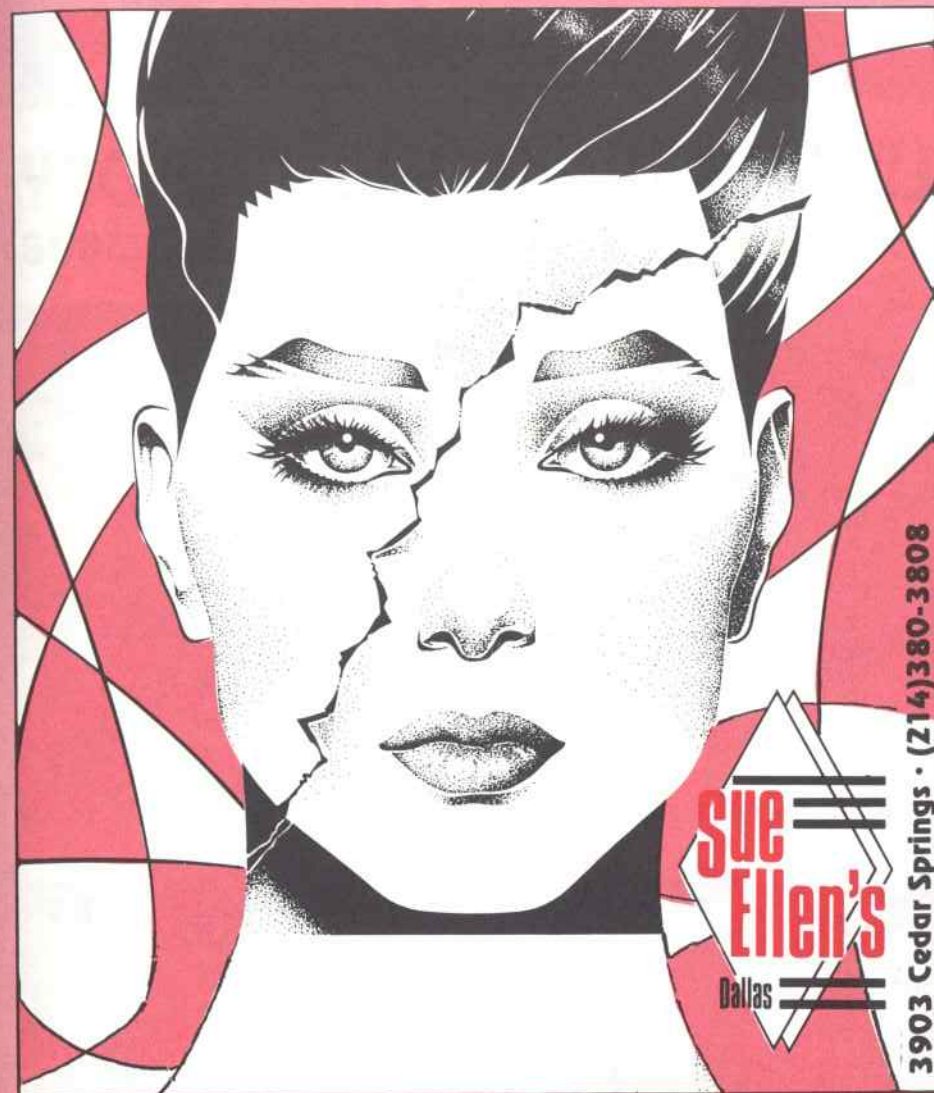

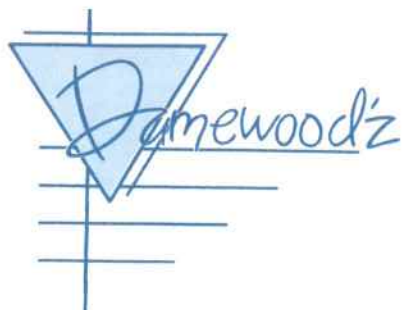

Nicole Conn wrote, produced and directed *Claire of the Moon*, about two women who meet at a writers' retreat.

Claire of the Moon

Just a couple of months after Hollywood "discovered" lesbians (in a small way) in the mainstream film *Three of Hearts*, a small independent film about lesbians (in a big way) has found its way into local theaters. If this timing doesn't seem remarkable to you, name the last major release to prominently feature lesbian characters (*Basic Instinct* doesn't count). Since, unlike its bigger-budgeted predecessor, Nicole Conn's *Claire of the Moon* is an independent effort, directed by a woman and featuring a mostly female cast, one reasonably expects *Claire* to be more honest and compelling, right?

Well....

The *Claire* of the title is a writer of some sort. The film begins with a flashback to an earlier heterosexual encounter in which *Claire* (Trisha Todd) packs up her Jaguar and heads off to a seaside writers' retreat, constantly lighting her brown-and-gold cigarettes and looking pensive. She spends a lot of time during the film doing this. You see, *Claire* is a woman with an attitude. If the exotic cigarettes don't clue you in to this, her grand entrance into Cabin Four at the retreat makes this clear.

Enter Noel (Karen Trumbo), author, sex therapist and mildly butch lesbian. When *Claire*, assigned as her cabinmate, in-

trudes on her fastidiously chaste world, Noel bristles. She spends a lot of time during the film doing this. You see, Noel is a woman with some hangups. As her neuroses chafe against *Claire's* attitude, it's hate at first sight.

You see where this is headed, don't you?

But before we can get going, we must first meet the other women at the retreat, led by Maggie, a dyed-in-the-flannel dyke. These others form an assortment of caricatures: the housewife-as-part-time author, the flaming Southern romance queen, the New Age space cadet, etc. Serving primarily as (sometimes needed) comic relief, these other women are negligible in terms of the plot, played overbroadly and without much grounding in reality. (For instance, the Southern belle addresses individuals as "y'all").

