SKIN CARE AND HIV

Everyone wants to look their best. But good health is more than skin deep. Cutaneous diseases can be serious, even life-threatening. As a dermatologist, I've seen how skin problems can devastate people's self-esteem. Physicians offer treatment for most skin ailments, whether HIV-related or not, but prompt diagnosis is essential.

Remember, *anyone* can suffer from these conditions, but when combined with HIV, they are more difficult to diagnose and treat. I'll also give readers some tips on skin care.

Kaposi's sarcoma [KS] is probably the best known cutaneous sign of HIV infection. KS is a systemic disease causing pink-to-purple lesions anywhere on the skin or in the mouth. KS is diagnosed easily by a relatively painless biopsy procedure. Injection of chemotherapeutic agents into the lesions is one effective treatment. Although not a cure, it does fade the KS and has few side effects.

Skin infections include common problems like athlete's foot, scabies, warts, molluscum, herpes simplex, folliculitis and staph. However, some cutaneous lesions may signify an internal opportunistic infection such as a fungus or a parasite, like pneumocystis carinii.

Athlete's foot, or tinea, is caused by a fungus found throughout the world. Although a common nuisance in humid, warm climates, tinea is more difficult to treat in patients with HIV. Clotrimazole cream (nonprescription) can help, but prevention (keeping one's feet dry and avoiding contact with the gym floor, for instance) is key.

Scabies is a common and contagious

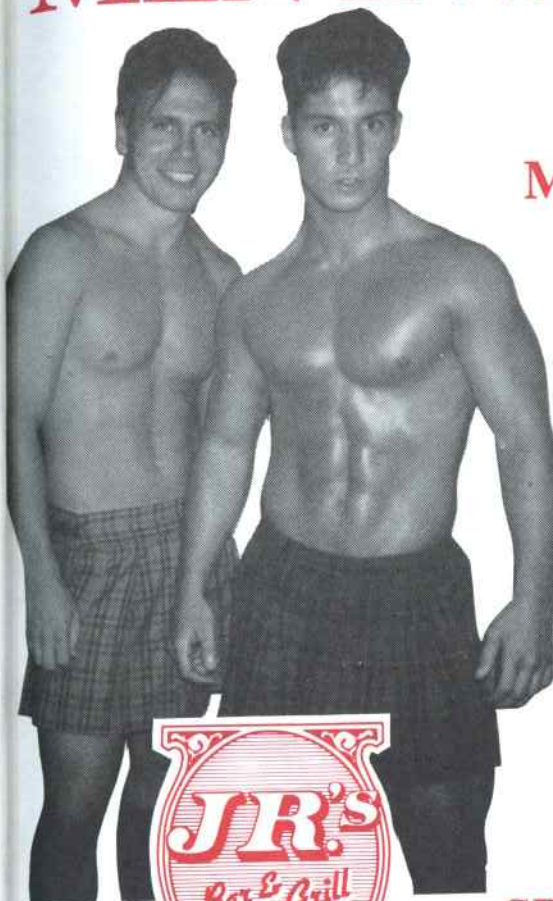

disease caused by a mite which produces extreme itching. The hands, body and genitals are affected and it requires prescription medicine for a cure. People with HIV can develop a more widespread and aggressive form of scabies that can mimic other skin conditions.

Warts, or verruca, are caused by the common, contagious papillomavirus. Verruca multiply on the body and are most easily treated when small. Genital/anal warts are a sexually transmitted disease [STD]. One effective treatment for verruca is "freezing" with liquid nitrogen applied without an anesthetic. Topical podophyllin liquid or surgical excision may be required for some warts.

A different wart, molluscum contagiosum, appears as smooth, pink bumps on any part of the body, but commonly in the beard area. Molluscum are treated like common warts, but small lesions can be removed by scraping with minimal discomfort.

Studies show that ultraviolet light, found in the sun's rays and in tanning beds, may stimulate HIV production. It also causes premature aging of the skin, pigment irregularities and skin cancers like melanoma.

The herpes simplex virus [HSV], a common recurrent STD, can also cause persistent, painful genital sores. A related virus, herpes zoster, causes another painful rash known as "shingles." Acyclovir capsules are usually effective in controlling HSV and shingles, but a culture should be performed first.

