ACCESSING THE PUBLIC HEALTH CARE SYSTEM IN HARRIS COUNTY

Gaining access to and using the public health care system in one's city or county need not be intimidating or stressful. In this article, I will discuss the Harris County [Houston] Hospital District and the services it offers to those with HIV. Future **MEDICAL UPDATE** articles will deal with public health services in Dallas and other Texas cities.

In choosing the Harris County Hospital District and the Thomas Street Clinic, a patient can receive quality medical care, but without some of the niceties of the private health care system. Some patients with limited health insurance benefits (e.g., Medicare) may utilize HCHD for routine care and medications, but continue to use the private health care system for in-patient hospital services. Understanding how to access and use the system can reduce your stress and ensure proper care.

The Harris County Hospital District [HCHD] is a tax-supported system that provides hospital and health services to qualified indigent persons as well patients who have the ability to pay and are residents of Harris County. HCHD is composed of Ben Taub and LBJ hospitals, nine community health centers and a dental clinic. Doctors are supplied by the Baylor College of Medicine and the University of Texas Medical Branch. The dentists are with the University of Texas Dental Branch or from a private contract service. The nurses, social workers, pharmacists, laboratory staff and other support personnel are employees of Harris County. Numerous professional students receive well-supervised training in the system.

The designated health clinic for persons with HIV infection is the Thomas Street Clinic, (713)546-5700. Located at 2015 Thomas Street, the clinic was originally the home of the Southern Pacific Railroad Hospital. The building has also housed the M.D. Anderson Hospital's Rehabilitation Unit and was acquired by Harris County in

a land swap with M.D. Anderson. It has undergone numerous (and seemingly endless) renovations in an effort to meet the needs of its current patients.

Like all HCHD community health centers, Thomas Street Clinic is a full-service facility. Pharmacy, laboratory, X-ray, cen-

tral supply, nutritional counseling and social work services compliment the medical care. Various community HIV/AIDS service providers are housed in the building to provide easier access to community resources.

Thomas Street Clinic has a unique volunteer program sponsored by the PWA Coalition of Houston that provides emotional support to patients, orients new patients to the facility, provides escort service, serves noon meals and plans a monthly special event. The volunteers are strong patient advocates, and most are themselves Thomas Street patients. Other volunteers are family members or concerned members of the community. This expanding program is always eager for fresh ideas and new volunteers. [For more information, call (713)546-5737.]

The first step in receiving services from the Harris County Hospital District is to obtain an eligibility card. Generally referred to as a "gold card," (because of the color of the plastic used), the card has a unique identification number, the bearer's name and birthdate, the health clinic and hos-

pital to which the client is assigned, his or her pay code and an expiration date. A \$1 fee is assessed for processing each eligibility card. The County requires each patient to pay toward his or her care. Current minimum payments are \$5 per doctor's visit, \$2 per prescription and \$2 per Central Supply line-item (e.g. dressings, IV supplies).

There are four eligibility registration centers open from 8 a.m.-3 p.m. Monday through Friday. Applicants are taken on a first-come, first serve basis. Waiting times vary, but it is best to be prepared by bringing a book or radio headset, as well as a pillow if you have trouble with hard plastic chairs. The centers are located at 7100 North Loop East (713)671-0334, 5959 Long Drive (713) 643-3691, 1029 Strawberry (713) 472-2367 and the Baytown Health Center, 1602 Garth Road (713)427-6757. Individual health centers, including Thomas Street Clinic, have eligibility workers available by appointment only. To make an appointment with the eligibility worker at Thomas Street, call (713)546-5720.

All applicants will be required to prove their residency, income and identity. You will also need proof of any dependents. If you have Medicare, Medicaid or health insurance, or are in an alien amnesty program, those identification cards will also be needed.

Identification records can include: Social Security cards, school records, picture identification cards, driver's license, birth certificate (except for married women), Medicare cards, current Medicaid cards, Society Security Award letter or check, alien registration cards, amnesty card or residence visas. Other documents may be accepted. Applications for infants can include a Popras form, hospital armband or an infant birth fact record.

Proof of residency must be dated within the last 60 days. Records can include business mail or billing statements with the applicant's name and address. Non-business or junk mail is not accepted. Other items accepted include school records, sworn HCHD documents from recognized social service agencies, state or federal agency certification documents (e.g., food stamps or Medicaid), a sworn HCHD document signed by landlord or property manager, or a mortgage payment coupon.