Meanwhile, back at Cabin Four, things are heating up between our heroines. *Claire* balks at Noel's "shrink" tactics. Noel decides that *Claire* is a "cheap, garden-variety slut" for sleeping with men from the bar in town. The remainder of the film proceeds much in the following manner: Noel and *Claire* talk as *Claire* smokes decoratively, Noel talks to Maggie about her problems, the writers talk about sexual semantics, *Claire* and Noel talk pro-

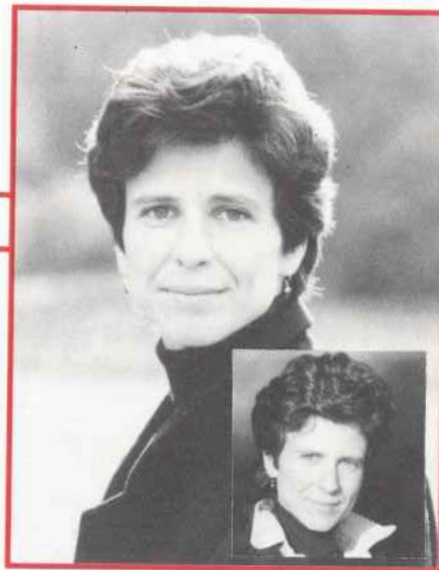
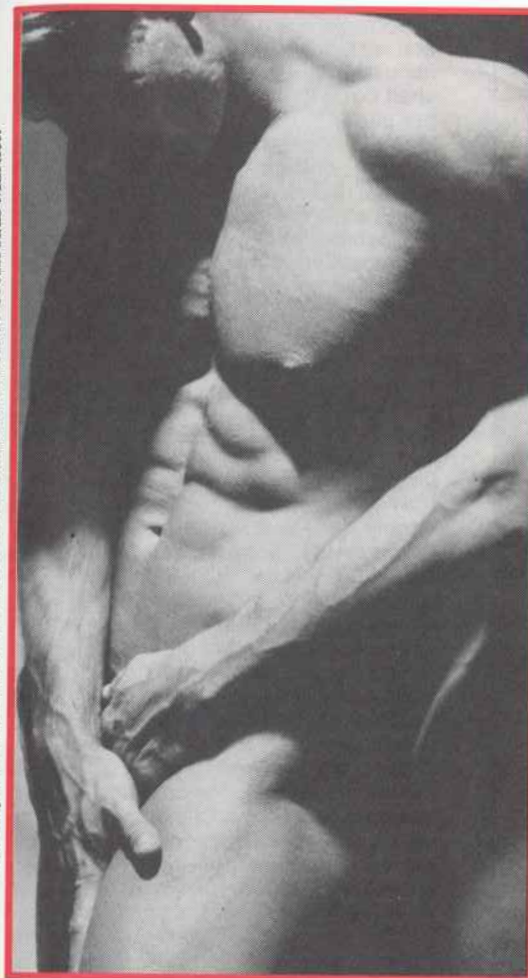

vocatively over drinks. Note the common thread. These women *talk*. At length. On a wide variety of subjects. Admittedly, some of the dialogue is clever, but not all, and much of the material is, at best, tangential to the story. After a while, it becomes all parry and no thrust. The general feel is that of mildly interesting dinner party conversation. But I'm not sure I'd shell out six bucks to attend such a dinner party.

Claire of the Moon basically boils down to one hundred minutes of foreplay. I wanted to really like this film, but even its politics left me cold. Although several of the lesbian characters protest against being labeled man-haters, there is endless man-bashing, with every male character who's discussed (only Claire's lovers are actually seen) portrayed as selfish and abusive. If the film has a point, it seems to be that true intimacy is more possible between women than between women and men. Why? Because, the film says repeatedly, men and women speak different languages. Then couldn't two men also be truly intimate? We'll never know. If men are largely absent from Claire's worldview, then gay men are completely so. As are nonwhite women. While I appreciate the focus on women in this film, a wider worldview would have enriched the story with a more realistic context.

Technically, *Claire* is solid, with the look and sound of a good television movie, if not that of a Hollywood release. The attractive piano score sets a convincing tone. There are some good performances, especially Trumbo's. The coastal setting is lovely and evocative. One complaint, however: I don't ask for car chases or raging dinosaurs, but didn't anyone on the crew know how to dolly or pan? With nothing in motion but slow zooms, *Claire in the Moon* has the air of a filmed play. When Noel and Claire finally make love (after so many fits and starts that the audience had begun to laugh at the increasingly ludicrous interruptions), it is indeed beautiful, carefully choreographed and lit with a golden haze. Unfortunately, it looks like any other movie love scene from the last decade or so, pretty and passionless. Though Noel claims her assertions about intimacy are not based on sex, the film's ending subverts its own intentions.

With this film, the Eagle may have finally landed, but it finds *the Moon* to be a very dry place.

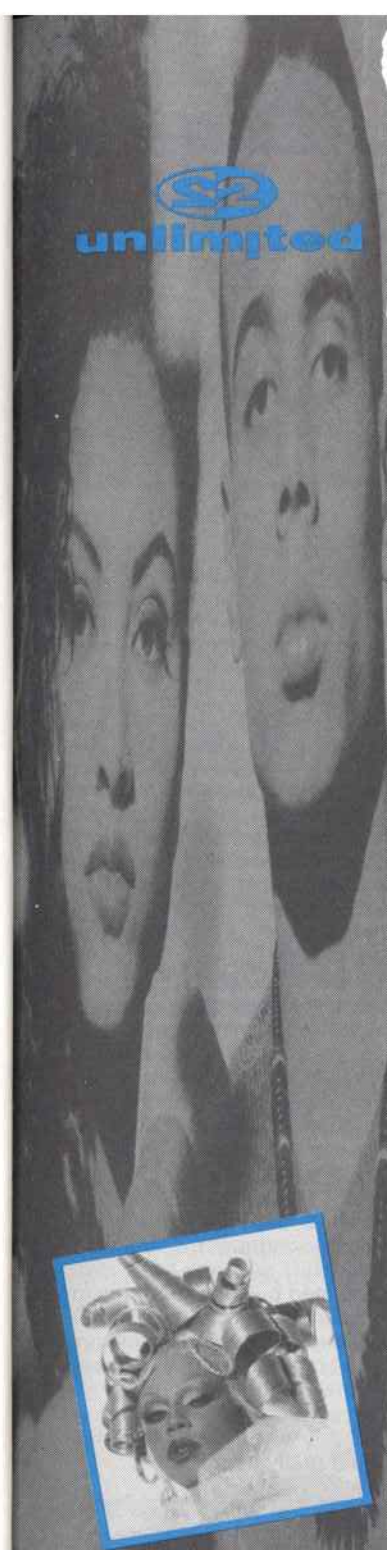

Gay Pride '93:

You Should Have Been There



Dear Guys,

Well, another pride parade has come and gone. One more year—who'd have believed it? This year's parade was the biggest and most heavily attended that Houston's ever seen, whether for Gay/Lesbian Pride, St. Patrick's Day, the KKK or otherwise. There were over one hundred entries in the parade, and thousands of people lined the streets of Westheimer to view it. You should have been there.

