The Christmas and Hanukhah seasons, a time that should be filled with the joy of family and friends, can seem unbearable after the death of a loved one. Below I have provided a number of hints designed to make the holiday season a little easier.

1.) Recognize that grief takes both a physical and emotional toll. Plan ahead for nap and exercise time. Ensure that you have adequate supplies of prescription medications, and take them as scheduled. Watch your diet—eat regular meals and avoid overindulgence. Restrict your alcohol intake. Seek out an AA or grief support group if needed.

2.) Remember that we do not grieve on schedule. Our feelings and needs may not mesh with those of other family members or friends. Include others in your planning, and include compromise in your plans. Now is not the time to burn bridges.

3.) No one can read your mind. Communicating your desires to others will ease their discomfort and ensure that your needs are met. Don't waste energy second-guessing each other.

4). Parties, parties, parties. You may not feel up to the hectic rounds, but consider participating. A token effort to say hello may turn into a pleasurable experience. Go early before the event becomes too crowded. Have transportation available to exit when you feel overwhelmed. Avoid alcohol or recreational drugs, which can impair your coping abilities. If you decide not to attend an event, let your hosts know and thank them for remembering you. Perhaps you can arrange to visit at another time.

5.) Holiday shopping can be an escape or a chore. On a "good" day, organize a shopping list to help you focus your energy. Plan short trips on traditionally slow days in the stores. At the first hint of headache or fatigue, head for home. Among alternatives to traditional gift-giving are mail order items, gift certifi-

cates, cash gifts and memorial contributions. Or you may simply choose to give fewer gifts than in the past. Circles of friends may want to have gift pools.

6.) Traditional rituals will be changed because someone is missing. Embracing change will help redefine your holiday celebration. This can be a great opportunity to stop routine activities you never enjoyed and try something new. Use this holiday season to make great choices that nurture you.

7.) Holiday cards can be a great way to keep in touch with others. Sending cards to friends and family of the deceased reminds them that you care. If you are grieving, cards can let others know that you are interested in their support.


8.) Doing something for others can be a great way to help ourselves. Adopting a needy family, working on a community project, donating money we would have spent on our loved one or inviting a guest to our festivities can give us a sense of purpose and accomplishment. However, in doing for others, we must not push ourselves to exhaustion in an attempt to hide from our own feelings.

9.) Whether you choose to publicly ignore your loss or to acknowledge it, make a choice. Plan ahead if you want to visit your loved one's grave. If there is no grave site, other memorial rituals may be performed including formal prayers, quiet reflection at a specific time, hanging a special ornament, wearing a particular accessory or writing a love note to leave in a special place or to ritualistically burn.

10.) We've all heard the advice, "Take one day at a time." Sometimes we have to take it one hour at a time. Planning ahead and rehearsing in our minds how we want to handle the special day can give us the strength to cope. Growth and change, however painful, are a part of living.

Heather MacRae of Falsettos
Talks About Family, Relationships
And the Theatre



Houstonians get a special holiday gift this year when the national tour of the critically acclaimed Broadway hit Falsettos comes to Jones Hall December 21–26. The funny, poignant musical actually consists of two self-contained, one-act plays, 1981's March of the Falsettos and 1990's Falsettoland. In 1992, the sequels were joined and remounted for their Broadway debut under the name Falsettos. The musical was nominated for seven Tony Awards, and won the 1992 Tony for Best Score (to author and composer William Finn) and Best Book (to Finn and co-author and director James Lapine). It's the story of Marvin Rupert, a Jewish man who's married and has a young son, Jason. Jason is faced with the trials and tribulations of his parents' divorce as his father falls in love with another man, Whizzer, and his mother's remarriage to his father's psychiatrist. It's also about the crisis that confronts Jason and his extended family when Whizzer learns he has a mysterious new disease.

THIS WEEK IN TEXAS had the opportunity to chat with actress Heather MacRae, who is recreating her Broadway role as Dr. Charlotte, Marvin's next door neighbor who happens to be a lesbian. Ms. MacRae talked about American theatre, her career, and Falsettos and what it has to say about family and relationships.

