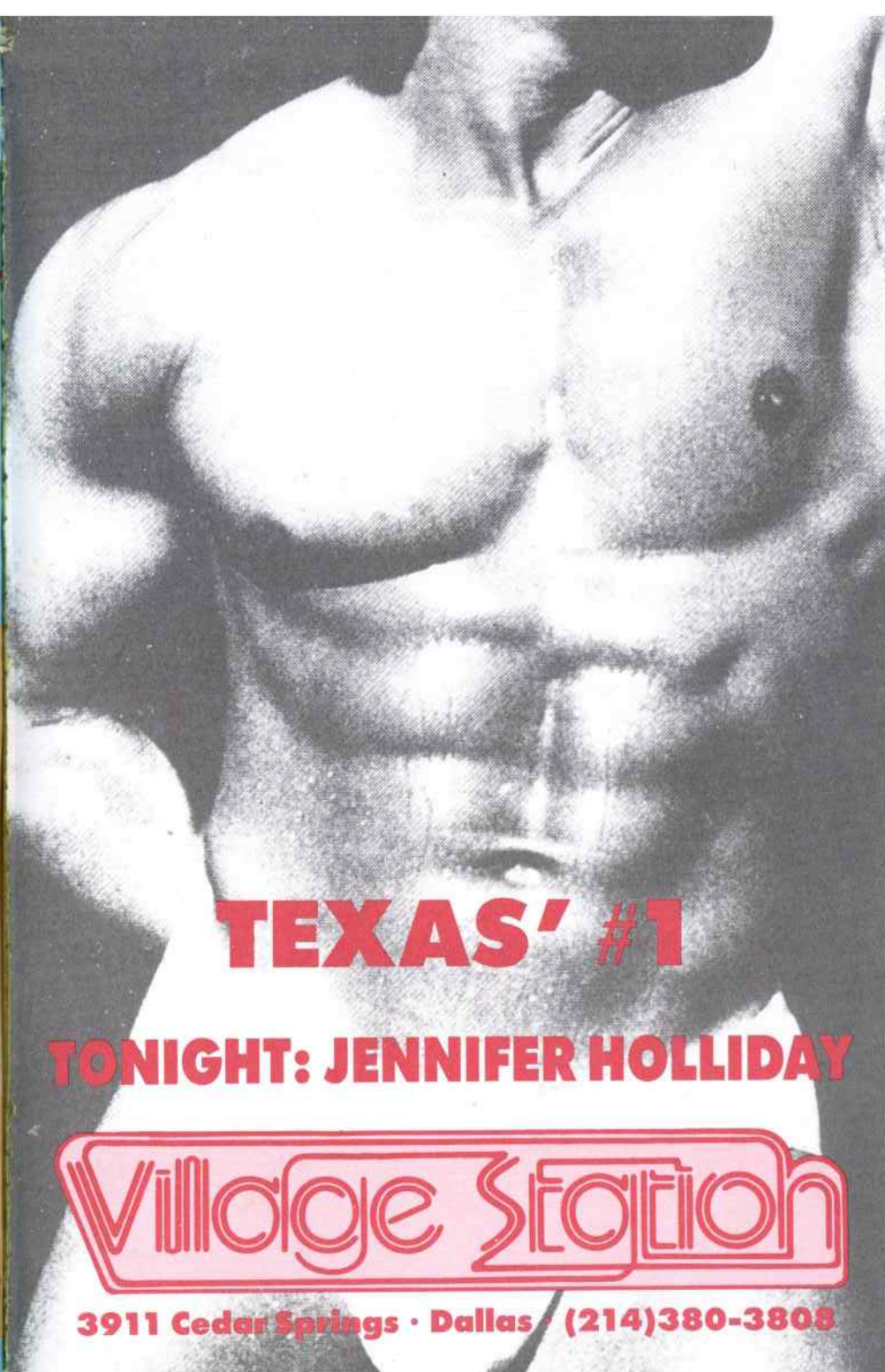

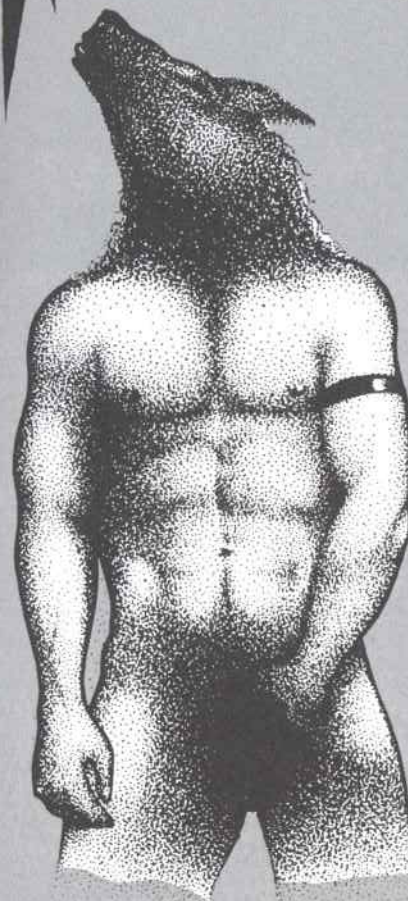

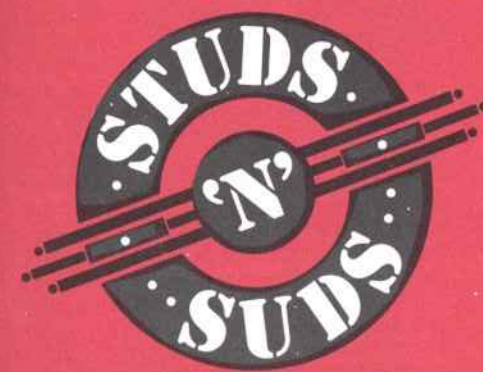

## A SEAT AT THE TABLE

A seat at the table. A voice in the debate. A vote when it counts. This year's city elections in Houston provide a unique opportunity for gays and lesbians to achieve all three. Five gay men endorsed by the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus are running for City Council seats. Along with two gay mayoral candidates, these men represent an unprecedented wave of gay and lesbian activism in Houston politics, and a new opportunity to represent ourselves at last.

There has been no better time for us to come together and make a difference with our votes. Brian Bradley (Pos. 4), Rob Bridges (Pos. 3), Ray Hill (Pos. 2) and Gary Van Ooteghem (Pos. 1) are running at large. They'll be on every ballot. Gene Harrington is running in District D, which includes the Montrose area and a significant concentration of the gay vote.

These are not the first candidates from our community. I was endorsed for City Council last year and ran a strong race in District C. Current candidates Hill and Van Ooteghem have run before for other offices. What is different this year is the impact of sheer numbers. This is an unmistakable statement that "it's our turn."