There were rodeo queers on horses and leather folks on floats, drag queens in convertibles, political and religious contingents on foot. Dinosaurs were hot this year. I thought one of the cleverest floats had a dinosaur theme with the slogan "Out and Proud—You Bet Jurassic!" Okay, that was the float we happened to be riding on. We dressed one of the dinosaurs in the gold-sequined Madonna-esque top you wore in the parade two years ago, Bob. It was *almost* like you were there.

But not quite.

You know, I've ridden on a few floats in my time, but this was the first time I actually participated in the construction of one. It was so much fun. Believe it or not, Joey, I didn't spill or break anything all night. I even dabbed up the errant drips with a cloth when my brush got a little too saturated with pink paint, just like you taught me when we remodeled that garage apartment together. You would have been proud.

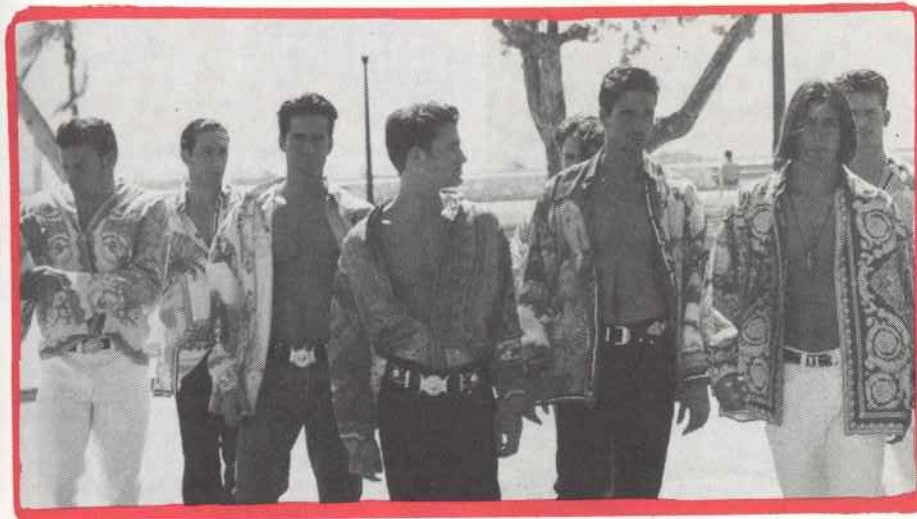
Along the parade route, I noticed more flyers and leaflets being distributed than in previous years. Maybe people have more to say these days. Lots of "Lift the Ban" stuff. Lots of AIDS stuff. Various and sun-

dry petitions. I was given a women's medical survey/questionnaire that made me realize how very little lesbians know about their general health. I was given a flyer by the ACLU which suggested that if gay men and lesbians are not seen as appropriate defenders of this country in the armed forces, then perhaps they should not be subjected to the same forms of taxation as others. Hmmm. Thought fodder.

Unfortunately, the post-parade rally and entertainment planned for Spotts Park were canceled, due to inclement weather. No alternative rain location. The stage would have been in the same location where you had sung so many of your original Pride theme songs, John. When you left, you seem to have taken that musical tradition with you. Too bad; the crowd seemed like it needed a grand finale to cap the day. I doubt that you'd remember this, Naomi, but one of the first times you and I met was at a rally show following a Gay Pride Parade. Many, many moons and Whitney Houston hits ago. After that first night, you became the standard by which I would measure most other club entertainers—not just female impersonators.

Hundreds of people came out to the park anyway to continue the open-air revelry. A makeshift soapbox-style platform was fashioned out of a jungle gym on the playground. Various impromptu speakers—political, radical and ex-military types—though impassioned in their messages, had to make child-like pleas for attention as they shouted from the monkey bars. Too bad you were about the only ones who could really hear them.

People milled about among the tents and tables concessionaires had set up in the park to display their wares. There were artisans' booths with crafts and jewelry and various objets de gay art. Lots of stuff adorned with pink triangles and rainbows. The best rainbow I saw all afternoon was the one that showed up shortly before sunset. It wasn't on a float or a kite or a banner or a string of balloons. This was the real thing—a huge, glorious rainbow stretched in front of Houston's skyline, over the field where the last few pride diehards had gathered in the mud, a la Woodstock, to eke out a few last moments of community celebration. We burst into spontaneous applause and cheers, hundreds of us with our heads back, gazing skyward. God was there, and he was saying he was having a good time.

Seeing it made me feel like all of you were there, too.

You would have thought that by this time we'd have all been exhausted from putting the float together most of the night before and Sunday morning, but we all got energy from some unknown source. Maybe we were revived spending the day surrounded by gays and lesbians who, even if for just a few hours, felt collectively empowered enough to hold their lover's hand in the light of day, and to come together without fear, state proudly who they were and what they believed in. Even if just for a few hours.

You should have been there.

While we were putting the float together late Saturday night, someone came in and said the U.S. had just bombed Iraq. I thought it was a joke. And then when I found out why, it stopped being funny. Oh, of course it's a very serious offense to plot to threaten the life of a former president, or anyone else for that matter. I just don't remember George Bush jumping up and spending all kinds of money and manpower in a big, immediate, dramatic response when your lives were being threatened. Difference is, in your cases it turned out to be more than just a threat.

