Dayna Steele has reigned for years as "Houston's First Lady of Radio" because of her knack for conducting highly entertaining and revealing interviews, her insider's track on the local and national music scene and her commitment to excellence. broadcast native Houstonian, Davna's radio career began in 1982 at KLOL. She was featured as one of the top female disc jockeys in the country on the FMQB "Women of Rock" CD in 1995 and was nominated as "Radio Air Personality of the Year" in 1996 by Billboard Magazine. Dayna was the only woman nominated. In 1996, Dayna moved to FM 97.1, a new talk radio station, to host




Membership

Debra is a native Houstonian. She attended Lee High School located in the southwestern part of her legislative district received her bachelor's degree in sociology with honors and her law from degree University of Houston. She has served as state representative Legislative District 137 since 1981. District 137

encompasses the Heights, Montrose, the Museum District, Greenway Plaza and Gulfton.

Debra currently serves as the chair of the House Committee on Elections and a member of the powerful State Affairs and Calendars committees. She also serves on the Joint Interim committees on Appropriations, Criminal Jurisprudence, Environmental Affairs, Business and Industry, and Cultural and Historical Resources.

Rep. Danburg has received many awards and honors for her hard work. She has been recognized for excellence in service by numerous local, state and national organizations including; Common Cause, Planned Parenthood, Texas Human Rights Campaign Fund, Houston Area Women's Center, Texas Council on Family Violence, Sierra Club, Combined Law Enforcement Association of Texas, Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus, Houston Association of Marriage and Family Therapy, Texas Municipal League, and the Federation of Houston Professional Women. She was also named "Best Legislator" by *Houston City* magazine. In October of 1997 she will receive the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Lesbian and Gay Rights Lobby of Texas.

In 1994 she served as faculty in residence for the New Leadership Program at the Center for the American Woman in Politics at Rutgers University. In 1993 she was named Alumna of the Year by the College of Social Sciences of the University of Houston. Since 1992 she has been a mayoral appointment to the Houston Municipal Arts Commission and serves on the board of the Blaffer Gallery. She was also recently appointed to the board of the Cultural Arts Council (CACHH).

Rep. Danburg is one of the most prolific and successful state representatives in authoring and passing legislation. During the course of her career, Rep. Danburg has authored and passed bills covering a wide range of topics including crime, women's rights, gay and lesbian rights, civic/community issues, the arts, consumer protection, the environment, health care, elections and ethics, and higher education.



Head to the New Pharmacy - Stat!

Kansa City-based STATSCRIPT Pharmacy opened their second Houston location last month at 3407 Montrose at Hawthorne, next to superchains Einstein Bagels and Starbucks Coffee. They are a charter member of our Chamber. Founded on the premise that individuals taking certain drugs deserve personalized service and detailed information from specialized pharmacies like Bill Southward and Larry Harrison in the daily integration of complete HIV-related drug therapies. Although most any type of prescription drug (not only HIV-related) may be filled at STATSCRIPT, you can bet charcoal and lighter fluid won't be found on aisle 17 because, well, there are no aisles or multiple-retail merchandising. Which, frankly, is a nice change from the take-a-number-have-a-seat-we'llget-to-ya-when-we-feel-like-it "drug-department" store. We hope to see you on Thursday, September 11 from 6 - 8 pm for a ribbon-cutting ceremony and another great networking opportunity in our Chamber!

STATSCRIPT Pharmacy was born 11 years ago in Kansas City when the only HIV/AIDS-treating doctor in the city at that time realized there was something missing. Not only did his patients struggle to find a pharmacy that carried the only AIDS drug at that time (AZT) but they often received poor embarrassing service at those pharmacies. Furthermore, many patients had questions regarding the drug they were on which the local pharmacies could not answer.

It was then the doctor decided his patients needed and deserved a convenient pharmacy, so STATSCRIPT was born in a small section of his office. There they could be assured of confidential professional services and receive counseling on their medication. Receiving counseling on one drug might seem simple, but consider that almost 11 years later a HIV+ patient may be taking anywhere from 8-21 prescriptions a month. Now you see the importance of specialized and individualized counseling to help integrate these complex therapies into someone's life.

Soon the word spread about STATSCRIPT Pharmacy's caring and compassionate services to the growing

Recycling Toner/Ink Makes Sense

If you had the chance to save money and the environment at the same time, would you do it? Well, that is what my company, 3R Cartridge Recycling, can do for you or your company. I am in the business of recycling ink cartridges. I take

the empty toner or ink jet cartridge that you were going to throw in the trash and recondition, refill and recycle it. Using a remanufactured toner cartridge costs approximately 30% to 50% less than comparable "original" cartridges. Over 110 million pounds of black toner cartridges are saved from our landfills annually by people choosing to recycle.

