Gays, Religion & Psychotherapy

Citing from scripture and dogma, many religious institutions have led the attack against homosexuality, branding it sinful, immoral and against the laws of God and nature. Although in recent years some churches have taken a more liberal view, many continue to condemn homosexuality as an affront to God and a danger to the heart of Judeo-Christian life—marriage and family. The gay male or lesbian who seeks help for alcoholism is well aware of religious homophobia. It appears in newspaper columns written by fundamentalist preachers, who sometimes equate homosexuality with the "Communist threat," and a few call for the literal extermination of homosexuals. It appears in the Pope's statement that acting upon one's homosexual feelings is a sin. It appears in people's comments that AIDS victims are only getting what they deserve, and God is punishing them for their sins.

Religious homophobia does not confine its destructive effects to homosexuality. A number of fundamentalists equate homosexuality with alcoholism and view both as self-induced, self-inflicted moral sickness. Their contention is that all homosexuals and alcoholics have to do is repent, pray and give up their sinful condition. Perhaps they cannot help becoming alcoholic or homosexual, but they can give it up. Such attitudes tend to evoke rage—and if not rage, then despair.

The client sitting in front of the counselor may have stopped going to church long ago because of the tremendous guilt instilled by his or her religion. A number of gays report the traumatic results of confessing their homosexual behavior or perhaps just their feelings to priests and having the priests castigate them or refuse absolution.

Many gays describe their despair as



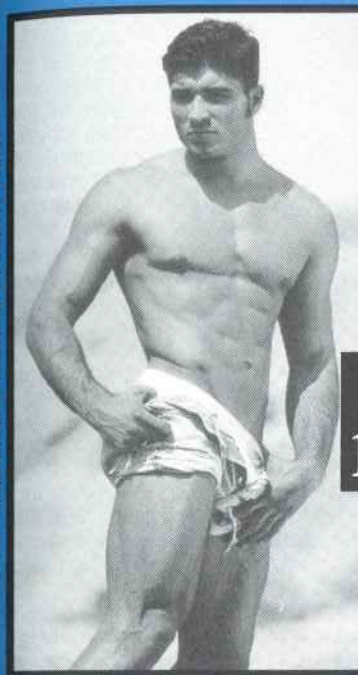

they measured their feelings and behavior against their churches' teachings and learned that by those standards they were sinners. Because of these kinds of conflicts and emotional scars, many gay people may have extra trouble in sobriety with spiritual concepts involving "moral" inventories and mentioning a belief in God. Fortunately, nuns, priests, ministers or rabbis can often help heal some of the scars simply by acting in an accepting and understanding manner.

Late in the nineteenth century, the medical/psychiatric profession tempered somewhat the prevailing religious view of homosexuality by defining it as a mental aberration, a form of illness, and claiming it should be treated, not condemned as sinful. Since that time, much homophobia has simply taken on a pseudoscientific aura, and many gay men and lesbians have been subjected to all kinds of indignities, insults and poor treatment by health professionals under the guise of therapy or treatment. A number of lesbians have reported that their gynecologists have told them to have intercourse to "get over" or "outgrow" their lesbianism. Gay men have been subjected to electric shocks in aversive therapy to condition them to not respond erotically to other men. And there have been reports of lobotomies and other forms of brain surgery being performed on gay men and lesbians in attempts to "cure" them of their homosexuality.

Up until 1973, the American Psychiatric Association [APA] labeled homosexuality an illness and so listed it in the *Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders*. After careful consideration as well as much discussion and disagreement, the APA declared that homosexuality "by itself does not necessarily constitute a psychiatric disorder." The APA's state-

ment went to say that only if a person is unable to accept and adjust to being homosexual can he or she be considered as sick—a state labeled “Ego-Dystonic Homosexuality.” Categorizing the inability to accept homosexuality as pathological seems rather inappropriate, given the high level of homophobia in this culture. In addition, officially getting rid of labels does not automatically get rid of homophobic attitudes.