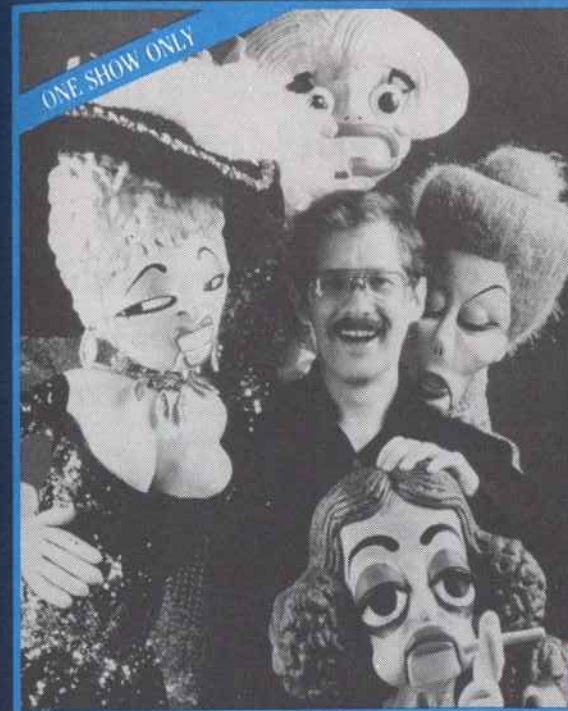

Adding Insult to Injury

The following letter was sent to state Sen. Rodney Ellis of Houston.—Editor

Dear Rodney:

I appreciate the invitation to attend the signing of the new Texas Hate Crimes bill, which enhances criminal penalties for hate-induced crimes against specific groups, including the gay/lesbian community. For years our community has fought for such legislation, and this act is a culmination of the determination of legislators like yourself and gay/lesbian lobbying efforts.

As one who was hospitalized and disfigured by "gay-bashers" nearly 20 years ago, I know personally the importance of such legislation. I was pleased and honored by your invitation to attend the signing ceremony at the Governor's mansion.

However, the fact remains that, in essence, I am still considered a criminal in my own state. In spite of tacit promises by the Governor, Lt. Governor and Speaker of the House that homosexual sodomy would be removed from our criminal code, it was not.

Over 100 organizations and persons throughout the state requested the Governor, minimally, to not sign the penal code bill and allow it to become law without her signature as a public display of her displeasure at the sodomy provision.

The Governor ignored these requests, signed the bill and made no mention of her philosophy on the sodomy provision until asked about it by a reporter. Frankly, her actions added insult to injury.

Thus, if I had attended the hate crime bill signing and remained silent, I would have been hypocritical. If I had attended and spoken out against the Governor's failure to publicly state her opposition to anti-gay bigotry, I would have shown ingratitude for your kind invitation. Thus, I declined to attend.

Again, I appreciate the invitation, but under the circumstances, I could not accept.

P.S.: Whoever chose the invitees to the signing should be reminded that Laurie Eiserloh, the Executive Director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, whose tireless efforts on behalf of this bill helped make it possible, wasn't even informed of the ceremony. Our "friends" in the closet could learn from our community—closets are dark, isolated places where only mildew and moths thrive.

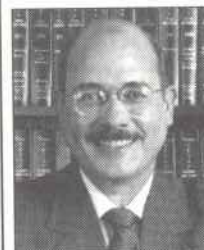

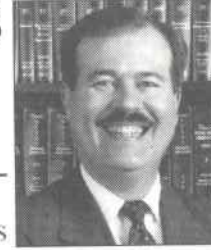

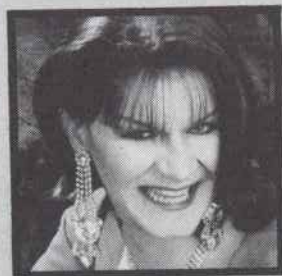

Fighting Homophobia in Ourselves and Others

It is sly, clever, diabolical, insidious and ubiquitous. It builds walls between people who want to express love. It creates self-loathing, gives birth to homicides, suicides, substance abuse and much, much more. Most who are in its grip do not realize it. It poisons the mind and heart, allowing only for negative perceptions. This vile thing has done us more harm from within and from outside our community than any other thing. Its name is homophobia and hate is its forte.

Homophobia is a twofold thing. One, as it relates to heterosexuals, it is an unreasonable fear of gay men and lesbians. Two, as it relates to gay and lesbian people themselves, it is a conscious or unconscious acceptance of the larger culture's myths concerning gays.

Among straight men and women, for the most part, same-sex love cannot be fully expressed. This is because of the paranoia and suspicion that is inculcated in all of us by our sexually neurotic and illiterate culture. The great paradox of this situation is that, although being gay or lesbian is believed to be the lowest thing one can be, rare is the person who has not had thoughts and feelings that are homosexual in nature. And a large part of the population has had at least one experience with someone of the same sex. The fear of their own feelings and the perceptions of others are ever-present and limiting in heterosexual same-sex relationships.

To understand our own homophobia toward ourselves and other lesbian and gay people, we must realize that it is the same thing and comes from the same place the straight world got it. Perry Garkinkel, in his book *In A Man's World*, which was about the roles men play, put it this way: "To many, if not most, heterosexual

men, the 'typical male homosexual' is less good, less honest, less fair, less positive, less valuable, less stable, less intellectual, less friendly, less clean, more shallow, more unhealthy, than the typical male heterosexual. Above all, he is seen as less masculine.

"This is not the reaction of only uncultured rednecks. In a January, 1977 *Psychology Today* poll of readers' attitudes about masculinity—a group of respondents markedly more affluent and better educated than the average American—a surprising 70% reported believing that 'homosexual men are not masculine,' a decidedly damning view in a society that so admires masculinity. To me, that reinforces my suspicion that the homosexual is our culture's bad boy: the very model of what the 'teachings' say you are not supposed to be."

And I am sure they would have found that lesbians were not considered feminine if they had asked. Haven't we all heard other gays and lesbians assert these same things? And is it not a kind of homophobia to think that the only men who are worth your time have to be straight-acting and macho? The culture, through homophobia, punishes us and we punish ourselves, because despite it all we have not become what boys or girls should become.

