DOING THE

'BUREAUCRACY BOOGIE'

Or,

How You Can Survive Red Tape

What do the former Soviet Union, public clinics, government programs and insurance plans all have in common? What's the ribbon that holds more than our Christmas packages together? You guessed it; everyone's favorite, red tape. Dealing with the "system" takes patience, assertiveness, organization and a sense of humor. Social workers learn early in their careers to negotiate with seemingly mindless institutions. This article's "Top Ten" list (presented with apologies to late-night talk show host David Letterman) might ease your dealings with some of our favorite bureaucrats.

10 Be organized. Keep a notebook handy to write down the name of the person who is handling your claim or giving you information, or is otherwise responsible for your case. If possible, get their direct phone number to bypass the endless voice mail systems. The individual's fax number may also come in handy. Check for "800" numbers if your contact is long-distance. Also verify the time zone and hours for the agency contact.

9 Be polite. No matter which agency you are dealing with, an individual human being is processing your information. That person may be concerned, helpful, overworked, underpaid, apathetic or "just plain stupid," but they are your entry into the system. Stick to the topic. Provide needed information, but don't waste their time with your life story. Often they

deserve thanks for their efforts, not sarcasm or verbal abuse. Taking your frustration out on the entry-level personnel is a waste of energy.

Be assertive, but control your aggression. If your initial contact can't answer your question, ask to speak with a supervisor.

stating your requests and questions. Quote earlier contacts to clarify your concerns. Try to understand the limits of some organizations. Ask how long it will take to process your application or to get answers to your questions. Plan your follow-up contacts accordingly.

7 Get it in writing. Ask for copies of policies to be sent to you when appropriate. If your problem or question pertains to only a portion of a large brochure or other standard handout, ask that the section you need to review be highlighted or marked.

Never send your only copy of a document. If the Post Office misplaces your seven-page application form, it will be much easier to send a copy of your copy than to have to fill out the form all over again.

Keep copies. Never send your only copy of a document. If the Postal Service misplaces your seven-page application form, it will be much easier to send a copy of your copy than it will be to complete the form again from scratch. When you must submit originals (such as a certified copy of your birth certificate to Social Security), ask if you can hand-deliver it and have it returned while you wait. Otherwise, take a deep breath and trust that your originals will return to you in good time. In the worst-case scenario, nearly all originals can be regenerated from the source agency.

5 Copies, copies, copies. Although the folks at Kinko's and the Copy Club can be great fun, you probably don't want to get to know them on a first-name basis. If you are filling out various program applications, you may feel as if you are experiencing déjà vu when you read the documentation requirements. Make four to five copies of birth certificates, proof of income (e.g., Social Security awards letters), powers of attorney, living wills ("advanced directives to physicians") and identification (e.g., driver's license, Social Security cards). Remember, copies are cheap; gas and your time are not.

4 Network. Yes, it's the 90's thing to do. Ask your friends, family, doctor or case worker for tips on dealing with specific agencies. Use their contacts and shortcuts. (And remember to thank them for the advice.)

3 Learn to relish idle time. You may sit (stand) on line or listen to the "hold" music for what seems to be an eternity. At agencies, bring a book, headset, self-contained amusements, a snack, scheduled medication, and a cushion to sit on. People-watching can be a fine art, but don't stare rudely. Practice your social skills with your fellow applicants. When knowingly entering the land of phone hold, utilize a speaker phone whenever possible. This frees your hands up for other paperwork, desk cleaning or remote control usage. (Return to the handset when the call is answered to avoid those annoying echoes.) Napping, relaxation exercises, journal and letter writing, and planning your fantasy trip to Tahiti are other good ways to pass the time.

2 Find a safety valve for your frustrations. Since screaming at agency personnel is seldom effective (although personally gratifying at times), channel the anger constructively. Write an angry letter (but think twice before mailing it). Consider joining an activist or advocacy group dedicated to effecting change. Volunteer at the agency in question to make it a better place for yourself and others. Have a primal scream in the privacy of your car or home. (Don't try this in agency halls or stairwells as it tends to upset the security staff.) Physically get the negative energy out through exercise, dance or punching a couch cushion. Playing with a pet, verbalizing to a loved one, requesting a back rub or relaxing with a favorite movie are other possibilities. As a last resort, there's always chocolate!