TWT: What kind of play is Falsettos?

[Ms. MacRae]: When you talk about Falsettos, people say, "Oh God, it sounds so depressing," and it is quite sad. But it's also very funny and very joyous because it's a celebration of life, it's not about death; it's really about families and people coming together in a time of crisis and trying to figure out how to deal with this mysterious illness.

William Finn always says he can't stand that people think of this as an "AIDS musical." It's not about AIDS. It's really about relationships—about this little group of people who come together and face this tragedy. It'll make you laugh, it'll make you cry; I know that sounds corny, but it's really true.

The music is so beautiful; there's a quartet in the second act between the two gay men and the two lesbians in the hospital; they stand by Whizzer's hospital bed, singing this beautiful song called "Four Unlikely Lovers." It's really an anthem, it's

so wonderful.

You originated the part of Dr. Charlotte, didn't you?

Yes, I did. I've been doing it since 1990, on and off for three years.


How many of the original cast members are in this touring show?

Of the people who originally opened on Broadway, there's three of us. Everybody else has done it in another form, like on a tour, or the Hartford stage production. So this is a very good cast, because it's a combination of [members from] the Broadway company and another company. Everybody in the show, with the exception of one person, has done it on Broadway.

There's been a lot of talk about "family values," especially among conservatives, and Falsettos approaches the subject from a different angle.

I think, of course, people are concerned with all the terrible things that are happening in the world, and I think that the family structure is very important in our soci-

ety. But unfortunately, not everybody is lucky enough to have the traditional family. Not everybody has a mommy and daddy who are their real parents...If you have an extended family, they don't necessarily have to be your biological relations.

I think people take for granted that, because you're a child's parent, you can sort of do whatever you want. As we know from all the newspaper and media stories, there are many parents who abuse that privilege. Just because you're somebody's biological relative doesn't mean you're going to give them the best life.

Jason has all these people who really love him, and even though it's not considered a normal family, what is "normal" anymore? There are just too many different kinds of relationships nowadays to consider that one is the right one. It's whatever's right for you, and as long as children are treated with love and respect, I think they'll grow up to be fine.

What has the response been to Falsettos?


Everywhere we go, we get phenomenal reviews, because it's an extraordinary piece of theatre; the music is absolutely beautiful and wonderful, it appeals to everybody. Initially, people might think,

"Gee, I don't know if I want to see that lesbians from next door, two gay guys." So I think people have to put aside their prejudices and just come to it with an open mind and an open heart, and I think they'll be surprised.

In the initial Broadway run, of course, we had the "Falsetto fans," the people who followed both the shows for a number of years and have seen them off Broadway, and the very sophisticated New York audience, the gay audience, then the suburbanites. Then we started getting tourists, and that was great because they had no idea what the show was about, and they'd wait for us after the show and say, "I've never seen anything like this, and it reminded me of my son or my daughter." Not necessarily a gay child; maybe they had a child who was ill or that they hadn't seen in a while.

A lot of people just want to see fluff; they only want to see something that doesn't make them think. And that's fine, if that's what they want. But I think that, if we're going to broaden our horizons and learn about life, when we go to the theatre we need to feel that we're coming out thinking about something, whether it's politics, religion, romance or whatever.



Because it's political?

Well, it's very political, but it also has male nudity and some graphic talk. It's sad, because it's really quite wonderful; magnificent, really. I find that sad—that Americans can't really open their hearts to see new ways of life. This is the '90s, and things are different now. We can't live in a little isolated world.

You've worked in television, movies and theatre. Do you have a preference among the three?

I love the theatre, I just love it. I would never stop doing plays. I've done a few movies, and I would love to do some more, and television, because monetarily, they're certainly more rewarding, but not creatively. Doing a play is a great experience, because you go from point A to point Z every night; it's complete, each night is a complete event. I've done a few movies and some television, and it can be sort of boring sitting around, but it's certainly a lot of fun and I hope to do more.