Applicants are required to prove all income in the last 30 days. If employed, provide the last four paycheck stubs showing

the date, name, employer and gross earnings. If stubs aren't available, the employer can sign a sworn HCHD wage verification form. If you are not working, your former employer may be asked to complete a sworn HCHD document indicating the last date you worked. If you are being supported by someone, that person must sign a sworn HCHD document that indicates their source of income, telephone number and address. Bank statements should be provided if you are living off of savings. A doctor's statement (on physician's letterhead) indicating the length of disability if unemployed may be requested. Divorce decrees showing the amount of child support may be needed. Self-employed persons will need to provide copies of their income tax returns or sworn statements from their bookkeeper. Social Security Awards letters indicating retirement, disability or supplemental income are acceptable. Medicare patients are required by federal law to present proof of assets and third-party insurance coverage.

If you have dependents, bring proof such as a birth certificate, last year's IRS 1040 form, a Social Security Award letter with the dependent's names, insurance or school documents, U.S. immigration forms, divorce decree or other document showing the parent-child relationship.

When possible, it is wise to bring two items in every category. If you have the correct documentation, an eligibility card will be issued on the spot. Making multiple trips to complete the application is time-consuming and frustrating. Call the appropriate office if you have any questions about the documents needed rather than wasting a trip. A friend or family member may be allowed to apply for you if you are unable to go to the office.

Now that you have survived the application process, you will be given a phone number to schedule an appointment. Have your "gold card" ready when you call. A limited number of appointment slots are available each day. The usual waiting time for new admissions is one to two weeks.



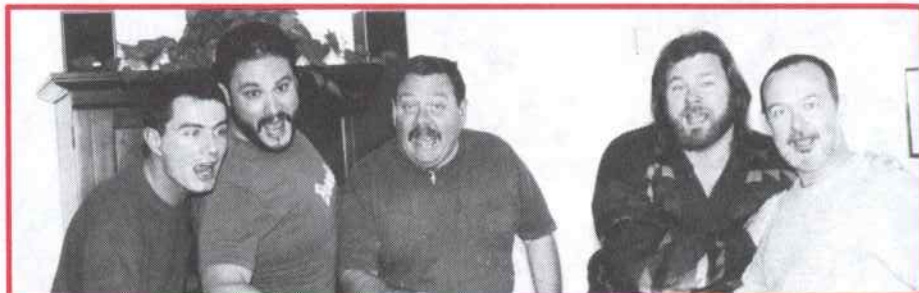

HOUSTON'S QUINTESSENCE

"Doing It Our Way"



Jim Winslett, Jaime Ballesteros, Jerry Reitz, Bob McCauley and Beau Cain are Houston's hottest, Quintessence.

The five voices began humming, slowly weaving Mozart's "Ave Verum Corpus" into the air at a small restaurant at the southeastern edge of Houston. Finishing that piece, three of them sang Gershwin's familiar torch song "Someone to Watch Over Me." After polite applause and some bemused glances from other restaurant patrons, the quintet then launched into a spirited rendition of the Marvelettes' "Please Mr. Postman." The "audience" applauded again, despite the fact that the five *men* sang "I hope that *he* turns out to be someone to watch over me—he may not be the man some *guys* think of as handsome." "I've been waiting a long, long time, since I heard from that *man* of mine...."

The five giving the impromptu concert were Quintessence, gay men who are reclaiming the music of their youths, which span over 40 years.

"Early in 1990, when we first met, Jaime [Ballesteros, the group's music director] and I almost immediately started kicking around the idea of getting a small ensemble together," Beau Cain recalls. They and Jim Winslett chose fellow Singer Jeff Cothran as bass. Cothran, who was ill, became concerned that his health might not hold up and urged the three to pick a replacement. Shortly thereafter, Winslett's companion, Jerry Reitz, became the

group's bass. Bob McCauley joined the group in February of this year, replacing a member who had moved to Dallas.

Doo-wop as a musical style had its commercial heyday during the mid-'50s and early '60s. It was characterized by a strong rhythmic beat and the use of nonsense syllables (like "doo-wop" and "sha-na-na"), and the sound created could be likened to that of a small orchestra in which the singers' voices were substituted for musical instruments. Doo-wop is thus distinct from the sentimental harmonies of barbershop, another primarily male musical form with which it is sometimes confused.

But Quintessence has broadened the definition to include music from a wide range of styles spanning several decades.

"You'll find 'doo-wopable' songs from the '40s on," Ballesteros, explains. "For example, Huey Lewis had a recent one, 'It's All Right,' and ten years ago Billy Joel had 'For the Longest Time.' Almost any Beach Boys song is 'doo-wopable.'"