Most of my business has been recycling of the toner cartridges and ink jet cartridges which are found in laser printers, copiers and fax machines. The toner car-

tridge is opened, examined for internal wear or damage, and internal parts are thoroughly cleaned. Worn or damaged parts are replaced with high quality components and toners which give excellent print quality and quantity. I have been in this business for two years and have found that many companies are increasingly eager to do whatever they can to reduce the amount of waste that is our landfills. to Recycling printer cartridges can be the beginning of a more comprehensive workplace recycling program. Please take a minute to look around your office and see what items are being "trashed." Maybe some of that can be turned into extra cash. It can also be an added

benefit to be able to tell clients or customers that you are doing your part to make this a "greener, cleaner" place to live. HIV/AIDS patient population and their doctors. They were and are still looking for people who fully understand their disease and who know their true needs just beyond handing them a bottle. Soon the company found itself expanding to other locations and cities. That growth continues. In the last year the company has doubled in size to meet the demand for community-based HIV/AIDS specialized pharmacy services. They currently have 16 locations and by the end of the year will have 20 locations nationwide.






Stephanie McGhee and Scott Garrison have been working on a membership directory. Target completion date is mid October. You asked for it...our committee delivers!



Home Equity Borrowing for Small Businesses-Not Just Swimming Pools!

Do you realize that Texas is the only state in the entire nation where homeowners can use the equity to buy a swimming pool but not start a small business? This is ridiculous! I'm no economist, but I feel very confident saying that small businesses contribute more to the economy than swimming pools.

Right now in Texas, laws almost as old as the Alamo limit equity borrowing to home improvements or paying taxes. To me, this just doesn't make sense. The equity in my home belongs to me and no one else. And, I should have the right to use it to start a new business, to finance a college education--or any way I please.

I have spent 14 years of hard work to change 150 years of government over-reaching "protectionism." In what many observers are calling the most significant property rights issue in years, we have passed legislation placing home equity reform on the statewide ballot in November. We will have the opportunity to unlock the equity in our homes by voting in favor of Proposition 8, the home equity constitutional amendment.

While polls indicate that an overwhelming majority of Texans support home equity reform, constitutional amendment elections in Texas are typically plagued with low voter turnout. When less than 15% of registered voters cast out ballots, anything can happen. That's why it's important for the small business com-

munity to actively support Proposition 8.

Small businesses are the biggest source of economic growth in Texas. According to State Comptroller John Sharp, more than \$375 million in additional borrowing power would flow to businesses as a result of home equity reform.

Home equity reform is particularly important for

small business owners, so much that:

- The 1996 Governor's Conference on Small Business made the issue its top priority for the past legislative session.
- · The Texas Association of Businesses and Chambers of Commerce, The Texas Association of Mexican American Chambers of Commerce and the Texas Association of African American Chambers of Commerce, and the Texas Economic Development Council have all endorsed it. Hopefully, this organization will, as
- A recent national survey conducted by the University of Michigan found that use of home equity borrowing for small business jumped from 7% to 28% over the past decade.

In addition, Texas is the only state that includes business property in its homestead restrictions, which prohibits small business from borrowing against their business premises. In any other state, a business's property would serve as another source of capital, but not in Texas. This unnecessary, outdated restriction is yet another reason small-business owners support Proposition 8 and home equity reform.

Passage of Proposition 8 will mean more availability of business capital, lower interest rates on collateralized consumer borrowing, the ability to write off interest and lower taxes paid to the IRS, and the ability for Texans to manage our own financial decisions, without this "big government" restriction.

Texans don't want someone else telling us what to do with our money. It's our equity, and we should decide how to use it. Texans should pass Proposition 8 on November 4, so that people can use home equity borrowing for small business or a college education, not just swimming pools.






Stephanie McGhee and Scott Garrison have been working on a membership directory. Target completion date is mid October. You asked for it...our committee delivers!

Bill Green Listed in *WORTH* Magazine s One of the Nation's Top 250 Financial Advisors

Who's the best person to help you manage your money? WORTH magazine tells you with its October issue, revealing the country's top 25 financial planners. Chamber member and Treasurer William L. Green, CPA, CFP is included on that list.

In a largely unregulated business, each advisor was subject to an intense review process. WORTH's criteria for excellence met steep tests: thorough background and credit checks, persona and client references, data on education, job history and credentials, method of compensations (the list favors fee-only), samples of contracts with clients, and original credit reports on each nominee. The bottom line question: Would you recommend this advisor to your parents?