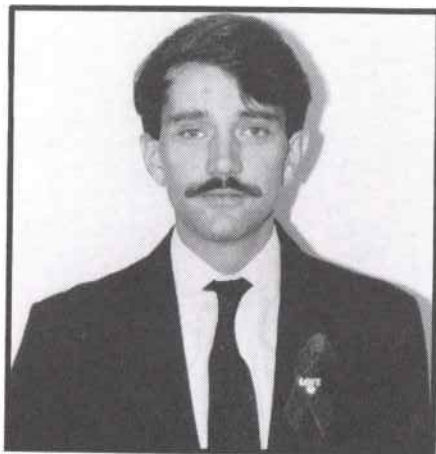
These candidates will be screened by a multitude of groups, questioned at dozens of candidate forums and interviewed by the media. They will talk about crime and potholes and garbage pickup, but they'll also talk about discrimination and domestic partnership ordinances and AIDS funding. Win or lose, they will shake up the status quo and decide the outcome of races. Better yet, their diversity of backgrounds and their divergent positions on city issues like zoning make labeling them single-issue candidates impossible.

"Take 5" is the name, and theme, of a fund-raiser planned for the five City Council candidates. With just a few weeks to campaign, every day and every dollar is precious. With so many of our own running, everyone must contribute. The candidates will be looking to generally the same pool of donors. That means one good way to get money into all the campaigns is one big joint fund-raiser. Of course, that also has the makings of a great party/rally/community event. "Take 5" is just that—with friends, entertainment, food and drinks. It will be held at the Lovett Inn on Sunday, October 24 from 3-6 p.m. For more information, call (713)523-6109.

### BRIAN BRADLEY

Brian Bradley is an AIDS activist perhaps best known for the lawsuit he brought on behalf of HIV-positive persons against the health care industry. That suit is currently at the federal 5th Circuit Court of Appeals, just one step short of being heard by the United States Supreme Court. Also in the area of HIV, Bradley is one of only 10 people in the United States writing policy for the Ryan White Emergency Care Act, a fund that totals \$880 million. Serving as a member of the National Advisory Committee on housing for HIV-positive people, he brings a strong voice to the committee for providing adequate accommodations for the HIV-positive community.

Bradley is a registered nurse by profes-

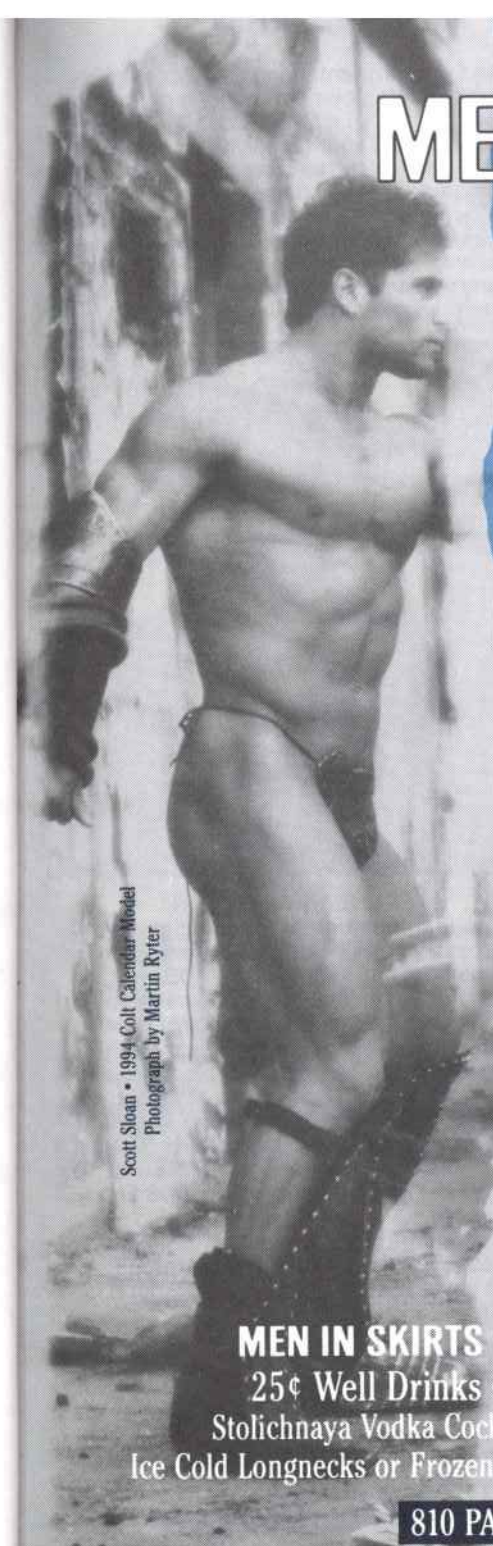

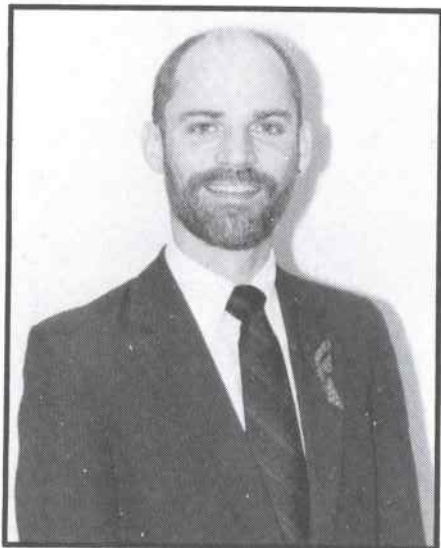

sion. He spends a lot of his time with organizations such as the Texas Human Rights Foundation and the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus, trying to move forward the cause of gay and lesbian rights.

*"I think we're saying to the gay and lesbian community that this is our time, we want to speak for ourselves, we know our issues better than anyone else... I'd like for HIV-positive people to know that they have a voice that is speaking for them and an ear that's willing to listen to them."*



**ROB BRIDGES**

Rob Bridges has done double duty as an activist in both Houston's art community and the gay/lesbian community.

His years of service to the gay community include serving as President Pro-Tem of the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus, as statewide chair of Lesbian/Gay Democrats of Texas and as chair of a committee of the Montrose Activity Center. Rob led the call for political empowerment of the Houston gay and lesbian community during the recent redistricting battles at City Hall, resulting in this year's tidal wave of openly gay candidates. He has also served as a municipal lobbyist, pushing for proper tracking and reporting of hate crimes.

In the arts community, Rob is a member of the American Federation of Musicians, on whose finance committee he served, and was the successful sponsor of a by-law amendment to include gender, illness

and sexual orientation in the Federation's official employment nondiscrimination policy.

*"This race is about speaking for ourselves, and shattering the stereotypes that hold us back as individuals and as a community. Instead of complaining about what we can't do, we are expanding the definition of what we can do. We can run, we can win and we can serve our city as well as or better than any sitting elected official."*



**GENE HARRINGTON**

A longtime fighter for civil rights, progressive and liberal, Gene Harrington is most recently known as an AIDS and gay/lesbian rights activist. He has served on the boards of the American Civil Liberties Union, the Texas Human Rights Foundation and the Montrose Clinic, and also served on the Thomas Street Clinic Advisory Board and the task forces on AIDS of the Mayor of Houston and the Texas Legislature. Harrington is also proud to have been a co-founder of the AIDS Equity League.

