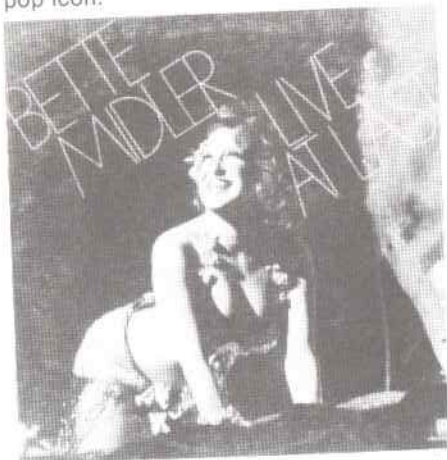
# EXPERIENCE THE DIVINE

Or, How Bette Midler Enlightened the World  
And Managed to Have Fun Doing It!

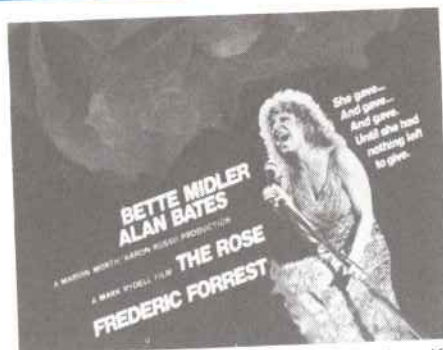

Like many gay men who came out in the late '70s, I was made aware—by the media, by friends and by a legion of female impersonators who pantomimed to her tunes—of an entertainer who began her artistic life in New York's Continental Baths in the early part of that decade, and in just a few short years had garnered a Grammy, a Tony and an Emmy for her work. The entertainer was, of course, Bette Midler.

Ernestine, a comedic female impersonator from Houston, introduced Bette's work to many gay Texans, including in his repertoire a remake of the big-band classic "In the Mood" from Bette's 1977 *Live at Last* album. In our minds, Ms. Midler was the one who'd made good—gone from entertaining "the boys" in the baths to becoming a major recording artist and a pop icon.



Imagine our delight, therefore, when, in 1979, our Miss Bette surprised the critics



with her portrayal of the tormented, self-destructive rock singer in *The Rose*, earning two Golden Globe awards, an Oscar nomination and her second Grammy for the soundtrack from the film in the process.

Despite these earlier successes, however, Bette dropped from sight shortly after her second film the next year, *Jinxed*, bombed at the box office, ending what many in Hollywood had believed would be a promising film career.

That's not to say that Ms. Midler wasn't still working during the lean years. She recorded her ninth album, *No Frills*, in 1982 and starred in an HBO special based on it. She undertook a national concert tour that same year and in 1985 released a comedy album, *Mud Will Be Flung Tonight!* None of these efforts proved to be popular or successful, however, and to her legion of fans, the magic was gone. Certainly, her earlier work was still adored by her enormous gay following, and *Live at Last* and the soundtrack from *The Rose* continued to launch a thousand drag careers, but Bette seemed to have lost her touch.

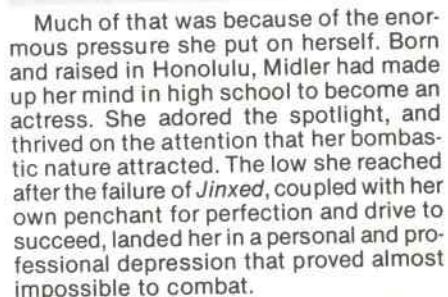

But then she met Martin Von Haselberg, whom she married. His love and support, and the subsequent birth of her daughter Sophie, renewed Bette's determination, and sparked the fire that has led to one of the most successful comebacks in the history of entertainment.

The Divine Miss M landed a multipicture contract with Touchstone Pictures, the "serious" side of the Disney film empire, and in the late 1980s embarked on a recharged film career that has landed her squarely among the elite few of America's biggest box office attractions.

Ms. Midler's first film for Disney was *Down and Out in Beverly Hills*, co-starring Richard Dreyfuss and Nick Nolte. In it, she plays a spoiled Beverly Hills housewife who is won over by the somewhat mystical

charms of a homeless man (Nolte). The film was a huge box office success and made Midler the nation's #1 female Hollywood draw.

She followed the success of that film by starring in *Ruthless People* with Danny DeVito, *Outrageous Fortune* with Shelly Long and *Big Business* with Lily Tomlin. While all three films were successful, many believed that *Big Business*, in which she played, along with Tomlin, the role of twins separated at birth, was by far the funniest. As a country bumpkin and a big-city executive, Midler proved, once again, that she was in top form, both as an actress and as an entertainer.



In 1988, Bette starred in *Beaches*, the first film produced by Midler's company, All Girl Productions. The movie, which was a huge success, details the friendship of two very different women during the course of their 30-year relationship. It not only reestablished Midler as a dramatic actress, it also gave her and her production company the clout to take on the "big boys" in the Hollywood power structure.

The original Atlantic soundtrack recording of *Beaches* was Midler's first album of music since *No Frills* in 1985, and it put her recording career back on track. Certified triple platinum (over three million sales), the album yielded the #1 single "Wind Beneath My Wings," which brought Midler her fourth Grammy, the 1989 Record of the Year.

After *Beaches*, Midler starred in two more features, *Stella*, a remake of the 1937 Barbara Stanwyck classic *Stella Dallas*, and *Scenes from a Mall* with Woody Allen. While not as successful as her other efforts, they still guaranteed that Midler is and will continue to be a formidable force in cinema. During this same period, she undertook another HBO special, *The Mondo Beyondo Show*, as well as the Disney animated feature *Oliver and Company*, in which Midler was featured as the voice of Georgette.

In the midst of this two-and-a-half year stretch of nonstop work, Midler somehow found time to record a new studio album, *Some People's Lives*. It was released in September of 1990, and quickly became a top ten album thanks, in part, to the #1 single "From a Distance." The song seemed to embody the feelings of separation experienced by Americans serving in the Middle East during the Persian Gulf war and their loved ones at home.