In 1994, *WORTH* published the first list of the country's top 60 financial advisors, when there were less than 100,000 people calling themselves financial planners. In 1996, the list was updated and broadened to 200. The

advisory field has more than tripled since 1994, to over 300,000. *WORTH* editors revisited the advisers selected from last year, accepted several hundred ne nominations for review, and expanded geographical coverage so readers can select a planner near to them.

Bill Green was included in the list both last year and again this year. His firm, Green/White Advisors, is located at 1225 N. Loop W., Suite 1030. His telephone number is 713-869-1144, extension 11. Beside his involvement in the Greater Houston Gay and Lesbian Chamber of Commerce, Bill is on the Board of Directors of the Montrose Counseling Center, and is a member of EPAH. "I'm very pleased to be on the list of top planners once again. I love this business. It's a lot of fun for me working with clients of all type and financial goals. And, it's kind of nice for members of our community to have this type of professional recognition."

Gay Press Emerges as Fastest Growing Ad Market

Advertising spending in the gay press reached \$100.2 million this year, a 35.9% increase over 1996, according to the fourth annual Mulryan/Nash Gay Press Report, a national study of ad spending and editorial content in the 138 gay-targeted print publications across the U.S.

"According to our calculations, the gay press has once more emerged as the fastest growing print/ad market in the U.S.," stated Dave Mulryan, partner of Mylryan/Nash. "For the past three consecutive years, gay-press ad revenues have grown faster than those, in both mainstream press and other niche markets." In comparison, he noted, ad revenues in mainstream newspapers grew just 12.9% over 1996, as reported by the Newspaper Association of America, and ad spending in mainstream magazines grew 11.2% according to

the Publisher's Information Bureau. Meanwhile, as revenues in the Hispanic press grew 11% according to Hispanic Business News and advertising directed at African Americans grew an estimated 2.1% according to Target Market News (no print-only breakdown was available).

Meanwhile, mainstream advertisers continued to show a strong commitmento the gay press. Among the big-name, first-time advertisers in 1997 were the generally-conservative Aetna Retirement Services, American Express Financial Services, and IBM. HBO and the Sundance Channel also appeared for the first time, ass did the airlines United and Continental. And in the fashion category Perry Ellis, Joe Boxer, Prada and Dolce & Gabbana all placed ads.

After tons of work and lots of anticipation, EMPOWER '97 finally arrived. Saturday, October 11 was a tremendous day for the GHGLCC and the gay and lesbian community in Houston. Crowd attendance is estimated at 1,500 despite the pouring rain. Counting the exhibitors (100 companies at 137 booths), volunteers from various organizations, and entertainers, at least 2,000 people enjoyed the event.

The AFH informed us by phone last week that we raised 1,500 lbs of food for Stone Soup Pantry, plus almost \$200.00 in cash donations (which will buy twice that in food). All feedback has been very positive from vendors and attendees. Most of the comments are about the excellent organization of EMPOWER '97 and the professionalism and appearance of the show. Vendors have reported new business in the form of sales at the expo and new clients for future business, as well as great leads.

We were proud of a lot that day, but especially of the care most exhibitors took in decorating and presenting their booths. We looked GOOD!! We were also proud of the attendees who came out despite the rain, and who spent such quality time going to each booth and talk-

ing with each vendor. Even the George R. Brown and the GES Exhibition company staff were impressed, and they see a lot of shows.

There were a couple of disappointments—notably, KHMX Mix 96.5 did not provide any of the on-air promotion we were promised in exchange for their media sponsorship. They received a lot of publicity from our advertising, but did not meet their obligations to us, and so were asked to pay for their booth or leave the show. They chose to leave. Their loss!

The evening comedy performance was terrific. Each performer was hilarious, but the headliner, Judy Tenuta, blew the crowd away! Judy performed for almost an hour and a half and had the crowd rolling in the aisles the whole time.

If you missed EMPOWER '97, you missed more than a business expo. The feeling of goodwill and pride and energy in the GRB that day was phenomenal. It was a fantastic day for the GHGLCC, the community, and for business!




Stewart L. Zuckerbrod, M.D.

Advocating for Equal Rights: PFLAG works to broaden the base of support for equal human and civil rights by mobilizing millions of non-gay family members from all political, economic and social sectors of society.

PFLAG in Houston

The Houston Chapter of PFLAG was founded in 1981, one of the 20 original chapters of the organization that now includes 400 chapters across the U.S. and in 11 countries. At the beginning of 1992, PFLAG Houston set goals of growing in membership and achieving a visible presence in the community. The chapter now counts 300 members, welcomes 120 to the monthly meetings, and has recently instituted "mid-month" meetings to accommodate members who can't attend the regular sessions.

We have achieved national recognition for our initiates in education and advocacy - but we are proudest of the lifeline we offer to families.
