HIVINFECTION Here and Now Antiretrovirals

"It is unkind and untrue, however, to suggest that we can do nothing to help people with HIV disease. We can provide care, prevent and treat complications, and in many cases prolong life. It is hope and not despair that we should emphasize."


A long with hope, we need to emphasize education. Learning about HIV infection, how it can be prevented and treated can be life-saving. One cannot learn enough about HIV disease.

I previously have written that treatment against HIV infection must rest upon a foundation of mental health, good health habits, proper nutrition, protection from infectin and a close working relationship with a physician. Anti-HIV therapy will ultimately be the key in treating this disease. Although our present tools are imperfect, they are partially effective in inhibiting the HIV virus and slowing destruc-

tion of the immune system. We need to make the most of what we have available today so that we will be able to apply the newer, more effective drugs that are sure to be developed.

It is important to have a basic understanding of what the HIV virus does to the body and how we presently treat the infection. The virus is a retrovirus. "Retro" means backward, and in a sense, the virus does behave in a backwards manner (on many levels). Unlike humans, the genetic material in the virus is RNA, not DNA. Therefore, it needs a very unique enzyme to help it produce the viral information in a DNA form. This enzyme is called reverse transcriptase. Without this enzyme, the HIV virus cannot take over a cell or produce new viruses. All of the present anti-HIV (antiretroviral) drugs interfere with the function of reverse transcriptase and, hence, slow viral reproduction. This class of drugs is known as nucleoside analog reverse transcriptase inhibitors and is currently available as AZT (zidovudine), ddl (didanosine) and ddC (zalcitadine).

HIV damages the immune system by attaching itself to proteins on the outside of



a specific white cell (CD4 cell or T lymphocyte), gaining entry into the cell, reprogramming the cell to actually produce more HIV virus, and then ultimately killing the white blood cell which it had infected.

In theory, these drugs should slow the advance of HIV disease. What happens in real life? The truth is that these drugs work. Not in every patient, not as well or as long as one would like, but they work. And they are available now. We need to make the most of them.

There have been four major studies demonstrating the benefit of AZT in HIV infection without symptoms. The most recent study, the European-Australian Collaborative Group Study, reported that AZT cut the rate of progression of HIV disease among patients with more than 400 CD4 (T) cells by one half. In this study, the benefits of treatment were sustained for 2½ years. If one waits until symptoms occur, there is benefit to treatment, but it tends not to last as long. To obtain the maximum benefit from today's therapy, get tested. The sooner you start managing this disease, the better you will do.

I can't discuss early intervention with AZT and not mention the Concorde trial. This poorly designed and executed study did not demonstrate an advantage to starting AZT in asymptomatic individuals versus waiting to institute treatment until symptoms appeared. Almost one-third of the participants who were counted as taking a placebo (sugar pill) were actually taking AZT. It's hard to show a difference in outcomes when both comparative groups are taking the same medication. Other than demonstrating brilliantly how not to conduct a study, there is not much to learn from the Concorde trial.

Despite the number of studies that demonstrate that AZT slows the progression of HIV disease, there is a lot of resistance to taking this drug. Part of it is denial. Initiation of antiretroviral therapy is frequently a very emotional event in that one is confronted with a daily reminder of his or her illness. Many feel that this is the beginning of the end. These are very real concerns and need to be verbalized to one's physician. He or she will help you work through these issues. Rather than losing control, the individual is taking an active, positive step in altering the progression of illness.

Other concerns include toxicity of the present antiretroviral medications. At currently recommended doses, the incidence


of low red cell or white cell counts with AZT is between 1 and 2%. These are considered the most serious side effects of AZT and are readily monitored. Other side effects such as nausea, headache or fatique are most commonly seen at the onset of treatment and tend to resolve with time. I try to minimize these symptoms by starting with a small dose of AZT and gradually increasing the dose over a period of weeks. ddl and ddC do not affect the white or red counts, but can have irritating effects on the pancreas and nerves, resulting in pancreatitis and peripheral neuropathy. Since pancreatitis can be a lifethreatening condition, amylase (pancreatic enzyme) levels should be checked periodically. With all of these drugs, the incidence of side effects increases with low T-cell counts. In individuals with higher Tcell counts, and no symptoms, these are very well-tolerated medications.