In 1991, Midler teamed with Mark Rydell, who had directed her in 1979 in *The Rose*, for her next motion picture, *For the Boys*. The film, which earned her a third Golden Globe award and a second Oscar nomination, spanned three decades, with Bette playing a USO performer who entertained the troops in World War II, the Korean War and Vietnam.

As if to make up for time lost earlier in her career, Midler continues to work. She recently starred in Disney Studio's *Hocus Pocus*, and will appear as Mama Rose in the upcoming CBS special *Gypsy*. And as if all of these achievements aren't enough, she has embarked on an ambitious national concert tour to coincide with the

release of *Experience the Divine—Bette Midler's Greatest Hits*, a tribute to her 20-year association with Atlantic Records.

Featured on the new album is the previously unreleased live version of the Johnny Mercer & Harold Arlen standard "One for My Baby (And One More for the Road)." Bette's moving performance of the song was recorded last year, during her Emmy Award-winning appearance as the final guest on *The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson*.



Bette is already on the road with her concert tour, having opened at Radio City Music Hall in New York City on September 14 for a three-week run, the longest for any solo artist in Radio City's history.

It's hard to determine exactly what it is about Bette Midler that has won her the affections and adoration of so many millions of fans. But it seems appropriate that she has included Texas on her tour—a state where, so many years ago, she became a cult hero to so many young men who were just embarking on their gay road.

Bette Midler performs in Dallas at the Reunion Arena tomorrow, December 4; in Austin on December 6 at the Frank Irwin Center; and in Houston on December 8 at the Summit.

# ON THE EDGE:

## USING GENE THERAPY TO TREAT HIV INFECTION



One of the most exciting and promising areas of AIDS research is the field of gene therapy. While gene therapy may sound like some futuristic fantasy or like something out of a Steven Spielberg film, in fact, there are currently over 30 protocols in the United States investigating the use of gene therapy. Not all these protocols involve AIDS. However, it is likely that general advances in the area of gene therapy will result in advances in the treatment of AIDS.

This is the first in a series of articles that will discuss the latest advances in AIDS research. The information that follows is fairly basic. For more detailed information, contact the agency in your community that coordinates local HIV drug protocols and they will direct you to the appropriate resources.

**What is the function of genes?** Speaking of Spielberg, if you saw the movie *Jurassic Park*, you're probably now familiar with one of the most basic tenets of genetics. In the movie, scientists succeed in recreating dinosaurs using the dinosaur blood stored in the body of a fossilized mosquito. Why was this possible? Because every cell of a dinosaur has the entire blueprint necessary for creating that dinosaur. So from a single dinosaur blood cell, the scientists were able to create a whole dinosaur. The cloning of living animals is still far in the future. Still, the basic premise that DNA contains all the instructions for the creation and maintenance of life is a fact.

Human cells are no different. Every human cell contains vast amounts of information and instructions involved in the reproduction and survival of human beings. These instructions are contained in what is referred to as deoxyribonucleic acid [DNA]. The DNA, in turn, is made up of thousands of genes that are arranged in the now familiar double strand helix.

Each gene controls a different function, and together these genes control the entire structure, function and reproduction of cells. DNA can be thought of as the master plan of living things.

**What is gene therapy?** Sometimes disease is caused by a mutation or alteration of genes. This mutation can cause the wrong instructions to be given and result in a certain disease or undesirable condition. Gene therapy is an emerging branch of molecular biology that attempts to treat conditions and diseases caused by such gene mutations by correcting these errors or intervening in some other fashion.

**What does this have to do with AIDS?** It is a common misconception that all genetic diseases are inherited. This is not the case. Certain cancers, for instance, start with genetic mutations that occur after birth. AIDS, in a very basic sense, also originates from a genetic mutation. HIV must enter the human cell and insert itself into the DNA in order to survive and multiply. Once HIV is integrated, the cell then becomes a factory for the production of virus and eventually the host cell dies.

**How does gene therapy hope to affect AIDS?** It is best to think of HIV as a part of a puzzle floating around in the body looking for a place to fit in. Normally, a cell gets infected when the virus fits itself neatly into the cell's DNA. This is what happens when we say a cell is "infected by HIV." The hope of genetic engineering, in simple terms, is to disrupt that fit. In other words, scientists hope to alter the process of virus integration or even alter the virus itself in order to interrupt the process of viral infection.

**What is the role of so-called "vectors"?** The first question, of course, is how do you insert these beneficial and altering genes where they are needed? Scientists have devised an answer that is both clever and



ironic. If a virus can insert itself into a cell and cause disease, why not use a virus to insert a beneficial gene and cause a cure or a disruption of the disease process? The virus used to insert the altering and beneficial gene is usually a disabled virus that cannot reproduce but that can still insert the necessary gene into the cell. This disabled virus is generally referred to as a "vector." Different types of vectors are currently being used to treat other diseases and it is hoped that these and newer vectors can be developed to treat AIDS.

#### How is gene therapy currently being used?

An example of how gene therapy is currently being employed is in the case of a disease called Severe Combined Immunodeficiency Disease [SCID]. SCID is very much like AIDS in that it causes severe immune suppression. However, it is different from AIDS in that it is caused not by a virus, but rather by the body's lack of a gene called adenosine deaminase [ADA]. In this case, scientists remove some of the patient's T-cells, correct them for the ADA gene deficiency and reinsert the corrected genes. The results, though far from conclusive, have been encouraging.

In the AIDS field, there are several ongoing investigations. Viagene, a San Diego-based biotechnology company, is developing a gene therapy that is intended to elicit an immune response similar to that expected from a gp160 therapeutic vaccine. The Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center in Seattle is working on a project to treat HIV patients suffering from lymphoma by performing bone marrow transplants and inserting gene-modified blood cells that are involved in fighting infections. Hybridon, a Massachusetts biotechnology company, is working on what is referred to as an "anti-sense" drug, that it is hoped will block the production of certain proteins, thereby blocking the replication of HIV. Other AIDS protocols involving gene therapy exist and new ones are expected soon.