Harrington has been a law professor at Texas Southern University for more than 25 years and has lived within District D for almost 30 years.

Always politically active, Gene Harrington was chosen for the "Issues Committee" of Congressmen Mickey Leland and Craig Washington, and served on the Harris County Jail Medical Advisory Committee. Interestingly, he also once chaired the Houston Archeological & Historical Com-

mission and served with the Peace Corps in Nigeria.

*"If on election day, the female black high school student with HIV or the young gay teenager who feels excluded can see a 50-year-old gay man who was diagnosed seven years ago standing proudly, the campaign will be a success. I expect to win, but our victory has already been achieved."*



**RAY HILL**

Ray Hill, a native Houstonian, has been a pioneer organizer in the lesbian and gay rights movement, the free speech movement and the criminal justice reform movement. In 1968, he helped found the Promethean Society, Houston's first gay and lesbian organization. He was a co-founder of the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus (then called the Gay Political Caucus) in 1975, and served as the group's president in 1989; was a co-founder of the Gay Activist Alliance at the University of Houston; was a co-founder and executive director of the Houston Human Rights League in 1976; organized Houston Town Meeting I in 1978; chaired the executive and coordinating committees for the March on Washington for Lesbian and Gay Rights in 1979; and served as president and chair of the board of the Montrose Activity Center.

Hill was also producer and host of "Wilde 'n' Stein," the first gay and lesbian radio program in the nation, from 1975-78 and from 1982-83; and has served as pro-

ducer and host of "The Prison Show" on radio station KPFT since 1980.

In 1987, the Supreme Court handed Hill a landmark legal victory in his case *Hill v. the City of Houston*, which established that citizens could not be arrested merely for speaking to police officers, as long they were not physically hindering the officers in the performance of their duties.

*"I have always been out front making a difference for the betterment of the lesbian and gay community. I have fought hard for fairness for all, and to protect old-fashioned constitutional values."*



**GARY VAN OOTEGHEM**

Gary Van Ooteghem has been active in gay and lesbian politics for the past 20 years. He is the former Comptroller of Harris County and the Houston Port Authority, and was fired by the County in 1975 when he gave a speech in support of gay rights. Van Ooteghem was the founding president and co-founder of the Gay Political Caucus (now called the Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus), founding president of the Montrose Activity Center, co-chair of the Gay Rights National Lobby (now known as the Human Rights Campaign Fund), co-chair of the National Gay Task Force (now the National Gay & Lesbian Task Force) and chair of the Anita Bryant March in Houston.

*"Accountability in government. That's what I'm about. And I mean business."*

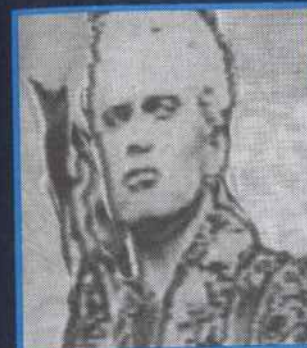

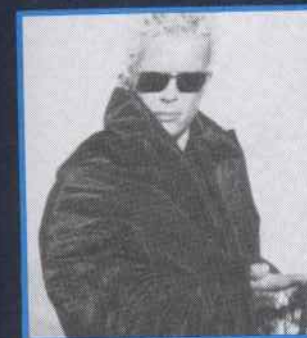

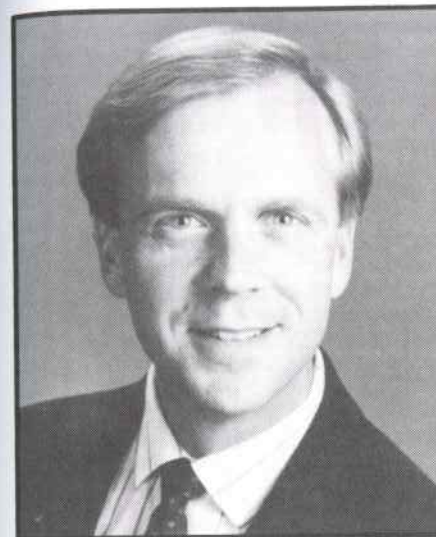

## AZT REVISITED

There is fashion in medicine as in all other things. Bitter melon is fashionable right now. AZT is not, although it has been in the past. Some AIDS activists have pointed their often unfocused anger at Burroughs Wellcome, the maker of AZT, as well as the medical community in general for advocating the use of an unpopular drug. All of this stems from the recent Berlin AIDS Conference, at which Dr. Maxime Seligman asserted that his Concorde trial had found no benefit to early use of AZT in asymptomatic persons with HIV. The Concorde study did not assert that AZT was never beneficial or that it was too toxic. On the contrary, one finding of the Concorde trial was that AZT was quite non-toxic even at the high doses used in the trial.

Nevertheless, suddenly AZT was all bad and the ranting began. For the sake of rational decision making on a very important topic, I would like to review the legitimate uses of this drug, its limitations and its risks.

Before I go any further, let me say that I do not work for Burroughs Wellcome, I receive no money from them, I own no stock in the company. We haven't even gotten any doughnuts from their drug rep in a long time. I am not an apologist for Burroughs Wellcome.

AZT is a derivative of thymidine, one of the building blocks of DNA. Incorporation of azido-thymidine instead of thymidine into a growing strand of DNA can break or weaken the strand. The drug was devel-

oped as an experimental treatment for leukemia. Its use in treating leukemia was abandoned because it caused too much anemia in the doses of 1500-2000 mg. that were used and because it did not work in leukemia. It sat on the shelf for a long time until AIDS came around.

It was known that AZT had a greater affinity for viral reverse transcriptase (the protein that builds DNA) than for that of mammals. Therefore, it was logically tried in HIV disease and the results made headlines. Those first test subjects taking AZT had many fewer opportunistic illnesses, showed improvement in immune functioning and decrease of virus in the blood, and lived longer.

In part because of an outcry from AIDS activists, the drug was rushed through the FDA approval process. When AZT became available for general use, those of us who treated patients with HIV witnessed for the first time a drug that made our patients better. I remember how remarkable it was to watch people gain weight and strength. Lab values responded, too. CD4 counts rose, sometimes as much as double the baseline. Skin tests of immune function became reactive once again. People with Kaposi's sarcoma saw a slowing or even regression of tumor. Perhaps most incredible was the effect of AZT on those with HIV dementia. After a few days of intravenous AZT, people who did not know their own names and could not feed themselves woke up and became themselves again. That is a phenomenon I have wit-

nessed and will never forget.

In spite of the successes of AZT, it soon became clear that it had real limitations. At high doses, it caused anemia and neutropenia in a large percentage of patients. Perhaps even worse, the drug had a lot of side effects like headache, nausea and fatigue. Some people simply could not take it. The toxicity and tolerability improved when it was learned that 500-600 mg. per day was the optimum dose. I think AZT has suffered in reputation because of its side effects, which people confuse with toxicity. A side effect is something you feel without associated harm. For instance, tetracycline makes a lot of people nauseated without actually hurting them. Theophylline makes people jittery, but people with asthma take it so they can breathe.