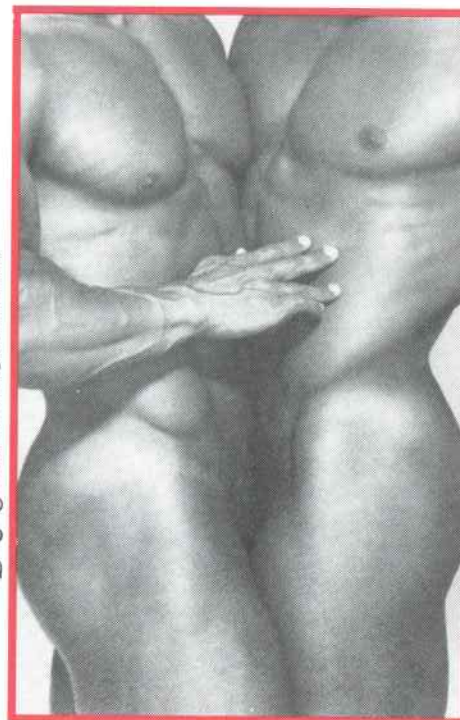
In spite of the APA's declaration, many psychologists and psychiatrists continue to view homosexuality as mental illness; it is not unusual to hear of gays being treated as though the essence of their emotional problems—if such are present—is their “abnormal” lifestyles. Many gay people still report having psychiatrists, psychologists and other professionals urge them to change their sexual orientation or offer to “cure” them. Countless gay men and lesbians have been subjected to hostile and destructive treatment based on the psychological view that gays are the way they are because of “arrested psychosexual development” or because of neuroses. This latter, unfortunately common, situation is analogous to the view that alcoholism is a symptom of an underlying personality disorder. Urging a lesbian or gay man to gain insight, change her or his behavior and thereby be “cured of homosexuality” is much like exhorting an alcoholic to do the same with her or his alcoholism. Both sets of exhortations are rooted in ignorance, prejudice, fear and hostility.

Just as destructive are the more subtle instances in which counselors simply ignore the issue of homosexuality. Because of ignorance and homophobia, they are in denial and do not attend to the realities of the person in front of them by asking and actively seeking to know the person's background, experiences and feelings about sexual identity. This is similar to the way many psychiatrists, psychologists and doctors fail to ask their clients about their alcohol use—because of the helping professionals' prejudice and resultant denial. Obviously, it is difficult if not impossible to give proper service when blinded by prejudice.

HIV & LONG-TERM SURVIVORS

The Ninth International Conference on AIDS, held recently in Berlin, Germany, shed more light on long-term survivors than any previous international conference. This was in response to last year's conference, held in Amsterdam, during which AIDS activists rallied and demanded that researchers look more closely into the factors and treatments surrounding long-term survivors. A small group of people infected with HIV seem to escape the normal fate; they live with the virus for more than a decade without developing the first symptoms of AIDS.

There are already people who live for more than 15 years, some with normal CD4 counts; others may survive even with drastically reduced T-helper cell counts. Why?

There is no single explanation why some HIV-positive people are long-term survivors and some are not. One important factor seems to be good access to health care. Another appears to be a holistic approach to the treatment of HIV, including nutritional support, psychological support and standard medical therapy. When natural therapies are used in combination with standard medical therapies, a much more effective treatment plan emerges. It has been my experience that this combination approach is absolutely necessary if the treatment of HIV is to be successful.

Individuals diagnosed with AIDS in 1991 have nearly twice the survival rate of those diagnosed in 1984 because of improved therapy and health care. These numbers are even more impressive in hospitals and institutions that specialize in the treatment of HIV disease.

One very clear point made at the Berlin conference was that the CD4 count is not the only surrogate marker that is important

in following disease progression. It is very clear now that specialized CD8 positive cells (suppressor cells) make a previously undiscovered cytokine, a type of protein secreted by T cells. Long-term survivors maintained high numbers of these activated cells. The CD8 positive cell anti-HIV activity is linked to maintenance of high levels of CD4 positive cells and appears to be a major factor preventing viral mutations in long-term survival. Finding ways to increase this CD8 activity may indeed be a key to long-term survival. Other important surrogate markers to follow are P-24 antigen, a protein that suggests active HIV replication; beta 2 microglobulin, a protein secreted by lymphocytes; and neopterin, a protein secreted by macrophages. Increasing levels of these markers over time may indicate an increased chance of HIV disease progression.

Another important factor in HIV progression seems to be the strain of the virus. In addition, repeated exposures to the HIV virus through unprotected sex or continued IV drug abuse also seem to increase the rate of progression. Co-factors are important in the progression of HIV disease and these include herpes viruses such as CMV, Epstein-Barr virus and human herpes virus-6. Perhaps even a bacteria called mycoplasma may be responsible for faster progression in HIV disease. Equally important co-factors are age and lifestyle. There was also evidence this year that HLA typing and genetic factors may be useful in identifying people who are at risk for rapid disease progression. These studies suggest that resistance to HIV may be associated with MCH class I alleles and may have an immune basis.