**What are the potential problems?** Any time you deal with genes, of course, you are dealing with the basic mechanics of living things. There is the theoretical concern that altered genes might produce further complications or new diseases, or that the genes might further mutate once in the body and cause new problems. Also, because the vectors used are sometimes

disabled viruses, it is feared that these viruses themselves could become reactivated and cause further complications. So far, these concerns have not been a problem in the human studies.

Another potential problem concerns the nature of AIDS and HIV. Because HIV is so widely disseminated throughout the body when a person has AIDS, infiltrating not only the blood but the lymphatic system and tissues (in other words, HIV is practically everywhere in the body), it is feared that it will prove impossible to get altered material to all affected parts.

There is also a political issue. Many people believe that altering genes is inherently immoral; that, in a sense, scientists are playing God. This may turn out to be the greatest obstacle to the use of gene therapy, since it is a response filled with emotion and irrationality. In this respect, it is important to distinguish between manipulation of genes that will affect reproduction and manipulation of genes that function only after birth. What is being attempted with gene therapy is not the creation of a superhuman being or an altered race; it is more like the transplantation of an organ—simply, it is fixing something that needs fixing.

Finally, there is the issue of money. At present, the cost of gene therapy is exorbitant. Some scientists estimate that such treatment would cost up to \$200,000 per patient. But as with every new advance, it is hoped that over time costs will decrease and fall to more realistic levels.

After so many years of hearing about new treatments for AIDS, it is easy to be skeptical about any new approaches, especially when they seem to rely on such technical and intricate science. But the truth is that, even though AIDS research has progressed, in large part it has been a hit-or-miss process in which new compounds are tried and then discarded. This method has been successful in part, but not entirely. Gene therapy strikes at the very heart and mechanics of the disease, and we can hope that this molecular approach will provide, if not the answer, then at least a significant advance.

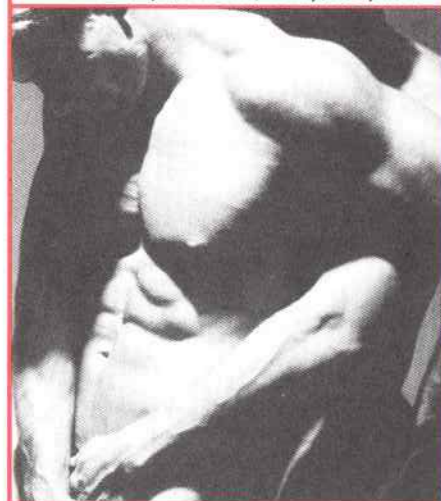

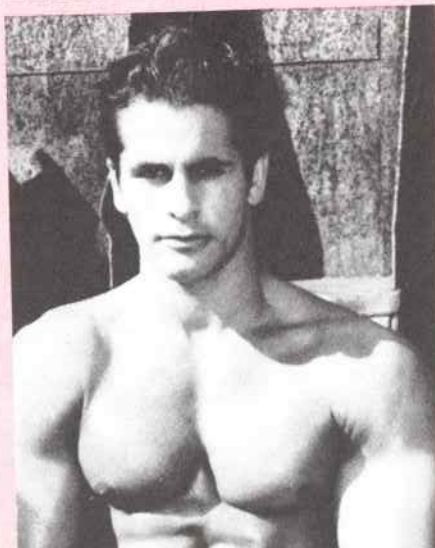

This is the story of Barney's Beanery and a hateful sign that affronted gays and lesbians for years. Like the weather, everybody talked about it, but nobody did anything. Morris Kight, an activist since the 1930s, tells this story.

"No one is quite sure when it began, but some believe it might have started as early as 1955. In those days West Hollywood, with its cheaper rents, easy access to public transportation and its laid-back way of life, was attractive to the many young gay men and women hoping to make it in the movies, show business or downtown offices. For them, Barney's Beanery at Santa Monica and Holloway was an affordable hangout. When a Los Angeles County deputy sheriff informed Barney Anthony,

# 'Faggots - Stay Out'

## An Early Victory for Gay Rights

'Barn, your place is picking up a reputation as a fag hangout, and you've got to get rid of them,' Barn whipped out a piece of cardboard, four inches wide and 36 inches long, and wrote in bold, black letters, 'FAGGOTS — STAY OUT!'

"Year after year the sign grew in notoriety. Out-of-town visitors made a point of seeing it. A photograph of it appeared in *Life* magazine and was incorporated into the world-famous sculpture "Faggots Stay Out," by Ed Kienholz. This sculpture can be seen today in the Musee des Arts in Brussels."

Here, the writer must interrupt Kight's story to point out that in those days, the gay community—what there was of it—had that "wounded look." Gays, not straights, were fond of saying, "Oh, you'll never get a bunch of queens to unite on anything." They were right. Yes, there were a few small organizations. In California there were One Inc., the Mattachine Society and the Society for Individual Rights [SIR] and in Dallas there was the Circle of Friends. But despite the heroic efforts of a few, without community support, these

organizations were mostly ineffective.

Then came Stonewall. The off-again-on-again riots over three days in June 1969 have been described as "the firecracker up the gay community's ass." Gay men and women began shedding that wounded look, and activism was born with the Gay Activists Alliance [GAA] of New York, the first organization to dare to use the word "gay" in its title.

Shortly after the 1969 riots, Morty Manford, later to become President of the GAA, went to Barney's Beanery with Morris Kight to see the sign for himself, and said, "...and you are willing to put up with that!" Cut by the criticism, Kight organized the Gay Liberation Front of Los Angeles. As a longtime community organizer, he knew the value of a specific target, and what could be better than that hateful sign? Kight continues...

"So, in January 1970, the Gay Liberation Front went to Barney's, and night after night we were there. We picketed, urging customers to go somewhere else. And we did a shop-in, ordering cups of coffee and sitting at our tables until they turned to ice.

