

#### WHY WOMYN?

According to anthropologist and linguist Edward Sapir and too many others to name, "Language to is a guide 'social reality'" which affects both human interpretation and human behavior. Changing woman to womyn is an aggressive act of protest against past cultural assumptions which allows us to free our own identity and power. Besides, changing the spelling of our universe is a lot easier than running for office or moving to an island. Or is it? Try writing womyn -- feel the form of "Y," justify respelling the past. Think about your own autonomy and identity, then party with other womyn and have a good time!

# Herstory

You might say that the Russian Revolution was started by American womenin 1857! On March 8 of that year, garment workers from New York's Lower East Side sweat shops ( many of them daughters of Russian Jewish immigrants ) demonstrated against unsafe work places, brutal hours and quotas. They also sought childcare and other basic needs. When, in an effort to "shame the rich" they marched into a wealthy neighborhood, police violently dispersed them, trampling some under horses, arresting others. Fifty years later, conditions were no better. So a similar march was neld again on March 8. Larger than the first, it too was brutally dispersed.

A few years after that, an international socialist meeting inaugurated an annual day to honor working women. The date of March 8 was chosen to express solidarity with the New York garment workers.

On 8/March/1918
Europe was in the final, terrible year of World
War I. In Saint
Petersburg, Russia's capital, it was Feb. 23
on the old Julian calendar. The labor union women there wanted to use Women's Day to voice their demands that

Russia get out of the war, bring home the troops, lower prices and release food to the people. They called for a general strike. The men leading unions and political parties didn't think it could be pulled off. So the women put together committees and got workers to walk out and housewives to join demonstrations. At least 90,000 people participated. This so encouraged progressive forces that the strike blossomed into what is now called "The February Revolution", and which led - 8 months later to The October Revolution, which did end the war for Russia (and helped end it elsewhere), as well as totally changing the lives of all her people.

Many times since then, women have chosen this date to act for human rights, as in: 1936, Madrid: 80,000 women marched (at the height of the Spanish Civil War) demanding "progress & liberty". 1961, Vietnam: the Union of Women for the Liberation of South Vietnam was founded to defend & advance women's rights & to encourage women to join in the armed struggle which freed their country from foreign control. 1970 New York City: the women of Youth Against War & Facism restored the U. S. celebration of International Women's Day with a rally at Union Spuare & march to the Women's House of Detention, to show support for sisters imprisoned there. 1971, Uraguay: Tupamaros guerillas, dressed as police, freed 50 women political prisoners all without firing a shot! 1975, Cuba: The Family Code, the most progressive legistlation of its kind in the world. became effective. Provisions include equal responsibility of men and women for child-rearing & household tasks, equal access to divorce & protection of children's rights.

And that is how "The shirtwaist makers of New York/Marched 60 years to St. Petersburg/To make the general strike/That gave jobs to the people of Oriente Province.

# Are You Guilty?

Dear Sisters,

By way of introduction, I have worked and lived in this community for over 15 years. During this time I have come to Love Montrose, my sisters and brothers (Gay and Straight), and the city itself. As a member of The National Organization of Women, I have worked diligently for equal rights. As the Executive Director of Testing Research and Couseling Service I have counseled with hundreds of our gay brotners and sisters to help live happier and healthier emotional lives. As a concerned individual I fought for and earned the court system respect-becoming the first open Lesbian to gain custody of foster children in Texas. In 1970, I was arrested thirteen times in a period of eleven months testing an archaic city ordinance which limited freedom of personal expression and dress. I ended this fight in the U.S. Supreme Court in 1974. I, along with many of our gay sisters and brothers, was a founding member of the Texas Gay Task Force and later the Texas Gay Conference. I recently acted as the President of the Board of Directors of the Montrose patrol and spent nearly every Friday, Saturday and Sunday night for a year on the streets of Montrose to help keep our community safe. I was the prime founder and first president of the MSA pool league.