In terms of psychological factors, a less

traumatic childhood and adolescence, a solid self-image and realistic coping mechanisms are protective factors against the progression to AIDS. Long-term survivors had fewer traumatic life events, exhibited considerable psychological resilience, and continued to maintain hopes and goals and derive satisfaction from their lives. Untreated depression doubled the rate of progression to AIDS.

Physical exercise improves biological condition at all stages of HIV infection, including AIDS. There is evidence that a delay of AIDS-related complications seems to be possible through regular exercise.

The body has unusually high metabolic needs in the presence of HIV infection. Your diet must contain an abundance of vitamins, minerals, calories and protein. Eat plenty of onion, garlic and ginger. Avoid raw foods such as clams, oysters, marinated or uncooked fish, sushi, rare meats and undercooked eggs. Inadequate protein intake results in lowered resistance to infection, poor wound healing, weight loss and a general lack of vigor. Limit your dairy consumption to five percent of your total fat. Most HIV-positive people have a limited tolerance to dairy products that, when exceeded, can cause a production of excess gas, loose bowels and even fatigue.

Numerous studies have linked vitamin and mineral deficiencies to weakened immune system functioning. The most common deficiencies are of vitamins A, C and E and of zinc and selenium. Caffeine, alcohol and sugar have a negative effect on the immune system. When consumed in excess, alcohol is a poison to every system of your body. It depresses the nervous system, inhibits bone marrow's ability to regenerate blood cells, depletes B vitamins and is dehydrating. In the March issue of *The Journal of Infectious Diseases*, researchers report finding that even moderate alcohol consumption may accelerate the growth of HIV. The study revealed that drinking only two beers both suppressed the body's immune system and enabled HIV to replicate more rapidly. Since 1973, there have been several scientific studies that have provided strong evidence of sugar's negative effect on the immune system. White cells, including T cells, are adversely affected by excessive amounts of sugar in the blood stream.

In addition to the appropriate use of antiviral drugs, a key to survival with HIV is preventing opportunistic infections [OI].

The best and latest OI prophylaxis should also be part of an overall strategy for treating HIV. There are now prophylactic medications available for the overwhelming majority of opportunistic infections.

Another important factor is the doctor/patient relationship. There currently exists no single approach among doctors which might be called the "accepted medical position." Conversely, there is no single intervention that is universally accepted by all patients. A cooperative and trusting relationship must be built between the patient and physician. HIV patients should refuse to stay out of the decision-making process about their future course of treatment. Effective communication is crucial and HIV patients must have the right to participate in key decisions and to ask about alternative methods of treatment.

The alternative therapies movement has encouraged strides in accelerating the drug approval process that will benefit patients with AIDS. Physicians caring for patients with HIV infection should make every attempt to inform themselves about complimentary therapies that may be in use in their community. Establishing trust and open communication will allow health professionals to enter caring partnerships with their patients, including those who may be empowering themselves in the presence of this relentless disease by using alternative treatments. The blend of traditional medical treatment and a holistic approach to alternative treatments is a key to long-term survival.

HIV infection is increasingly being viewed as a manageable chronic disease rather than as a terminal illness. There will one day be a treatment that allows HIV-positive patients to have normal life spans. Everything that is possible in a medical/holistic approach should be done to keep patients alive until that day arrives.

