KAPOSI'S SARCOMA COMMITTEE FORMS

HOUSTON—The gay community has heard much about Kaposi's Sarcoma, the so-called "gay cancer." Although the media, both gay and non-gay, have given attention to the disease and reaction from the gay community has been highly supportive, no one has really underscored the fact that, at present, there is no cure for this cancer and that research to find a cure is a costly procedure.

The Kaposi's Sarcoma and Opportunistic Infection (KS/OI) syndrome constitutes an emerging epidemic in the gay communities of most large urban areas, including Houston, which has not only a large, well-organized gay community, but a well-respected cancer research center at *University of Texas M.D. Anderson Hospital*.

M.D. Anderson has initiated a large-scale project which, with the active support of the gay community, will involve community education, medical and epidemiological research. However, in order to continue, funds must be made available for these activities, *TWT News* was told.

In order to constitute and encourage such activities, a private, non-profit community service organization will be chartered under the name of "*The Kaposi's Sarcoma Committee (KSC) of Houston*." The purpose of this committee will be to solicit, accept and distribute funds for community education and other gay-related immunodeficiency diseases.

KSC will consist of a 10-member board of directors and such subcommittees as may be deemed necessary to expedite the committee's purposes. Thus far, members of the KSC board of directors include State Representative **Debra Danburg**, **Dr. William Manzell** of M.D. Anderson Hospital, **Dr. Didier Piot**, **Dr. David Short**, **Bill Bailey** of *The Different Drum*, and **Andy Mills** of *Mary's Lounge*.

Planned for the near future is a

series of fundraising activities of a varied nature which will be entertaining to the participants and profitable to KSC. Ms. Danburg has agreed to make available her legal trust fund for accumulation of all funds to be presented to M.D. Anderson Hospital by Houston's gay community, and specifically for use in research for this particular cancer which has become such a threat to the community as a whole.

Within six months of its inception, the committee hopes to collect \$100,000 in donations and from other fundraising activities. "The need for support by the entire gay community is obvious, and the danger to all of us from gay-related immunodeficiency diseases cannot be minimized," a spokesperson said.

NOTE:

We wish to add this latest information. **Mac MacAdory** was appointed Chairman of the K.S.C. and the fund raisers have begun. *Chicago Hellfire* has offered to collect donations, *The Wrangler M.C.* will produce "Taxi Sum Sundance" in Dallas on May 20 with a portion of the profits going to the K.S.C. *The Drum* and *The Loading Dock* of Houston held a Sodom and Gamorrah party May 16th and raised over forty-six hundred dollars. And many more functions are in the planning.

M.D. Anderson Hospital, one of America's leading cancer research hospitals has set up a special account, and has assured the K.S.C. and the gay community that all funds received through the K.S.C. will be used solely for the study and research of **Kaposi's Sarcoma**.

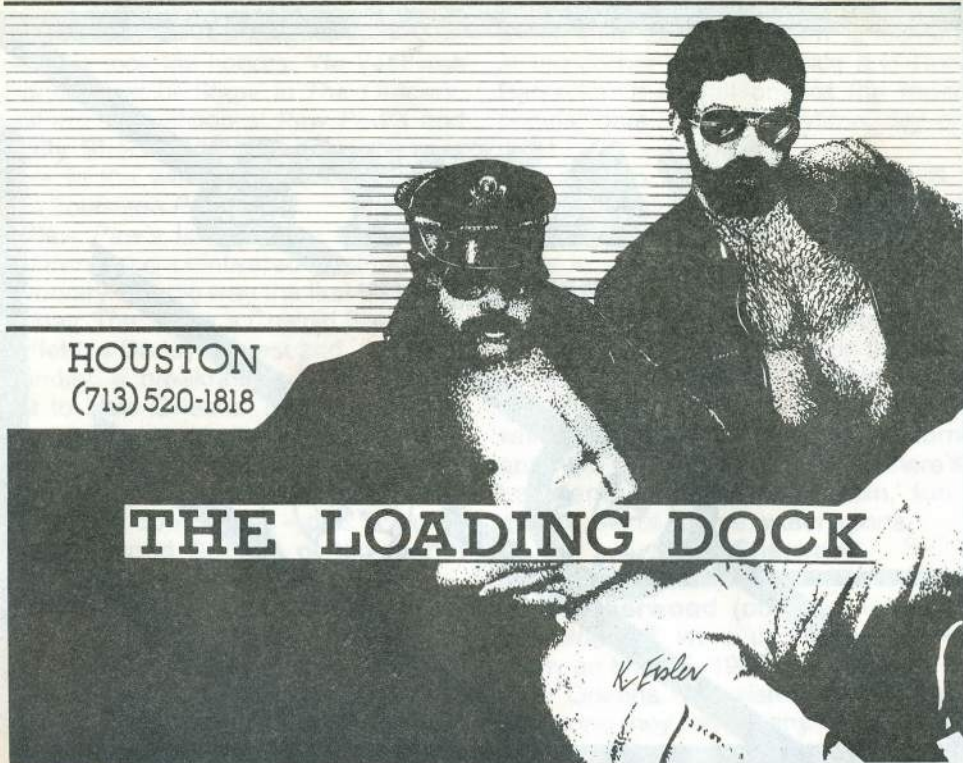