A friend once boasted, "All my friends are straight and I live in a nice straight neighborhood. I would not want to live in that area (i.e., the gay area) with all those queens." This came from someone who enjoys experiencing many things that most other gay men do and who occasionally dresses in drag. And he does them with the gays in the area he would not live in. It is fairly obvious that this person's true inner opinion of himself and his kind is not very high. Very often, our internalized

homophobia works on an unconscious level and comes out in the form my friend expressed.

We have enough problems dealing with the homophobia of heterosexuals. But a major step in dealing with the problems they cause our community would be to recognize and deal with our own homophobia. Each of us needs to try to catch it in ourselves when it rears its ugly head.

Near the close of his chapter on homophobia, Garfinkel says, "Nor is the solution all that exotic: It is education, exposure to the feared 'other,' shattering myths and lies. If we make no commitment to truth, homophobia will continue to pit father against son, friend against friend, gays against straights and each man against himself." And I would add to this list, "gays against gays." Search back through that file in which you put the things you so willingly accepted as a child, because now, as a thinking adult, you may want to delete some of it. Once we as individuals, and as a community, keep a high awareness of homophobia within ourselves and our community, the stronger, healthier and happier we will surely be.

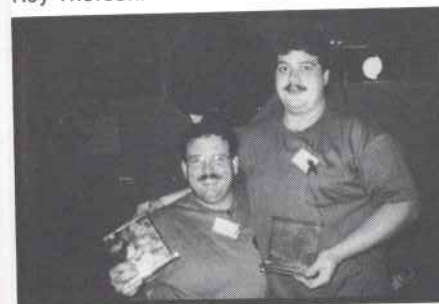

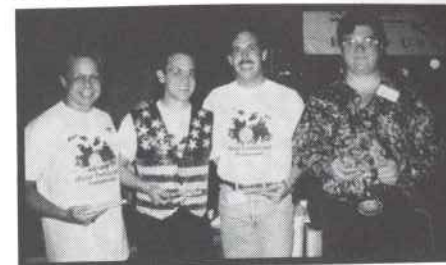

GREATER HOUSTON HIV ALLIANCE VOTE PAVES WAY FOR NEW AGENCY

*Organizers Hope Move Will
Make It Easier to Bring
AIDS Funding to Area.*

HOUSTON — In a move that they hope will make it easier to bring HIV funding to the area, the board of the Greater Houston HIV Alliance voted recently to end their organization's role in the distribution and management of AIDS money in Houston. The board's action paves the way for a new agency that will assume the Alliance's duties, which include parceling out funding to area service providers and maintaining records on how the money is spent.

At a meeting held June 24, GHHA board members decided that the Alliance, dogged by past controversies and audits calling in to question past management practices, could no longer effectively fulfill its grant-management duties. The new organization, which as yet has no name, will be formed by some GHHA board members and others not currently associated with the Alliance. Organizers hope the group will be in operation by some time in early September.

The idea behind the move is that the proposed new agency, unencumbered by past controversies and unfavorable financial reviews, will be more successful at bringing government HIV funds into the Houston area. The old Alliance, meanwhile, will continue to operate as long as necessary to resolve issues remaining from the agency's past.

Part of the Alliance's problem has been that the results of previous audits remain a part of the organization's record and are taken into consideration by state and federal agencies considering grant applications. Therefore, as Executive Director Michael Springer noted, even though the Alliance's current management practices recently received a clean bill of health from the Texas Department of Health, GHHA can't entirely escape its past.

"There are several grants we'd like to apply for now, but we don't stand to get them at this point," Springer said. He added that he believed the dissolution of the

Alliance and assumption of its duties by a new agency would be a positive development for the city.

The Alliance, formerly known as the Greater Houston AIDS Alliance, administered federal Ryan White funds in the Houston area until last July, when Harris County Commissioners Court voted to transfer control nearly \$6 million of that money to the county's Division of HIV Services, leaving the Alliance with \$2.6 million in TDH funds.

Alliance Executive Director Sue Cooper, who had become the focus of anger on the part of numerous board members, transferred to the new county agency, taking some Alliance staffers with her. Board members who stayed with the Alliance condemned the county's actions as a political move by County Judge Jon Lindsay designed to destroy the agency. An audit of the Alliance's financial records for 1991 turned up evidence of poor management under Cooper's stewardship of the agency.

The decision by the Greater Houston HIV Alliance comes at a time when the federal government is expected to increase the amount of Ryan White funding it provides to communities hardest hit by the AIDS epidemic.

TURTLE CREEK CHORALE CONCERT TO BENEFIT AIDS INTERFAITH NETWORK

*Evening of Religious Music Will
Include Women's Chorus of Dallas.*

DALLAS — In its ongoing efforts to change the face of AIDS through music, the Turtle Creek Chorale will take to the stage once again, to raise greatly-needed funds for a North Texas AIDS service organization—this time, the AIDS Interfaith Network. Joining the Chorale for its Monday, July 26 concert will be the Women's Chorus of Dallas.

AIDS Interfaith Network was selected by both vocal groups because of its recognized leadership in the area of counseling of persons affected by AIDS, as well as for its outstanding and exemplary ministry. During the past four years, AIN has provided pastoral counseling and home care to more than 800 clients and 2,000

family members and friends. And through the African-American Health Coalition and Project Esperanza, the Network has been able to establish direct outreach services into the African-American and Hispanic communities.

AIN was formed in 1986 by a group of concerned religious and lay persons as a multicultural organization that would endeavor to meet the spiritual, emotional and practical needs of all people with HIV/AIDS and their families and friends. During its existence, AIN has established itself as the only non-profit organization in Dallas whose single mission is to educate and develop the resources of religious communities to positively impact the AIDS crisis.

It must be working, for in 1991, AIN became the only HIV/AIDS service organization to ever receive the President's Volunteer Action Award—the nation's highest volunteer award.

In keeping with the religious and spiritual nature of the Network, the benefit concert will take place at 8 p.m. at St. Rita's Catholic Church, 12521 Inwood Road in Dallas. Featured in the concert will be John Rutter's "Requiem," as well as other sacred pieces. A reception honoring AIN Care Team volunteers and the PWAs served by those teams will follow the performance.