Quintessence has played venues ranging from last June's Lesbian/Gay Pride Week rally in Spotts Park, to a recent EPAH fund-raiser at Houston's elegant Heritage Club to the National Leather Association's International Conference in October. The group generally opens with "Making Our Dreams Come True," the theme from *Laverne & Shirley*, which has proven to be

a big crowd-pleaser and has, in effect, become a signature tune.

The members of Quintessence bring a diverse range of backgrounds and musical experience to their performances. Cain, a baritone, grew up in an artistic, musical family, and studied and taught dance for many years. He was conductor of the Montrose Singers for four years, and an associate conductor of the Lone Star Symphonic Band for a year.

Ballesteros, a tenor and the group's music director, has degrees in music and voice. He was president of the Montrose Singers, and has played piano at benefits like "Soiree Aubergine" and "That's What Friends Are For!"

"I got introduced to singing chorally at MCCR," says Winslett, who attends Houston's Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection. Winslett, a treble whose gifted voice reaches over four octaves, sings alto with the church choir, and recently completed a year-long stint as director of Jubilation, a smaller "outreach" group of the main MCCR chorus in which he sings tenor.

"I just enjoy singing," says Reitz, who adds his beautiful bass to Quintessence's lineup. "I actually became a member of this group because of Jim's introduction of me to the Montrose Singers, and through Jeff Cothran, who was a good friend of mine for many years." Reitz sings with both Jubilation and the MCCR choir, and plays English handbells.

McCauley, a tenor, has degrees in musical composition from Rice University and the New England Conservatory, and a country song he wrote was published in Austin earlier this year. His master's thesis, an orchestral piece, won the Creative Artists Program Award for Music Composition from the Cultural Arts Council of Houston.

"There's an ongoing process here... we realize that, when you've only got five human voices, you have limitations in the coloring that you can get," Cain says. "Nothing's going to kill a concert faster than having everything sound the same... So you start mixing and matching, and you get a different sound."

So Ballesteros, Cain and McCauley as a trio have begun mining the rich field of torch songs, and as such have baptised themselves "Exquisite Torchers."

Though they recently sang at a fundraiser for a church in southwest Houston,

and are not averse to performing for non-gay audiences, the five are firm about not tailoring their performances to hide their sexuality. This is reflected in the group's mission statement, which includes the goals of inspiring, enlightening and entertaining audiences through excellence in the performance arts.

"We don't pander to heterosexual tastes," Cain observes, "and this goes right back to the *Laverne & Shirley* theme—we are making our dreams come true. It would have been wonderful if we could have grown up being accepted for just what we were, and knowing that people—our parents, our school chums, our teachers and everybody—could have just...given us a normal life, instead of making us feel like we had something to hide. We are making our dreams come true."

Through their love of singing and their affection for one another, the five have come to value their time together.

"We get together on Saturdays, and we've become like a family together," Reitz says. "We started off just for the fun of it, and it is fun; but we think we have a message, we have a gift to share, and why not have fun with it?"

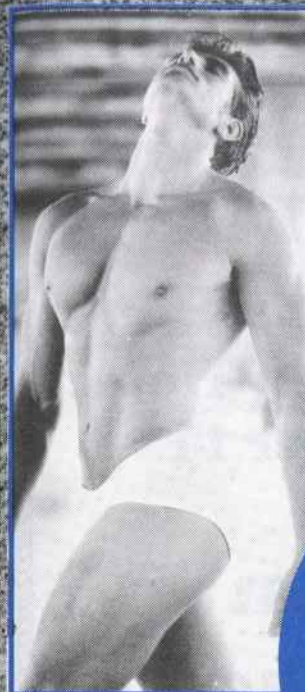
"We approach problems very much from the family model, not from the 'choir' model or a business model," Ballesteros adds. "When one or another of us needed to direct attention to some other part of his life, we didn't say, 'Get out of here' or 'Come back when you're better' or anything like that."

"It's just like you'd do in a family; if your mate, your brother or your sister is going through a tough time, you go through it with them. If it meant that we had to not take some gigs, then that's what we'd do."

Now in their second year, Quintessence marks Gay/Lesbian Pride Week, normally held in late June, as their anniversary. They recently became members of GALA Choruses, the national association of gay and lesbian choral groups, and have started attracting notice outside the state. They are studying the possibility of reaching a wider audience through recording and touring, and to that end, they are considering producing a concert and performing in selected major events outside of Houston and Texas in 1994.

