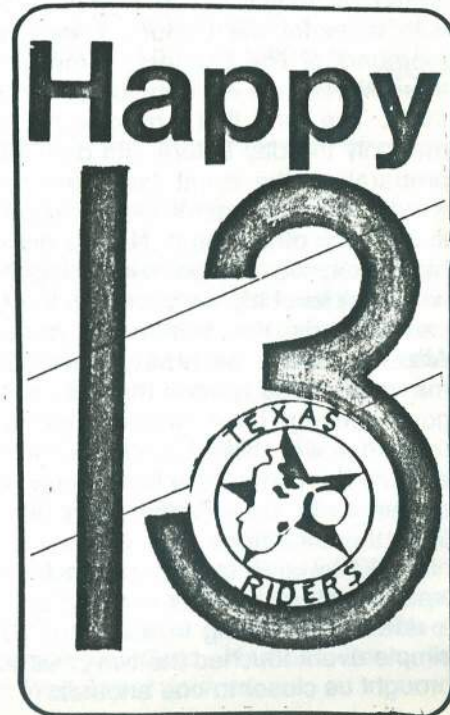
The Colts also had a campout at *Rosebud* on Thanksgiving weekend. It

was our second campout just for members and their boyfriends. It's always nice to get out of town for the weekend, especially with just members of your club.