We also saw that the benefits of AZT were temporary; with time, the disease marched on. We found out that the HIV virus was capable of mutating and becoming resistant to AZT. It also became apparent that AZT, ddI and ddC were, as a class of drugs, too weak to ever control this virus alone.

This being the case, if one is living with a disease that has an 80-90% mortality rate and all one has are a few weak antivirals, how do you know when or even if to use them? Let's review the facts of AZT use:

1.) The drug has proven, albeit temporary, benefit in people with AIDS and symptomatic HIV disease. Several good studies have shown that.

2.) In asymptomatic people, there is disagreement as to benefit. The ACTG studies and the European-Australian study seemed to indicate there was benefit. The Concorde and the V.A. studies showed no difference between those taking and those not taking AZT. These two latter trials have gotten a lot of criticism because they allowed people to switch from nontreatment to treatment at will, blurring the differences between the groups.

3.) The drug works best and longest at earliest stages of the disease. This seems confusing, but think of the analogy of a house with termites. If you only have a weak treatment to combat the termites with, it's better to use it early than to wait until the house is about to fall down. I have a number of patients who were probably exposed in the early eighties who started taking AZT in 1987 with CD4 counts above

500. Their counts have normalized at around 1,000. When we noticed a decline after four or more years of AZT use, they switched to ddI and the counts went back up. These drugs are clearly most effective in early-stage disease.

4.) Switching to other antivirals or adding them to AZT prolongs the benefit. We only have three now, but hopefully more and better drugs are coming.

5.) The drug is safe. Serious toxicity occurs in about 3% of those taking AZT. A slightly higher percentage can't take it because they do not like the way it makes them feel. In my practice, that runs about 5-10%. Spin magazine articles notwithstanding, I can say that out of many hundreds of people I have monitored taking AZT, I have never seen it make someone worse. Pregnant women taking AZT have normal pregnancies and give birth to normal babies. This would not be the case with a truly toxic drug.

Burroughs Wellcome has no special sway over the FDA. If there were any legitimate evidence that AZT harmed and/or killed anybody, that drug would come off the market so fast your head would spin.

When, how or even if to treat HIV is an understandably emotionally charged subject. A lot of fear and anger sometimes gets directed at care givers for being thus far unable to end this nightmare. A more reasonable target of this anger might be the federal government, for failing to respond adequately to this crisis. If HIV had struck straight white Americans first, we would have seen a research effort that would make the space program look like practice.

The only way to make a decision regarding treatment of HIV is by working with a physician with whom you communicate and by having all the facts at hand. I am not trying to suggest that all persons with HIV should take AZT or any other drug. It is merely an option. For many people, it is better than doing nothing. We know the end result of that.

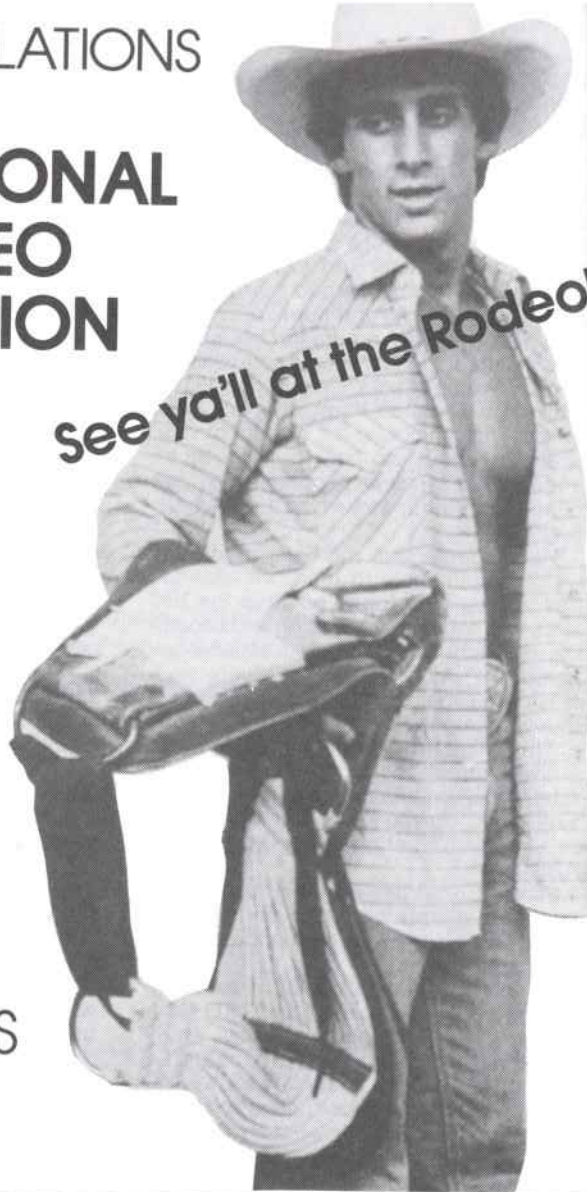

## Fighting for Our Rights Means Fighting *All* Forms of Oppression

At the September 1 meeting of the Houston Gay and Lesbian Political Caucus, which was also an election meeting to replace outgoing president Chris Bacon, I was surprised to find on the agenda the formation of what was called a Minority Coalition Committee. When this agenda item came up, there was no discussion, pro or con. In fact, almost no interest was shown in the issue. A Caucus member made the proposal and spoke in favor of it; no one else said a word. The proposal passed, of course; no one dissented. After all, it doesn't take much time or energy to form a committee, particularly when there is no call for committee members nor an announcement of a committee meeting.

Later, as the two presidential candidates gave their speeches, each talked about the need to work with established racial minority groups to fight for gay rights: "We can't do it alone; after all, we're only 10% of the population." During the question-and-answer session, Caucus members asked, what's your plan to get minorities to fight for us? What can minorities do for us? How can we use minorities to advance our interests? How can we get minorities to promote the white gay and lesbian agenda?

No one asked what white gays could do for people of color; how white gays can assist people of color in achieving their objectives; how white gays could help to fight the racial bigotry and class inequities that have, for many people of color, turned the American dream into a nightmare. And, as usual, lesbians and gays of color were ignored. In GLPC, for all practical purposes, African, Asian, Latin and Native American fags and dykes don't exist. The Caucus has no black or Asian members. (I am black, but was there as a reporter.) There are two, maybe three, Latinos. It's no wonder there wasn't much interest in the Minority Coalition Committee. If gays of color feel so alienated from the GLPC that we have, so far, refused to take part, how does anyone expect to get hetero-dominated



minority groups to support gay issues?

If you think you can manipulate minority organizations into supporting gay issues while you fail to support their issues, *you are wrong*. If you think you can make inroads with communities of color while ignoring the needs, interests, talents, and past and future contributions of gays and lesbians of color, *you are wrong*. If you think you can gain the support of gays of color without first taking a strong stand against racism in white gay and nongay communities, *you are wrong*. And if you think gays of color will be manipulated into working for the white gay agenda against the interests of our communities of color, *you are wrong*.