1 Give yourself a pat on the back. It takes a great deal of emotional energy to access, comprehend and negotiate with bureaucratic systems. Even if you had help with the applications, *you* were the one who decided to ask for help and persevere rather than giving up.

TOP NEWS STORIES OF 1993



On the following pages are the top news stories of 1993 — a chronicle of the year's most important news developments from the perspective of the gay and lesbian community of Texas. These stories were selected on the basis of how they related to issues of greatest concern to the state's gay and lesbian population.

TEXANS, OTHER AMERICANS CONVERGE ON NATION'S CAPITAL FOR 1993 MARCH ON WASHINGTON

After months of planning and organizing across the country, Texans and huge numbers of other Americans converged on the nation's capital on April 25 for the 1993 March on Washington for Lesbian, Gay and Bi Equal Rights and Liberation. The historic event was staged to demand full recognition of equal rights for gay and lesbian Americans, and illustrated the unity and strength of the community.

Grouped by state or affinity, marchers made their way to the rally site on the Capitol Mall, where they heard speeches by supportive political figures, civil rights leaders, show business celebrities and national gay leaders. Though he had been invited, President Bill Clinton opted not to attend, instead sending a statement that was read to the crowd.

Estimates of the number of people participating in the March ranged from a low of 300,000 by the National Park Service to the figure of one million claimed by organizers.

A long schedule of events covering the spectrum of gay, lesbian, HIV and other, related issues was in conjunction with the March. The Human Rights Campaign Fund and the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force sponsored "Lobby Days" as a way

of encouraging citizens to pressure their elected representatives. ACT-UP staged a protest against profiteering by drug manufacturers at the expense of people with AIDS, and thousands of gay and lesbian couples gathered to take part in a ritual of union and commitment. The ceremony, presided over by the Rev. Troy Perry, founder of the UFMCC, and other clergy, was staged outside Internal Revenue Service offices to symbolize the call for government recognition of same-sex unions.

An event of special interest to Texans was held on the eve of the March, when over 1,000 people partied at the "Texas Two-Step," a country and western affair held at a popular Washington dance club. The more than \$15,000 raised went to the Texas Human Rights Foundation, the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas and the National March on Washington.

21.06 RETAINED IN TEXAS PENAL CODE; STATE SUPREME COURT HEARING CASE

The Texas Supreme Court confronted the issue of the state's "anti-sodomy law," 21.06, once again in 1993, hearing oral arguments in *Morales, et al. v. the State of Texas*, the case challenging that statute of the state penal code.

Patrick Wiseman, the attorney representing the five named plaintiffs, argued

that the law clearly discriminates between homosexual and heterosexual conduct, and is a violation of an individual's right to privacy and equal protection under the Texas Constitution.

The State's primary argument has been that 21.06 must be retained in the interest of "upholding public morality." Wiseman countered that, although homosexuality was considered a disease in the past, for nearly two decades it has not been considered such by the American Psychological Association. He further contended that the State could not find a credible expert witness to support its arguments.

While the state's high court considered the case, however, the Texas Senate took the matter of 21.06 into its own hands, voting down a proposal to keep the statute in a newly revised penal code that took effect this year. The elimination of 21.06 was just one of a number of criminal justice reforms sponsored by Sen. John Whitmire of Houston in an effort to overhaul what many legislators viewed as an antiquated document.

The Senate action drew strong reaction from various groups around the state, including the American Family Association of Dallas County, Concerned Women for America and the Eagle Forum—all of which condemned the legislative action. The Federation of Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays, however, petitioned the Legislature to get rid of 21.06, citing extreme prejudice instilled in Texans from kindergarten on as well as statistics suggesting that as many as 30% of all suicides among teens can be traced to the guilt and shame they feel when they discover they are homosexual.