"After Barney Anthony died, his business was bought by Irwin Held, who turned out to be absolutely intransigent. The media pressed around and often there were live simultaneous broadcasts from Barney's Beanery. Finally, an extremely tactful deputy sheriff was designated to be the contact between me and Held. He asked our final demands, and they were: 1) Give us the hated sign; 2) Agree not to discriminate against lesbians and gays in hiring or service; 3) Never allow the sign back again. Held agreed, we gave a rousing 'We won! We won! We won!' and off we marched, proudly bearing the sign that we had always equated with 'COLORED ONLY' in Southern public accommodations.

"It would be wonderful to say that was

the end of it, but oh, no! Irwin Held broke his word, and in 1984 the sign reappeared. The City of West Hollywood had just been voted in, and the City Council, in an early civil rights action, voted in a nondiscrimination ordinance on lesbian/gay issues. Off the city government went to once again remove the sign."

Today that sign is part of the Morris Kight/McCadden Place Collection. This collection, years in the building, has recently been given to the Gay and Lesbian Community Services Center. In time, the sign will hang in a locked and guarded display case. It is the most memorable artifact from our bad old days.

Morris adds, "Someone said it long ago: 'Eternal vigilance is the price of liberty.'"

What was your and [director] Marc Huet's original intent with this film?

Basically, what happened was that Marc was feeling really put out by the fact that there wasn't any honest and open depictions or conversations about sexuality with gay men, because the mainstream media was portraying gay men either as not having sex or being in monogamous, sanitized relationships, which was definitely one aspect of what was going on, but it wasn't the only aspect. It was like, "Shock! Horror!", gay men were having sex and no one was dealing with the issue.

We thought—it was actually Marc's idea—why not do an interview with people and talk about sexuality and bring it out in the open? There's no reason to hide it, everyone's doing it, so why not be able to talk about it? Therein lies the key...not closing off the dialogue, dealing with the issue. But everyone was so frightened.

That was basically the thrust of the project, because there wasn't anything out there like this. There are films that deal with the spread of HIV, films that deal with gay youth, but nothing about gay men talking about sex. Why does my libido get active and I feel like I have to have sex? What do I do when I have sex? What does sex mean to me? Does sex mean watching a porno video, does sex mean hugging and kissing someone, does sex mean being in the bottom of the toilet in an S&M club?

Sex means so many different things now, and we just felt that that issue needed to be addressed.

**What about [Sen.] Jesse Helms?**

Jesse Helms came up with denial of funding for the National Endowment for the Arts if anything was homoerotic or sadomasochistic. He was forcing his view...on what could be funded and what couldn't be funded. Gay people pay taxes just like the Christian Right pays taxes, and the NEA is a community-based organization that gives grants based on community standards, and certainly the gay community has different standards than the straight community.

It's gotten a little easier now. With Jane Alexander as the head there's this hope, this portent of hope, that it will get easier for artists working gay and lesbian themes. There's also been a tirade against gay and lesbian film festivals and imagery that has homoeroticism, as Jesse Helms perceives it. So that's where his role came in. Every movement needs a villain and he's ours,

# LAWRENCE HELMAN

## Co-Producer of 'Sex Is...'

**S**ex Is..., in the words of co-producer Lawrence Helman, is a "pornumentary," a bold, penetrating look at the meaning of sex and sexuality in the lives of 15 gay men. From church pastor to porn star, the cast offers deeply touching interviews and provocative personal stories. Combined with rare archival film and hot flashes of erotic footage, they provide a panoramic view of gay male sexuality from the repressive '50s through the hedonistic '70s to the cautionary '90s and the age of AIDS.

Sex Is... won the Audience Award for Best Gay Film at the 1993 Berlin International Film Festival, and has broken box office records at the Castro Theatre in San Francisco and the Cinema Village in New York.

To find out what it is that has made this film such a critical and financial success, TWT spoke with Helman, whose comments are almost as controversial as the film itself.

so thank God for him.

**So many people say that Sex Is... is a film that Jesse Helms should not see. Do you agree?**

Not at all. I don't think there's anything that anyone should not see. I think that things should be presented, they should be out there, and they should speak on their own merit—everyone should be able to make that decision to see whatever they want, and then whether or not they believe in that, that's another story. Saying "you can't..."—that's ridiculous.

**Were the porn clips used for creative impact or for the marketability of the film?**

We had many work-in-progress screenings, and one thing that kept coming up was "It's a good documentary, but..." Finally, we put some of the erotic material in and it seemed to be working.

The inclusion of the erotic material is not done to shock, it's done to bring attention; it's not done to titillate, it's done to illustrate. We felt that, not all but some, let's say many, gay men are very comfortable with erotic material. Again, it's a community standards thing. This film was not made with a straight audience in mind. This film was made by gay people for gay people, and if straight people want to come, fine. Usually it's the other way around—it's made by gay people for a straight audience. It's an inclusionary film. We're saying, "Come look at our lives,

come look at our stories"; we're not all together, you can't say "gay man" is going to cover everybody.

The erotic material brings a new dimension to the documentary format because a lot of people will be very comfortable with this imagery in the privacy of their own home. What we're trying to do is take the brown paper bag off of erotic imagery and show it in its context.

Why can't the inclusion of erotic imagery change? Sometimes I call this film a pornumentary, because people think that porn has its arena and documentary has its arena and never the twain shall meet. There's no reason for that, because they're both viable media.

We're just trying to get rid of the double standard. In 80 minutes of film, we have 2½ minutes of erotic imagery. In developing the film, we were told by a lab in Los Angeles that if it's male frontal nudity, they couldn't do it because that's pornographic, but if it's female frontal nudity they could do it. So where is this standard and this morality? It doesn't make any sense.

Sex Is... has already had a successful run in Austin, and opens this weekend at the Major Theatre in Dallas for a one-week engagement. The producers are also looking for a location in Houston. For screening information at the Major Theatre, call (214)821-3456.