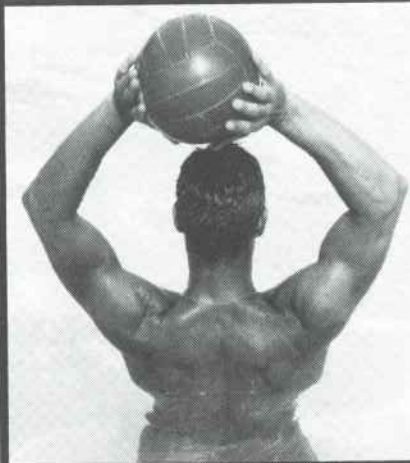

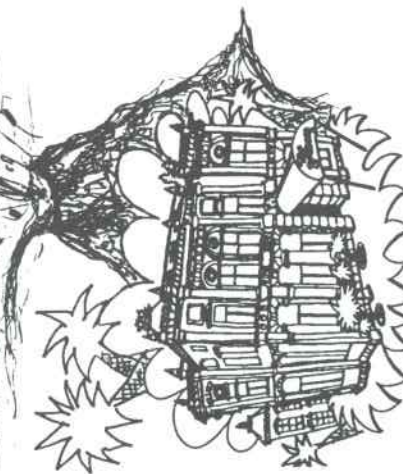

The Fugitive is a film forced, like its hero, to tread a precarious path. To be honest, its premise, lifted from the classic television series of the same title, is borderline ludicrous. One can easily picture a schlocky Fifties movie poster screaming, "Convicted of A Crime He Didn't Commit! Forced to Flee From Dogged Pursuit! Will He Find Killer in Time?!" Fortunately, director Andrew Davis shows a sure hand in guiding his characters through the potential pitfalls, and the result may be the most entertaining action confection of the summer.

Davis and screenwriters Jeb Stuart and David Twohy very wisely stick to the core of the original story. Richard Kimble (Harrison Ford) is a celebrated and dedicated vascular surgeon in Chicago. Called in to surgery following some gala, he returns home to encounter the infamous one-armed man who has killed Kimble's wife. However, the police, naturally skeptical, arrest Kimble for the murder, resulting in a conviction and death sentence. It is a testament to the pacing of the film that all of this happens before the opening credits have finished. This is important, because if one were able to think for a minute about the developments, it would prove impossible to suspend disbelief. However, the action moves at a brisk, even manic, speed and the skillful performances patch over any rough spots. In this slapdash but ef-

fective manner, the filmmakers manage to sustain the paranoid, anything-goes edge of a nightmare.

On the bus to the prison, Kimble witnesses the stabbing of a guard by a fellow convict, ducks a hail of bullets, survives the rolling crash of the bus down a hillside, convinces a guard to remove his handcuffs and pulls the injured guard free of the bus just before it is demolished in spectacular fashion by a speeding train. All of this within the space of about three minutes. But before analytical thought kicks in, Kimble is off and running and U.S. marshal Sam Gerard (Tommy Lee Jones) is in, well, dogged pursuit. The plot unwinds as matters continue, but the points are moot. Despite all the ensuing business, the focus remains the cat-and-mouse courtship of Kimble and Gerard,

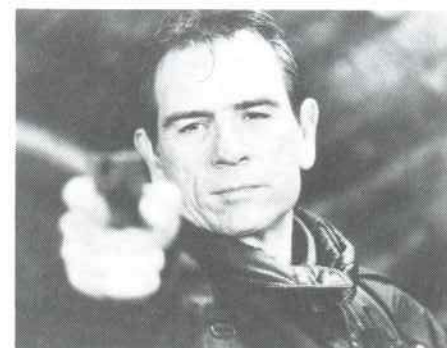

with the good doctor always just one step ahead.

Ford is the most natural choice for Kimble. When not playing charming rogues such as Han Solo or Indiana Jones, he specializes in portraying the harried everyman, a specialty he takes here to its extreme. His unique combination of affability and awkwardness creates immediate empathy for a character that might otherwise have been just a plot device in human clothing. Likewise, Jones, as the intrepid tracker, makes the most of the material. To be fair, he has the best lines in the film, but his modulation of tone from sardonic to genuine is his own particular genius at work. In addition, Jones manifests a translucent intelligence. One can almost see the gears grinding behind his stoic expression, trying to unravel Kimble's unpredictable moves. The other actors acquit themselves admirably, including Joe Pantoliano (*Three of Hearts*) as Gerard's right-hand man and Sela Ward (TV's *Sisters*) as the hapless Mrs. Kimble.

But the film belongs to Ford and Jones, whose characters, from the moment they first meet (in the already famous top-of-the-dam scene), are so intently focused on one another, that the pursuit, and its resolution, have an almost romantic edge. Unlike the television series, which covered quite a bit of territory, both physical and dramatic, the film stays close to home, with most of the action taking place in and around Chicago. Despite the red herrings and the irredeemably convoluted explanation, there is a great deal of fun to be had

in Kimble's frantic and, to Gerard's frustration, successful attempts to simultaneously avoid capture and track down the true killer. If there is another true central character, it may be Chicago itself, the hectic pace of which, from the frantic activity of the emergency room at Cook County Hospital, to the antic celebrations of the Saint Patrick's Day parade, provide convenient cover for Kimble, and obstacles for Gerard. While *The Fugitive* may not challenge the mind, it may be a better rollercoaster ride than may be had at any theme park this summer.