The matter went to the House/Senate Conference Committee in May of this year, where committee members narrowly voted to retain Section 21.06 in the new Penal Code. Frances L. Pearson, President of P-FLAG, summed up the reaction of gay rights activists when she said, "the 'sodomy statute'... is a slap in the face, not only to those who are gay themselves, but also to their families and friends. This law is not on the books for criminal prosecution, but only for bigotry and prejudice."

Section 21.06 is considered a serious impediment to the attainment of full civil rights by gay and lesbian Texans because, even though it has rarely if ever been enforced, it is used to discriminate against them in the areas of housing, employment,

education, public policy and insurance.

As 1993 drew to a close, the Texas Supreme Court had not yet made a ruling on *Morales*, leaving the civil rights of gay and lesbian Texans still in limbo.

REPUBLICANS GAIN LOCK ON STATE'S TWO SENATE SEATS AFTER HUTCHISON SWAMPS KRUEGER

Democrat Bob Krueger, appointed by Gov. Ann Richards to fill a United States Senate seat left vacant when Lloyd Bentsen was appointed Secretary of the Treasury by President Clinton, faced an uphill battle to retain his Congressional post when he squared off against Republican Kay Bailey Hutchison in a special election called by Richards last May. The Senate race was of particular importance to the gay and lesbian community because it was being watched both in Texas and across the nation for the effects its outcome might have on Clinton's plan to lift the ban on gays and lesbians serving in the military. Krueger had declared his support for lifting the ban, while many GOP candidates actually used the ban as a focal point of their campaigns, running homophobic TV and radio ads attacking Krueger for his support of Clinton's proposal.

Hutchison's well-financed campaign and conservative leanings were major obstacles to Krueger's efforts, and his admitted lack of knowledge on gay, lesbian and HIV-related issues made it difficult for him to gain the enthusiastic support of the more liberal factions of the Democratic Party. Several gay and lesbian political organizations throughout the state either voted to endorse opponents or declined to support any candidate at all.

Krueger responded to the concerns of the gay and lesbian community early in his campaign by intensifying his outreach to the community, screened in person with groups like Lesbian/Gay Democrats of Texas [LGDT] and the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus. Krueger did win the support of LGDT.

"Krueger is the first sitting U.S. Senator from Texas ever to seek the endorsement of the gay/lesbian community," said LGDT co-chair Rob Bridges in announcing the

group's decision to support the Democrat. "In the first few weeks of his campaign, we have had more direct contact with Sen. Krueger than we had with Lloyd Bentsen and Phil Gramm in the last ten years. This is a giant step forward for us toward increasing our influence in a legislative body as conservative as the U.S. Senate."

But others in the gay community felt it was too little and too late. "I think he was held responsible to a portion of his constituency that had concerns, and I'm not going to give him a medal for doing something that he's supposed to do," said Houston activist Brian Bradley.

Krueger, as expected, faced Hutchison in a runoff election and ultimately lost to the Republican candidate by the widest margin racked up in a Texas Senate race in decades. Hutchison overwhelmed Krueger by taking two-thirds of the vote, and her election marked the first time in over 100 years that both of Texas' Senate seats were held by Republicans.

As the year came to an end, Hutchison's viability as a candidate for reelection was being questioned by Democrats and Republicans alike as she continued to battle allegations that she had misappropriated state resources during her election campaign.

COMPUTER MAKER'S GAY-SUPPORTIVE BENEFITS POLICY STIRS CONTROVERSY IN TEXAS COUNTY

In a controversy that drew national attention, officials in Williamson County, a fast-growing area north of Austin, voted in early December to deny tax incentives to Apple Computer, which had planned to build an \$80 million facility in the county. The sticking point was the company's domestic partnership policy.

Apple officials said it was unlikely they would build in Williamson County if the company wasn't granted the incentives, and they reiterated their support for the firm's year-old policy, which extends health benefits to the live-in companions of unmarried employees, both straight and gay. The computer maker had sought the tax abatements, worth \$750,000, to construct a facility that would bring in over

1,000 new jobs and infuse millions of dollars into the local economy.

A week later, the county commissioners reversed themselves, voting to provide Apple with other financial incentives matching the previously rejected tax abatement.