DALLAS' AIDS RESOURCE CENTER RECEIVES DONATION OF FINE CHINA

*Earl Lynn Buckman Motivated by
Belief that Clients Deserve the Best.*

DALLAS — The daily struggle to go on living in the face of HIV disease—coupled with a seemingly endless landscape of roadblocks set up by government and service organizations that seem to deter a person challenged by AIDS at every turn—leaves many PWAs tired and disheartened. And with the social implications of the disease, people with AIDS are almost always challenged by the potential for diminished feelings of self-worth.

It is no wonder, therefore, that Earl Lynn Buckner's recent gift to the AIDS Resource Center created such a sensation. While much of the funding the Center receives



is geared towards basic health maintenance, Buckner's gift—a Wedgewood service for 144, plus serving pieces—was offered to show the clients of the Center that they deserve the very best.

Of course, clients of Chez Louise have been receiving the best from the staff and volunteers from the start. Since so many people with AIDS are estranged from their families, friends and co-workers, the hot meals program allows the individual the opportunity to compare notes with other HIV-positive people over a nutritious meal. It also forces the person to get dressed and go out when it might be easier to just stay home.

According to Karen Estes, Special Proj-

ects Manager at the AIDS Resource Center, "We are ecstatic. As a nonprofit organization, we rely completely on grants, foundations and individual donors. Such a tremendous, out-of-the-ordinary and fine gift as this should not go unrecognized. We are proud that someone believes 'those folks' who are HIV-positive deserve the best."

While a cure for HIV may not yet be on the horizon, the symptoms of self-hatred and diminished self-worth are being addressed, thanks to the efforts of the AIDS Resource Center and individuals like Earl Lynn Buckman.

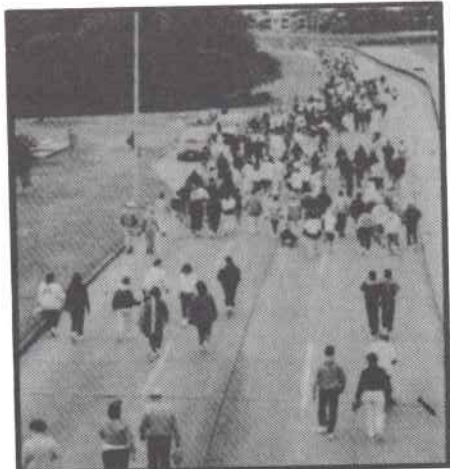
Albert Vaja assumed his volunteer position last month. Vaja is the owner of A and K Productions, an event-planning firm, has 20 years experience event management and logistical planning in cities across the country.

Vaja speaks with enthusiasm about his new role, and says one of his goals will be to raise awareness of and participation in the Walk among people beyond Montrose and other gay areas of the city.

CENTRAL TEXAS GAY VETERANS' GROUP TO HOLD VIGIL NEXT WEDNESDAY

*Event Designed to Show Support
For President's Efforts
To Lift Military Ban.*

AUSTIN — As speculation increases over whether President Bill Clinton will remain firm in his pledge to issue an executive order lifting the ban on gay men and lesbians serving the military, one Texas gay veterans group has scheduled a candlelight vigil to show its support for such a move. The vigil, sponsored by Gay, Lesbian and Bisexual Veterans of Central Texas [GLBVCT], will be held next Wednesday, July 14 at 8:30 p.m. in Woolridge Park, located on the corner of 9th and Guadalupe.

Recent reports in the media suggested that Clinton and military leaders have reached a stalemate in their efforts to reach agreement on the matter, and some gay leaders continue to worry that Clinton will cave in to pressure from the Pentagon and Congress and accept a compromise proposal bringing little real improvement in the status of gay and lesbian people in the armed forces. Defense Secretary Les Aspin is drawing up a set of recommendations on how President Clinton should implement a proposed executive order on gay and lesbian service people.

In a statement released last Friday, GLBVCT president Rich Bailey said the vigil is the culmination of several weeks of activity designed to draw attention to the U.S. armed forces' ban on gay and lesbian service members.

"President Clinton has said he intends to end the military's ban on homosexuals. He can, with the stroke of a pen, take a giant stride in ending the official discrimination [against] lesbians and gays in this country."

"This vigil is intended to let both him and Congress know that we expect him to keep his word."

GLBVCT is affiliated with Gay, Lesbian and Bisexual Veterans of America, which has over 40 chapters throughout the country. Membership in the organization is open to gay, lesbian and bisexual former and current service members, their friends and supporters.

HARRIS COUNTY JAIL MEDICAL TASK FORCE MEETS SATURDAY

*Proposal to Set Up Phone Line
For Data Collection Considered.*

HOUSTON — The Harris County Jail Citizens Medical Advisory Team Task Force holds its next meeting tomorrow (Saturday, July 10). The Task Force, facilitated by activist Matt Locklin, was formed to address the existence of very serious medical problems among inmates in the Harris County Jail and official indifference to those problems. The meeting is scheduled for 10 a.m. at the offices of the Houston Red Cross Chapter, 2700 S.W. Frwy.

At the Task Force's last meeting, held June 24, community activist Ray Hill recounted a number of recent instances in which jail inmates with HIV-related conditions received minimal or no treatment. He emphasized that dealing with problems of inmate abuse and official indifference would have to start with a systematic effort to gather concrete data. A proposal made during the meeting and currently being considered would set up a telephone line to accept collect calls from inmates.

Attendees also viewed an educational video dealing with AIDS in prison, produced by paralegal and prison reform advocate Rory Levy.

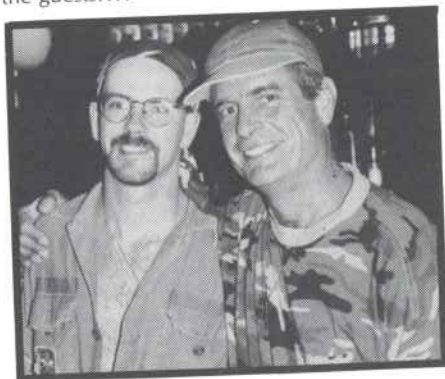
The Task Force has issued a recommendation that all inmates and jail staff be tested for tuberculosis at appropriate intervals, and that those testing positive for the disease receive appropriate treatment.