I also do my nightclub act, in which I sing some original material. My brother Bruce is a wonderful songwriter, so I do some of his songs. Now that I'm a little older and can be more objective about my parents' careers, I do a whole tribute to my father and my mother, Gordon and Sheila MacRae, and kind of talk about my life growing up with them. I sing songs from Carousel and Oklahoma.

What's up next for you?

Eventually I'm going to have to do another play [laughs]. I think the original Broadway cast, everybody in the cast is going to go to Los Angeles to do Falsettos there for three months, then after that, who knows? I do voice-overs, and I'll do my club act again. Once we do the L.A. show, it'll be time to move on to something else, because I've been doing it on and off for a long time.

It's hard, because there's nothing much that I see out there in terms of musicals that I like as much as Falsettos. People are always coming up to me and recognizing me, and that's nice, because you know that you've made an impact on somebody's life, and they always say they loved the show and they loved my character. It's wonderful to be appreciated like that, but eventually you have to move on.

12 Steps to A More Dysfunctional Christmas

Rob Nash Presents Another Masterful One-Man Show

A re you blue because you'll be having Christmas without your "traditional" family this year? 12 Steps to A More Dystunctional Christmas may help you feel glad instead.

Do you dread Christmas because you have to be with your "traditional" family this year? 12 Steps... may help you look forward to the holiday with laughter instead.

12 Steps to A More Dysfunctional Christmas is a comedy performed by one man—the man who also wrote the play, Rob Nash. After reading all the "writings on the walls" about Nash and about this piece, Iconcluded that the writer/actor more than likely is writing and playing what he's lived. And I believe that this is the key to Nash's success with both his earlier hit 12 Steps to A More Dysfunctional You as well this current seguel.

After a performance of Nash's first "dysfunctional" play earlier this year in Edinburgh, Scotland, an artistic director/composer/writer/performer/avid theatre-goer wrote him personally, saying, "Last weekend I saw 18 shows at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe, ranging from the indescribably terrible to the quite magnificent. I am simply writing to congratulate you on your

amazing tour de force. It was quite the best show I have ever seen on the Fringe, both in terms of the writing and your performance."

The popularity of the holiday sequel is evident in the size of the crowds that have been turning out to see ... Dysfunctional Christmas at Houston's small Curtains Theater. On the Friday evening I attended, chairs were placed in the aisles to accommodate the overflow, and the audience consisted of a fairly equal mix of same-sex and opposite-sex couples. The diversity of the crowd didn't seem to affect the level of laughter at points in the dialogue when one of the characters pokes fun at the absurdity of homophobic misconceptions.

Nash has created characters that are so true to life that it's easy to identify someone you know in each personality represented. I found this little two-act delightful and as much fun as stand-up comedy, which is understandable when one recalls that that performance genre is a part of Rob Nash's background.

What really fascinated me was the artist's ability to switch quickly among five different characters with a minimal lapse in concentration or energy. With every change, he kept each person true to their character without the loss in intensity one

would expect when a single performer does all the work for nearly two hours.

Nash plays a 62-year-old grandmother who kept her alcoholic husband in the house until her three children were grown and no longer there to shield her; the woman's caretaker son, who happens to be gay; a grandson and a granddaughter of the woman, who are acting out the effects of their dysfunctional "inheritance"; the children's mother, who is in the Junior League and is a master of denial; and "Miss Denial's" sister, who's obsessed with pop psychology and the vocabulary of the New Age movement, and also happens to be a lesbian.

Nash makes this five-way role-changing seem as easy as changing an old shirt. In fact, in the earliest scenes, he uses an old red and black plaid shirt as a prop, which helps the audience keep the character switches clear. By the closing scenes, the actor has done such a good job creating his characters that theatre-goers are easily able to recognize them by their speech patterns, and the shirt prop is no longer used.