One note: the year of the lesbian seems to be continuing at the movies. One minor but important (and sympathetic) character in *The Fugitive*, a colleague of Kimble's, sports, among other things, a red ribbon and a "Hate Is Not A Family Value" button on her lapels. Looked like family to me.

EISERLOH ANNOUNCES DECISION TO RESIGN AS HEAD OF STATE LESBIAN/GAY LOBBY

*Cites Personal, Financial Reasons,
Burnout As Factors in Move.*

AUSTIN — Laurie Eiserloh, who has served as Executive Director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas [LGRL] for nearly three years, has announced her intention to resign from the organization later from her post later this year.

"Right now I'm looking at November 15," Eiserloh said in a statement released Monday. "That's the date I started at the Lobby three years ago, but to some extent the date I leave depends on whether or not the board finds a replacement for me by then."

Eiserloh joined the Lobby nearly three years ago as the first woman lobbyist for the statewide organization. LGRL works to advance the rights of gay and lesbian people and those with HIV in the state Legislature.

She explained that personal and financial considerations had played a part in her decision. "I have decided to leave for reasons that I do not mind sharing," Eiserloh said. "First of all, I will turn 30 in December and my partner Jessica and I have just bought a home together and have made a commitment to each other. In several years, we may consider having a child together.

"Because of these responsibilities, I feel the need for greater financial security and greater job security. Nevertheless, I have enjoyed my job at LGRL and this has been an incredibly difficult decision for me to make."

Eiserloh conceded that burnout was

another factor. "It's difficult to travel all over the state on a shoestring and put in 15-hour days at the Capitol and raise your own salary, but that's how these jobs go," she said. "I think three years is pretty much the upper limit on executive director positions for lesbian/gay and AIDS action groups.

"Nevertheless, when I go out into the community, such as on my recent trip to Houston, and visit with many of the talented activists we have in this state, I feel completely rejuvenated."

During Eiserloh's tenure, LGRL lobbied for and won passage of a hate-crimes statistics act, a hate-crimes penalty enhancement provision in state law, improved laws governing funeral homes and the appointment of five openly gay or lesbian people to state boards and commissions.

Eiserloh said she intended to maintain ties with LGRL. "The Lobby is extremely important to me. I believe strongly in the Lobby's mission and I will do everything in my power to make certain that LGRL continues to be a voice in statement government." She added that she also hoped to remain involved in lesbian and gay politics, and would like to run for public office in the near future.

LGRL began a nationwide search for Eiserloh's replacement this week. The board is looking for someone who has experience in politics and a proven record in fund-raising plus administrative skills. Women, minorities and people of color are encouraged to apply.

OMEGA HOUSE OFFICIALLY OPENS NEW FACILITY

*Larger Houston AIDS Hospice
Will Accommodate Eight Residents.*

HOUSTON — Celebrating the culmination of a dream made possible by the donations and hard work of so many, Omega House opened its new facility to the public for a few hours last Thursday evening. An eclectic crowd of volunteers, elected officials, design professionals and others toured the hospice, marveling at the

changes that had transformed the structure into a beautiful, inviting place for people with AIDS to spend their last days. After a ceremony which included the reading of a statement from Houston Mayor Bob Lanier's office proclaiming Thursday Omega House Day, founder Eleanor Munger cut a red ribbon to signify the official opening of the new residence.

The bedrooms (six private, one semi-private) and other areas of the house were renovated by members of the Texas Gulf Coast chapter of the American Society of Interior Designers [ASID], who donated their time and services to help make the new facility a reality. There is also a medication room; a large, ultra-modern kitchen; office space; and a beautifully furnished dining/living area. A painting of Ms. Munger hangs above the fireplace in the entrance room.

The new facility will accommodate eight residents, more than double the number housed in the current hospice.

Omega House is a hospice for people with AIDS who are in the final stages of their illness and have nowhere else to live. Residents are admitted without regard for their ability to pay. The House also provides spiritual, psychological and palliative medical care.

Ms. Munger, a retired Montessori teacher, founded Omega House in August of 1986 with the help of Michael Shuff. Since then, the facility has provided care for nearly 200 people with AIDS.