Folliculitis, hair follicle infection, has many causes and can be chronic, especially with HIV. Deodorant soaps are antibacterial and are a good first-line treatment. Staphylococcus, or "staph," can cause folliculitis and a variety of cutaneous infections which often require oral antibiotics.

Psoriasis and seborrheic dermatitis are common skin conditions seen in the general population. In HIV patients, they can

be debilitating and affect any part of the body with redness, scaliness and itching. We don't know the cause, but sudden worsening of either condition may indicate a worsening immune status. One percent hydrocortisone cream and anti-dandruff shampoos may help the mildest cases, but other therapies are available through your physician for psoriasis and seborrheic dermatitis.

Itching can be unbearable for people with HIV. Moisturize the skin first and see your doctor if you get no relief. Also, HIV causes an overreaction to mosquito bites, producing large, red nodules on the skin. Take measures to avoid insect bites, including wearing long pants, socks and shoes and using insect repellent.

Most people like to get a tan. But studies show that ultraviolet light [UVL], found in the sun's rays and in tanning beds, may stimulate HIV production. UVL also causes premature aging of the skin, pigment irregularities and skin cancers like melanoma, which can be fatal. People with depressed immune systems have a higher risk of cancers, so we will likely see more skin cancer in HIV patients as they live longer and the ozone layer is depleted. Sunscreens offer good protection and many brands have "sunless tanning" formulas which many patients like.

Here are a few tips for healthy skin:

- 1.) Practice safe sex. Remember, there are at least a dozen common STDs besides HIV (like hepatitis B).
- 2.) Don't put off showing your physician a growth or rash that is obviously not going away.
- 3.) Remember, there's no such thing as a "safe" tan.
- 4.) Don't smoke—tobacco causes facial wrinkles.
- 5.) Simple skin care is best—gentle cleansing and moisturizing is usually adequate. Expensive products do not undo or prevent wrinkles.

In my practice, I see many other skin rashes associated with HIV. Some conditions may require a test, but many can be diagnosed on sight in the office. People with HIV/AIDS should bring any new skin condition to the attention of their primary care doctor or dermatologist—and the sooner the better.

Houstonians Raise Funds for AIDS With This Sunday's From All Walks of Life

This Sunday, November 7, thousands of Houstonians are expected to turn out for the 5th annual "From All Walks of Life," organized by and benefiting AIDS Foundation Houston. The Walk, which helps pay for the services AFH provides to its clients, is also considered an excellent opportunity to increase AIDS awareness in the community at large.

A new starting point has been chosen for this year's event, the historic Old Sabine Street Bridge over Buffalo Bayou near downtown Houston. Walk registration begins early Sunday morning at 8, after which emcee and co-host Susan Starnes of Channel 11 will present Mayor Bob Lanier and wife Elyse, again serving as Walk co-chairs this year. Also addressing Walk participants will be City Council member Vince Ryan, Gallery Furniture owner Jim "Mack" McIngvale, Dr. Adan Rios of ONCOL and AFH board chair Perry Nagel.

Prior to the start of the walk at 9 a.m., to be signaled by KRBE 104 personality John Leach, warmup music will be performed by Marsha Carlton and Clay Howell. Entertainment will also be provided on the main stage beginning shortly after the start of the Walk until 2 p.m. Among those scheduled to perform are Yvonne Washington (9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m.), Annette

Valadez (11:15 a.m.), the St. Anne's Contemporary Choir (11:30 a.m.), Harlan Holt and Michael Brown (12:15 p.m.) and the Lone Star Symphonic Band (various times). Emceeding the stage show from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. will be comedian Diane Johnson and Alley Theatre actress Vicki Weathersby.

Refreshments will be provided by a variety of Houston caterers, food service companies and restaurants. There will be merchandise giveaways as well as opportunities to win prizes donated by local businesses.

Another new feature of this year's event is the AFH Volunteer Booth, which will provide information on the many aspects of volunteer service available at AFH as well as volunteer applications. "The existence of AFH is dependent upon the talents and dedication of hundreds of men and women from all parts of the metropolitan community," Peggy Sale, AFH Director of Volunteers, commented. "We could not do what we do without volunteers."