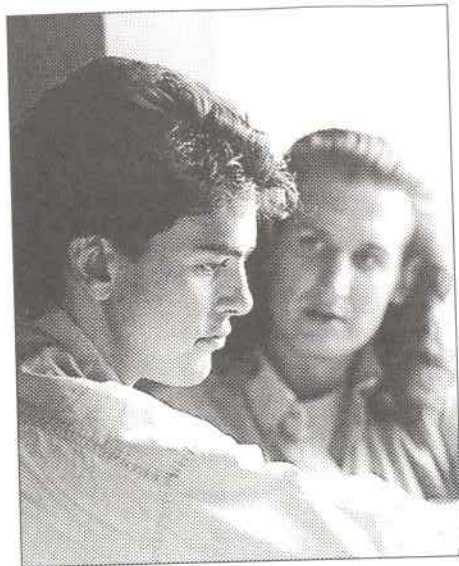

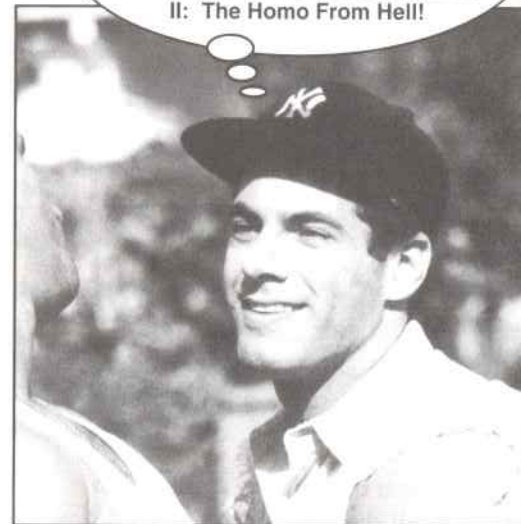

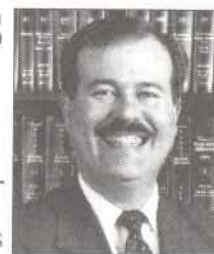

## True Christians Not Anti-Gay

Dear TWT:

The goal of most lesbian and gay activists is to solve the social and personal problems associated with homosexuality. From their own experience, they see that these problems arise primarily because our current homophobic society does not explain to developing young homosexual women and men the nature of their difference and the realities they face in growing to adulthood.

The problems activists want to solve are the things Christian fundamentalist and right-wing forces condemn homosexuals for: failure of relationships, lack of self-respect, spiritual disenfranchisement, sexual obsession, promiscuity, alcohol and drug abuse, and sexually transmitted disease.

Yet, ironically, these anti-gay forces block every attempt the lesbian and gay community makes to solve these very problems.

The anti-gay forces insist that the legitimization of homosexual relationships threatens the heterosexual family. In the name of Jesus, they call for homosexuals to be forced back into a secret, criminalized underculture, saying that this will help the problems that face modern American heterosexuals struggling to raise a family in difficult times.

The problems that beset the modern family are far more likely to be based in economic issues than in the civil rights struggles of homosexuals.

What can improving the lot of young gay men and lesbians possibly have to do with the problems of divorce, rape, child abuse, spouse-beating, alcoholism, illegitimacy, unwanted pregnancy and even abortion in the lives of heterosexuals?

Jesus said very little about sexual ethics. He said absolutely nothing about homosexuality. Jesus did speak about social relations and about economic issues.

He taught that the problems of society were resolved by love and forgiving—not hatred and blaming. Jesus specifically objected to strict literal interpretation of Biblical law (this is why He was executed at the urging of the conservative religious leaders of His day).

Jesus told his followers to love one another and sell all that they had and give to the poor (not to the Church). Where are the Christian fundamentalist leaders urging their flock to disavow materialism and lead lives of simplicity, dispossession and generosity? That is what Christianity is about, not the oppression of homosexuals.

## GAY GAMES V GOES TO EUROPE

Washington D.C. — The Federation of Gay Games has announced that Amsterdam, Netherlands has been chosen as the site for Gay Games V, to be held in 1998. The announcement was made at the Federation's annual meeting held in Washington D.C., November 12-14. This marks the first time in history the Gay Games will be held off the North American continent.

Bids to host Gay Game V were received from three cities: Amsterdam, Atlanta and Sydney. "All three bids were exceptional," stated co-presidents Susan Kennedy and Rick Peterson. "Everyone is excited to see the Gay Games enhance its international status by being held off the North American continent for the first time. ## DALLAS, HOUSTON RADIO STATIONS TO AIR DOCUMENTARY ON AIDS

*'Give Me Those Moments' Features  
Interviews with Parents of Men  
Lost to Disease.*

TEXAS — Joe Logan of the *Philadelphia Inquirer* calls it "a stirring documentary," Brian Caffall of the *Philadelphia Gay News* found it to be "an extremely moving account of love, loss and understanding;" and singer/songwriter Margie Adam says, "the candor of the parents is really breathtaking at times."

They, and a lot of other people, are talking about *Give Me Those Moments: Parents Remember Their Gay Sons Who Died of AIDS*, a new half-hour documentary from Bert Wylen, producer of the award-winning *Unfriendly Fire: Lesbians and Gays in the Military*. Broadcast originally in Philadelphia after the local AIDS Walk on October 17, the radio broadcast brought a flood of compassionate response from listeners throughout the area. At least two stations in Texas will be broadcasting the documentary this month.

KPFT-FM 90 in Houston is airing the program during this evening's [Friday, December 3] broadcast of *Gay and Lesbian Voices*, a weekly two-hour program of interest to the local gay community, beginning at 6 p.m. KNON-FM 89.3 in Dallas will run the documentary during the December 26 edition of *Lambda Weekly*, North Texas' only radio show designed with gay and lesbian listeners in mind. *Lambda Weekly* begins at 2:30 p.m.

KNON Program Director Steve Walters, said the documentary fits his station's needs perfectly.

"I'm always looking for quality programming for our Dallas/Fort Worth listening audience. *Moments* is a top notch documentary, and I'm proud to include it in our time slot."

In the half-hour presentation, listeners will be given the chance to identify, through a series of moving interviews, with parents who have lost their gay sons to AIDS. The parents recall what it was like finding out that their sons were gay and had AIDS, how they coped with the disease, what some of them do now as AIDS activists to



carry on the memories of their beloved deceased and how they deal with their ongoing grief.