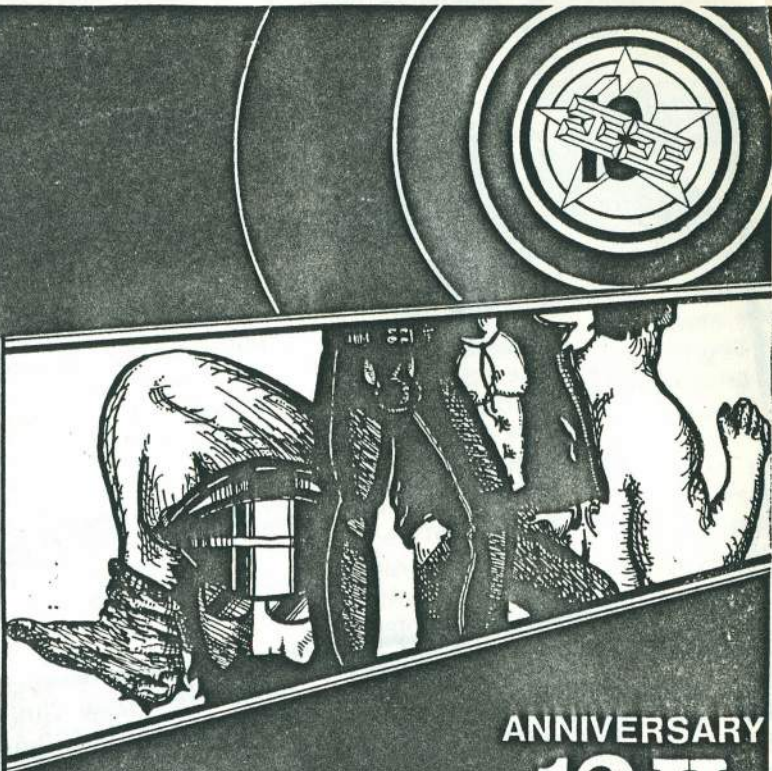

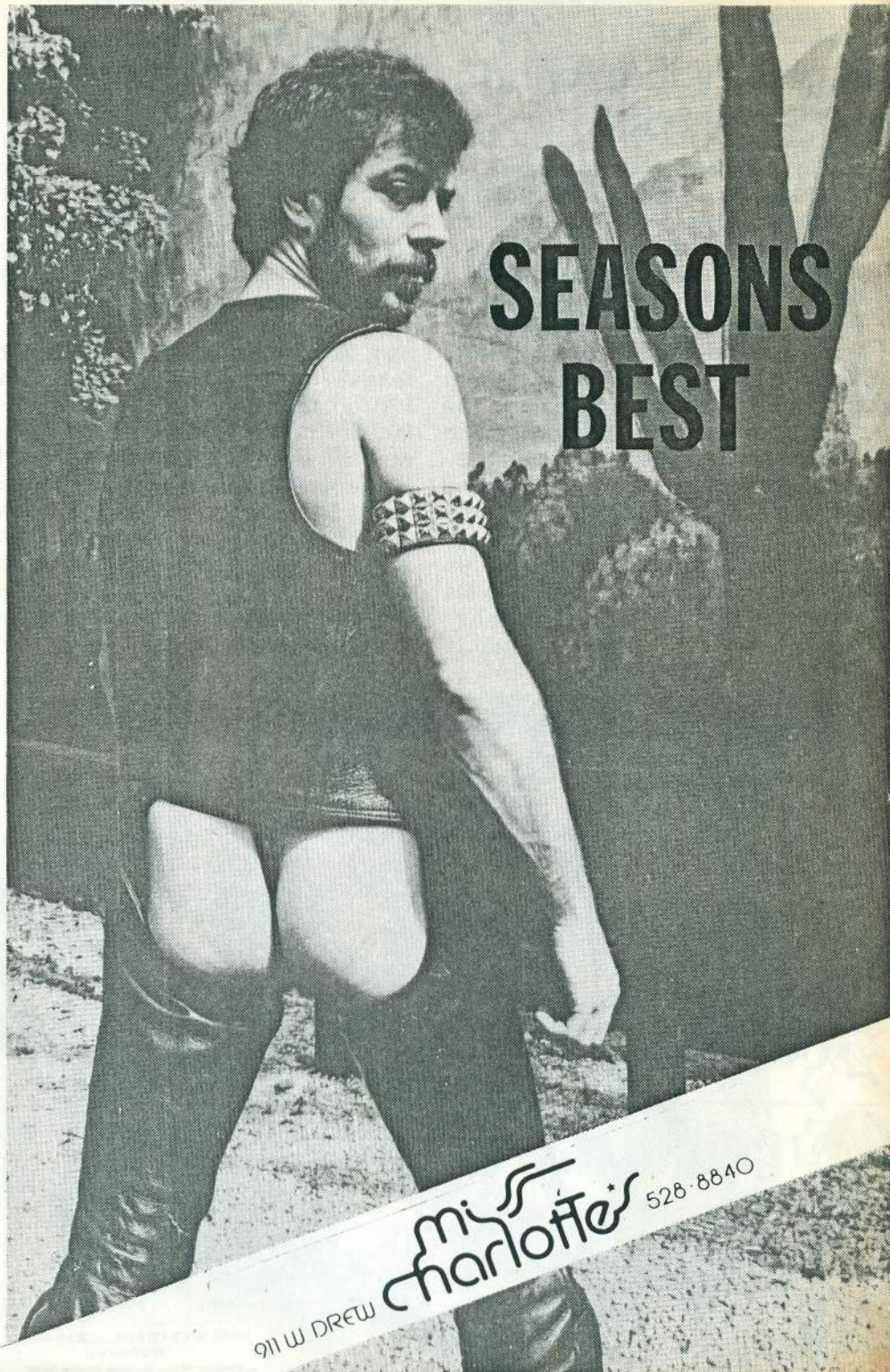

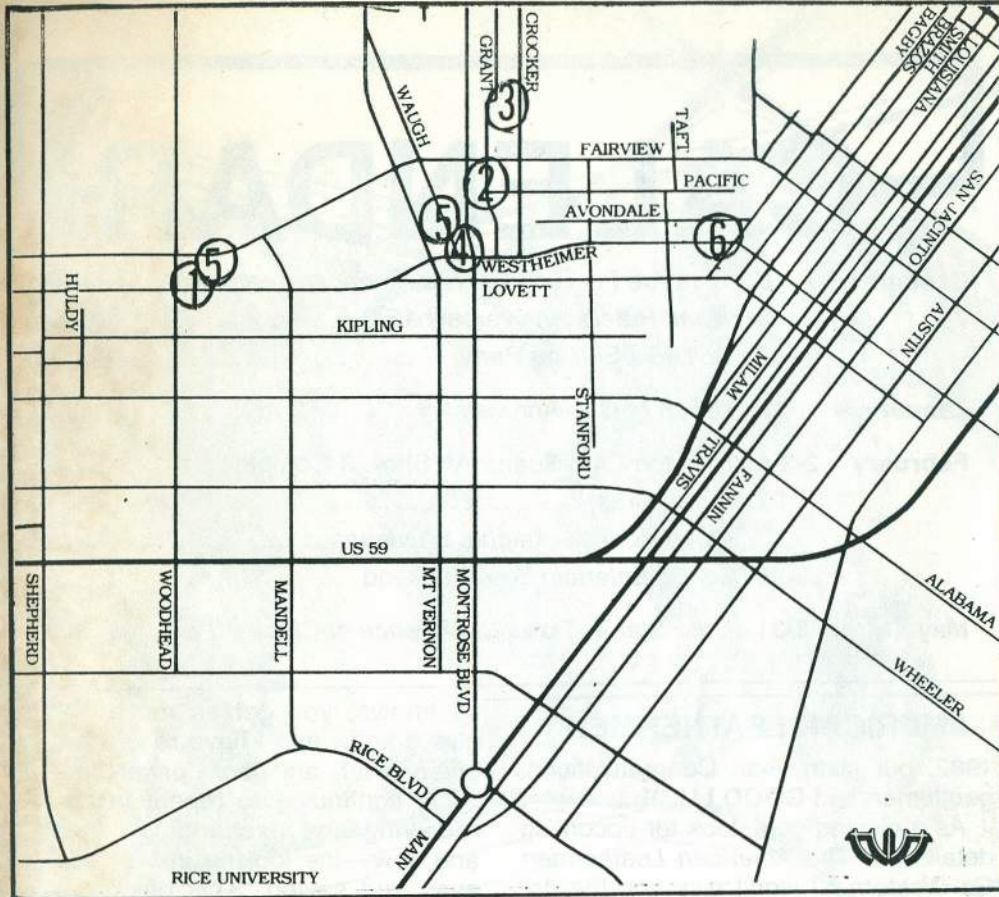