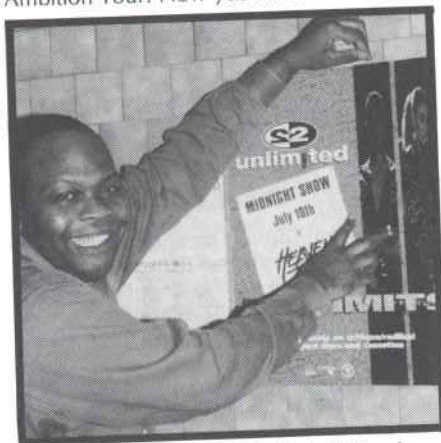

He loved to dance...he's dancing still.

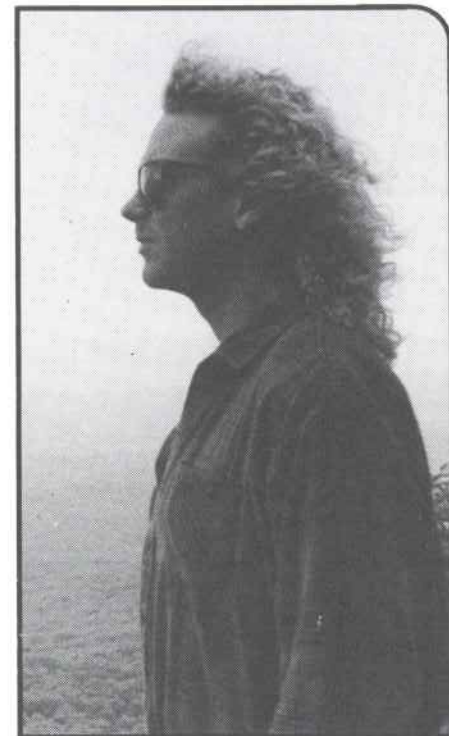

Funeral services were held June 29 in Memphis at Forest Hills Funeral Chapel with burial in Forest Hills Cemetery.

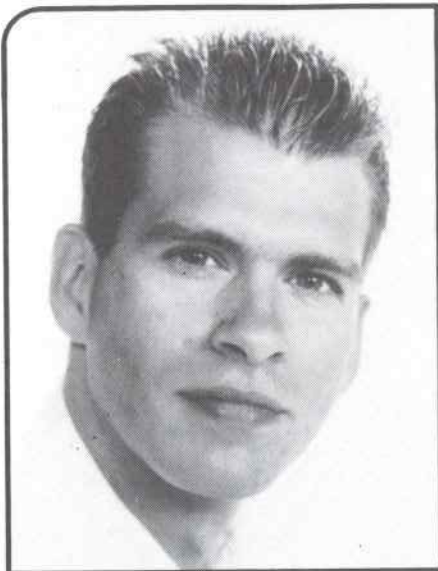

Popular Houston playwright Kenny Joe Spivey, age 36, died peacefully Thursday, July 1, 1993 in Galveston, Texas. Spivey was Artistic Director of Dreem Katz, a local performing arts group founded by him in 1979. Spivey created Dreem Katz, a group of friends interested in the arts, who would perform Spivey's original works in his backyard for neighbors and friends. Spivey's outrageous style became so popular that Dreem Katz outgrew their backyard stage and performed the world premiere of Spivey's first full-length play, *Every Day at Dawn Pigs Dance in Ancient Ritual. I Know. I Dance with Them (Pigs Dance I)*, at Main Street Theatre. Since this first production, Spivey has written, directed and produced over a dozen plays, including *Suck—A Montrose Vampire Story*, *Romp Through Hell (Pigs Dance II)*, *Fertility Dance*, *In Chains* and *Nasty Disposition (Pigs Dance III)*, with two works in progress, entitled *She's Retarded* and *The Black*, his full-length musical. Spivey composed music and was past president of the Montrose Symphonic Band. Spivey performed at many theatres, including Stages, Main Street Theatre, Heights Theatre, Chocolate Bayou Theatre, Dougherty Art Center and the Vortex (Austin). Spivey wrote and directed numerous plays for the Jewish Community Center's Summer Performing Arts program. He gave his time and talents to many Houston organizations. In short, Spivey was a genius!

A memorial service celebrating Spivey's life will be held Sunday, July 11 at 2 p.m. at the Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection, 1919 Decatur in Houston.

John Edwin Coffman

Professor John Edwin Coffman passed away at 1:15 p.m., June 28, 1993 after a lengthy struggle with AIDS. Dr. Coffman had been a professor at the University of Houston for 23 years, where he taught geography. He won both the first Social Science College Award and a university-wide Teaching Excellence Award. He wrote many books for children, and over 60 articles for the *World Book Encyclopedia*, including the articles "The United States," and "Texas."

Professor Coffman was born in Robstown, Texas on February 17, 1942. He was reputed to be the largest baby ever born in Robstown Hospital. He attended private schools in Corpus Christi and Bob Jones Academy in Greenville, South Carolina. He had an AA from Del Mar College in Corpus Christi and a BA in Economics, an MA, a C.Phil and a PhD in Geography, all from UCLA.

The funeral service was held at 2 p.m. on Sunday, July 4 at the Community Gospel Church.

Professor Coffman was preceded in death by his father, Carl Sim Coffman; his mother, Zeda Lee Coffman; and his spouse, Ricky Dan Kinsell, all of Porter, Texas.

