GAY MARRIAGE: It's Not Such A New Idea After All

It's hard to turn on the TV these days without seeing a news story or a talk show dealing with gay issues. One of the favorite topics is gay marriage. It's such a completely radical, new concept, so 1990s—or is it?

The truth? It is the modern-day *suppression and persecution* of gay marriage relationships that is historically unprecedented, not the *recognition* of them! Surprised? So was a homophobic Washington, D.C. trial judge last year. He learned this news the hard way.

Craig Dean and Patrick Gill, the Washington, D.C. gay couple who are suing for the right to be married, were the judge's teachers. The judge was adamantly opposed to their case. The judge's problem was that the District of Columbia's statutes are among the most gay-positive and anti-discriminatory in the nation—if the

judge followed the law as *written*, he would have to rule in their favor. The judge desperately needed a way out. If there was one thing he wanted to avoid, it was becoming the first judge in American history to order a marriage license issued to two men!

As luck would have it, judges have a sneaky little way of getting around the law sometimes. It's called the Judeo-Christian Cultural Traditions Argument, and it's just plain, old-fashioned bigotry dressed up in the legal equivalent of drag. It doesn't really fool anyone—it just gives the judge a way to save face when he's in a sticky spot. As Ann Richards likes to say, "You can put lipstick on a hog and call her Mona, but it's still a hog." The ruling usually sounds something like this:

"Hear ye, hear ye, it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that you people may have thought the law gave you some rights, but you were mistaken. It may look like a hog, but her name is Mona and she can do whatever she wants. The cultural and religious history of Judeo-Christian society is that you've always sat at the back of the bus. We like it that way, and we're not going to change it."

In the Washington case, the judge planned to use this reasoning to rule that the word "marriage" had always necessarily required two people of opposite genders. "Therefore," he planned to rule, "even though the District's marriage statute is gender-neutral, and even though our human rights statute prevents discrimination against citizens based on 'sexual orientation,' the cultural and religious history of Judeo-Christian society means you lose anyway."

"This'll be a piece of cake," the judge probably thought. "Nobody ever heard of queers getting married until the ACLU wanted something to torment Jerry Falwell with." He thought, "This is going to be so easy that I'll even make them go and gather the switches I'm going to flog them with." So the judge ordered Craig and Patrick to submit a "Memorandum on the History of Same-Sex Marriage." Then he went home, watched Rush Limbaugh and had a good night's sleep.

But things didn't turn out the way he planned. Imagine the judge's horror when the litigants submitted a 63-page scholarly compendium of legally and religiously sanctioned same-sex marriage rites going back over 3,000 years to ancient Egypt and

Mesopotamia and including Grecian, Roman, African, Asian and even Native American cultures and traditions!

Perhaps most vexing to the judge (aside from the fact that he was only six months from retirement when this whole mess landed in *his* court), this exhaustive research also revealed a rich history of same-sex marriages in the *Christian* faith. Surprised again? (Actually, so were even Craig and Patrick.) Wait till you hear the rest.

To the judge's eternal consternation, it turns out that the Catholic Church placed the unmistakable stamp of Christian morality on homosexual unions for over 1,500 years, quietly stopping the practice only in the 19th century. (I imagine the judge took a couple of headache pills when he got to this point in the Memorandum.) These marriages were not performed by just one errant priest here or there going astray every hundred years or so. No, the church developed over 100 liturgies specifically for same-sex marriages. Obviously, the procreative aspects of marriage did not apply to same-sex unions, so these references were dropped. In place of these, the liturgies emphasized the companionate aspects of marriage and, in the case of a male couple, celebrated "brotherhood."

One such liturgy exalts "Your Holy Martyrs Sergius and Bacchus," two Roman soldiers who were Christian homosexual lovers. As the Memorandum fully explained, the Romans demanded that the lovers renounce their faith, which they refused to do. They were tortured. When Bacchus died, Sergius faltered in his faith, until Bacchus appeared to him in a vision, imploring him to remain strong. "Your reward will be me," Bacchus said to Sergius, according to Catholic tradition, clearly referring to their reunion in heaven. The martyrdom of Sergius and Bacchus was very popular in the early church, especially in the Greek-speaking world. The two of them, holding hands with crowns above their heads, are commonly-depicted icons in the Greek Orthodox tradition.