Rob Nash brings a notable background of education and experience to his latest play, which is having its world premiere at Curtains. Nash, a Houston native, resides in San Francisco and performs stand-up comedy at The Improv and on VH1's Stand-Up Spotlight with Rosie O'Donnell. His acting career began early, with training at the Theatre Under the Stars' Humphries School, where he played the Artful Dodger in Oliver as well as other significant roles. At The University of Texas in Austin, he wrote for the Daily Texan and helped write that paper's first gay comic strip.

Nash is now writing for a trade paper on stand-up comedy as well as for *The Tonight Show*. After opening 12 Steps to A More Dysfunctional You in Houston in October 1992, he took it to Austin, San Francisco and Edinburgh, where it was one of the most highly acclaimed American shows at the Festival on the Fringe. It has been scheduled for a return to Curtains in January, and will then go on tour nationwide.

AIDS SERVICES OF DALLAS HONORS VOLUNTEERS

Over 20 Awards Handed out At Fifth Annual Ceremony Held Last Sunday.

DALLAS — When AIDS first began taking its toll on the residents of Dallas, no one could foresee the devastating effect that the disease—and the associated prejudice and discrimination—would have on its victims. It was years later before anyone realized that those with the disease faced not just a possible death sentence, but potential loss of employment and home as well.

AIDS Services of Dallas [ASD] recognized the need for a feeling of security in people facing this health challenge, and embarked on a program to create resident facilities for those individuals who faced AIDS, unemployment and homelessness, opening its first facility, A Place for Us, in 1987. Since that time, ASD has sheltered hundreds of people living with AIDS.

It took a community of spirit and hard work to create that first facility and build ASD into one of the largest providers of medically supportive housing for people with AIDS in the United States. That spirit and hard work came to the agency in the form of a staff of more than 500 volunteers who, combined, provided ASD with an average 954 volunteer hours per month or, in monetary terms, more than \$124,000 annually.

According to Don Maison, President and Chief Executive Officer of ASD, it is "an array of community involvment, from the Dallas Junior League to the Lutheran Youth Convention, [that] has contributed greatly to our facilities." Levi Turner, ASD Volunteer Coordinator, agreed. "The greatest gift our volunteers provide is the donation of their time in providing emotional and practical support to our residents. Our volunteers come from over 30 Dallas-area churches, civic and community groups, representing a variety of different religious and racial backgrounds. Together they help to provide a higher quality of life to people living with AIDS/HIV disease."

In recognition of the accomplishments of these volunteers, every year ASD holds a Volunteer Appreciation Event. The or-

ganization's fifth such ceremony was held last Sunday, December 12, with more than 20 awards handed out in recognition of volunteer commitment and dedication. Receiving the Daryl Moore Memorial Award, named for the founder of the PWA Coalition of Dallas, Inc., was Erin Owen. Owen, a clinical psychologist with Productive Rehabilitation Institute of Dallas of Ergonomics [PRIDE], was saluted for outstanding contribution by an individual.

Other awards went to GHT Alarm Systems, recognized with the Phil Morrow Memorial Award for Outstanding Contribution by an Organization; the Oak Lawn Community Services Care-A-Van program, which provides transportation to PWAs; Rainbow Days; Regis Hairstylists; Oak Lawn Extermination; Jim Davis; Susan Ludwick; Norman Ford; Dave White; Brian Morgan; Carol West; and the International Apparal Mart of Dallas.

Similar awards were presented in honor of ASD's Supper Club volunteers as well as in honor of those volunteers who have lost their struggle with AIDS during the past year.

While the awards themselves are heartily appreciated by the volunteers, many find greater reward in the bonds of friendship that develops between them and the clients they serve. It is these bonds of friendship that, according to Maison, "give the residents the drive and determination to continue their fight against AIDS and live their lives with meaning."

And, according to Turner, "It is perhaps their strong commitment to ASD that best exemplifies the quality of our volunteers."

1993 HOUSTON BLACK TIE DINNER RAISES OVER \$91,000

Eight Local, State Organizations And Human Rights Campaign Fund Share Proceeds from Nov. 6 Event.