Omega House is a nonprofit organization recognized as tax-exempt by the IRS and the State of Texas. Most of the hos-



pice's operating expenses come from charitable donations, and it also receives some state funding. Residents are cared for by a combination of volunteer and paid staff. DALLAS ACT UP TO PROTEST PARKLAND HOSPITAL AIDS CLINIC

*Group Accuses Institution of
Negligence and Inadequacy
In Treatment of HIV Patients.*

DALLAS — Dallas' chapter of ACT UP [AIDS Coalition to Unleash Power], a direct action and advocacy group committed to ending the AIDS crisis through any means necessary, has scheduled a protest march against the Parkland Hospital AIDS Clinic for what the group claims is the Clinic's "negligence and deliberate inadequacy in treating people living with AIDS." The protest—which is expected to attract participants from AIDS service agencies and their clients, PWA support groups and their caregivers and others groups and individuals concerned about Parkland AIDS patients' struggle to secure decent care—will take place next Tuesday, August 24, at 4 p.m. directly in front of the Parkland Outpatient Clinic entrance at 5201 Harry Hines Boulevard.

According to ACT UP representatives, since January of this year, Parkland AIDS Clinic patients and their caregivers have expressed dissatisfaction with the level of care and concern exhibited by Parkland staff. Each complaint has been registered

with Parkland and Southwestern Medical Center officials, to no avail. ACT UP has monitored these complaints, which include: waiting lists as long as three months for initial and periodic exams; no walk-in Clinic access; last minute appointment cancellations without patient notification; rapid turnover of Clinic staff, with resultant staff shortages; medication errors; lack of clinical trials; lack of community interaction, including cancellation of scheduled speaking engagements by hospital staff; stalling volunteers efforts to improve care; and lack of patient education.

Organizers say the protest will be directed at the controllers of Parkland AIDS Clinic, Parkland's CEO Dr. Ron Anderson and UT Southwestern's Chairman of Internal Medicine Dr. Dan Foster, who, in the words of a statement issued by ACT UP, are being challenged to "stop wasting lives, wasting time and wasting money." Further, they will demand that Parkland offer "immediate improvement in the AIDS Clinic's standard of care for patients who know that AIDS won't wait."

HOUSTON PHYSICIAN SUES INSURANCE FIRM THAT FIRED HIM

*Judge Refuses to Grant
Injunction Against HMO.*

HOUSTON — A Houston physician prominent in the treatment of HIV filed suit recently against a health maintenance organization that he says terminated its contract with him because he was spending too much money treating patients with the disease. But his request for a temporary injunction against the HMO, CIGNA Plan of Houston, was denied.

A health maintenance organization contracts with physicians to provide care for its prepaid subscribers.

In his suit, Dr. Joseph Gathe, an infectious disease specialist and co-director of the AIDS unit at Park Plaza Hospital, claims that his contract with CIGNA was terminated "without cause." He says he was really fired by the company because CIGNA officials are more concerned about keeping cost down than about providing their members with adequate medical care. And his suit claims that, after his

services for CIGNA were terminated, his patients' care was endangered when they were turned over to doctors less experienced in the treatment of AIDS.

Attorneys for CIGNA insist that the firm was within its rights to terminate Gathe's services for the HMO, and that the contract he had signed with the company allowed for either party to the agreement to end it.

On Friday, Judge Carolyn Garcia denied Gathe's request that a temporary injunction be granted against CIGNA. But she also ordered the company not to disqualify six of Gathe's former AIDS patients who are participating in protocols on experimental HIV drugs.

Among those present at the hearings last week were members of the AIDS Equity League. Gathe had sent the League a letter asking for its support in his court fight against CIGNA.

Activist Brian Bradley applauded Gathe's action, regardless of the ultimate outcome of the physician's case. "Finally, we've had a doctor step forward and say, 'We're being shafted by the insurance companies.'" But Bradley also expressed the fear that CIGNA's termination of Gathe's contract would endanger the status of experimental drug protocols now being carried out in the Houston area and, ultimately, the health of many people with AIDS who might benefit from those drugs.

DALLAS CLINIC TO RUN STUDY OF NEW ANTIVIRAL DRUG

*Trial to Test 3TC in Combination
Against Other Medications.*

DALLAS — At the recent Ninth International AIDS Conference in Berlin, one of the bright spots was reports on promising results achieved with a new antiviral drug, 3TC, in combination with other antiviral drugs such as AZT, ddI and ddC.