The Catholic liturgies typically ended with the traditional kiss and the singing of one of the Psalms: "Behold how good and sweet it is for brothers to live as one." (By this time, the judge was probably taking long swigs out of a bottle of Mylanta.)

The poor old judge had really stepped in it now. The reliable Judeo-Christian Traditions ploy was broken, and he was the one who had jammed the screwdriver

into the gears by ordering that damned Memorandum. It would not be as easy to turn gay rights into puree as he had thought. The judge realized that these two men wanting a marriage license were asking nothing more than a *return* to cultural traditions practiced for 15 centuries, not the *abandonment* of them. What was the judge to do?

Unfortunately, now you won't be surprised. He ruled against them anyway. In an outrageous opinion that disregarded both the District of Columbia's statutes and the Memorandum he himself had ordered (and now wished had never been written), he quoted biblical scripture at length and denied Craig and Patrick's marriage license.

Our heroes promptly appealed their case. Both were promptly fired from their jobs. Bloodied but unbowed, they formed the Equal Marriage Rights Fund to try to raise money for their legal battle. They have appeared on *Oprah Winfrey*, *Donahue*, *Nightwatch*, *CBS News*, *Fox Morning News* and other programs. Their struggle has been reported in the pages of *USA Today*, *The New York Times*, *The San Francisco Bay Times*, *The Washington Post*, *The Advocate* and countless other newspapers and periodicals. At the March on Washington in April of this year, their group of supporters carried a banner and sang "Chapel of Love" as they marched by the White House ("We're goin' to the chapel and we're gonna get married...")

Sadly, their fund-raising efforts have been woefully inadequate. Even some of their supporters tend to see their cause as hopeless—just too radically new an idea to ever succeed. The irony is that it isn't radical or new at all, except by contemporary standards. Perhaps if people knew the truth about history, things would be different.

Two men getting married? Two women? It's nothing new to the church. It's been going on on every continent of the globe, in virtually every faith, in virtually every age of man, in tribes, clans, countries and even in the Vatican for as long as history records. It's really a very modest proposal. So to speak.

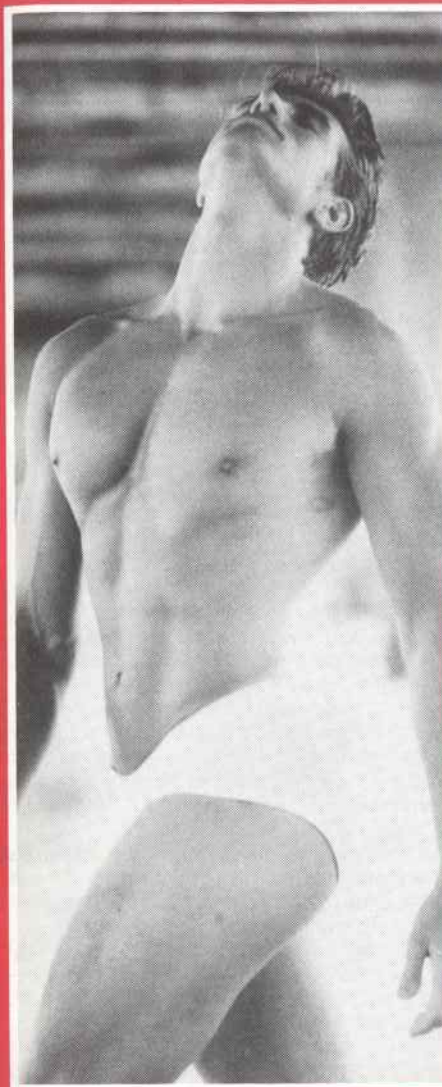

MEDICAL UPDATE

Questions & Answers on HIV

I've heard all sorts of different information about safe sex. I know that anal sex is dangerous, but how safe are oral sex and "rimming"?

The issue of safe sex is a tough one. No definitive studies have been done to assess the degree of risk of transmission of HIV infection involved with any particular type of sexual activity. We know that the virus is contained in bodily fluids. Therefore, any activity involving exchange of bodily fluids contains some inherent risk. Sexual activity can be loosely broken down into the categories of safest, safer and unsafe.