Board chair Nagel noted that the Walk was the culmination of hard work on the part of many. "With the support of hundreds of volunteers, the staff and board of trustees of AFH, 30 Houston businesses, 47 performers and our ambassadors, 'From All Walks of Life 1993' will be an event to remember."

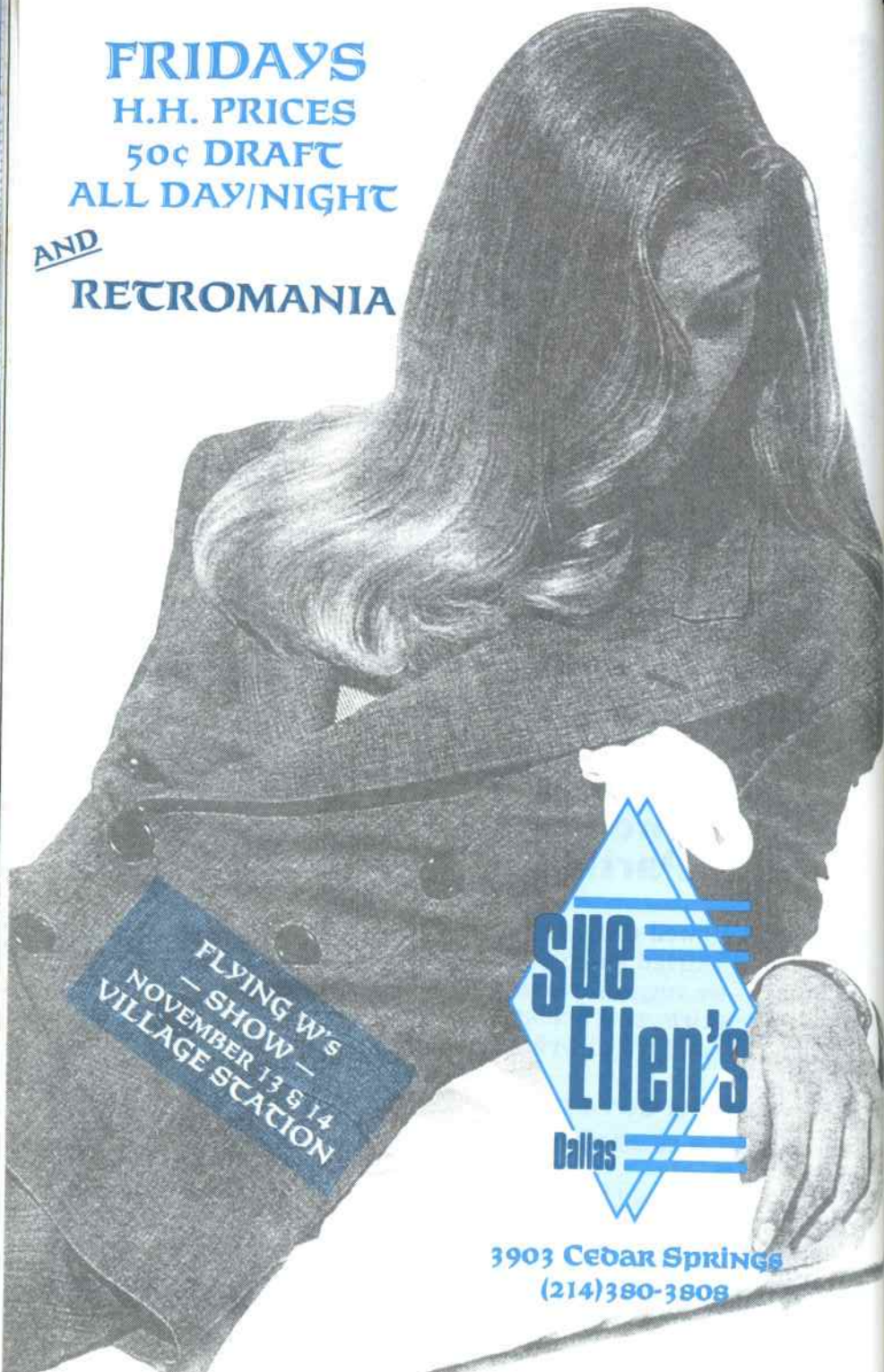

The ellipse in the title of *Sex Is...* leaves a blank to be filled in. Accordingly, the question at the heart of this film pertains to an elusive definition of the nature and "meaning of sex and sexuality in the lives of gay men," as the subtitle would have it. In this diverting documentary, filmmaker Marc Huestis showcases 15 men (including himself) of varied ages and backgrounds as they attempt to answer the question.

Jim Glyer, a church pastor in his seventies, recalls his early struggles to fit a role defined for him by society. Miguel Gutierrez, a 19-year-old student, cheerfully confesses, "I'm a slut and I love it." Huestis himself recalls having picked up older men in public places as a 13-year-old. Reminiscences range from monogamous partnerships to orgy rooms, from celibacy to indulgence, from casual encounters to elaborately planned sadomasochistic scenes. And always close at hand is the specter of HIV, with implications coloring considerations of sexuality both past and present.

Huestis does an admirable job in presenting a balanced portrait of a tremendously diverse community, although at times one might wish for further exploration of some topics (for instance, only one couple is featured). The film is structured so that it follows a basic "storyline." First, tales are told of earliest sexual feelings and experiences, including several revelations of abuse. A wider variety of experiences are related in the stories of life outside the closet. The joyfully hedonistic at-

mosphere of the 1970s urban gay scene is recalled, followed by sober reflection on the toll wrought by AIDS. Finally, the film

looks at the present and at the future, as sex, like life, goes on.

Although all involved are given a good share of screen time, several of the participants emerge as particularly memorable characters. Bob Hawk, an ingratiating speaker with a slight stammer, gives the most vivid account of pre-Stonewall life. His affection for the underground bars of the time is palpable, and his hope, poignant, as a man entering middle age alone in a youth-obsessed culture. Wayne Corbitt, a "performance poet" and playwright, seems at times too self-consciously mannered, but, nonetheless, relates many of the film's most dramatic episodes, including a suicide attempt, and his own dilemma, as an African-American, upon finding himself involved in a sadomaso-