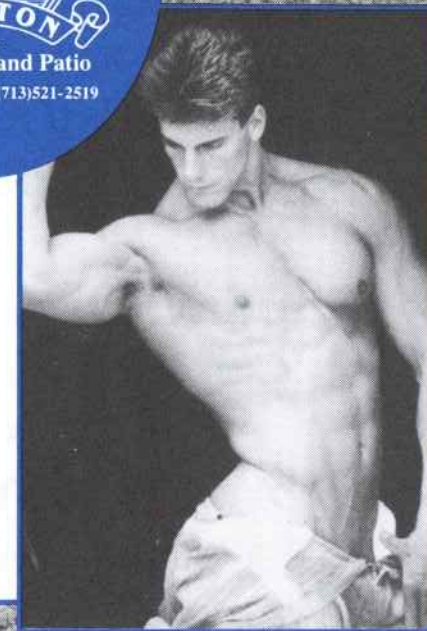

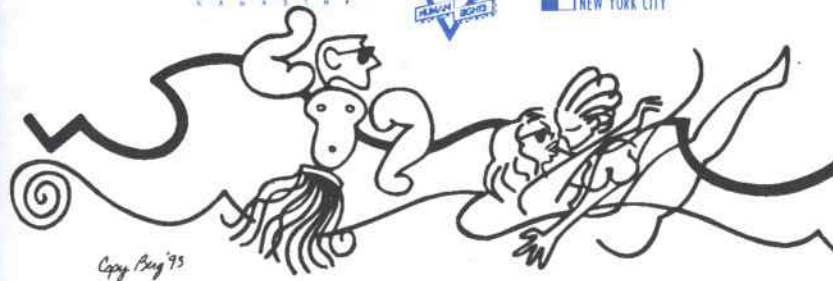

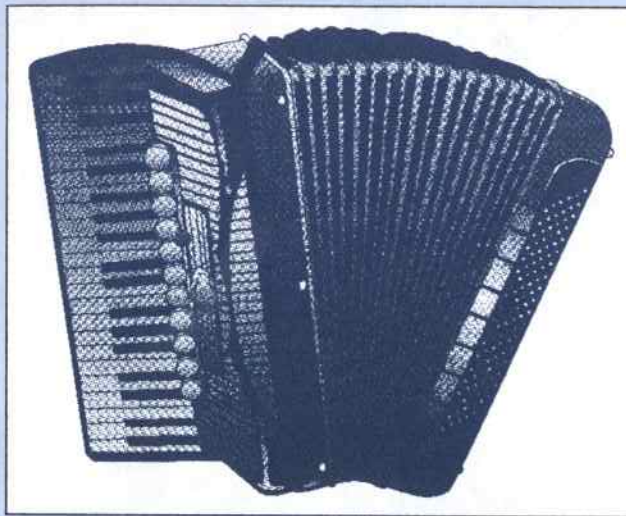

CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY

How to Tell If Someone You Know Has A Problem with Substance Abuse

Many people mistakenly believe you cannot label someone alcoholic, that this determination must be made by the individual with the problem. However, that person is most often the last to admit that he or she even has a problem. So it may be up to you to observe the signs and draw conclusions from them, especially if you happen to be attracted to alcoholic or drug-dependent people and don't wish to repeat the patterns of past relationships.

Below I have listed some of the observations that will tend to confirm alcoholism or drug addiction in a person who exhibits eight or more of them:

- 1.) Is this person drinking or using drugs more now than in the past?
- 2.) Do you fear physical or verbal abuse when (s)he is drinking or drugging?
- 3.) Has (s)he ever forgotten things or denied things happened while under the influence? These are called blackouts, and can range in severity from just missing bits and pieces of the previous evening to having no memory of what happened over several days' time.
- 4.) Do you become concerned over the person's quantity of drinking or drugging?
- 5.) Does (s)he refuse to discuss drinking and drugging, or even refuse to consider the possibility that a problem exists?
- 6.) Has (s)he made repeated promises to stop or control his or her drinking or drugging, and broken every one of them?

7.) Has (s)he ever lied about the amount of consumption or tried to hide it from you?

8.) Do you find yourself making excuses to family or friends for his or her behavior?

9.) Have you ever felt the need to lie about this person's drinking or drug use to cover up for him or her?

10.) Are most of this person's friends drinking or drugging buddies?

11.) Is (s)he always making excuses and trying to justify why he or she has to drink or do drugs?

12.) Do you experience guilt and sometimes feel that you have caused this person's behavior?

13.) Are nearly all your holidays and special occasions ruined because of his or her drinking or drug use?

14.) Do you feel uptight and afraid you'll say the wrong thing when you are around this person?