At a time when the state of the economy has become a very important issue for many Americans, and the battle between gays and the right wing heats up across the country, the Williamson County controversy touched on a number of sensitive issues. While conservative Christians and others who supported the original vote saw it as a principled stand against condoning immorality, others viewed it as unwarranted government interference in the policies of private business. And gay and lesbian leaders condemned the commissioners' original rejection of Apple's request as an endorsement of bigotry, while hailing the later reversal as a victory for nondiscrimination and a potential harbinger of more enlightened corporate policies toward gay employees.

"Today's vote is a victory," said David M. Smith, Director of Public Information for the National Gay & Lesbian Task Force, of the decision to grant Apple tax incentives. "Jobs prevailed over prejudice. Apple is coming to Williamson County and the company's domestic partner benefits policy remains intact.... This vote should send a positive message to other companies that are considering implementing domestic partner policies."

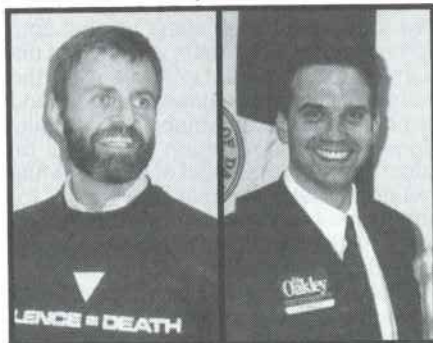
Paul von Wupperfeld, state president of the Log Cabin Republicans of Texas, agreed. "I think this situation demonstrated loud and clear that bigotry and discrimination are bad for business."

RECORD NUMBER OF OPENLY GAY CANDIDATES RUN IN CITY ELECTIONS

Dallas and Houston joined the growing list of communities across the U.S. in 1993 that saw openly gay and lesbian candidates running for city offices. While only a few victories were racked up in these races, the candidacies represented a significant milestone in both the advancement of the gay and lesbian civil rights movement and the growing desire of gays

and lesbians to take their "seat at the table" of government.

Dallas led the way last spring, with four openly gay candidates vying for two city council seats. In District 2, longtime gay activist and candidate Jack Bordan was unsuccessful in his attempt to unseat incumbent council member Chris Luna, while in District 3, Mike Hutchison lost his race to Bob Stimson. Hutchison had the backing of the Dallas Gay Political Caucus, the Lesbian/Gay Political Action Committee and the Victory Fund.

In the hotly-contested District 14 race, gay businessmen Ed Oakley and Craig McDaniel faced Sharon Boyd in the race for the seat that represents an area including the Oak Lawn district of Dallas. In what was seen as a watershed campaign, voters were asked to choose between "community loyalty" and the issues. Ultimately, divisiveness between Dallas' two gay political organizations—LG-PAC and the Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance—was seen as a contributing factor in splitting the vote between Oakley and Boyd, forcing Boyd and McDaniel into a runoff. McDaniel ultimately won the council seat.

In Houston, meanwhile, City Council races drew five gay candidates in November's citywide elections—an unprecedented number for any Texas city—while one openly gay candidate also ventured into the mayoral race.

All six candidates—Gene Harrington in District D, Gary Van Ooteghem in at-Large Position 1, Ray Hill in at-Large Position 2, Rob Bridges in at-Large Position 3, Brian Bradley in at-Large Position 4 and mayoral candidate Brian Bowen—were all unsuccessful in their races, though disappoint-

ing results were tempered with an awareness that the Houston gay and lesbian community had gained political strength from having several of its own on the ballot.

"The election tonight is not the issue," Harrington said as supporters gathered to watch election returns the evening of November 2. "We have made our voices heard, and never again will we be silent."

CLINTON PLAN TO ALTER MILITARY POLICY ON GAY SERVICE PERSONNEL CALLED INADEQUATE

During the 1992 presidential campaign, Democrat Bill Clinton attracted widespread support among gay and lesbian voters eager to end over a decade of Republican stewardship of the White House. Among the candidate's selling points was a pledge to abolish the armed forces' ban on gay and lesbian service personnel.

So there was hope when Clinton announced shortly after his inauguration last January that he intended to make good on his pledge. And even after strong opposition from Republicans and others in Congress and around the nation forced the President to call for a six-month "cooling off" period during which the issue would be studied and an executive order drawn up, gay leaders still held out hope for significant change in military policy.