Traditional liberal-conservative racial rhetoric has failed. It prevents white gays and gays of color from forming a queer united front. It prevents lesbians, gay men and communities of color from uniting to fight our common enemies. The people who firebombed the home of a lesbian PWA in Tampa Bay, Fla. are the same people who bombed NAACP offices in Sacramento, Cal. and Tacoma, Wash. the same people who desecrated Jewish cemeteries and synagogues, the same people who murdered a doctor who provided abortions to women in Melbourne, Fla., and the same people who torched the home of a white fag and black dyke in Oregon, killing both.

If the queer movement is to become a liberation movement, it must expand its vision to include the freedom of all queers—white, brown, black, yellow, red, female, male, young, old, homo, bi, transgender. We must develop a progressive queer politics that recognizes the interconnectedness of homophobia, racism, sexism and classism and is committed to fighting them all. We must challenge the institutions that deny us all human rights—not blindly submit to them. We must work together to build a united front that challenges all forms of oppression. I challenge every one of you to join me in this fight.

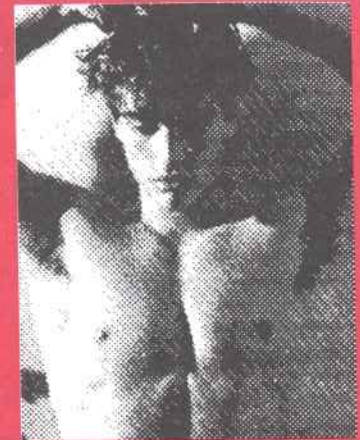

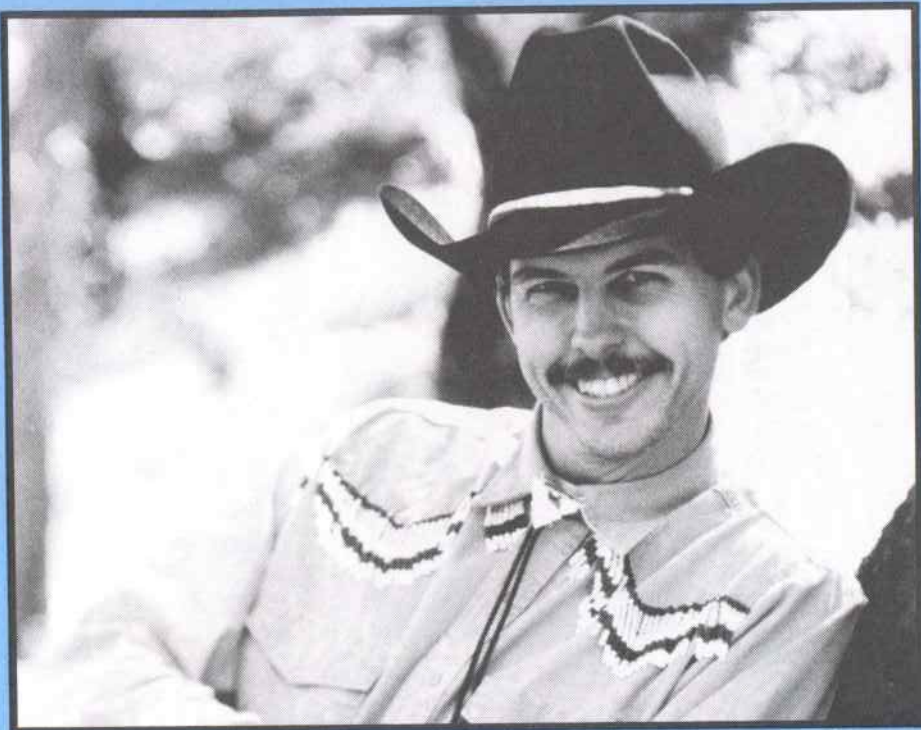

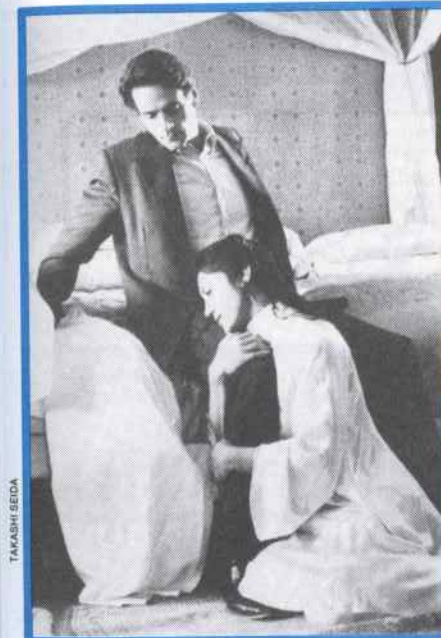

In the midst of a spate of releases featuring Chinese and Chinese-American characters, impresario David Geffen, as attuned to the zeitgeist as ever, has finally unleashed his long-promised film adaptation of *M. Butterfly*. The film is based on the hit Broadway play by David Henry Hwang (who also wrote the screenplay). Like John Guare's *Six Degrees of Separation* (also due as a film soon), *M. Butterfly* uses a factual framework to tell a fictional parable of racial and sexual divisions. In 1986, *The New York Times* carried a brief account of the espionage trial in France of Bernard Boursicot and Shi Pei Pu. While awaiting trial, it was revealed, to Boursicot's great surprise, that Shi Pei Pu was actually a man. Commenting on having never seen his lover naked, Boursicot said, "I thought she was very modest. I thought this was a Chinese custom."

Hwang, seeing the inherent stereotyping in this statement reflecting the Western view of Asian women as frail lotus blossoms, promptly set to work on his own version of the story, using just the outline, to create a deconstructivist *Madama Butterfly*. In his telling, the diplomat Rene Gallimard (Jeremy Irons) is a true imperialist. When he first sees Song Liling (John

Lone), "she" is performing an aria from the Puccini opera. Immediately he embraces the idea of the fragile Oriental and the dominant Westerner. He pursues Song, and then, having gained an admission of attraction, ignores her, forcing her to send a series of letters begging for his attention. When he finally deigns to see her, he demands proof of his conquest. "Are you my Butterfly?" he asks repeatedly, until she finally responds in the affirmative.

Gallimard's new self-confidence carries over into his work as well, where he is valued for his "insight" into the native psychology. Quizzed about American prospects in Vietnam, Gallimard foresees easy victory for the West. "Orientals will always submit to a greater force," he opines. Meanwhile, he has been impressing Song with his importance by telling her the intimate details of the intelligence reports on China and Vietnam, which Song has been quietly passing along to party officials. When, one night, drunk on liquor and self-importance, Gallimard appears at her home and orders her to strip, she stops

him by telling him that she is pregnant.