Cost can also be a hurdle to getting treatment. Although these drugs are less expensive than they were when first introduced, they are far from cheap. For individuals with limited financial resources, the Texas HIV Medication Program provides most of the drugs used to treat HIV disease for those individuals who qualify. Comparison shopping for prices at pharmacies frequently is productive, as is utilization of mail order pharmacies. Your physician should be able to guide you with this.

When should one start treatment directed against the HIV virus? Present guidelines recommend initiation of therapy for CD4 counts of 500 or less. If an individual has symptoms related to his or her HIV infection, treatment should be started regardless of CD4 cell count. There is also considerable data to support treatment of HIV infection at CD4 levels greater than 500. These options should be explored with your physician.

I have outlined a brief overview of antiretroviral therapy. I hope that it will raise interest and questions for discussion between patients and their physicians. The more informed the individual, the better decisions he will make.

Houston's MCCR:

Helping Gay Men and Lesbians Reclaim Their Spirituality and Heal the Wounds of A Homophobic Society

ave you ever gotten angry about the way organized religion has attempted to rob gays and lesbians of a place to worship and to grow in spirituality? Do you wish there were a church you could go to where you could feel loved and accepted for who you are instead of feeling judged and condemned?

Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection [MCCR] may be the church home a lot of gay and lesbian people in the Houston area thought did not exist. "I think the MCC church in general, the whole denomination, has been one of the best-kept secrets in town," says church member Michael Williamson. "I think people may have a spiritual deficiency because they don't know what to do. They've been told that being a homosexual is wrong by their parents or their previous church or whatever, and I think it's because we've been a real good secret and people just didn't know that we were there."

MCCR - The Building and Grounds

MCCR has grown from a 68-member group meeting in a bicycle shop when it was founded in 1975 to a 409-member congregation with a sanctuary that holds 420 people comfortably and has crowded in as many as 550 on occasion.

Over the past several years, church leaders searched for another facility, but found nothing affordable. Within the past year, MCCR has acquired six additional nearby lots, four of which are already be-

ing used as a parking lot that's usually full on Sunday mornings. The other two lots, located adjacent to the present church building, were purchased about three months ago. One lot has a five-room house on it that will probably be used for church offices, freeing up space for meeting rooms in the main building.

"The numbers keep growing and I've never seen a reversal in that," says Dee Lamb, a member of the staff clergy who is also a charter member of the church. When MCCR moved into its present building, purchased from the Tabernacle Baptist Church in the late 1970s, its membership had grown to approximately 250. The main building houses a large auditorium, a prayer chapel, fellowship hall, nursery, kitchen, several offices and a library. (The MCC library, administered by volunteer Charles Botts, houses the largest collection of gay and lesbian publications available to the public in the South.)

As the congregation's numbers steadily grew, church leaders realized they were going to need more space. Besides the large crowds attending the 10:45 Sunday morning service, more and more community groups were using the church for meetings on weeknights. Lacking sufficient funds to purchase a new and larger facility elsewhere, church members decided they would seek to acquire property around the present location.

"Planted, we're growing, and we're

growing to plant," says the Rev. John Gill, head Pastor of MCCR. He explains that, with the decision not to move, the congregation has made a commitment to start getting more involved in its neighborhood, which is located in the historic old Sixth Ward near downtown Houston.

"At the same time, with the initiation of the parish extension, which is now another MCC church (Maranatha Fellowship Metropolitan Community Church), we believe we've planted elsewhere to grow," Rev. Gill continues. He adds that MCCR and Maranatha Fellowship MCC plan to help plant another church in the Friendswood/ NASA/Dickinson area. Once that church is established, there are plans for all three churches to help plant yet another church in the Conroe/Spring/Huntsville area.

MCCR: The People—
The Real Reason MCCR is Growing

Two themes recur when MCCR members and clergy try to explain why they believe their church has grown: More and more gay men and lesbians are reclaiming the spirituality that the religious right has tried to take away from them, and more and more of them are taking an active role in healing their lives of the inner and outer wounds inflicted upon them by a predominantly homophobic society.


"I think people need to know that their spirituality and their sexuality need not be enemies and need not be separated," says the Rev. Carolyn Mobley, Assistant Pastor at MCCR. Mobley was female Grand Marshal in this year's Houston Gay/Lesbian Pride Parade.