15.) Have you ever "protected" this individual by calling a boss or telling others that he or she is ill?

16.) Does (s)he think that because (s)he only drinks beer or wine, or only does "harmless" drugs, that there is no problem?

17.) Is this person's personality visibly changed when drinking or doing drugs?

18.) Does (s)he stay away from social functions when (s)he finds out that no alcohol will be served?

19.) Can this person only go to restaurants where liquor is served?

20.) Does this person ever drive while intoxicated?

21.) Has (s)he ever received one or more DWIs?

It is important to note that if you are involved with someone who is chemically dependent, you may become ill yourself.

22.) Has this person's behavior frightened you when (s)he is drinking or doing drugs?

23.) Has anyone else ever expressed concern over this individual's drinking or drugging behavior?

24.) Does (s)he suffer a lot of guilt and remorse after a big drinking or drugging episode?

25.) Does (s)he seem to have low self-worth or self-esteem?

26.) Have you ever found this person's "stash" when (s)he has been trying to hide it?

27.) Does this person seem to have financial problems directly related to drinking or drug use?

28.) Does (s)he look forward to events devoted to or associated with drinking or using drugs?

It's important to note that if you are involved with someone who is chemically dependent, you may become ill yourself. There is a term for the family members of chemical abusers—co-dependents.

If you feel you are suffering either from chemical dependency or from the effects of a chemically-dependent person's behavior, consult a qualified professional, who should be happy to discuss all obsessive-compulsive behaviors including alcoholism, drug addictions, relationships, co-dependency, overeating, overspending, sex and anything else you feel might be out of control in your life.

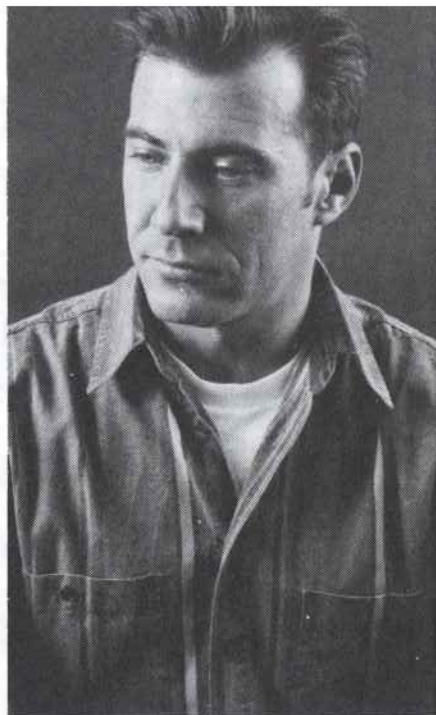
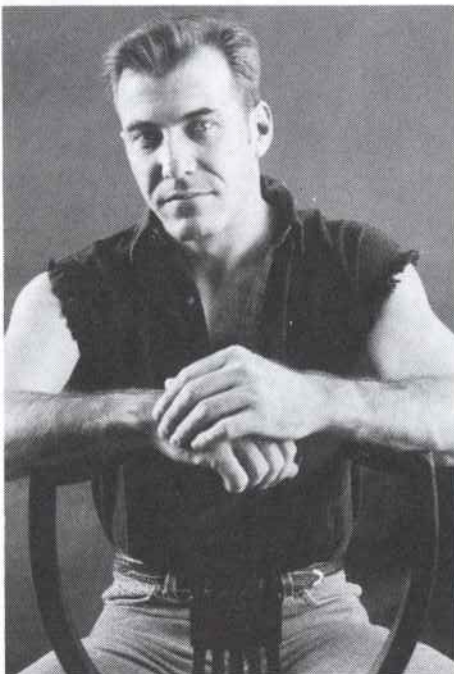