While she is off in the country "giving birth," Gallimard is blindsided by the onset of the Cultural Revolution and American losses in Vietnam, which get him sent back to France. There he pines for his Butterfly until the day she appears, shyly apologetic as ever, on his doorstep. He is delighted, even to the point of taking a job as a courier of government documents which he copies for Song. Anything, so long as he can keep his little bit of imperialism at home. But upon his arrest and the subsequent revelation, suddenly it is not so clear who is the tragic Butterfly, and who the cruel Pinkerton.

The film looks exquisite, from the sensational opening credits (over a sea of computer-animated Asian images), to the gracefully observed production design of Carol Spier, to the breathtaking cinematography by Peter Suschitzky. Hwang's screenplay is very pared down from the original, which used theatrical conventions such as actors in multiple roles and lines delivered directly to the audience to impart the story, which on stage unfolded in Gallimard's mind. In the more literal medium of film, much of this had to be abandoned or rewritten, with mixed success. The film plays much more clearly as a parable of East-West relations. But it is shorn of much of its humor and poetry, and some of the fantasy scenes do not play true as reality.

However, these flaws are often transcended by the sensational lead performances. Irons, reunited with director David Cronenberg, with whom he worked so effectively in *Dead Ringers*, is more animated than in any other role I can recall. His Gallimard is surprisingly empathetic, although it is difficult to believe him as a pathetic twit of a clerk. As Song, Lone is more androgynous than feminine, but this, along with his ability to play the subtle grace notes in the subtext, highlight Gallimard's capacity for self-deception. Although we see through Song's disguise, we still feel the power when Song appears before Gallimard for the first time as a man. The look that passes across Irons' face perfectly captures the delicious and terrible irony of a man who wanted some kind of power so badly that he was willing to ignore the obvious for years. And we know as well that he would go back in a minute, if he could retrieve the illusion of his Butterfly.

## SAN ANTONIO CAUCUS CONSIDERS CAMPAIGN AGAINST OFFICIALS INVOLVED IN RESENDEZ CASE

*Group Will Work to Defeat  
Bexar County D.A., District Judge.*

SAN ANTONIO — The killing of a gay man in San Antonio nearly four years ago continues to have repercussions, and a local gay and lesbian organization has joined the controversy. The San Antonio Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus [SALGPC] has scheduled a meeting for next Thursday, October 21 to consider political action against two officials for their role in giving the killer of Charles Perez Resendez what many in the local gay and lesbian and Hispanic communities considered much too lenient a sentence.

Bexar County District Attorney Steve Hilbig and county District Judge Terry McDonald, are under fire for their roles in a plea bargain deal in which 18-year-old Marine cadet Nicolo Giangrasso agreed to plead guilty in the death of Resendez in exchange for a sentence of ten years' probation with deferred adjudication.

Last Thursday, the Caucus' steering committee approved a recommendation by political action committee chair Glenn Stehle that SALGPC work with other community groups that want to see Hilbig and McDonald defeated in next March's primary.

The two officials worked out the plea bargain with defense attorney Eduardo Garcia, whose law firm was a contributor to previous political campaigns of both the judge and the district attorney. The light sentence given Giangrasso provoked outrage among many in the San Antonio gay and Hispanic communities.

After his arrest, Giangrasso told police that Resendez had made advances toward him after they stopped at a local motel. However, shortly before accepting the plea bargain agreement, Giangrasso said he had awakened in the motel room the next morning to find Resendez in bed next to him. He said he assumed at the time that he had been drugged and raped, and then beat Resendez in a rage.

According to Bexar County district

court records, no physical exam for rape or tests for the presence of drugs in his system were conducted on Giangrasso, and no evidence was presented to support the claim that the Marine was raped by the 37-year-old Resendez.

After he was set free and returned home to Philadelphia on February 7, 1992, Giangrasso was charged with aggravated assault and a weapons violation in Mercer County, New Jersey. Hilbig then filed a motion to revoke Giangrasso's probation, but McDonald did not act on it.

## FEDERAL COURT UPHOLDS RULING AGAINST HIV-POSITIVE HOSPITAL EMPLOYEE IN HOUSTON

*Brian Bradley Says He May Appeal  
Decision by 5th Circuit.*

HOUSTON — A federal appeals court dealt a setback to a Houston hospital worker's attempts to prove that his former employer had violated his rights after learning that he is HIV-positive. The 5th Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans last Thursday upheld a ruling by visiting Senior U.S. District Judge Milton Pollack in February dismissing Brian Bradley's case against M.D. Anderson Cancer Center. Bradley's suit, which was originally filed in January of 1992, charged the hospital with violating his free speech rights and discriminating against him as a handicapped person. Attorneys for the hospital argued that Bradley could not carry out his job without endangering patients.

The HIV and gay-rights activist, who is running for a seat on Houston City Council, said the 5th Circuit's decision was not the end of his fight against his former employer.

In July of 1991, M.D. Anderson administrators transferred Bradley from his job as a scrub technician in the operating room after he revealed he was HIV-positive in an article in the *Houston Chronicle*. The transfer amounted to a demotion, since

Bradley was forced to choose from among several alternative jobs involving no patient contact.

Bradley, who said he found out about the latest development in his case from a small news item in last Friday's *Houston Chronicle*, was consulting with his attorneys and the Texas Human Rights Foundation about his next move. He was adamant that the appeals court's decision did not signal the end of his fight, and wants to appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court, even at the risk of losing his case there.

"I am as determined today as I was on the first day of this case... There are broad social issues that must be addressed here, and if we are going to be treated in a discriminatory fashion, then let it be out in the open."

## BENCHES IN LEE PARK 'LIVING TRIBUTE' DISCOVERED MISSING

*Donations by Caven Enterprises  
To PWA Memorial Believed Stolen.*

DALLAS — During the 1992 Alan Ross Texas Freedom Parade celebrations, the clubs of Caven Enterprises—JR's Bar and Grill, Sue Ellen's, Throckmorton Mining Company and Village Station—presented to the City of Dallas four solid teak benches to be used in the Living Tribute to the AIDS Community area of Lee Park. The funds for the benches, totaling over \$2,400, were raised through donations collected from the clubs' customers and employees.

Just this past week, however—during meetings held in Arlington Hall concerning renovation of the facility, which is situated adjacent to the Living Tribute—it was noticed by former city council candidate Ed Oakley and Dallas Tavern Guild executive director Alan Ross, who coordinated the project, that the benches were no longer in the area.

Ross immediately launched an investigation into the missing benches, and determined that they had either been removed by Parks Department personnel pursuant to the renovation of the property, or had been stolen. Subsequent calls to Yvonne Washington, assistant director of the West Region of the Parks and Recreation Department, which includes Lee Park, indicated that Washington was aware that



the benches had been stolen the previous week. She also indicated that Ross should have already been notified of the theft.

As of press time, Ross had spoken with various park staff members about the theft and received very little information. What is known is that the theft apparently occurred during the day Tuesday, October 5. What is not yet known is whether a police report of the incident was filed and why park officials and Ross were not notified.