chistic relationship as a "slave" to a white South African "master."

Corbitt's defense of S&M is rebutted by "Madame X," a cross-dressing prostitute, and this film's reigning diva. Other standouts include "Lulu," who turned from an active sex life to celibacy in fear of AIDS; Gerard Koskovich, a self-described "queer historian," whose socialized view of sexuality leads to an enthusiasm for in-your-face tactics over physical intimacy; Larry Brinkin and R. Wood Massi, who exude warmth and commitment as the film's one couple; and Huestis himself, who is willing to go as far as, if not farther than, any participant.

Even with such willing disclosure, the "talking heads" format might have been rather dry, so Huestis enlivens proceedings with intercutting of film and video clips. Many of these are graphic—very graphic—demonstrations of the very sexuality being discussed. No more coy with the choice of these inserts than he is in the interviews, these clips include not only nudity, but brief, yet completely explicit, scenes of male-to-male sexual intercourse.

Not all is heavy breathing, however. Other scenes are spliced in for comic effect. Included are several priceless clips from portentous Fifties "educational" films and bad "social realist" films on the order of *Reefer Madness*. Great care is taken, also, to offend archconservative Sen. Jesse Helms (as if he wouldn't be offended enough by the very existence of this film), to whose "memory" this film is dedicated.

All in all, *Sex Is...* is a rather entertaining look at a "closeted" subject. And yet one wonders precisely whom the filmmakers had in mind as an audience for their product. Non-gay persons (and, possibly, many lesbians) are likely to be so repelled by the explicit portrayal of sexuality that they will stay away, or come away with a negative impression. Although it has some humor and the gossipy "True Confessions" tone of daytime talk shows, most gay men will find little in the way of fresh insight or life-changing revelations. As it stands, it seems best suited to gay males either in their teens or living isolated lives, such as in some rural areas... exactly those with the least access to this film.