## AIDS EQUITY LEAGUE INVESTIGATING CASE OF POSSIBLE HIV BIAS

*Houstonian Says She Was Given  
Test Without Her Consent,  
Turned Away by Doctor.*

HOUSTON — A young woman who was misdiagnosed as HIV-positive and was then refused further treatment by her physician is apparently the latest case of AIDS-related discrimination in the Houston area.

In a statement she gave to the AIDS Equity League on November 3, Theresa Lewing, who is pregnant, said she visited the office of Dr. Walter F. Moreano for a checkup in early October, at which time the physician gave her an HIV test, without her consent. She was later informed that she had tested positive for HIV, was told that Moreano would provide her with no further treatment and was referred to Lyndon B. Johnson General Hospital.

Several weeks later, Lewing learned that Moreano had apparently misread the results of her lab tests and that she is, in fact, HIV-negative.

During a call he placed to Moreano's office on November 3, AEL Executive Director Lane Lewis was told, "This hospital [sic] does not deliver any HIV babies.... That is one of the rules, that we don't treat HIV mothers...She's high risk...if she comes back positive, we automatically refer to LBJ."

In a certified letter dated November 12, Lewis asked Moreano to provide AEL with information relating to his office's policy on treating HIV patients, including HIV testing policy, pre- and post-test counsel-

ing and referral policy for those with HIV.

When Moreano's office failed to respond to the League's request, Lewis followed up with a call to the physician's office and was told that the letter in question had not been received. Last Monday, Lewis faxed a copy of the letter to Moreano's office, and during a phone call later placed to the AEL office, a member of Moreano's staff insisted that the doctor had never treated HIV-positive people and therefore had no policy on dealing with such patients.

Phone calls placed by TWT NEWS to Moreano's office Tuesday were not returned.

Lewis said AEL has referred Theresa Lewing to legal counsel, provided her with appropriate medical referrals and has asked the United States Attorney General's office to look into her case.

## DALLAS-AREA ACTOR SHARES PROCEEDS FROM PERFORMANCES WITH AIDS CHARITIES

*Donations Enable PWAs to  
Enjoy Thanksgiving Holiday.*

DALLAS — Thanksgiving is traditionally a time to spend with family and loved ones, giving thanks for one's blessings, and a table laden with delicious holiday foods has traditionally been a central part of the celebration. But for people with HIV infection or AIDS—many of whom are separated from their families and friends during the holidays—loved ones are not the only thing that may be absent from the festivities. With so much of their limited incomes committed to medical care and basic living needs, even the Thanksgiving turkey may not be on the table for many PWAs.

One Dallas-area actor recognized this rather gloomy scenario and decided to do something about it. Mark Allen Branson, who has been performing his one-man show throughout Dallas to raise funds for the Dallas County Deaf Caucus, says he realized that too many people affected by AIDS could not be certain of a traditional Thanksgiving feast, and allocated monies raised from the show for the residents at AIDS Services of Dallas. That facility provides housing for people living with AIDS who are also facing monetary problems.

Formed as an operating entity of the PWA Coalition of Dallas, Inc., ASD has offered compassionate support to people regardless of race, gender and sexual orientation since 1987 by providing HIV-infected men, women and children with low-cost or no-cost, medically-supported housing. Because of the residence status of so many of its clients, meals become a major source of socialization. Branson's recent gift of proceeds from his shows to ASD meant that those residents would be able to enjoy the holiday in a traditional way.

For now, Branson plans to continue raising funds and awareness through his performances for ASD, the American Foundation for AIDS Research [AmFAR] and other AIDS service organizations throughout Texas. As Branson states, "It just needs to be done."

## AIDS OUTREACH CENTER SEES BIG JUMP IN DEMAND FOR ITS SERVICES

*Women, Minorities Represent  
Larger Share of Case Load  
For Tarrant County Agency.*

FORT WORTH — Promoting the maintenance of optimum physical, emotional and spiritual health; preventing transmission of HIV; providing comprehensive, cost-effective volunteer support to minimize the financial impact of the epidemic; assisting other area educators and service providers to assure effective services; providing assistance in planning for current and future needs regarding AIDS; and eliminating discrimination surrounding AIDS.

If these functions seem comprehensive,

and if they seem overwhelming, imagine being solely responsible for executing them. As the primary organization in Tarrant County providing and coordinating services to men, women and children affected by the HIV/AIDS epidemic, that is exactly what Fort Worth's AIDS Outreach Center does.

And, based on the latest figures recently released in AOC's annual report, the residents of Tarrant County are fortunate that the organization does its work well. In 1993, the Center served an astounding 1,463 persons with HIV and AIDS—a 31% increase over 1992. In addition, 1,880 family members and loved ones of persons infected with HIV were served—a 67% increase over last year. Finally, 15,564 people, representing the general public, were reached through AOC's Information Line and community education seminars—an 83% increase over last year.

In all, there was a 76% increase in total persons served through the agency over 1992, and according to Executive Director Thomas Bruner, those numbers are significant.

"By my standard, a 76% increase in a single year far exceeds all our projections for growth. While pleased with our ability to reach men, women and children touched by this epidemic, we are alarmed by the sheer volume of the need these numbers represent. Clearly, the AIDS epidemic is far from over in our community. In fact, it's only getting bigger, and so is the demand for our services."

The numbers aren't the only thing that is changing in Tarrant County's battle against the disease—so too is the diversity of AOC's client base. Among the agency's 723 formally registered clients with HIV or AIDS, women, African-Americans, Hispanics and heterosexuals represent a larger percentage of the totals. Heterosexuals make up 39% of the agency's case load—a 3% increase over last year. Women represent 17% of the clients (a 3% increase), African-Americans 28% (a 4% increase) and Hispanics 9% (a 2% increase).

"Everything we hear about the gradual spread of HIV and AIDS into different communities is true," says Sister Mary Fulbright, AOC Board President. "That slow but steady increase can be seen in the faces of our clients. They are getting progressively darker, more female and less gay."