HOUSTON — Organizers of this year's Houston Black Tie Dinner announced last week that the recently held event raised over \$91,000. In a reception held last Thursday, President Frank Campisi and Secretary Shelley Porter presented checks to the beneficiaries of proceeds from the Dinner. Campisi and Porter served as Cochairs of this year's fund-raiser.

The November 6 affair, which saw local politicians, business leaders, activists and other supporters of Houston's gay and lesbian community turn out in their finest for an evening of speeches, entertainment and fine food at the posh Westin Oaks Hotel, was organized by The Houston Black Tie Dinner, Inc. Pleased with the success of this year's event, which sold out, officers of the recently created organization say they have already reserved a larger ballroom for next year's dinner.

The majority of funds raised from the November 6 event, approximately \$52,000, were distributed to eight local or statewide organizations: AIDS Foundation Houston, The Assistance Fund, Bering Community Service Foundation, the Gay Men's Chorus of Houston, Heartsong, the Lesbian Health initiative, the Montrose Clinic/Houston Clinical Research Network and the Texas Human Rights Foundation. The Human Rights Campaign Fund, headquartered in Washington, D.C., received over \$39,000.

In attendance were Committee Chairs, Table Captains and Underwriters of the event.

"The success of the dinner was a great community effort to help our own locally and lobby for our rights in Congress," Campisi said. "The funds raised are a tribute to a lot of hard work and a spirit of working together in the pursuit of freedom.

"Since the 1993 dinner sold out, we have reserved a larger ballroom for next year and look forward to an even more successful 1994 dinner."

EXPANSION IN PLANS FOR DALLAS' GAY AND LESBIAN COMMUNITY CENTER

Hotline, 'Lambda University' Among Projects for 1994.

DALLLAS — Throughout history, the town hall has been a integral part of the social structure of a community. Within its walls, everything of importance and interest to a group of people transpires, making it the focal point of that community's business and social life.

Such a focal point is of primary importance to the gay community, a group whose burgeoning efforts at organizing its own society have resulted in the duplica-



tion of time-honored institutions geared specifically towards gay and lesbian people. In the early '80s, however, Dallas had no such institution, no place to help foster the feeling of community that the "town hall" engenders.

That all changed with the creation of the Gay and Lesbian Community Center, the local community's answer to the "town hall." Not merely a meeting place, the Center has become what its organizers envisioned—a focal point of the community's business and social life.

Through the years, the Gay and Lesbian Community Center has changed locations several times—but it has never waivered in its original intent—to provide the community with a permanent structure in which to meet and congregate safely and comfortably.

Now, more than ten years after its creation, the Dallas Gay and Lesbian Community Center has announced plans to mount an ambitious expansion and remodeling program for 1994, beginning in February with a major remodeling and transformation of the sanctuary—a remnant of the days when the facility housed the Metropolitan Community Church—into flexible meeting rooms to address the growing demand for space by local organizations. Included in the remodeling project will be the installation of additional audio/visual equipment.

Also in the plans is the addition of a Coffee House—which is considered vital to fostering new groups and programs—and the creation of a Education Conference Center, which will house the DGA archives and an expanded and improved library facility.

New programs and services at the Community Center in 1994 will include:

 Administrative and communication services featuring Voice Mail, copier and fax services, plus a mail center, a referral network, a mailing list service, a community calendar and a "welcome wagon"

packet;

 Expansion of the volunteer training and support programs the Center provides for the Foundation for Human Understanding, the umbrella organization which supports the AIDS Resource Center, the NAMES Project, the Nelson-Tebedo Clinic and the Food Pantry;

 Development of a Gay and Lesbian Hotline with a target start-up date in April.
 The Hotline will deal with items pertinent to the gay community, including coming out, youth and lesbian issues, and antiviolence and discrimination information;

 Continuance of local age-related support programs, such as Gay and Lesbian Young Adults, Old Lesbians and the Prime Timers, with the planned addition of programs associated with national groups such as SAGE [Seniors Acting in a Gay Environment]:

 Development of self-esteem and selfrespect workshops covering topics like coming out, dating, relationship building, parenting and the pride associated with the history of the gay movement; and

 The creation of "Lambda University" with accredited programs for gay/lesbian high school and college-level Continuing Education.