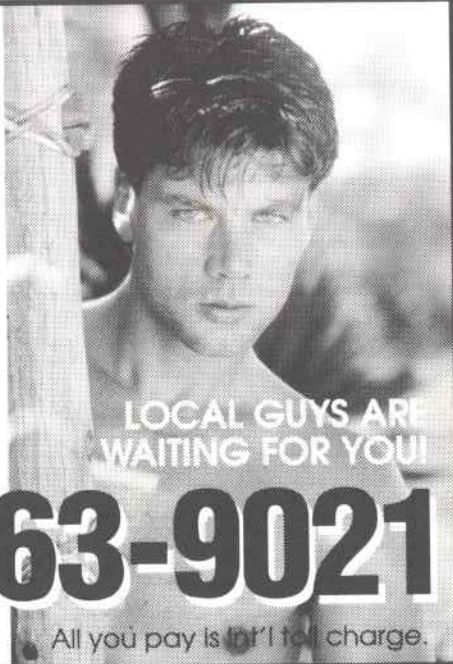

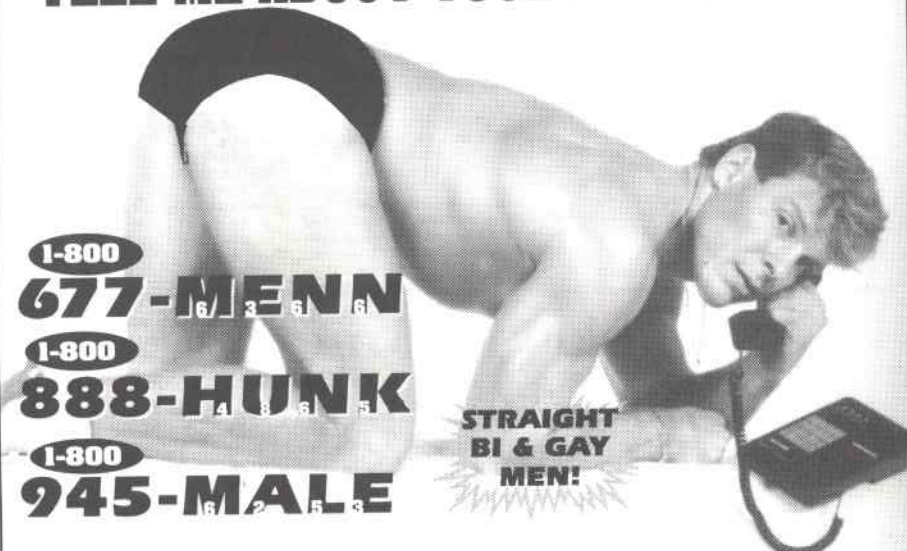

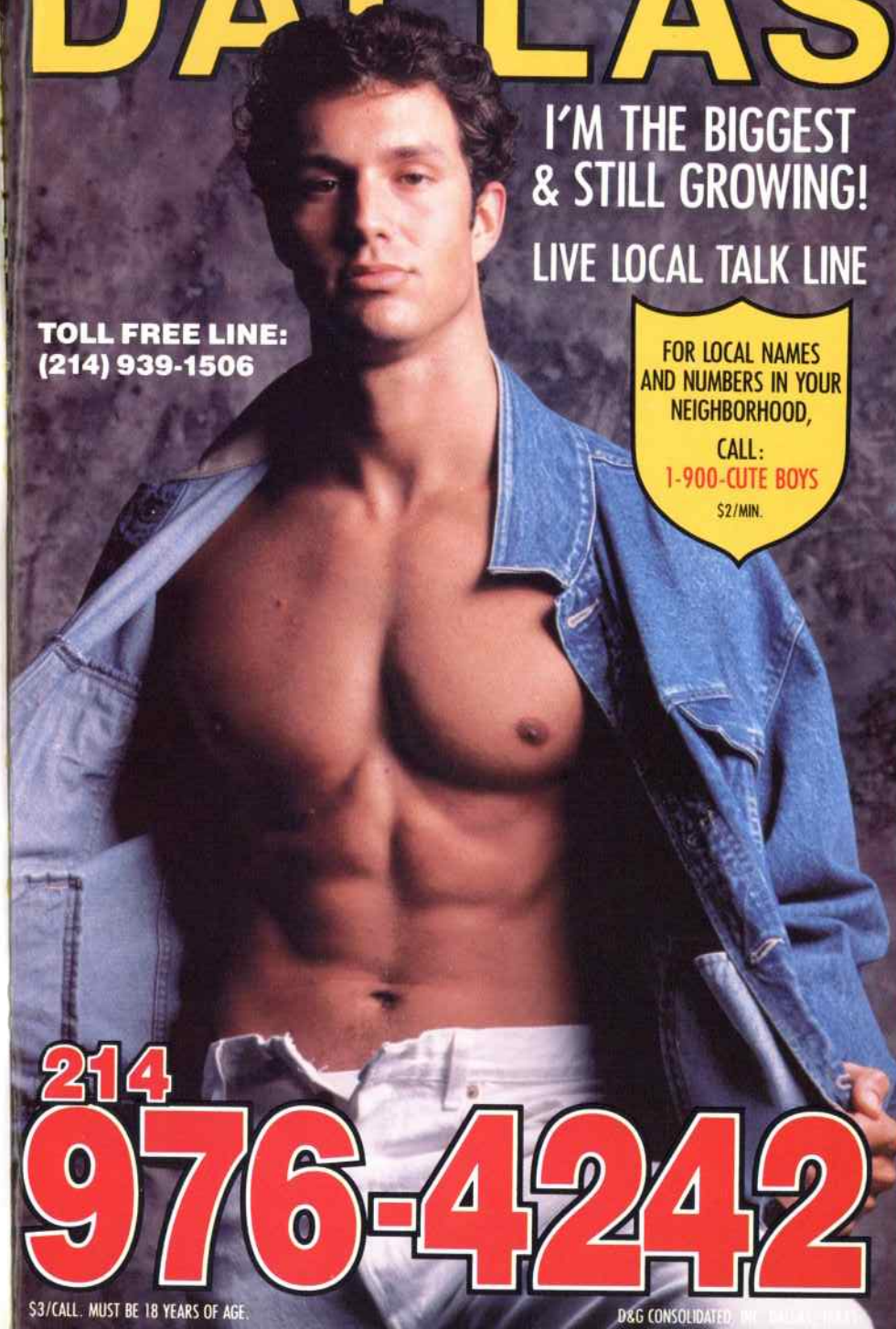