Safest sex involves no exchange of bodily fluids. This includes dry kissing, hugging, touching and massaging. Safer sex includes deep wet kissing, mutual masturbation and oral sex with a condom. Using sex toys can also be safe as long as the sex toys are not shared. Anal or vaginal sex using a condom can be safe, if certain precautions are taken. Always use a new latex condom, check the expiration date and know that you are familiar with its proper use. If you have questions, ask a competent health care provider about how to properly apply and dispose of a condom before attempting to use one.

Unsafe sex involves any exchange of or direct contact with bodily fluids. The safety of oral sex without a barrier remains controversial. Certainly, oral sex to the point of ejaculation is unsafe. However, males produce secretions from the penis before ejaculation, and this "pre-cum" may be infectious. Therefore, any oral sex without a condom must be considered risky. You specifically asked about rim-

ming. The risk of transmission of HIV infection through this activity is unknown, and it should be considered risky until proven otherwise. Rimming definitely exposes you to several other serious infections, including viral hepatitis.

The biggest defense against acquiring any infection from a sex partner is to be responsible for yourself. Knowing your partner's sex history is helpful only if that history can be trusted. If you are HIV positive, it is essential that you discuss this with your potential partner before any sexual activity occurs. If both partners are HIV positive, the same safe sex rules need to apply to avoid exposure to other sexually transmitted infections as well as reinfection with HIV itself. Remember, excessive use of alcohol or drugs clouds your judgment and can lead to regretful actions.

I recently have developed a few Kaposi's sarcoma lesions. I am embarrassed by one that is developing on my face. What treatment is available for this?

The manifestation of Kaposi's sarcoma varies from person to person. Many people develop only a few lesions that remain stable and are not particularly bothersome. Other people develop multiple lesions that can be progressive and disabling. Kaposi's sarcoma can also involve the internal organs and can, rarely, be life-threatening.

The approach to treatment of KS must be individualized according to the degree of involvement and the desires of the patient. If you have only a few lesions and your primary concern is the cosmetic appearance of a facial lesion, then local treat-

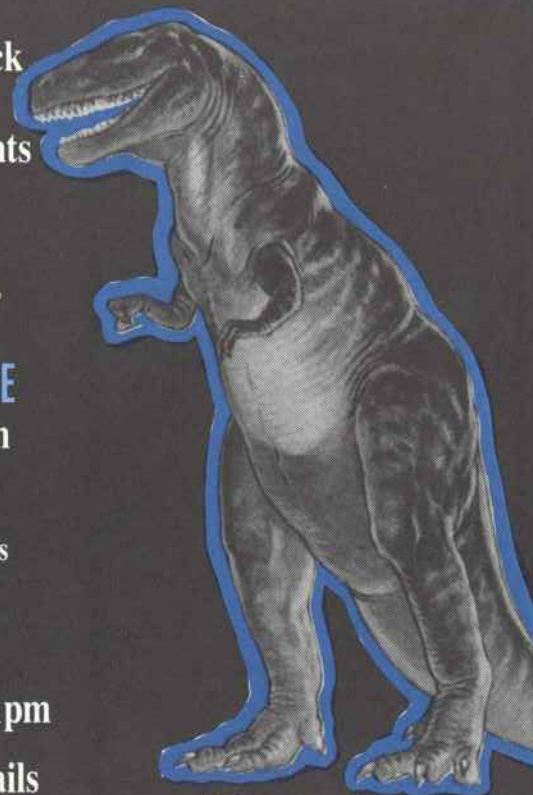

ment of the problem lesion may be appropriate. Intralesional therapy consists of injecting a weak concentration of a chemotherapy drug directly into the lesion. This causes momentary pain at the time of injection but overall is well tolerated. This method generally produces very good results. The best results are obtained with newer, smaller lesions. Radiation can also be used for local treatment. Depending on the location of the lesion, this method also has few side effects and can produce good results.

More extensive Kaposi's sarcoma, or rapidly progressing KS, may require systemic treatment. Patients with higher T helper cell counts may benefit from treatment with interferon. Interferon is injected by the patient into the fat tissue under the skin, much like insulin is injected. Side effects can be significant, including muscle aches, fever and fatigue. If the T helper cell count is lower, systemic chemotherapy may be the only option. These drugs are administered intravenously, usually either in an infusion center or hospital outpatient center. Traditional chemotherapy drugs can have serious side effects and because of this have generally been of limited usefulness. Fortunately, there are new agents manufactured by taking one of the toxic chemotherapy drugs and coating the molecules of the drug with fat molecules called liposomes. These new liposomal agents are currently in clinical trials and have been shown quite effective with greatly reduced side effects. I would expect these drugs to have FDA approval soon and be generally available.