In April, studies of 3TC began in the U.S., Canada and Europe. Two hundred and two patients received varying doses of the drug, and while some received doses that turned out to be too low to be effective, some promising results were achieved. 3TC does appear to achieve some anti-HIV activity, at least on a par with other drugs such as AZT. And while there appeared to be no long-term large increases in the

number of T-helper cells in the cases studied, 3TC did seem to produce a lower incidence of those drug reactions—such as headache, fatigue, diarrhea and, most importantly, neuropathy—which are normally associated with other antiviral drugs, except in cases of advanced HIV disease when those symptoms are normally seen.

Based on these somewhat promising results, Glaxo, 3TC's manufacturer, scheduled two additional trials of the drug, mostly in combination with AZT, to test its efficacy. 3001, the first study—designed for 320 patients and blinded in such a way that no one would know who was receiving which antivirals—includes Dallas and 12 other American cities. The study was designed to test single drugs against different doses of 3TC in combination in patients with 200–500 T-helper cells and no history of AZT, ddI or ddC use.

The second study, dubbed 3002, will have 225 patients and will also be blinded. It will test different doses of 3TC in combination against another combination. Patients in the study must have taken AZT for at least 24 weeks, but never have taken ddI or ddC. Their T-helper cell count must be in the 100 to 300 range.

Study 3001 has been extended through September 15 for new study participants. Those accepted into the study will receive lab monitoring, medication, physician visits and \$25 per study visit. 3001 is being administered in Dallas by the Nelson-Tebedo Community Clinic. 'GARDEN PARTY' IN DALLAS TO HONOR EISERLOH, MAXEY

*Fund-Raiser Will Benefit
Lobby's Efforts in Austin.*

DALLAS — In the face of President Clinton's recent recanting of his promise to lift the ban on gays and lesbians in the military, it is important to remember the tremendous strides that the community has made in the ongoing battle to gain political clout and social acceptance in this country. Despite the President's decision not to abide fully by his earlier pledge on the military issue, legislative reform has been taking place that is laying the groundwork for freedoms never before imagined.

In Texas alone, we have witnessed en-

actment of hate crimes legislation which includes sexual orientation in its definition. A funeral home bill was approved that guarantees the rights of individuals to designate someone other than parents or siblings to make funeral arrangements—an important issue to gay and lesbian couples. And although a new Texas Penal Code was approved that retains Section 21.06—the state's "anti-sodomy" law—the Senate initially rejected the statute, partially on the ground that it is seldom enforced.

These milestones have not come easily, however. It has taken a dedicated and concerted effort by gays and lesbians across the state, and, particularly, of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas. Headed by Executive Director Laurie Eiserloh, the LGRL is the gay and lesbian voice in the halls of the state Capitol.

According to Paul Rogers, co-chair of the Lesbian/Gay Political Coalition of Dallas, "When the Texas Legislature is in session, during the first five months of odd-numbered years, Laurie Eiserloh works with House and Senate committees to discuss and lobby for legislation which would benefit our community. She will call to our attention bills which should be supported and, just as importantly, bills we need to fight. When the Legislature is not in session, work continues in state government on an individual level. Again, our lobbyist (Eiserloh) is on the job to discuss and educate individual office holders and state agencies on our opinions. Education is a never-ending process."

Eiserloh will be honored at a fund-raising party next Saturday, August 28, hosted by the Lesbian/Gay Political Coalition of Dallas, and co-hosted by Dallas City Councilmembers Craig McDaniel and Chris Luna. Joining Eiserloh as honoree will be Texas' first openly gay state Representative, Glenn Maxey of Austin. The first-time event has been dubbed The Dallas Garden Party, and as such, will be held in the gardens of Wynn Wagner III and Joe McFall's residence. A \$25 donation will provide attendees with an annual membership in the Lobby, and will support LGRL in its efforts to educate state officials about the importance of equality for all Texans.

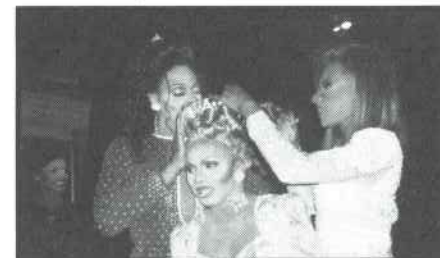