What is even more impressive about the

work of the AIDS Outreach Center is the fact that so much of it is performed by a volunteer staff. In total, 725 different agency volunteers gave 29,340 hours of service at an estimated value of \$440,694. These volunteers staffed the Information Line and the Nutrition Center; provided counseling and support groups to affected persons; offered legal advice and housing assistance; and offered both emotional and physical assistance directly to those with the disease.

## TEXAS COUNTY DENIES TAX BREAK TO APPLE COMPUTER

*Firm's Domestic Partnership Policy  
Behind 3-2 Vote.*

TEXAS — A vote by the Williamson County Board of Commissioners not to grant tax breaks to a national computer maker because of its domestic partnership policy has endangered the central Texas county's chances of being the site of a new Apple USA manufacturing plant that would create hundreds of jobs.

The computer firm was planning to build an \$80 million facility that would have brought an estimated 700 jobs to Williamson County. Upset with Apple's policy that offers domestic partnership benefits to its gay and lesbian employees, however, a majority of commissioners voted to deny the company a tax abatement for the new plant.

Apple officials reiterated their support for the company's year-old policy. "It is unlikely that we will move to Williamson County unless the tax abatements are granted," said Apple spokesperson Lisa Byrne. "We do not intend to change our policy in order to obtain the tax break."

In a statement released Tuesday, NGLTF Executive Director Peri Jude Radecic denounced the Board of Commissioners' vote. "[Their] decision is appalling," Radecic said. "This is the first time we have heard of a government entity using its power to punish a company for treating its gay and lesbian employees fairly."

"As more and more companies adopt these policies motivated by fairness, the Commissioners in Williamson County will learn very quickly that bigotry is very unprofitable."

A memorial service will be held Saturday, December 4th at 2:00 pm on the Santa Fe side of JR's Bar and Grill.



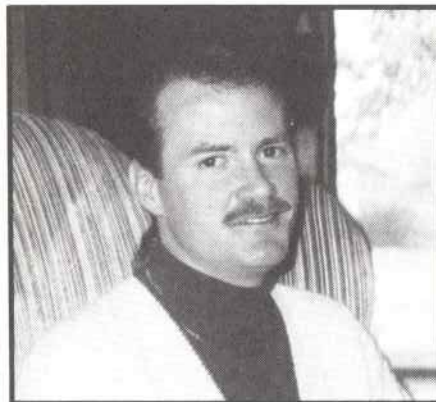

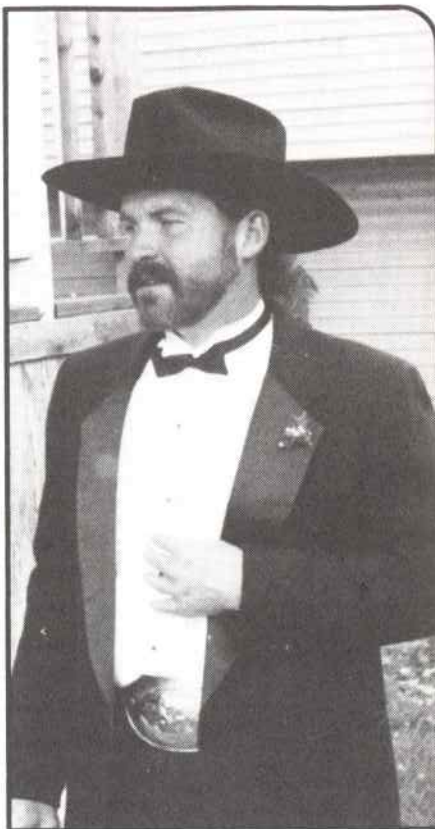

William Earl Hess, born November 15, 1955, died suddenly on July 17, 1993 in Sacramento, California where he had lived for several years. He could also tear up the dance floor, whirling around with tambourine and whistle, and had been a popular deejay at Santa Fe Junction.

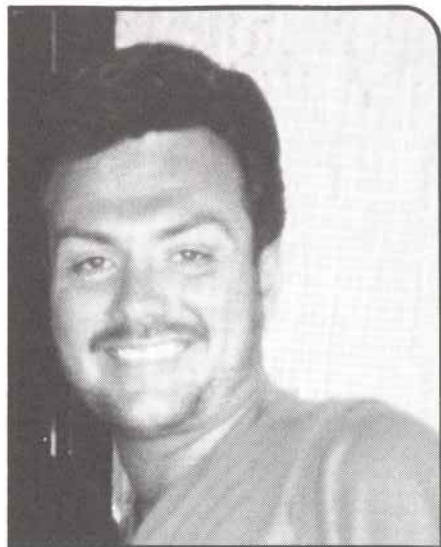
He was a joyful and grateful member of Metropolitan Community Church in Dallas.