"There's no real dichotomy. There is a unity of ourselves between our spirituality and our sexuality, and it needs to be brought together. This is a place where that can begin to happen. People can know that God loves them and we invite them to come and share in this walk with us as we

grow...."

One of the programs MCCR provides the community as an aid in reclaiming its spirituality is a series of classes on homosexuality and the Bible. This series, taught at least twice a year, explains the Scripture passages that many homophobes have used to claim that the Bible condemns homosexuality. Those who attend the class see for themselves, one passage at a time, that such claims are not valid.

The Rev. Ralph Lasher, another member of the staff clergy, who is also Executive Director of the Montrose Clinic, currently

teaches that series on the first Wednesday of each month. The title of Lasher's course reflects its content: "Homophobia is a Sin, Not Homosexuality." Rev. Mobley notes that the title constitutes a wonderful reversal on the popular myth that homosexuality is both a choice and a sin. "They're quick to talk about that Sodom and Gomorrah story," she says, "and it's well established in lots of academic corners that the true sin of Sodom was primarily that of inhospitality to homosexuals, so it's good to use that title."

Another aspect of reclaiming spirituality is met through worshipping together and feeling the resultant sense of belonging and acceptance. The most popular and well-attended service at MCCR each week is the 10:45 service on Sunday mornings. A special effort is made to satisfy the needs of congregants, who come from many different backgrounds. With people from such a diversity of religious traditions, messages with a strongly doctrinal focus would be very divisive. Instead, Rev. John Gill, affectionately known as "Pastor John," consistently serves up lessons in true spirituality, which offer truths that unite rather than divide people and which also are readily applicable to daily living. Those in attendance often say, after hearing one of Rev. Gill's messages, "He said just exactly what I needed to hear today."

Expressing one's spirituality through service to others is another part of the process of reclaiming that spirituality. At MCCR, there is a "phenomenal emphasis on the empowerment and the activity of the laity," Rev. Gill says. "In most mainline demominational churches, the ministry is done by the clergy, and here, most of the ministry is done by the members and friends. The clergy here don't do it, we enable it." he says.

"Just being involved and helping people is a blessing," says church secretary Richard Sarno, who takes part in the administrative ministry of the church.

Office manager Claire Vasilioy says, "I don't know that I would have had the strength and the courage to face some of the issues I'm dealing with had I not worked in the church and witnessed the faith that I find in this church and within myself because I'm part of the church."

Another of MCCR's many ministries is music. "We probably have one of the finest music programs in the whole city, and that's comparing it to all churches,"

says Michael Williamson, who previously worked as a lay person in other churches that were not gay-affirming, as is MCCR. "And people, when they're looking for something, and they come to visit...that music! It tugs at the heartstrings."

Other ministries that provide an outlet for the diversity of talents within a church of MCCR's size are drama, building maintenance, a prayer chain, outreach ministries, social activities, food service, interpreting for the hearing impaired (available at the 10:45 a.m. Sunday service), Bible study teaching, nursery work, Children's Church, library work, decorating, food pantry and transportation, to name just a few.

MCCR Provides A Place to Heal from

The Wounds of Living in A Homophobic Society

When asked what message he would like to send to members of the gay and lesbian community who are not aware of MCCR's ministry, Rev. Gill answers, "We're not an institutional church, like they remembered, of judgment and condemnation, like the one that may have thrown them out. We're a family of faith and fellowship that loves them and wants to invite them in. The most difficult thing in this ministry, I've found in 21 years, is convincing a people that have been abused and hurt, if not directly by the church, then definitely in an indirect manner...that we have learned our lesson [at MCCR]. We're not angels; we're not perfect, but we have not forgotten those lessons we've learned. and we try desperately not to repeat that kind of condemnation and judgment and narrowness, and try to help people understand that, at least to give us a chance. Try us, you'll love us immediately...Get over the old, negative, hurting stereotype that you think we [churches] are."

MCCR provides a place to begin healing from that hurt. "I think people are looking for some kind of leadership and guidance spiritually...and that's another reason, I think, that the church has grown," says Williamson. "And I have to say, too, that John Gill is a fine leader...a 'relational' person, and he is very intentional about that. I think that is a factor in why the church has grown..."

ow far would you be willing to go to make someone happy? What if that someone was your parent? Is it possible to balance an independent lifestyle against the demands of those who raised, provided for and still love you?

Maybe. But not likely.

In Ang Lee's new film comedy The Wedding Banquet, Wai-Tung Gao (Winston Chao) is a native of Taiwan, now a citizen of the United States in which he has resided for a decade, fervently, pursuing that mythic "American dream." Having carved out a comfortable niche for himself as a landlord, he lives in Manhattan with his white lover, Simon (Mitchell Lichtenstein). He spends his days fending off complaints from his tenants, especially Wei-Wei (May Chin), an art student on the verge of being returned to China, who manifests a liking for Simon, and an attraction to Wai-Tung. Much of his spare time is also taken up fending off his parents' attempts at matchmaking. Wai-Tung is the only son of an only son, and so carries the great burden of carrying on the family name.

Suffering through a disastrous blind date with a woman sent to him by his parents, Wai-Tung learns that his father's health is deteriorating, though his father is determined to last until he knows the

line will continue. Racked with guilt, Wai-Tung accepts Simon's suggestion: marry Wei-Wei. This, Simon reasons, will kill two birds with one stone. Wai-Tung's parents can relax, and Wei-Wei can obtain her green card to remain in the country.

However, these best-laid plans soon go awry. Upon notification of the impending nuptials, Wai-Tung's parents (Ah-Leh Gua and Si-hung Lung) immediately materialize to meet the bride-to-be, and to witness the ceremony. With stealthy help from Simon, cast as Wai-Tung and Wei-Wei's platonic housemate and landlord, Wei-Wei quickly wins the affection of both Ma and Pa. But parental dotage turns to anger and depression when the imagined grand wedding turns out to be a City Hall guickie. Before any of the three schemers can turn the tide of events, they are swept up into the preparations for a huge wedding banquet. Whereupon, as they say, comic complications ensue.

Happily, director Lee never soft-pedals his story for the American market. At least half of the film's dialogue is in Chinese (subtitled in English, of course). Lee seems to take particular pleasure in subverting the expectations of audience members not of Asian descent. Our first glimpse of Wei-Wei is of her bare back as she rinses

and strokes her long, dark hair in stereotypically demure "lotus blossom" fashion. Then, having demonstrated the cliche, she takes a long hit from a bottle of booze. forcing the audience to get past the type and view her with fresh eyes. Later, during the banquet, after hearing a non-Asian guest remark on his surprise at the hardpartying attitude of the Chinese, another guest remarks, "You are witnessing the result of five thousand years of sexual repression.'

Likewise, Lee doesn't shy away from the gay subject matter. The relationship between Wai-Tung and Simon is fleshed out with minutiae which lend authenticity: Simon helping Wai-Tung to fill out a singles club application from his parents.

Wai-Tung's jealousy of Simon's friend, a clumsy attempt to snatch a few minutes of lovemaking with the parents away Though never torridly or explicitly sexual the film contains enough affection between the two men to have sent a dozen or so unenlightened preview attendees fleeing the theater. Simon, though still relegated to something of a secondary concern once the parents arrive, is less of a cipher than most movie spouses, and he gains as much audience empathy as do the couple at the center of the film. When he finds himself alone amongst the couples on Wai-Tung's wedding night, the pain feels real. Perhaps it's not surprising, then. to find listed with those being thanked during the closing credits such gay-related

organizations as ACT UP, Gay Men's Health Crisis and Alyson Publications.

The acting throughout is first-rate. Chao is strikingly attractive and very believable as the harried son/lover/landlord/groom. Chin is very much his equal as the formidable and unpredictable Wei-Wei. Gua and lung as the parents are charming and likable, despite their characters' manipulative tendencies, which range from passive-aggressive to simply aggressive. ichtenstein is natural as Simon, resisting the urge to portray his character as either "straight" or flaming. All the supporting performances are dead-on as well.

This is an encouraging feature debut from Lee. He sensitively and skillfully weaves an engaging story about two sides of society Hollywood rarely shows. Though it runs out of good material a bit early, and could stand a little pruning, The Wedding Banquet works well both as a farce and as a family comedy...for all kinds of families.



naturally in many species, we have been vindicated. That which has been intuitively suspected for years has been confirmed. This may expedite the process toward full civil liberties. Arguments for gay rights will shift from privacy issues to equal protection under existing civil rights laws designed to protect genetic minorities.

The bad news is: we may have opened Pandora's Box, and the information we discovered may be our undoing, for we have no control over how it will be used. Privacy protections are gone; a simple test destroyed that era. Mr. Clinton's lame "Don't ask, don't tell" policy concerning gays in the military will be moot, due to biological screening upon induction. Similarly, other branches of government and public institutions may circumvent uncomfortable personal inquiries by employing a blood test as criterion for selection in hiring/promoting/terminating employees. Insurance companies, especially, will be able to blacklist gay men as high risk and be allowed to deny them medical and other benefits allotted heterosexual clients. For both adults and children, blood tests for detection of this genetic trait will mean they will be identified and monitored all their lives.

For the unborn, who are totally unrecognized as having any civil rights in this country, an amniocentesis for this trait could be a determining factor in its continued development. Parents under both monetary and environmental stresses to have smaller families may decide to forgo pregnancies identified with homosexual offspring. A new Holocaust may be about to unfold for the future unborn gay babies of the world. It is conceivable that, by the end of this decade, abortion may surpass AIDS as the number one killer of gay males in this country.

This community has suffered devastating losses over the last decade due to AIDS, but we have not lost our hope for those who come after us. Gay men may wish to reconsider their unwavering support of the pro-abortion movement, as we would be accomplices in our own genocide. A community without children has no future. Unless we recognize our precarious position on the abortion issue, our future as a community may indeed be short-lived.

I myself live in a small rural town where I'm not able to speak with anyone about myself for fear of what they might do. I lived in Dallas for most of my life and took for granted that people are very accepting of all lifestyles. It makes it a lot easier to find your true self in an atmosphere where people are willing to acknowledge what you are and respect it.

But recently, I moved with my family to Uvalde, a closed-minded, hypocritical town. I was just learning to be open and honest with myself and family about my sexuality, then all of the sudden, everyone here is trying to put homosexuality back in the closet! I know I can't be the only youth going through this, either, I'm not sure if I can withstand the prejudice alone. And who knows how many other repressed youths are forced to deal with a homophobic community?

There's got to be some way that services for counseling and youth groups can be extended beyond the cities. Someone needs to reach out to members of the community who are not able to receive help they may need-maybe a free youth hotline for troubled gay, lesbian and bisexual youths. Any effort whatsoever to help those of us in totally straight environments would be much appreciated.

ALGPC PUSHING FOR DOMESTIC PARTNERS POLICY IN AUSTIN

Hearings Set for Next Thursday; Decision Expected by September 15.

AUSTIN - The Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus is calling upon Mayor Bruce Todd and City Council to implement a domestic partnership registry for the City of Austin and domestic partnership ben-

efits for city employees.

Domestic partnership involves the registration of couples unrelated by marriage or blood who share significant emotional and financial ties. ALGPC representatives point out that, although lesbian and gay people do benefit from domestic partnership provisions, in other cities in which such policies have been implemented, 60 to 80 percent of those who have benefited from these ordinances are heterosexual.

Domestic partnership registration has been adopted in several other cities across the country, including San Francisco, New York and Seattle. If adopted in Austin, the registration program would be the first of its kind undertaken by any city in Texas.

Activists are also pushing for the inclusion of domestic partners on City employees' health insurance policies and in bereavement leave. In 1990, Travis County adopted a bereavement leave policy for its employees involved in domestic partnerships, and ALGPC would like to see a similar policy implemented by the city.

ALGPC co-chair Diane Hardi-Garcia told TWT NEWS. "We have a city council that used domestic partnership to help win their campaign. It's time for them to come through. We're tired of being 'check-writing queers.' We want action, not words."

"Religious right wingers are watching," she added. "They can't stand the idea of changing the definition of the traditional family. [In a recent survey], only 25% were traditional families. The time has come to change this traditional definition. We feel when we don't get these benefits, we aren't getting equal pay."

A recent editorial in the Austin American Statesman took a positive stand on the issue, saying, "Every effort to extend access to medical coverage is a move in

the right direction."

Hearings on the domestic partnership issue are now scheduled for September 2. A decision is expected on the matter by the middle of the month.

HOUSTON CAUCUS **OBSERVES 18TH YEAR** WITH DINNER, AWARDS

Keynote Speaker Torie Osborne Cites 'Window of Opportunity,' Calls for End to Divisiveness.

HOUSTON - Turned out in their finest, over 200 people helped the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus celebrate its 18th anniversary with an evening of dining, dancing and awards last Saturday evening at the city's prestigious Four Seasons Hotel. Among the crowd were community activists, community leaders, elected officials and other Caucus supporters.

Keynote speaker for the evening was Torie Osborne, Executive Director of the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force. Opening her remarks with a "greeting from the vortex of confusion," Osborne discussed Bill Clinton's presidential victory last year and how it changed the political landscape for gay men and lesbians.

"It's easier to fight from the outside when you have an enemy on the inside," she said, referring to 12 years of Republicans in the White House. "It's harder when you have a friend on the inside...especially when they betray you." She characterized President Clinton's "don't ask, don't tell" policy on gay service people as "ridiculous, unjust, unfair" and said it "codifies discrimination and the closet."

But Osborne said the rest of the decade would be "an incredibly exciting time," providing gays and lesbians with a "window of opportunity" in which to make significant gains advancing their cause. "We don't yet have political power in this country; this is what we face in the 'gay '90s'building power 'brick-by-brick.'" She described NGLTF's role as one of building connections among the thousands of local gay-related groups across the country. But she warned that success would also be dependent upon bringing an end to divisiveness and "leadership-bashing."

Caucus vice-president Rennie Trozzi, in charge of planning for the awards dinner, noted that attendance at this year's event, at around 250, was nearly twice that at last year's affair. He attributed the evening's success to broader outreach. "We talked to a lot of people who would normally not come to a Caucus event, and we got more board members involved on the dinner committee."

The banquet was also an occasion to honor individuals and organizations judged to have made extraordinary contributions to the Caucus and the community over the past year. Houston City Council member Ben Reves won the organization's Humanitarian Award, Honored as Volunteer of the Year was GLPC secretary Rob Cavanaugh, while board chair Kevin Davidson received the Dennis Spencer Award. State Sen. John Whitmire, who earlier this year led a vigorous fight to keep Section 21.06. the "anti-sodomy" statute, out of the newly-revised Texas penal code, was honored with the Harvey Milk Award. Houston attorney and transgender activist Phyllis Frye received the Bayard Rustin Civil Rights Award, former GLPC president Annise Parker received the Don Hrachovy Lifetime Achievement Award while Caucus member and activist Terri Richardson was honored as Newcomer of the Year.

Also receiving awards were Rennie Trozzi, the Houston Press and state Reps. Garnet Coleman and Scott Hochberg.

CAVEN ENTERPRISES BENEFITS DALLAS NONPROFIT GROUPS

Nearly \$6,000 Goes to OLCS Dental Clinic, Women's Institute.

DALLAS - Perhaps no other industry in the gay community has been more affected by the AIDS crisis than the nightclub business. Employees of this particular trade often work long hours, with little or



no attention to health-related concerns such as nutrition and exercise. And often these employees are unable to handle the expenses involved in coping with the effects of HIV disease, particularly if the illness results in the loss of their employment. The resulting strain on social services in the community can be devastating.

One company, Caven Enterprises, recognized the debilitating social and economic consequences of this scenario early on. As the largest gay employer in Texas. Caven executives had witnessed firsthand the horrendous drain AIDS had on the financial strength and morale of the company. So, in 1987, they organized the Caven Employee Benevolence Association [CEBA] to assist those employees challenged by AIDS with their finances.

According to Alan Ross of Caven Enterprises, "We wanted to help ourselves before we turned to other services in the community." In just six years, CEBA has enabled dozens of Caven employees to enjoy a better quality of life, despite AIDS, and has now expanded its service program to include women with certain types of cancer.

Each year, Caven employees present a turnabout show, in which they take to the stage for a night of madcap fun and frivolity. Proceeds from the entire evening benefit CEBA, which distributes half the funds to organizations in the community. This year, CEBA members decided to contribute the entire proceeds from their recent show at Village Station—almost \$6,000—to two groups this year, the Candy Marcum Institute for Women's Studies at Oak Lawn Community Services and the Nelson-Tebedo Community Clinic's Dental Program.

The Candy Marcum Institute [CMI], formed earlier this year, is, according to OLCS marketing director Evilu Pridgeon, "an outgrowth of all the women's programs that have been implemented [by OLCS] in the last five years." CEBA's contribution of almost \$3,000 to the Institute will enable it to proceed with its plans to expand OLCS' role in providing the women of Dallas with quality social services.

Likewise, the Nelson-Tebedo Community Clinic's Dental Program, an outreach project of the AIDS Resource Center, offers dental services to HIV-positive people in the Dallas area. According to Nelson-Tebedo director Deb Trott, "this care includes basic dental services: examinations, cleanings, fillings and extractions. In the future, we hope to expand to be able to provide root canal work and dentures." "Without the support of community groups such as CEBA, much of what is provided for HIV-positive persons at Nelson-Tebedo would not be a reality."

THAT'S WHAT FRIENDS ARE FOR! GEARING UP FOR 4TH BENEFIT

Gala Houston Fund-Raiser To Be Held Next Spring.

HOUSTON — Organizers of That's What Friends Are For!, one of the city's

premier fund-raising events for HIV, have announced that preparations are beginning for the group's fourth gala, to be held in the spring of 1994. Last year's benefit, held at the luxurious Westin Galleria Hotel, returned \$20,000 to local 501(c)3 HIV direct service organizations.

Garrett asked organizations interested in being selected as beneficiaries for next spring's event to write him a letter describing their operation and particular financial needs. All organizations must be providing direct services to those with HIV and be recognized as 501(c)3 charitable organizations. Among organizations currently being considered as beneficiaries are The Assistance Fund, Milam House, the Pet Patrol and the AIDS Alliance of the Bay Area.

That's What Friends Are For! is sponsored by the Larry Garrett Foundation, which Garrett said was established so that donations to this and other sponsored events will be tax-deductible. Proceeds from the three previous events have been sheltered by past 501(c)3 beneficiaries.

MONTROSE CLINIC IN HOUSTON RECEIVES \$100,000 GRANT FROM DALLAS FOUNDATION

Funds Will Go Toward Work on New Westheimer Facility.

HOUSTON — The Montrose Clinic announced last week that it has received a grant of \$100,00 from the Meadows Foundation of Dallas. The money will go toward the conversion of a vacant building in the lower Westheimer area into a medical facility to provide education and treatment for HIV infection and other sexually transmitted diseases.

Executive Director Ralph Lasher said that with the Meadows grant, the Montrose Clinic has reached 80% of the \$1.9

million goal set for its capital campaign, and that hoped-for funding from other sources should bring the campaign to a successful completion well ahead of schedule.

Lasher added that renovation work on the new location might start as early as next week.

The Meadows Foundation was created in 1948 by Algur and Virginia Meadows to benefit the people of Texas. With assets valued at more than \$500,000,000, the Meadows Foundation had at the beginning of 1993 made cumulative charitable expenditures in excess of \$250,000.000.

Founded in 1981, the Montrose Clinic offers research, education, prevention, treatment and other services in the area of HIV/AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases, as well as educational programs specifically targeted to deaf and hearing-impaired people. The Houston Clinical Research Network, an affiliate of the Montrose Clinic, coordinates trials of experimental HIV treatments.

BACHELOR AUCTION RAISES OVER \$11,500 FOR OAK LAWN COUNSELING CENTER

Proceeds Will Go to OLCS' Ongoing Programs, Hotline & Candy Marcum Institute.

DALLAS — In the ongoing effort to fund the service programs necessary for the physical and mental health of the gay and lesbian community, many organizations in Texas have developed new and innovative methods with which to spark the public's interest, thereby improving the chances for a successful event. One such event is the annual Bachelor/Bachelorette Auction benefiting Oak Lawn Community Services, which, in just three short years, has become one of Dallas' most popular and successful fund-raising events.

This year's auction was held at the beautiful Hall of State in Fair Park, and was attended by almost 200 community leaders and supporters. Seated amidst the candlelit splendor and opulence of the famed art deco hall, guests were given the opportunity to bid on dates with noted personalities from around the state.

Included in the date package were an evening at the Dallas Symphony Orchestra and the Grand Kempenski Hotel with Turtle Creek Chorale Director Tim Seelig and his lover Louis Kelly; a weekend in New Orleans with White Rock Community Church Pastor Rev. Jerry Cook; and a romantic sunset dinner sail on Lake Grapevine with realty executive Lory Masters. By far the most popular package, however—and the one that fetched the highest bid from the assembled crowd at \$2,200—was the night on the town in Austin with state Rep. Glen Maxey and his lover, James McKie.