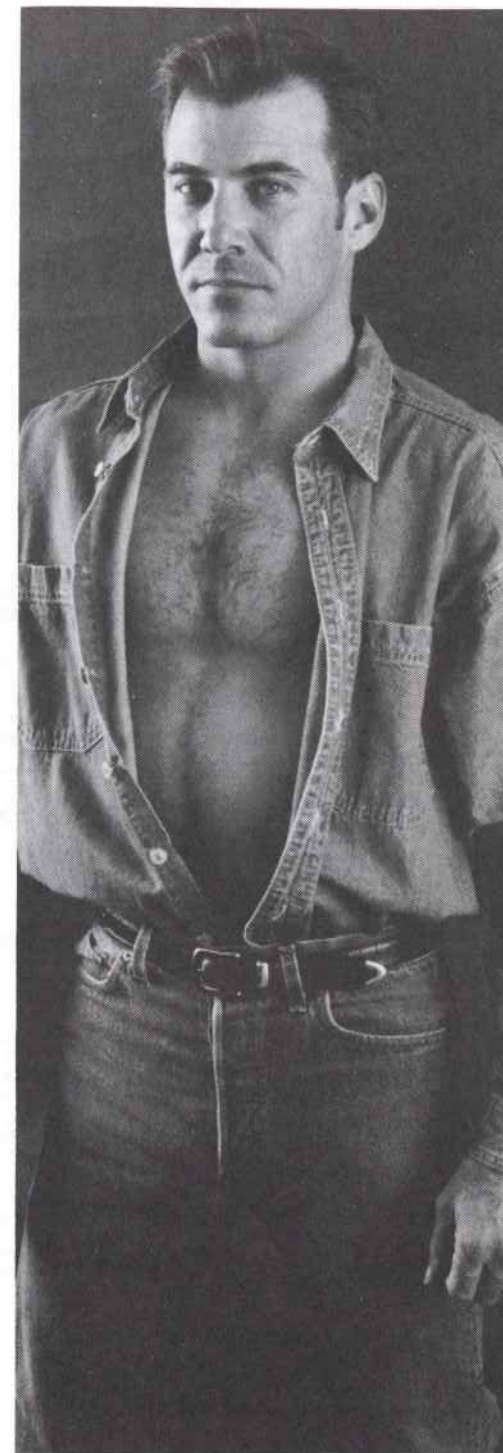


BILL PASTERNAKI

Why He Resigned from The Agora

Dear TWT:

When I first put forth the name "Agora" for this group, I anticipated a strong organization that would act as a gay think tank, where the members would write and discuss various positions to take on issues of social justice and cultural integrity for the Houston gay/lesbian community. I felt that people would think well of a group that thought well of itself, and that good public relations for gay and lesbian people would accrue from the respect The Agora would gain.

Since last February, I've been suggesting ideals and goals for the group: commitments to quality and meaning, to foresight and responsibility, to extension to as many different communities as possible. I've also stressed a vigorous pragmatism in response to The Agora's limited resources. Eduardo Castro and I produced a welcome brochure, three press releases and three newsletters that are written, edited and designed well. We tried to make these things the best quality we could, not merely adequate. The vision I had for The Agora could have been boiled down to two words: brains and guts.

No other vision for The Agora has been put forth except for a vague notion reduced from one-half of the mission statement: "positive portrayals." As far as I can see, "positive portrayals" has come to mean showcasing people who can pass for straight, regular guys and gals; or showing people who own all the accouterments of the paradigmatic heterosexual lifestyle.

The other half of the mission statement calls for education and accurate information about gays and lesbians. But when I bring this up before the leadership or push for any attention to specifically gay cultural elements, then I'm faced with glazed-over eyes and pursed little mouths. I understand this attitude; it's called internalized homophobia....



I'm ashamed of what The Agora is right now: mediocre. I don't want my name and reputation connected to anything that is mediocre. I'm ashamed that The Agora's leadership would rather pass out business cards and spend their time on purely political and bureaucratic maneuvers than get down to goals and objectives and work to counter the hateful rhetoric of the religious right, and the crushing indifference of our so-called "friends" in government and the press....

I wish that this group would abandon the name The Agora and choose one better fitting its current middlebrow goals and low aspirations. For all those who have died and who will die soon, and for all those gay and lesbian people for whom better respect in the media could make for better and healthier lives, I will ask that everyone ignore whatever this organization manufactures, since its mediocrity will only invite ridicule and scorn.

OFFICIALS IN CENTRAL TEXAS COUNTY REVERSE PRIOR VETO OF TAX BREAKS FOR COMPUTER PLANT

*Gay Leaders Praise Apple USA
For Standing Firm on
Domestic Partnership Policy.*

AUSTIN — A week after they initially refused to provide tax incentives to Apple Computer because the company's domestic partnership policy includes gay and lesbian employees, the Williamson County Board of Commissioners did an about-face on Tuesday, voting to provide tax reimbursements more or less matching the \$750,000 tax abatement rejected last week.

The 3-2 reversal was made possible when one of the Commissioners, David Hays, changed his mind and voted in favor of granting the tax break.

"Today's vote is a victory," said David M. Smith, Director of Public Information for the National Gay & Lesbian Task Force. Smith was in attendance for Tuesday's vote. "Jobs prevailed over prejudice. Apple is coming to Williamson County and the company's domestic partner benefits policy remains intact."

The facility Apple plans to build would bring an estimated 1,700 jobs to the county, located north of Austin.