Sex Is... plays at the Dobie Theatre in Austin November 12-18 and at the Major Theatre in Dallas December 2-8.

GAY CANDIDATES FALL SHORT IN HOUSTON ELECTIONS

*Few Caucus-Endorsed Hopefuls
Win or Make Runoffs;
Zoning Loses for Third Time
In City's History.*

HOUSTON — Voters stopped short of making history last Tuesday when five openly gay candidates for Houston City Council failed to make it into runoffs. Houstonians also rejected zoning for the third time in the city's history.

Overall voter turnout was approximately 20%, though it appeared to be closer to 30% in heavily gay precincts. Gene Harrington received 30.8% of the vote in his race against District D Incumbent Al Calloway. Also running were Gary Van Ooteghem for at Large Pos. 1, Ray Hill for at Large Pos. 2, Rob Bridges for at Large Pos. 3 and Brian Bradley for at Large Pos. 4.



Gay City Council Candidates [l-r] Rob Bridges, Gary Van Ooteghem and Ray Hill were first to vote in Precinct 34 in Houston's Montrose area last Tuesday morning.

At an election-night party held Tuesday evening at the Wyndham Warwick, disappointment at vote totals was tempered with an awareness that the gay and lesbian community had gained political strength from having several of its own on the ballot. "The election tonight is not the issue," Harrington told the crowd. "We have made our voices heard, and never again will we be silent."

In other city races in which GLPC issued endorsements, City Controller George Greanias won reelection with a comfortable margin, while District I City Council member Ben Reyes just barely managed to avoid a runoff. GLPC-supported candidates in races for City Council Districts B, C, F and H failed even to make it into runoffs.

In a race widely considered a foregone

conclusion, incumbent Mayor Bob Lanier rolled over all opposition to hold onto office. Openly gay candidate Brian Bowen received about 5% of the vote. The Caucus did not issue an endorsement in the mayoral contest.

Houstonians narrowly voted down zoning Tuesday night, the third such rejection in the city's history. The issue attracted attention in the local gay and lesbian community late last year when it became apparent that some provisions of the proposed regulations might threaten the existence of gay nightclubs and other businesses in the Montrose area. GLPC did not take a stand on the issue.

AIDS EQUITY LEAGUE LOOKS INTO CLAIMS OF HIV-RELATED BIAS

*Houston Health Clinic Agrees
To Eliminate Policy Against
Treating Patients with Virus.*

HOUSTON — If recent incidents are any indication, discrimination against people with or perceived to have HIV continues to be a serious problem in the Houston area. The AIDS Equity League, which seeks to insure fair and unbiased treatment of HIV-positive and at-risk people, has been investigating two recent cases apparently involving such discrimination, and can claim at least partial success in one of them.

Several months ago, Fred Walters Jr.

placed a call to the Whole Health Center on Richmond Avenue while searching for a doctor who would use a holistic approach in the treatment of HIV. Walters said he was informed by the clinic's receptionist that the center was prohibited from treating people with HIV because of a lease agreement the clinic's doctor, Gilbert Manso, had signed with the landlord of the building, Keppel Houston group.

Then, a month ago, Walters was reminded of the phone call while watching a local television news story about an HIV discrimination case. A second call to the Whole Health Center confirmed that the clinic had a policy against treating HIV-positive patients. Walters then wrote a letter to the AIDS Equity League asking that the organization become involved in his case.

A check by AEL verified that the lease on the building occupied by Whole Health Center included a provision barring tenants from treating people with AIDS or performing abortions. AEL Executive Director Lane Lewis sent a letter to the clinic demanding that all discriminatory language be removed from the lease and that the Whole Health Center submit a written apology to AEL on Walters' behalf for any undue stress he was caused.

Lewis said AEL has received a letter from Dr. Manso stating that the offending clause had been removed from the lease, though no letter of apology has been forthcoming from the building's landlord.

The AIDS Equity League is also checking into another possible case of HIV-related discrimination, in which a young Houston-area woman claims she was tested for exposure to the virus during a routine medical visit and was then refused further treatment when the results of an initial ELISA test came back positive. A Western blot test failed to confirm that finding.