According to both Ross and Oakley, who oversaw installation of the benches, "it would have taken at least two people with the correct tools to disassemble the benches from the concrete and a pickup [truck] to take them from the park. Because there is no lighting in the park, the theft had to take place during the daylight."

At press time, Ross was unable to establish if there will be a cash reward for information about the missing benches, but he is asking anyone with information to contact him at (214)559-4190.

## PRIDE COORDINATORS FROM ACROSS U.S. MEET IN HOUSTON

*Three-Day IAL/GPC Conference  
Includes Workshops, Speeches  
By National Figures.*

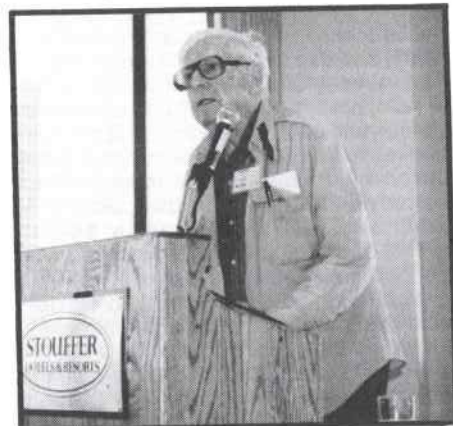
HOUSTON — Representatives of gay and lesbian pride associations across the U.S. assembled in Houston last weekend to network and exchange insights during this year's conference of the International Association of Lesbian/Gay Pride Coordinators, held at the Stouffer Presidente Hotel.

Gay pride celebrations date back to 1970, when gay men and lesbians in several American cities staged marches and rallies to commemorate the Stonewall Riot that occurred in New York City the year



before. IAL/GPC, formed in 1982, holds a conference in a different host city each year. There were also delegations from Canada and Germany at this year's event.

A major portion of the three-day conference was devoted to workshops dealing with various aspects of pride celebrations. J.B. Newman, vice president of operations of Christopher Street West, conducted a workshop on the nuts and bolts of plan-

ning pride celebrations, from raising seed money to bringing in name entertainers.

A workshop on diversity presented by Mary Philbin and Flora Piterak dealt with the issues and problems facing pride coordinators and others who are trying to make their organizations more representative of their communities. Annise Parker and Kathy Hubbard of Houston presented workshops on politics and the financial issues involved in setting up pride organizations. There were also workshops on history, insurance, publications and other subjects.

Special guest at Saturday evening's Texas Conference Banquet was Peri Jude Radevic, who on November 1 will assume the post of executive director of the National Gay & Lesbian Task Force [NGLTF]. Radevic said her goals as head of NGLTF will be to strengthen the gay and lesbian rights movement at state and local levels, and to fashion alliances among gay organizations and between those groups and the larger community.

Keynote speaker Juan Palomo, an openly gay editorial for the *Houston Post*, decried the recent decline of gay activism, citing

the dissolution of Queer Nation chapters across the country. He also condemned President Clinton's compromise decision on the military ban on gay and lesbians serving in the nation's armed forces, saying the community was still "shellshocked" after Clinton's "betrayal."

The conference concluded with a plenary session on Sunday featuring an address by Morris Kight, a veteran activist with decades of commitment to pacifist, civil rights and gay and lesbian causes. Kight, a principle co-founder of Christopher Street West, submitted the original proposal for Stonewall 25 at the fourth annual conference of pride coordinators in 1985.

Kight, who was born in a small Texas town 73 years ago, opened his address by saying he was "coming out" as a parent and grandparent. Several members of his family, including his grandson, were present for his speech.

## DALLAS CHORUS TO OPEN 14TH SEASON WITH 'WIZARD OF OZ'

*Will Return to Morton H. Meyerson  
With Concert of Holiday Music.*

DALLAS — The Turtle Creek Chorale has been heralded by many as Texas' musical ambassador to the world. It gained that reputation because of the remarkable talent of the 200-member male vocal group and because of a recent PBS special, "After Goodbye," which spotlighted the way in Chorale members have dealt with the losses they have experienced to AIDS. Also catapulting the group onto the world stage during its 13th season last year were sold-out performances at New York's Carnegie Hall, as well as the worldwide release of their CD, *Testament*.

The Chorale begins its 14th season this year, and is guaranteeing its audiences a season that, in the words of artistic director Dr. Timothy Seelig, "is sure to entertain, excite and enlighten."

The 1993-94 season begins next Friday evening, October 22, in the McFarlin Auditorium on the campus of Southern Methodist University when the Chorale will offer its interpretation of L. Frank Baum's timeless children's classic *The Wizard of Oz*. The production is an exciting new venture for the group and, according to Seelig, "will be an extravaganza with Broad-

way-style sets, lights, orchestra and choreography. This will be the *Wizard of Oz* exactly as you remember it...or maybe not exactly."

During the Christmas holidays, the Chorale will return to the Morton H. Meyerson Symphony Center for a holiday celebration of traditional and familiar music from around the world. In mid-March of next year, the chorus will present "United We Sing," also at the Meyerson and featuring music of the soul rooted in Africa and imported to America. Joining the Chorale for this presentation will be the men's chorus from the First Baptist Church of Dallas, New Arts Six and the Dallas Black Dance Theatre.

The Turtle Creek Chorale's season finale will be "There's No Place Like Home," scheduled for early June next summer in the Meyerson. With special guest star Miss Texas 1993 Bashara Chandler, the chorus will return to its Texas roots as the state is the backdrop of an evening of music dedicated to the Lone Star musical heritage.

## NEW PROGRAM TO ASSIST PWAS AT DALLAS CLINIC

*'Registration Helpers' to Start  
At Parkland November 1.*

DALLAS — One of the many complaints persons with HIV/AIDS have had about the AIDS Clinic at Parkland Memorial Hospital is the difficulty they experience not only in locating the Clinic, but in locating the various departments and services they must access once at the facility.

To help alleviate some of the more practical concerns of the AIDS Clinic's patients, the AIDS Resource Center will soon begin a new program designed to assist first-time Parkland patients in getting registered into the hospital's system, and finding their way around the Clinic. Dubbed Registered Helpers at Parkland [RHAP], the new program will use volunteers, many of whom are already Parkland patients who are familiar with the hospital system,

to orient the new patients.

Volunteers will guide new patients to the correct elevators to reach the Clinic's sixth floor location and will show them the Clinic and assist them in getting an appointment slip at the front desk.

According to the program's coordinator, Don Harp of the Nelson-Tebedo Community Clinic, the new program will be easier to run than it was to get Parkland to agree to it.

"It took Parkland three months and 20 days to come to the decision on policy regarding the RHAP program. In that time, my idea was passed from department to department. I was somewhat disappointed that the red tape and bureaucracy made an unknown number of new patients go to Parkland with no idea of where to start. I was also surprised that this program, which benefits new patients—as well as taking some of the load off the Parkland AIDS Clinic staff—was not received with open arms, but rather with the usual 'hurry up and wait' mentality that Parkland is famous for."