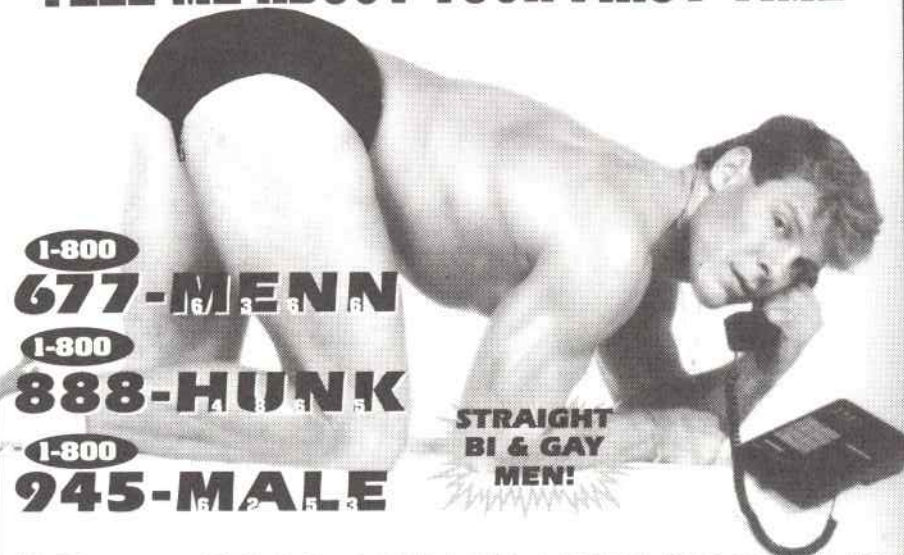

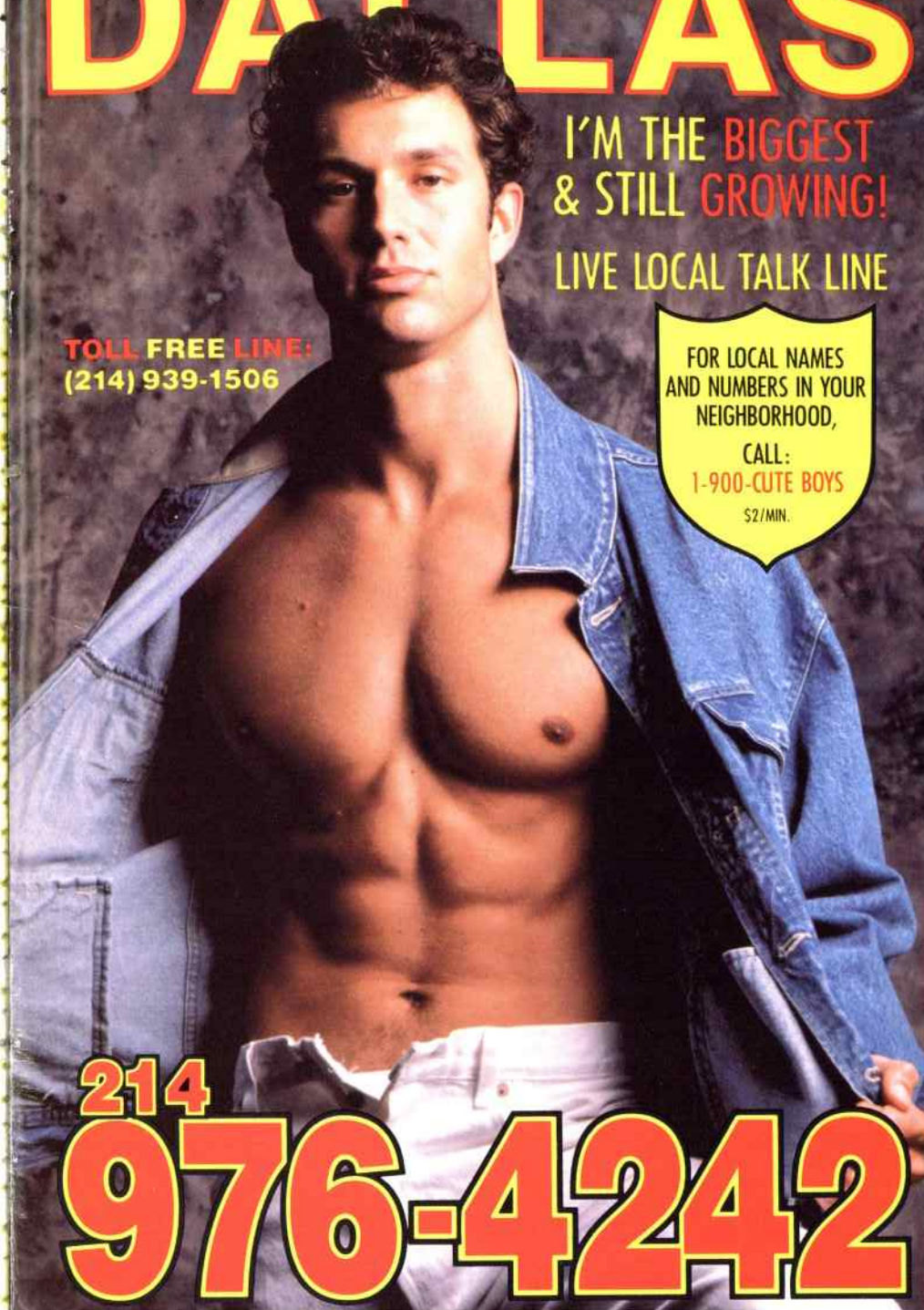

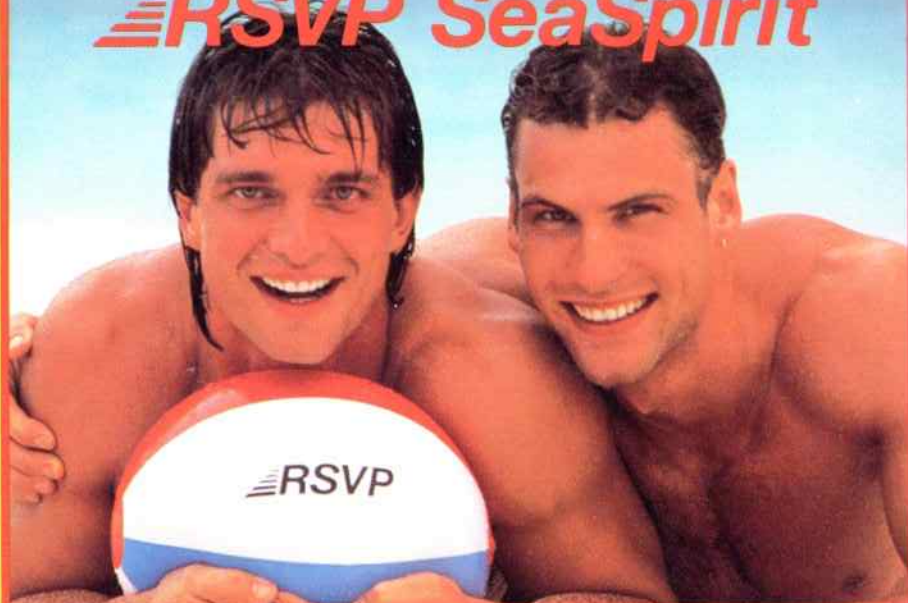