The treatment options for your particular case of KS should be discussed with your doctor. You should weigh both the potential benefits and the side effects carefully. Do not expose yourself to a treatment that, while improving the KS, will cause undue impact on the rest of your body or quality of life.

A Brief History of The Gay Men's Chorus of Houston Part II



The Gay Men's Chorus of Houston has taken part in countless events benefiting worthy causes, like last year's "From All Walks of Life" fund-raiser for AIDS Foundation Houston.

1 986 was a very busy year for the Gay Men's Chorus of Houston, then called the Montrose Singers. In March they presented the world premiere of *Texas Fahrten* in its entirety. The chorus, performing under the name "Round Robin," presented the musical history in New Braunfels for its Texas sesquicentennial "Founders Day" ceremony to a standing-room-only audience, including a visiting chorus from Germany.

In 1988, the Singers were joined by the Lone Star Symphonic Band, HeartSong (Houston women's chorus) and the choir of the Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection for a Christmas concert that benefited the Stone Soup pantry and the Houston Area Women's Center. The Singers have always helped by lending their voices in song to aid fund-raising for worthy causes throughout the community. Over the years, MacAdory House, Omega House, AIDS Foundation Houston, the PWA Coalition, Park Plaza Hospital and other organizations have benefited. For many years, the Singers have given their time, energy and voice to entertain folks

at Independence Hall, the home for Houston's handicapped.

1990 was a milestone year for the group. In February, the chorus joined the touring company of *Heart Strings*, an evening of hope for the healing of AIDS at Jones Hall co-sponsored by DIFFA/Houston and the Bering Community Service Foundation.

Later that year, the Singers participated in Celebration '90: Gay Games III and Cultural Festival in Vancouver, British Columbia. The 12 members of the chorus who attended gave a superb concert, and the

group's sound was compared favorably with that of much larger choruses. The Celebration '90 Chorus, the first international chorus of men and women (gay, lesbian and straight), was over 300 voices strong, with members from around the U.S. and Canada, as well as England, Germany, France, Spain and Australia.

Over the years, the chorus has performed songs either written or arranged for them by their directors, accompanists or members. Among those contributing music to the group have been John-Michael Albert, Beau Cain, Jeff Cothran, Lief Lippert, Bryan Jennings, Bill Keller and Rex Gillit. Songs have also been composed in honor of members like Dennis Dunwoody and Jeff Cothran who have contributed so much to the chorus.

The Montrose Singers joined thousands of other Texans in the spring of 1991 for the March on Austin and the associated "Texas Sing Out," in which choruses from around the state joined together for a special performance. In 1992, the group found time during a busy schedule of appearances locally and around the country to give two performances for last year's tour of *Heart Strings, An AIDS Event in Three Acts* at Houston's Jones Hall. In order to better identify itself and what it stands for, the group also decided last year to change its name from the Montrose Singers to the Gay Men's Chorus of Houston.

The chorus performed at the awards banquet of the 15th National Lesbian and Gay Health Conference & 11th Annual AIDS/HIV Forum held last month in Houston. The Singers will host a Christmas concert featuring performances by HeartSong and the New Orleans Gay Men's Chorus on December 11 at the Wortham Theater.

Official plans for 1994 include a regional choral festival in Kansas City sponsored by Heartland Men's Chorus, followed by participation in Gay Games IV and Stonewall 25 in New York City. In 1995, the group will attend the GALA V convention in Tampa, Florida.

The Gay Men's Chorus of Houston currently holds rehearsals at the Montrose Activity Center, 3330 Graustark, on Thursdays at 7 p.m. Anyone interested in singing is invited to attend. A new class of "non-singing" members has also been established to further enhance the group's pool of talent in other areas. For more information, call the chorus at (713)984-9683.