TWT NEWS contacted Parkland Hospital and spoke with Esther Bauer, a community relations representative in the hospital's administrative offices, who responded to Harp's comments by stating, "I can understand his concerns. The approval process for any new program is somewhat lengthy. First of all, we must make sure that the people that are helping (in this case, the Registration Helpers) are, in fact, helpers. Then, because things change so quickly at Parkland, we have to make sure that everyone is informed about a new program...I suppose that can take awhile."

"The initial contact Mr. Harp made was with a woman on staff who went on vacation for three weeks, so in essence we were unaware of the program during that time. When Mr. Harp presented the plan, we had to research it—we have a volunteer staff already in place, and we wanted to determine whether the new program should be incorporated into the existing volunteer effort...We think the program is a pretty neat idea, and we look forward to its implementation."

The Registration Helpers at Parkland program is currently scheduled for a November 1 startup, and is actively recruiting volunteers for the new service. But Harp says that anyone who needs this service before the startup date can still obtain it by calling him at (214)528-2336 between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. Monday through Friday.

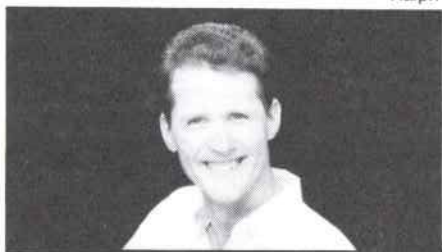
Formerly from Louisiana and a graduate of LSU, a horseman and member of the Longhorn Cattle Breeders Association, Hank was a man of many facets.

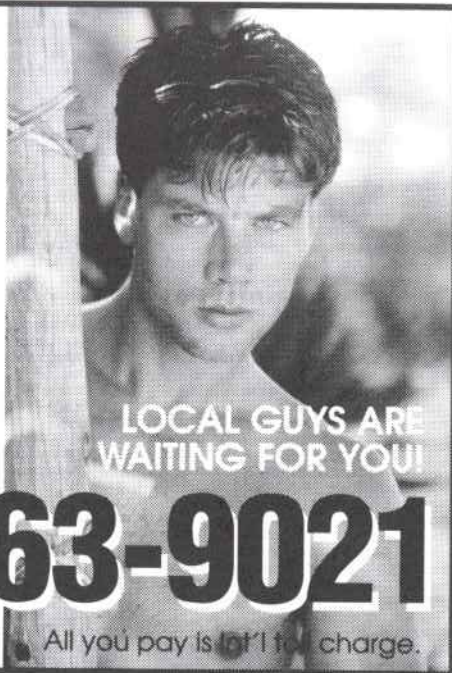

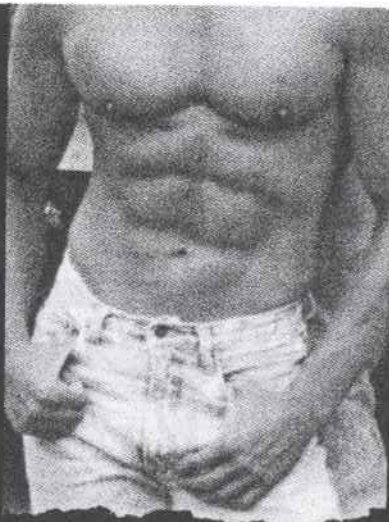

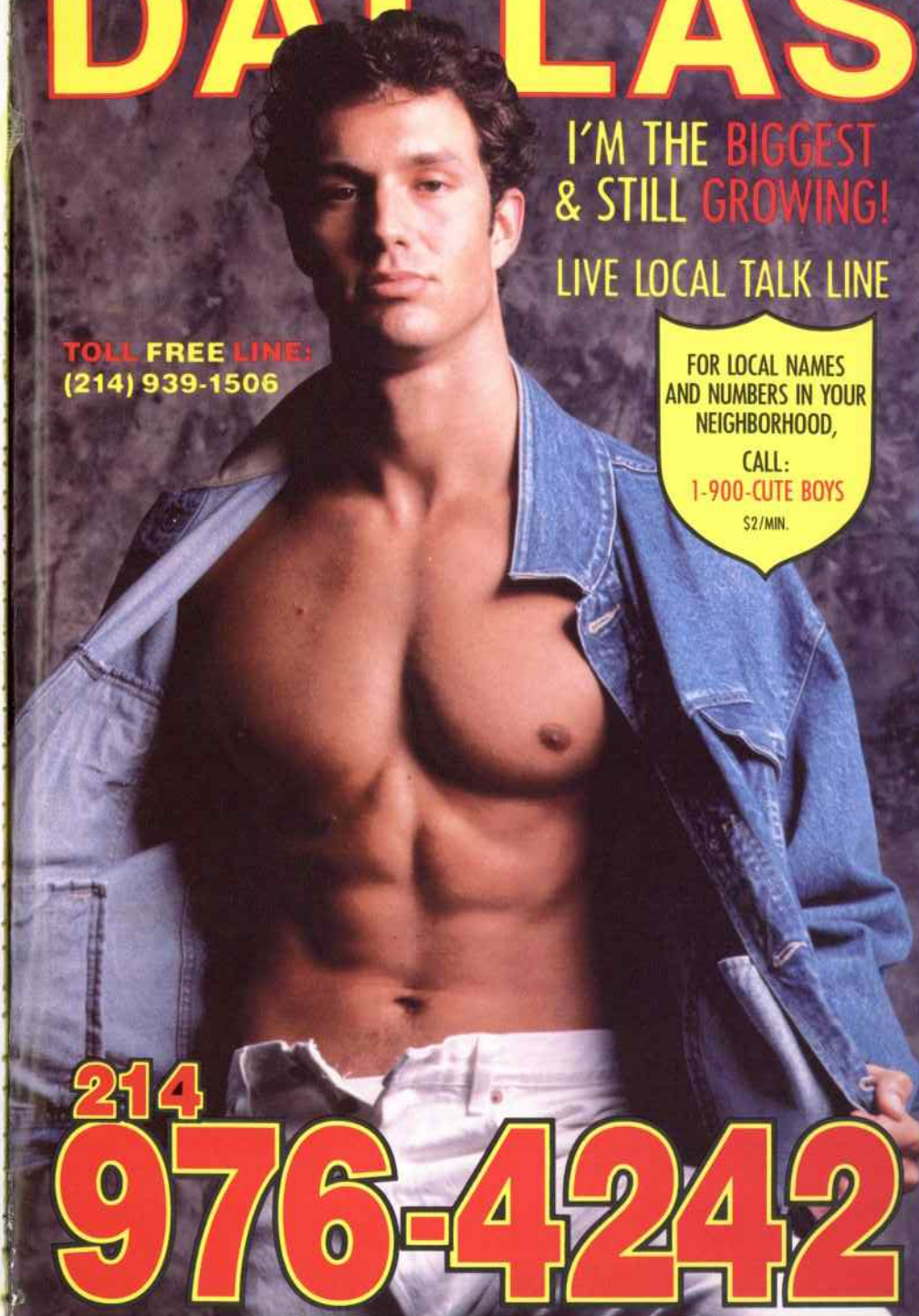