"This battle is a perfect example of the type of discrimination gay and lesbian people face every day," Smith said. "This time it was an entire corporation. Apple has been absolutely heroic throughout this debate and has never wavered in support of its domestic partnership policy and treating its gay and lesbian employees fairly... This vote should send a positive signal to other companies that are considering implementing domestic partner policies."

Paul von Wupperfeld, state president of the Log Cabin Republicans of Texas, echoed Smith's sentiments.

"I think it's terrific. I think the reversal of that decision sends a strong message—that when you couple nondiscrimination with good economic policy, it proves to be a pretty powerful force."

Von Wupperfeld added that he believed the about-face by Williams County Commissioners would strengthen the resolve

of other companies in adopting and retaining nondiscrimination policies.

"I think this situation demonstrated loud and clear that bigotry and discrimination are bad for business."

In addition, the merchants will sponsor a 15-foot Christmas tree, which will serve as a memorial to those people lost to AIDS. Patrons of the event are urged to bring decorations with the names of those friends and loved ones they have lost for use on the tree. Memorial decorations may also be purchased for a small donation. These decorations will be used on this year's tree, as well as in subsequent holiday displays at The Quadrangle.

HOUSTON ACTIVISTS SAY PWAS ABUSED IN CITY, COUNTY JAILS

*Claim Inmates Being Assaulted,
Denied Medical Treatment.*

HOUSTON — Inmates with AIDS are being physically abused and denied vital medical treatments in both the Houston and Harris County jail systems, activists charged Tuesday at a press briefing held to call attention to the problems. They presented two case histories that they say prove their charges, and called on jail officials to acknowledge the problems and begin dealing with them.

Conducting the press conference were Ray Hill, a longtime prisoner rights activist; Matt Locklin, director of the Harris Co. Jail Citizens Medical Advisory Task Force; and Mike Stubblefield, activist and director of the Alternative Broadcasting Service. Also present was Mark Ash, attorney for inmate Steven Dane.

Dane was taken to the Harris County Jail and booked for a possession charge on November 29. While lined up with other inmates in a hallway on the second floor, he used a nearby telephone to call for assistance. According to Dane, a deputy walked up, grabbed the receiver from his hand and struck him on the face. Dane says he then received further blows to the head, right forearm, ribs, stomach and right leg.

The deputy in question claims that Dane threatened to bite him and thus infect him with HIV. Dane denies that charge, countering that he pleaded with the officer not to beat him because he was ill, and that after he [Dane] began bleeding from his injuries, he warned the officer against coming in contact with his blood. Dane has been charged with assault by threat, a Class C misdemeanor. At press time, Dane was not receiving medical treatment.

A second incident involves Andrew Abrego, who suffers from AIDS-related complications and at the time of his ar-



rest was fitted with two external catheters. Abrego was taken to the city jail after he walked into a police substation on September 27 to report he had been mugged the day before, and the officer on duty discovered that he had several outstanding warrants for unpaid fines. Abrego claims that he was denied medical treatment while in custody until a jailer at the prison farm, to which he had been transferred to work off his fines, intervened.

Locklin said the Task Force is currently seeking financial support to help it set up a hotline that can be used by inmates to report instances of abuse and neglect. He may be reached at (713)942-7600.

LIST OF HOUSTON RESTAURANTS RAISING AIDS FUNDS GROWS

*Additional Beneficiaries Chosen
For Red Ribbon Project.*

HOUSTON — Just a few weeks after it was officially launched, an ongoing program by Houston-area restaurants to raise funds for AIDS continues growing. The number of establishments signing up to take part in the Houston Red Ribbon Restaurant Project has reached 58, with still more expressing an interest in taking part.

Symbolizing participation in the Project is a Lucite obelisk nearly a foot tall, embedded with the familiar red AIDS awareness ribbon. Each restaurant places the obelisk on one of its tables, and 10% of that table's proceeds will be donated to AIDS-related nonprofit organizations.

At a press briefing held Tuesday at Rugles Restaurant, Red Ribbon Restaurant Project organizers Candy Anderson and Guy Young provided an update on the program, which they said has drawn the attention of other cities around the nation.

Under the Project's "Share the Wealth" plan, the Pet Patrol, Casa de Esperanza, the Montrose Clinic and The Assistance Fund will become beneficiaries effective January 1.

Yount explained that, under current plans, for the first few months of 1994 proceeds from the Red Ribbon project will go entirely to such programs, which often operate under severe financial constraints. "We want to give the outreach programs a head start," he said.