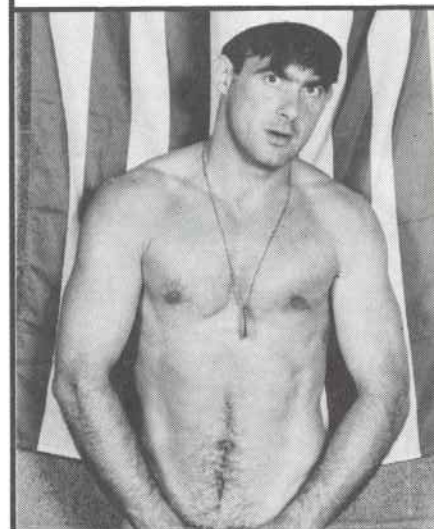

HOUSTONIAN NAMED TO BOARD OF GAY AND LESBIAN VICTORY FUND

Appointment of Annise Parker Part Of Effort to Expand, Diversify.

HOUSTON — The Gay and Lesbian Victory Fund, a nationwide organization whose members provide financial support to gay and lesbian political candidates, last week announced the appointment of Houston community leader Annise Parker to its board of directors. Parker is the first person from the Houston area to serve on the board.

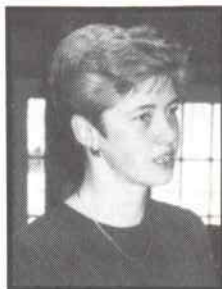
Parker's appointment was one of two made last week by the Victory Fund in the latest of a series of moves aimed at expanding its political and geographical reach. Also appointed to the board was Dr. Fred McCall-Perez, a Miami physician who has been active in raising campaign funds for openly gay and lesbian candidates. McCall served on the President's Health Care Task Force and the White House Health Care Professionals Review group in Washington, D.C. Board members were also recently added in Chicago, Denver and Milwaukee.

Parker is a longtime activist and community leader in Houston, her hometown. She served as president of the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus from 1986-88, and has been the organization's Police Committee Chair since early 1992. She is co-owner of Inklings, a lesbian/feminist/gay bookstore.

Employed by the Mosbacher Energy Company since 1981, Parker has also served on numerous community and state boards, and on a United Way committee. She has been a delegate to all state Democratic conventions since 1980, and was a candidate for Houston City Council District C, which at the time included the Montrose area, in 1991.

Parker said the Victory Fund had impressed her with its energy and commitment. "This is the first group of people I've worked with in a while who are really enthusiastic about what they're doing." As a board member, she will be actively involved recruiting new members.

"As a recent candidate for office, Annise adds new depth to the board," said

John Ramos of the Victory Fund. "In addition to her years of experience in political activism, she brings insight into the organizational needs of the campaigns that we sponsor and the unique perspective of being an openly lesbian candidate from the Southern United States." Ramos, a Dallas businessman, is chair of the Fund's Board Development Committee.

As part of a drive to recruit members in the Houston area, the Fund will hold a private fund-raising reception in October. Organizers hope to have nationally known gay and lesbian figures appear as special guests.

The Gay and Lesbian Victory Fund, founded in May of 1991, is a nationwide donor network that supports gay and lesbian political candidates around the country. Members donate \$100 to the Fund itself, and agree to contribute a minimum of \$100 each to at least two of the candidates recommended by the organization each year. The Fund does not issue recommendations in races in which there are two or more gay or lesbian candidates running.

FOUNDATION GIVES \$2,500 TO DALLAS FOOD PANTRY

Donation Comes at Time of Growing Caseload at Agency.

DALLAS — In 1987, midway into the first decade of AIDS, two Dallas-area residents challenged by the disease were found to be starving because all of the

limited resources were being directed towards housing and medical expenses. Since proper nutrition is essential to maintain weight and to reduce the opportunistic infections associated with the disease, AIDS service workers knew that this was a potentially critical situation. They also knew that if just two people were facing this crisis, there were probably hundreds more who had not yet been identified.

It was then that the idea of a food pantry was devised—a place where people with HIV/AIDS and with limited income could obtain food items and hygiene supplies they needed to maintain a dignified life. Dallas' Food Pantry was envisioned as a vital link between those infected and the plentiful resources available in the community.

The Food Pantry has accomplished a great deal in its six years of operation, working with sometimes limited resources and a seemingly endless demand. It counts among its assets a very supportive business and civic community, and a hard-working and dedicated staff of employees and volunteers. It has a very positive and beneficial working relationship with several grocery stores and food distributors in and around Dallas. What it sometimes doesn't have is money.