What I am trying to say here is this, I have spent 15 years in service to our gay community. I have battled injustice and discrimination sometimes at great personal sacrifice. I am not the only one to do so. Hundreds of Thousands of our Gay Sisters and Brothers throughout the world have fought the same battle. We've suffered under the same myths and rumors. We have all, at one time or another, been the subject of misunderstanding and ridicule at the hands of our Non-Gay citizens.

Tonight I find myself wondering what we've learned in the past few hundred years of Gay Sufferage.

We have been discriminated against.

Have we learned not to discriminate?

We have suffered the pains of rumors and slander based on untrue mythology of homosexuality. Have we learned openmindedness and acceptance of others regarless of their beliefs?

Have we not learned that all people are of unique worth and dignity by virtue of their simply being human beings?

In the past five weeks I have met three marvelous womyn. I have enjoyed the pleasure of their companionship and an intimacy that only we as womyn seem to fully comprehend and appreciate. But, alas these encounters were not destined to become lasting friendships.

WHY

Some of our sisters have not learned that each one of us is special. Some of our sisters have set themselves up as judges of others. Today, as we work to dispell the myths of lesbianism spread by our hetersexual counterparts, some gay womyn are perpetuating myths of their own about another class of people. Some of our sisters (perhaps those enjoying the freedom I helped to earn for them) are destroying my freedom and happiness with their thoughtless lack of understanding and compassion for other sisters.

As womyn we know we are special. We like to envision ourselves even more special because we are womyn loving womyn. We like to believe we have a deep understanding of other womyn because we have common bonds emotionally and physically in a world long under the domain of the opposite sex. Are we special?

Tonight I met another woman. Almost, the first words out of her mouth were, "I know all about you!"

How could she?
We had never met. We had never discussed life,
politics, religion, love or anything for that
matter. We had never shared time together to get to know each other.
And yet, she knew all about me? How could she?
She did not know what causes me to laugh, cry, love or (heaven forbid) hate.

She did not know my wants, needs, likes and dislikes-but she Knew all about me because a "Friend" had told her!

Let me share with you what she did know. She "Heard" that before 1972 I was a male, that I had sex reassignment surgery. Even with that knowledge she still referred to me as-"He."

This woman will never know that I too am a woman. She will never know what's in my head. She will never understand that I suffer the same discrimination (and more) that she does as a woman. She will never know that I can understand her emotions and quest for life, liberty, love and the pursuit of personal freedom and happiness.

Ladies, I've paid my dues. I have done my share of suffering and some of yours as well.

You don't know your sisters until you meet them with open hearts and minds. Let us not fall into the trap that many of the hetersexual folks fall into by judging other people with labels. Let us not judge at all. Do take the time to get to know your sisters-you may be surprised and like what you find. If you take the time to get to know me, you may learn that, in spite of getting off to a bad start at birth. I too am a special woman of unique dignity and worth.

Dear S.O.S.;

A THOUGHT FOR BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Rosa Parks was the catalyst that set off the Montgomery, Alabama bus boycott of 1956. That, in turn was the action that thrust Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. into national prominence and it was one of the major preludes to the massive Civil Rights campaign of the 1960's.

Sister Parks is often portrayed as simply a tired domestic worker who refused to comply with Montgomery's Jim Crow Ordinance and give up her seat to a white man. At the time she was the Secretary of the local National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP). She had recently returned from a seminar for community leaders at Highlander Folkschool in Knoxville.

She was a womyn formed in the struggles of her people, aware that she needed to learn organizing skills and fresh from an experience which reinforced her instinctual knowledge that she was worthy of respect and had to assert her rights.


There are multitudes of Rosa Parks' all over the world. Groups, institutions, and individuals like Highlander are the catalyst needed to cause the chemical reaction—to leaven the dough—to make liberation happen. There are more "Dr. Kings" out

there to respond to the "Rosa Parks" " and to catapult her aspirations. As I once said in a poem:


