Houston's Assistance Fund: Quietly Playing A Crucial Role In the Fight Against AIDS

Many people in the Houston area have heard of The Assistance Fund but do not know what it does. Others may not have heard of the organization at all. A client of The Assistance Fund sums it up: "Without it, I would be dead by now! I am glad you are here for us. It is a very bad world out there; the dollar bill rules. What can a poor person do with the costs to deal with the suffering of AIDS. I was shocked to see how fast you helped me. A person with this terrible thing from hell needs all the help there is. Thank you!"

The Assistance Fund [TAF] began one summer in 1987 when Dennis McNabb gathered together a group of concerned individuals to address the problem of the rising cost of medical treatment for people who were HIV-positive or suffering from full-blown AIDS. Heartened by the courage of two women who were overseers of the \$50,000 left after the closing of the Institute for Immunological Disorders, McNabb joined forces with the Houston chapter of the Design Industries Foundation for AIDS [DIFFA] to form The Assistance Fund. With Susan Strong and a group of enthusiastic volunteers, McNabb began raising charitable dollars to pay the health insurance premiums for men, women and children with AIDS who could no longer

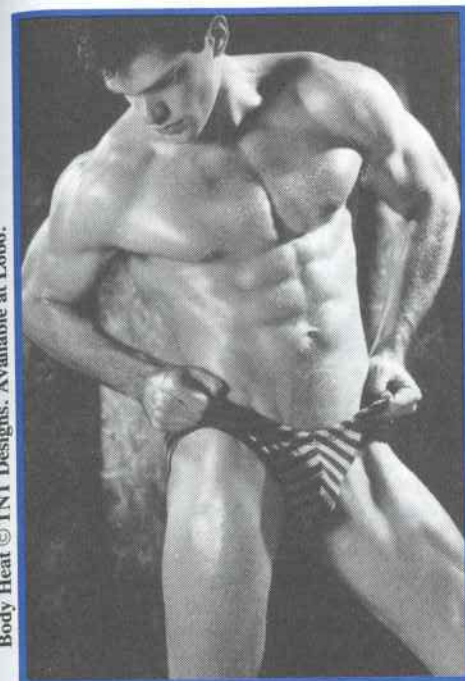
meet this escalating monthly expense on their own. In 1989, DIFFA/Houston and TAF parted ways, though they still work closely together today, with DIFFA giving a generous grant this year to the Fund.

In 1991, under the presidency of Harold Raines, TAF staged its first gala fund-raiser, "It's in the Bag," raising over \$50,000. The 1992 fund-raiser, organized by president Charles Freeman and board member Letitia Clever, brought in over \$120,000.

To date, TAF has assisted over 600 people with AIDS. In June of this year alone, TAF paid out over \$32,000 in insurance premiums on behalf of its clients. The Assistance Fund, believed to be the only organization of its kind in the country, faces an incalculable challenge as the number of clients it serves continues to grow, and the cost of health insurance for PWAs outpaces that held by the general public almost two to one.

TAF not only pays medical insurance premiums for those who are HIV-positive or have AIDS and cannot afford payments until they qualify for Medicare, but also assists with emergency prescriptions. Many clients testify to the quality of life made possible for them through The Assistance Fund.

"I'm convinced that that's why I'm as healthy as I am now, because I was able to keep my private insurance," says Joy Rodriguez. Because of TAF, Joy was able to keep her private physician and to get into the kind of hospitals she needed, all of which would have been impossible if she had given up her private insurance without the help of TAF.

"The Assistance Fund put a little ease in my life because it was just one less burden that I had to carry," states Paul Gartenmayer, another TAF client. "...I can concentrate more on keeping myself healthy, he adds.

The Assistance Fund is administered by volunteers, keeping the overhead to a minimum. "The amount of money invested in The Assistance Fund goes directly for patient benefit and it is one of the most well-spent dollars as far as the return on the dollar for practical things for the person," says Dr. Joseph C. Gathe, Jr., a Houston infectious disease specialist and physician who treats many PWAs. Charles Freeman, President of the Board of Directors of TAF until June of this year, says, "Ninety-seven percent of every dollar that comes in for The Assistance Fund goes to insurance payments. Less than three percent of all the money we collect goes to the administrative costs."

"It's a lot less expensive to pay for the insurance premiums and let the individual's own insurance take care of their needs when they become ill than for a public entity, like the Hospital District, to have to pick up those really increased costs...for every \$1 that's spent, probably \$150 is saved," says Eleanor Tinsley, a member of Houston City Council.

This year's "It's in the Bag" fund-raiser was officially kicked off on Saturday, August 28 at Neiman Marcus in the Galleria when award-winning entertainer and Texas native Tommy Tune generously donated his time to present featured bags that will be auctioned at The Assistance Fund's grand event at JAGS, 5120 Woodway at Sage in Houston on September 26 from 6-10 p.m.

"It's in the Bag '93" will feature blues legends Carol Fran and the Clarence Hollimon Express, the gospel group Kathy Taylor and The Choraleers and salsa sensations Norma Zenteno and The Secret. Partiers will again get to bid on a wide array of items in live and silent auctions, to be emceed by KLOL's Dayna Steel. Tickets to the event are \$50 and can be purchased by calling (713)529-4788.

Bags for this year's auction were created by 39 different artists and 35 businesses, including The Enchanted Garden, Hunan Restaurant, Brennan's, the Houston Grand Opera, Dream Merchant, American Airlines, Advance Travel, Earl Rosenblum Jewelry, the Houston Ballet, Saks Fifth Avenue and Macy's. Also donating bags are actress/comic Whoopi Goldberg and actor Brent Spiner of *Star Trek: the Next Generation*.

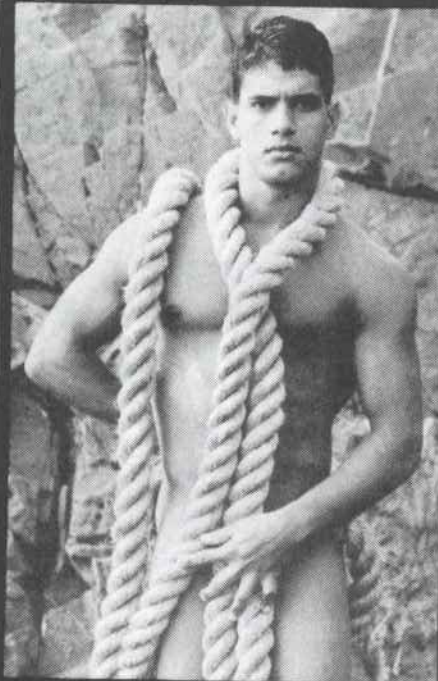

Treating HIV Wasting Syndrome with Anabolic Steroids and Growth Hormone

The so-called wasting syndrome in HIV disease is actually a variety of different conditions leading to progressive, uncontrolled weight loss. If left unchecked, this wasting can lead to profound malnutrition which greatly compounds the underlying immune deficiency. Wasting may have many causes, including opportunistic infections, impaired chewing or swallowing, chronic malabsorption and diarrhea, or progression of the HIV itself. Obviously, if a correctable problem is the cause of wasting, one attempts the appropriate treatment first. Unfortunately, one frequently cannot identify a specific cause of the disorder and it is attributed to the failure of the person to keep up with the metabolic demands of chronic disease.

In chronic diseases, the requirements of calories and nutrients to maintain the immune defenses, to rebuild damaged tissues, to weather the insults of fevers and infections, may become overwhelming. In an effort to maintain immediate requirements of life, the body sometimes goes into what is called a catabolic (tissue breakdown) state as opposed to the anabolic state. In this state, one may find it impossible to maintain weight even with a maximum effort to take in enough calories and nutrients. It is in this scenario that the category of drugs known as anabolic steroids may play a role.

Most people are familiar with anabolic steroids because of their abuse by athletes and body builders for weight gain and

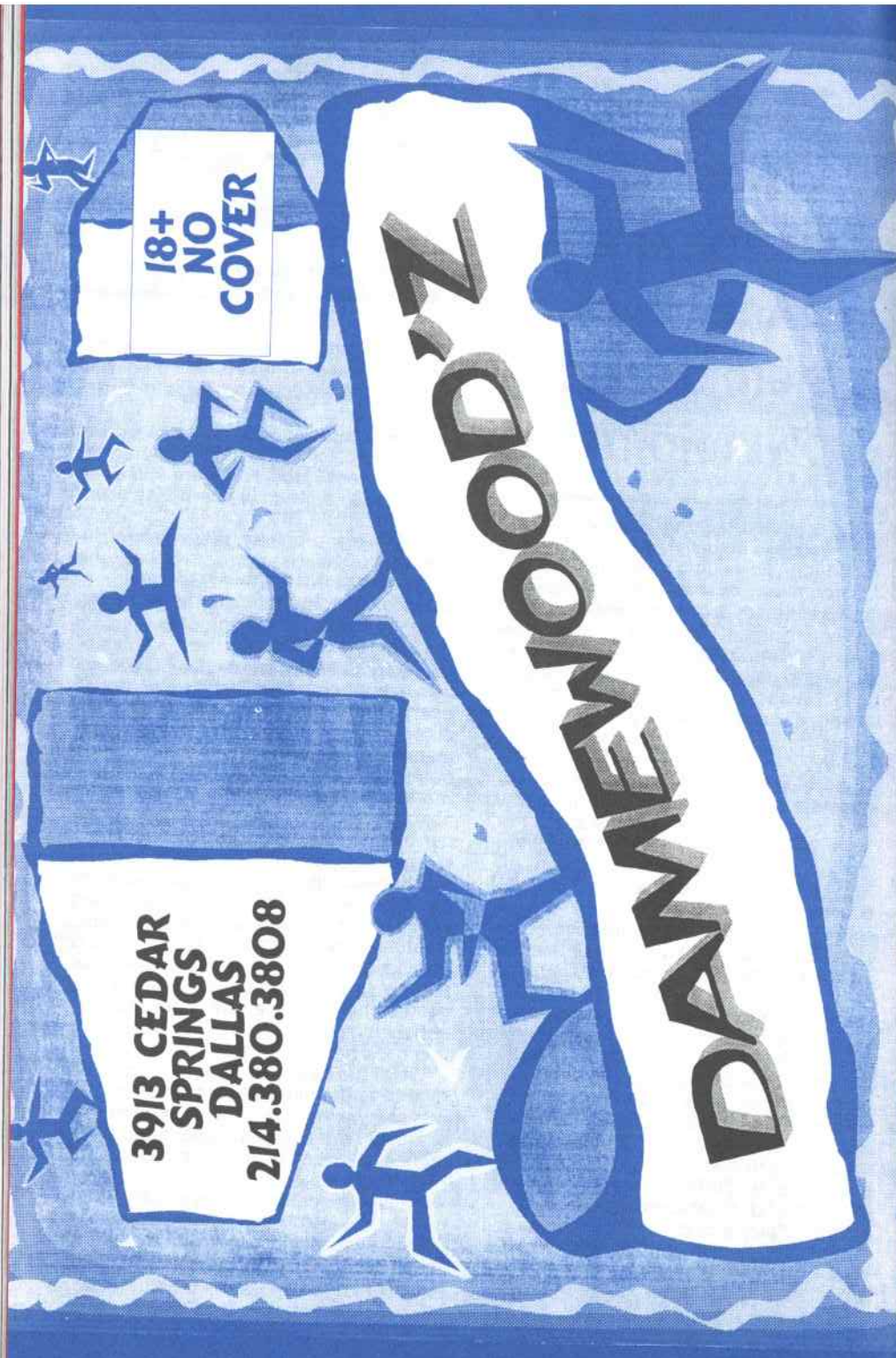

athletic enhancement. Unfortunately, the pervasive abuse of these potent drugs has led to tight regulations regarding their use. Many of the more potent drugs in this category are no longer available in this country because of past abuses. Fortunately, several good drugs are still available and can be tried in combating wasting in advanced HIV disease.

Anabolic-androgenic steroids are derivatives of testosterone. Some of the drugs have few of the masculinizing properties of testosterone and more of the anabolic effects. These drugs have proven useful in the treatment of some types of anemias, renal diseases, certain types of cancers, and wasting. They are useful as a part of the treatment program in any condition in which the patient is facing a great metabolic demand. Examples include burns, trauma, radiation therapy, chemotherapy and immobilization due to any illness. Obviously, some of these conditions can exist in late-stage HIV disease. There is limited but encouraging data to suggest that these drugs may have a positive effect on the so-called autoimmune diseases which also may accompany HIV disease. Contrary to what one often hears, there is no evidence that these drugs are immunosuppressive. Some authors have even suggested that they may have an immune-enhancing effect. The studies to support this have not been done.

Very little has been formally published regarding the use of these drugs in HIV disease; however, their use is commonplace and there is much anecdotal information regarding their efficacy. Observed benefits of the anabolic steroids include increased appetite, heightened energy level and sense of well-being, increased libido and an increase in lean body weight. I have personally witnessed weight gains in excess of 20 lbs. in my patients, even



in cases of very late-stage disease. It must be remembered that these are powerful drugs with some very real potential toxicities. These include elevated liver enzymes, cholestatic hepatitis, acne, gynecomastia (breast enlargements) and fluid retention. Acne is the only side effect I see with any regularity, the other symptoms being quite rare. Faced with the consequences of progressive wasting, one might reasonably conclude that the benefits outweigh the risks.

Many different forms of these drugs have been formulated in an effort to find a drug with a maximum of anabolic action and a minimum of masculinization. There are oral forms (Halotestin Testred, Anavar, Andadrol-50, Winstrol), which are relatively weak and have variable benefit against wasting. The injectable forms (Testosterone cypionate, Durabolin, Deca-Durabolin) are more potent and can be administered at two- to four-week intervals.

Human growth hormone, which is responsible for normal growth and development in human beings, is also being studied as a means of reversing the wasting of HIV disease. As well as promoting an anabolic state, growth hormone appears to have an immune-stimulating effect. The drug has a number of problematic side effects including fluid retention, joint pain and high blood sugars. At the present time, growth hormone is prohibitively expensive and only available through investigational protocols. The National Institutes of Health has a growth hormone protocol, as does Dr. Phillip Lee with Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

I think it is important to underscore that anabolic drugs are very potent and should only be used in a person who cannot maintain body weight by any other means. In such an individual, however, they can add greatly to the quality of life.

Dr. Bockmon has had a general practice for over 12 years in Houston, with a strong emphasis on the treatment of and research into HIV infection. Currently, Dr. Bockmon serves as Medical Director of the Houston Clinical Research Network [HCRN] and is on staff at Baylor College of Medicine.



Miss Camp America Pageant:

25 Years of Camp, Drag and Giving Back to the Community

The Miss Camp America Pageant began in 1969 at an apartment in Houston, where 11 people gathered to watch the Miss America Pageant on television. Ten of those attending took turns drawing one of the state names representing the top ten finalists in the pageant that year. Before the evening was over, one of them became "Miss Camp America" by virtue of that state's winning the title in Atlantic City, New Jersey.

Twenty-five years later, The Miss Camp America Foundation, Inc. [MCAF], which sponsors the pageant, has grown way beyond that small group of friends gathered

in an apartment. On Saturday, September 18 at the University of Houston's Cullen Auditorium Performance Hall, MCAF will crown their 25th Miss Camp America. She will join a group of past winners who've been crowned in bars, in ballrooms and on legitimate stages such as the Tower Theatre, the Alley Theatre and Houston's Music Hall. As the new Miss Camp America embarks on a year of entertaining Houston at MCAF fund-raising events as well as participating in countless benefits for charities, organizations and individuals, the experience will be one of fond memories and hard, exhausting work.

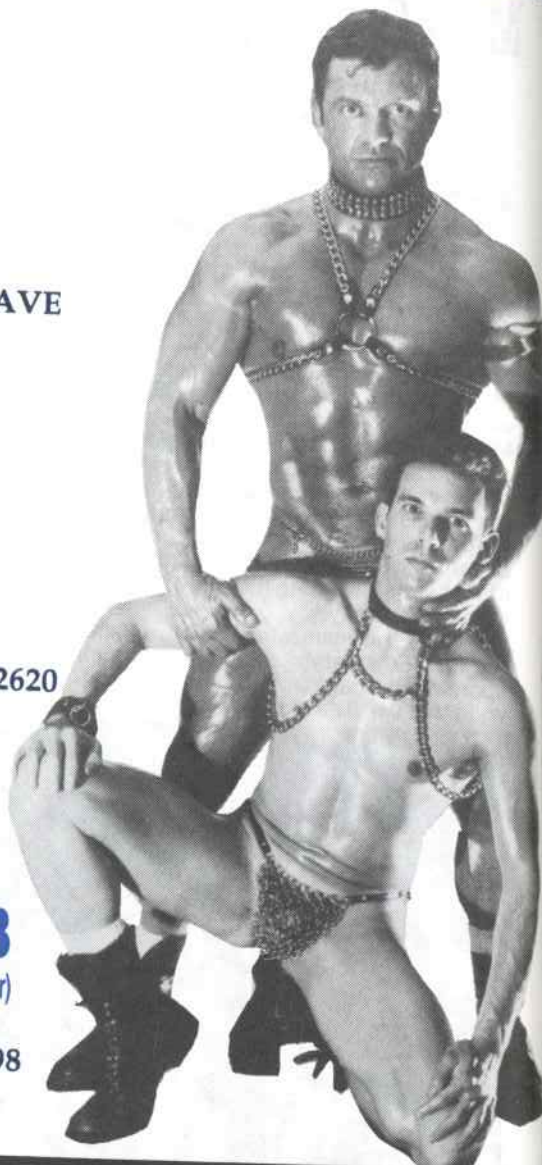

THREE MEN IN A STIMULATING,
FAST-PACED, ACTION PACKED STAGE PERFORMANCE

What started out as a purely social group in 1969 has been transformed into a nonprofit, 501(c)3 tax-exempt organization. The Miss Camp America Foundation is a major fund-raising force for the Houston AIDS community, raising \$14,000 last year. The group's activities include a Deb-U-Not Ball, EGG-Sectional Easter Review, silent auction, raffle and pre-pageant party. This year, MCAF funds will be divided among four charities: the Colt 45's AIDS TroubleFund, the Pet Patrol, Body Positive and The Assistance Fund.

Whenever entertainment, showgirls or support are needed for any event, MCAF members are there, in and out of drag. Foundation members have taken to fund-raising and supporting the Houston community as if it were a second job, one they put their heart and soul into. In addition, the MCAF Care Bear Project, which includes visits to local hospitals and people with AIDS, has become a community service project for the members.



The annual spoof of the Miss America Pageant, the MCAF-sponsored Miss Camp America Pageant, has become an extravagant, campy and highly entertaining spectacle. Planning for the show begins immediately after the curtain falls on the previous year's event. Months of meetings, theme and music selection and writing take place before the first dance step is taught, costume sewn or wig ratted and styled into place. After the show's structure is in place and approved by the board of trustees, eight weeks of grueling rehearsal begin so that the final production will reflect all the hard work, caring and commitment of all those involved.

Only Miss Camp America Foundation members are allowed to perform in the show. The top nine, who were selected at the previous year's show, do talent presentations, model swimwear and don evening gowns as they compete for the crown.

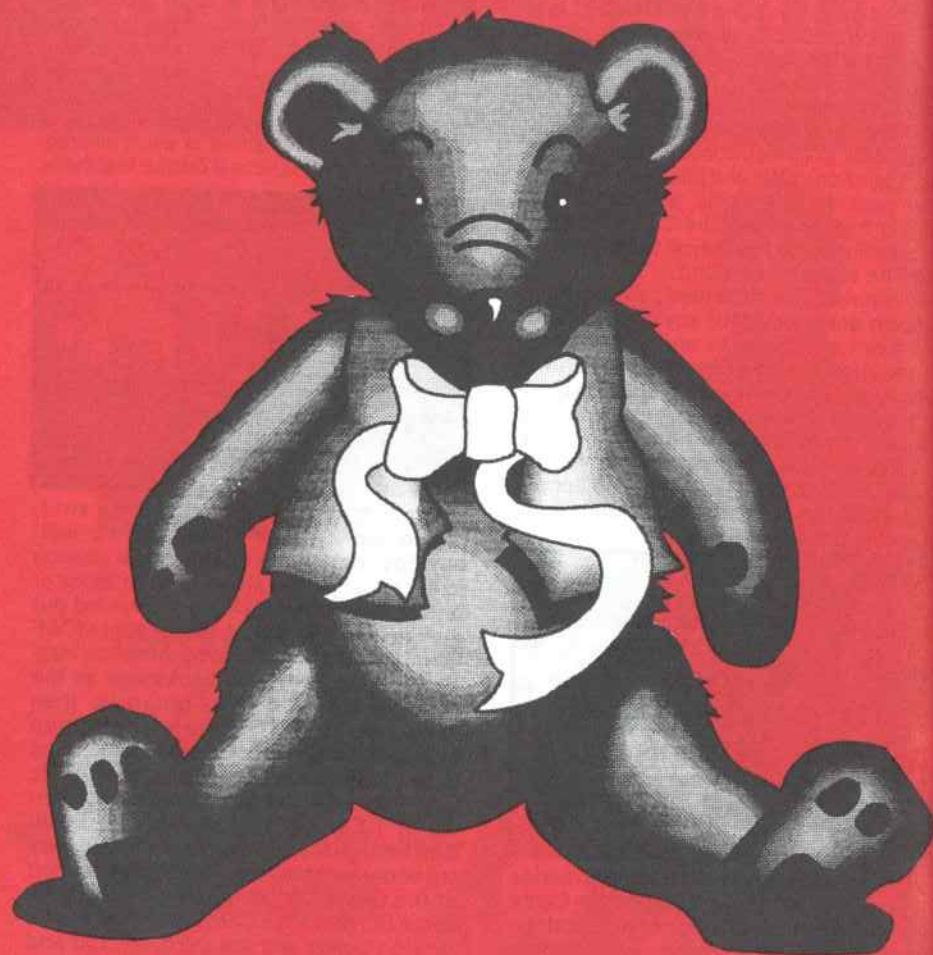
They're complemented by a cast of MCAF members performing in huge production numbers, some of which have included dancing waters, flying saucers and riverboats. The sets and costumes are extraordinary, featuring more sequins, feathers, rhinestones and glitter than most Las Vegas shows. The show is even choreographed by professional dance teachers.



Even though the top nine may strut, dance and work the runway the hardest, any Foundation member has the chance to become the new Miss Camp America or one of the top nine. Those interested put their names into a hat. A designated MCAF member watches the Miss America Pageant live on television backstage as the show in Houston is in progress, then names are drawn from the hat by a group of past Miss Camp Americas and matched to the top ten states selected in Atlantic City. Pat Petty, the first Miss Camp America in 1969 (and co-founder with David Stewart), guards these choices until they are announced on stage at the conclusion of the show. Of the top ten, one will become the new Miss Camp America. As the tension builds and the third, second and first runners-up are announced, the audience gets to share in the anticipation of who will be the new Miss Camp America.

Finally the announcement is made on stage, bringing tears just as in Atlantic City. The following year will be an unforgettable experience for the winner and her top nine.

Next Saturday, September 18, the Miss Camp America Foundation, Inc. presents its Silver Anniversary show, "Guys Not Dolls." Miss Camp America 1993 Tim Seidler (Lucy Balls) will pass his crown on to the new Miss Camp America. 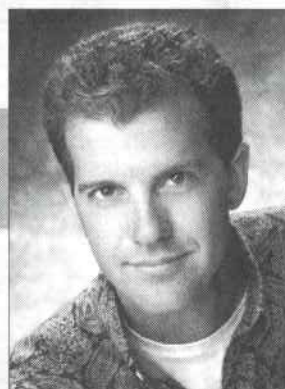

Some Thoughts on Clinton's Action on Ban

Dear Mr. President:

I want to express my thoughts on your handling of the issue of letting gay men and lesbians serve in the military forces. I have some 30 years of experience in political action—I tried working in the other political party before I settled on the Democratic Party.

You have said that your executive order was the best that you could get past Congress. I would agree. I have gotten the same opinion in a letter from Rep. Gerry Studds. At least one article in *Congressional Quarterly Weekly Report* leads me to agree. We of the gay community are going to have to work on Congress. More of my compatriots are going to have to lobby their members of Congress.

My biggest complaint with you and many members of Congress is that you have let the leaders of the military be treated as experts on this issue. This they are not. They are just bureaucrats who are married to their department's established way of doing things. You can tell them that the militaries of Germany, Norway, Canada and the Netherlands all managed to handle change and keep the necessary discipline—this country's military can, too.

I would look back to President [Jimmy] Carter's term in office. One problem he had was that, when he tried to please swing voters, he alienated the people who could have gotten out and worked to

reelect him. For example, he fired Bella Abzug and alienated feminist groups. Really, it is very difficult in this country for a Democratic President to get reelected and equally easy for a Republican President to get reelected. I have trouble convincing people around me that things like the Electoral College stack presidential elections against candidates who would do things like abolish the ban.

I feel safe in saying that the issue is not settled. There are certain to be court challenges to anything that you or Congress do. Public opinion is sure to shift, likely in my favor. The last public opinion poll I saw was for the Houston area—49% to 42% in favor of eliminating the ban.

There is one aspect of the issue where I

have not formed an opinion. Some people have said that it would have been better if you had made your executive order back in February, as originally promised, in spite of what Congress might do. I tried to make best use of the time from February through July 15 to lobby and encourage others to lobby members of Congress in support of a total abolition of the ban.

You have done some things that I think are very much to your credit. For example, you appointed an open lesbian, Roberta Achtenberg, to an important position. Several of your cabinet members have instituted non-discrimination policies with respect to sexual orientation.

AUSTIN CITY COUNCIL APPROVES DOMESTIC PARTNERSHIP BENEFITS

Move Makes Community First in State, One of Few Across Country To Offer Such a Plan.

AUSTIN — By a vote of 5-2, Austin City Council last Thursday adopted a new policy which would give spousal benefits to the partners of employees in same-sex or unmarried heterosexual relationships. Over 120 people signed up to speak at the meeting, which ran for several hours. More than half of those who spoke declared themselves in favor of providing domestic partner benefits.

According to the new policy, which goes into effect January 1, "partners" are defined as people sharing both a residence and "a close, personal, intimate relationship." Such a partner "may be of the same or opposite gender as the employee."

"It is economic, it is fair, it is just to offer equal benefits to all," said Council member Jackie Goodman, one of the supporters of the new policy.

Austin is the only city in Texas so far to have adopted such a policy. Several cities in California, including San Francisco and Los Angeles, as well as Seattle, Atlanta, New Orleans, New York and the District of Columbia, have similar policies. Under the Austin plan, the partners of city employees will receive the same kinds of benefits, including health insurance, that employees' legally recognized spouses do.

Those opposed to the policy have expressed the fear that implementing it will cost too much money, while supporters believe it will actually save money. A report compiled by the city's Human Resources Department estimates that providing the additional benefits will cost the city around \$700,000.

Mark Weaver, long known for his homophobic attitudes and his campaign against the gay and lesbian community, opposed the domestic partnership policy, saying he believed the vote by City Council was the wrong message to send teenagers. Jack Chambers, a right-wing radio talk show host, also opposed the move, saying government should uphold traditional notions of family.

Supporters of the new policy, noting that most of those taking advantage of such benefits in other cities have been heterosexuals with unmarried partners, argue that the definition of "family" should be broadened to correspond more closely to reality.

HOUSTON CAUCUS PICKS NEW PRESIDENT, BOARD MEMBER

Terri Richardson Fifth Woman To Hold Top GLPC Post.

HOUSTON — In choosing a new president at their meeting last week, the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus passed over a member of the old guard and opted instead for a representative of a newer generation who hopes to bring a new leadership style to the organization. Terri Richardson becomes the fifth woman to occupy the Caucus' top leadership post.

As required by GLPC bylaws, Richardson first resigned from her seat on the Caucus board of directors, then placed her name in nomination at the meeting held September 1, when second call for nominations was issued.

The GLPC presidency was left vacant after Chris Bacon, an lawyer, announced his resignation from the post in order to take a job with the Federal Defender's Office. Federal employees are prohibited from serving in a decision-making capacity with political action committees.

Richardson defeated Gary Van Ooteghem, a co-founder of the Caucus and its first president, who had announced his candidacy at the August 4 meeting. Van Ooteghem made headlines nearly two decades ago when he was fired as Harris County Comptroller in 1975 after informing his superiors of his homosexuality and calling for a policy of non-discrimination based on sexual orientation.

Richardson, a legal secretary, joined the Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus nearly a year ago. She was honored as Newcomer of the Year at the organization's banquet and awards dinner on August 21. Before her election as president, she held board seat 5. Richardson is active with ACT-UP/Gulf Coast, a direct-action group that deals primarily with AIDS issues.

In her campaign speech before the caucus

last Wednesday, Richardson declared that AIDS was the "new frontier of discrimination" against the gay and lesbian community, and "we need to be speaking more about that." She also spoke of the need to expand the caucus's membership and presence in the community through greater outreach efforts, and said it is again time to begin pressing for a city anti-discrimination ordinance. A previous attempt by Houston City Council to put into effect such an ordinance was overwhelmingly rejected by voters in January of 1985.

Richardson added that she favored making support for a city antidiscrimination law a litmus test for all political candidates seeking the Caucus' support. She also told TWT NEWS that she hoped to bring a proactive leadership style to her new post.

Keith McGee was elected to fill board seat 3, defeating David Westerkamp. That seat was left vacant when Gary Van Ooteghem resigned to run for the presidency.

A call for self-nominations was also issued to fill board seat 5. Van Ooteghem, David Westerkamp, Norm Thompson and Randy Goswick entered the race for that seat.

A proposed change in the bylaws governing removal of board members was rejected by the Caucus. That change would have provided for the automatic removal of members missing three consecutive board meetings.

Screening Committee chair Jim Owens issued a call for participation by members in the Caucus' candidate screening process, which begins September 14. The Screening Committee will release its recommendations for consideration by the whole Caucus at the group's endorsement meeting on September 29.



'10,000 ANGELS' RAISES FUNDS FOR AIDS IN DALLAS

\$2,200 From Two Recent Benefits Will Go to 25 Service Agencies.

DALLAS — Every month, expenses for the various AIDS services organizations providing care and support for those with AIDS in the Dallas area increase at alarming proportions. Cost of individual care, coupled with the increased caseload, have driven total operating costs for these organizations to unprecedented levels.

Various charitable groups throughout the city do their best to assist these organizations, but as demand increases, and governmental aid programs are either reduced or eliminated, even these groups find themselves stretched to the breaking point. In many instances, simple things such as phone lines are disrupted because there just isn't enough money to go around.

Over four years ago, one Dallas businessman recognized a need, not just for fund-raising efforts to support these organizations, but for people throughout the city to join together to network, to celebrate life and to remember those people lost to AIDS. That's when he decided to form 10,000 Angels.

The founder's name isn't important. What is the purpose of the group. "10,000 Angels is a way of keeping memories alive and celebrating the lives of those we have lost to AIDS and those who struggle every day in the fight against this killer. We can each do our small part."

"The main objective is to raise funds each and every month and distribute the monies collected evenly to 25 different AIDS support groups in Dallas. Even the smallest amount given by the multitude of

Angels will have a big impact as each month is added together."

10,000 Angels presented its first two benefit events last week, at Village Station and the Round-Up Saloon. The Village Station event, dubbed "Free Your Soul," featured a host of entertainers from the Dallas area, including the world premiere performance of GAF Records' Genetic Pre-disposition. It raised nearly \$1,600. The next night, entertainers from across Texas gathered at the Round-Up, raising over \$600. Thanks to the efforts of these entertainers, and supporters from across the Metroplex, checks in the amount of \$90 each have been distributed to 25 Dallas-area organizations that provide services to PWAs.

Members of the 10,000 Angels foresee more such events in the future. Their goal is to feature a spectrum of talented performers who are not normally seen on Dallas stages. And, according to one Angel, "When there is no longer a need for these events to take place, then we can sit back and rest; but as long as even one person is fighting for their life, we must keep our services available to them every time there is need."

TWO RECENT ASSAULTS IN HOUSTON MAY BE HATE CRIMES

*21-Year-Old Stabbed,
Secretary of Gay Caucus Beaten
In Separate Incidents.*

HOUSTON — Recent assaults on two Houston men have served to remind the community that hate-motivated crimes against gay men and lesbians remain a serious problem in Texas' largest city. A hate crime charge has already been filed in one of the cases.

Christopher Dunning reported to police that two men approached his car in the 2500 block of Stanford early in the morning on Wednesday, September 1. Dunning said one of the men pulled a gun on him, called him "fag" and told him to turn over any money he might have. After Dunning denied having any money, he was forced out of his car and searched. One of the men then stabbed him in the chest. Dunning, 21, was taken to Hermann Hospital.

Four men were arrested in connection

with Dunning's assaultcase, and charges of carrying a weapon, aggravated robbery with a weapon and committing a hate crime have been filed in the case.

In another incident, Rob Cavanaugh was the victim of what may have been a hate-motivated assault and robbery last Tuesday morning at 12:30 a.m. in the Waugh Drive/Missouri Street area of Montrose. Cavanaugh was walking from his apartment to a nearby convenience store shortly after midnight when he was approached by two men who beat him severely about the head and stole his wallet. Two eyewitnesses filed reports with the Houston Police Department; the suspects are described as two Hispanic males who drove away in a dark-colored, late model Chevrolet Suburban.

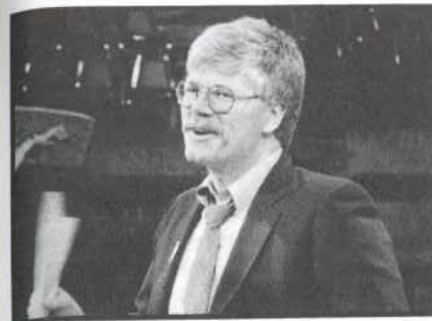
Cavanaugh was taken to Twelve Oaks Hospital with lacerations and a broken jaw. No arrests had been made at press time. Anyone with information which might help investigators was asked to call the Houston Police Department at (713)529-3100 or HGLPC at 521-1000.

CHAMBER MUSIC MARATHON TO BENEFIT DALLAS' AIDS RESOURCE CENTER

*Dallas Symphony, Oak Lawn Band
And Turtle Creek Chorale Among
Participants in Fund-Raiser
At Caruth Auditorium Tomorrow.*

DALLAS — Members of the Dallas Symphony, Turtle Creek Chorale, Oak Lawn Band and the Mesquite Civic Chorus—along with individual performers and other music groups from around Texas and as far away as Alaska—will join together for Dallas' first Chamber Music Marathon, benefiting the AIDS Resource Center. The Caruth Auditorium of the Meadows School of the Arts at Southern Methodist University will be the site of the event, which will feature classical, jazz, folk and other musical styles.



John Thomas, executive director of Dallas' AIDS Resource Center, called Chamber Music Marathon a "lovely response" to needs of AIDS service agencies.

The idea for the Dallas Chamber Music Marathon was first conceived by Don Nobles, a noted Dallas musician, who recognized the potential of such an event both as a means for Dallas music lovers to enjoy a large and varied musical menu, as well as a way to raise needed funds for AIDS causes.

Nobles' sister, Shirley Erickson, and his wife, Jan Nobles, were instrumental in bringing his idea to fruition. According to Ms. Nobles, "I think Don would be very pleased that this seed of an idea is coming to fruition. Being a musician, Don was most interested in drawing together others of the same mind to make a significant difference for this worthwhile cause. He wanted to give something back to people with AIDS. It's been very healing for me to participate in the planning of this marathon. I carry the idea that we are still doing something together."

The Chamber Music Marathon will be held tomorrow, Saturday, September 11, from 12 noon until 12 midnight, with a dinner break from 6 until 8 p.m. Ticketholders will be admitted anytime during the day, and may come and go at their leisure. Cost for the event is \$10 for adults, \$5 for children, and tickets are available at the door. Larger donations, benefiting the research and educational programs of the AIDS Resource Center, will be accepted.

John Thomas, Executive Director of the AIDS Resource Center, believes that the Marathon will greatly contribute to the work that he and the Center's staff and volunteers perform. "In the midst of what is often viewed as the horror of AIDS, there has also been a strange beauty. This festival of beautiful music is a lovely response to the ongoing need for AIDS awareness as well as financial support for our programs."

AUTHOR OF ESSAY ON SEXUAL ORIENTATION TO TOUR TEXAS

*Chandler Burr Will Speak on
Latest Research in Genetics.*

TEXAS — Earlier this year, Chandler Burr created a sensation with an article that appeared in *The Atlantic Monthly* concerning the genetics of homosexuality. In "Homosexuality and Biology," Burr offered his readers insight into current trends in scientific research on the roots of sexual orientation, and suggested that "the range of environmental and biological inputs a developing child receives is both enormous and enormously complex"—a factor which must be kept in mind when examining human sexual development.

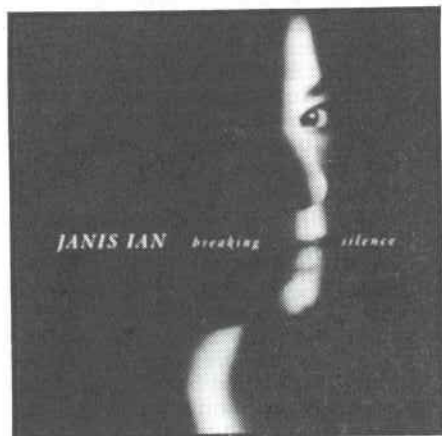
Burr comes to Texas this month, with stops at Southern Methodist University in Dallas, Texas A&M University in College Station and Bering Memorial United Methodist Church in Houston. During his visit, he will speak to mixed gay and straight audiences about the latest research in sexual orientation and the ability to modify behavior, as well as the ramifications of the new findings. Questions and a discussion period will follow each address.

The tour is designed to bring directly to the public the message that sexual orientation is not chosen. By speaking in a mixed forum at major universities and churches, with the opportunity to comment and question, Burr and his sponsors hope to reach the most diverse and open-minded audience possible.

Burr's appearance in Dallas on Tuesday, September 21 is presented by Crossroads Market, in conjunction with the Dallas chapter of Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays and the SMU Gay and Lesbian Student Organization. It will be held in the Hughes-Trigg Theater of the Hughes-Trigg Student Center, 3140 Dyer, on the SMU campus. A \$2 donation is requested. For more information, call (214)521-8919.

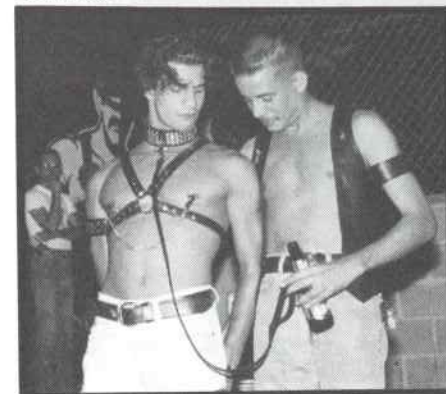

1953 - 1993

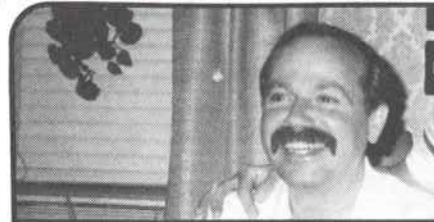

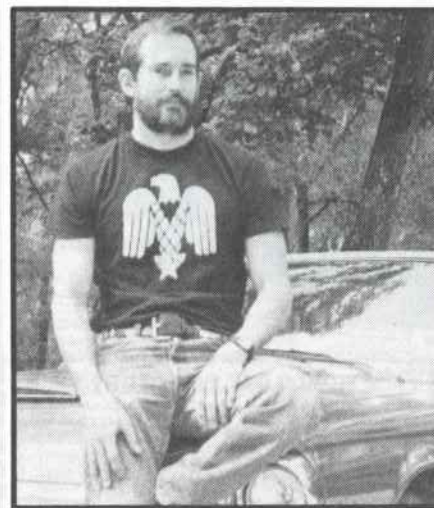
Dennis L. Rochester (above)

Died June 28, 1993

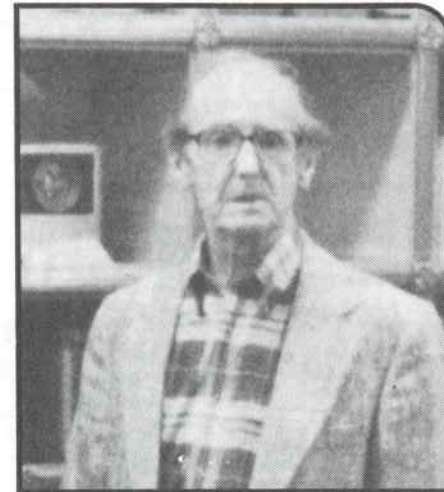