With all these programs scheduled to go on line in 1994, help is needed to achieve the ambitious goals already established. Community involvement and participation is encouraged to ensure the success of the Center's ongoing programs, as well as those planned for next year. DALLAS SINGER SARAH ANGELL BENEFITS HIV GROUPS

Proceeds from Sales of Cassette Go to Four Nonprofit Organizations.

DALLAS — The release of Dr. Timothy Seelig's latest CD, Everything is Possible—with 100% of the proceeds benefiting Dallas' Nelson-Tebedo Clinic, the Turtle Creek Chorale AIDS Fund and the Cathedral of Hope AIDS Ministry—signals a growing trend and awareness among musicians and vocalists alike to put their talents to work in the battle against AIDS.

But before Dr. Seelig, there was Sarah Angell, a Dallas singer whose roots in the gay community are quite strong—in fact, they launched her career. While she has a beautiful voice, however, Angell had no experience and none of the mechanical elements (such as demo tapes and the like) necessary to break into the business. That's where the gay community comes in.

Angell was convinced by Jim Caruso of the group Wiseguys to perform in an Open Mic competition at a local gay nitespot one evening. She did, and was hired by the club that night. After that booking, she was hired by other gay clubs to perform, and has appeared in the famed Pyramid Room of the Fairmont Hotel. Now she even has a demo tape—something she feels confident will lead to even more work.

Angell hasn't forgotten how instrumental the gay community has been to her success—nor the number of friends she has lost to AIDS. Because of that, she decided to produce a cassette of music whose proceeds would, in some way, help to bring an end to the AIDS crisis. And when she mentioned her intentions to friends and associates, she was gratified to discover that there were others who wanted to help her realize her goal.

Chanteuse is the result of a collaboration between Angell and accompanist Buddy Shanahan. Because production costs have been underwritten, all proceeds benefit the Foundation for Human Understanding in support of the AIDS Resource Center, The Nelson-Tebedo Clinic, The NAMES Project and the Food Pantry. Because of all the help Angell received from her friends, only twelve cents from the sale of each cassette is used to cover expenses. The balance goes to the Foundation—an amount which already exceeds \$2,000.

RED RIBBON STAMP GOES ON DISPLAY AT HOUSTON CLINIC

Presentation by Houston Postmaster Part of AIDS Day Observances.

HOUSTON — A poster-size reproduction of the Red Ribbon AIDS awareness postage recently issued by the U.S. Postal Service will be placed on permanent display at Thomas Street Clinic, a Harris County facility that provides outpatient medical care and counseling for people with HIV and AIDS. The decision to place the poster at Thomas Street was made by board members of HIV Service Providers last week.

The stamp was officially presented to Houston-area HIV service providers during ceremonies held at the offices of the Houston Independent School District, which included a display of panels from the NAMES Project AIDS Memorial Quilt and performances by student musicians.

Around noon, several dozen members of ACT UP/Gulf Coast, carrying a wooden coffin and posters bearing the photos of people lost to AIDS, staged a demonstration through downtown Houston that culminated in a brief press conference held on the steps of City Hall. Group spokesperson Ross Perry read a statement condemning President Bill Clinton's response to the AIDS epidemic and calling for the adoption of the Barbara McClintock Project to Cure AIDS.

The McClintock Project would centralize AIDS research in the U.S., placing it under the direction of a Special Assistant to the President on AIDS and, advocates believe, eliminating conflicts of interest that hamper HIV research.

World AIDS Day observances in Houston culminated with a ceremony Wednesday evening at the Metropolitan Multi-Purpose Center that included the reading of the names of people lost to AIDS, and the decorating and lighting of the Tree of Remembrance.