The event grossed over \$11,500 for Oak Lawn Community Services, nearly doubling last year's totals. Proceeds will be used for the ongoing AIDS service programs at OLCS, as well as to maintain the AIDS Hotline and to fund the newly-created Candy Marcum Institute for Women's Studies, which is designed to focus on the needs, interests and desires of women and the people who care about them.

Lee Heck, the Director of Revenue Development at OLCS and the coordinator of this year's Auction, was understandably pleased with the results. "We really increased the numbers dramatically this year," he said. "The Hall of State was a fabulous location, and it was a well-attended event. A lot of people who were unfamiliar with OLCS and its programs got a chance to see us and find out what we're all about, and that's important. We're very happy with the way it all turned out."

Alternative Broadcasting Service Seeking Volunteers to Assist With Upcoming Productions.

HOUSTON — The Alternative Broadcasting Service has announced that production is complete on ABS' video tape of the Houston Gay/Lesbian Pride Week '93 parade, and orders are now being accepted for the tape.

ABS Executive Director Mike Stubblefield said funding provided by the Houston Pride Committee was crucial in making the video possible. "I just want to thank the Pride Committee for stepping in at such a late period to help in the financial underwriting of this production," he said. "Prior funding which we had been promised had been canceled with less than a week to go before the parade, and the Pride Committee stepped in literally at the last minute and helped make this event real."

Copies of the parade video cost \$19.95 each (plus \$3.50 for shipping and handling). Send check or money order to the Pride Committee of Houston, P.O. Box 66071, Houston, TX 77266-6071. Include return address and a telephone number, and allow two weeks for delivery. Stubblefield said proceeds from sales of the tape will go directly to the Pride Committee to retire this year's debt and begin preparing for next year's celebration.

The Pride Parade will also be shown on Houston Public Access television on Saturday, August 28 from 2:30–4:30 p.m. and again on Thursday, September 2 from 9–11 p.m.

HIV FUNDING IMPASSE IN SAN ANTONIO NEAR RESOLUTION

No Interruption of Services Expected for People with AIDS.

SAN ANTONIO — The San Antonio HIV/AIDS Consortium's funding request to the Texas Department of Health, originally made on June 23, may finally be nearing approval. The Consortium serves as a clearinghouse for AIDS service agencies in Bexar County and is made up of representatives from each of the agencies as well as PWAs from the community.

The original recommendations by the Consortium's funding committee, approved by the entire Consortium by a vote of 29 to 6 in the amount of approximately \$535,000, were rejected by the state Health Department, which cited as the main reason for its action inadequate funding of agencies providing medical services.

The funding request has been the subject of controversy all summer. In the recommendations, minority-oriented agencies such as Beat AIDS, which provides education and testing aimed at the black community; the Hispanic AIDS Committee [HAC]; and the AIDS Resource Center, an AIDS support organization, were awarded a larger share of their requests than longer established medical service entities like the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District, the Bexar County Hospital District and the San Antonio AIDS Foundation [SAAF].

The funding committee's recommendations even prompted the San Antonio Express-News' lifestyle editor, Blair Corning, to blast the awards in her column. Corning, who is a member of the Mayor's AIDS Commission, specifically lamented the fact that the AIDS Foundation was not fully funded and quoted SAAF executive director Sharon Rupp as saying that the Foundation might have to close its doors.

According to a letter sent to Casey Blass, HIV Division Director of the state Health Department by Peter Peterson, a member of the Consortium funding committee (a copy of which was obtained by TWT NEWS), the charge that medical services were cut is unfounded. In his letter, Peterson stated that monies were awarded in amounts the committee deemed appropriate. As examples, he cited the City of San Antonio and the Bexar County Hospital District which, Peterson claimed, both have surpluses that could be applied to AIDS services. He also said that the AIDS Foundation was awarded enough money to operate through at least March of 1994 at the level of staffing requested, and was also awarded funds to hire an additional LVN.

Peterson noted that since the funding decision was made, the Bexar County Hospital District and the local Veterans Hospital have both agreed to award funds to SAAF. "If the San Antonio AIDS Foundation is in danger of closing, it is because of their own mismanagement, not because of the [lack of] state funding awarded to them," he stated.

According to Cliff McSparran of the HIV Services Program of the Texas Department of Health, although the funding contracts which are due to become effective on September 1 are still being negotiated, they should be complete by that date. Therefore, people with AIDS who depend on assistance from state-funded agencies should not suffer a loss of service.