But when the new Clinton policy was announced last summer, it was widely criticized in Texas and elsewhere as a modest step in the right direction that left too much of the old anti-gay policy in place.

According to the President's proposal, popularly summed up as "don't ask, don't tell," recruits were no longer to be asked or required to reveal their sexual orientation. But the armed services could still discharge members who engage in homosexual conduct. Bodily contact would qualify as grounds for discharge, while certain other activities—like reading "homosexual" materials, patronizing gay clubs or marching in gay rights parades—would not, in theory, provide sufficient grounds for separation from military service.

The controversy didn't end with Clin-

ton's announcement of his plan, however.

In September, the House of Representatives and the Senate voted to accept proposals put forward by Rep. Ike Skelton of Missouri and Sen. Sam Nunn of Georgia that were even more restrictive than the Clinton plan. The Nunn-Skelton proposals were condemned as a "lie and hide" policy by Human Rights Campaign Fund Executive Director Tim McFeeley.

Amendments introduced by Sen. Barbara Boxer of California and Rep. Marty Meehan of Massachusetts which would have struck the Nunn-Skelton language from defense legislation were defeated in both the House and Senate. Gay and lesbian leaders attempted to put a good face on the defeats, citing the large numbers of legislators, including 11 Republicans, who had voted against the harsher plan.

As the year drew to a close, several court cases challenging the military's ban on gay service personnel promised to keep the issue alive.

In October, NGLTF Executive Director Peri Jude Radecic urged the Clinton administration not to ask the Supreme Court for an emergency stay of an order by a U.S. District Judge enjoining the Defense Department from discriminating against gay service personnel.

In November, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit issued a decision reinstating Navy midshipman Joseph Steffan. In a letter sent to Clinton, HRCF Director McFeeley called on the President not to appeal the court's decision.

AUSTIN BECOMES FIRST CITY IN TEXAS WITH DOMESTIC PARTNER POLICY

AUSTIN — In early September, Austin City Council voted to adopt a new policy giving spousal benefits to the partners of employees in same-sex or unmarried heterosexual relationships.

Instrumental in the push for adoption of such a policy was the Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus. Diane Hardy-Garcia, a co-chair of ALGPC at the time, called on elected officials to fulfill their campaign promises on the matter.

"We have a city council that used do-

mestic partnership to help win their campaigns. It's time for them to come through. We're tired of being 'check-writing queers.' We want action, not words."

The move made Austin the only city in Texas so far to have adopted such a policy. San Francisco, Los Angeles, Seattle and several other cities across the country have similar policies. Under the Austin plan, which goes into effect tomorrow (January 1), the partners of city employees will receive the same kinds of benefits, including health insurance, that other employees' legally recognized spouses do. "Partners" are defined as people sharing both a residence and "a close, personal, intimate relationship."

Among those leading opposition to the policy were right-wing activists Mark Weaver and Jack Chambers, who said city government should uphold traditional notions of family. Supporters countered that the definition of "family" should be broadened to correspond more closely to reality. Opponents also expressed the fear that extending benefits coverage to unmarried couples would cost the city too much money, while supporters countered that it would actually save money. Supporters also noted that 60-80 percent of those taking advantage of such benefits in other cities have been heterosexuals with unmarried partners.

During an open enrollment period that ended in November, fewer employees signed up for the new benefits than city officials had expected.

Opponents have vowed to continue their fight against Austin's new domestic partnership policy, and one of them, the Rev. Charles Bullock of Christ Memorial Baptist Church, is spearheading a petition drive in hopes of forcing city officials to schedule a referendum that would give voters a say on the matter. Petition organizers claim they have collected several thousand of the minimum 20,000 signatures needed to bring the matter before City Council.

ALGPC officials and other supporters of the benefits policy at first insisted they were not worried by the petition drive, reasoning that, because the new policy involved budgetary matters and was not formally codified in an ordinance, it was not subject to a popular vote. But more recently, they have begun to acknowledge that the referendum effort needs to be taken seriously.