That's where The Stewart B. McKinney Foundation, Inc. of Fairfield, Connecticut, and other organizations like it, come in. Established in May of 1987 by Lucie C. McKinney, the widow of Stewart B. McKinney, a nine-term congressman from Connecticut who died of AIDS-related illness, the Foundation's overall goal is to provide a legacy of caring for the disadvantaged and to continue a quality of life for those living with AIDS.

In keeping with that credo, the McKinney Foundation recently bestowed a "challenge donation" on the AIDS Resource Center's Food Pantry and its Meal Programs. Totalling \$2,500, the donation will, it is hoped, encourage other businesses, corporations and foundations to donate to the Food Pantry. And, according to Food Pantry Director Mary Franklin, it could not come at a better time.

"Being that August is our greatest time of need, the universe has provided, one more time, a caring institute, a caring person to fill the gap as our numbers increase. As of July, our big weeks are averaging over 500 people. Our slow weeks average 470. We're currently two months ahead of my projections—I didn't anticipate 500



cases until September. We can certainly use this generous donation."

TEXAS HUMAN RIGHTS FOUNDATION RECEIVES GRANTS

Funding Will Help Provide Legal Aid for People with HIV.

AUSTIN — The Texas Human Rights Foundation has announced funding from two separate sources for the group's AIDS Legal Resource Project [ALRP]. The Houston chapter of the Design Industries Foundation for AIDS has awarded the project \$2,500 to help continue its work providing legal information and attorney referrals for persons with HIV and AIDS.

THRFF, a statewide, nonprofit organization that works to eliminate discrimination against gay men, lesbians and people with HIV, has been providing services since 1988 through its statewide, toll-free telephone helpline. In 1991, ALRP distributed nearly 6,000 copies of its brochure "AIDS and the Law: Know Your Rights" throughout the state, and last year helped over 400 people through direct telephone contact.

ALRP Project Director Kim Vickery expressed her organization's gratitude for the DIFFA grant. "In the world of nonprofits, you never know where your next dollar is coming from, and with this project, the demand for services increases every day. The grant from DIFFA will certainly help sustain the project for quite some time."

With back orders for nearly 2,000 copies, ALRP has also been searching for ways to pay for printing additional copies of "AIDS and the Law." With a grant from the OnCol Center for I.V. Therapies, the AIDS Legal Resource Project will now be able to print

an additional 4,000 copies of an updated version of the pamphlet. OnCol was founded by Houston physicians and HIV researchers Gary Brewton, Adan Rios, Gordon Crofoot and Jorge Quesada.

GAY SWITCHBOARD IN HOUSTON FACING BUDGET SHORTFALL

*Group's Officials Appeal to
Community for Help.*

HOUSTON — The Gay & Lesbian Switchboard of Houston [GLSH] was unable to meet its expenses this month and is in danger of closing down if it does not receive immediate help from the community. Switchboard officials are asking all those who have ever been helped by the service as well as those who appreciate the role it plays in the community to help the organization through this critical period.

"We've been at this for 11 years," said Jewel Gray, President of the Board of Directors of the Switchboard. "We've reached a crisis and we're desperate." To simply pay the rent, lights and phone bill, the Switchboard has been operating on a bare-bones budget of \$600 a month and has run out of funds raised through its last fund-raiser. Although commitments have been made by some organizations and businesses to help in the future, there is an immediate need for operating expenses at the present.

"What we've been doing is telling everybody we can that we're in a bad place," said Gray. She explained that many who use the switchboard and appreciate its value to themselves and to the community don't currently have the resources to help. Others who have been helped in the past and have become active within the community have forgotten about the switchboard. Then there are those who appreciate its value to the community, but are not aware of its needs. "We're kind of caught in a Catch-22," said Gray, who added that she is making an appeal to everyone she can to help out.

The switchboard serves as a clearing-house of information about the Houston gay and lesbian community to those who are just coming out and to those who have come to town either to visit or to stay. It

also provides peer counseling to people who are lonely and need someone to talk to about something that is troubling them, as well as to people who are going through a physical or emotional crisis.