GAY BUSINESS GROUP IN DALLAS TO HOLD CAREER FAIR

*Workshop Next Sunday Aimed at
Educating Young People.*

DALLAS — When the Stonewall Professional and Business Association was

founded in Dallas 1992 to support, develop and improve opportunities in and for the gay and lesbian community, organizers envisioned the group with existing business in mind. While that vision and purpose still exist today, current leadership recognizes that future generations of gay businessmen and women must be cultivated to ensure the viability and success of business in the community.

To better educate gay and lesbian young people about the opportunities available to them, and to help them develop the skills necessary to achieve their goals, the Association will present a Career Fair for students and young adults on Saturday, November 13 at the First Unitarian Church in Dallas. The day's events will encourage participants to integrate their professional, activist and personal lives.

The three components of the day-long workshop will include an address by keynote speaker Dallas City Councilman Chris Luna, who is expected to discuss the benefits of tolerance for diversity in the workplace. Included in the event will be workshops on general career topics and those specific to the gay community, including "How to Land a Job" and "Out in the Workplace," a panel discussion among people who are open about their sexuality in their professional lives. Also featured will be a presentation on the Mentoring Program, which allows young participants to meet someone in a profession that interests them. Representatives from a variety of careers—including health professions, law, retail, accounting, journalism and teaching—will be available to discuss their respective fields.

DALLAS CHURCH TO REMEMBER THOSE WITH HIV DURING 'PRAYER WEEKEND'

*San Francisco MCC Pastor to Speak
At Cathedral of Hope Services
This Sunday, Monday.*

DALLAS — One way gay and lesbian people have found to cope with the dev-

astating impact of AIDS is to explore the spiritual aspects of life. In the Dallas area, the Cathedral of Hope Metropolitan Community Church has, through its teachings and the programs it offers, become for many of those affected by HIV and AIDS an inspiring source of peace and calm.

According to the Rev. Paul Tucker, Director of Pastoral Care at the Cathedral, "AIDS has been a devastating disease for the Metroplex, yet it has also been a clarion call to action for us as a church. We have mobilized our staff and volunteers into one of the best HIV service organizations in the community. We have not let this disease numb us into inaction."

While much of the action the Cathedral of Hope takes to combat AIDS is on the physical level, it cannot be denied that the primary purpose of the church is spiritual. In keeping with that purpose, the church sets aside two days each year as days of prayer for everyone who has been touched by HIV, and to remember those who have died from the disease over the last year. This year, the annual AIDS Prayer Weekend will be held on Sunday and Monday, November 7-8, at the Cathedral. According to Rev. Tucker, "Our AIDS Prayer Weekend demonstrates that we believe we have to give our prayers life by the action and commitments of our lives."

With that in mind, the Cathedral will focus on several different ways that congregants can be of service to those affected, just as the AIDS crisis has affected different parts of the community.

For children affected by AIDS, the church will collect disposable diapers all weekend long. Especially needed are medium and large sizes. These diapers will then be donated to Bryan's House, an agency that serves women and children with HIV.

For those challenged by the disease themselves, there will be a healing service on Sunday night, with prayers offered for those in attendance as well as others coping with AIDS. On Monday night, the focus will shift to ways in which people can celebrate life even in the midst of death and disease as they work together to make a difference in the world. Also provided will be information about the various volunteer opportunities the church offers.

Guest speaker for Sunday and Monday's services will be the Rev. Jim Mitulski, Pastor of Metropolitan Community Church San Francisco. Mitulski's congregation

has had an overwhelming experience with AIDS, with over 80% of its men estimated to be HIV-positive. Despite these staggering numbers, the church has flourished and grown. Mitulski will relate his experiences with the disease, and the methods he and his flock have developed to cope with it, throughout the weekend.

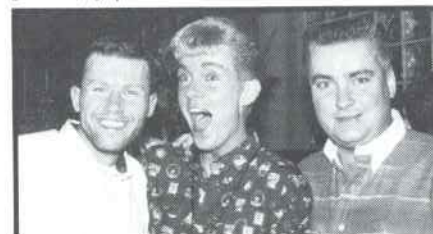