During the second quarter of next year, the Houston Clinical Research Network, an affiliate of the Montrose Clinic that coordinates local HIV treatment trials, will begin receiving a share of the proceeds. Young explained that the donations that will go to HCRN are in keeping with a request by the American Foundation for AIDS Research that funds raised through the Red Ribbon Project benefit local organizations. AmFAR, which was originally designated as a national beneficiary of the project, supports HCRN and similar research programs around the country.

Houston attorney Jim Walker, who along with Anderson and Yount chairs the Project's Benefiting Charities Committee, said the program is being sheltered under the 501(c)(3) status of the Larry Garrett Foundation, which also produces "That's What Friends Are For!," a gala AIDS fundraiser held annually. Garrett brings his fund-raising experience and community contacts to his role as an advisor to the Red Ribbon Restaurant Project.

STUDENTS AT COLLEGE IN DALLAS AREA HOLD DRIVE FOR AIDS FOOD PANTRY

*Donations Will Help AIDS Resource
Center to Assist PWAs.*

DALLAS — The staff of Brookhaven College, which is located in a suburb of Dallas, have always been proud of their students and their Students Reaching Out [SRO] project. The program has a long history of community service, including numerous food drives for various food pantries throughout the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex.

In addition, students focus a great deal of attention on health care issues, particularly in the battle against AIDS. Student nurses from Brookhaven, for example, work with persons with AIDS in area hospitals such as Baylor and Parkland, and SRO volunteers work at Bryan's House.

Recently, the students at Brookhaven combined their track record for accumulating food items and personal grooming supplies with their concern for AIDS issues to promote their first-ever food drive for the AIDS Resource Center.

Although the food drive is conducted every semester, this effort was a very special one because it was entirely student-driven; it was the first time the group has donated food to a gay and lesbian AIDS organization; and it was regarded as an attempt to show that the students of Brookhaven college and some of the surrounding communities see themselves as resources in the fight against AIDS.

Brookhaven's goal for the drive was 1,000 lbs. of food and a cash contribution of \$500. In true form, however, the students exceeded that amount, gathering over 1,400 lbs. of food in addition to the promised cash contribution.

Mary Franklin, Director of the Resource Center's Food Pantry, and her staff of three part-time employees and 30 volunteers, feed the more than 1,200 eligible clients of the Pantry, all of whom must present a letter which substantiates their diagnosis of HIV infection and certifies a T-cell count below 500. While it is Franklin and her staff who actually do the legwork involved in assisting the Pantry's clients, what they do would not be possible with-

out the assistance of Brookhaven College and the many other businesses and organizations committed to doing what they can to help end the AIDS pandemic. SRO sponsor Mary Read feels it's the least she and her group can do.

"It seems that the belief here," Reed says, "is that if we as a nation can feed the sick and starving of Somalia, then we as a community should be able to feed the sick and starving of Dallas."

THRF RECEIVES GIFT FROM ESTATE OF AUSTIN BUSINESSMAN

*Funds Will Support 21.06 Lawsuit,
AIDS Legal Resource Project.*

AUSTIN — The Texas Human Rights Foundation [THRF] announced this week that it has received a \$12,000 contribution from the bequest of David Miller, an Austin businessman who died last February of AIDS complications. THRF is a statewide nonprofit organization whose stated goal is the elimination of discrimination against lesbians, gay men and those with HIV through litigation, education and legal referrals.

The donation, which represents the largest single individual gift the Foundation has ever received, will be divided between THRF's two largest programs. Seven thousand dollars of the bequest will be allocated to support THRF's lawsuit challenging §21.06 of the Texas Penal Code, currently pending before the Texas Supreme Court, while the remaining \$5,000 will be used to support THRF's AIDS Legal Resource Project [ALRP]. Through a statewide toll-free phone number, the ALRP provides free legal information and attorney referrals to Texans affected by HIV. As the only statewide program of its kind, the ALRP also distributes free "AIDS and the Law: Know Your Rights" brochures and conducts free "AIDS and the Law" seminars around the state.

"We are overwhelmed by the magnitude of this gift," commented THRF Executive Director Suzy Wagers. "With these funds, we will be able to provide crucial legal services to many individuals who could not otherwise afford them. In a nonprofit setting where funding is always needed, this goes a long way."

Mary Patierno of New York, Miller's

sister, observed, "I am thrilled to help THRF in this way. David was very supportive of their work, particularly in overturning the anti-sodomy law. 'Given the tenuous nature of civil rights of gay and lesbian Texans right now, I would hope that this gift inspires others to get involved and give both their time and money.'"