"There are some things that I think are important enough to hang onto," says Gray, "and it's not just because I'm a person who works on the Switchboard. Before, I was also one of the people who called for information when I came into town 12 years ago," she continued. "We're there for those who feel alien in our community, who are moving from one community to another, from one area of life to another, and they're ready to be more out and involved in the gay world. And then there's the counseling."

Gray said there are many other services the Switchboard would like to provide the community. One example she cited was the possibility of a leadership training program for H.A.T.C.H. kids as they grow and come into the community.

GLSH officials estimate that, ideally, with funding for all the committees that are a part of the Gay & Lesbian Switchboard of Houston, the budget should be \$1,500-\$1,800 a month. But such figures are for the future. For now, the Switchboard faces the immediate need of meeting this month's rent.

OAK LAWN BAND ANNOUNCES 1993-94 SEASON SCHEDULE

DALLAS — It's not uncommon for gay men and lesbians of Texas to tell stories about growing up in small Texas towns or cities. Most of their stories, traditionally,

include at least on reference to the high school experience—a time when raging hormones and peer pressure combine to produce what often is a painful, and usually closeted, adolescent experience.

One highlight of those remembrances is frequent references to being labeled a "band fairy," a term which relegated the recipient of the moniker to second-class citizenship within the hierarchy of the high school structure. "Band fairies," readers may recall, were ostracized, taunted and condemned by the more middle-of-the-road students, who viewed male band members as effete and female members as something less than feminine. Texas high schools, after all, glorify nothing less than the masculinity of the team quarterback or the femininity of the chiffon-encased prom queen.

In 1980, some former "band fairies" banded together, deciding to put their well-honed talents to use for the betterment of their community. Beginning as a small marching band that participated in various gay pride parades in and around the state, the Oak Lawn Band is now a full-sized symphonic band that devotes much of its efforts to a three-concert season. As part of the Lesbian and Gay Bands of America (LGBA), the group strives to be a positive reflection of the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex through pride, spirit and musicianship.

Now, 13 years later, the Oak Lawn Band has announced the schedule for what many believe will be its most ambitious season to date. Beginning with its premiere concert on Saturday, September 11 entitled "A Celebration of Our Heritage II," the group will be presenting a diverse and exciting array of new, popular and classical works, many of which will be performed for the first time.

In their first concert, which will be held at Rusk Middle School at 2929 Inwood Road in Dallas, the band will perform "Suite for Band," the premiere performance of music composed by the group's principle clarinetist, Dr. John Wheeler, as well as numerous works of well-know gay and lesbian composers. 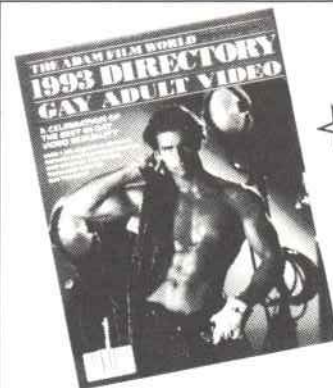

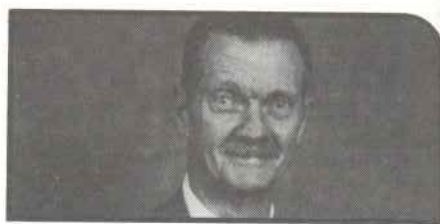
Christopher Lee Tyler Shrum, better known to friends and family as Lee, died July 29, 1993.

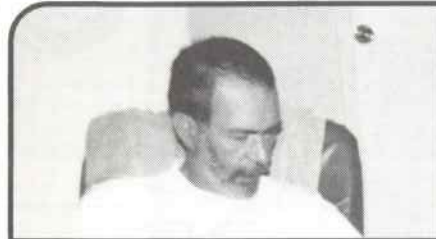

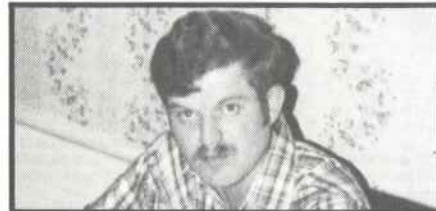

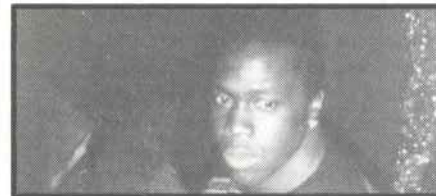
